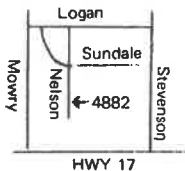


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We Get Letters

In the exchange of letters (January 1985 Prompter) from the Bows & Beaus and Woodstackers, the latter had the opportunity of reviewing Wendy Delahaise's letter before replying, whereas the Bows & Beaus did not get the same privilege before publication. This letter is designed to set the record straight.

1) Unilateral Action: It was at Doug Saunders' request that the Bows & Beaus, for the first time, tried to have the class and club on the same night. It was agreed that 1 1/2 hours would be devoted to each, i.e., less teaching time than on a separate class night, and therefore a longer period for graduation. The Board and Doug agreed to aim for graduation between Halloween and Thanksgiving.

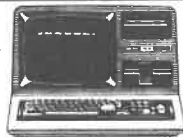
Later in the year, again by agreement, it was decided to plan (and advertise) a refresher class for rusty dancers starting September 10 (basically, they would join the last weeks of our class). Also, August 6 was picked for the club to dance and Doug to call at the Santa Clara County Fair.

The point here is that all the above decisions were agreed upon by the caller and Board. To accuse us of acting unilaterally is a prime

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case of the pot calling the kettle black. It was Doug who, unilaterally, started to shortchange the club members on dancing time (which we need to keep up our skills). It was he who, unilaterally, without talking to our Board, announced that the refresher class would start on August 6 (the night set aside for our dancing at the Fair) and that graduation would now be on September 10 (the date originally advertised for starting the refresher class). The whole thing not only cast us in the role of villains in the eyes of our class, but caused the club considerable embarrassment.

Trying to salvage something of a bad situation, the Board stuck to the original graduation date, but offered to consider the application of any dancer who felt ready to join our club, using the procedures applicable to dancers coming from another club.

I am willing to give the benefit of the doubt to class members who predominantly heard one side of the story; I am sorry that they got caught in the upheaval. But Ron

Swanson was Bows & Beaus Vice-President, in charge of the class; he attended Board meetings. For him to sign his name to a statement accusing our Board of unilateral action is incomprehensible — to put it mildly.

2) Premeditation: The Woodstackers' letter admits that the plotting to form a new club had been going on for some time; the graduation issue was the pretext to take action.

3) Married Couples: The couples in our class were told early in the game that our current bylaws precluded them from becoming full members of the Bows & Beaus, so, at least, they were not misled. A committee has been appointed for updating and reviewing our bylaws: the issue of membership for couples will certainly be addressed among others. Whatever changes the committee recommends will then have to be approved by our members. Since there is a divided opinion in the Bows & Beaus on the issue, the result cannot be predicted. Meanwhile it was made



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clear to couples that they would be most welcome to dance with us as guests for as long as they desired.

The above is fact, not fiction. Now let us get back to square dancing!

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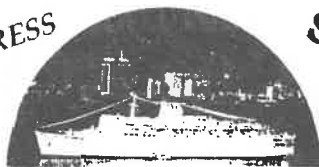
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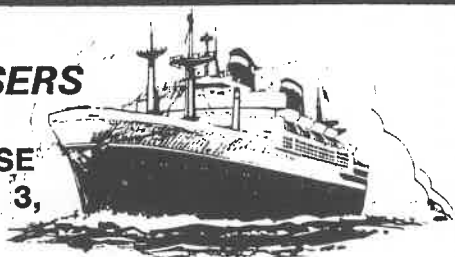

It is quite obvious Bill Davis' article, in your January issue, stated what he felt would be improvements in the National Square Dance Program, as a caller and not as a dancer.

Much of what he has proposed, such as stabilizing the number of calls within a level, I heartily agree with, but as a dancer I take serious exception to his intent to change calls periodically within a level.

