Contrary to anything you may have heard, I did not lose my Almaden Squares badge in the ladies restroom. It may have walked in there by itself, but I didn't lose it there. (Likely story!! B.)

The Silver State Square Dance Festival is just around the corner (June 1 - 3) in Reno, and the Prompter is again planning our annual Prompter Bus Trip to this affair (see our ad this issue). 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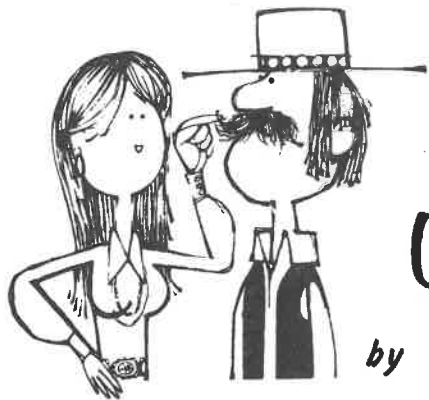

An Open Letter To The Members of CALLERLAB

This is a test: How many calls must a dancer learn to dance at the Mainstream Level?

No, the answer is NOT 68 (the last number on the Mainstream list). The correct answer is 127 when you eliminate all families and list the moves separately. And even this is not reality considering that many moves, which appear as one number on the list, require teaches from several different formations and/or boy/girl combinations and are, as a result, additional learning experiences for the dancers.

Recently there have been numerous proposals put forth in magazines across the U.S., suggesting a reduction in the number of moves in the Mainstream Program so that it may be taught easily within 32 weeks.

Related proposals recommend that the Plus Program be eliminated as such. Replacing the Mainstream and

Plus Programs would be a "Club Level" created by eliminating unused and/or unpopular moves from both programs. This "Club Level" would contain the most popular moves and yet be short enough to be taught within a reasonable class length. We recommend that CALLERLAB give serious consideration to these proposals.

As an interesting aside, the Santa Clara Valley Callers Association has just completed a year-long study to determine the frequency of usage of Mainstream and Plus moves at actual dances (the real world, folks). This study revealed that 90% of the dancers' time was spent dancing only 66 moves out of a possible 158. In fact, during the 6,109 times in which callers gave commands, 29 of the 158 calls were never used, and another 15 were used only once or twice.

This study suggests, to us, three things. First, there are many moves which dancers must take the time

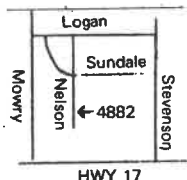

Though I haven't always agreed with you, I do agree with your desire for an increase in the excellence of square dancers at the various levels, and perhaps a longer transition time as a dancer progresses through the various levels.

As a relatively new Plus dancer, I feel that there should be a gradation in the Plus square dances, with each level requiring a different level of achievement. All the square dance manufacturers showed their new products and designs at the recent Western Manufacturers Market (that's the closest category for square dance apparel) in Sacramento. My partner, Jean Jones, and I saw many new and exciting items. Some of them won't be available for several months, but watch for these:

High heeled T straps, made by Capezzio, will be marketed by Rockmount (the shirt company) and will come in colors not available in the Leo's T straps. Coast Shoes will soon have two styles of men's dance shoes. One, a loafer style, the other a laced, soft supple shoe. All the dress manufacturers showed light, bright colors for the Spring and Summer seasons and Malco Modes is now producing a new jumper in gingham, solids, and denim that can be worn with a blouse for cooler weather and without for our warm (hot!) summer dancing. You'll also see some soft, ruffled, very feminine chiffon shawls for the summer evenings.

Malco Modes and Sam's each have a new slip. Malco's is a super

sheer nylon, similar to organza and is a double layer, 60 yards. It looks like a winner! Sam's new one is organdy, trimmed with lace, and comes in a two layer, 40 yards, or a three layer, 60 yards, and in twenty colors.

