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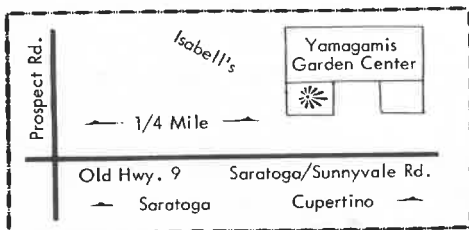


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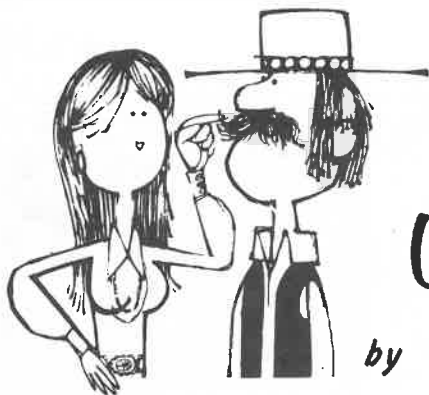
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"OUR" OPINION !

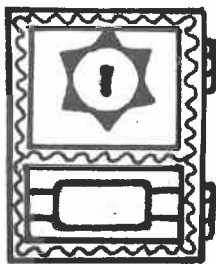

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Fashionable Thoughts by Martibet



LOVE KNOT SHRUG

It's hard to believe that next month's issue will mark our Second Anniversary. The past two years have been an enjoyable and a rewarding experience, as well as some hard work.

We wanted to make "something special" for this momentous occasion. We decided upon a closely crocheted shrug to keep you warm on those cool fall evenings which are fast approaching. Our "something special" can be made up in plenty of time for gift giving, or for that special Holiday Hoedown. It can be made up in a color to match your primary color scheme, or to accentuate a minor color within your attire for the evening.

MATERIALS

Knitting Worsted (Weight - 18 oz.) and Size K crochet hook.

BASE

ROW 1: Chain 77, turn, sc in 2nd stitch from hook. Single crochet across row (76 sts).

ROW 2: Single crochet across row, ch 1, turn.

ROW 3: Repeat row 2 until there are 65 rows of single crochet, then join with a sl st in first ch st of ch 77, forming armhole. Chain 1, turn.

1ST SLEEVE

ROW 1: Single crochet around armhole so there are 65 sts for sleeve, chain 1, turn to back side.

ROW 2: Single crochet around from inside, chain 1, turn to right side.

ROW 3: Single crochet around from right side, chain 1, turn to back side.

ROW 4: Continue rows 2 & 3 until there are a total of 10 rows of single crochet.

ROW 11: Work Love Knot stitch in every third stitch around armhole.

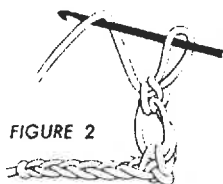
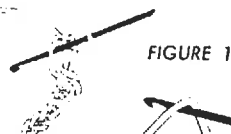
LOVE KNOT STITCH

STEP 1: Sc in 2nd st of last row.

STEP 2: Draw loop on hook to measure 1 inch (or length desired).

STEP 3: Thread over and draw through loop on hook, insert hook between the 1 inch loop and the single strand behind it (Fig. 1) and draw a loop through (2 loops on hook); thread over and draw through the 2 loops on hook. This completes a knot stitch.

STEP 4: Repeat Step 2 (Fig. 2).



STEP 5: Repeat Step 3. This completes two knot sts.

STEP 6: Skip next 2 sts on previous row and make an sc in next st. One knot-st loop made.

STEP 7: Repeat Steps 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 to end of row.

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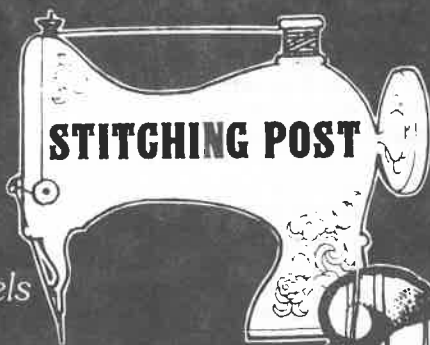
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Stir The Bucket With Betty

Many of our readers have requested that we share more Spanish style cuisine favorites. The following recipes will allow you to enjoy spicy flavors while adjusting the amount of "hotness" to suit your taste.

Appetizer: TOMATO SALSA DIP

2 large cans stewed tomatoes
1 medium onion, chopped finely
1 can green chili peppers,
chopped
salt to taste
Tostados (chips)

Drain tomatoes and chop. Add onions and peppers. * Degree of hotness is determined by the amount of onion used -- Not Peppers. Salt to taste, and serve with tostados.

