California Senate Rules Committee Resolution

RELATIVE TO STATE SQUARE DANCE MONTH

WHEREAS, The California Square Dance Council, which was formed in 1952, serves to promote square dancing throughout the state, thus bringing enjoyment and expression to many; and

WHEREAS, The California Square Dance Council consists of 1,027 clubs, which sponsor new dancer classes, hold dances, and conduct weekend festivals; and

WHEREAS, The clubs hold benefit dances and perform exhibition dances for public services, such as Easter Seals, Cancer and Heart Funds; and

WHEREAS, The California Square Dance Council sponsors a state convention each year which attracts thousands of participants and one of the largest undertakings has been to sponsor a float in the Rose Bowl Parade; and

WHEREAS, In view of the great impact which square dancing has had in the lives of many Californians, the month of September 1984 has been designated as "State Square Dance Month"; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE SENATE RULES COMMITTEE, That the Members hereby recognize the month of September 1984 as "State Square Dance Month" in California, thereby encouraging the people of the state to partake in festivities planned for that time; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitably prepared copy of this resolution be transmitted to the California Square Dance Council.

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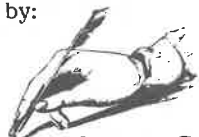
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PUBLISHER'S PATTER

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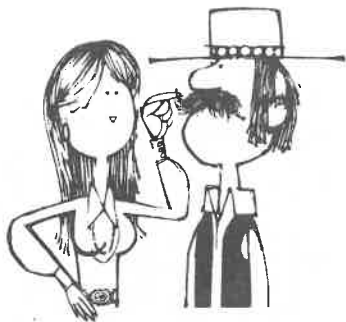

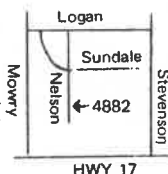
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We Get Letters

Dear Editors,

After reading Bob Southern's article in the Challenge Corner of the July issue, I think some comments are needed.

Bob made a statement in reference to "National Level", stating that callers of PACE functions are showing up with a preconceived notion of what the level "will be". Wrong, Bob, callers of PACE functions are showing up and calling what the level "should be".

To describe exactly what National Level is, is difficult, but a National Level does exist and is recognized by callers and dancers from every geographical area of the United States. Rather than try to define what National Level is, let's define what this level is not: 1) It is not calling a dance at 100 beats a minute; 2) It is not cueing every call; 3) It is not calling all sequences from standard or "vanilla" positions; 4) It is not calling to one or two squares who are having trouble, while ignoring the more capable dancers; 5) It is not spacing the calls so far apart so as to allow for lots of recovery time.

In his article Bob stated that he had heard from several local callers who stated that their dancers had been blown away at the PACE Advanced level dances and would not go back. I wonder who told these dancers that they were accomplished at the A-2 level. PACE dances are advertised as an A-2 level, not easy or soft, just A-2. This means that the dance will be a full A-2 level with DBD



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positioning.

I feel that many of the teachers of Advanced workshops in this area should quit burying their heads in the sand and accept the fact that they must teach Advanced material in much more depth in order to give their dancers a fighting chance at a full A-2 level. If I were a caller and teacher of Advanced dancers in this area, and my dancers could not dance to any of the twelve PACE callers (who are among the most accomplished and respected in the country at the Advanced and Challenge level), I would be questioning what I was doing wrong.

With a few exceptions, callers in this area do not attend PACE functions. Very few local callers are on Advanced or Challenge committees. Callers often accept dancers into their workshops without making sure they can adequately dance the level below the workshop. Worst of all, some callers are teaching a level which they, themselves, cannot competently dance, or do not dance at all. Would a teacher be hired to teach

children in any subject in which that teacher was not competent? Any effective teacher will have a course of study, lesson plans of some type, and goals for both himself and the student. Only a few callers in this area hand out a sheet to their dancers, giving the calls that will be taught the following week. A list of the teaching order is also given to the dancers, so that the dancers can study on their own in the event of illness, vacations, or anything else that causes them to miss workshop sessions.

