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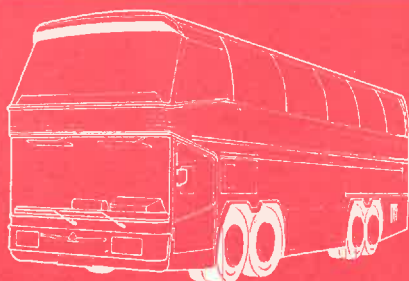

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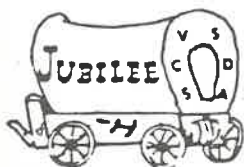


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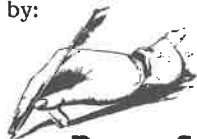

Hope you all have your masks ready for Halloween. This is the month for witches and goblins, and a check of this month's ads shows a preponderance of "Halloween" dances toward the end of the month. Look out for black cats!!

Clubs, callers and associations all have insurance available to cover "liability". For instance, suppose the place really gets jumping and one of the speakers falls over and hits a dancer in the head. Or suppose that on party night someone brings some finger sandwiches that have set in the sun too long and produce instant food poisoning. I wonder if liability insurance will cover the following situation, as described in an Indiana newspaper:

"Achieving some sort of new record for bizarre lawsuits, an Indiana man this week sued a teen-aged girl for permanently injuring his leg when she kicked him during a square dance.

"David McGregor of Evansville charged in his suit that his left leg was injured by a kick from Connie Coston of Crossville, Illinois during a July 3, 1982 square dance at Evansville's Freedom Festival.

Coston was 13 at the time.

"Coston's lawyer said his client had never expected a lawsuit over square dancing and 'it came as a complete surprise'. He said the girl was a member of a southern Illinois square dance club when the alleged kick occurred.

"McGregor's lawyer declined comment but the suit charges the girl with "negligent, unreasonable and uncontrolled dancing."

I've had some people tell me in the past that I was doing some "uncontrolled" dancing. Guess I'll have to be more careful in the future, or my insurance premiums may go up. But then, the cost of many of the items associated with square dancing have increased in the last couple of years. While many hoedowns cost \$6.00 per couple, I still feel this is the entertainment bargain of the year. Where else can one get three hours of entertainment with food for \$3.00 per person. Certainly not at the movies (have you checked the price of popcorn at the movies recently??), not at the opera, and certainly not at any of the

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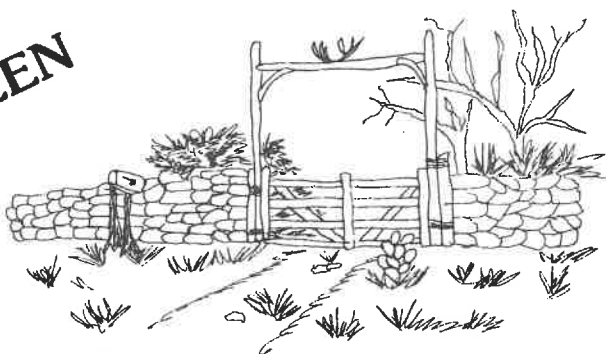
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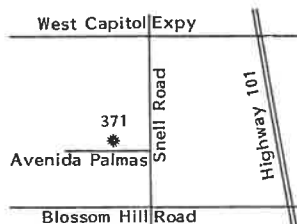
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"OUR" OPINION !

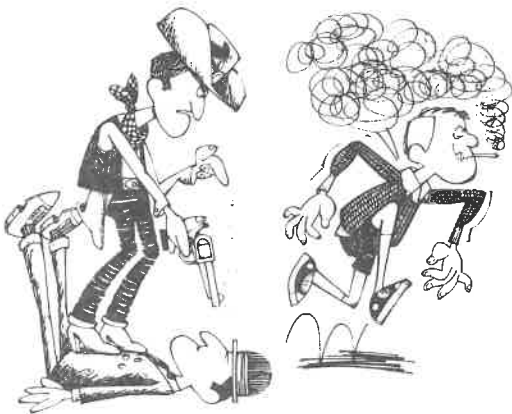

Dear Editor,

There are several thing I did not understand about Bob Southern's article in the Challenge Corner. He argues that PACE callers call at a 'National Level' instead of calling to the floor. Mr. Southern asks "What is 'National Level'?" I would ask rather, "What is Advanced?" Callerlab has developed a list of advanced calls and their definitions. The reason Callerlab went to the effort to do this was so someone from one part of the country could dance anywhere else in the country.