Two good records this month are Fine Tunes' second release, "Song Sung Blue" (107) by Rick Hampton, and "Love's Been a Little Bit Hard" (105) by Jay Henderson. They both have Mainstream figures. Fine Tunes has done so well with their first releases, we're looking forward to the next ones. As I've said before, there are thirty to forty releases each month, some just right for you, so come in and listen!

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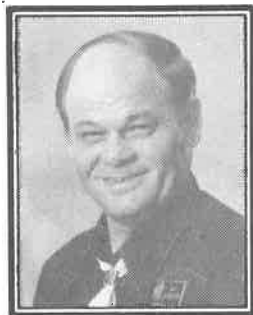
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BEYOND MAINSTREAM

MIX TO A DIAMOND
CALLERLAB
Plus Quarterly Selection
Fourth Quarter 1983

DEFINITION

(CALLERLAB October 1983) From a two-faced line (or any wave or line of four) Centers Cross Run, the new centers Single or Partner Hinge (as appropriate), to end in a Diamond. From right-handed two-faced lines, it ends in right-hand diamonds; from left-handed two-faced lines it ends in left-hand diamonds; from ocean waves it ends in facing diamonds; and from lines, various "funny" diamonds result.

DANCING HINTS

Mix to a Diamond is an extremely versatile call that can 'catch you by surprise' depending upon the starting formation. The natural tendency for all dancers to be in motion at the start of the call can create some rather interesting (and unfortunate) results.

For the center dancer, it is important to establish your 'traffic pattern' before you begin the call. Since you will Cross Run around the farthest end, determine who that person is before the formation is 'lost' and everyone else is moving. If you are not sure which way to go, quickly glance in one direction to see how many dancers are there — if there are two, you will be executing the Cross Run action in that direction; if there is only one, you will be "Running" the other direction. Also, consider that, in order for the move to dance

smoothly, the center dancers must begin their "Cross Run" without delay (as the end dancers cannot begin their part of the call until the centers are out of the way).

The end dancers must avoid the natural tendency to face each other at the start of the call. As an end, be sure you cleanly execute the 'side-step' action (the "Runnee" part) BEFORE you attempt to do the Hinge. The end dancers must also hesitate momentarily to allow the centers to begin their Cross Run, otherwise 'traffic jams' and bruised bodies will be the result. Additionally, the end dancers can be of help to center dancers unsure of the direction in which to Cross Run. Since as an end dancer you know exactly who has to Run around you (it can't be the person next to you at the start), you can gently guide the person next to you toward the OTHER end of the formation.

Because Mix to a Diamond can result in many different forms of a diamond, some dancers may think they are 'wrong' at the completion of the call and immediately want to turn around (or adjust) to form regular twin diamonds. If you are sure you have done your part correctly, accept that the caller intentionally 'put you there' and he will figure out what to call next.

Mix to a Diamond dances well using 6 beats of music, so there is no reason to 'rush' the call — if all dancers can see (and 'set') the starting formation by using a slight delay at the start, the success of the call is assured.

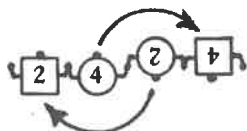
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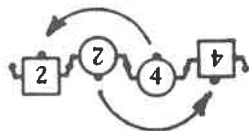

appropriate), to end in a Diamond.

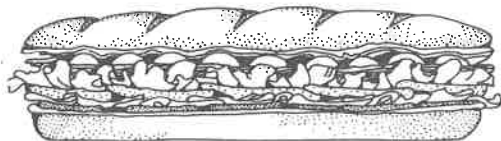

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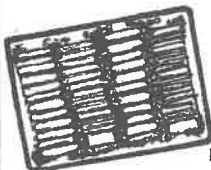

★ CORNER

We received some criticism from a caller of some stature regarding our column last month — mainly in the area of omission as opposed to opinion. His comment was that since we said that callers starting out in the Advanced and Challenge areas should gain knowledge of the subject first, we failed to go on and tell them some possible sources for gaining such knowledge.