PACE was started because the callers in this area could not, or would not, answer the needs of the dancers who wished to go on to more complicated dancing levels. Many Challenge dancers have learned the levels from dancing in tape groups only. PACE wanted to expand its monthly weekends to include the Advanced level, thereby giving the Advanced dancers in the area the opportunity to dance to top-notch visiting callers. Now, because many of the Advanced



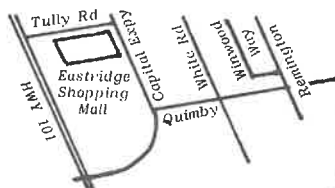
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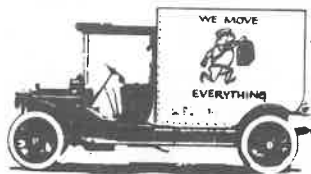
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dancers in our area are not being adequately prepared in the Advanced level, PACE is being unfairly criticized.

Bob has given PACE a black eye without knowing first-hand what is taking place at their functions. As far as I know, he seldom, if ever, attends PACE functions. Instead he stands on the side lines, getting hearsay evidence. This reminds me of a sportswriter who stands outside the stadium at the end of a sporting event and asks the fans what went on during the game. If he asks ten fans, he gets ten different answers. Next time, Bob, before reporting on an event, how about attending the ball game yourself.

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Stir The Bucket With Betty

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- 1½ cups sour cream
- 1½ cups mayonnaise
- 1 pkg. frozen chopped spinach
(cooked and drained well)
- Tops of 3 green onions, chopped
- 1 can water chestnuts, chopped
- 1 pkg. Knorr Leek Soup Mix
- 1 round loaf of sour French bread

Mix all ingredients, except bread, the day before you plan to use it to allow flavors to blend. Day of use: Hollow out the loaf of bread. Cut up top and inside for "dippers". Pour prepared dip in bread "bowl" and serve with bread dippers. "Bowl" may be torn apart and eaten as goop diminishes.

Entree: MARINATED CHICKEN STRIPS

- 2 whole chicken breasts (12 oz. each) split, boned & skinned
- ½ tsp. salt
- ½ tsp. coarse ground pepper
- 4 tsp. cornstarch
- 4 tsp. oil
- 1 egg white, beaten
- 6 Tbsp. butter
- ½ cup minced parsley
- ¼ minced chives

Slice chicken diagonally crosswise in ½" wide, 3" long strips. Place strips in bowl, toss with salt and pepper. Let stand 20 minutes. Sprinkle with cornstarch and oil, turn with spoon to coat. Let stand 20 minutes. Fold in egg white with

chicken strips and let stand 30 minutes. In large, heavy skillet over medium-high heat, melt butter until it bubbles and begins to brown. Add marinated chicken. Saute 4 minutes or until opaque throughout and lightly golden. Fold in parsley and chives. Immediately remove to warm serving dish. This recipe may be doubled, but don't try to cook the chicken all at once. It's yummy!!

Serves 4

Dessert: CHOCOLATE CHERRY CAKE (MICROWAVE)

CAKE:

- 1 pkg. chocolate cake mix
- 1 can Comstock cherry pie filling
- 2 eggs
- ½ cup sour cream
- ½ cup chocolate chips

SAUCE:

- ½ cup chocolate chips
- 1 or 2 jiggers Grand Marnier
or Triple Sec

Mix cake ingredients by hand until well blended. Pour into a buttered bundt microwave cake pan. Cover lightly with plastic wrap. Microwave on High for 7 minutes; turn and bake 7 more minutes. Take out and let stand 10 minutes; run a knife around the edges, invert onto plate. If the center is very damp, bake 1 more minute, or in 1 minute intervals, until done. For sauce: melt chocolate chips 1 minute on High; turn and microwave 1 minute more. Stir until smooth. Add liqueur and blend until smooth. Drizzle over cake. It's a winner! Cake stays moist for days, too!