Main Course: JUBILEE JACK

2 tbsp. butter
1 medium onion finely chopped
1 can (8 oz.) tomato sauce
1 can (4 oz.) green chili peppers, chopped
 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. salt
2 eggs, slightly beaten
1 cup half and half cream
8 tortillas, preferably corn
 $\frac{1}{3}$ cup oil
 $\frac{3}{4}$ lb. Jack cheese, shredded
1 cup sour cream
 $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. Cheddar cheese, shredded

Heat butter in skillet and saute onion until transparent. Add tomato sauce, chili peppers and salt. Simmer 5 minutes; remove from heat. Combine eggs and cream -- blend into tomato/chili pepper sauce. Cut tortillas into wedges.

Fry tortilla wedges, a few at a time, in oil until crisp. Drain. Place half of the wedges at the bottom of a 2 quart casserole. Add half of the Jack cheese and half of the sauce in layers. Repeat. Top with sour cream. Sprinkle with Cheddar cheese. Bake at 350° F. until bubbly.

Vegetable: PISTO A LA BILBAINA (Fried Vegetables)

2 lbs. summer squash, peeled and chopped
2 lbs. ripe tomatoes, peeled, chopped and seeded
2 lbs. green peppers, seeded and chopped
1 lb. onion, chopped
2 tbsp. parsley, chopped
1 clove garlic, minced
 $\frac{1}{4}$ cup olive oil
salt
1 tsp. sugar
2 eggs
4 slices French bread, buttered

Heat oil in large casserole over low heat. Slowly cook onion, garlic and parsley. Add green peppers when onion begins to brown. Cover and simmer for 10 minutes. Stir in squash and tomatoes; add salt to taste. Simmer about 20 minutes or until squash is tender. Scramble eggs into mixture. Toast slices of buttered French bread in oven until browned. Place on top of casserole and serve.

★ CORNER

The PACE Spectacular will be on April 2, 3, 4, 1982 with Dave Hodson, Lee Kopman, and Johnny Preston.

We were approached recently by a dancer at one of our out of town dances and asked how soon one should go into Advanced or Challenge dancing. We had an opportunity to observe this dancer during the evening, and he and his partner did quite well considering the level of the dance. A little struggle here and there was noted, however. Between tips we were told by this dancer that he and his partner had just gotten out of a beginners class which began last September. We gave them even more credit for their ability, but did tell them that we thought it was too soon to consider Advanced. We suggested that they stay in the Plus levels for at least one or two years before attempting a more difficult level.

As Advanced and Challenge dancing have become more popular in the last couple of years, we think too many dancers are now trying to charge through the Plus levels and go into the levels above.

We guess it is a part of all of us to try to be the "best" or highest level or whatever, but many times we kill our enjoyment of square dancing by trying to get there too fast. We then end up becoming part of the large number of drop-outs that have tried the same thing.

For those of you who read this column and are dancing the Plus or QS levels, we are not thinking we are "better" than you because we dance Advanced or Challenge. We just put more time into dancing than maybe you have, or are willing to devote to it. Also, a good measure of ability to learn and remember new calls by their definitions is necessary to be successful at these levels. We have discussed learning calls by definition in past issues.

Advanced and Challenge dancing requires that you become mobile dancers. That is to say that you will develop an attitude of going to dances or callers where you will get what you are looking for. This is sometimes painful. You may face leaving friends or clubs who do not want to seek out these higher levels or do not have the time to devote to them. This problem can and does come up when trying to move up from any level such as Beginner to QS to Plus.

A great deal of self evaluation also should be considered before trying to move on up. One must consider the degree of difficulty that the club you now belong to is dancing. We all know that different degrees of difficulty can be encountered at any level -- all of the levels can be called easy or hard. For instance, if you are now dancing in a Plus club, how hard is that Plus being called? If you have no APD experience at all, you will have to learn that along with the new figures. Maybe that will make it more difficult than you can or wish to handle. How well do you feel you are dancing now at your club? Do you feel that you are the best dancer in the club, or do you rate a number of couples above you in ability? Will you have to go somewhere else to prepare yourself

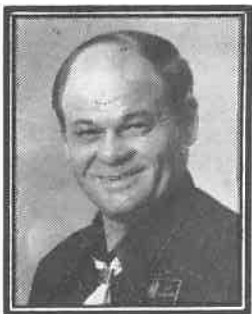


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Was That Really MAINSTREAM??

