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PUBLISHER'S PATTER

Although this is the April issue of The Prompter, due to publishing and printing lead times, these words are actually being written the first week in March. Within the last ten minutes I have been talking to some colleagues in Philadelphia and New York and learned that the entire Eastern Seaboard is shut down by an intense snowstorm. Airports are closed, schools are out of session, banks and offices are closed, and in deference to the cold (in the teens at 11:00 a.m.), people are staying inside and enjoying the fire. It makes me glad to be here in sunny California where the temperature is supposed to hit 70° today.

I'm sure the cold has considerable impact on square dancing activities also. Square dancing on the East Coast is considerably different then it is here in California. Clubs usually meet only two nights a month (instead of weekly as they do here), and many of the club nights are Friday or Saturday. Not only does this limit the opportunities for club dancing, but it also reduces the occurrences of hoedowns with

out-of-town callers. (In essence, the club night is a "mini-hoedown".) The result of all this is that any hoedown (such as the Banana Fling or the Sweetheart Special here in San Jose) draws dancers who drive greater distances than they might here in California.

Anyway, can you just imagine being on the planning staff for one of these kinds of events and having to take the weather into consideration? A hard rainstorm here might reduce dance attendance by a couple of squares, but what would three inches of snow falling on Saturday evening do to the dance?? To say nothing of the effects of a major snowstorm!! It's nice to be a Californian!!

There is a major square dancing event just around the corner for dancers in this area. This is the 37th Silver State Square Dance Festival being held in Reno, June 1 - 3. The line-up of callers includes Rhythm Records' Wade Driver and Kip Garvey. Filling out the bill is Paul Marcum from Tennessee and

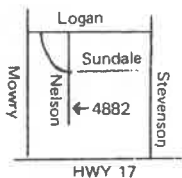

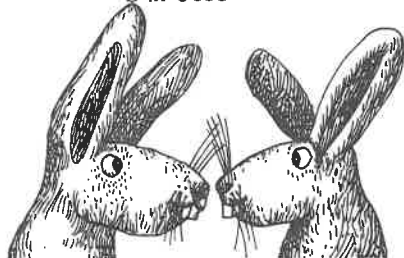

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Fashionable Thoughts by Martibel



We have recently come across some timely and informative sewing articles which we think you will find of value. This article is courtesy of Simplicity Pattern Company.

SHEERS

The feminine sheers, voile, chiffon and georgette are enjoying new popularity. Made of synthetics, they now have the added appeal of easy care.

One challenge remains: Seams, edges and thread-ends show through and must be neat and inconspicuous. Delicate fabrics must be handled carefully. Here are some helpful pointers.

A sheer may be backed with opaque fabrics or self-fabric, but then ceases to be a sheer and is handled as any other fabric. The following refers to unbacked woven sheers.

PATTERN CHOICE: Sheers, whether soft or crisp, are feminine in appearance and lend themselves

to designs with fullness. Even a tailored style will take on a softer look. Check the suggested fabrics on the pattern envelope. For a garment with buttonholes in front, a top-stitched band which can be interfaced or a fly front which conceals buttonholes is particularly suitable. To avoid unsightly facings, see other suggestions below.

FACINGS and INTERFACINGS: Whenever possible, avoid facings that show through to the right side. For example, a whole bodice may be cut double; the neck edge in a collar application may be finished with a bias strip rather than with a facing.

When facings must be used, as in collars, cuffs and buttonhole areas, a lightweight interfacing is also used, making these areas opaque. This sheer-opaque combination is often found in good ready-to-wear. Neck and sleeve edges may be finished with narrow French binding or faced with a bias strip.

MARKING and BASTING: Mark with tailor's tacks; other marks will



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show through on right side and pins may slip out. Soft sheers may require handbasting to prevent shifting.

STITCHING: For machine sewing use a universal ballpoint machine needle no. 11. To avoid damaging the fabric use a fresh machine needle. Set machine at 12-14 stitches per inch.