There are many sources for gaining knowledge of Advanced and Challenge choreography. An excellent source of material and knowledge of Advanced is "News 'N Notes". This is a callers' note service published monthly by Ed Foote and a group of callers on the East Coast. In our opinion it is probably the best service for this type of material. There are other notes available, but this to have better and more usable information in the Advanced area.

Another good source of information in this area, and in many others as well, is callers in your area that you know are already calling at these levels. The longer they have been doing it, the more information they probably will have obtained on the subject. They usually are willing to help you find the information you need to study when getting started.

Sometimes our egos get in the way of asking another caller for such help and that is too bad. Without obtaining back issues of the notes, it is hard to catch up on all of the knowledge necessary to call these levels as there really aren't any books which explain the "hows" of calling them. Usually, the only place you can get back issues of notes is through a caller who has them. Most note services do not keep back issues and therefore do not have them to sell. We feel that if they did offer them for sale, they would be doing a service to all new callers.

As an Advanced and Challenge dancer, how much do you feel you contribute to the current square dance movement? Do you go out of your way to encourage your friends to join square dancing? Or, have you stopped doing this because they couldn't dance with you anyway? If you are an Advanced dancer, do you only attend Advanced clubs and hoedowns? Or, are you a Challenge dancer and only attend Challenge clubs and hoedowns? Do you remember when you last attended a Plus dance or hoedown?

If you answered yes to most of the above, and no to the last question, perhaps you should re-evaluate your position and current contribution to the overall square dance movement. If we lose sight of the need to provide dancers for the movement, and lose sight of the need to help dancers at the lower levels, we may just find ourselves in for some real problems if everyone were to become an Advanced or Challenge dancer.

We also may encounter great difficulty in finding dancers for the Advanced and Challenge levels as we all know they must start as new dancers and progress through the lower levels before a very few get into Advanced and Challenge. Do something nice for somebody, get them into square dancing. If we don't . . . where have all the dancers gone, the answer is blowin' in the wind. See you in a Star Tip!

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Stir The Bucket With Betty

This month's recipes are "tried and true" varieties. We hope you enjoy them as much as we have!

SUE'S BROCCOLI SALAD

- 2 medium bunches of broccoli, raw, washed and drained
- 1/2 cup sunflower seeds, roasted, salted
- 1 (8 oz.) bottle of Catalina dressing

Cut broccoli flowerets from stalk and into bite sized pieces. Place in large bowl. Add 1/2 cup sunflower seeds (use more if you're really into sunflower seeds) and toss lightly with broccoli. Pour whole bottle of dressing over broccoli and toss. Refrigerate until chilled. This is a crunchy, nutty salad that's proven in the past to be addicting.

BETTY'S VEAL CONCOCTION (Microwave)

- 2 lbs. veal stew meat, cubed
- 3 - 4 carrots, sliced thin, diagonally, or use frozen baby carrots
- 2 onions sliced
- 1/4 cup flour
- 1/2 cup bread crumbs
- 1 Tbsp. parsley flakes
- 1 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. pepper (I prefer a tad more)
- 3/4 cup chicken broth, undiluted
- mushrooms (optional)

Place veal, carrots and onion in a 3 quart casserole. Mix flour, bread crumbs and parsley together. Sprinkle over veal. Mix together wine, consomme, salt and pepper and pour over veal. Cover (Saranwrap works well) and



microwave on High for 15 minutes. Stir. If "gravy" is thick, thin with a dash of wine. Add mushrooms and continue cooking, covered, on High for 15 minutes. Test meat for tenderness and continue to cook with a stir and a "dash" until tender. Serve in a shallow bowl, dish or shell with wild rice, broccoli salad and green peas.

BARBARA'S CHERRY DUMP CAKE

This is the best variation of a dump cake I've ever tasted. It was, without a doubt, one of those memorable birthday celebration cakes. Keep it in mind for your next celebration.

