"OUR" OPINION !

Quiz of the month — how many miles would you dance on a three "State" tour (California State, Silver State and Golden State)??

Answer: 94.1 MILES!!!

We've just completed the second leg of the Triple Crown (with apologies to the Derby, etc.) of NorCal-NorNevada square dancing. While we wait a bit and rest the feet before Golden State, we'll look back on our impressions of San Jose and Reno.

A bouquet of roses to all of those from throughout California who contributed to our State Convention (San Jose, April 22-24). The callers, round dance cuers, contra and clogging leaders, and exhibition groups all donated their time and paid their own expenses to help make the weekend a great success.

If roses are in order for all those callers who came and called, how about giving the thorns to the "no-shows" who made a commitment to call, but didn't appear. Roses, too, to the many callers at the Convention who agreed to be "standbys". We were impressed by the willingness of these callers to take on additional calling assignments, even when it meant a rush trip to (or from) the Fairgrounds.

Speaking of Fairgrounds, splitting the dancing between two locations, while not desirable, seemed to work out OK. The Advanced and Challenge dances and workshops were certainly well attended all weekend. We only heard about two problems: the shuttle scheduling had

some rough spots, and somebody forgot about the need to sell ribbons at the Fairgrounds on Friday night.

For the round dancers, the excellent wood floor in the Auditorium was dedicated to round dancing all day Saturday and Sunday, and on Friday and Saturday evenings there were double rounds in the Auditorium as well as single rounds in two additional halls.

At Silver State (Reno, May 6-8), the round dancers had the hall to themselves from 10 a.m. to noon both Saturday and Sunday. With four halls available, we can't understand why there was no square dancing before noon. (Not all callers sleep in until noon, Honey!) That omission, and the lack of any Advanced dancing on Sunday, were the only glitches in a fun weekend of dancing. The sound was noticeably better than last year, and the weather was nearly perfect.

The three Prompter busses were kept busy all weekend as members of the group sought out dancing, food, rest and OTHER FUN (not necessarily in that order!). One (who shall remain nameless) tried to become a real estate tycoon — at least we heard he invested heavily in several "Reno Properties".

Ron Farni, who was trying to win the title of "Trivia Champ of Bus #1", stumped everyone — including himself -- when he asked for Tarzan's given name (before he was lost in the jungle — Tarzan, not Ron). The answer, Ron, is on page 18. We'll give you one more chance

Update: Square Dancing As The State Dance...

Editor's Note: At the 26th Jubilee an aide to then California State Senator Dan O'Keefe announced that the Senator would introduce a bill in Sacramento naming Square Dancing as the State Dance. He also held a drawing to select eight couples who would go to Sacramento as guests of the Senator and dance in the Capitol Rotunda to publicize the legislation. During an interview (The Prompter, November 1982) Mr. O'Keefe made a commitment that, even if he lost the impending election, he would still arrange and fund the trip for the selected dancers.

Mr. O'Keefe did lose the election, and we have received many inquiries from dancers about the legislation and the trip. We

contacted Mr. O'Keefe and invited him to comment on his plans to honor his commitment. His response follows:

Dear Readers,

I would like to thank the many members of the Santa Clara County Square Dance Community for your helpful assistance over the last ten years. I first met many of you at your state convention held in Santa Clara County during the time I served as a school board president. I spoke before that convention on the subject of how to curb the unreasonable and abusive charges imposed upon the Square Dancers for the rental of public buildings. Penalizing non-profit groups with excessive unrelated charges and using the passage of Proposition 13 as an excuse for those fees did great damage to many volunteer groups and undermined the spirit of California's Civic Center Act. I had always opposed policies that attempt to bully and discriminate against individuals and groups that want to use public supported facilities. No group, I might add, uses public facilities with greater care and concern than the Square Dancers.

During the time I served in the California State Senate we worked together on an effort to have legislation drafted that would make Square Dancing the official dance of this state. Your help in providing me with the model language used by other states in approving similar measures was appreciated.

