You might be called on to help with the refreshments, to help set up and take down equipment or maybe to fill in a square that needs a couple. I'm sure there are other ideas you may have also. How about writing in and sharing them with the dancers in the area??

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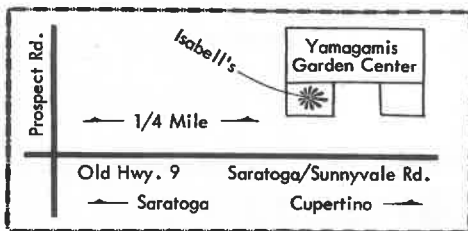
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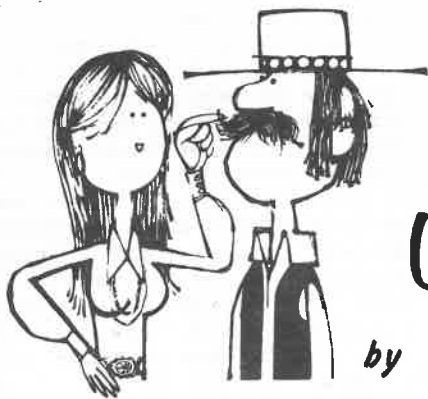
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"OUR" OPINION !

Dear Ginger,

This is one solution to the puzzle that was in the January issue.

1. Only one combination of dancers will satisfy the 10 statements of the problem; giving the dancers in each of the two squares. They are: Square A - Al, Ed, Don, George, Betty, Clara, Helen and Flo. Square B - Bert, Chuck, Hal, Fred, Alice, Ethel, Dotty and Greta. Also statement numbers 7, 8 and 9 give some of their positions.

2. From Number 7: Alice cannot be #4 Lady. From Numbers 5 and 9: Neither she nor Clara can be #2 Ladies, therefore, Alice and Clara must be either #1 or #3 Ladies.

3. In Square A - Ed is either #3 or #4 Man and George is the other. If we let Ed be #3 Man (George #4), from Number 6: Flo is his partner and Ethel is #3 Lady in Square B. From Statement 2 (above): Alice would be #1 Lady in B and Clara #1 in A; leaving Betty to be #4 Lady. But George is #4 Man and from Number 10 they cannot be partners. Therefore, Ed must not be #3 man, but #4 -- and George #3.

4. From Number 6: Flo and Ethel are #4 Ladies. From Number 10: Clara is George's partner. In Square B, Alice would then be #3 Lady and from Number 8: The other Side Lady is Greta, #2. This leaves Dotty to be #1 Lady in B. From Number 5: Fred cannot be #4 Man (Alice is #3 Lady), but is #2 Man. This leaves Chuck to be #4 Man and his Right-Hand Lady is Dotty, in #1 position.

There are other ways to reach the same answer and they are just as good as the above.

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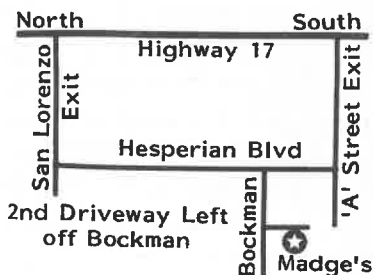
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Was That Really MAINSTREAM??

FERRIS WHEEL
CALLERLAB Basic #48

Definition:

(CALLERLAB #48) Starting formation: Two parallel, two-faced lines. The couples facing out wheel and deal to become the outside couples in a double pass thru formation. Meanwhile the couples facing in step straight forward to momentarily form a two-faced line in the center. Without stopping they wheel and deal in that line to end as the center couples in a double pass thru formation.

(CALLERS NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #1912.)

Observations:

Ferris Wheel is the most frequently used command to convert parallel two-faced lines into a (starting) double pass thru

formation, and is usually executed extremely well from parallel, right-facing two-faced lines regardless of the actual boy-girl partner pairing arrangement -- it makes very little difference how the sexes of the dancers are arranged in their couple. From left-facing parallel two-faced lines, some minor hesitation usually occurs during execution due to the obvious 'leftie' requirements. This hesitation is due to infrequent dancer exposure to Ferris Wheel from this formation, and not due to the complexity of the call itself. Additionally, the combination 'Ferris Wheel, Pass Thru' creates a smooth, forward-flowing alternative to the more abrupt 'Wheel & Deal' from parallel two-faced lines -- this combination is very frequently used, and some very accomplished dancers will actually execute a Ferris Wheel when a Wheel & Deal is called from these formations.

