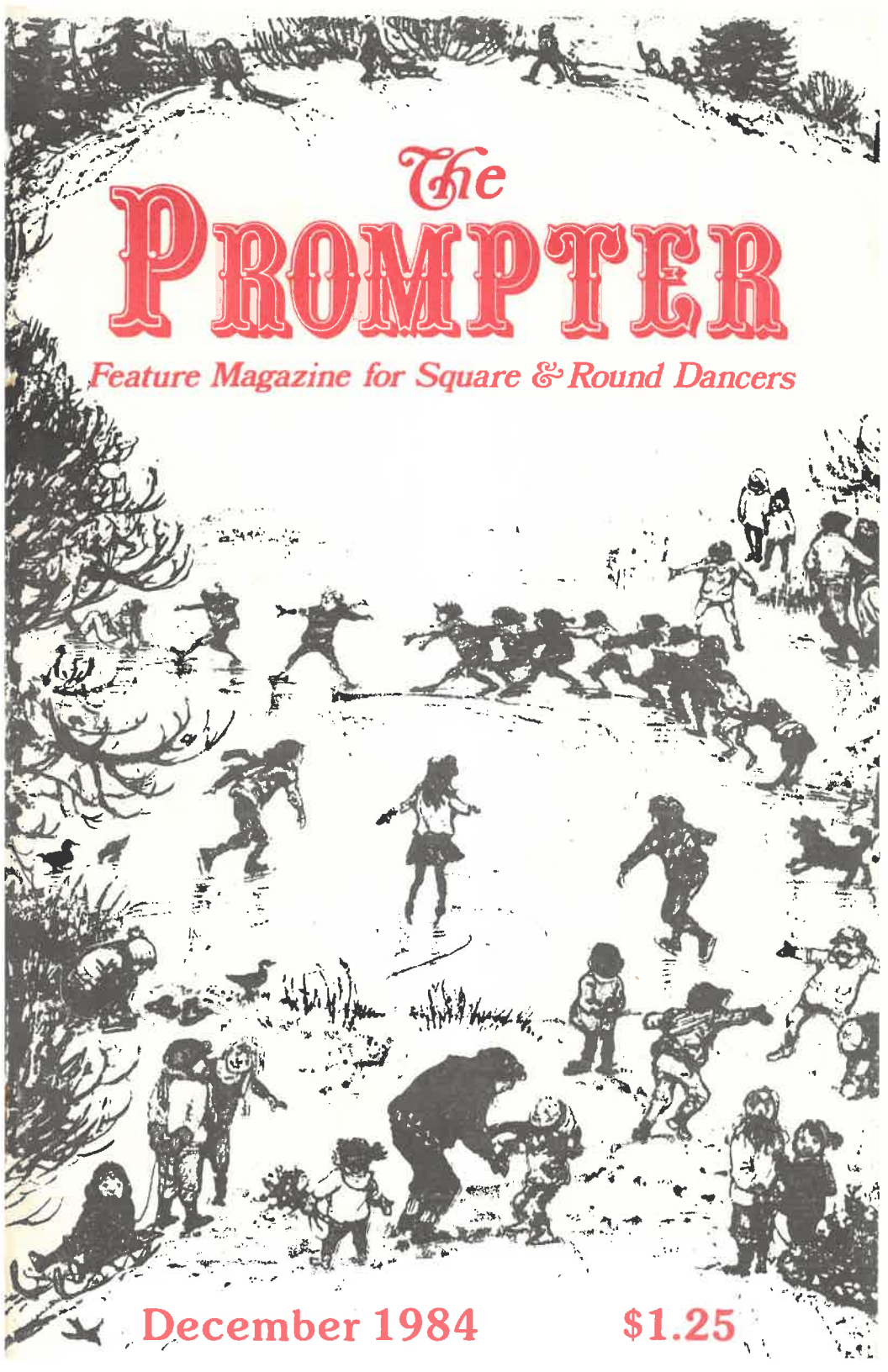

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PUBLISHER'S PATTER

We lose a lot of dancers each year, and many studies have been made as to why this is so. I'll suggest another reason, I call it "brain overload".