- 1 (20 oz.) can crushed pineapple
- 1 (21 oz.) can cherry pie filling
- 1 box yellow cake mix
- 1 cube + 2 Tbsp. butter, melted
- 1/2 cup nuts, chopped
- Cool Whip or whipped cream

Grease a 9x13 baking pan. Spread pineapple evenly over bottom of pan. Pour cherry filling on top. Spread cake mix from box (dry) over cherries. Drizzle melted butter over cake mix. Sprinkle nuts over top. Bake at 350° for 1 hour or until done. Serve with whipped cream.

THE CARE AND FEEDING OF PETTICOATS

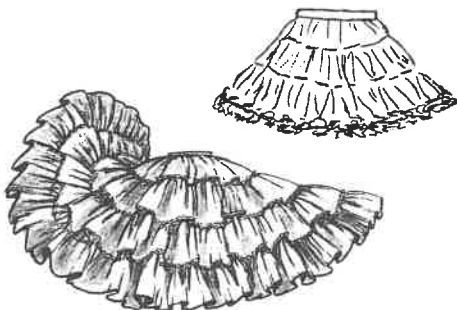
The other day a friend stopped by the house after school. Since she followed me home, I lacked time to pick up the living room and Maria was a bit confused by what she saw. The living room was polkadotted with open umbrellas dressed atop with crisp clean petticoats. She never has understood the square dancing phenomenon!

Is it time for your petticoat to be freshened up? Were you happy with the petticoat after its last laundering? Was it a bright white or a dingy greyish white? I have a few good suggestions, collected over the years, to pass on to you.

Everybody has their favorite method of refurbishing the petticoat. Here are a few of the most popular methods of sprucing it up:

First of all, let's look at getting that netting back to a crisp color, even white. The most "tried and true" method is to use 1 cup of Cascade automatic dishwasher detergent to one washer tub of very warm to hot water on a setting of "pre-soak". After the petticoat, waist encircling the center washer post, has completed its pre-wash cycle, rinse it thoroughly or run through a regular wash cycle.

Now the slip is ready to spread over an open umbrella which has been propped up between the pillows of the couch. Pull out the lace and layers of tulle or nylon.



Allow to dry completely (usually overnight) before removing.

Nothing pulls down a petticoat faster than being hung. Add the weight of the water and before long that petticoat is truly "flat". Drying a petticoat on top of an open umbrella helps to eliminate or, at least, slow down the "going flat" process.

Let's say your petticoat color can still be brightened, but the pouf has gone pft-t-t! My favorite way of reviving petticoats is to use the following materials: "Future" floor wax (or any of the acrylic floor waxes which will not yellow), and a round oil pan (look for a clean, new one out in the garage), or use the bathtub or a large sink. Dip the clean petticoat into the pan into which you've poured about one quart of acrylic floor wax. Make sure the whole petticoat is saturated. Pull upward by the waistband, allowing the floor wax to drip into the pan (save the excess wax to reuse another time). When dripping has ceased, shake lightly,

then spread petticoat over an old, open umbrella. Preferably dry the petticoat outside on the patio (not in direct sunlight); but if weather is inclement, spread papers on the floor under the umbrella to catch wayward drips of floor wax. Dry thoroughly before removing; your petticoat will be stiff again.

A second way of stiffening is to use powdered milk. Yep, that's right, powdered milk!! Mix 1 cup Carnation (doesn't leave an odor) powdered milk with 3 cups water; blend well. Dip petticoat in mixture and allow to soak up all of the mixture. Spread out to dry. The milk may tend to stain an umbrella or carpeting, so be prepared.

Fishermen beware!! Your wives may be dipping into your 30 lb. test monofilament fish line any day now!! Zigzag stitch the line to all tiers of your petticoat along the seams. A 100 yard spool will usually do one petticoat. Washing will not effect the line except for hot water.

