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PUBLISHER'S PATTER

The month of April is right around the corner and if you've looked at the length of your front lawn recently, you'll suddenly realize that Spring is here. (Particularly with the recent rains.) We've had a few sunny days interspersed among the downpours and Betty said if I didn't get out and cut the grass, she was worried that a tiger or two might appear around the tree. Actually, April will be a good month for square dancing as people look to get away from the house for a few hours of rest and relaxation. (What could be more relaxing than square dancing - right?)

Speaking of going out to dances, we're always somewhat amazed as we assemble the ads for each month's issue. It seems there is always one weekend of the month that is more popular than any other, with several clubs holding similar dances on the same night. For example, on March 12th there were five dances scheduled in the Santa Clara Valley. Three were at the Plus level, the fourth MS and the fifth was Newer Dancer 1-60.

Assuming that the dance sponsors would like to draw at least 25 squares of dancers to be able to meet expenses and to keep the club from going in the hole, this means that 125 squares of dancers would be dancing on March 12th. This is great... and while it can happen here in the South Bay Area, I just wouldn't want to count on it. With several good dances "competing" for the same dancers, no one is going to do as well as they would like.

In an attempt to avoid this type of scheduling conflict, the SCVSDA publishes a yearly calendar (in December) and appoints a calendar chairman. Association clubs are expected to coordinate hoedown schedules through the Calendar chairman. Think about it next time you schedule a hoedown. There have been a number of Saturdays when there were no Plus hoedowns!

In our effort to attend at least one newer dancer hoedown a month, Betty and I recently visited the Mike Degmetich/Ken Kenmille affair a couple of weeks ago. They had about 30 squares of the most

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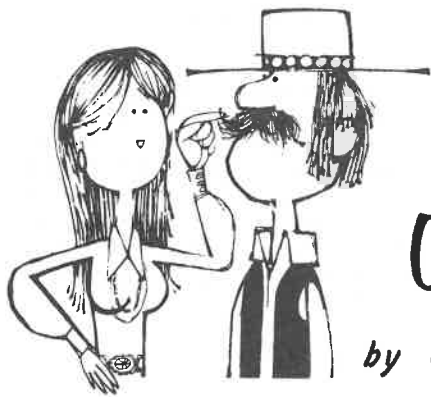
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"OUR" OPINION !

Excerpt from a news item in the San Jose Mercury, March 11, 1983...

"San Jose redevelopment officials on Thursday proposed a 328,000 square foot expansion of the Convention Center..."

"The city's present Convention Center... contains 30,000 square feet of exhibit space, less than facilities in Fresno, Sacramento and Long Beach."

We read the above article with more than passing interest because San Jose will be hosting the 25th Annual California State Square Dance Convention later this month (April 22 - 24, at both the Convention Center and the Fairgrounds), and a number of dancers have asked us why the Advanced and Challenge dancing is being held at a different location from the rest of the Convention. The answer is — the Convention Center simply doesn't have enough space to accommodate the program being presented.

We've attended prior conventions in the larger facilities in Long Beach and Fresno, and believe this year's program is larger and more complete than ever before. Six halls will be in use on Friday night, expanding to seven for Saturday and Sunday.

If you've never attended a weekend festival or convention before, DON'T miss this one!! No matter what your interest or level, there's a program for you. For the square dancer: Plus level (two halls); Quarterly Selection level; Youth; September Newer Dancer;

January Newer Dancer; Advanced; Challenge; Workshops and Styling Clinics. In addition: Round Dancing (on a wood floor); Contrás; Clogging; and Exhibitions.

Because of the space constraints at the Convention Center, the Advanced and Challenge halls will be located at the Fairgrounds. The Fairgrounds will also be utilized for RV parking during the weekend.

The State Committee will be providing a shuttle bus service between the Fairgrounds, the Convention Center and Convention Headquarters at the Hyatt House Hotel. Information on the schedule and cost (if any) for the shuttle service will be available at the Convention.