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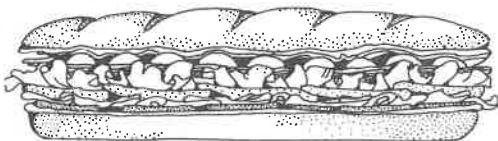
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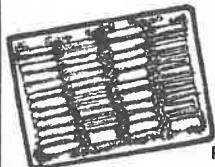
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Fashionable Thoughts

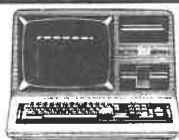

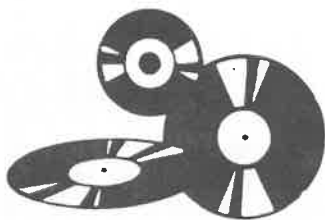

Your square dance stores are already bursting with new things for the Fall season, and there will be more and more items arriving each month. Soon to come, from Jeri Bee (one of the few companies that include size 4 in their line!!), a coordinated grouping of two different blouses, one plain and one gingham, to match a skirt of plain and gingham fabrics, making two outfits of three items. And they have another grouping of two different skirts in pin dot fabric, one pleated (that's unusual) and one very fancy, with two different blouses of the same fabric, making a total of four very unusual outfits, besides any other skirts you may already have to go with these blouses.

A new company, called "Ruffles" is producing a new pettupant called "Camipant", featuring enclosed waist elastic, and ruffles that start lower so that there is less bulk across the tummy. These come in three lengths and, so far, in ten colors. "Ruffles" also has a "practice slip" made of poly-cotton. It is a circle and a half with a lace edged, six inch bottom ruffle. I see it, not only as a practice slip, but also for wearing under a scratchy net slip or over a slip to prevent "dips".

"Steppin Out", another new company, is making a beautiful organza slip, double layered, in fullnesses of 40 to 100 yards. This slip should more than take the place of the Carousel, which is no longer available. Check out their gorgeous coral color.

Now, a really neat new item for the seamstress. Are you forever misplacing your little thread clippers? Well, Gingher, the quality scissor people, now has a pair of thread clippers in a little case that



hangs on a ribbon around your neck. They sell for around \$10.00. They'll be a neat Christmas gift for your sewing friends.

Wait until you see the new multi-colored, sparkley, square dance stickers!! Bright and gay, and you get a 5" interlocking square plus four tiny interlocking squares, all for about \$2.00.

Local Boys Make Good!!! Included on the "10 Best Selling" record list for the country are Riverboat's (owned by Bob Elling) "Hank William's Medley" (210) and "Fireball Mail" (203), both by Ron Welsh, and "Flashdance" (207) by Gary Carnes. How's that for a record record?!!

Ethel Bieda has written a new dance to "Doll Dance" on Blue Star (2234). The old music has been redone and it's already the Round of the Month in many parts of the country.

Red Boot Records has three very good releases this month. "Piano Roll Blues" (297) by Mac McCall. It's good old rinky tink piano music, and, if you don't already have one of the old releases of this piece, this is a must. The other two are new hit tunes, "I May Be Used" (2995) by Mike Hoose, and "I Got Mexico" (2994) by Johnny Jones

My pick this month is "Right or Wrong" on Ranch House (214) by Darryl McMillan... come listen to it and see if you agree!

BEYOND MAINSTREAM

DIAMOND CIRCULATE
(CALLERLAB Plus Call #15)

DEFINITION

(CALLERLAB April 1983) Starting formation - Any Diamond. Each dancer moves forward to the next position in his diamond, changing his original facing direction one-quarter (90°) toward the center of the diamond. Points become centers, and vice versa. If the call is directed to facing diamonds, all must pass right shoulders.

(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #1431.)

DIAMOND CIRCULATE (Example #1)

From Heads Veer Left, Head Ladies Hinge (Right-facing Diamonds)...



Each dancer moves forward to the next position in his diamond, changing his original facing direction one-quarter (90°) toward the center of the diamond.



DIAMOND CIRCULATE (Example #2)

From Heads Step to a Wave, Head Ladies Hinge (Facing Diamonds)...



Each dancer moves forward to the

next position in his diamond, changing his original facing direction one-quarter (90°) toward the center of the diamond. If the call is directed to facing diamonds, all must pass right shoulders.