Extremely hot temperatures tend to shrink the line. This is Marti's favorite method of revitalizing a petticoat.

Here's another idea that works! Use 3 oz. of Elmer's White Glue to 3 quarts of water. Dunk the petticoat, thoroughly saturating the skirt, and allow to drip excess liquid. Spread over your umbrella and dry.

If you don't want to be bothered with the dip and dry methods, try this one. Wash and spin dry your petticoat. Lay it on a flat surface or on a hanger and spray each layer with spray starch. Quickly place in dryer and dry at a low temperature for a couple of minutes. One can of spray usually does three petticoats.

Marti and I hope these ideas will help you save that favorite petticoat. If you have a secret formula you'd like to share with us on adding pouf to your petticoat, send it our way! New ideas are always welcome!



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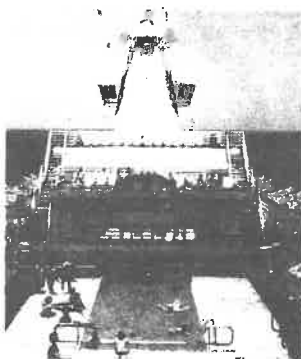
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ROUNDS FOR SQUARE DANCERS

Most of us agree that round dancing is half of the square dance program and is a complement to the program. To me, it is like icing on the cake.

Just what does round dancing mean to the square dancer and the square dance program?

A square dance club that has a good percentage of dancers doing rounds is a stronger club, has more and better visitations, and the survival rate has proven to be far greater. Why? The club offers a more diversified program for the dancers, smoother dancers are developed, and the round dancer adds to the financial soundness of the club.

Every club should have a basic round dance class. It is the teacher's responsibility to thoroughly teach the basics to the beginning dancers. The teacher who starts by teaching dancers or routines, instead of basics first, is destroying potential dancers for your club. This leads to frustration and eventually dropouts, and is doing our square and round dance activities a disservice. If the round dance basics are thoroughly imbedded in dancers' minds, they can dance with confidence and enjoyment.

What should be taught in round dance basics? The biggest share of our round dances are two-steps and waltzes. Naturally, we spend most of our time and efforts on these. I also believe we should cover the very basic steps in cha cha, rhumba, tango and swing. Some of these



steps have always been in our rounds, and I have found that most new dancers like the change of rhythm from the two-step and waltz. Several square dancer's rounds have the very basic cha cha, rhumba and swing steps, along with the two-step, in the dance routine. These can be used in some of the early dances that are taught.

You ask, what does all this have to do with rounds for the square dancer? This is a very important part of this program. If the new dancers receive a good basic foundation, they can visit any square dance club and dance the rounds with no problems, if they are cued.

Second, should rounds be cued or not? I believe they should be. We have found in our traveling that the clubs which have the round dances cued have floors full of dancers, whereas the non-cued clubs have a very small percentage of round dancers. Why is this?

For years, we have had square dancers say that it is too much to try to memorize all of the rounds and this is the reason they don't round dance.

How many square dancers would

we have if we had to memorize each call and dance it just to the music. The caller is cueing you through the squares just as a round dance cuer is cueing you through the rounds.

Most of the square dancer's rounds or Rounds of the Month are made up of basic figures. Once in a while, a dance has a gimmick figure or a low-level intermediate step in it. This is easily taught and the balance of the dance can be done from cues.

Again you ask, why is this necessary? Remember, we have dancers who are new — ones who have danced three or four years — and some who have danced ten to fifteen years or longer. We all need something new, something different and maybe a little challenging once in a while.

We should plan a well-rounded dance program that is enjoyable to everyone. Some dancers have lost interest in square dancing because of the round dance programs, and have joined just a round dance club.

We can't afford to lose any square dancers!

It's a tough job for round dance chairmen to choose dances that will please all of the dancers. Most round dancers, even though they may not care for a certain dance, will still be on the floor dancing. They are the first to fill the squares for the next set, as they are not sitting on the sidelines, involved in conversations that have to be finished before they can dance. Don't put dances on the program that only two or three couples will do. Play these before or after the dance.