When straight-stitching with a zigzag machine, use the small hole throat plate to prevent fabric being drawn into the hole; or, on machines with an adjustable needle position, put needle in left or right position (check seam allowance).

If sheer fabric catches in feed dog, place strips of tissue paper under seams when stitching. After stitching, tear away tissue.

SEAMS: The following are neat and narrow and are especially recommended for sheer fabrics.

FRENCH SEAM: With wrong sides together, stitch a plain seam a scant $1/2$ " from raw edges. Trim seam allowances to $1/8$ ".



Press seam allowances to one side. Fold work on stitched line, wrong side out. Stitch again $1/8$ " from fold (this will be on regular seamline allowed).



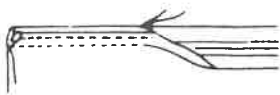
The finished French Seam may be made wider, as long as the total used in the seam does not exceed $5/8$ ".



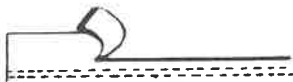
MOCK FRENCH SEAM: Stitch plain seam. Fold seam allowances to half their width.



Bring folded edges together. Stitch near edge.

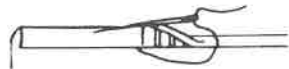


DOUBLE-STITCHED SEAMS: With right sides together, as usual, stitch a plain seam. Make a second line of stitching in seam allowance about $1/8$ " from stitched seamline. Trim close to second line. Press to one side.



HEMS: In straight dirndl skirts, make hems 3" to 8" wide. In circular skirts, make narrow hems. Before marking hem, hang garment for 48 hours to allow it to stretch.

Simplified rolled hem: Allow $1/4$ " for hem. Fold in raw edge $1/8$ ". Slip needle through fold and anchor thread. Take a tiny stitch in garment below raw edge, then slip needle through fold; repeat as shown with stitches about $1/4$ " apart. After every few stitches, draw up the thread to form a roll.



PRESSING: Test first on a fabric sample. Some sheers cannot be steamed and some may require a low or synthetic setting. Use caution always.

DARTS: Make dart as usual. Make a second line of stitching within dart, $1/8$ " from first; trim close to second line.

CLOSURES: If buttonholes or loops are to be made, use a lightweight interfacing. Make bound buttonholes only in interfaced areas where construction will not show through; make small buttonholes with narrow corded lips. Machine worked buttonholes may be used as is or finished by hand with silk twist or a single strand of embroidery floss. Button loops may be corded or uncorded. Other closures include covered snaps, hooks and eyes, or tiny buttons with thread loops.

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HOT CRAB DIP

8 oz. crabmeat
8 oz. cream cheese
2 Tbsp. milk
2 Tbsp. chopped onion
1 Tbsp. horseradish
salt & pepper to taste

Combine all ingredients and blend well. Place in ovenproof casserole and sprinkle with slivered almonds. Bake at 375° for 20 minutes. Serve with toasted rounds or crackers of your choice.

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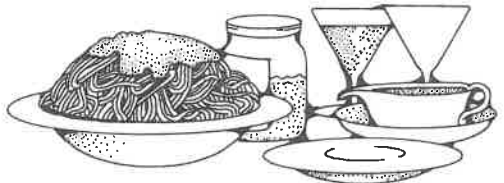


BIBB LETTUCE VINAGRETTE

4 heads bibb or butter lettuce
2 hardboiled eggs, chopped coarsely
2 Tbsp. shoestring beets
1/2 tsp. chopped chives
vegetable or olive oil
wine vinegar
English dry mustard
salt & pepper to taste

Remove outer leaves from lettuce heads and cut hearts in half. Wash, dry and chill. To serve, place lettuce hearts in bowl and top with condiments. Make a French dressing of 2 parts oil and 1 part vinegar, adding mustard and seasonings to taste. Pour over salad.

