At the end of the Advanced dancing, she disappeared and shortly re-appeared for the Challenge tips in... you guessed it, a pair of blue jeans, T-shirt, and beach sandals (Zori's). 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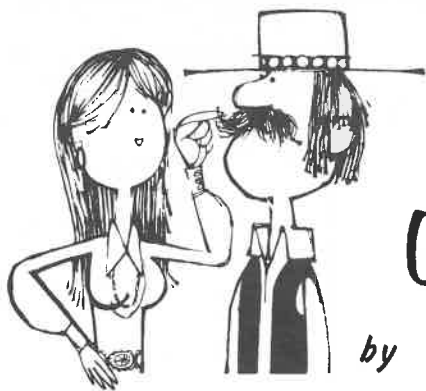
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"OUR" OPINION !

PATCHWORK SKIRT

Have you ever wondered what to do with all those sewing leftovers you have lying around taking up space? Most of these "treasures" are too small to make anything, yet too large to throw away. Betty and I, being thrifty (pack rats could be another name), have discussed this subject quite often. We decided that a patchwork skirt could be one way of putting our "treasures" to good use.

Two colors could be used; a variety of colors and fabrics could be used, including eyelet; or a selection of coordinating colors could be used to make this style of skirt.

We contacted Jan Caldwell from Dancers' Choice and she provided us with the pattern and agreed to be our model.

Approximate yardage for a dress is 5 yards; approximate yardage for a skirt is $3\frac{1}{2}$ yards.

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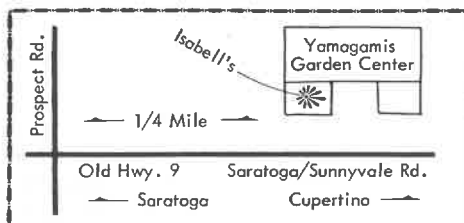
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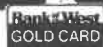
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Stir The Bucket With Betty

Marti and I recently had an opportunity to volunteer to bring goodies for one of our clubs. As usual we threw around ideas for the "party night". An unanimous vote for an ice cream feed was the result. The flavors were a success and many requests for the recipes - some "no cook" - came about. Here they are; just in time for the Fourth or that special weekend.



BASIC FRUIT ICE CREAM

This recipe can be made with any fruit, fresh or frozen.

- 4 eggs
- 2½ cups granulated sugar
- 1 pint whipping cream
- 3 cups pureed fruit
- 2 tsp. vanilla extract
- 1 quart milk
- 1 (1 lb.) bag frozen fruit or equivalent fresh fruit

Beat eggs until frothy. Add sugar and beat well. Stir in cream and blend to dissolve the sugar. Add pureed fruit. Blend to even color. Add extract and milk. Blend. Pour into freezer container and add paddle. * Add extra whole fruit and start freezer. It takes about twenty minutes and yields 1 gallon.

* The whole fruit should be partially frozen to remain whole. Otherwise, the freezing process will disintegrate the whole fruit.

ROCKY ROAD ICE CREAM

- 1¼ cups granulated sugar
- 8 egg yolks, beaten
- 18 oz. chocolate chips, melted
- 1 quart milk, scalded/cooled
- 1 tsp. vanilla extract
- 2 cups whipping cream
- 1½ cups finely chopped walnuts
- 1/3 (10½oz.) bag of mini marshmallows

Mix sugar, egg yolks and melted chocolate. Blend thoroughly. Add cream and vanilla. Blend. Add cooled scalded milk. (Skim off any milk film and discard.) Blend. * Add nuts and marshmallows. Stir. Pour into freezer container and add paddle. This recipe takes at least 30 - 40 minutes to freeze. Yields 1 gallon.

* Marshmallows tend to dissolve so you may want to add marshmallows about 10 minutes into the freezing process. If added early and they do dissolve, it just adds an additional creaminess to the ice cream.



CHOCOLATE MINT

- 4 eggs
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup granulated sugar
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups milk
- 3 cups half & half
- 2 cups heavy cream
- 3 cups chocolate syrup
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. mint extract

Beat eggs until frothy. Add sugar and blend. Add milk products and blend. Add syrup and stir until blended. Add salt and mint extract. Pour into freezer and freeze until firm.