If you enjoy the opportunity to dance to a variety of callers, consider this — at last count more than 80 callers from throughout the state are scheduled for the weekend!

Like to do a lot of dancing? If you could be in six (or seven) places at once you could square dance, round dance and clog for more than 600 hours!! For those of us who can only be in one place at a time, we'll have to settle for only 20 hours of dancing during the three day weekend.

When your feet stop speaking to you (or start yelling at you) you'll have the opportunity to browse through commercial booths representing square dance shops and services from throughout the state. (That's when my wallet starts

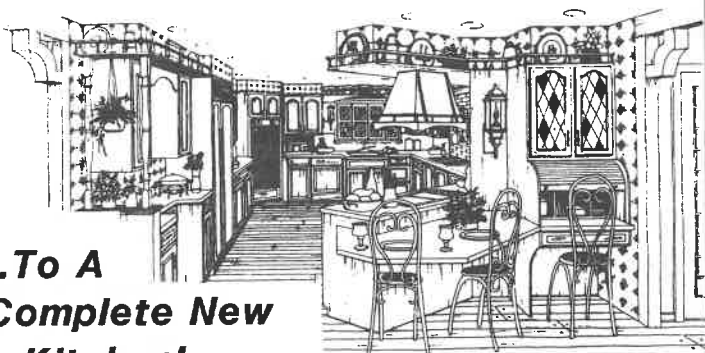

It was our pleasure to take several members of Council to the Katydids Sweetheart Dance on Saturday night and the hospitality and great dancing were apparent by the numerous compliments we received from Council.

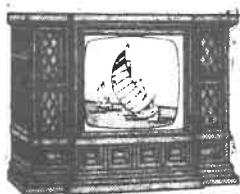
Recently, our Schools Coordinator, Mac McClure, in a meeting with school representatives for the San Jose Unified School District, generated a policy for use

of school facilities in this district by square dancers. Following is a guideline containing two sections. Section One (I) is to be applied when a SCVSDA club applies for the use of a facility on a regular club-use basis (meetings and recreational dancing). Section Two (II) will cover the use of school facilities on a one-time basis when donations or contributions may be asked for at the facility to cover cost of expenses.

SECTION I

1. The Square Dance Club shall make written application for the facility and furnish the school with phone numbers and addresses of two Club members who may be contacted when necessary.

2. The Square Dance Club shall list on its application the names of two responsible club members that the school shall make available a key for the facility. The school shall determine the feasibility of



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issuing a key to the custody of these club members. Any change of these responsible club members shall be by letter from the Club President.

3. The school shall furnish the Square Dance Club with written instructions as to conditions for set up of facility and equipment necessary to leave school in condition suitable for school use.

4. There shall be no rental or custodial fees. The Square Dance Club shall pay \$10 per night for utilities. The school shall specify when such payment will be made.

5. The school shall notify the Square Dance Club, at least one week prior, when facilities are not available and the Square Dance Club shall notify the school, at least one week prior, when use of facility is not contemplated.

SECTION II

1. The Square Dance Clubs may apply for use of a school facility on a one-time basis (usually Saturday nights) when a contribution or donation will be taken at the facility to cover cost of expenses. This is not within the scope of square dance use of facilities as outlined in the Education Code. The fee schedule for use of the school facilities shall be as determined by school policy under this situation.

2. The school may request names of member clubs of the Santa Clara Valley Square Dancers Association, Inc., its Officers, and Directors as the school deems necessary.

It is most important to all of us that we follow these guidelines when we use the school facilities in order to satisfy the requirements of the Education Code for School Use. Another provision of the above was that the school district was assured that the SCVSDA, Inc. and its member Clubs have liability insurance to cover use of school facilities and that a Certificate of Insurance will be furnished upon request. If any Club needs such a Certificate, please contact us at (408)259-1958.

