

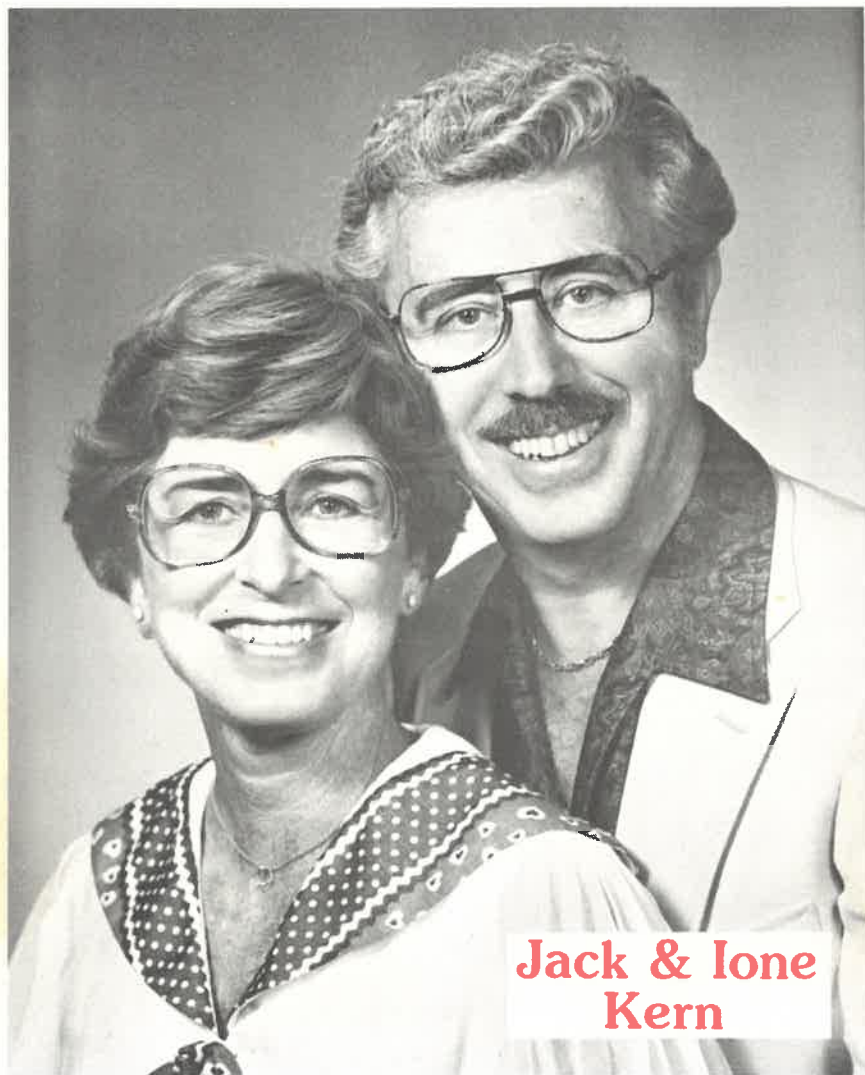

There are fewer people at the club events and hoedowns that we've attended. I think the biggest challenge to dancing during the Summer is finding something appropriate to wear considering the high temperatures at most of our dance facilities. It takes a dedicated dancer (or a dirty old man like me) to go out and literally "melt" at a three-hour Saturday hoedown. So, all you other people out there who have been "flakin'-off", listen up!!! September's cooler weather is coming, so check The Prompter for refresher workshops and get back in "The Swing".

This might also be a good time

for me to make my yearly pitch for the support of beginning square dance classes. Many clubs are in the process of planning and organizing their beginners' classes for the Fall; and they need your help!!!

One of the ways you can help is to assume that the class is going to be no more successful than you personally make it. Publicize your class among your friends. Invite people you meet (grocery, bank, stores, etc.) to come and join you. It is a truism among square dance classes that, "The more, the merrier!!"