CROSS TRAIL THROUGH
CALLERLAB Basic #29

Definition:

(CALLERLAB #29) Starting formation: Facing couples. Dancers Pass Thru. The right-hand dancer crosses in front of partner to the left while the left-hand dancer crosses behind partner to the right. The ending position of the dancers is dependent upon the next call.

(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #25 and #700 -- it does not replace Burleson #448, Cross Trail.)

Observations:

Unfortunately, Cross Trail Thru is usually poorly executed on most Mainstream floors due to: (1) The left-hand dancer (usually a man) failing to 'yield the right-of-way' to the right-hand dancer (usually a lady); (2) The right-hand dancer wanting to pass right shoulders with the left-hand dancer; (3) Callers not using or calling Cross Trail Thru from any formation except lines facing in; (4) The move being usually (too frequently) the last call before an Allemande Left; and (5) Callers not calling the command often enough for the dancers to remember and properly execute the call. Cross Trail Through is a very useful call to stress control of the dancers' positioning and forward momentum, and can also be used to reinforce

another infrequently used call -- Standard Half Sashay (CALLERLAB #12 in our new lists -- See The Prompter issue of December 1980) Mainstream call that can be used to stress the "left shoulder passing rule".

Teaching Tips:

Dancers seem to have little difficulty with Cross Trail Thru as long as two points are stressed during the first instruction (1) The left-hand dancer ALWAYS lets the right-hand dancer cross in front of him/her; and (2) The right-hand dancer MUST ALWAYS pass left shoulders with the left-hand dancer. Regarding the "left shoulder passing rule", my own preference is to tell the dancers that any time they hear the word "Cross" or the word "Trail", there will be a passing situation involving the left shoulders; and only very rarely will the dancers be directed to pass left shoulders at any other time. Additionally, it is recommended that: (A) Cross Trail Through be frequently called; (B) It be called frequently from formations other than only lines facing in; and (C) It be called and used as a move to stress control of dancer positioning and forward body momentum. This 'controlled positioning' aspect can be achieved through frequent use of Cross Trail Through from same-sex couples and half-sashayed couples. Under all circumstances, the 'rules' for this call should be reinforced (and re-taught if necessary) at frequent intervals.

Teaching (Initially)

Heads Right and Left Thru, Same 2 Cross Trail Thru, Allemande Left, Do Sa Do at home.

Heads Lead Right, Circle to a Line, Right and Left Thru, Cross Trail Thru, Allemande Left, Promenade.

Heads Cross Trail Thru, Separate Around 1 to a Line, Cross Trail Thru, Swing Partner, Promenade.

Heads Square Thru, Right and Left Thru, Cross Trail Thru, Right and Left Grand, Promenade.

Heads Pass Thru, Separate Around 1 to a Line, Cross Trail Thru, Swing (original) Partner, Promenade.

Heads Cross Trail Thru, Separate Around 2 to a Line, Pass Thru, Bend the Line, Cross Trail Thru, Swing (original) Partner, Promenade.

4 Ladies Chain, Sides Half Sashay, Heads Square Thru, All Cross Trail Thru, Swing (original) Partner, Promenade.

4 Couples Half Sashay, Heads Lead Right, Circle to a Line, Cross Trail Thru, U Turn Back, Cross Trail Thru, Swing (original) Partner, Promenade.

4 Ladies Chain, Heads Rollaway, All Circle Left, 4 Men (Ladies) Forward and Back, 4 Men (Ladies) Cross Trail Thru, Swing (original) Partner, Promenade.

Heads Rollaway, All Circle Left, 4 Men (Ladies) Forward and Back, 4 Men (Ladies) Square Thru, All Cross Trail Thru, U Turn Back, Cross Trail Thru, U Turn Back, Swing (original) Partner, Promenade.

Reinforcement (Mainstream Level)

Heads Square Thru, Cross Trail Thru, Trade By, Cross Trail Thru, Trade By, Allemande Left, Promenade.

Heads Star Thru, Cross Trail Thru, Touch $\frac{1}{4}$, Swing Thru, Men Run, Pass Thru, U Turn Back, Cross Trail Thru, Right and Left Grand, Promenade.

Heads Cross Trail Thru, Separate Around 2 to a Line, Star Thru, Centers Cross Trail Thru, All Cross Trail Thru, Trade By, Touch $\frac{1}{4}$, Scootback, Swing Thru, Men Run, Cross Trail Thru, Pass One Person, Allemande Left, Promenade.