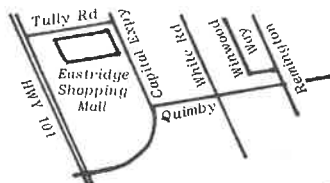
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As long as a call is on the list a dancer should have been taught to dance it.

In this area we are lucky to get callers from all over the country without having to travel to dance to them. The level they call at the dances Mr. Southern referred to is Advanced. The callers rarely deviate from the list and when they do, the call is workshopped first so that everyone on the floor knows it. It must be fascinating, as a caller, to see how callers from different regions of the country call - which calls they prefer and from what formations. However, with a couple of exceptions, local callers do not come to these dances. Why not? Even Mr. Southern had to rely on a report from a dancer rather than attending the dance himself and seeing first hand how the entire floor did.

Advanced dancing is not a Bay Area phenomenon - it is called all over the country. I believe that we have some very good dancers in this area, but we also have a tremendous resource that we either

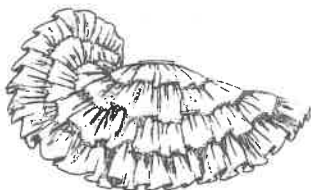
don't utilize or under utilize. We have a unique opportunity to dance to callers from New York, Massachusetts, Ohio, Texas, and many other places, without going to the trouble and expense of traveling there. This gives a dancer (and a caller) a prospective on what other parts of the country are doing with the Advanced program. It is an advantage that most people in this country don't have, and if we make full use of it, the added exposure to different styles of calling can sharpen our dancing skills beyond anything we can get in a closed environment.

Dear Editor,

Please renew my subscription to The Prompter. If possible, I'd like copies of the July and August issues. I want to read the rest of Bonnie Herron's articles.

Incidentally, you might tell Bonnie that although I love and use the delightful anecdote about Henry Ford buying the Wayside Inn in



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order to hire Benjamin Lovett, I'm afraid it just isn't true. My reading and discussions with the archivist at the Ford Museum in Dearborn seem to indicate that Ford bought the Wayside Inn in June, 1923 and then decided to invite his friends Thomas Edison and Harvey Firestone, among others, to a dance at the inn. While searching for a caller for the dance, Benjamin Lovett, who lived in Hudson and taught in Marlboro, was suggested and invited to the inn. Ford and Lovett met first in October, 1923. As near as I can tell, Ford already owned the Wayside Inn before he met Lovett.

One other quote about the number of square dancers is probably also not accurate. The figure 6,000,000 dancers was first used by Bob Osgood in "Sets In Order" about thirty years ago. He tells a neat story about how the figure was accidentally inflated by a popular national magazine to 40,000,000 and served as a useful reference for quite awhile. However, using every source I can discover, I now believe the figure 1,000,000 to

2,000,000 is more like it. Of course, it depends on who you count as a square dancer. I base my estimate on those who have completed square dance classes and are members of square dance clubs. If you count every school child who danced a square dance at least once, and every adult who ever attended a one night stand, perhaps you could come up with 6,000,000.

I feel it is a real indication that something is drastically wrong with the "national folk dance" when it attracts less than 1% of the American public! Gallup polls occasionally report the percentage of Americans who participate in many popular recreations — from fishing to bowling. They don't report activities in which less than 1% of the population participates, square dancing never makes it...

I enjoy your magazine. Keep up the good work.

Dear Parents,

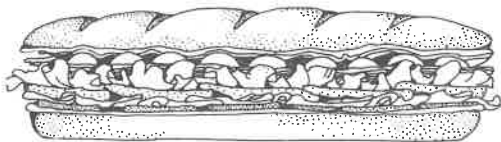
I will be the first to admit that you came to the Jubilee to dance and have fun, not to look after your kids (whom you feel are old enough to take care of themselves); but so did I.