Even though I am no longer

On Monday, May 16, 1983, I will meet in Sacramento with several members of the senate in an attempt to gain sponsorship of the measure I drafted last year and scheduled to introduce in this session.

Completing many of the tasks undertaken while I served in the legislature takes more time than I expected. Without the resources of staff and income, it is going slower than I would like. Nevertheless, I am firm in my commitment. I hope to have word to you shortly on the progress of the legislation and the

success of our trip to Sacramento with the following individuals: Art and Marie Hansford, John and Cathryn Hassur, John L. Nichols, Esther McBride, Sam and Yvette Polizzi, Chuck and Phyllis DePalmo, James A. Duncan, and Rufus A. Maxfield. Alternates: Harold Brunner and Carol Orser.

comment on your suggested remedies.

You say that a dancer, on any given night, can find a place to dance at whatever level he wishes. Are you saying that he can find a dance or workshop at the exact level at which he is capable of dancing comfortably and that this dancer will progress smoothly into this new level? There are several reasons why this will not happen. No two callers start teaching any of the levels at exactly the same time or teach the calls in the same sequence or in the same manner. Also, most dancers simply will not strike out on their own to join a group which is totally new to them.

You also suggest in your article that one of the main reasons for the exodus of square dancers is the lack of weekend dances at the lower levels. I do not agree with this because the problem we are discussing has been happening for the past twenty-five years, which is long before levels were in existence. Also, twenty-five years ago all dances were given at a degree of ease which the new graduating dancer could enjoy.

Furthermore, you think that it is the Square Dancers Association which should put on the lower level dances. Again, I believe your thinking is in error. The Association has many functions, but the putting on of dances is not one of them. I feel that it is the function of the clubs, which are under the direction and guidance of their callers.

What you suggest in your article is the status quo, which obviously has never worked. Don't you think it's about time for some imaginative thinking — is it really that painful to try something new and different? Incidentally, since writing my original article, I have been told that a plan similar to mine is in effect on the East Coast and is working successfully. Wouldn't it be nice if a few daring, innovative callers in our area could get together and take "one giant step" for square dancing?

The vacation season is now upon us and with it comes various decision making situations. Perhaps a couple of reminders are in order here, particularly to you newer round dancers.

Not everyone can attend every class night or every club night and, as a result, there will be some dances on which you will inadvertently miss the teach. But, remember, there will be a review in the future. Also, we just cannot know every single round dance that is being done.

If you aren't the kind of person who enjoys trying the unknown with cues — relax, see what you can pick up by watching others dance. After all, an additional rest of approximately three minutes once in a while is not all that bad! No reason to give up — hang in there — we all manage to get caught up eventually.

Time to continue with our list from last month, things one should be aware of to become a "comfortable" easy level round dancer.

INTERNATIONAL ROUND DANCE STANDARD

Phase II of Round Dancing

EXPLANATORY TERMS

(Continued)

MANEUVER - Any type of turn necessary to end in Closed Position Man facing Reverse Line of Progression with Man's left and Woman's right foot free.

REVERSE TWIRL - Same as Twirl except change right face to left face turn.

REVERSE TWIRL VINE - Woman twirls left face as Man moves along with her in a Vine figure.

ROCKING STEPS - A series of steps with a rocking action transferring the weight from one foot to the other by stepping either forward, backward or sideward. The number of steps as indicated.

ROCKING STEPS (THREE STEPS) - A three step action executed in variable positions, directions and rhythms. Timing as indicated.

SCOOT - A series of forward, close steps (can be done in any number of counts). Scoot four (in any position).

SLIDING DOOR - Partners facing same direction, releasing hands, change sides, still facing same direction, Woman crossing in front of Man.

SLOW RIGHT FACE COUPLE PIVOT - With a blending motion, from Closed Position Man steps back left turning on ball of foot approximately 1/2 right face (Woman step forward right between Man's feet), hold one count, Man step forward right between Woman's feet (Woman step back left) continuing right face turn to end in position and facing direction as indicated, hold one count; (Pivot,-,2,-;).