The California State Square Dance Convention is being held this month, April 22 - 24, and everything is set and a complete dancing program is available for a full weekend of fun! Hope to see you "across the square"!

The Callers Appreciation Dance will be held April 30th, watch for details in this issue. Let's all support this dance and show our callers that we appreciate their efforts in providing great dancing for our clubs. We will announce the Top Ten Callers for the Jubilee in October at this dance, so, get your ballots in right away so your vote will count.

Was That Really MAINSTREAM??

SWEEP A QUARTER
(CALLERLAB Basic #52)

Definition:

(CALLERLAB #52) Starting formation: Facing couples in a circling movement (right or left). Dancers continue the circling movement one quarter (90°) in the direction of the body flow.

(Callers NOTE: The definition above partially replaces Burleson #1188.)

Observations:

Sweep a Quarter is executed very well by dancers at all levels; even when the call is given in 'technically illegal' situations (i.e., following Star Thru, Slide Thru, Veer, etc.), usually the result of inadequate caller consideration of the dancers' understanding of the definition — In these latter cases, the caller usually wants a 'Veer and Bend' in the direction of the Man (or Beau) dancer of the couple. Other than the misuse of the call described above, there are very few instances where the dancers will have any trouble at all with Sweep a Quarter.

Teaching Tips:

Sweep a Quarter is one of the first calls that is taught which causes the dancers to consider their body flow in the previous move to successfully complete this new "extension" of that move. Additionally, the actual placement of this call in the recommended teaching order is such that immediate dancer success with the move can occur during the first night of instruction. Regarding the additional ways to use this call as defined by Burleson (#1188), my own personal preference is to delay these possibilities until the dancers are thoroughly familiar with all the Mainstream moves (about six to eight months), and then to intentionally specify that 'individual Sweep a Quarter' or 'Sweep 1/2 (3/4)' is a series of different calls than the one they originally learned

-- While this practice is controversial, it seems to result in a minimum of dancer confusion. Under all circumstances, "couples Sweep a Quarter" is so frequently called that the dancers can be expected to execute this move with very few problems.

MATERIAL

Heads Flutterwheel, Sweep a Quarter, Pass Thru, Allemande Left, Do Sa Do at Home.

Heads Square Thru, Touch 1/4, Swing Thru, Swing Thru, Boys Run, Reverse Flutterwheel, Sweep a Quarter, Veer Right, Ferris Wheel, Pass Thru, Allemande Left, Promenade.

Heads Lead Right, Circle to a Line, RL Thru, Flutterwheel, Sweep a Quarter, Square Thru 3/4, Allemande Left, Promenade.

Heads Lead Right, Veer Left, Ferris Wheel, Centers Sweep a Quarter (Set rotated 1/4).

4 Ladies Chain, Grand Flutterwheel, Sweep a Quarter (Set rotated 1/4).

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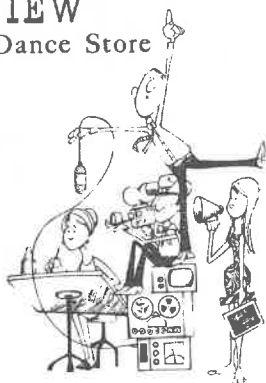

Vacation time's coming and the new National Square Dance Directory is out now, in time for you to plan your trips to include lots of dancing. It's really more than a national directory as it includes listings all over the world — Canada, Cuba, England, Egypt, Argentina, Australia, Israel, Italy and on and on. It lists square dance, round dance, clogging, and contra groups with contacts for you to call when you reach a new area. Upcoming festivals are also listed.

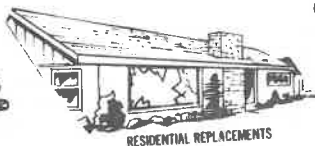
Looking for "a little something" that's different for a gift? See the new dancer couple jewelry with turquoise inlay. Comes in pendants and earrings and, for the man, money clips and key chains.