I'm beginning to wonder if there isn't some level of dancing complexity for each of us where the brain overload is just too great (and I think mine is phantom split columns). If you are a "faithful" reader of The Prompter, you know that Betty and I make several attempts each week at Challenge dancing. While I have not been quick to learn the more complicated choreography at any level of square dancing, the Challenge levels definitely are more difficult.

While we dance primarily to Davis, Stevens, Sybalsky and Southern (who I think are the best instructors in the business at the Challenge level), there are still some calls and/or concepts I have a terrible time in mastering. There have even been times when I just wanted to say, "To heck with it!" Once, in recent history, I didn't even go dancing because the energy

barrier was just too great — as much as I enjoy dancing, I just couldn't make it because the brain was overloaded.

So, what is the solution? I contend that the best way to counteract "brain overload" is to realize that each of us has some dancing level where we can be competent and enjoy dancing. Staying somewhere near this level will allow us the enjoyment of doing things well. And enjoyment is what this activity is all about.

And talk about brain overload, we recently attended one of Dave Steven's all day C-2 dances (our first). There were six or seven squares at the dance and everyone I talked to found the day a true challenge. We enjoyed the people and the dancing, but it was tough. Of course, C-2 dancing is supposed to be "challenging". This dance lived up to its billing.

The Holidays are just around the corner and if you're been in any of the stores recently, they're starting earlier and earlier every year with

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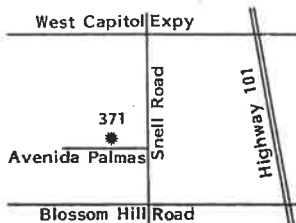
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"OUR" OPINION !

The Caseys also indicate that "surplus funds" (profits?) from these dances, along with Association dues, are used for liability and medical

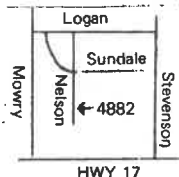

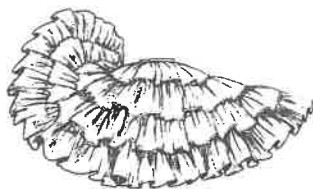

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Stir The Bucket With Betty

This month's column is totally dedicated to "the sweet tooth" group of our readership! Throw away those Figurines, Dexatrim pills, and diet powders and indulge yourself! This month we unfold, thanks to Ginger and Chris, the mysteries of the Truffle. The recipes are from "Oh Truffles by Au Chocolat" written by Pam Williams and Rita Morin. The book, published by Stein and Day, New York, is available in bookstores and well worth the price of \$10.95. Our selection of truffle recipes starts out with an easy basic and progresses to the more difficult. Use the finest chocolate you can find (chocolates which will be combined should be the same brand), and the freshest cream and butter, for these heavenly truffles. Enjoy!

GANACHE TRUFFLE

- 8 oz. chocolate (chopped fine)
- 1/3 cup whipping cream
- 1 lb. chocolate (for optional decoration)

Bring cream just to a boil in heavy saucepan. Remove from heat. Beat chocolate into cream using hand mixer or whisk. Beat until smooth and all chocolate is melted. Chill in refrigerator until firm (1 - 3 hours). Scrape spoon or melon-ball cutter across surface of mixture; quickly press with fingertips into 1-inch balls. Freeze, well wrapped in plastic. Decoration: Dip in same flavor of chocolate as used to make truffles. Store, well wrapped, in refrigerator for 1 week; freezer 1 - 2 months.



WALNUT TRUFFLE

- 4 oz. milk chocolate
- 4 oz. white chocolate
- 2 Tbsp. unsalted butter at room temperature
- 1 cup whipping cream
- 1 cup chopped walnuts
- 1 lb. semisweet chocolate (for optional decoration)
- 2 cups walnut halves (for optional decoration)

Scald cream in heavy saucepan. Remove from heat and let cool to room temperature. Strain through sieve. Carefully melt milk and white

chocolates together in double boiler over hot water. Remove from heat. With a whisk, beat butter into chocolate until smooth. Vigorously beat cream into chocolate and butter mixture with whisk until light and fluffy. Fold in chopped walnuts, mixing well. Chill until firm (2 - 4 hours). Scrape spoon or melon-ball cutter across surface of mixture; quickly press with fingertips into 1-inch balls. Freeze, well wrapped in plastic.