SOLO ROLL - A right face or left face individual turn progressing in designated direction to end in designated position. The number of steps used determined by rhythm and choreography..

SWING - Lift the free foot with the leg straight, toes pointed down, about three inches above the floor.

SWIVEL - A step taken on the ball of the foot with the motion of the next step or body movement causing the foot to turn at the point of contact.

THRU - Both partners bring foot between each other taking weight.

TOGETHER STEP STEP - Step diagonally together, in place, step, step, hold;

TRAVELING BOX - In Closed Position, Man sideward on left foot, close right to left foot, forward on left foot (Woman back),-; turn to Reverse Semi-Closed Position walk forward, -,2,-; Blend to Closed Position Man sideward on right foot,

close left to right foot, backward on right,-; blend to Semi-Closed Position walk forward,-,2,-;

TWIRL - A progressive right face turn by the Woman under her right hand and Man's left hand.

TWIRL VINE - Woman twirls as Man moves along with her in a Vine figure.

TWIST - The turning of the upper body to change facing direction without changing weight.

TWISTY VINE - Same as the Vine except Woman crosses opposite from Man.

UNWRAP - Reversing the condition of a Wrap to a designated position.

VINE EIGHT - Do a Vine Four two times in succession.

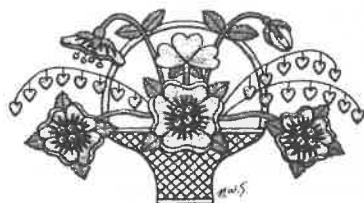
VINE FOUR - Side right or left, following with a cross in back, with another side in same direction, with a cross in front.

VINE THREE - Side right or left, following with a cross in back, with another side in same direction.

VINE (OPEN) - Same action as regular Vine except both Man and Woman turn to Left Open or Open Position as they take the crossing steps. Can be used for both two step or waltz.

WHEEL - A series of steps in a side by side position, partners turn as a couple with the inside feet as a common pivot point.

WRAP - From an Open Position retain the inside handhold at waist level as Woman makes a complete left face turn to face the same direction as the Man, resulting in wrapping the Woman's left arm in front of her waist and Man's right arm behind her waist. Join the free outside hands in front a chest height.

This new series of articles, with pictograms and dancing tips, will feature a call from the CALLERLAB Mainstream Quarterly Selection Program, the Plus Program, or the Plus Quarterly Selection Program each month.

EXPLODE FAMILY (from Waves only)

CALLERLAB Plus Call #11

Definition: (CALLERLAB April 1983) Starting formation: any four dancer Ocean Wave.

a. the Wave - Everyone releases handholds, steps forward and turns one quarter (90°) in to face the adjacent dancer (their momentary partner), and right hand pull by that person, to end as couples back-to-back.

b. and Anything - Everyone releases handholds, steps forward and turns one quarter (90°) to face the adjacent dancer and do the 'anything' call.

(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #242, and partially replaces Burleson #1293. CALLERLAB recommends that the call always be given as "Explode and (anything)".)

DANCING TIPS

When stepping thru the Wave, don't take too large a step. This will help you stay with your own foursome and avoid the confusion sometimes created in the center of the square (when dancers meet face to face) when dancing these moves from parallel Ocean Waves.

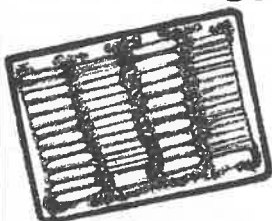
As you step thru the Wave, keep track of the person stepping thru beside you (momentary partner) as this is the person you will turn one quarter towards to "pull by with" or "face". Recognize that this "momentary partner" can be on either side of you depending upon your starting position in the Wave, and whether it is a right-hand or left-hand Wave.

CHALLENGE



★ CORNER

Recent ramblings took us to Reno where we called the Friday night Advanced program. Unfortunately, the room used for this dance and the beginner level dance had such poor acoustics, that Jim Hilton couldn't fix it. He took some of the blame, but it was really not his fault. Short of a quick rebuild of the hall, nothing could really be done.