Teaching Tips:

Dancers seem to have no difficulty with the execution of Ferris Wheel immediately following the definition. Frequent use of Ferris Wheel from left-facing parallel two-faced lines is recommended to reduce dancer hesitation in the execution of the call from this formation. The real problem created by teaching Ferris Wheel is the obvious similarity to Wheel & Deal (both in sound of the call and in the moves required by the call). Even though Ferris Wheel is taught later than Wheel & Deal, the 'instant acceptance' of Ferris

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Wheel seems to reduce some of the proficiency already gained in the execution of Wheel & Deal. To attempt to alleviate this problem, my preference is to use Wheel & Deal frequently from both parallel two-faced lines and tidal two-faced lines (Ferris Wheel is not possible from tidal formations). If necessary, the teaching of Ferris Wheel should be delayed until the dancers are 'thoroughly accomplished' in their execution of Wheel & Deal.

TEACHING MATERIAL

Heads Square Thru, Swing Thru, Boys Run, Ferris Wheel, Pass Thru, Allemande Left, Do Sa Do at home.

Heads Lead Right, Veer Left, Ferris Wheel, Right & Left Thru, Zoom, Star Thru... Same 2 Ladies Chain (home).

Heads Star Thru, Pass Thru, Veer Right, Ferris Wheel, Zoom, Square Thru 3/4, AL, Promenade.

Heads Square Thru, Touch 1/4, Swing Thru, Centers Run, Ferris Wheel, Girls Pass Thru, Star Thru, Ferris Wheel, Pass Thru, Swing Thru, Girls Trade, Boys Run, Ferris Wheel, Pass Thru, AL, Do Sa Do at home.

Heads Star Thru, Pass Thru, Veer Right, Ferris Wheel, Pass Thru, Touch 1/4, Swing Thru, Centers Run, Couples Circulate, Ferris Wheel, Pass Thru, Star Thru, Ferris Wheel, Pass Thru, Star Thru, Flutterwheel, Pass Thru, AL, Promenade.

Heads Square Thru, Touch 1/4, Centers Run, Ferris Wheel, Pass Thru, Veer Right, Ferris Wheel, Pass Thru, Swing Thru, Boys Run, Star Thru, AL, Promenade.

Heads Lead Right, Veer Left, Wheel & Deal, Star Thru, Veer Left, Wheel & Deal, Pass Thru, Wheel & Deal, Pass Thru, Veer Right, Ferris Wheel, All Half Sashay, Pass Thru, Right & Left Grand, Promenade.

Heads Veer Right, Wheel & Deal, Square Thru, Touch 1/4, Centers Run, Ferris Wheel, Pass Thru, Veer Right, Ferris Wheel, Pass Thru, Swing Thru, Boys Run, Veer Right, Wheel & Deal, Star Thru, Pass Thru, Trade By, AL, Promenade.

If you're the class representative for your club and are required to attend every class night anyway, come by and pick up your badge! Stir The Bucket With Betty

TOMATO SOUP

- 2 cups peeled, diced tomatoes
- 3 Tbsp. butter
- 2 Tbsp. flour
- 1 tsp. salt
- dash of pepper to taste
- 1/4 tsp. soda
- 1 cup half & half
- 1/2 cup dry wine or undiluted chicken broth

Simmer tomatoes in butter for 5 minutes. Puree in blender. Add to blender: flour, salt and pepper. Blend. Pour into saucepan and bring to a boil. Reduce heat and cook for 2 or 3 minutes; stirring constantly. Add soda and half & half. Cook over low heat until thickened slightly. Stir in wine or broth and heat to simmering.