For a spectacular decoration: Remove centers from freezer to soften slightly, press walnut half into top of each truffle and dip in melted chocolate, coating only bottom half so walnut is still showing. Store in refrigerator, tightly wrapped, for 1 week; freezer 1 month.



AMARETTO TRUFFLE

- 4 oz. semisweet chocolate
- 4 oz. milk chocolate
- 1/2 cup unsalted butter at room temperature
- 1/2 cup Amaretto Liqueur
- 1 lb. semisweet chocolate (for optional decoration)
- 1/4 lb. finely chopped toasted almonds (for optional decoration)

Carefully melt chocolate in double boiler over hot water just until melted. Remove from heat. Vigorously beat butter into warm chocolate with a whisk or at high speed with a hand mixer until light and fluffy. Continue beating and slowly add Amaretto Liqueur. Chill mixture until firm (1 - 3 hours). Scrape spoon or melon-ball cutter across surface of mixture; quickly press with fingertips into 1-inch balls. Freeze, well wrapped in plastic. Decoration: Dip centers in melted semisweet chocolate, sprinkling chopped almonds on top while chocolate is still wet. Store, well wrapped, in refrigerator for 1 month; freezer indefinitely.

CHOCOLATE DIPPING AND TEMPERING

- 1 lb. pure chocolate broken into pieces
- 4 oz. pure chocolate grated as finely as possible
- Double boiler
- Wooden spoon
- Candy thermometer
- Cold tap water in bowl or pan approximately same size as double boiler bottom

Place 1 lb. chocolate into double boiler over hot water. Be careful to stir and watch that water doesn't boil. Insert candy thermometer into chocolate mass and monitor the temperature constantly. When temperature reaches 100°F, remove top of double boiler and place in cold water bath, continuing to stir vigorously as temperature drops. Add grated chocolate by tablespoons. After every two tablespoon additions, beat until shavings are dissolved. When temperature reaches 87°F, remove a small amount of chocolate from double boiler and spread on marble slab or cooled plate. Let this amount harden to test that remaining chocolate is tempered. As the test batch is hardening, make sure to maintain a temperature of 87°F and continue stirring. Don't forget around sides and bottom of the pan, as these areas cool faster. If test is positive — in that the chocolate remains smooth and glossy — it is ready to be used for molding and dipping. If there are any grey streaks or dull areas, return test chocolate to double boiler and repeat tempering process from the beginning. Dipping centers: drop center into chocolate. Using dipping or dinner fork, retrieve center by lifting gently out of chocolate. Lightly tap fork on side of pan to remove excess chocolate. (This prevents a pool of excess chocolate on bottom of finished chocolate called a "foot".) Carefully place chocolate on parchment or wax paper lined tray to harden. You can also use your fingers for dipping. Release truffle from fingertips onto parchment swirling top for a decorative finish.

A LIFE IN THE DAY OF A ROUND DANCE TEACHER

We recently took a trip to Canada to do a round dance weekend and were quite excited about our first "international" appearance. Plus — anyone would be excited about going to a place called Saskatoon, Saskatchewan — in October. Little did we know that getting there would turn out to be anything but routine.

Our travel plans from San Francisco to Saskatoon included two plane changes: one at Calgary, with a thirty minute connection; and the second at Edmonton, where we had forty-five minutes to change planes — and get through customs. (If you think that sounds like a high risk schedule — read on!)

We were flying Air Canada and, as luck would have it, our first flight was thirty minutes late getting off the ground because of air traffic in San Francisco. The stewardess said, "Not to worry, your plane in Calgary will wait. There are quite a few passengers on this plane making the same connection."

It is not in my nature "not to worry" and I was already worrying about whether our luggage would make all the connections, so this concern now had company. As it turned out, the stewardess was half wrong. Our connecting plane didn't wait because it didn't have to — it wasn't there yet. In fact, it was forty-five minutes late.

Finally, we were off the ground in Calgary — different airplane,

different stewardess, but same problem. Forty-five minute connection time in Edmonton, forty-five minutes late equals zero. The stewardess said, "Not to worry, we'll get you off the plane first and rush you through customs. Everyone on the other end will be informed of your situation."