When the class starts, volunteer to attend and help the caller any way you can. It really gives the beginning dancers a shot-in-the-arm to see several couples of club members joining them at class every night. Not only can you help to fill the squares, the moral support shown makes the class members feel that the club really has some interest in the outcome of the class. It goes without saying that the caller has a much easier time with the "educating" when he/she

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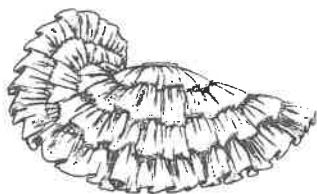
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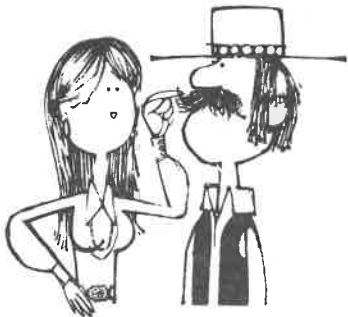

This letter is to confirm my several telephone conversations (during the past week) with you and various members of your staff.

As I am sure you will remember, I first called you when we discovered that mail addressed to "The Prompter, P. O. Box 13238, San Jose, CA 95013" was being returned to the senders marked: "No such P. O. Box number in San Jose, CA." Because your letter to us in April advised that this would be our new address, I was naturally a bit confused.

Now understand, Mr. Lawrence, that the address change didn't make

us too happy to begin with. First, P. O. Box 310 was a nice easy address to remember. Second, there was the matter of having to order all new pre-printed letterhead, business cards, checks, business forms, etc. Third, there was the additional work of changing all references to our address in the magazine itself. And fourth, after you decided to change our address, we had to pay the postage to mail all of those nice little "change of address" postcards!

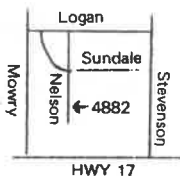


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We Get Letters

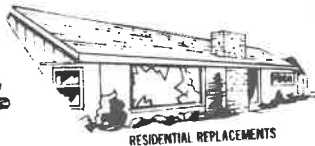

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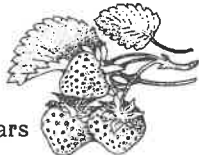
Stir The Bucket With Betty

Do you have a backyard garden? Well, if you do, or if there's a favorite nearby fruit and vegetable stand that you frequent, maybe some of our special "harvest" recipes which follow will provide you with a special treat.

STRAWBERRY FREEZER JAM

- 1 quart strawberries
- 4 cups sugar
- $\frac{3}{4}$ cup water
- 1 box pectin
- 5 - 7 clean, hot jelly jars

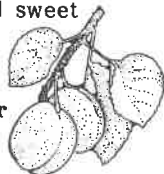


Crush strawberries in blender for 5 seconds. You should have 2 cups of puree, if necessary add water. In large bowl add puree to sugar. Blend well and let stand 10 minutes. Mix $\frac{3}{4}$ cup water and box of pectin in saucepan. Bring to a boil and boil 1 minute, stirring constantly. Stir pectin mixture into puree and stir 3 minutes. Ladle into sterilized, hot jars and seal. Keep at room temperature for 24 hours, then store in freezer.

PLUM CHUTNEY

- 6 cups pitted plums, cut into eighths
- 8 cups coarsely chopped firm apples, peeled
- 4 cups coarsely chopped sweet Spanish onions
- 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups white vinegar
- 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups raisins
- 2 cups dark brown sugar
- 2 cups granulated sugar
- 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. ground allspice
- 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. ground ginger
- 1 tsp. ground cloves
- 4 tsp. salt
- 2 cloves garlic, finely chopped
- 6 drops Tabasco (or to taste)



Combine plums, apples, onions and vinegar in large, heavy kettle. Boil and simmer uncovered for 1 hour. Add remaining ingredients, bring to boil, and simmer until mixture thickens and is the consistency of fruit preserves. Pour into hot, sterilized jars and seal. Cool and store in cool, dark, dry place.