Yields 1 gallon

PEPPERMINT ICE CREAM

- 4 eggs
- $2\frac{1}{4}$ cups granulated sugar
- 3 cups milk
- 3 cups half & half
- 2 cups heavy cream
- Peppermint extract (to taste)
- 6 oz. pkg. Air Bon Bons -
peppermint flavored, crushed
or approximately 20 peppermint
sticks broken into small pieces
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. salt

Beat eggs until frothy. Add sugar and blend. Add milk, cream and half & half. Add extract and salt. Add crushed Bon Bons just before pouring into freezer. Add paddle and freeze approximately 25 to 30 minutes or until firm.

Yields 1 gallon
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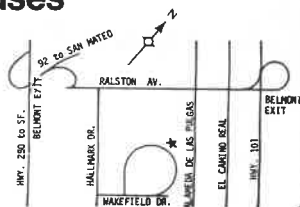
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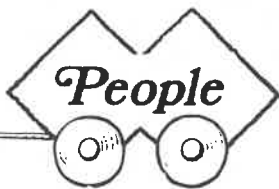

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Was That Really MAINSTREAM??

ZOOM FAMILY
CALLERLAB Basic #42

Definition:

(CALLERLAB #42) a. ZOOM. Starting formation: One couple following another, or one dancer following another. From one couple following another, each dancer in the lead couple separates away from his partner and walks around a full circle (360°) to end in the position of the dancer who was directly behind him. Meanwhile, each trailing dancer steps directly forward into the vacated position of the lead dancer. Every dancer ends facing in the same direction he started. From one dancer following another, the lead dancer walks away from the center of the square and around a full circle (360°) to the position of the dancer who was directly behind him. Meanwhile, the trailing dancer steps directly

forward into the position vacated by the lead dancer. b. SUBSTITUTE. Starting formation: One couple following another. The lead couple makes an arch with their joined inside hands and backs that arch over the trailing couple who steps forward. The couples exchange places, but nobody changes facing direction. (Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #93 and Burleson #1474.)

Observations:

The Zoom portion of this Family presents a smooth, forward flowing way to exchange leading and trailing dancers without causing any "back up" body momentum problems as long as the caller uses good judgment in the use of the call. The one formation where Zoom is sometimes used as a gimmick (and a dangerous one) is the Trade By formation, where everybody does the leading dancers' "roll back" action. This latter formaton must be used very carefully (and with appropriate advance warning) in order to avoid the obvious 'crunch' action of two dancers attempting to occupy the same 'piece of real estate'. The Substitute portion of the Family is extremely useful from the two-faced line formations where the center of the square could become very crowded (and possibly dangerous) if Zoom were called. Although Substitute does require a "backing up" action, it is the preferred call from two-faced lines.

Teaching Tips:

CHALLENGE



★ CORNER

Bob is on vacation this month and we are rerunning one of his earlier columns which we feel is still timely and which you may have missed.

It becomes increasingly clear that there are really several levels of Advanced and Challenge dancing. We thought we would take a look at these levels and address some of the problems this creates.

First, let's look at the Advanced level. We have found, when calling Advanced dances, that if we call much more than easy Advanced, the floor gets in trouble very quickly. This is probably okay, but it does prove our point that Advanced should be broken down into three levels. This is not to say that the list should be divided into three parts. Let's look at that for a moment.

We have felt for some time that the degree of difficulty of any dance at any level can be changed by the formation from which a basic is called, the sequence of basics used, and the number of more difficult basics called in a row. We use as an example, Cast a Shadow. This basic is usually called from two-faced lines, which would be considered the "standard position". It can also be called from waves, columns and promenades. Usually, the degree of difficulty

increases with each formation. What is called before and after the figure will also increase the difficulty of the dance. Finally, the number of Advanced or Challenge commands out of, say, every ten given will increase or decrease the difficulty of the dance. All position dancing certainly enters the picture here in increasing or decreasing the difficulty at any level.