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SEAFOOD TETRAZZINI

1 (8 oz.) pkg. spaghetti, vermicelli or fettuccini
2 cups tomato juice
1 lb. raw shrimp
1 1/2 lbs. raw scallops
2 tsp. salt
1 tsp. caraway seeds
2 Tbsp. vinegar
2 Tbsp. butter
2 Tbsp. flour
2 cups milk
1/4 cup sherry

Cook pasta until tender. Drain. Pour tomato juice over pasta and cook slowly for 30 minutes, stirring frequently. Set aside, keeping warm. Peel shrimp, combine with scallops and cover with boiling water. Add salt, caraway seeds and vinegar. Cook 20 minutes, drain. Make a cream sauce by melting butter and blending in flour until smooth and bubbly. Add milk and stir to blend

to a sauce texture. Add drained seafood to sauce, season with sherry and combine with spaghetti mixture. Transfer to larger baking dish (2 quart), dot with butter and broil 4 inches from flame until surface is golden brown. Serve hot.

Serves 6 to 8

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PEACH FLAMBE TROCADERO

4 peaches, peeled and quartered
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1 tsp. grated lemon rind

1 tsp. grated orange rind

1 Tbsp. sweet butter

2 Tbsp. sugar

raspberry jelly or preserves

4 scoops vanilla ice cream

1 jigger Cointreau

1 jigger cognac

1 jigger kirsh

1/2 cup toasted, sliced almonds

Use a chafing dish to melt butter with sugar and rinds. Cook slowly until almost caramelized. Add peaches, 1 Tbsp. jelly or jam and



Cointreau. Warm fruit slowly in the sauce. Dish ice cream into bowls or glasses. Add cognac and kirsh to chafing dish and ignite! Top ice cream with flaming peaches and sauce, sprinkle with almonds. Garnish with a dollop of jelly. Serve immediately.

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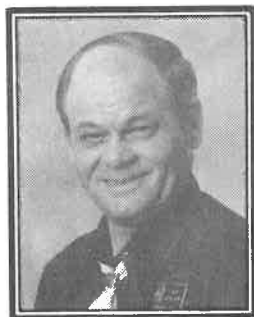
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BEYOND MAINSTREAM

PEEL THE TOP
(CALLERLAB Plus Call #24)

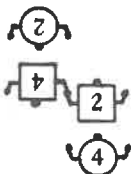
DEFINITION

(CALLERLAB April 1983) Starting formation: Z formation or Box Circulate. The lead dancers Peel Off as the trailing dancers step straight forward and take adjacent hands; everyone then does a Fan the Top.

(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #1620.)

PEEL THE TOP (Example #1)

From Sides Pass the Ocean, Swing Thru, Girls Fold...



The lead dancers Peel Off as the trailing dancers step straight forward and take adjacent hands;...



everyone then does a Fan the Top (centers cast 3/4 while the ends move up 1/4).



PEEL THE TOP (Example #2)

From Heads Touch 1/4...



The lead dancers Peel Off as the trailing dancers step straight forward and take adjacent hands;...



everyone then does a Fan the Top (centers cast 3/4 while the ends move up 1/4).



DANCING HINTS

When executed properly, Peel the Top is a smooth forward-flowing Plus call that can give you a large amount of dancing enjoyment. As with all 'Peel' calls, the dancers are arranged in the standard "leaders" and "trailers" type of formation.

When you are a lead dancer, you must cleanly execute the Peel Off action such that you only accomplish the 'roll back' action before you start the 'move up 1/4' action. As a lead dancer, you will

have the advantage of being able to accomplish your actions in one smooth, forward-flowing motion. Additionally, you will finish the call with your inside hand joined with the dancers who started immediately behind you.

The trailing dancers at the start of the call have the advantage of knowing exactly which dancer they will have hands joined with at the end of the call. As a 'trailer', you will complete the call with the dancer who starts as a 'leader' immediately in front of you; and you are in a position to gently control the exact spot on the floor

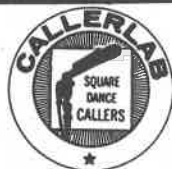
where the call will end. Since some original lead dancers hesitate to 'move up 1/4', your precise positioning can let this dancer know exactly where she/he should end the call.