DANCING HINTS

Diamond Circulate is an extremely simple call that most dancers execute very well. The most important factors to remember are that: 1) EACH dancer must move forward to the exact position occupied by the dancer immediately in front of him in the diamond (the next position in your diamond will always be in the direction of your shoulder that is toward the original diamond center); 2) Original CENTER dancers must circulate such that they complete the call having the **same shoulder** (not their entire body) toward the original center of their diamond; 3) Original CENTER dancers must complete the call such that they **CANNOT** touch the original center of their diamond (this assures that the formation remains a "diamond" and does not become a "star"); and 4) If dancers must pass each other during the circulate action, they must always pass **RIGHT** shoulders (Example #2).

Diamond Circulate "moves very quickly" (only 3 beats of music) and dances very well as long as the new diamond formation always form "crisply" — Remembering the items above can help you enjoy this very versatile call.

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'ROUND' ABOUT

FEEL A BIT AWKWARD?

Ever get the feeling, when trying to learn a new figure or even when having an "off" night when nothing feels right, that "something" is wrong with your balance? Sometimes it may be all your fault. Sometimes it may actually be your partner's fault. Sometimes you may both be guilty, and the evening's dancing could turn out to be much more work than fun.

If you were never taught the two points we are about to discuss, or if you were taught and just need to be reminded, here's how to keep your dancing comfortable and your balance and control at its best:

1. **Never look at your feet.**
2. **Remember the basic dance walk!**

If you look at your feet, it causes many problems with both body flight affecting you individually and you and your partner as a couple. This is so because when you look down, your body also bends forward from the waist creating a "downward" force with every step you take. This will make just progressing straight forward or backward difficult, and the execution of mechanically correct turns and pivots impossible. Always keep your head upright and look off in the direction of progression keeping a point in view somewhere off in the distance at eye level.

The basic dance walk should be

the first thing a teacher presents to a new dancer. We'd like to describe it for you, in detail, so you might give it a try and see if your dancing doesn't improve in both "feel" and quality as a result.

First, assume open position, line of dance, with your partner. Flex (a slight bend not visible to the casual observer) your knees, keeping your upper bodies perpendicular to the floor with heads upright as described above.

Second, remember that every forward step is powered by the standing foot. When walking normally, the power comes from the upper body with a "shoulder lead". In dancing this is not the case because that necessitates a forward lean and a forward lean is something to avoid for the sake of proper body mechanics and controlled body flight. Now you're ready to begin the dance walk.

(Directions for M, W do opposite.) Take your L foot forward, ball of foot skimming the floor, until the heel comes in contact with the floor. Then "push off" of the R foot, keeping both knees flexed and your upper body perpendicular to the floor, so that all your weight is transferred from the R to the L foot.

Now, take the R foot forward (a passing step, no touch or hesitation) in the same manner with the ball of the foot lead and knees flexed, until the heel come in contact with the floor. Then "push off" of the L foot taking weight on the R.

Do this dance walk to a 4/4 timed piece of music, walking

(taking one step to every other beat of music) until you can perform the dance walk without "bouncing" up and down. In other words, keeping your upper body perpendicular to the floor and your head parallel to the floor. After a little practice to turn this dance walk into a habit, you will have developed the power and control in your dancing that will influence how you feel and how you look. You will feel more comfortable and you will look more controlled. Your dancing will take on that practiced, effortless quality that is so pleasant to watch and perform.

The dance walk, with the flexed knees and body positioning, should

also be incorporated in every backward and sideward progression as well.

We're not saying that there are never times when rising and falling are not to be used to style certain dance figures. However, the dance walk must be learned and practiced (in open position, closed position, etc.) to ensure a good foundation in proper progression, posture and control is built before "styling" is considered.

A proper dance walk, incorporating the proper body mechanics needed to execute turns and pivots, will give you all the styling you need to feel and look good in your round dancing.