We continue to notice, during our travels, that many dancers attending Advanced and Challenge dances are really not prepared for this level. We also notice that callers are really dropping the level to Plus with a scattered usage of Advanced commands at these dances. This may be necessary to protect their position in the business or to keep the dancers "winning", but is it really what Advanced and Challenge is supposed to be all about?

In view of the phenomenal growth of Advanced and Challenge, some drop in level is to be expected, but we feel that the lowering of the level at dances has gone too far already. We now seem to be content to look at the number of people that attend these dances as the major criteria of success of the movement instead of how well the dancers attending are prepared to dance the level.

If you consider the above, putting bodies on the floor and letting them

win all of the time as the major reason for the Advanced and Challenge level to exist, we feel you are missing the whole point of the upper levels of dancing. We mentioned problems of "spill-over" from the lower levels to the higher levels last month. This is one of those problem areas. Perhaps many callers and dancers do not feel that this is a problem. But we feel, if it continues to go in the direction we see it now going, that it really is possible to see in the future many "Advanced and Challenge Clubs" that are similar in respects to the "Plus Clubs" of today that are made up of many dancers who cannot really dance Plus level.

One dictionary we consulted, defined Advanced as "moved forward; ahead of the times; very progressive or unconventional". It will be unfortunate if we previously have moved forward only to begin "Advancing" backwards as the number of dancers increases.

While your first thoughts on reading the above may be very mixed, we are sure that our past readers will remember our position on Soft, Medium, and Hard Advanced and Challenge levels. We still feel that there is a place for Soft Advanced and Challenge, but this level would still use all of the commands on the lists even if they are used only in the easiest formations and standard positions. To us, Soft Advanced and Challenge does not mean a Plus or Mainstream dance with a few Advanced or Challenge commands thrown in. If we continue with what is happening, we may see all dancers become Advanced instead of Plus, and then Challenge, sooner than we might imagine.

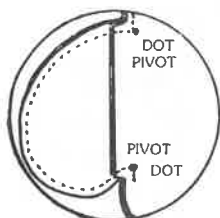

STRIP-QUILTED JACKET (Part 3)

CONSTRUCTION

Sew pockets (right sides together) to sides of fronts and back with $3/8$ " seam. Be sure pocket placement matches on all pieces. Use iron and press pockets out. Use $1/2$ " seam and stitch fronts to back at shoulders. Press seam open. Stitch sleeves to jacket. Press seam toward sleeve. Pin front to back from sleeve edge to jacket bottom — matching sleeve seams and pocket edges. Stitch in one continuous seam, curving the underarm turn. At pockets, backstitch about $1/2$ " above pocket, pivot at seam allowance, sew around pocket back to jacket, pivot at seam allowance, sew to bottom of jacket.



Clip underarm curve and seam allowance above and below pocket. Press seam open. Stitch collar lining to pieced collar (wrong sides together). Sew rest of lining together the same as the jacket without pockets. Baste neck edge of jacket and lining just inside seam

line. Clip curves.

On outside of jacket pin collar to neck edge, quilted sides together, center backs and front edges matched. Baste in place. Leave collar folded down and pin lining to neck edge, matching front edges, shoulder seams, and center back (right side of lining will be against lining side of collar). Stitch around neck edge. Clip curves where necessary and trim seam allowance. Press seam toward jacket.

Turn jacket inside out and push sleeves through lining sleeves. Lay garment across ironing board, lining side up. Smooth lining and jacket — matching center back, seams, bottom and front edges. Pin in place. Match sleeve seams and edges. Pin in place. Stitch around all raw edges ($1/4$ "). Turn jacket.

Fold 3" wide bias in half lengthwise and iron. Pin raw edge of bias $1/4$ " from raw edge of jacket (on outside). Start at a lower side seam and fold end of bias under. Work all the way around the jacket; lap end over starting point. Stitch $1/4$ " from raw edge of bias. Turn bias to inside and blind stitch to lining just over machine stitching. If you are planning a cuff for your jacket, the bias must be sewn to the inside of the sleeve (start at seam and lap ends) then turned to the outside for blind stitching.