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Fashionable Thoughts by Martibet



Marti and I are pleased to spotlight Sherry Provenza of the Acey Deuceys and Blossom Hill Cloggers as our "Seamstress With The Mostest" for the month. Sherry is an excellent seamstress technically as well as being very clever with her creations. It's a pleasure to show off one of her favorite creations in our column.

We hope to be able to spotlight the work of a variety of square dancing world tailors and seamstresses over the next few months. Let us know if you or a friend would like to share an idea or two with us.

SQUARE DANCE COAT

Since the weather outside has been quite cold and wet lately, here is something to keep you warm and protect your pretty square dance dresses -- a coat especially made for square dancing. This coat was made out of denim blue kettlecloth, lined to the waist with white synthetic fleece, and Scotchguarded for protection. The bodice of the coat was made from a Vogue Basic Design Pattern (#2765 - no longer available) and a circle skirt was added. Authentic Patterns (#282) has a pattern for a square dance coat with raglan sleeves, but any coat or jacket pattern with a waistline would do.

An added attraction of this coat is a hidden inside pocket, just big enough for keys, a comb, and a little money for the times you don't want to take your purse to a hoedown.



In case you don't have a circle skirt pattern, Marti and I would like to include the following pattern for you to use. Obviously,, you will not need a zipper and hooks & eyes as optionals. Nor will you have to proceed beyond #8 in the steps outlined. You will have to remember to leave, and plan for, a seam at the waist and down the front for at least an 1 1/2" overlap for buttons, snaps, etc.

Use the top of your coat pattern, add the circle skirt and a lining (with pocket, if you like), and you will have a coat which is a pleasure to wear over your square dance dresses.

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CIRCULAR SKIRT

Materials: * 3 yards of 36" or 45" polyester broadcloth or "Sheer Mist" lining. Hook & eye. 7" zipper. Thread.

Select Waist Measurement:

22" = 2 1/2"

24" = 3"

26" = 3 1/2"

28" = 4"

30" = 4 1/2 "

Set compass or string and pencil to second measurement for "waist cut".

1. Fold material (across the material from selvage to selvage) so that it is long enough to include "waist cut" and length of finished skirt plus 1/2" for rolled hem (i.e. $3 \frac{1}{2}" + 21 \frac{1}{2}" + 1/2" = 25 \frac{1}{2}"$).

2. Beginning at selvage/fold corner and using a compass or string/pencil device, mark the waist measurement (i.e. 3 1/2"). Don't cut until after marking bottom cutting line.

3. Beginning at same corner of selvage/fold, measure and mark bottom cutting line (i.e. 25 1/2").

4. Cut at waistline and bottom cutting line (1/2 circle).

5. Follow steps 1 - 4 for the second panel to form full circle.

6. Sew selvages together to form side seams; leaving 7" open at top in one seam for zipper.

7. Staystitch waist and hem edges.

8. Roll hem 1/2" and stitch in place.

9. Measure your waist, add 1" to the length, and cut a piece of material that length and 2 1/2" to 4" wide for your waistband.

10. Prepare waistband and stitch onto skirt.

11. Place hook & eye to fasten.

12. A zipper is optional. If you use one, insert between steps 8 and 9. I really feel it's unnecessary.

* 3 yards is sufficient for a 21 1/2" skirt with a waist measurement from 22" to 28". If your waist is larger than 28", add 1" of material for each inch of waistline.

More on Spin the Windmill In from a squared set. Recent opinions have supported our earlier contention. Most agree that if the command were given as above, and

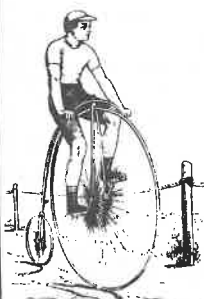

This would then cause the Heads to work with the Heads and the Sides to work with the Sides. The end result would put the number one gent in the number three gents spot at the end of the call.

It was further expressed by some dancers and some callers that most dancers are not into puzzle solving while on the fly at a dance. As was stated "the caller always loses with some dancers". In the above case, it was felt that the caller would lose with most of the dancers because the proper command was not given in the first place. Each to his own opinion, but the large majority of the dancers like to win or at least be told how they lost so they can win the next time. See you in a star tip!