Five trips to the restroom later, we were on the ground and being rushed through customs. Well, halfway through customs. We were asked why we were entering Canada and, unfortunately, no one had informed us we were supposed to lie. You see, you can't go to Canada to work without having a work permit, and teaching a round dance weekend is considered work.

This meant we were illegal entrants and required a special form to be admitted as an exception. We explained to the gentleman our connection problem and he said, "Not to worry, the plane to Saskatoon will wait." I continued to worry and was rewarded by the fact that this time it was not in vain. Twenty minutes in customs was five minutes longer than the plane would wait.

We were escorted up to reservations to see what other connections could be made. We learned that this was Canada's Thanksgiving Weekend (Columbus Day), only two planes a day went into Saskatoon, and the next one (last one) was oversold by eleven seats. The best they could do was 7 p.m. the next day. Two more trips to the restroom cleared my head

and I realized that our only choice was automobile — a six hour drive.

I went to the car rental area where there were four agencies. The first three had no cars, or none that they would send one-way to Saskatoon (almost as though there was no way to get them back). The last rental agency (Avis), said "Sure, we have a car. Thirty-six dollars a day, ten cents a kilometer, plus a drop off fee."

This was too easy. I said, "How much is the drop off fee?"

"\$175.00", she said.

I went back upstairs where Ione was guarding the luggage, mumbling over and over, "I can't believe this is happening." With considerable effort we were able to reach the people in Saskatoon, who were waiting at the airport to welcome us, and presented them with the news. It was now 4 p.m. The party dance that night started at 7:30 p.m. (fortunately, we did not have to be there for that), and our clinic started the next morning at 9:30 a.m.

The committees met and the strategies developed, but in the meantime they gave us the names of two couples in Edmonton who were going to the weekend and who may not have left yet.

I phoned the first name and contrary to our run of luck, someone answered the phone. After explaining the situation she said, "I have some good news and some bad news." The bad news was that they were not going. They had been in an auto accident that morning and her husband was in the hospital with a dislocated ankle, cracked ribs, lacerations, etc. However, her sister and brother-in-law were going to the weekend, were leaving in thirty minutes, and would be happy

to take us. I breathed a sigh of relief and then mentioned we had quite a bit of luggage as we were planning to stay for a week to do some sightseeing. She said, "Not to worry." I tried my best.

One and a half hours later they met us at the airport — driving a Japanese import with a trunk that already looked full. All we had were two large suitcases, a big hanging bag, a record box, a briefcase, a duffelbag full of slips and shoes, two heavy coats, and Ione's purse. How we got this all in the car I will never know, but I will always remember that trip since sitting in the back seat was like we had been packed for shipping — with all those little white plastic foam things. We were immobilized for six hours, but did arrive in Saskatoon at 2 a.m. in time for a little sleep and on to the morning workshop.

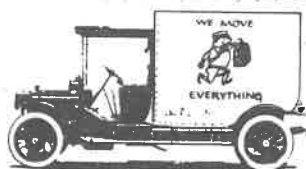

The couple who drove us to Saskatoon will hopefully come down to visit us in the near future; the rest of the folks at the dance, including those who put us up, couldn't have been more friendly and hospitable. The clinics and dancing went beautifully, as did the sightseeing over the next few days. All in all, it was the most memorable weekend we have done, and we look forward to making a return trip someday soon!

CHALLENGE

A new note on an old subject. A while back, we wrote a short piece on "garbage calling". Having been guilty of this ourselves a time or two, we realize that some callers make extensive use of experimentals at Plus, and higher levels, because they simply become bored with the material they are calling and want to do something new for themselves and their dancers. Sometimes it is more for themselves than for the dancers and that is probably the worst reason for using experimentals.

We get frequent complaints from dancers that certain callers do much more of this than the dancers want to put up with. Many dancers have left workshops due to the overuse of experimentals by the caller. Their feeling is that they went to learn Advanced, or C-1, or C-2, or whatever and they would like to spend their time doing just that, not learning a lot of material that, based on past experience, will not survive the test of time.

