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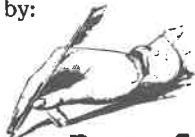

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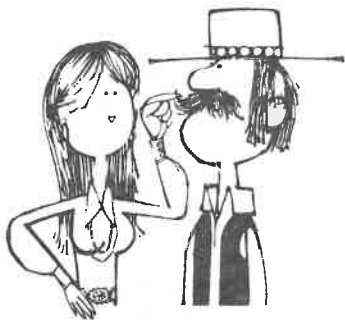
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# "OUR" OPINION !

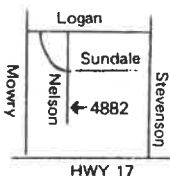

Enclosed is my solution to The Prompter Puzzler; I was working on it while on the bus to Reno.

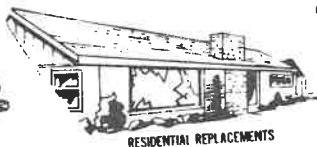

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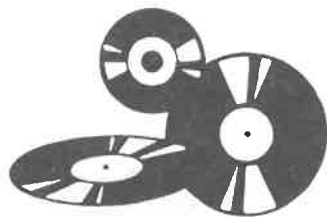
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# WHAT'S NEW!!

Sewing time again! This month, Authentic presents a two-in-one dress pattern, featuring a peasant style, midriff bodice with elasticised scoop neckline and short, puffed, raglan sleeves. The skirt is gored and gathered with a wide ruffle at the lower edge. They suggest we make the upper bodice and two of the gores of contrasting material. Then, there is an overskirt, also with midriff, shorter than the dress skirt with a ruffle at its lower edge, producing the effect of a double-ruffled skirt when worn over the dress. All right!! Two dresses for little more than the price and time for one!!

Fashions by Bettye, the company that makes just a few, beautifully designed and produced items each season, now has the most attractive, square dance jumper-sundress we've ever seen. It's made of two fabrics, a solid and a print or dotted swiss, giving the effect of an overdress, trimmed in eyelet. ## **CHOCOLATE ZUCCHINI CAKE**

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# Fashionable Thoughts by Martibel

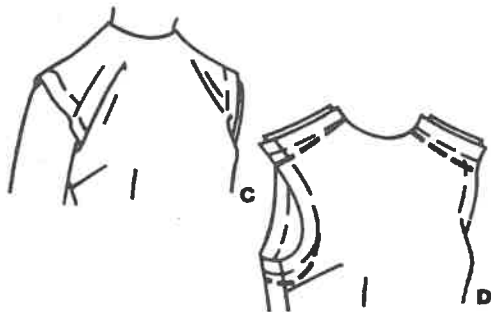


This month we continue with more suggestions from Vogue Pattern Company on how to correct the bodice of your dress so that it will fit "just right".

## HELP WANTED! FOR SLOPING SHOULDERS (Part 2)

Vertical wrinkles near the armhole signal that your shoulders slope **more** than the pattern's seams, a contour called "sloping shoulders" (C).

### SLOPING SHOULDERS



To mold the shoulder seam to your figure, open up the seams and lower the seamline at the end of the shoulder. Taper the seamline back into the original seamline at the neck (D).

To fix the related areas:

Increase the armhole seam allowance by the same amount the seamline was lowered at the end of the shoulder (D), using a French curve for the most precise results.

Adjust any armhole facings to match the new shoulder and underarm seamlines (there's no need

to change the seamline on set-in sleeves). Reposition the pattern symbols and notch markings accordingly.

### UNEVEN SHOULDERS

If you see wrinkles on just your right side, or just your left, your figure is like many — asymmetrical. Carrying a briefcase, wearing a shoulder bag, or holding a baby on one side, over a period of time, may cause one shoulder to slope more than the other. Correcting this is easy; simply open up the shoulder seam on the wrinkled side only, and reshape the seam to fit, as described above for "sloping shoulders". Be sure to make the related adjustments at the underarm on this side, too. Usually this is a minor adjustment, and because it erases the telltale wrinkle, your garment will actually look more balanced than if it were really symmetrical.

### OTHER SLEEVE STYLES

To fit the shoulder area on other sleeve styles, use the same principles as for set-in sleeves. For raglan sleeves, reshape the shoulder dart — shorten it and make it more shallow for square shoulders. For sloping shoulders, make the dart deeper and longer. For kimono and dolman sleeves (or other sleeves cut in one with the bodice), take in or let out the shoulder seams the required amount to fit the curve of the seam to your contours. Remember to correct the underarm curve to subtract or add the same amount for a proper fit.