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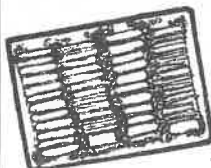
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whom, too. It was being done by non-dancing kids whose parents brought them along without enough to occupy their time.

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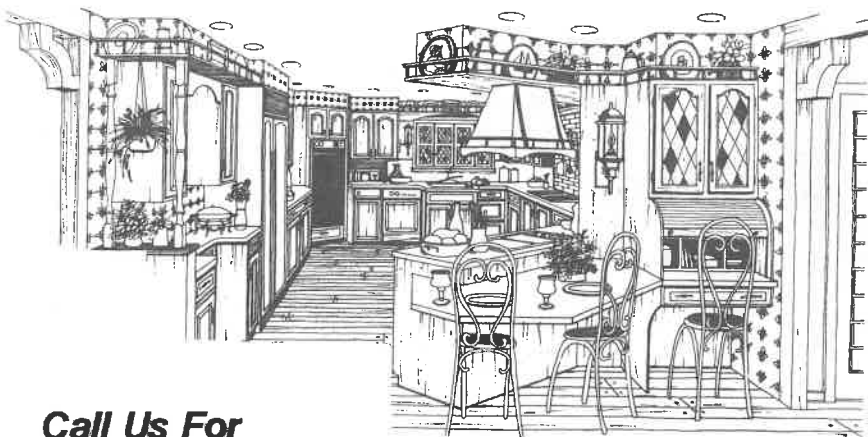
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MAC'S LITTER BASKET

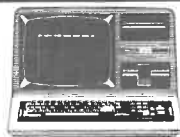
I am particularly grateful to the staff of The Prompter, especially Honey and Chuck, for giving me the chance and for putting up with my absurdities.

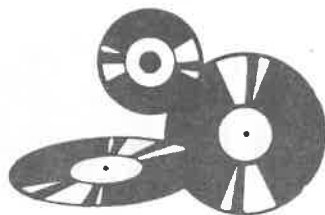

WHAT'S NEW!!

From The DANCE STORE

There are lots of good new items this month: First, sheer-to-the-hip support panty hose with COTTON soles and a reinforced toe! No panty to show beneath your pettipants and no big toes ruining an otherwise good pair of panty hose. Called "Dancing Legs", they are available in Suntan and Beige, in sizes Petite, Medium, Tall and Queen.

Next, Sam's Manufacturing Company has two new slips, both of organza. One has taffeta binding on the bottom and comes in 20, 40, or 60 yards. The second is edged with very feminine white lace with either pale pink, blue, or yellow accents and has color coordinated taffeta binding on each tier. Both slips are available in all of Sam's colors.

Now the biggie!! Coast has a new lady's shoe with the same 1" sculptured heel as the Missy, but has a modified pointed toe and a 5/16" angled instep strap. It's a very feminine, dressy, low heeled shoe. Also, Coast's men's shoes are now available in both tie and loafer styles in white, black, and beige. They are a soft, supple leather with a special leather-wrapped cushioned

midsole and heel for maximum comfort (why can't they do that for the ladies?), and have the dancers chrome leather outsoles. They are expensive, but if they prove to be as comfortable as they say, they'll be well worth the extra price.

New records this month — "Ooh La La" by Ken Bower has Chaparral's good make-you-want-to-dance beat, but is not going to be as universally usable as normal, so you'll have to listen to it first. A little late, but very good, is "Those Lazy, Hazy, Crazy Days of Summer" on Square Tunes (210), by Johnny Preston. Jack Berg continues to produce good music on his Chicago Country label with "Hello My Baby" (011) and, if you're looking for a new patter record, try "Hot Time" on Rocket (107) with good guitar and banjo, also fiddle and harmonica. "Ragged but Right" by Earl Kensy, on Gold Star (721), is a good, smooth piece of music. It has a Mainstream figure, but is so smooth you can easily put anything you want to it. These should give you a good start on the new season, with more coming next month.