Peel the Top dances extremely well using 6 beats of music; so there is no need to 'rush' the call. The original lead dancers have a tendency to want to hurry (probably due to having to accomplish their action using 'no hands'); but the original trailing dancers can 'steady them' (or slow them down) by dancing their part of the call correctly.

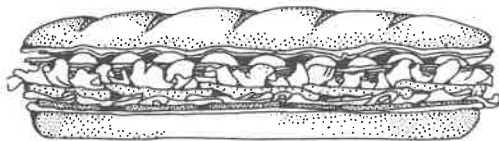

Selection Committee, have announced that there will be no new quarterly figures. Both committees feel there are currently no available calls worthy of placement on the lists.



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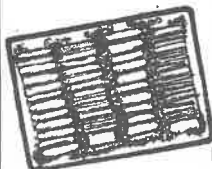

We are sure this action resulted from the many letters and petitions that they received from all over the United States. The NFDC sent a packet of square dance information to each member of the Post Office & Civil Service Committee in January.

Badge Flyer - We are very grateful for the response of badge donations from the November mailout. We want to thank all publications, dancers' associations, and callers' associations who

reprinted and distributed the flyer. We have shipped fifty-six orders to nineteen states. The donations will enable us to send information to all of you more often. Thanks!!

Your Help is Still Needed - Send letters and petitions to Katie Hall, Chairwoman Subcommittee on Census & Population, and to William Ford, Chairman Post Office & Civil Service Committee. Express a desire for them to expedite Committee consideration of HR 1706 - S 1448 for a permanent designation and report it to the House for a vote as soon as possible.

With all of us working together diligently, we will surely be rewarded with the "permanent designation" for the "Square Dance the National Folk Dance of the United States of America" by our Congress.

Bill Introduced to Designate Square Dancing as State Dance

State Senator John T. Doolittle recently announced the introduction of legislation which would designate the square dance as the official state dance.

In commenting on the bill, Senator Doolittle said, "The square dance is a uniquely attractive art form that remains a vibrant and entertaining part of California folklore.

"We have distinctive and meaningful symbols of our ideals in our state's flag, and we have recognized a number of things in

our culture which have historical significance (state motto, nickname, colors, song, mineral, rock, fish, insect, tree, flower, etc.), but nowhere have we paid tribute to the square dance which was first associated with the American people in 1651.

"The square dance is enjoyed by over 250,000 people in California, and it has been one dance traditionally recognized by the American people as a dignified and enjoyable expression of American folk dancing."

By the time you receive this edition, you may still be able to get tickets to the Advanced and Challenge Spectacular on April 6, 7 & 8. The Spectacular will have limited space for Advanced dancers this year. However, it may be filled by now. If not, be sure and attend.

Last night at the Almaden Squares (little plug there), we were dancing a combination of A-2 and C-1. This seems to be the trend for this club nowadays since many of the dancers in the club are dancing C-2 and up. Those who are not dancing these levels yet are taking C-1 in a sneaky Monday night operation called by a prominent female caller who has a lot to do with this magazine (another little plug).

One of the club members, who dances C-2, rained on us a bit

about the number of Advanced and Challenge experimentals (not to mention Mainstream and Plus) that dancers are expected to keep up on in these levels. He mentioned that his flash card pile for experimentals was almost as thick as his flash cards for C-2. He admitted he has a negative attitude about experimentals in general, so when he is asked to do it "With Confidence", he doesn't because he doesn't like experimentals anyway.

This is not the first, and we are sure it won't be the last, time we have heard this complaint. We wonder how many Advanced and Challenge dancers feel the same way? Drop us a line and let us know your feelings.