Have you ever wished there were something special to give that Angel that is always working above and beyond the call of duty for the Club's Beginner Class? How about a stained glass angel to hang in a sunny window? We've mentioned Buck Peeler's stained glass square dance figures before, but this angel would be especially nice for that especially nice class angel.

Another gifted square dancer in our area is Doreen Webster who is marketing lovely quilted wallets with the double square symbol on them. They come in a variety of colors and prints, all with pretty lace and braid trims. Perfect gift items -- gifts, heck!! -- I bought one for myself!

The Dance Store has developed two new items. A very stylish quilted jacket (we came out with one last year, but this is the "new improved" model), nice and warm for traveling to and from the dances and also very comfortable for dancing that first cool tip; and, something very different in a patchwork skirt, done in gores instead of tiers, with lots of trim and that slimming firm waistband in front and the elastic and tie in back.

Cloggers, there may be hope for your taps! Since the Selva Tap Company went out of business, we have been scouting around for good clogging taps and will soon have three styles in stock for your inspection.

There are two more Rhythm Records out this month (and there

should be more next month), "I'm Getting Good at Missing You" by Wade Driver (158), and "Dixie on My Mind" by Wade and Pat Barbour (157). Bronc Wise was a big hit in this area at a recent hoedown, so I'm sure his "Shaddup Your Face" on Hi Hat (5040) will be a big hit, too. For you young ones out there (actual or at heart), listen to "That'll Be The Day" by Jeff Nelson on Rebel (107), it's a very danceable rock beat.

There's something for just about everyone this month, as Glenn is producing a Round Dance Teaching Series. So far there are five records in the series covering the various two-steps, from forward and backward, boxes and vines, through turning two-steps and lace ups. They are by Frank and Phyl Lehnert and can be used either alone or along with their "Step Close Step" instruction book. The first band on each side of the record is vocal instruction and the second band puts the exercise to music with Frank cueing it. A whole Round Dance course for you to practice at home, or just choose the record that covers the basic that troubles you. They are another well done dancer help. And we hope to have more "helps" for you next month.

PROMPTER PROFILE

Bronc Wise

Bronc Wise is a young man who in a few short years has become a highly popular square dance caller -- without the help of attending a formalized callers' college.

Bronc started square dancing a short seven years ago in 1974. His parents, Wil and Mavis Wise, were square dancers who had dropped out of dancing a couple of years before. His mother wanted to start dancing again, so Bronc was talked into going to beginners' class with the proviso that if he didn't like it, he wouldn't have to go back. That beginners class was sponsored by the Long Beach (California) Recreation Department and was taught by Bill Hay, an individual who was to become instrumental in helping Bronc to develop his calling talent.

As the class progressed, Bronc began to express an interest in calling. Bill gave him a record so he could practice and call a tip at the "Half Way" class dance. That did it! From that point on Bill encouraged and helped Bronc; Bronc called his first full dance shortly after graduation.

Another individual who has helped Bronc is Dick Houlton. Bronc attended Dick's A.O.S. (Always On Sunday) functions and learned many of his techniques from observing and listening to Dick. Dick also critiqued Bronc's tapes, providing constructive criticism when appropriate. Bronc also credits Ernie Kinney of Hi Hat Records for much help and encouragement.

Bronc graduated from high school in 1976 where he played football and qualified for the Southern California Championships in wrestling. He went on to Long

Beach City College where he continued wrestling and was ranked 9th in the State in the super heavyweight class. He weighed 320 pounds at the time, but is now down to a "svelte" 225 pounds. Bronc says he just stopped eating and the pounds melted away. He is now a kinesiology (muscle movement) major at Cal State Long Beach, where he is a part-time student while a full-time caller.