## A Dancer's Opinion

Square dancing does have some obvious advantages over ballet. Where else but at a square dance would you get to see Ron Farni and Max Knauss embracing in a lively Do Sa Do without the possibility of arrest or even raised eyebrows. I don't mind a California Twirl with a tall gal, but does the caller ever allow a shortlegged guy extra time to "Walk Around Your Corner", especially when it's a day's hike (and so far I haven't dared to take any shortcuts).

Speaking of callers, have you ever noticed that while they're trying to think of something brilliant to say they call "Boys Trade" five times in a row! About the time I've done Zoom and Re-Zoom several dozen times I realize I'm going nowhere fast and decide I'll go to the pizza place on the next "Weave the Ring".

All in all, square dancing is probably still the best form of dance. Certainly most marriages will not survive round dancing. Disco dancing is guaranteed to slip a few discs. And where else can you goof up and then righteously cast the blame on seven other individuals with excellent probabilities of pulling it off — especially if the caller didn't see it!!

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# CHALLENGE



## ★ CORNER

First, we obviously have to thank A. Nonomus, of Sunnysvale, for suggesting the nomination for president. We are sure, however, that Fritz would not agree. Maybe he will after November.

Also, we checked again with our sources regarding the recent Advanced and Challenge Spectacular put on by PACE. Perhaps we are using the wrong sources (we think not), but they again stated that dancers had considerable problems handling the level called in the Advanced hall. While we support the PACE operations, and recognize their present and past leadership in the Challenge movement, we have heard from several callers in the area that their dancers have been blown away at PACE dances and would not go back. We have also been told that some callers actually tell their dancers not to go to PACE functions.

While we do not wish to get into a battle with PACE on this subject, we feel there are some weaknesses in the letter from Sherman Balch. First, we suggest that the best way to find out how dancers feel they did at an event would be to ask the dancers, not the callers. While we agree that the callers involved were of great integrity, we question that any callers are going to really admit the floor did poorly or they perhaps did a poor job of calling to

the floor.

Second, we agree that it is not expected that every dancer execute every sequence of every tip. We would, however, expect them to execute more sequences than we understand they executed in this instance.

Third, we call attention to the words "so-called national level" towards the end of Sherman's letter. This gives us a hint that the callers are showing up with a preconceived notion of what the level will be. Instead, they should be showing up with the notion that they will show a good time to the dancers, no matter what, and make them want to come back to PACE functions. It has yet to be proved that there is such a thing as "a national level", except perhaps as determined by a very few callers who have decided what they would like it to be. But, that is not necessarily reality, is it?

Last, we note in the second paragraph some particularly telling words that we have heard before from this group; the plea for information regarding whether PACE should continue to have this level. It seems strange that callers of the stature of those hired by PACE cannot attract more than seven squares for Advanced, when some clubs with callers of equal or less stature can have an Advanced dance and attract thirty squares. Something is keeping the Advanced dancer away from PACE in droves. If it is not the way the level is called, what is the reason? Maybe some thought should be directed in this area, guys.

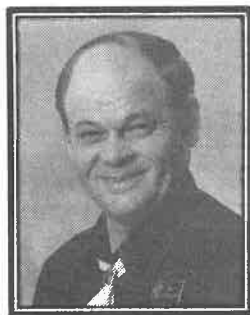

# BEYOND MAINSTREAM

**DIXIE GRAND**  
(CALLERLAB Plus Call #24)

## DEFINITION

(CALLERLAB April 1983) Starting formation — Dixie Grand Circle, Double Pass Thru, Quarter Tag, or any formation in which only four of eight dancers can start.

Leaders start the call by joining right hands with the facing dancers and pulling by. Each dancer moves ahead around the circle and gives a left hand to the next, pulling by, and a right hand to the next, pulling by. Regardless of the starting formation, as the movement progresses, the formation converts to a circle.

(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #46.)

## DIXIE GRAND

From Heads Star Thru, Zoom...

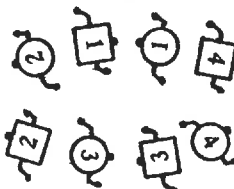


Leaders start the call by joining

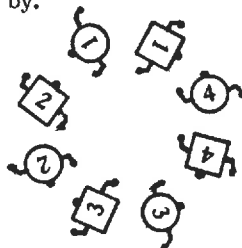
right hands with the facing dancers and pulling by...

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## DANCING HINTS

The "main secret" to all calls using the term "Dixie" is to remember that half of the dancers within the formation will be active by the right hand before all dancers will become active using a left hand — Dixie Grand is no exception; but this call may be executed from many formations, some of which are infrequently used or "strange" or "unusual".