We were requested recently to vote on the current Advanced Quarterly Experimental list. This was a vote on which moves to retain and which to drop. We voted to drop most all of them. Maybe other callers will do the same and that will help. If you dancers think you have problems, we (five of us involved at the Advanced level) sat here while writing this article and tried to name the six AQS figures and only got five out of six without looking them up. For your information, here they are: Mini-Busy, Cross Double Your Pleasure, Linear Action, Change Lanes, Shadow to a Diamond and Zing. Hang in there, for this list could be ten calls maximum at any one time.

We have stated, in past articles in this magazine, that we are in favor of dropping the QS calls in Mainstream and Plus. We feel the

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same way at Advanced and Challenge levels (Ditto!! Ed.). It has always been and will remain our feeling that if "the dancers", and we think it is mostly "the callers", want to have new figures to dance or try out, they should be taken from the list just above the level that they are now dancing or calling. CALLERLAB has rules against this, although the reasoning escapes us.

It would seem that rather than use valuable dancing time to learn figures that may or may not survive, it would be better to use figures that have been around and are established on a higher list. This would allow the dancers to have some exposure to the figures and concepts at the next level without them having to go full bore into it. If they decide later to go on up to the next level, they will already have possibly nailed down several figures from that level. We notice that Mike Sikorsky is of the same opinion, be sure to read his article elsewhere in this issue.

We have said it before and we



will say it again, YOU as a dancer have to assume some control over the things you are dancing. If you feel as we do, write to CALLERLAB, Box 679, Pocono Pines, PA 18350 and make your wishes known. Do it now!! CALLERLAB will be meeting April 15 - 18.

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MIKE & GAIL SEASTROM

You may never have thought of going to the dentist as fun, but when the dentist is Mike Seastrom practicing his "second profession" as a caller, going to the dentist can be a "painless" experience.

Mike and Gail Seastrom live in Northridge, a suburb of Los Angeles. Mike has a dental office in nearby Tarzana, and calls dances throughout California (with an occasional swing through other parts of the U.S.). The Seastroms have been married 13 years and have two children, a son 6 and a daughter 16 months.

Everyone has heard about the want-ad for a 30 year old with a college degree and 20 years of experience — and Mike just about fills the bill! Although he is only 34 years old, Mike has 22 years of calling experience.

Born in Culver City, Mike started dancing with a teen class in 1960 when he and his brother and sisters lost a bet with their mother on a Rose Bowl game. (They had agreed that if their team lost they would try square dancing for three lessons.) In spite of a shaky start — Mike fell during the first night of class and suffered a bloody nose — he soon became an avid square dancer.

When Mike was in the 6th grade, his class learned "square dancing" — and which Mike soon realized was really folk dancing. He borrowed some records from his caller to show his classmates what modern square dancing was like and ended up teaching a class at school. By the time he was 12, Mike was



teaching a beginners class for his teen club.

By the time he was in high school, Mike was calling 3 to 4 nights a week, singing in choir and glee clubs, playing guitar in a band, and playing fullback and linebacker well enough on the football team to be named all-league. A shoulder injury during his senior year ended Mike's football career and a potential scholarship to Cornell University.

Gail, who was born in Lynwood, not too many miles from Culver City, met Mike at a school dance during high school. As Mike recalls, "Gail was looking for someone else and found me!" Gail learned to

square dance (the "hard" way -- she never went through a class) so she could continue to see Mike. "He played football every Saturday night and called every Friday night, so I learned to dance."

Mike started his college education in New Mexico, transferring to San Diego State when he and Gail were married. They returned to the Los Angeles area when Mike attended dental school at USC. Although the school workload limited his time for week-night calling, Mike continued to call on the weekends.

Many of Mike's dental patients are dancers and callers. ("We schedule callers early in the day so their mouths can 'wake up' in time to call an evening dance.") The waiting room in Mike's office reflects his interests -- there are plenty of square dancing books and magazines along with flyers for dances and beginners classes.

Gail likes being a caller's taw and they both view the calling business as a partnership. Gail really enjoys people and Mike finds

that Gail has more time to "get around and talk to the dancers than I do". Gail has solved the problem of finding someone to dance with; their clubs maintain a "dance card" for the caller's taw. The idea is popular with both taws and dancers and Gail reports that the practice is spreading around the Los Angeles area.