Have you noticed that polka dots are "in" this season? Most of the square dance dress manufacturers have come out with some dotted dresses. Some especially pretty ones

are by Square Dance Dress Company, which is also presenting some lightweight cover-ups in eyelet, and a lightweight poly/cotton. These are designed to go over sleeveless Spring and Summer dresses. They also have a lightweight flared-sleeve jacket with a Peter Pan collar. It comes in navy, beige, black and white, all with topstitching.

And now for the records: my pick is on Hoedowner (109) "You Don't Know Me" by John Reitmajer, a standard figure with beautiful music featuring piano, organ, guitar and good drums. Check out "Hey Baby" by Ron Marion on Pioneer (124), it just has a standard figure, but it is a nice smooth piece of music. Mike Sikorsky has a good, upbeat hit with his "Proud Mary" on Four Bar B (6050), he uses a Grand Square break and a good standard figure. Then we have two more Chaparral releases, "Medley" (3506) including such good ole tunes as "Five Foot Two", "Hazel Eyes", "Zippity Do Da" and ending with "When the Saints Go Marching In", done by the whole Chaparral gang; and "Every Street's a Boulevard" (3507), again done by all the Chaparral boys. Both these records are the kind which get the dancers joining in on the choruses.

By the way, have you heard the new figure, "guillotine"? That's Heads Rollaway — now I'll leave you, until next month, unless the Editor takes my head off!



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Fashionable Thoughts by Martibet



This month we bring you the first of a three-part series on making a strip-quilted jacket. Our guest columnist is Bobbie Davis and we would like to thank her for sharing her idea with us.

STRIP-QUILTED JACKET by Bobbie Davis

Strip-quilted jackets are ideal cover-ups for square dance dresses. They are lightweight and virtually bulk-free while providing ample warmth for the journey in from the parking lot without being excessive for that first tip before the room warms up. They have an additional appeal in that they allow individual creativity that produces an impressive finished garment and still requires only a minimum of expertise with a sewing machine.

You may use any pattern you choose, but my favorite is "Log Cabin Jacket" pattern designed by Diana Leone of the Quilting Bee Fabric Shop in Los Altos. This pattern includes sizes 8 - 20 and has modified raglan sleeves that eliminate the bulk of set-in sleeves and allows room for the puffy sleeves of square dance dresses.

MATERIALS REQUIRED

1/4 yard each of 12 to 14 fabrics (or more yardage of fewer fabrics).

2 1/2 to 3 yards of lining fabric (depending on size).

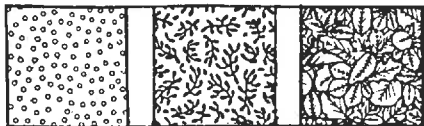
2 1/2 to 3 yards of batting material.

7 yards of 3 inch wide bias binding.

Marking guide, sharpie pen, scissors.



Decide which two colors dominate your wardrobe, and use these colors as the basis for your jacket. I start by finding a fabric I really like that has both my chosen colors in the design. (This is a good time to use some of the leftover remnants you have been saving for years.)



Coordinate your other fabrics around this piece. Use light and dark tones of each color, and vary the density of the print. Transition fabrics that use both colors help tie the jacket together. Fabrics should be cotton or poly/cotton blends.

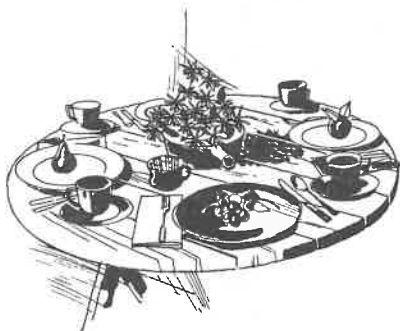
Appetizer:

SPICY NUTS & BOLTS

- 1/2 cup margarine
- 1 envelope taco seasoning mix
- 1 (8 oz.) jar soy nuts or peanuts
- 2 cups pretzel sticks
- 2 cups corn chexs
- 1 (3 oz.) can chow mein noodles
- 2 cups corn chips

Melt margarine in a saucepan. Stir in taco mix — set aside. In large baking pan, mix nuts, pretzels, cereal, noodles and corn chips. Pour margarine/taco sauce over mixture and stir to coat. Bake 30 minutes at 350° F., stirring occasionally. Store in an airtight container.