Bronc's calling duties keep him busy six to seven nights a week. He has 31 squares of A-1 dancers on Mondays, sponsored by the Pioneer 8's. Tuesdays finds him working a C-1 workshop sponsored by the Wise Guys (get it?). Wednesdays and Thursdays he has large beginners' classes sponsored by the Pioneer 8's and the Square 8'ers. Weekends are used either for hoedowns or clubs such as the Square 888 of Long Beach, the Spinning Squares of Whittier, or starting in August, the Whirlaways of Long Beach.

He has made several road trips since he has been calling (mostly doing Advanced calling), but is somewhat restricted from leaving the Long Beach area because of local commitments. He has called at Silver State in Reno, at the Alaska Singles Convention in Anchorage, the Southland Stomp, the A Square D Jamboree, the Sequoia Stomp in Visalia, the Minnesota Advanced and Challenge Weekend (2 years), and has attended six National Conventions. He is booked for three festivals in Oregon and is looking forward to calling at the Bakersfield Fiesta. He is also an accredited member of CALLERLAB.

Bronc is also a recording artist, with several releases on Hi Hat

Records. He has also recorded with C Bar C Records and D & R Records.

Bronc is somewhat of a ham by his own admission. He is an accomplished musician having played in a rock band since he was 11 years old. He has had no formal musical training, but plays the guitar and mandolin with equal ease. He has long been an admirer of Elvis Presley and has several records of Presley's famous songs which he has adapted as singing calls. He has developed an imitation of Elvis which is a "command performance" everywhere he calls.

Looking to the future, Bronc would like to do a little more traveling around the West. He is very satisfied with his current weekly program and feels he is making a good contribution to square dancing in the Long Beach area. He enjoys calling at all levels, and really enjoys working with people and seeing them improve in their dancing. "I'd like to continue what I'm doing, and hope to do it better!"

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CIRCULATIN' WITH THE



The club name "Rafter Rockers" might conjure up several pictures in one's mind. And when one considers the "Circulatin'" club this month, they'd probably all be true. The San Jose Rafter Rockers are coming up on their 27th Anniversary in a few weeks and yet this club has a thread of youth which serves to keep them ever young and fresh.

The Rafter Rockers were formed from a beginners class of a club called the Star Swingers. Jack and Neva Johannes were the callers for

both clubs. The way it worked was that the Star Swingers were kind of an Advanced club and the Rafter Rockers was an "intermediate" club which served as a "feeder" club for the Star Swingers. Graduates of a beginners class danced for least a year with the Rafter Rockers before they were eligible for the Star Swingers. The Star Swingers were a very active group until they disbanded in 1966. They sponsored a hoedown every month and jointly sponsored a teen club with the

Rafter Rockers for a couple of years. Neva Johannes called for the Rafter Rockers for 14 years until her retirement in 1968. Herb Jackson was the caller from 1968 until Bob Tripp took over the calling duties in 1972. When Bob retired in 1980, Ken Kenmille was selected as the club caller and under Ken's direction, the club continues to grow and expand. They currently have 126 members and 8 honorary members.

The Rafter Rockers are a very active club. The night we visited the group they were dancing eight squares with Ken mixing the level from tip to tip to give everyone a challenge. The club has a "special" dance night each month such as "T" Shirt Night, Short Pants Night, Pajama Night, etc. (Maybe I'll go more often! They sponsor three hoedowns a year and have co-sponsored a Halloween Dance with the Surf Twirlers for the past ten years. They also dance at convalescent homes at Christmas time, have family picnics, ice cream socials, river trips, campouts, and sponsor club bus trips to Reno for Silver State. There has been a Rafter Rocker on the board of the Santa Clara Valley Square Dancers Association every year since its inception. Past SCVSDA Presidents, Dot and Charlie Ash, have been Rafter Rockers for 22 years. Current SCVSDA Treasurers, Clara and Werner Boe, have been Rafter Rockers for many years. Several Past Presidents of the club are still active members. Geroge and Edie Spooner were members of the first

Rafter Rockers beginners class and are still active members. Fred and Ada Pulling were also members of that first beginners class and.... after having been out of square dancing for many years, are members of the current Rafter Rockers beginners class.