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CHALLENGE



★ CORNER

Recent articles have provoked numerous letters and comments from dancers and callers alike. Some have been positive and some have been negative. All in all, they have, at least, caused some of us to think about the subjects in different ways.

Recently, one of our local callers told me he agreed with the various statements that we made about the problems of CALLERLAB in one of our articles. He also said, as have several others, that the Chairman was very much out of line when he wrote me the letter that we published. He stated that it smacks of dictatorship, a statement with which we agree. We would very much appreciate those callers who feel this way writing in to let us know. However, we understand why most wouldn't, as they have their reputations to protect. It's nice that you have at least approached us verbally and told us how you feel.

Was the new crossing rule clarified by CALLERLAB? A recent article written by Ed Foote in News

N' Notes would seem to indicate that it is just as confused as it was before. The following is what Ed had to say on the subject of teaching the affected calls with the new rule.

"How do we teach the affected calls with the new rule? You must protect yourself and show both methods... the old left shoulder pass and the new right shoulder pass. The left shoulder pass has been in effect too long for it to suddenly go away... your dancers will find people years from now still passing left shoulders.

"By showing both methods, you protect yourself from dancers attending an event somewhere, seeing left shoulder passes, and coming back to you with questions. Explain the whole situation, as outlined last month, so the dancers understand what is going on.

"I have told my dancers of the rule change. But I have also told them that if the left-side dancer is hesitant at taking the lead in doing the crossing action, then the right-side dancer should go ahead and do the call passing left shoulders to avoid the set breaking down."

Ed goes on to discuss the possibility that some callers may try to trap dancers by using a crossing action call in such a way that if it is not done right shoulder they will not be able to do the next call. We do not feel that this will happen very often, as callers who do this to get their kicks will pay a price for doing it that may prove to be more costly than the kick is worth.

While we take no real position regarding Ed's article, it further points out the problem that CALLERLAB has created. As we said in a previous article, if the resolutions at this year's convention

LET THE BUYER BEWARE

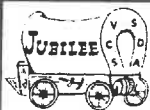
Some years ago after a waltz teach at a National Square Dance Convention, two couples lingered and asked for some instruction on the Telemark which they said was still bothering them. The teacher, well known in some areas, said, "No need to be concerned, all you do is this" — and he proceeded to walk a flat-footed arc to the left in 3 steps and added, "The lady just backs up and pivots to the right." Both couples seemed very relieved at this simplistic version and thanked him for clearing up this bothersome figure.

Unfortunately it is just this sort of thing that confounds the round dance field and causes problems where so many teachers and dancers become defensive. We are not advocating that the Telemark, an Advanced level figure when carried to all its nuances, should be allowed to reach a critical stage in its performance, however, there must be some middle ground where we can settle for adequacy.

There is a way to overcome this misinformation if the teacher would spend more time in improving dance skills and the dancers would favor those who accomplish this end. At least we should alert those who are anxious to improve their personal dancing so that "Let the Buyer Beware" is relevant to round dancing as well as the open market.

A few guidelines to follow could include: If your teacher glosses over many more advanced figures and says "not to worry" — you should. If you hear "Banjo Pivot" cued for an Impetus turn or "Left Pivot" cued for a Telemark — be more than suspicious. When a teacher admonishes his or her dancers to stay home and not attend improvement clinics it is time to ask yourself, "Why?" If a leader says that only basics make up round dancing and that everything else is ballroom — start running.

Nobody should blame a teacher for not knowing all the answers, nevertheless, there is no substitute for honesty. One of the most admirable statements a person can make is, "I don't know, but I'll try and find out and get back to you." You don't need a light like Diogenes of old to discover good round dance practice -- it's out there somewhere, and you are the buyer.

Fashionable Thoughts by Martibet



Marti and I would like to invite you to the Brunch and Fashion Show at the 28th Jubilee. It's a marvelous opportunity to view exciting new square dance ensembles especially created for this event. Tickets are available. Please take note of the Brunch Ad in this issue for details.