1 1/2 lbs. jumbo shrimp
1/2 cup bread crumbs
1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese
1/2 cup melted butter
1 clove garlic, minced
1 Tbsp. minced parsley
3 Tbsp. lemon juice
1/2 cup white wine

Boil shrimp in salted water until pink. Drain and devein, leaving tail on. Split along back curve. Mix next five ingredients to form a stuffing. Stuff shrimp with approximately 1 Tbsp. of mixture. Mix wine and lemon juice and baste shrimp. Broil for 3 minutes, basting every minute, or bake at 350° F. for 15 to 20 minutes, basting frequently.

CHOCOLATE ZUCCHINI CAKE

2 1/2 cups flour
1/2 cup cocoa
2 1/2 tsp. baking powder
1 1/2 tsp. baking soda
1 tsp. salt
1 tsp. cinnamon
3/4 cup butter
1/2 cup milk
2 cups sugar
3 eggs
2 tsp. vanilla
2 tsp. grated orange peel
2 cups shredded zucchini
1 cup chopped nuts

Combine dry ingredients. Beat butter and sugar until fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time. Stir in dry ingredients, alternating with milk. Add nuts last. Pour into a Bundt pan which is well greased. Bake for 1 hour at 350° F. Cool in pan for 15 minutes before turning out.

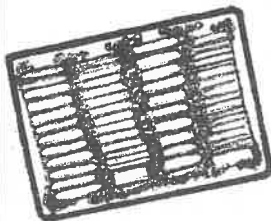
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PROMPTER PROFILE

The Social Aspects of Square Dancing

"Square dancing is fun." How many times have we seen or heard that basic statement in publications, on bumper stickers, across T-shirts, on badges? That thought has been amplified and expanded in expressions such as "square dancing is fun set to music". Recently, however, we have heard disturbing stories to the effect that the fun has gone out of square dancing, for whatever reason.

"Fun," according to the dictionary, "is what provides amusement or enjoyment," and the examples given all refer to the interaction of people with people. Similarly, the dictionary defines "social" as "marked by pleasant companionship with one's friends or associates". So it would seem that a fundamental feature of square dancing is the enjoyment found in the interactions of the people.

If, in fact, some of the fun and some of the pleasant companionship have been lost from our favorite pastime, it is time to look more closely at how we can improve this situation. There is a wide variety of social activity available to the square dancer beyond the simple procedure of joining in groups of eight to move to music. Too many people merely attend a dance and then go home, without really being a part of the scene, without touching or being touched by others.

While "getting involved" in such leadership roles as officers of clubs and associations, chairmen of special events, panelists and the like is indeed a rewarding experience with social implications, nevertheless, the majority of dancers neither aspire to nor are particularly fitted for

such involvement.

But every dancer can share the pleasure derived from the social aspects of square dancing: club visitations, festival weekends, group travel. There's nothing more intriguing than a mystery bus trip, clambering onto a bus headed for who-knows-where, the singing, the wisecracks, the mystery of it all, or the exhilaration of a banner-stealing expedition, meeting new people at another club, carrying off their banner, knowing full well they'll be back soon to reclaim it and capture yours, all the while swelling attendance at both dances.

Then there's the ego trip of putting on an exhibition at some civic affair or on TV, the square dance week demo at a shopping mall, the satisfaction of capturing the fancy of the non-dancers as they join you for their first sample of a new-found pleasure.