We feel that if the above were taken into consideration for each Advanced basic, and consideration were given to breaking down the sequences and frequency of the more difficult calls, three levels could be established for Advanced dancing. Such as, Easy, Intermediate, and Hard. These would still use all of the basics, but limit the way in which they are used and the frequency of the calls. Bob Fisk said that the move from Plus 2 to Advanced is really a giant step. We agree. Perhaps it is too giant a step for many of us to make all at once. We would be able to have people dancing at the Advanced level who could then devote the time they wish, without having to become A-2 dancers ready to go into C-1. We do feel that dancers should not be misled into thinking that just because they finish an easy A-2 class, they are ready to go into C-1 level classes or groups. They will just be ready to work their way into intermediate A-2 if they wish to go on. This will give the dancers a choice rather than the callers forcing them into something they don't want.

We do not advocate breaking down the Challenge levels in the above method for we feel when people are really ready for Challenge level they have decided to put in all the time and effort necessary to reach their goal. Anyway, the whole idea is food for thought. Whether you agree or disagree, drop us a line and let us know how you feel.

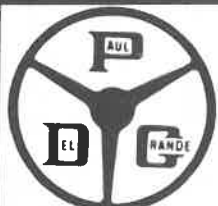

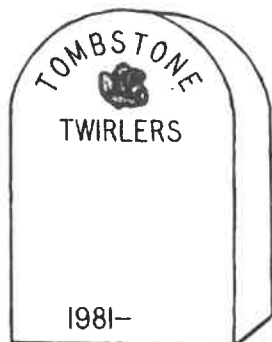

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PROMPTER PROFILE

Elmer De Graf

Elmer DeGraf has been square dancing for thirty-two years and he didn't even start dancing until he was fifty-five years old!

When Elmer was born, Grover Cleveland was President of the United States, the Spanish American War was still four years away, and his birthplace, San Francisco, was enjoying a construction boom with the building of beautiful wooden homes that were destined to be destroyed by the Great Earthquake and Fire twelve years later. The year was 1894. The history of our area, and of square dancing, is very real to Elmer; he has lived through it.

Dancing has always been an important part of Elmer's life. In 1914 he met his late wife, Alice, at a dance. "I was a member of a military group called the California Greys," Elmer recalls, "We served as honor guard for dignitaries visiting the San Francisco area, and in 1914 we went with the Governor to the old Coconut Grove Ballroom for the annual Governor's Ball. Alice was there as a guest of the Governor's military aide and during the evening I got to dance with her. It was all in the line of duty, you understand. We were supposed to make sure all the girls got to dance all evening. Anyway, I managed to get Alice's phone number."

Elmer didn't get around to calling Alice right away. "I got involved with the San Francisco World's Fair in 1915 and didn't see her again for over a year. Then, in 1916, I guess I must have run out of phone numbers or something. Anyway, I called her."

That phone call was the start of a long relationship. Elmer and Alice were married for fifty-nine years, until Alice passed away five years ago.



Square dancing entered their lives in 1949. They were exposed to square dancing while members of a folk dance club called the Clodhoppers. "Square dancing was sort of a dirty word to avid folk dancers. So we sneaked away and joined a square dance club down in Redwood City (the Covered Wagon Squares), they did nothing but square dance. At Saturday night hoedowns our folk dance group, the Clodhoppers, had six tips of rounds and folk dances and one tip of square dancing, and the Clodhoppers couldn't understand how we did so well at the squares. It took them a whole year to find out we had been square dancing on the side!"

Before long, Elmer and Alice went to their first square dance "hoedown" and had a miserable

time! "They made us feel we weren't welcome there, so I got mad. I built a terrace behind our house (in Los Altos Hills) that would hold eight squares and, once a month, I put on my own hoe-downs!"

The once a month hoe-downs lasted nearly six years. By then, square dancing had become a major part of the DeGraf's social life. "We made it such a major part of our life that if any of the family had an anniversary or birthday party, it had to be on a night we weren't square dancing." And Elmer found a way to gain free time to devote to dancing. "We did everything we could to insult what we called the "civilians" (non-square dancers)." Elmer also discovered that if they stopped hosting parties, they would soon be dropped from other's guest lists.

Elmer and Alice continued to be active square dancers until 1976, when Alice passed away. Elmer tried to withdraw, but his square dancing friends wouldn't let him. The DeGrafs had been dancing with Larry Ward's B Sharps for seventeen years and Elmer finally agreed to return. His only problem turned out to be finding a partner. "I thought I was going to have to shoot someone so I could have a widow to dance with!" But Elmer found a partner: first one, then a second, then a third, until he had a "harem" of partners. (His many partners do, in fact, wear a special "Elmer's Harem" badge.)