Turn up cuffs and your jacket is ready to wear to the next hoedown. It will also look great with slacks, skirts, or regular dresses. I am sure you will find this a most versatile and satisfying project.

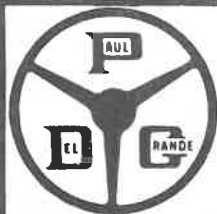

PRODUCT & RECORD REVIEW

From The Dance Store

Good, Good News!! Finally there is a product to take the place of the old "Slo-Down". It's called "Trak-Shun" and its manufacturer claims it's completely safe for wood, asphalt and linoleum tile floors.

Another product I'm especially pleased to review this month is the round dance book, "Cold Feet": How to Get Them Dancing", by Kaye Anderson. This is the best beginners' round dance book I've come across covering two steps and waltzes — it includes directions for each basic for both the man and woman, also with foot print diagrams for both. Kaye Anderson also gives you styling tips for each basic and all the cueing variations you are likely to encounter. Also includes positions, round dance etiquette (gentlemen, do you always escort your partner off the floor?), a list of easy and intermediate classics, and a good index. With this book, you can dance! Sells for about \$13.00.

Fashions by Bettye is presenting the prettiest square dance sun dress ever. It combines solids and a little patchwork, has a gored and gathered skirt, and straps wide enough to cover your bra straps. Very attractive — don't wait to get yours as Bettye's produces in small quantities and they may all be gone by hot weather time.

Bill Davis has come up with a really good learning and calling help. Flash Cards — like the kids use to learn words and math — they have the basic on one side and then are either blank, or with the definition on the reverse; and for the caller, with "get outs" on the reverse. Available in all levels, basics through Challenge.

Callers, don't forget about those old, but good, patriotic records — it's getting near July 4th party times. There's "It's a Grand Old Flag", "God Bless America", and "America the Beautiful" to name a few, and do you have a "Star Spangled Banner" in your record case? Never can tell when you'll be called upon for it.

There are two good Hoedowners releases this month, "The Steal of the Night" (110) (and "Steal" is correct) by Bill Sigmon, has a good strong danceable beat, and "Someone Could Lose a Heart" (111) by Kim Hohnholt — different rhythm, just like the pop version, and has a Grand Square break. I also like "Only Teasin' You" on Roofers (114) by Gerald McWhirter, a remake of "Angry". The music is a little bit busy, but if you turn down the treble it should work well and it has a good Track II figure and a neat drum break. Quadrille's "If Heaven Ain't Like Dixie" (823) is for the caller that can get a lot of words out fast but, if you can do it, it should please the dancers. Chaparral has two new releases, "Cherokee Fiddle" (512) by Ken Bower, and "Hazel Eyes" (3505) by all the Chaparral Boys. Rhythm has finally released "Knock, Knock, Knock" (168) to its dealers. It's by Wade Driver. There are two Circle D releases, "Bet Your Heart on Me" (219) by Kevin Bacon, and "Some Ladies Don't Love Cowboys" (220) by Randy Dibble, almost a home town boy. And twenty-one other releases... come in and LISTEN!

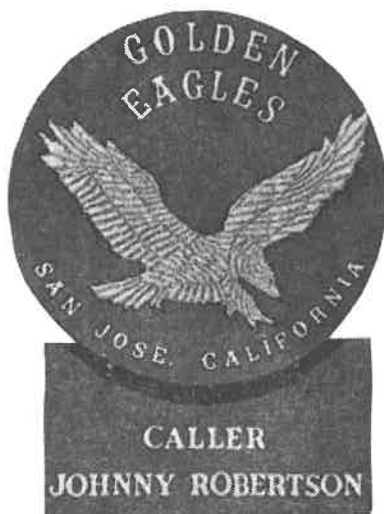

NATIONAL CONVENTION UPDATE

THREE-DAY REGISTRATION POLICY

When it comes to National Square Dance Conventions, the theme song could well be "All or Nothing at All". You sign up for all three days of the convention or you don't sign up at all.