What do we really need for "rounds for the square dancer"? 1. A very thorough and well-rounded basics class; 2. Cues for those who need them; and 3. A program that all dancers can dance and enjoy.

Here are some final suggestions: Let's all take the very positive attitude that round dancing is half of the square dance program. Make it an interesting and enjoyable program each dance.

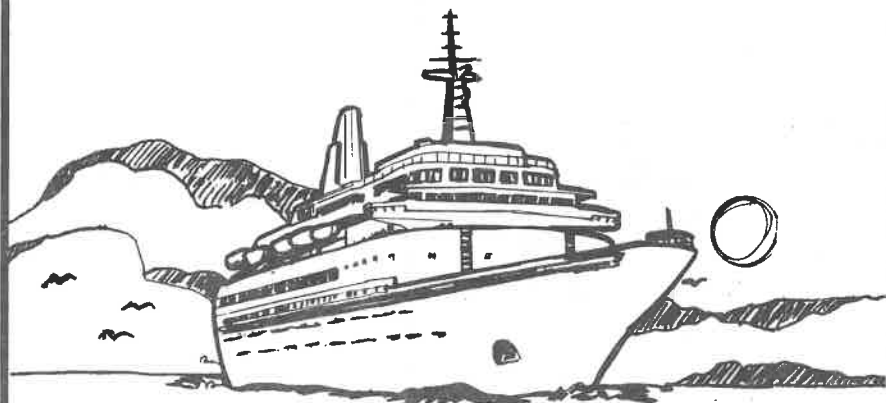
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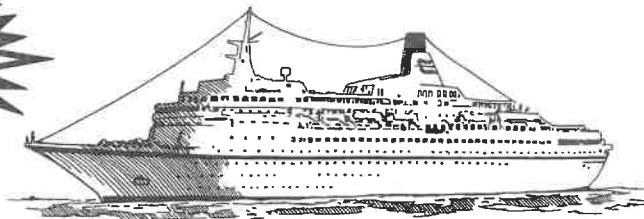
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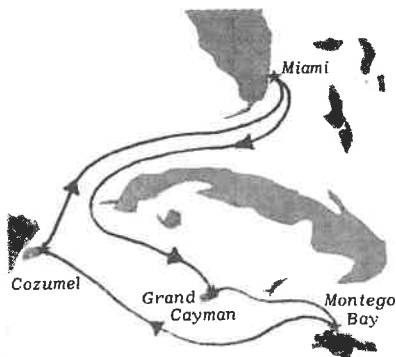
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PROMPTER PROFILE

Jim & Joann Osborne

Square dance callers come in many different styles and breeds, from those who call as a full-time profession to those who call an occasional one-night stand. In between are the large number of callers with dual careers who spend 40+ hours a week in another profession and an additional many hours each week as a caller. This month's featured caller runs a full-time electronics business and also spends several nights a week calling and teaching the art of square dancing.

Jim Osborne is a "true" native. He was born and raised in San Jose. Jim graduated from high school in Mountain View, where his parents still live. In 1966 Jim was offered the opportunity to "enjoy" the U. S. Navy for four years. He was trained as an electronics technician, which was to come in very handy later on in life. Thirty-nine of his forty-eight months of service life was spent on the ocean, making three cruises to the western Pacific (read that as Viet Nam).

Jim is the kind of entrepreneur you read about in "The Wall Street Journal". After getting out of the Navy, he worked for several years as manager of a two-way radio shop. He also did a considerable amount of electronics design work. In 1979, he decided he had worked for others long enough and started his own company, Selectone Corporation of Hayward. Selectone builds tone-signaling equipment for two-way radios. Jim has recently opened a Selectone division in Australia and more than 30% of the



company's sales come from outside the United States.