Last October Marti and I decided we needed a "Prompter Dress" for the Jubilee. We selected C & C Originals pattern #111 — the Tulip Skirt. We used white eyelet for the bodice and skirt and a red calico print for the tulip petals and midriff. A "tattoo" lace trim was used at the neckline, sleeve edging and tulip petal edges. The pattern directions are clearly stated and we found the pattern running true to size.

The tulip effect was what we wanted -- a unique pattern. However, we found we wanted to make a couple of variations (changes, would be more aptly put). First of all the skirt pattern is a circular, non-gathered design which has the tulip petals sewn down on the skirt. We wanted more movement in the skirt and petals so we chose to do the following:

1. Use 5 to 6 gores for a gathered skirt; with a ruffled tier 1 1/2 widths of 45" materials per gore.
2. Cut double the number of petals so each petal was double-sided with a tattoo lace trim.
3. Gather the finished skirt to fit the waistline and fit the petals to gathered skirt.
4. Finish as pattern indicates, joining to bodice and fitted midriff.



These dresses look alike, but aren't! Can you detect the difference?

An option: underline the eyelet skirt so petticoat color doesn't bleed through so as to detract from the contrast petal color.

Now that's what I did! Marti chose to do another variation which created the same effect. Marti used the gathered gore skirt for more skirt movement, but chose to make the midriff and petals as an apron. This choice really opens up the flexibility of a well-designed white dress.

Moral of this story: Dare to make a change in a pattern to fit your needs, creativity and personality. The more often you make variations to a well-designed pattern, the easier it becomes.

Stir The Bucket With Betty

This month's column is definitely not for the weight watchers, but, boy, are these dishes good!!

Appetizer:

FLUFF FRUIT DIP

- 1 cup sour cream
- 1/3 cup apricot or peach jam
or orange marmalade
- 1/4 cup finely chopped walnuts
- 2 or 3 Tbsp. milk
- Assorted fresh (or canned) fruit
dippers, chilled

Blend all ingredients, except fruit, until the mixture is a good dipping consistency. Chill thoroughly before serving.

Better Homes & Gardens

Main Entree:

VEGETABLE FETTUCINI

- 1 lb. fettucini or spaghetti
- 1 Tbsp. salt
- 3 Tbsp. Parmesan cheese, grated
- 8 Tbsp. butter, softened
- 1/4 cup heavy cream
- 1/2 cup Parmesan cheese, grated
- 1 yellow crookneck squash,
cut into bite-sized pieces
- 1 pattypan squash (summer),
cut into bite-sized pieces
- 8 medium mushrooms sliced or
quartered
- 2 green onions, sliced
- 10 (or more) carrot nuggets

Blend butter, cream and 1/2 cup Parmesan cheese until thoroughly mixed. Chill. Stem vegetables until barely tender (omit onions). Saute lightly, mushrooms in 2 Tbsp. butter. Place all vegetables aside, covered, to retain heat. In 6 to 8 quarts of boiling, salted water add 1 Tbsp. olive oil and pasta. Bring to a boil, reduce heat and cook until tender.



Drain. Add cheese, cream, butter mixture to fettucini along with drained vegetables. Toss until well coated with cheese mixture. Serve immediately with a tossed green salad and toasted garlic sour French bread. Salt and pepper to taste and sprinkle with remaining Parmesan cheese.

Betty's Variation

Dessert:

GRANITA (Flavored Ice Sherbet) LEMON ICE

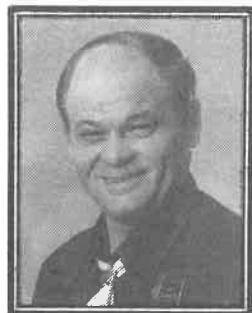
- 2 cups water
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 cup lemon juice

Bring water and sugar to a boil stirring until sugar dissolves. Let mixture cook from boiling for 5 minutes. Remove from heat and let cool to room temperature. Pour in lemon juice and blend. Pour into a non-divided ice tray. Freeze granita for 3 to 4 hours stirring every 30 minutes and scraping ice particles from side of tray. The finished granita should have a fine, snowy texture. Serve with your favorite cookie.