The lead (or starting) dancers will either be facing each other or will have their right hands joined with each other immediately prior to executing Dixie Grand. When you are the leader, you must quickly establish 1) That you are the lead dancer; and 2) Exactly **who** you must be active with in the execution of the right-hand pull by action.

The trailing (or initially inactive) dancers have the more important part in the proper execution of Dixie Grand — they must **avoid** the natural tendency to want to start their action with a right hand. As a trailing dancer, you can easily avoid

this problem by thinking, "Ready with a Left" as soon as you have established that you **are** the trailing (or inactive) dancer.

As with most "Dixie" calls, Dixie Grand is executed within a single file (or tandem) track such that each dancer is required to only consider the dancer immediately in front of him during the execution of the call (the reason that **all** ending formations are circles). This means that you never need to consider (or worry about) dancers alongside of you as long as there is a dancer in front of you on the **same** track as you are moving.

Even though Dixie Grand "moves quickly", there is no need to rush the call — it dances well using 6 beats of music and we really shouldn't try to shorten this timing.

## TELEMARK FIGURES (Part 2)

### CLOSED TELEMARK

We like to call this figure "Telemark to Banjo" where everything is done basically the same as the Open Telemark except the ending position. The lady must overturn her 2nd step and she steps back in contra banjo position as the man steps outside his partner on 3 to usually face LOD & WALL. If you use a long count on 2 for the Open Telemark, you must use an even longer count for this figure to allow the lady time to turn to contra banjo. Remember that we are not looking for a hip-to-hip position here, but what we like to call a "reluctant" step outside partner where a near closed position is used and the shoulders kept nearly

parallel.

Additional Notes: So far we have assumed that the Telemark starts in CP, but it is often taken from Sidecar also. This will give us a smooth turn to SCP (Open Telemark) but makes it difficult to go to banjo in the Closed Telemark. Every once in a while somebody writes in a Telemark from Banjo in a cue sheet and we shudder — again, it can be done, but not really properly.

### HOVER TELEMARK

This figure combines the Hover with a small amount of turn, hence the name. Its most common usage is in waltz where we start facing the wall or thereabouts in CP and make a LF turn in the process. In foxtrot it is often done after a feather finish which ends facing diag LOD & WALL in contra banjo. The 1st step of the Hover Telemark is forward with a strong heel lead starting a rise to the ball of the foot. Step 2 is to the side and forward continuing the LF turn that is initiated by the type of lead on step 1 to turn about 1/8 and begin a left sway (=lifting the R side). Step 3 starts with an "almost brush" that brings the L twd the R but not closing while veering in the L knee and then stepping side into the new direction while blending to V-SCP. The Lady has opposite footwork but does not do the almost brush because she has a little more turn to take. The head turns for both are a "soft" turn on step 3 with the total turn varying from 1/4 to 1/2. For other rhythms see the note for Open Telemark.

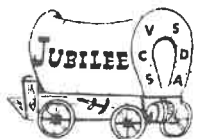

Each year the float is decorated by volunteers. Starting early in the

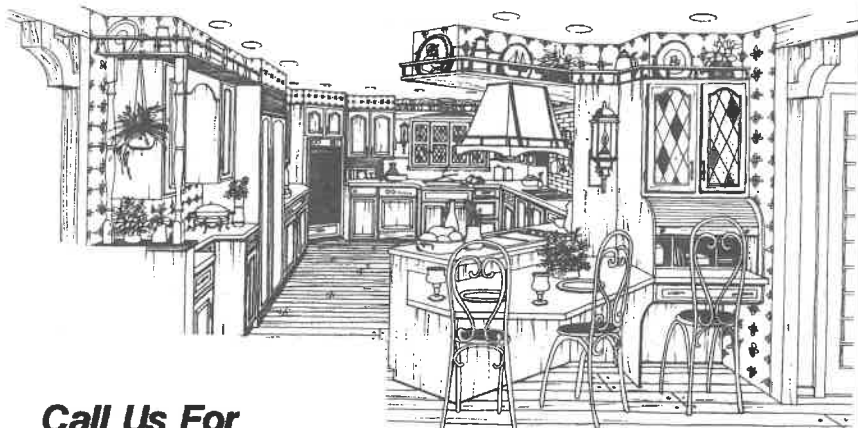
year and being finished in December in time for joining the parade on New Year's Day. The dancers on the float, five couples, are chosen in a drawing held at the National Convention each year.