The International Association of Round Dance Teachers

To enable dancers to better evaluate a round dance, ROUNDALAB adopted, in 1979, a point system devised by Dave Fleck of Toledo, Ohio. First introduced at the 26th National Square Dance Convention in Atlantic City, New Jersey, the Fleck Rating, as it has become known, was carefully studied, evaluated and slightly modified before its formal acceptance by the ROUNDALAB membership.

While the rating system has limitations, a teacher and/or dancer, by comparing dance rating numbers, can more readily recognize where a dance fits in the total round dance

picture.

The value and limitations of the point system have been under study this past year by the Point Rating Review Committee chaired by Harmon and Betty Jorritsma. The rating system will be thoroughly discussed at the ROUNDALAB annual meeting October 28-30, 1984. Anyone who has comments on the system, and/or the manner of evaluating round dances, should direct their correspondence to the Jorritsmas at 13552 Redbird, Garden Grove, CA 92643. Anaheim Selected As Site For 1988 National Convention

Anaheim, California has been selected as the location for the 36th National Square Dance Convention to be held June 23 - 25, 1988. The announcement came during the recent 33rd National held in Baltimore, Maryland.

Four previous National Conventions have been held in California: Riverside (1952 - the 1st National Convention), San Diego (1956), Long Beach (1964), and Anaheim (1976). The 1976 Anaheim Convention set an all-time record for attendance when 39,796 dancers participated in the three-day event. That convention also holds the record for the most foreign

attendees - 337.

Not only does California hold the record for hosting the largest convention ever, more Californians have attended national conventions than dancers from any other state: 68,104 attendees from 1954 - 1984 (attendance figures for the 1952 and 1953 conventions are not available). Following California in attendance are Michigan (42,559), Texas (35,874), and Illinois (28,229). At the other end of the scale are Washington, D.C. (245), Hawaii (286), Alaska (457), and Maine (531).

Other future convention sites are: Birmingham, AL (1985); Indianapolis, IN (1986); and Houston, TX (1987).

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The Day The President Learned To Yellow Rock!

Thursday, June 28, 1984 — It's a warm, muggy afternoon in Baltimore. Eighteen square dancers, clad in the familiar blue-on-blue costume, reluctantly leave behind the excitement of the opening day of the 33rd National Square Dance Convention. They board a bus bound for Washington, D.C.

Who are these people? Where are they going? And why? Let's ride along and find out. The dancers are the Baltimore Executive Committee, the chairmen responsible for organizing the various facets of the convention. They are going to the White House to meet President Reagan. Why? Because he wants to convey greetings and good wishes to the 24,000-plus dancers attending the convention.

As the trip progresses, we can feel the excitement build. But... when the bus pulls up in front of the Executive Office Building, the good natured bantering and laughter cease. We are here, in our nation's capital, about to say hello to the President of the United States!

Once inside the building, we sit down to wait, wondering a bit nervously what lies ahead. The ladies retire to the restroom to primp a bit, but only after submitting to a thorough search of their pocketbooks and a trip through a metal detector. What price glamour! But we'll have our pictures taken with the President, and we don't want to look dowdy.

This task taken care of, the ladies join the gentlemen, and we are off on a tour of the White House, escorted by Jean Jackson of the President's staff. Besides the usual East Room, Red Room, State Dining Room and Rose Garden, we

are shown several areas not always open to the public. In one room we are even invited to sit down for a bit. One could soon get used to this VIP treatment!

Then it is time. An aide ushers us into a reception room near the Oval Office. Trying not to appear flustered by the television cameras and the barrage of photographers, we line up to shake hands with President Reagan and have our pictures taken with him. He walks in, flashing his movie star smile, neatly attired in a well-tailored beige suit.

After patiently greeting us all and posing for seemingly endless pictures, he graciously accepts our gifts of the Baltimore cookbook, souvenir cap and belt buckle, and the convention Program Book.