Mike and Gail are out calling 3 or 4 times a week, including a number of weekend events. Mike has been recording for several years and currently is on the staff of Circle D records. The Seastroms enjoy round dancing whenever they get the chance, and also enjoy prompting and teaching Contras.

As their children get older, Mike and Gail look forward to having more time for camping, sports activities, traveling -- and for their favorite activity, square dancing!

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"I THINK I'LL WRITE AN ARTICLE..."

I'm on the Mainstream Quarterly Selections Committee and I just received my ballot. We're supposed to vote for the new Mainstream (MS) Quarterly Selection (QS). By the time you read this article, you will probably have already danced the new call a few times. (Editor's note: No new Mainstream Quarterly was selected.)

The choice was between three new calls, and "no new movements". Once again, faithfully, I voted for "no new movements". Maybe I'm in the minority on this one, but I have an opinion that I would like to share.

My experience has been that when people go to a dance, they want to dance. They don't want to workshop. If they want to workshop, they go to a workshop. At least, it's that way at the Mainstream and Plus levels, and those are the levels at which most people dance.

Callerlab has done a great deal of good for square dancing, and I'm proud to be a member of that fine organization. For those of you who have been dancing 7 or 8 years, think back to the time when you were taught 2 or 3 new calls every Friday and Saturday night, and the next weekend you'd get a half dozen more, all different from the prior week! There was a legitimate reason for this occurrence. Many callers and dancers alike felt the "fun" level dances (the name for

open dances at the time) had become somewhat stale. Not only had there been no new calls added to the "basics" list in a long time, "All Position Dancing", or "Dancing By Definition", was a virtually unknown commodity, under any name.

Most dancers and callers wanted some new calls, but we all longed for some system which would unify the callers in their selection of material to be taught. When Callerlab started the Mainstream Quarterly Selection program (MSQS), that meant we all taught the same 1 or 2 calls every quarter. In unison, I think, we all knelt down and kissed our Burlasons.

The MSQS has brought us a lot of good calls: Recycle, Track II, Coordinate and Ferris Wheel, to name a few.

That's the past. Now, let's examine the present. I have one very important question to ask: Has the Quarterly Selections program outlived its usefulness?

Dancers have to learn an awful lot just to get to the Plus level anymore, and when they get there, I think they want to relax for awhile. As it stands now, a Plus dancer is responsible for learning the Plus Quarterly Selections, and the Mainstream Quarterly Selections as well. Since there's a maximum of 2 calls per quarter per level, that means each Plus dancer must learn as many as 4 new calls per quarter! That's a lot of learning for a person who just wants to dance. Especially when you consider that the choice belongs to the caller,

not the dancer. Then next quarter, there can be as many as 4 more, and chances are you won't hear the other 4 again. If, by chance, one of these calls becomes popular enough to add permanently to the Plus list, then you've made the Plus level that much harder to achieve for the next year's grads.

Since I don't like to identify a problem without proposing a solution or two, here goes:

Suspend all Plus and Mainstream Quarterly Selections for 3 years, and then re-evaluate. Currently, many Plus dancers have either not mastered that level, or enjoy it as it is, or both.

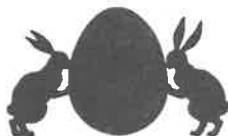
As a caller, there is more than enough material currently at both Mainstream and Plus with which to provide an interesting and fun dance, without use of the Quarterly Selections.

As a dancer, if you want to learn more, why not learn the next level? Relaxing at the Plus dances on the weekend while learning A-1 during the week is a popular thing to do. That way, those who want to

learn more can, and those who don't want to don't have to. The choice then becomes totally yours.

As a dancer who wants to learn more, spend your time learning the next level. That way you'll be learning a definite list of calls that you will use again, and will be expected to remember. And when you're finished, you will have accomplished something. Why spend your time learning calls that there's a 90+% chance you'll never hear again after the current 3 months are up? A feeling of accomplishment is a great deal more satisfying.