Heads Half Sashay, Same 2 Square Thru, Cross Trail Thru, Trade By, Swing Thru, Centers Run, Tag the Line-In, Star Thru, Centers Cross Trail Thru, Centers In Cast Off $\frac{3}{4}$, Pass Thru, Wheel and Deal, Zoom, Star Thru, Cross Trail Thru, Allemande Left, Promenade.

From The Dance Store

The Fall Season always brings lots of new clothing to the stores, and the square dance manufacturers are putting out many "almost one of a kind" print skirts, an easy way for beginners to get started on their square dance wardrobe. Also, you'll see many of the favorite dress styles back in the stores, but they'll be in new fabrics and colors.

We have another book out covering the Mainstream Basics. It's by Ralph Trout and he presents the basics in a very thorough, step-by-step manner using symbols, direction arrows, and color coded dancers; making them very easy to follow. It's a 53 page, 8½ x 11, spiral bound book and sells for approximately \$8.00.

There are two big records this month. "Elvira" by Elmer Sheffield on Red Boot (1262) with a very different beat. The dancers get with it, but they are really intent on listening to the song itself. And

the second record is "For What I Been Thinking Bout Ya" by Gary Shoemake, another floor raiser, by Chaparral (310) Blue Star label seems to be picking up in popularity in this area (always has been popular in other areas of the country)... last month they came out with "Old Lump of Coal" (2136) and this month they have "I Was Country When Country Wasn't Cool" (1242) by Johnny Wykoff. Another good record this month is "The Way I Am" by Bronc Wise on Hi Hat (5033) plus thirty three other releases, some of which will be just right for you for dancing or for calling, so get to your record store and LISTEN!

Again, our sincere appreciation for your efforts on behalf of the 30th National Square Dance Con-

vention and we encourage the same support to future Conventions.

The 30th National Square Dance Convention registered in excess of twenty-seven thousand dancers. Cancellation requests, however, have taken their toll and the Convention goes on record with an official registration total of 24,379.

The following are registration totals which may be of interest:

There were 2,946 at-the-door registrations. Unbelievably, this included dancers from all States with the exception of Alabama and West Virginia. Here are some additional statistics obtained from the

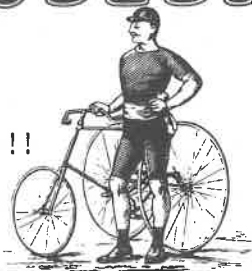
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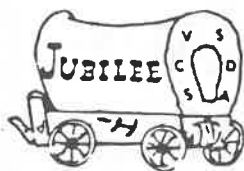
registration forms: 10,275 persons indicated they had attended previous National Conventions, and 697 indicated a desire to be programmed in some phase of the Convention. There were 1,164 requests for RV space and/or information, and 5,051 requests for housing. Seven hundred thirty-seven Cookbooks and 8,645 Program Books were ordered. Two hundred seventy-seven persons completed Register-A-Friend registration forms which were mailed with confirmations. Totals include 1,207 Teen and Pre-Teen dancers, and 2,590 Solo dancers.

The number of dancers participating in the Seattle attempt to stage the "World's Largest Square Dance" (the greatest number of dancers, dancing to one caller, in one place at the same time) is estimated by various means to exceed 18,000.

A verification count, to be submitted to Guinness Superlatives Limited for entry in the Guinness Book of Records, is being accomplished by Staff Sergeant Yeatnan, a member of the Photo Imagery Section of the 109th Military Intelligence Battalion, a unit of the US Army 9th Infantry Division presently stationed at Fort Lewis, WA.

To commemorate this occasion, we'll have special silver year bars available at our booth during the Jubilee Weekend. If you don't have your Jubilee badge, be sure to get one this year!