Here is an idea for the bored caller, or the caller that thinks his dancers are bored. The next time you feel that you have to do an experimental, use the time instead to learn to teach and call a move that is on the next list higher than the level of the club or workshop you are doing. By doing so, you will broaden your own experience and,

at the same time, you will have something new to teach your dancers. Also, since the figure is already on an established list, it has already stood the test of time and will still be around if and when your dancers decides to move up to that level.

Another idea to broaden the material you have available is to use calls on the next higher list which can be directed by the use of calls the dancers are already familiar with. Many good callers do this with ease. Since most calls are made up of existing calls anyway, it is not very hard to do. An example of this would be to call a Dixie Diamond at a Mainstream, Plus, or Advanced dance. Not that you will say Dixie Diamond mind you, but you will use the directional commands: Ladies lead Dixie Style to a Wave, Men Hinge, Ladies Turn Back, to accomplish the Dixie Diamond figure. Be careful to pick only figures in which you can direct all parts easily. Figures that have numerous dancers doing different things at the same time do not lend themselves to this use.

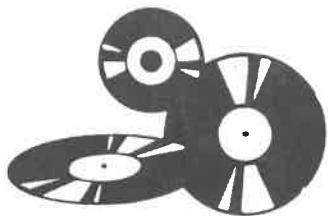
Some Advanced figures that work well for us are: Acey Deucey, Quarter Thru, Pass In, Horseshoe Turn, Step and Slide, Pass Out, As Couples, Cycle and Wheel, Mix, Pass and Roll, Scoot and Dodge, Remake the (set up), and Scoot and Weave. Some C-1 figures that work are: Ah So, Alter the Wave, Circle By, Diamond Chain Thru, Dixie Diamond, O Circulate, Scatter Scoot, Swing the Fractions, Tag Back to a Wave, and Transfer and Anything. Try them and you'll see, but be sure you can do a good job of directing the action in terms that the dancers will understand.

Notes from around the square... P.A.C.E. will have Dave Lightly calling this month; Diamond Dancers first dance was successful; Napa weekend coming up in January; Almaden Squares C-1 class starts in January; Star Eights and Acey Deuceys will be starting Advanced workshops in January; Advanced and Challenge is everywhere, go dance some. Have a Merry Christmas! See you in a Star Tip! Ho! Ho! Ho!

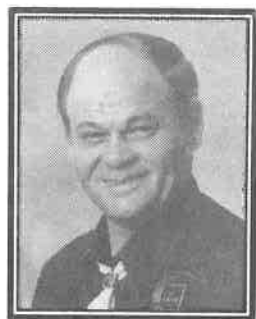

BEYOND MAINSTREAM

(Anything) & ROLL
(CALLERLAB Plus Call #10)

DEFINITION

(CALLERLAB April 1983) Starting formation - Various. The term "...& Roll" may be added to any call which, by definition, causes one or more dancers to have turning body flow to the right or left at the completion of the call, but not to a call which, by definition, has all dancers walking straight forward at the completion of the call. It is an instruction to the dancer(s) to turn individually in place, one-quarter (90°) more in the direction of body flow determined by the preceding command.

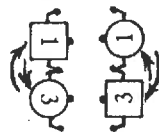
Note that if "...& Roll" is added to a call which, by definition, has some dancers walking straight forward at the completion of the call, those dancer will do nothing for the "...& Roll".

(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #1311.)

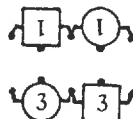
In addition to the definition above, CALLERLAB also (April 1983) established the following uses of Anything & Roll as deemed appropriate for possible inclusion in Plus Programs at the caller's discretion: Star Thru & Roll, California Twirl & Roll, Run Family & Roll, Trade Family (not to include Couples Trade) & Roll, Touch 1/4 & Roll, Spin the Top & Roll, Cast Off 3/4 from Ocean Waves only & Roll, Slide Thru & Roll, Fold Family & Roll, Peel Off & Roll, Fan the Top & Roll, Single Hinge & Roll, Back Track & Roll, Flip the Diamond & Roll, Peel the Top & Roll, and Trade the Wave & Roll.

DANCING HINTS

Anything & Roll ("...& Roll") is one of the very few calls that requires you, the dancer, to remember the action of the previous call in order to properly accomplish the "...& Roll" movement.