While Elmer enjoys square dancing, he isn't too enthusiastic about traveling. He has only been out of California twice in his eighty-seven years and his upcoming trip to Seattle for the National (his first National) will be his first trip out of the state since 1936.

Elmer DeGraf has seen many changes in square dancing and has opinions about them all. "When I first started dancing there were only six moves; now there are over 150. I think CALLERLAB has done a pretty good job establishing levels. Their biggest mistake is APD, which the average dancer

doesn't really like. The most successful clubs have callers who use APD calling directionally - for example, on Cloverleaf the man just knows he should go to the left!"

One thing in square dancing hasn't changed, according to Elmer. "This is the only activity where the social amenities are observed. The men wear long sleeved shirts and the women always look beautiful in their dresses. And when they finish dancing, people always thank one another."

Elmer has noticed that square dancing isn't for everyone. "When I first started dancing, I noticed that some beginners just never got the hang of it. I also noticed that when anyone held office in a club, as soon as their six months was up, they would quit dancing. So I got the idea that anyone who couldn't dance, we would elect them to office and that way we could get rid of them! That's also why I would never hold office myself. I figured someone was trying to get rid of me!"

Round dancing was always one of Elmer's favorites, but he didn't like mixers. "In the early days, they would always include a mixer and Alice and I would always sit those out. Alice knew I was a lousy round dancer, but I didn't want to advertise it."

In April of last year, Elmer's dancing nearly came to an end. He began having severe pains in his left leg and doctors couldn't find a cure. The problem progressed to the point where he couldn't even walk without assistance, but he still went to hoe-downs to sit and watch. "It was better to be miserable there than to be miserable at home alone."

Sheryl Martin, a physical therapist who dances with the B Sharps, learned of Elmer's problem and decided she could help. After the first two-hour long therapy session, Elmer was up and walking around the house. Sheryl continued with daily sessions for six weeks and still gives Elmer therapy once a week. The result? "Well, I'm

Fremont Single Squares

You may have seen some dancers at various hoedowns with a badge saying PHD. In this particular case the badge does not indicate the attainment of some particular academic degree, it shows that the individual is a member of the Fremont Single Squares and is enjoying "Plenty Happy Dancing".

The Fremont Single Squares was formed in 1971 from a beginner's class that had been sponsored by the Keeway Swingers. The original group consisted of six squares with Lee Buckingham as their caller. Lee was followed by Don Atkins and Ruster Witter before Ron Haggerty took up the calling duties two years ago. Ron met his wife at the Fremont Single Squares so the group has a special meaning for him.

The Fremont Singles currently consists of about ten squares from the tri-cities area of Newark, Hayward, and Fremont, but mostly from Fremont. The group is an over-eighteen singles club, but a certain percentage of the dancers are couples.

As with any singles group, the club offers a broad range of activities for its members. These include an annual barbecue, Coyote hayrides, snow trips to Strawberry, hikes to Mission Peak, and occasional potlucks. Of course, they also have a lot of dancing activities that are capped off with their annual Anniversary Hoedown. Styling Tips!

by Bob and Lois Elling

With classes graduating, we thought this would be a good time to pass on these Styling Tips which Bob and Lois share with their dancers.

These are suggestions to make your dancing more smooth and enjoyable:

I. GENERAL

1. Slide your feet; use a gliding step, toe first and take one step for each beat of music.

2. Stand straight and proud. It's amazing how much of a difference that can make. Just try it and see for yourself.

3. Smile and look at people as you dance with them. It not only looks nice but makes dancing more fun. And you never know what new friends you might make.

4. Small squares are better because big squares make bigger mistakes.

5. Always look in the direction you are going or are about to go. Often some dancers are looking the wrong way because they want to see if they did the same as the other side of the square.

6. Whenever turning, pivot on your toes; don't just walk around.

7. Never grip tightly; you might leave a bruise.

8. Every call ends with someone holding hands. When facing the same direction it is men palms up, ladies palms down. If there are two people of the same sex, put the right palm up and the left palm down. When two people are facing opposite directions, it is palm to palm as in ocean waves.

9. Any call involving a 'pull-by': pull gently towards each other, release the hand before you come shoulder to shoulder, then just walk past that person. If there is a forearm turn, turn 1/2 so that you are facing opposite directions,

release and then walk by. Remember, if the person is behind you, don't hold on.