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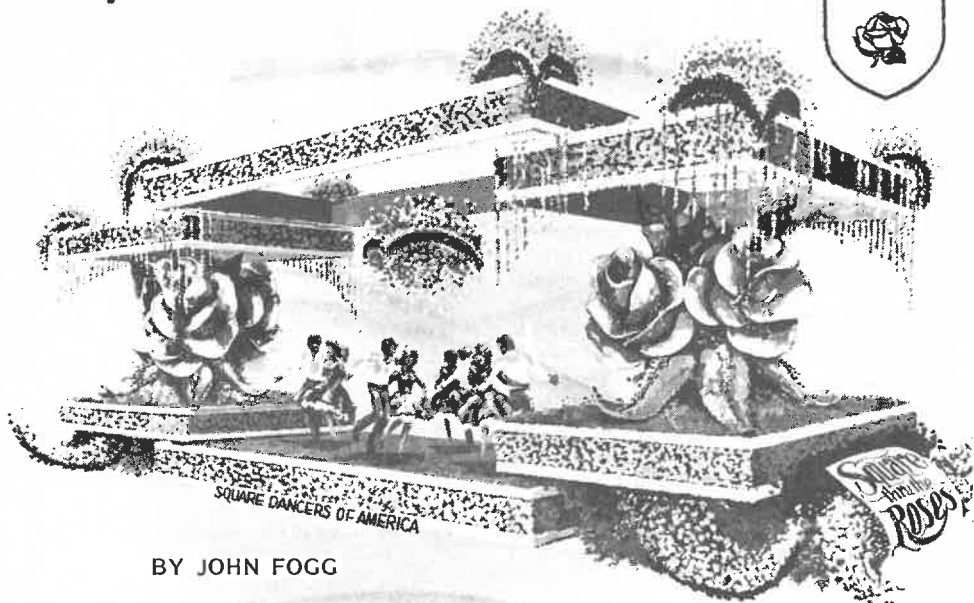

Our booth at the National Square Dance Convention in Seattle was in a very good location, right next to the Detroit Convention pre-registration booth.

Friday evening, as in past conventions, we held an information panel. Over 150 dancers were in attendance to view slides of the float construction. Pardon My RED FACE !

A recent happening in our club (the Peppy Steppers) brought into sharp focus a common human failing peculiar to group activities.

In casting about for a fund raiser for the Jerry Lewis Muscular Dystrophy drive, the idea of an all night roller-skating Square Dancing party was conceived. This was the brain child of our caller, Johnny Robertson, who had envisioned it for quite some time. It was discussed at length by a small faction of the club, and after a while it was presented to the full club for their approval, blessings and support.

The idea seemed to have some merit, but practicality tended to indicate that at best it was a zany idea that might appeal to the kids -- but not many others. The very thought of staying up all night seemed impossible, if not downright idiotic. Most square dancers (of my acquaintance) are ready for bed after a two or three hour session of dancing, and to top it off, the great majority of our club had not roller skated in decades. Here we were being asked to believe that somehow we would have loads of fun in combining the two activities.

Also, we were being asked to help cook and serve a full breakfast to perhaps hundreds of people at a hour so unspeakable that not even the birds were chirping. To add to the impossibility of the situation -- the Aloha Skating Rink (on Blossom Hill Road near Snell) does not have cooking facilities!!! We would actually have to set up our tables and stoves in the parking lot, cook the food camp style, and then haul it indoors where it could be served. The proposers of

this outrageous plot made it sound as though this were an everyday occurrence in their neighborhoods. Didn't everyone cook outdoors at 4:30 a.m. in a local parking lot? I didn't dare to admit that I'd never done it.

All in all the whole concept reeked of ruin and ridicule, and I frankly admit I made almost no effort at all to sell my ten tickets, nor did I, as club President, entreat others to sell theirs. There were relatively few tickets sold. At 11:30 p.m. a few devotees of lost causes began to gather for the last rites.

Something about the music, the spaciousness, the people of the skating rink, or perhaps it was the bright lights, quickly dispelled the clouds of doom and despair -- I found myself rushing to get my skates on -- completely surrounded by my fellow club members! Soon we were all out on the floor skating as though it were some long lost ecstasy rejoined. Before long our caller called, "Get yer gal," and the Jokers and the Peppy Steppers were squaring up on skates. Square Dancing on skates has to be about the funniest activity known to man. The hilarity is indescribable. Doing the Right and Left Grand and the Weave the Ring wasn't bad, but the "Up to the Middle and Back" was a complete catastrophe on wheels. I have never laughed so hard in my life.

A plywood jail was set up by the Aloha Rink, and Clyde Cook was asked to be the sheriff. The enthusiasm and dedication with which Clyde performed his duties was clear and conclusive evidence that in a past life he must have been a "peace officer" in a Wild West border town. As a ruthless uphold-

er of the law he was indeed ruthless -- and the law stated that you donated to the M.D.A. Fund or you cooled your heels in the Pokey for three minutes. Also you could pay the Sheriff "two bits" and he would joyfully jail any of your friends(?) that you designated. At twenty-five cents per arrest, Clyde collected exactly thirty-five dollars -- or 140 arrests were made by a man on skates who hadn't skated in years!

Breakfast was served at around 5:00 a.m. and it was delicious. After breakfast, the whole place was cleaned up in less than thirty minutes.