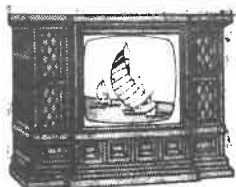
Since today we've entered "Mainstream"

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REVISION OF THE  
PENAL CODE

May 8, 1984

Dear Mr. & Mrs. Wolfson,

This is just a short note to thank you for sending me the May 1984 edition of The Prompter.

I can't tell you how pleased I am with the coverage you gave to Senate Bill 2146. Your efforts paid off today as the bill was approved by the Senate Governmental Organization Committee. The vote was 7-2. The two "no" votes came from Senator John Foran of San Francisco and Senator Bill Greene from Los Angeles.

The bill now moves to the full Senate for a vote. So, encourage your readers to contact their Senators and ask that they vote for the bill on the Senate Floor. We need twenty-one votes.

I was extremely pleased with the turnout and support from the State Square Dance Council as well as local square dance clubs. The committee hearing room was packed and we had a very nice square dance performance on the West steps of the Capitol during the lunch hour.

Again, thank you for your kind assistance.

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PENAL CODE

May 31, 1984

Dear Mr. Wolfson,

I am writing to inform you that Senate Bill 2146, which designates the square dance as the official state dance of California, was killed today during a vote on the Senate floor. The vote was 11 ayes and 16 noes.

I regret very much that we did not succeed in our initial attempt to enact the state dance. Unfortunately, some of my colleagues expressed feelings that this idea is "frivolous" and "square".

The enthusiastic, widespread support displayed by square dancers throughout the state convinces me that I should renew my efforts next year.

I appreciate your support of my efforts to enact this legislation. Perhaps our attempts next year will be more fruitful.

For your information, the vote on SB 2146 is enclosed.

# Lawmakers call Doolittle bills political

SACRAMENTO UNION CAPITOL BUREAU

Sen. John Doolittle, who is involved in a tough re-election campaign this year, was hit in both legislative houses Thursday by charges that he was carrying frivolous, symbolic bills for political gain.

A Doolittle-authored resolution opposing parole for mass murderer Juan Corona survived the charges to win Assembly approval.

But another Doolittle measure that would have made the square dance the state's official dance was rejected by a wide margin in the Senate.

Doolittle, a Citrus Heights Republican, will face Republican-turned-independent Sen. Ray Johnson in the 1st District this year.

The district includes the Sutter County area in which Corona killed 25 farmworkers. He is now in prison.

When Doolittle's anti-Corona resolution reached the Assembly floor, it was denounced by some Democrats as an election year ploy.

"Until a particular election situation, that senator probably couldn't even spell Juan Corona," Assemblyman Richard Floyd, D-Hawthorne, snorted.

The same charges arose minutes later on the Senate floor.

A succession of senators said that designating the square dance would denigrate the ethnic diversity of the state.

Doolittle pointed out that a half-million Californians "of all races and all ages" engage in square dancing and that it builds "positive family relationships."

The square dance bill was defeated on an 11-16 vote—10 short of the 21 needed for passage.

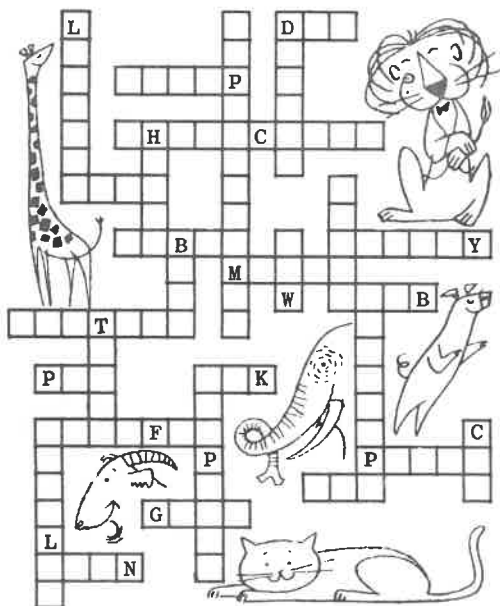

It was on this most recent cruise that we learned something new about square dancers. As we mentioned above, several of those in the group were non-dancers, taking advantage of the 10% group discount while enjoying the company of their dancing friends. Toward the end of the cruise, we begin to hear comments from these non-dancers about how quickly they had been made to feel welcome as part of the group. We did a little checking and found that dancers and non-

dancers alike felt the same way.

We had always been aware that square dancers make great hosts, but we had never thought about 'why'. Our conclusion: square dancers are used to meeting new people, immediately accepting them into their group, and immediately working and playing together. It happens at every open dance when a new couple walks into a square and the caller says, "Bow to your corner!"

Take a bow, dancers — you're great fun to be with!