But, you say, isn't that a bit unfair? Aren't there some folks who can make it for only one or two days? The answers are no and yes. But there are good reasons for the policy which is set by the National Executive Committee.

One, security — not mention the bookwork -- would become a hellacious problem if a whole bunch of different ribbons and badges were used.

Two, the sponsoring organization must rent the convention facility for the full three days, which naturally is a bit on the expensive side. It's expensive, but it's worth it in order to give the thousands of dancers a good convention.

Three, if only one-day registrations were allowed, there would probably be a whole lot of people wanting to come on Saturday, which would create some rather monstrous problems for the sponsor.

Last, but not least, is the fact that many hotel and motel rooms would be tied up for only one day at a time. That would quite obviously mess things up for the local merchants as well as for dancers wanting three- or four-day

reservations. There is also the possibility the hotel/motel managers would raise the rates for single-day reservations, which would be bad news indeed. That wouldn't leave us as much money to spend on food.

All together, now... "All, or nothing at all..."

GOOD NEWS! SHUTTLE BUS SERVICE!

There'll be busing at the 32nd National Square Dance Convention® in Louisville. That's busing, but bussing. For those of you interested in bussing, we have only one bit of advice: keep your partner in sight. For those of you who don't know the difference between busing and bussing, you sure have missed out on a lot.

But we digress. Back to the buses. Shuttle service to and from the major hotels/motels and the Kentucky Fair and Exposition Center has been arranged, with Jim and Connie Fisher (Fisher Buses) having contracted for a fleet of school buses. They are doing this on their own and the 32nd National will have no responsibility in the operation, but since the Fishers are square dancers, that should be all you need to know. If you can't trust a square dancer, who can you trust?

Shuttle service will begin Thursday, June 23, at 8 a.m. (EDT) at the hotels/motels and run each hour on the hour. Pickup at the Fairgrounds will begin at 8:30 a.m. and run each hour on the half-hour.

The last bus will leave the Fairgrounds at 1:30 a.m. (This schedule is subject to minor change, if necessary, to accommodate the dancers.) The same schedule will be in effect Friday, June 24, and Saturday, June 25. The fare will be \$1.00 per person one-way ride. A ticket booth will be set up at the Fairgrounds and the Fishers prefer you use tickets, but you may pay cash if you prefer — or if you must — as you board the bus. A complete schedule will be posted at various locations in case you forget.

WE WON'T LET YOU GO HUNGRY!

In addition to the large cafeteria and a restaurant at the Fairgrounds, there will be 23 concession stands selling food during the convention. DIABETIC FOOD will be available in the cafeteria. Food services will be provided by Tommy Lancaster Catering of New Albany, IN, and will be available starting with breakfast at 8:00 a.m. and remain open until 1:00 a.m. No prizes will be awarded to the first square dancer to hit all 25 eating spots, mainly because the way square dancers eat we don't have that many prizes to give away.

HOUSING & REGISTRATION

The Housing and Registration Committee advises dancers to send one night's deposit to the hotel/motel to which they have been assigned, even though they may not have received confirmation directly from the hotel/motel. Some of the smaller hotels/motels are not

sending confirmations. That's why they're smaller.

PARKING FEE \$2.00 PER CAR

The parking fee at the Kentucky Fair and Exposition Center will be \$2.00 per car. Passes will be available that permit you to leave and return to the Fairgrounds five times each day. The passes will be good for one day only and YOU MUST ASK FOR THIS PASS when you pay the initial fee upon entering the Fairgrounds.