Jim started square dancing in 1970 with the Bows and Beaus of Mountain View; Jerry denBroeder was the caller. He later danced with Ken Oburn and the Ankle Knockers. His first attempt at calling came at an amateur night with the Bows and Beaus. He recalls it as a "memorable" experience. He attended Bill Peters' Callers' Class in 1975 and then taught classes for the Bows and Beaus. Jim started calling for the Cross Trailers in 1977 and called for them for more than two years.

Jim began calling for his present clubs, the San Jose See Saws and the Township Twirlers, in 1980. With their weekly club nights, plus

their beginner classes, he's kept rather busy. In addition, he's a member of the Santa Clara Valley Callers Association and the Northern California Callers Association.

Joann Osborne was born in Minnesota, but moved to California when she was five years old. Joann is one of nine children. She was introduced to square dancing early in life by her parents, Andy and Velma Van Derostyne, who dance with the Square Hoppers and Dancers' Choice. She met Jim through a beginners class being taught by Feriss Eddington called the "Bright Eyes and Bushy Tails" Singles Class. Jim and Joann were married in 1982, and their son, Ray David, was born in 1983. Joann previously taught elementary school (2nd to 4th grades) in Hayward, but now stays home to take care of Ray.

Jim has been involved with ham radio since high school. In addition to his tone-signaling equipment business, Jim started a two-way radio site leasing business about ten

years ago. Erow Communications consists of a "mountain top" where Bay Area companies can lease antenna space for their radio telephone transmitting. As Jim says, "I spend lots of time on mountain tops."

The Osborne house is a "study" in computer controlled electronics. A computer controls the lights, the sprinkler system, the heating and cooling, etc. In addition, the security system not only turns on lights in the Osborne house, but Jim has also wired the neighbors' lights into the system so when one drives into their court, lights come on everywhere. In addition, everything can also be remotely controlled from Jim's car. Seems like you'd have to be an electronics technician just to keep this system running.

Jim enjoys square dancing and plans to keep on calling as long as there are dancers who want to dance. Sounds like he's got a long-term proposition.

Most callers use a combination of these techniques in their programming. Although reading cards is not often seen at the Mainstream and Plus levels, it is seen more frequently at the Advanced and Challenge levels due to the complexity of the choreography. Anyway, what I'm leading up to is a little story about Dave Stevens.

Dave has a set of pink cards and a set of green cards. When he's using cards, he watches the floor and cues the moves using a combination of sight calling and his cards. When he finishes with one card, he turns it over and picks up the next one (these are big stacks of cards — say 150 in each stack). Well, at the recent Napa Weekend some ingenious person had obtained blank cards of the same color and size as Dave's and had written messages on the cards and inserted them into Dave's stacks. Can you

imagine being on stage, calling along and when you read your next card it says, "Life is like being on a mule train. Unless you're the lead mule, all the scenery looks about the same." Dave handled it well, but I probably would have broken down completely with laughter.

The subject of cards brings to mind the first newer dancer hoedown Betty and I attended. The dance was called by Duane Nelson, who used pre-written sequences entirely; material which we found very interesting and challenging. Duane has recently retired and I would like to give him a belated thank you for his dedication and calling, particularly for that newer dancer hoedown several years back.

to learn (because they are on the lists) which they will seldom if ever dance. Second, that if CALLERLAB is to keep its recommended dancing programs up-to-date, they must put in place a plan to conduct a similar study on a periodic basis. Third, and perhaps most important, we feel that the study shows that callers have already created, by not using many moves, a reduced length program for Plus dancers today.

This year, for the first time in three years, members of CALLERLAB will have the opportunity to reduce the number of moves on the Mainstream Program. However, because of a self-imposed restriction (only three moves may be eliminated in one year), CALLERLAB cannot hope to deal with the problem within a reasonable time. We urge CALLERLAB to put in place a more comprehensive plan to deal with this "numbers game" and recognize reality.