The Rafter Rockers scrapbook is a joy to behold. Chris and Roberta Baert have maintained a thoroughly chronicled (both in pictures and text) account of Rafter Rocker activities. In addition, the club has a several page monthly newsletter which keeps all members aware of the club's activities. The editors of this impressive tome are Marie Perry and Joan Atkinson.

The club dress was designed for the 1979 Jubilee Fashion Show and Brunch. It has gradually taken over as the club dress and now everyone who joins the club soon shows up with the red barns on the beige background. There have been three different club badges, but the current one was designed by Hortense Ash who also designed and made the club banner.

The Rafter Rockers sponsor a beginners class every year, usually on Tuesday evenings. Jerry denBroeder handles the calling duties for the class. The present beginners class includes six couples who were former members.

The club currently dances on Wednesday evenings at Union School in Los Gatos. Presidents Chuck and Phillis DePalmo invite anyone interested in Rafter Rockin' to join them any Wednesday for an evening of fun.



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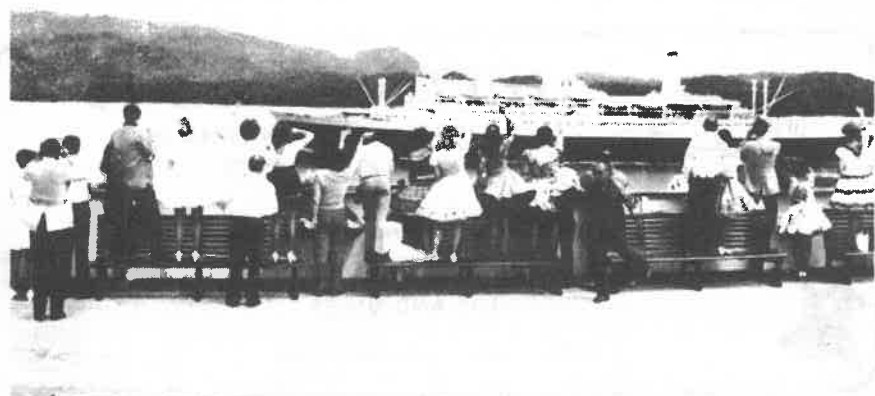

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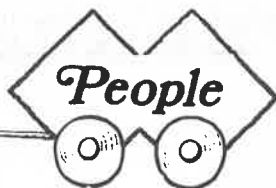

Position Is Everything

As I watch the dancers (that I am cueing to) move around the floor, I see so many who just don't look comfortable. They know the dance and respond easily to the cues, but are not keeping a continuous flow and blending one step to the next.

It is then that I wonder if their instructors cover the elements of positioning and flow while they are teaching. We feel that this is important because the choreographer designs a dance for comfort, ease, continuity and blending, therefore creating an attractive "picture" as all the dancers move around the floor.

Can we talk a minute about the "Maneuver". I invariably see dancers clipping the end of the maneuver to face the wall instead of reverse line of dance. They have under-turned by one quarter of a turn so they must make it up on the next cue. If this cue is two right-turning waltzes, they are still off by one quarter of a turn. Eventually a pivot rears its head and now the couple has a huge turn to make. Everything would have worked so much more smoothly if they had just maneuvered to face reverse line of dance. If a move is uncomfortable for you, check the step before it to see if the problem started there. 99 times out of a 100 that's where you will find the problem.

We also see people dancing at arms length. This is most uncomfortable. Dancing should be done as "one" person, not two

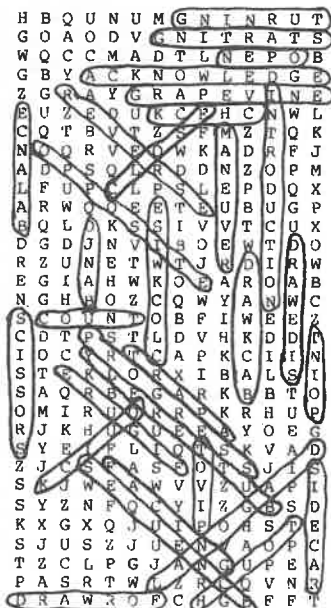
separate people. If you approach your partner and stand comfortably close, waistlines touching but shoulders back. Now... if the lady puts her left hand on his right shoulder, you will find that the shoulders will be comfortably angled. If she reaches around his back or to the back of his neck, she ends up leaning into him and now her balance is off. Again a pivot rears its head, and she is at a distinct disadvantage and can't execute the move with a smooth flow. When you dance close you can feel your partner's lead, you can feel his sway, you know which way he is going to go and even if it is the wrong way, she goes with him as "one" person. She can feel just how deep he is going to reach into a Whisk or a Hover. She can feel how large his step is going to be when he does a forward waltz, a forward two-step, or a run 3.