KENTUCKY BURGEOO LUNCHEON

There are still a few tickets left for the Kentucky Burgoo Luncheon, June 23, 24 and 25 from 11:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. each day. Authentic Kentucky Burgoo and other Kentucky foods will be served on the lawn of historic Farmington. Well, not on the lawn, really. There'll be chairs and tables there, but you can sit on the lawn if you want to. It might be your only chance to get bluegrass stains on your clothes. The Farmington Mansion, built in 1810, was designed by Thomas Jefferson, who is no longer with us. Tickets are \$8.50 per person and include a tour of Farmington as well as the luncheon. 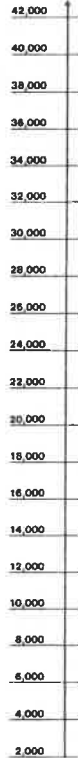

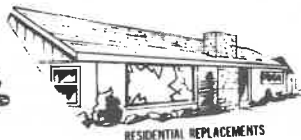

Plus QS List Changes; New Benefits For Subscribers

CALLERLAB's Plus Quarterly Selection Committee reports, as a result of the general membership balloting recently at the 1983 CALLERLAB Annual Convention held in Philadelphia, PA, the calls Zing and Track to a Diamond have been dropped from the Plus Quarterly Selection List.

The Plus Quarterly Selection for the quarter beginning April 1, 1983 is Track & Anything.

TRACK & ANYTHING

Definition: Starting formation — columns (right- or left-handed). Lead two dancers do the Track II, trailing two dancers Single File Circulate one position to form a momentary Box of Four and do the Anything call. Ending formation — depends on the Anything call.

Because the dancing possibilities are unlimited, dancing examples have not been given. Possible Anything moves include: Trade, Box Circulate, Single Hinge, Partner Tag, Follow Your Neighbor, Cast Off 3/4 (to a Diamond), Scoot Back, Walk & Dodge, and U Turn Back.

CALLERLAB INCREASES BENEFITS FOR SUBSCRIBERS

In 1980, CALLERLAB established a new category of affiliation in an effort to include more callers in its

international family. That new category was and is the subscriber. It was established in response to requests from many callers who supported CALLERLAB programs, but who, for good reasons, could not attend an annual CALLERLAB convention, a requirement for full membership.

The subscriber must meet all of the qualifications for full membership except attendance at an annual convention. Dues are the same as for a full member. Of course, if a subscriber attends an annual CALLERLAB convention, he or she automatically becomes a full member upon payment of the current dues. When a full member is unable to meet the convention attendance requirement, he or she may revert to subscriber status.

The subscriber receives all CALLERLAB publications, but is not able to participate in CALLERLAB business by vote or committee assignment. Until now, the subscriber was not covered by the CALLERLAB group liability insurance policy. However, at the 10th Annual CALLERLAB Convention, held in Philadelphia, PA, March 28-30, 1983, it was decided to include subscribers in the insurance coverage. This is a significant additional benefit of being a subscriber, and callers are encouraged to take advantage of the change and to become a subscriber.

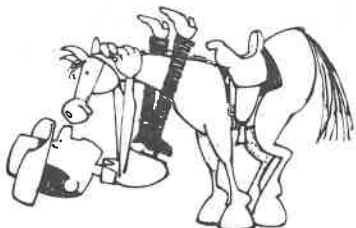

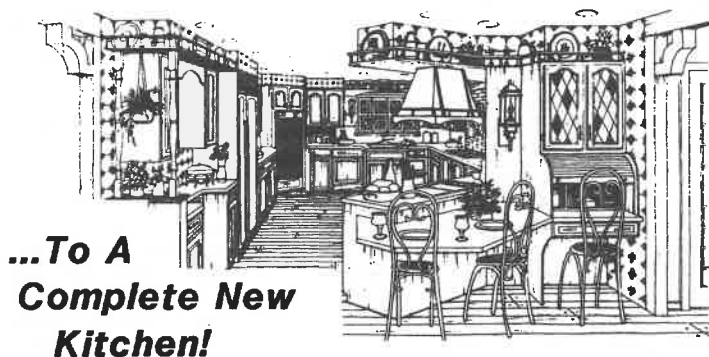

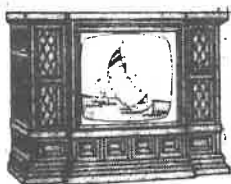
On Tuesday, April 26, we had a potluck dinner in honor of our September class. It was a gala