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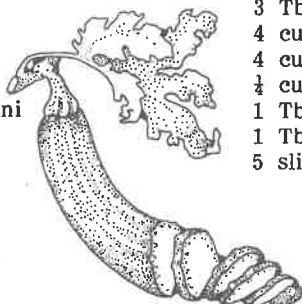

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ZUCCHINI BREAD

- 2 cups sugar
- 1 cup oil
- 3 eggs
- 2 tsp. vanilla
- 3 cups flour
- 3 cups grated zucchini
- 1 cup raisins
- ½ chopped nuts
- 1 Tbsp. cinnamon
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. soda
- ½ tsp. baking powder

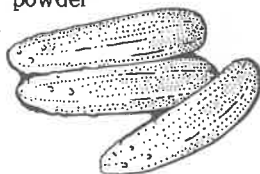


Mix sugar and oil, blending well. Beat in eggs and vanilla. Sift dry ingredients together. Add dry ingredients to egg mixture, alternating with zucchini, and blend. Fold in raisins and nuts. Pour batter into two greased loaf pans and bake 1 ½ hours at 300°. Cool 15 minutes before removing from pans.

- 5 slices onion



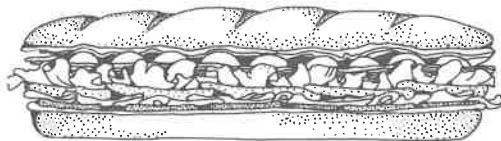
One Day Before: Sprinkle cukes with salt and let stand overnight.
Next Day: Drain and rinse cukes. Mix all ingredients, except cukes and onion, in pan. Bring to a boil for 5 minutes. Add cukes and let stand in hot liquid 15 minutes. Pack tightly in hot, sterilized jars, adding 1 slice onion to each jar. Seal with hot, sterilized lids. Cool and store in cool, dark, dry location.

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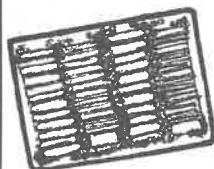

LIQUID EMBROIDERY PAINTING

Have you seen the ladies on the dance floor in dresses which have been painted with lovely designs, or in dresses with decorative painted lace? Did you wonder how it was done?

The process is really very simple. The painting is done with tubes of paint called liquid embroidery.

To do this type of decorating, you will need an iron-on transfer of the picture you want on your dress or shirt, tubes of liquid embroidery in the colors of your choice, and a frame, like an embroidery hoop, with a solid bottom.

Following the directions, press your iron-on transfer to your fabric. Position the fabric in the frame, with the design in the center, and fasten securely so that it will not move while you are working.

Hold the tube of paint straight up and down with the ballpoint tip against the fabric. Press gently against the fabric while moving the paint tube to cover the fabric with paint. The liquid embroidery should

flow freely. If the liquid embroidery stops flowing, press lightly on the top of the tube. This should resume the flow of the paint.

To paint on lace a special tip called a "fast-flow" is used. This tip allows the liquid embroidery to flow faster for more ease in painting the lace. The method for applying it, however, is the same.

Liquid embroidery paints can be purchased at many fabric, hobby and craft stores in the area. The brand that I am familiar with is called Tri-Chem Liquid Embroidery and can be purchased through home parties. Most of my paints are about 12 years old and still work great!

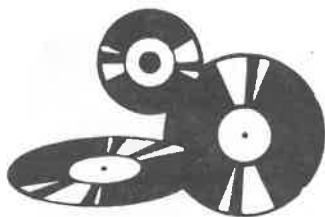

Last month, we mentioned a letter from Stewart Kramer regarding our June article. The letter was well written, and well thought out, but too long to address all of it part by part. We are sorry you found the article depressing, Stewart, but we share your views in most of the things you said.

The confusion existing regarding the Passing Rule and the Crossing Rule seems to still exist. Most callers we have talked to always allowed the dancers to pass right shoulders when doing a Cross Fold and never told them the difference. This is an admission that at the moment of passing, a Cross Fold feels like a Pass Thru anyway. The fact that it took you one and one-half pages to explain your views on this subject is an indication of just how confused the whole thing is.