Since the direction you turn in "...& Roll" is dependent upon the call ahead of it, the first thing you must accomplish is doing the "previous" call correctly -- otherwise all may be lost before you start. Assuming the "previous" call is danced correctly, three things which can help you dance "...& Roll" successfully are: (1) completing the previous call before trying to "...& Roll"; (2) "not wandering"; and (3) "rolling with the flow".

Because the caller must give the command "...& Roll" before you have actually completed the previous call (so that you will know that it is coming and pay attention to your turning direction), you may try to "Roll" before you have really

completed the call ahead of it. Be sure you have actually finished the call ahead before you try to "...& Roll".

The tendency to want to walk in a circle or "wander", rather than "Roll" in place, is normal and usually takes some thinking about to change. When you have completed the previous call -- stop, pretend your feet are glued to the floor, and then turn one-quarter more -- in place -- in the direction you were already turning.

Remember, the "Roll" is, by definition, always in the same direction you were already turning in the previous call. It is much harder to reverse your body flow -- so don't fight it -- "Roll with the flow".

Since "...& Roll" can create a wide variety of ending formations, don't expect to end in any particular formation. As you can see in Example #4, some unusual formations can result -- so, don't "fix it somehow" by moving or turning. "Hold your position" no matter how strange it may seem and let the caller worry about what to do next.

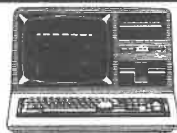
Although "...& Roll" only takes two beats of music to execute properly, there is no need to "rush" the actions -- even with so short a time, there is plenty of time to DANCE this move.

Surplus funds from these dances, as well as your Association dues, are used for the following items: Printing the calendars and Newer Dancer's Handbooks, liability and medical insurance, educational planning (in conjunction with the teachers' seminar held at the Jubilee), and help financially to support the youth clubs.

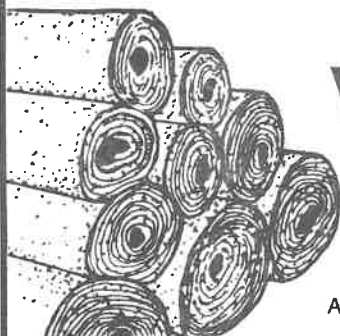
You also may not be aware of the "Jubilee Pennant", better known as the "Buckskin". This buckskin is displayed by the club which has it in their possession, BUT may be "stolen" by any Association club visiting them on a club night and signing in with two squares. Each club, when acquiring the buckskin, should burn its club brand (name) and date (no larger than three inches square) onto it. The club that last held the buckskin is not allowed to reclaim it for a period of thirty days. When the buckskin is full (as determined by the Board of Directors), the club with its name on it the most times can retain the buckskin permanently.

Dance Examples

Heads Lead Right, Veer Left,

Couples Circulate, **Harmonize**, Right & Left Grand.

Sides Square Thru, Swing Thru, **Harmonize**, Ferris Wheel, Zoom, Centers Pass Thru, All Pass Thru, Left Roll, Left Allemande.

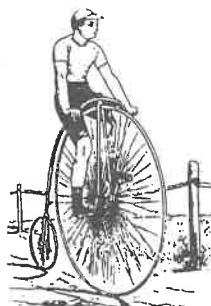
Singing Call Figure

Heads Square Thru, Do Sa Do, Swing Thru, **Harmonize**, Ferris Wheel, Zoom, Centers Pass Thru, Swing & Promenade.

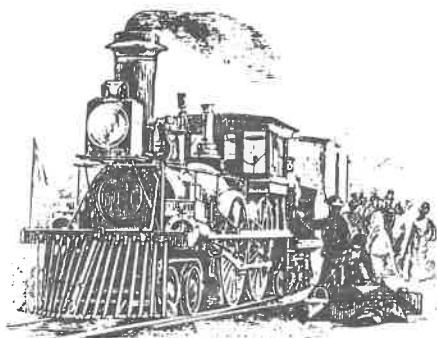

And as he twirled his beard, there was a chain reaction.



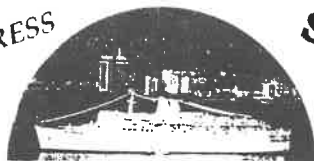
Bits of old records were caught in his hair;