The dance weekends, festivals, and conventions all offer opportunities to fraternize, to learn together, to exchange ideas and impressions. Such camper jamborees and dance weeks as Asilomar, Chula Vista, Kirkwood Lodge, Andy's Trout Farm, Fontana, and a host of others, offer extended opportunities for person to person contact. Perhaps the most intimate and varied experience of all is the square dance tour or cruise, where lasting associations can develop. In all these group activities, dancing is the common bond, but it is the interaction of people with people that pays off.

My wife and I first experienced this feeling of "belonging" at the 16th National in Philadelphia when we helped out at the tour booth and then joined in the spectacular Parade of States. Then followed a whole string of nationals, with more

and more participation in the extra-curricular activities associated with the convention. We really became aware of the broad spectrum of social possibilities when, as social and special events chairmen for the 26th National in Atlantic City, we were involved in providing hospitality for panels and clinics, callers, cuers, dance floors, VIP's, exhibition groups, solos, and many others. We were responsible for the information booth, fashion show, clambake, tours, sew and save, and a host of other people-to-people activities. In 1981 we were the escorts for the Philadelphia group tour to Seattle and Alaska.

From the simplest club visitation to the most extended holiday venture, there is one thing in common — people interaction. At a dance, that interaction is limited to eight people in a square, usually changing with each tip. Refreshment time or stunt time may pull most of the dancers together for a few brief moments, but there's nothing like being part of a larger group going somewhere together with a

common interest — practically living together, sharing the laughs, the thrills, the little mishaps over a period of time. Then there are the great reunions to relive those times, to compare notes and impressions — the lasting friendships that tie folks together across miles and time.

These, then, are some of the social aspects, the real dividends, of being a square dancer. True, they have minimal value if one merely observes or just goes along with the crowd. Some of the loneliest experiences imaginable are not joining in the singing on a mystery bus trip, going directly to the hotel room after dancing at a festival, not drawing a partner from the audience for a one-night stand.

But for those who put something of themselves into the affair, who "get involved" in the social aspects of square dancing, there are worlds of rewards both for oneself and for the whole glorious activity.

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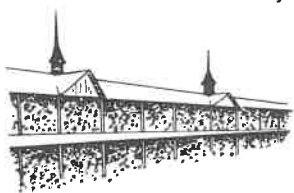
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LOUISVILLE IS THE END OF TRAIL, BUT NOT THE END OF THE DANCING

All of these dances are scheduled from 8 to 11 p.m.

For the youth dancers, the hours are 8 to 10:30 p.m. and the site is poolside at the Executive West. Ah, youth. It could give a whole new meaning to Dive In.

CONVENTION ERRATA

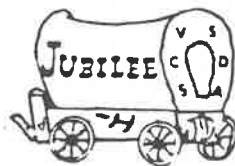

Other fabrics have built-in problems that you will want to avoid on your first project.

The lining will show if you make a cuff, so choose a lining that blends well with all your other fabrics. I usually select one of my favorite pieces that has both colors in the print, but keep it fairly simple since a "busy" cuff next to the quilted sleeve can look chaotic.

If you have a favorite batting that you know well, use it. My favorite is Pellon fleece. It is light, non-bulky, easy to cut and sew, and retains its shape during and after sewing. It is sold by the yard in most good fabric shops.

Pre-packaged bias (Wright's, etc.) does not have enough threads per inch to wash well and last the life of the jacket. You can make your own from 3/4 yard of one of your fabrics, or you can buy specially-made bias in 7 yard rolls at the Quilting Bee.

A yardstick will do as a marking guide, but I prefer a plexiglass strip called Quickline or a C-Thru guide. These have guides for 1/4" to 3" strips and are useful in other sewing projects.

Scissors must be sharp. Preparation time can be cut by hours if you stack-cut your fabric. I use Ginger shears. They cut easily through 12 layers of cotton fabric.

Next month we will continue with the directions for preparation and strip-quilting.