Some polite conversation follows, liberally sprinkled with humor. The President puts us all at ease. Then Jennie Zukauskas asks if she might give the President a yellow rock on

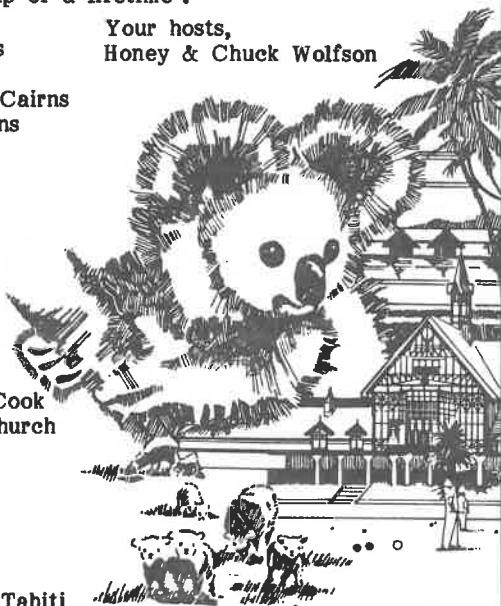

WASHINGTON UPDATE

Monday & Tuesday, June 25 & 26, 1984 — We had many meetings with staff members of Congressmen Mineta and Panetta. On Monday we met with Kathy Jurardo, Staff member of the Subcommittee on Census & Population, who was coordinator for the Hearing. Per previous instructions, four oral testimonies and twelve written testimonies from dancers and callers, covering all phases of the square dance activity, were submitted. We also had a lengthy strategy meeting with Congressmen Mineta and Panetta (Joint Sponsors of HR 1706) on Tuesday.

Wednesday, June 27, 1984 — The dance on the West Terrace of the Capitol, sponsored by the National Folk Dance Committee and Congressman Leon Panetta (CA), was a huge success and lasted for two and one-half hours on a very HOT day! There were many delighted spectators, including Senators, Representatives, and Staff members. The event received lots of local and national television and newspaper coverage. 2,382 participants were given commemorative badges furnished free of charge by the National Folk Dance Committee, including twenty-eight callers and five round dance callers (representing 16 states), dancers and ten bus tours (representing 45 states and Washington, D.C.), a caller from Hamburg, Germany, a dancing Sheik from Saudi Arabia, and three exhibition groups: Squarenaders (CA), O.K. Cloggers (OK), and the Happy Tappers (MO).

Bob Osgood went with us to meet with Kathy Jurardo after the Capitol Dance. At that time we were informed that three more people (a total of six) would testify for the opposition. We were amazed at their "titles".

Thursday, June 28, 1984 -- Subcommittee on Census & Population Hearing on HR 1706; Designating the Square Dance as the National Folk Dance of the U.S.A. Here is a "thumbnail sketch" of the Hearing: Room 311, Cannon House Office Building, where the Hearing was held at 9:30 a.m., was filled with dancers (in square dance attire), reporters, and supporters of the opposition group. The Hearing was recessed three times by Roll Call Votes (all Members of Congress are required to be on the House Floor for a Roll Call Vote).

The Hearing began at 9:45 a.m. and ended at 1:45 p.m. Chairwoman Katie Hall conducted the meeting and was the only member of the Subcommittee present. The following sat with Mrs. Hall as advisors: George Omas, Minority Counsel for Congressman Courter (NJ); Steve Pruitt, Staff Director, Subcommittee; Kathy Jurardo, Subcommittee staff member; and Gerald E. Parsons, Jr., Reference Librarian, Archive of Folk Culture, Library of Congress (Mr. Parsons submitted a study to the Subcommittee that was mainly opposed to the Square Dance as the National Folk Dance).

Speaking in favor of HR 1706 during the Hearing were Congressman Norman Mineta (CA), Congressman Leon Panetta (CA),

Congressman Earl Hutto (FL), NFDC Vice Chairman George Holser, NFDC Chairman Mac McClure, American Square Dance Coeditor Cathie Burdick, Congressman Mickey Leland (TX), and Square Dancing Magazine Editor Bob Osgood.

Speaking in opposition were Smithsonian Institute Assistant Secretary for Public Service Ralph Rinzler, Smithsonian Institute Senior Ethnomusicologist Dr. Thomas Vennum, tap dancer Lavon Robinson (PA), Eskimo Mr. Cameron (AK), National Council for Traditional Arts Executive Director Joe Wilson, square dance caller and Country Dance Society Vice-President Robert Dalsemer (he has received a grant from The National Endowment for the Arts), Society for Ethnomusicology, Inc. President Dr. Carol Robertson, Maryland Arts Council State Folklorist Dr. Charles Camp, and Dance Historian Dr. Gretchen Schneider.