We cannot agree with your feeling that little-used figures should not be dropped. There is always a reason, if it were searched for and found, that figures fall into disuse or receive very little usage at all. Only a couple of reasons might be that the callers, or the dancers, or both do not like the figure. Your reference to the fact that Pass to the Center has not killed Dive Thru yet is very correct. We maintain, however, that either Dive Thru should have been dropped when Pass to the Center was adopted, or Pass to the Center was not necessary. With the number of figures the average dancer has to know to square dance nowadays, they don't need unnecessary duplication of material to further complicate their lives. Another good example would be Curlique versus Touch a Quarter.

We are not alone on Grand Spin. Recently Ed Foote covered the same subject in his note service "News 'n Notes". His view was, for whatever reason, that about half the floor will go down when Grand Spin is called. Since this indicates that only about half of the callers and dancers are doing Grand Spin, it is probably a figure that is less than acceptable, for some reason, to about half the people involved. We do not agree that this is only because the people can't do it.

We appreciate your agreement as to the poorly worded resolutions from CALLERLAB. Unfortunately, it continues to happen. CALLERLAB has already published several "corrections" (?) since the

convention in an attempt to say what they really meant. We also appreciated your agreement regarding "hiding" the Quarterly Selections. The net result of the recommendation will probably be that Quarterlies will still be called at festivals and conventions without teaches or walk-thrus since most dancers will be expected to know them — as in the past.

As for the last part of your letter, past articles have offered solutions, if not resolutions. These have been offered in both the column and the "Weather" columns. Some of these ideas were mine, some of them were from other knowledgeable people in the field.

As to continuing in CALLERLAB, the following letter received by this writer is offered:

Dear Bob,

I read with great intent and an open mind, your recent article appearing in your "Challenge Chatter" where you cast some very serious and negative statements about the CALLERLAB organization.

It is impossible for me to answer you in an ethical, professional and "literate interpretive way and remain calm in my response to your article.

With the feelings you have expressed through your column as a writer, it is probably best in the interest of CALLERLAB and you that you disassociate yourself from the CALLERLAB organization.

It is also very regrettable that you were absent from the CALLERLAB Convention and could

not verbally express yourself to the entire voting membership which I assume you would.

We are not sure whether the implication is that there are no prominent callers in the area, or the only ones who deserve that title are national traveling callers. We happen to think that a number of the local people are prominent, as well as intelligent, callers.

While it is true that I was not in attendance at the convention, after the feedback from some of the "prominent" callers, and after reading Bob Van Antwerp's speech given at the convention, I am not sure who is more negative about CALLERLAB and its members, myself or Bob.

FOLLOW YOUR NEIGHBOR (CALLERLAB Plus Call #11)

DEFINITION

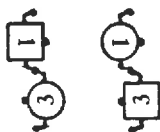
(CALLERLAB April 1983) Starting formation - Box Circulate. Dancers facing in release hands with the person next to them (their "neighbor") and step straight forward, join adjacent forearms with the one they meet, and turn three-quarters (270°) to become centers of a new wave. At the same time, the dancers facing out follow their "neighbors" by moving forward in a three-quarter looping turn (270°), turning towards their "neighbor" to finish adjacent to their "neighbor" as the ends of the new ocean wave.

When done from right-hand boxes, the dancers facing in turn by the right hand and the dancers facing out loop around right-face, to finish in a left-hand ocean wave. When done from left-hand boxes, the dancers facing in turn by the left hand and the dancers facing out loop around left-face, to finish in a right-hand ocean wave.

(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #651.)

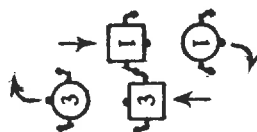
FOLLOW YOUR NEIGHBOR

From Heads Touch 1/4...



Dancers facing in release hands with the person next to them (their "neighbor") and step straight

and turn three-quarters (270°) to become centers of a new wave. At the same time the dancers facing out follow their "neighbors" by moving forward in a three-quarter looping turn (270°), turning towards their "neighbor"...



to finish adjacent to their "neighbor" as the ends of the new ocean wave.