As I stated earlier, these are my opinions. Your opinions, whether you agree or disagree, in whole or in part, are welcome. Remember, your opinion is of no value to anyone else until it is expressed.

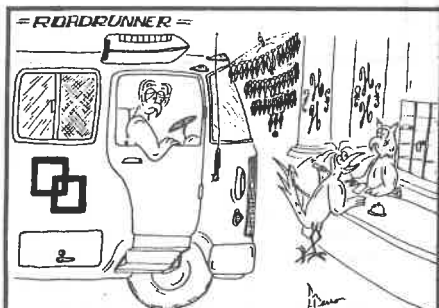

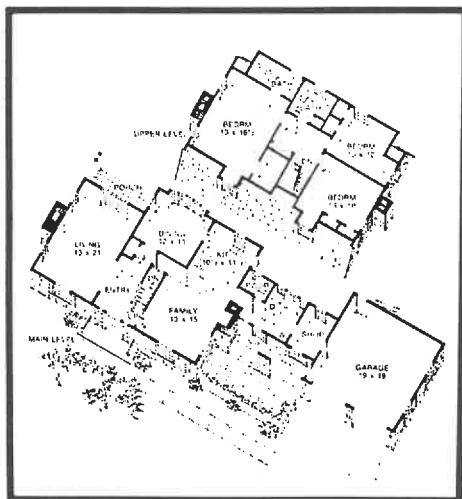
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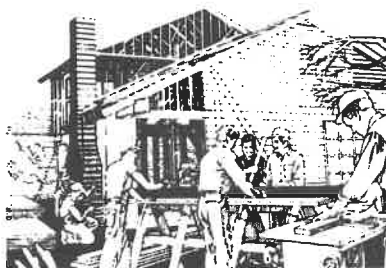

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33RD National Square Dance Convention® Baltimore, Maryland June 28, 29, 30, 1984

WHERE TO STAY ON THE BAY IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM THE CONVENTION HOUSING COMMITTEE

We are now making housing assignments. After receiving the names of the convention registrants assigned to them, it is up to each hotel or motel to notify the persons involved and request a deposit to hold the room reservations. Since they are dealing with a number of conventions, it may take some time. Please be patient and don't worry.

HOW DO WE GO ABOUT ASSIGNING HOUSING?

After those persons who registered at the Baltimore Pre-Convention Meeting and at the 32nd National Square Dance Convention in Louisville, housing assignments will be made on a first come, first served basis. When we cannot give you one of the choices you requested, we will match your choice of hotel or motel with what is available, using an equivalency matrix which takes into account both price range and distance. A great deal of time has gone into preparing this method, which we feel is about as fair as one could hope to be. We want everyone to have the cheapest housing, as well as that closest to downtown, available at the time their turn for housing assignment comes up.

The assignment of persons to specific rooms within a housing facility is the prerogative of the hotel or motel and will not be the responsibility of the convention. We forward to them requests for double or single rooms, as well as group requests. Other special needs will have to be dealt with by contacting the hotel you are assigned at the time you receive your confirmation from them. Remember also, that the Registration and Housing Committee has most of the hotel and motel rooms in metropolitan Baltimore under contract for our square dance convention. Persons desiring rooms at the convention rates can obtain same only by requesting them through the Convention Committee on the official Convention Registration Form.

Baltimore has a limited number of downtown hotel rooms — those within walking distance of the dance facilities. However, most other hotel and motel facilities are located within 20-30 minutes of the center of the city. Rest assured that transportation will be available on a reasonable schedule. And, don't forget that Washington, D.C., our nation's capital, is located about a 40 minute drive away, and hotel rooms around that city are plentiful.

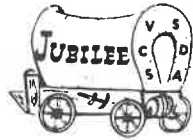
Rooms in downtown Baltimore are already filled. Demand for dormitory housing has been very heavy so that the high-rise dorms at Towson State