BEYOND MAINSTREAM

EXTEND (THE TAG)
(CALLERLAB Plus Call #5)

DEFINITION

(CALLERLAB April 1983) Starting formation — Double Pass Thru, Parallel Ocean Waves (1/2 Tag), any Tag (1/4 or 3/4) formation. All dancers release handholds (if necessary), step forward and form an ocean wave with the couple they are facing. If the Extend leaves dancers facing no one, they remain facing out. If the starting formation is right-handed, dancers Extend to a right-handed formation; if the starting formation is left-handed, dancers Extend to a left-handed formation. From a Double Pass Thru formation, dancers Extend to a right-hand Quarter Tag formation. From a Quarter Tag formation, dancers Extend to parallel waves. Therefore, all of these calls will be eligible for the Keep/Drop Vote recommended by the Ad Hoc Quarterly Selections Committee at the CALLERLAB Convention in Chicago, 1984.

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LEGACY

INTERNATIONAL ASSEMBLY OF "TRUSTEES" OF THE SQUARE DANCE ACTIVITY

LEGACY is defined as "A Leadership Communication Resource Center". Who then, is better qualified to promote Leadership Training. In order to accomplish this on a local basis, leadership training seminars have been developed. These meetings are patterned after LEGACY's regular biennial meetings and have been given the title MINI-LEGACY. These seminars are from one half day to two days in length. The one day meeting has become the most popular. Usually an evening dance follows the meetings.

MINI-LEGACY's are sponsored by State or Local Federations and Associations, usually assisted by

members of LEGACY who are called "Trustees". The main purpose of this type of meeting is to advise, inform and guide leaders and potential leaders in a manner that will assist them in performing duties and solving problems consistent with local conditions.

In bygone years, when a warrior fought and sacrificed for a cause, he was said to have earned his spurs. Like the knights in the days of the crusades — "You have done your work well, and you have won your spur."

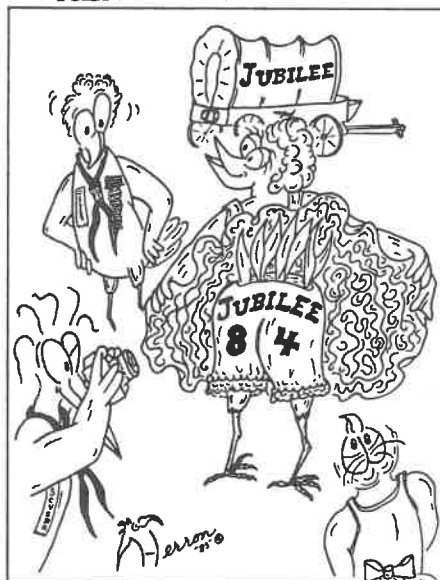
SPINNING WHEELS

DANCING HINTS

Extend (The Tag) is a versatile Plus call that is guaranteed to quickly (only 2 beats of music) change the dancers' formation. Since this change occurs so rapidly, you must immediately establish eye contact with the position (or dancer) where you will complete the call. This is easily done because you will always be moving forward during the Extend action.

From right-handed (or 'no hand') formations, the natural tendency to pass or form right-handed formations will help you correctly execute this call -- But from left-handed formations, you must assure that the Extend action also results "in a lefty". One easy way to accomplish proper execution from left-handed

formations is to remember that any Wave dancer has the more important part in establishing the ending formation because they are the only ones WHO KNOW that the same hand they held with the adjacent dancer in the wave MUST be joined with the dancer they are facing.

When executing the call from left-handed 1/4 Tag formation (the more difficult formation), original wave end dancers can help assure proper ending formation (left-hand parallel ocean waves) by exaggerating their action -- By intentionally extending their left hand to the outside dancer they face immediately upon starting the execution of the call. This action can help you avoid the unnecessary "hand dancing" that frequently occurs when two dancers are unsure which hand to join with the dancer they face.