DANCING HINTS

Follow Your Neighbor is another "exception call" that requires the in-facing dancers to use the same hand 'twice-in-a-row' for proper execution of the dancing action (i.e., from right-hand boxes, the in-facers must use their right hands a second time to accomplish the turning action). Additionally, the in-facing dancers have the more

important part in assuring that the call finishes in a "clean" ocean wave — Immediately following the turning action, you must **keep** the inside hands joined such that the original out-facing dancers will know exactly where the call is supposed to end. Since these out-facers do not have hands joined during the call, they need to have a 'point of reference' to assure proper completion of their action.

When you start the call as an out-facing dancer, you can properly accomplish your action by remembering that you **always** start the call by moving in the **direction** of the original hands (i.e., from right-hand boxes, the out-facers will

loop around right-face). A second consideration for the out-facing dancers is that upon completion of the "Follow Your Neighbor" action, you must have the **other hand** joined with the **same person** as when you started.

Follow Your Neighbor has three "secrets" to successful accomplishment: 1) In-facers must use the **same** hand two times consecutively; 2) In-facers must **keep** the inside hands joined following the turning action; and 3) The out-facers move in the direction of the original hands and complete the call having the **other hand** joined with the **same person** as when they started the call.

New PLUS Q/S Move

Jerry Schatzer, Chairman of the CALLERLAB Plus Quarterly Selections Committee, has announced that the Plus Quarterly Selection for the three-month period beginning August 1, 1984 is Load the Top.

LOAD THE TOP

Starting formation: Facing Lines of Four. Definition: From facing lines, start as in Load the Boat — the ends move around the outside passing two people and meet the third person with a right Cast Off full around; meanwhile, the Centers Pass Thru, Turn their backs to their partners, Partner Trade with their new partners, step to a momentary (right-hand) wave and Spin the Top; on each side now, the new foursomes Fan the Top, ending in parallel right-hand Waves. Ending formation: Parallel right-hand Ocean Waves. Timing: 20 beats.

-September 1984-

DANCING EXAMPLES

Heads Lead to the Right, Circle to a Line (Zero Line), **Load the Top**, Recycle and Sweep 1/4, Square Thru 3/4, Left Allemande.

Heads Square Thru, Slide Thru, **Load the Top**, Double Swing Thru, All Eight Circulate, Box the Gnat, RL Grand.

Heads Lead to the Right, Circle to a Line, Half Square Thru, Trade By, Slide Thru, **Load the Top**, Swing Thru, Girls Circulate and Boys Trade, Turn Thru, Left Allemande.

Heads Half Square Thru, Slide Thru, RL Thru, Box the Gnat, **Load the Top**, (a) RL Grand or (b) Turn Thru, Left Allemande.

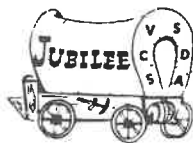

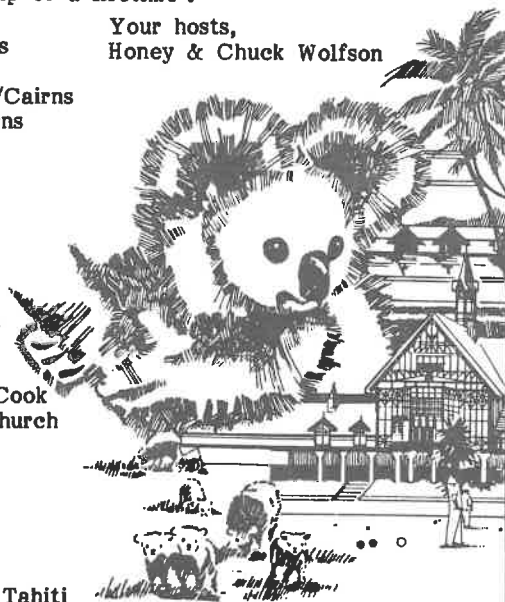

CALLERLAB



THE LANGUAGE OF SQUARE DANCE PROGRAMMING

There seems to be a great deal of variety, and some confusion, regarding the designation of dance programs throughout the square dance world. At conventions, festivals, and club dances; and in various publicity releases and publications, one sees program designations such as MS+, MS Plus, MSQS, Soft Plus, etc. What do these terms mean? Does MS+ indicate that the dancers should know some of the Plus Program? If so, what part? Or does it mean that, in addition to Mainstream Program dancing, there will be some sort of added attraction? The MS Plus designation is similarly vague and confusing.