The really amazing thing about the whole event was that no one got the least bit sleepy during the whole night -- not until after breakfast did anyone express tiredness. The joy and excitement of the affair kept everyone wide awake. It was one of the most enjoyable nights I've ever experienced.

Which brings us back to the

beginning. Most of us wondered how much better things would have been if we had really gotten behind the idea. What had originally promised to be a complete flop had generated almost eight hundred dollars for Jerry's Kids and we had hardly moved a muscle. One man, Mike Berry, was almost entirely responsible for the success achieved.

Had we all gotten behind Mike I'm sure we could have at least doubled the revenue. You may be sure that come the next skating Square Dance party we will all be much more enthusiastic. But that is not really the point. A great many people in any organization go along for the ride while letting someone else do the dirty work. There is even a small faction that will quite often actively work against the common goal. A relatively small nucleus of people seems to have the vision, foresight, and vitality to get up and make things go right. The rest of us have the duty to help them.

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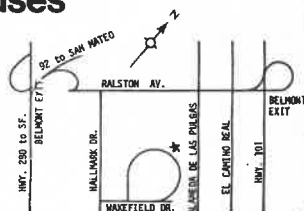
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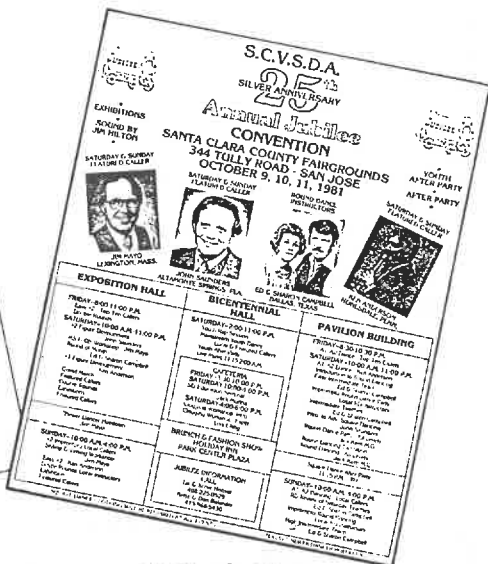
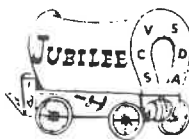

the Dancin' Dandies?). The Sunday evening program may be confusing to some "newer" dancers (those who've only been dancing 15 years or so). "Little Red Hen" wasn't a singing call -- in those days "patter" as we know it today didn't exist; each dance was written out and given a name, and it wasn't unusual for the dancers to know "Little Red Hen" or "K-5 Special" as well as the caller knew it.

Note also, that the Secretary of the SCVSDA was Clara Boe who (Continued on next page)

danced with the Rafter Rockers. Today, Clara is a Director of the SCVSDA and is still dancing with the Rafter Rockers.

There are no records to indicate the attendance at the first Jubilee, but the dance must have been a success because on Sunday, October 19, 1958, the Association proudly held their "Second Annual Jubilee", again at the Fairgrounds. The list of callers was about the same, with the addition of a new caller named Bill Davis.

In 1959, the Jubilee stayed at the Fairgrounds, but moved to Saturday, October 17. There were several additions to the program that year. A beginners round dance class was scheduled from 10:00 a.m. to noon, a Saturday night newer dancer hoedown was held at the K-5 barn, and the first fashion show was held -- at 9:00 p.m. on Saturday night in the main hall. The narrator was Jeanne Fisher. Two other new names appeared in the program: Bob Van Antwerp and Bill Peters.

By 1960, that "good floor" at the Fairgrounds wasn't viewed quite so favorably any longer, and the 4th Annual Jubilee was held at the Hawaiian Gardens on Almaden Road. The fashion show also moved to 6 00 p.m. Saturday evening and became a "dinner and fashion show". For the first time, the square dances were not listed by name, and a new type of calling made its first appearance -- "Hot Hash". During 1960, the area dancers had the opportunity to vote for their favorite caller when a ballot was run in Square Dance News, and the Jubilee Program that year used the term "featured callers" for the first time. Other firsts in 1960: Discussion groups and panels, and the addition of Ed Sanders to the list of area callers.

1961 marked the return to the Fairgrounds and the first two day Jubilee (Saturday and Sunday, October 6th and 7th). In his President's Message in the program, Bob Rader explained why: "...Previous to this we have had a one day affair. This year, however, in

preparation for our hosting of the 1962 State Convention in San Jose, we are trying on for size a Jubilee that will last for two days along with a new Pavilion Building that offers the ultimate in dancing pleasure..." There were two new names on the 1961 program: caller Brad Bradford and an exhibition group (a first at the Jubilee) called "The Jokers Olympic Team ???"