Square dancers were asked if they would have a dialogue with the Folklorists to come to an agreement on terminology for the Bill. We all answered in the affirmative as we all desire wording in the Bill describing the Square Dance as including Round Dancing, Clogging, Contra, Line, and Heritage Dances as stated by Congressman Leon Panetta in his testimony.

Those present at the Hearing felt the "deck had been stacked against us", but we feel that everyone in the square dance activity can be proud of the oral and written testimonies that were presented in favor of the square dance being

permanently designated the "National Folk Dance of the U.S.A.". The very strong testimonies in favor of HR 1706 by Congressmen Mineta, Panetta, Hutto, and Leland plus the fact that there are now 266 cosponsors (especially that all five members of the subcommittee are also cosponsors of HR 1706) clearly shows there is a mandate for the Bill to be marked up and sent to the House Floor for a vote.

We felt the opposition's testimonies were repetitious and for the most part based on points emphasized in the "Study" made by Mr. Gerald Parsons, Jr. Their main points of opposition were as follows: 1) No one dance should be designated the National Folk Dance, 2) Ethnic dance groups may feel slighted, 3) Might stop or slow down the development of other folk dances, and 4) The wording of HR 1706 is not correct — no definition of "Square Dance".

The opposition, at the last minute, was allowed three additional people to testify. These three were not on the agenda and had not submitted written testimony. The additional testimonies, and the fact that Mrs. Burdick and Mr. Osgood were requested to shorten their testimony (due to Roll Call votes), resulted in the opposition having 26 minutes more oral testimony than those in favor. We thought it was quite interesting that those testifying in opposition and their supporters chose not to remain and hear testimony in favor of HR 1706. By the time the hearing was

Request a "Mark-Up" for HR 1706 and for the Bill to be sent to the House Floor for a vote.

am of the opinion that you won't find any two callers that are more fun to dance with. The dance levels were A-2 and C-1 with two wood-floored halls operating concurrently (except for the evening dances).

Considering all this, the question keeps being asked, "Why wasn't this event sold out??" A good question!! Some say it was because the weather was hot (although both halls were air-conditioned). Others say that it was expensive (although the price of \$40.00 for a nominal 12 hours of dancing doesn't seem to be expensive to me).

I might make the argument that the event was not well advertised, particularly in the Bay Area. The TNT group did advertise one month in The Prompter, but it was a couple of months ago. (There were very few couples from the Bay Area in attendance.) I haven't seen any of the TNT flyers at the Advanced/Challenge clubs or hoedowns.

There may have been reluctance on the part of some dancers because of the "solidness" of the level (APD A-2) based on the reputation of the callers. My own feeling is that you'll never learn a level unless you get out and dance it. Anyone who had finished an A-2 class could have attended this event and had some good "floor time" at A-2. In any case, I don't have an answer to the problem. I do know that TNT couldn't have made sufficient profit to continue this event every year. They are going to try again in 1985 when the TNT weekend will be July 26 - 27. We'll be there and hope you'll also make plans in that direction.

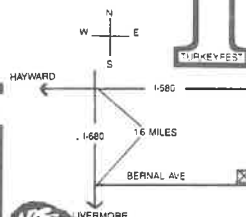

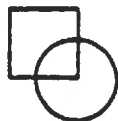
RAFTER ROCKERS

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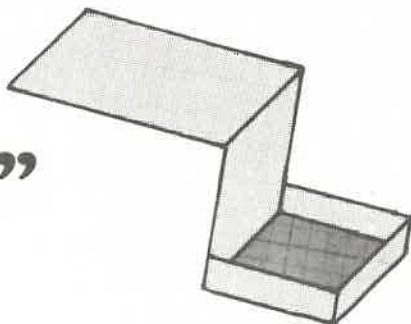