Terms such as Soft Plus really tell us nothing, since the "soft" part, like beauty, is in the eye of the beholder (or, probably, the caller for the evening). When one sees the MSQS designation, he probably assumes that the dancers will be expected to know something about Quarterly Selections. However, does that mean all Quarterly

Selections, only the current Quarterly Selection, or something else? Even more important is the fact that the Quarterly Selection Program was never intended to be a regular dance program. The latest publication of the CALLERLAB Basic and Mainstream Programs makes that clear with this statement: "There is no program called Mainstream Quarterly Selections Program. Those experimental calls are intended for use in Mainstream Workshops. No dancer is required to know the QS calls to attend a MS open dance. If such calls are used, the caller is to teach them if necessary. Please advertise dance programs as MS not MSQS."

Proper program designations help dancers to find that dance where they can be most comfortable and can have the greatest enjoyment. They also tell callers the program they are expected to call. We need to be more specific and careful in designating dance programs, and club officers and dancers need to

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be more insistent that callers adhere to the advertised program. Use of vague and incorrect programming language leads to confusion and frustration. Use of the proper terms aids both dancers and callers.

The correct program designations are shown below. Dancers should be able to dance, in accordance with their definitions, the number of basics or movements shown:

Basic Program (B)

Numbers 1 through 49 on the CALLERLAB Program approved 4/18/84.

Mainstream Program (MS)

Numbers 1 through 68 on the CALLERLAB Program approved 4/18/84.

Plus (+)

The Mainstream Program plus the 28 calls on the CALLERLAB Plus Program approved 4/18/84.

Advanced One (A-1)

The Mainstream and Plus Programs plus the 38 calls on the CALLERLAB A-1 Program approved 9/83.

Advanced Two (A-2)

The Mainstream and Plus Programs plus the 78 calls on the CALLERLAB A-2 Program approved 9/83.

Basic Challenge (C-1)

The Mainstream, Plus and Advanced Programs plus the 64 calls on the CALLERLAB C-1 Program approved 10/83.

Extended Challenge (C-2)

The Mainstream, Plus, Advanced and C-1 Programs plus the 76 calls on the CALLERLAB C-2 Program approved 12/83.

But, I will admit, I was even more surprised when you told me that you didn't know that you had changed the box numbers at Coyote (San Jose?) 95013 — even though the letter was over your name!

Mr. Lawrence, this is one heck of a way to run a business — or even a government bureaucracy. Please tell us, what should we tell our customers? If our address is, as you say, San Jose 95013, why can't

you deliver the mail to us instead of returning it to the sender? And, adding insult to injury, one batch of mail that was delivered was stamped with a happy face and the following message: "Hi, happy we found you. This address error was detected by your postal service. Please notify the sender of your correct address. We care." Now, although it's nice that you care, I suppose, from our point of view, we'd be more impressed if you would just deliver our mail — and without any hassle.

As a business that is dependent upon your ability to (literally) "deliver the mail", we cannot afford the kind of service we are receiving from the Postal Service. By copy of this letter, I am asking the Postmaster General to investigate this problem and advise me of his proposed solution.

Also, by printing this letter in The Prompter, I am asking our customers to contact you personally at (408)291-7555 each time the Postal Service returns mail that is correctly addressed to The Prompter, P. O. Box 13238, San Jose, CA 95013.

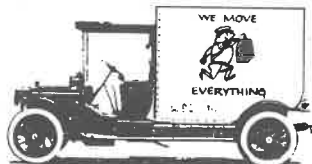

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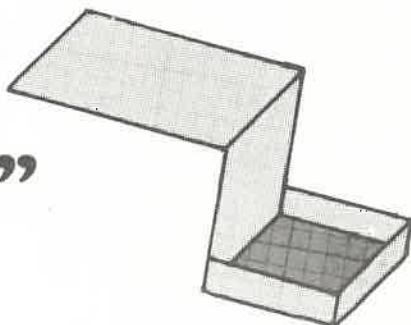