Many times just a turn of the head will help your positioning. I see some of the ladies looking at their partners constantly. If the cue is to semi-closed facing line, it is a definite disadvantage for the lady to be looking at her partner. Where your head goes, your shoulders follow. If the next cue is through-face-close, the lady cannot get her foot through for the first step. If she is looking at her partner (which makes her shoulders and hips face his), you are now more in closed than semi-closed. If

the lady will turn her head to face line, her shoulders and hips will follow and then she has plenty of room to bring her inside foot through for a through-face-close.

I notice many dancers who have trouble with "waltz away and then pick up to sidecar". If the lady is not aware of the fact that she and her partner waltzed away to a definite back to back position, she sure has one heck of a pickup to do there. It's a long way over to sidecar from a back to back. Why not waltz away a little more subtly and face open line of dance? Then the sidecar will not be so far away. Again, the side car was not the problem, it was the waltz away that preceeded it. One evening I saw quite a few couples waltz away to this back to back position, and they even made an extra effort to touch their trailing hands. There were five or six couples, all from the same leader, so I was led to believe that possibly the instructor had taught it that way.

Continuity and flow is the name of the game. Dancers need to remember that any step is a continuation of the step before it. The measures blend together moving smoothly from one step to the next and on and on until you reach the end. If you can get the "skip" out of the two forward two-step, you will appear smoother. If your knees are bent a little that "skip" disappears.

Each dancer should keep his feet on the floor rather than turn the

steps into "high-stepping". Flairs are executed with the foot close to the floor, not up in the air. You don't want to show the soles of your shoes. If your foot is in the air for the flair, you have to come back down eventually and will be out of balance for the next move.

No step should be uncomfortable. If it is, then ask your instructor to look at it and tell you why it is awkward for you. Which brings us to another often said statement, "I hate to ask questions. I don't like everybody else to know that I didn't get it and they did." Nonsense!! They probably didn't get it either. Your question will help them out. We had one couple tell us that their instructor embarrasses them at break time because it is his break time, too. I wouldn't give that instructor the satisfaction of attending his or her classes. NO WAY!! Find another instructor! I get more upset when no one asks me any questions because I feel that they don't care, or that maybe they don't like the dance. Questions show interest. Questions help others. Questions are a welcome part of classes or, at least, they should be.

Keeping some of these things in mind, you should find that you can dance all night with comfort, ease and a smooth blending of bodies, action and pleasure. It would be nice to get to the end of the night and feel relaxed and satisfied. Remember, this is our recreation. No one wants to walk out of a dance all keyed up, arms hurting,, toes sore, and head spinning.

Heat oven to 350° F.; grease and flour a 13"x9" pan. In a small bowl, blend filling ingredients; beat on highest speed until smooth and creamy. Set aside. In large bowl, mix cake ingredients. Beat 2 minutes at highest speed. Pour 1/2 of cake batter into pan. Pour filling mixture over batter; spread to cover. Pour remaining cake mixture over filling. Bake 45 to 55 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean. Cool completely. Frost with your favorite fudge icing. Store in refrigerator.

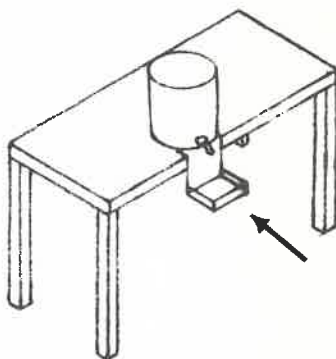