The two day program must have been a success as that format was followed for the next five years. 1962 saw the first teen dance at a Jubilee, on Saturday from 5 to 7:00 p.m. The program doesn't mention a fashion show, but the weekend admission price of \$2.50 per person included a pancake breakfast on Sunday morning. New names in 1962 were Ken Trimpey and "Ken" Steen.

In 1963 the SCVSDA sponsored the "Lucky 7 Jubilee" with the band (yes, they still featured live music) and committee members to be dressed as gamblers". The breakfast was repeated and the fashion show returned, moving from Saturday night to the Sunday morning breakfast, where it has stayed ever since. For the first time, there was a single featured caller" -- Buzz Brown called the Saturday afternoon dance. Also, a new exhibition group made their first appearance -- the Jubilaires, under the direction of Joel Kadish. (You can watch the Jubilaires at this year's Jubilee, in case you missed them in 1963!) Total attendance at the 7th Annual Jubilee: 866.

By 1964 disenchantment with the Fairgrounds had set in again: the 8th Jubilee was held at the San Jose Civic Auditorium and McCabe Hall. To encourage attendance, free babysitting was offered at the dance. 1964 was to be the last year of live music for square dancing at the Jubilee. There were no featured callers that year. The program invited you to dance to "Top Callers from 6 Northern Square Dance Associations".

It was back to the Fairgrounds and back to featured callers in

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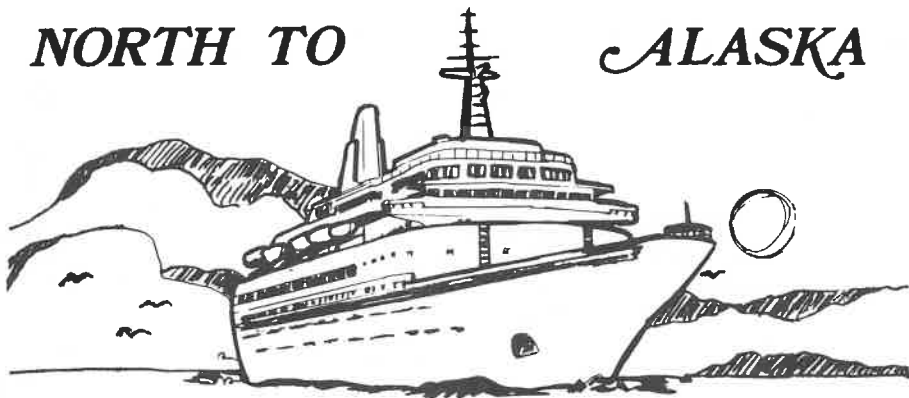

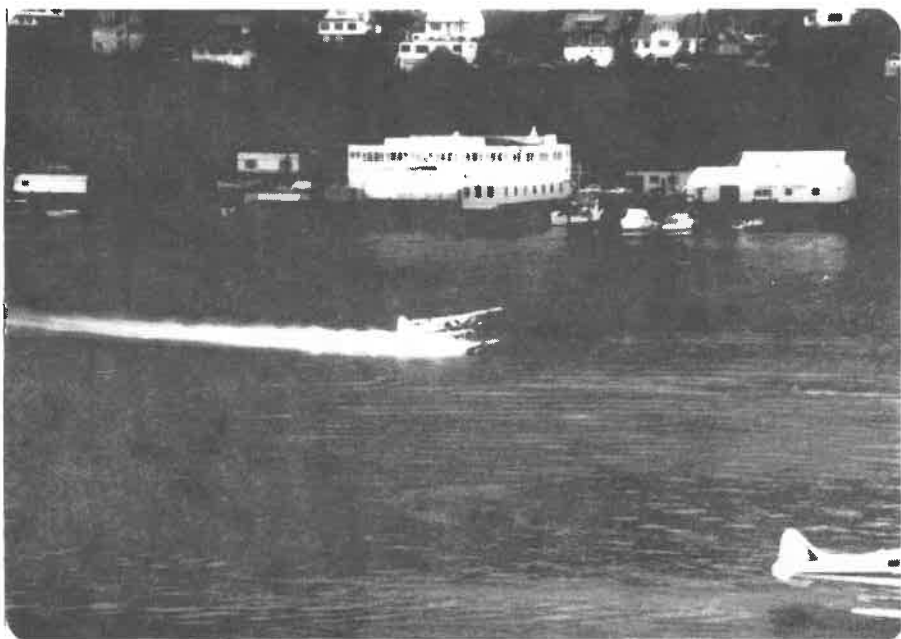

Dessert: **APPLE CUSTARD
MERINGUE**

6 to 8 apples, cored, peeled,
and chopped

6 to 8 tsp. granulated sugar

4 eggs

1 tbsp. butter, melted

2 tbsp. cornstarch

2 cups milk

2 to 4 tsp. powdered sugar

Stewed apples:

Cover apples with water. Add 1
tsp. of granulated sugar for each
apple used and cook until tender,
about 10 minutes. Set aside.