10. The best way to help someone else is to do your part correctly.

II. SPECIFIC BASICS

1. Weave the Ring - Acknowledge (bow) at the beginning. Men put palms behind your back at belt level. Walk past each person, not around them. You must get halfway around the ring.

2. Ladies Chain - Ladies put a right hand (not a skirt) in the middle and hold your skirts out to the side with the left hand. On the Courtesy Turn, release the skirt with the left and pick up the other side with the right hand.

3. Promenade - Men should take smaller steps. Remember the ladies have further to go. Men should promenade towards the center and then around; almost shoulder to shoulder.

4. Allemande Thar - Centers take shorter steps (so the outsides don't have to run). Ladies (when on the outside) hold your skirt out. If you are backing up and there is a gap between you and the couple in front, slow down. There should be a 90° angle between each couple. The heads will be in a straight line and the sides will be in a straight line.

5. Stars - Men: It's nice to place your free hand behind your back. Ladies: Hold out your skirt with your free hand. If the star moves forward, it is a palm up star. If the star moves backwards, it is a wrist hold like a Thar star.

6. Right & Left Thru - Concentrate on doing the Courtesy Turn as soon as possible without walking too far past the other couple. The left palm should be up for the men, down for the ladies. The lady's palm is placed on top of the man's (for the Courtesy Turn).

7. Pass Thru - Take only one

-The Prompter-

step beyond the other couple after passing them. Remember to stay facing the same direction; don't look back.

8. Flutterwheel - Men start moving immediately after their partners go. Men follow the ladies rather than going around them. Ladies, remember, it is a forearm hold to the other lady and a hand-hold with the man.

9. Centers Run - It is especially important that the outside people slide in and touch hands in the center as the center people go to the outside.

10. Grand Square - TAKE 32 STEPS. Example: Step - 2 - 3 - 4(turn) - etc. In other words, don't rush it. Sometimes the caller says to do only a part of a Grand Square and if you rush, you will not end in the correct spot.

11. Swing Thru (Ocean Wave) - Don't lock thumbs; cup hands together (palm to palm). Don't hold tight. Don't let your arms dangle like limp spaghetti. When turning with someone, don't pull or push. Press palms firmly against each

other. Using the hand contact as a pivot, just walk forward and you will turn naturally. Don't try to pull the other person by you.

12. Swings - Men, give your partner a strong support to hold onto. Don't give her the feeling she's going to slip out of your hands. Both dancers should give just enough balance or pull against the other to keep the swing comfortable. A swing is done by two people. Men don't "swing the ladies", but rather swing together. Men, don't try to pick the lady off the floor. Even unintentionally, it could cause the lady to lose her balance.

13. Right & Left Grand - If you like to do a kick at the start of a Right & Left Grand, remember this is dancing, not football. Keep the kick low and toe pointed down.

A GOOD DANCER IS A SMOOTH DANCER - These styling hints are designed to make you look better and make your dancing more comfortable and therefore more enjoyable. Happy Dancing!

Measure your skirt length and add 3", now divide by 3 and this is how big your squares will be. Sew a strip of 10 squares, taking a $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam; one strip of 20 squares; and one strip of 40 squares. Sew two rows of machine basting along the top of each strip for gathering. Starting with the bottom row (40 squares), gather to second row (20 squares), and then the second row to the top row (10 squares). In gathering, you will gather up 2 squares to fit under 1 square on the row above.

Gather the top row to fit a skirt waistband or the waistband on the bodice of your dress. Insert a zipper and add a shirt tail hem.

CALLERLAB Basic List has moved the Zoom Family into 'an earlier teaching position' during a newer dancer class. This will allow the dancers to become familiar with these calls before completion of the Basic Program. Even though my experience has been that the dancers have little trouble with either of these calls immediately following the definition, the new placement may encourage more use of the calls. My method is to let the trailers know they have the important part in assuring success of these calls because they are the only dancers who positively know 'who must do what' in order to achieve the proper ending formation. Additionally, Zoom is another good call to stress proper hand touching both before and after executing the call.

Heads Star Thru, Zoom, Zoom again, Square Thru 3/4, AL, Do Sa Do at home.