Custard Cream:

Separate egg yolk and whites.
Save both. Mix yolks with butter
and cornstarch. Gradually stir milk
into egg yolk mixture. Pour into a
double boiler and stir until it boils
and thickens.

Meringue:

Combine egg whites with 1 tsp. of
powdered sugar and beat on high
speed with electric mixer. Continue
to add powdered sugar until stiff
peaks are formed. Place stewed
apples in pyrex pie pan and top
with custard, then meringue. Bake
in hot oven until egg whites
(meringue) brown.

1965. Both have been a permanent
part of the Jubilee ever since.
Jerry denBroeder made his first
appearance on the list of area call-
ers.

1966 was the first three day
Jubilee and a covered wagon made
its first appearance on the program
book. Only minor changes have
occurred since 1966: in 1969 the
current covered wagon drawing
became a permanent part of the
Jubilee decor, 1974 was the first
year for a separate youth hall, and
1976 saw the introduction of the
Top Ten Callers on Friday night.

As the current SCVSDA Jubilee
committee makes its final arrange-
ments for the 1981 Silver Anniver-
sary Jubilee, October 9-11 at the
Fairgrounds, they can look back on
24 years of "good floors, good
sound, good callers, and good
dancers". They can also draw on 24
years of experience in presenting
one of the best organized festivals
in the country. Even this year's
callers have Jubilee experience!
Jim Mayo was a featured caller in
1968 and Ken Anderson was fea-

for the move to the higher level? A workshop? Another club that you feel dances at a greater degree of difficulty?

Hard questions to ask and answer honestly, aren't they? Nonetheless, they should be asked and answered if you really are asking yourself, "Am I ready to move up now to the next level?" If you can and do answer them, are you ready to take those actions required by the answers? Are you ready to

make the sacrifices that will be required of you to achieve your goal? Many of us want to reach the goal without doing the work that will get us there. When we take this attitude, we usually don't make it. This applies to all levels. We see many dancers in Advanced who aren't doing that well who are suddenly ready for Challenge. Without a solid base, we won't do any better at the next level that we did at the last.

STEP 8: Sl st to top of love knot at beginning of previous row.

STEP 9: Working over next knot-st loop, insert hook between loop and single strand of first knot st (A on Fig. 3) and make an sc, now sc between loop and single strand of second knot st (B on Fig.3).

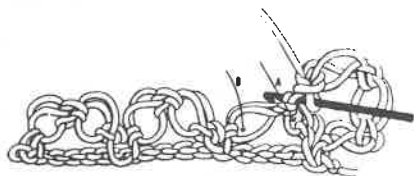

STEP 10: Make 2 knot sts, then repeat Step 9.

STEP 11: Repeat Step 10 to end of row.

STEP 12: Repeat Steps 8 through 10 for a total of 6 rows.

SECOND SLEEVE

Fold base in half and join to form second armhole. Repeat rows 1 through 4 of 1ST SLEEVE for second sleeve. Then work Love Knot stitch for 6 rows.

COLLAR

ROW 1: Join yarn at base of large opening. Chain 1, single crochet around so there are 155 single crochet, join with a sl st, chain 1, turn to back side.

ROW 2: Single crochet around from inside, chain 1, turn to right side.

ROW 3: Single crochet around from right side, chain 1, turn to back side.

ROW 4: Continue rows 2 & 3, increasing 1 sc every 15th stitch until there are a total of 10 rows.

ROW 11: Work Love Knot stitch, same as for sleeves, until there are 6 rows of Love Knot stitch.

When you've finished, stand back and admire your new shrug. Everyone else will!

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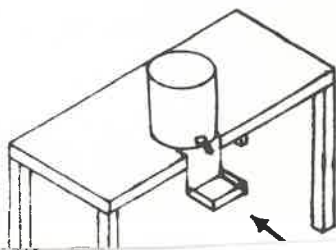
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