Anyone who has square danced over the past twenty years and had a major illness, or other discontinuity of participation, knows the difficulties of returning to square dancing due to the changes that have taken place. As Bill stated, "In 1964 we felt we were

totally up-to-date with the times, BUT HOW TIMES CHANGE. It doesn't take too close a look to see that the calls... have changed a lot in the ensuing 19 years." End of quote.

It doesn't take a genius to realize that the calls Bill is counting in those 200 square convention hall statistics are made up by callers, NOT THE DANCERS. We dance what you guys call! This is what CALLERLAB, and its choreography happy artists, have done to square dancing as a business enterprise. The dancers had nothing to do with these changes and as a group I believe square dancing has suffered from them.

We have got to stabilize this activity so that its participants can move IN - OUT, UP or DOWN with ease to meet today's mobile society. A dancer who leaves must know what he can return to with ease.

From a dancer's viewpoint, I want to see everybody able to enjoy this activity as a "National Pastime" not as a "National level problem". We must recognize there will be



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periods in dancers' lives where square dancing will have to take a back seat to other more important things in its participants' lives.

Bill's statement, "Stifling change is probably the surest way of killing the program," I believe is inconsistent when he himself recognized the tremendous changes in his previous statement, and we are facing "National Level" surveys showing the reduction of "club" dancing, as reported in previous issues, and also Jack Murtha's October letter, showing a less than 1% participation of Americans in square dancing. Something is "killing the program" and it is "changes" in it. The answer is not a "change or die philosophy", but "stability". Something you can learn in school and expect it to be there later on in life when you need a little FUN or want to return to after your other world has collapsed.

Baseball is still played with four bases and "first" is still to the "right". "To the right." Hum, sounds familiar.

Responsibility — whether directed or implied, comes into all aspects of our lives. Even into square dancing. Dancers have a responsibility to other dancers and the caller concerning one's level and ability. When they show up for a weekend dance, they should be knowledgeable and familiar, experienced with most of the material and figures for the advertised level of the dance. Callers are contracted and hired for a specific level. The caller has responsibility for putting together an interesting and fun program at the level he was hired for.

If the floor level is not up to the advertised level, then the caller is at a disadvantage. It may be difficult to back off and call a level that the floor can perform. In which case, the evening may not be as much fun as it could have been for either party.

Callers also share an additional responsibility with clubs or groups who contract with them to call a dance. The two parties need clear, and consistent, prompt communications to work out dates,



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times and locations. Details of travel, lodging, program requests, and other ideas are also important. Clubs hosting a dance need this close communication to have a successful evening. In putting together a dance, the group doing it has the responsibility to do the advertising, school or hall rental, and food-beverage supplies. As a general rule, clubs or groups do a fine job of this and don't need added worry over the caller not fulfilling his or her part of the bargain. Caller reliability and communication is important to the success of the dance. The anniversary hoedown is important to the point that it is what keeps some clubs afloat and existing; offering a night of fun dancing to other dancers and ensuring that the club will be able to continue for another year.

Valley, we get over there occasionally.

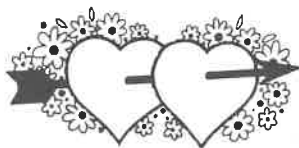
We enjoy the fine callers in the area and also yours (joke). I do enjoy dancing to your calling "Honey".

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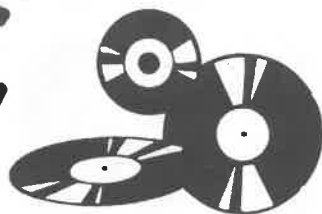

What's New?? Well, for you sewers, Shirley's Pattern Company (they make pattern parts — bodices, skirts and sleeves for you to mix and match) has a new six-gore skirt with a waistband that is smooth in front and elasticised in back with a sash (sound like a Dance Store Super Slimming Waistband?). Also a jumper blouse with a high neckline and 3/4 sleeves; a cute long and short peek-a-boo sleeve pattern; a jumper and/or sundress top (the laced front, Tyrolean style, with a removable dicky); AND a bodice with the high back neckline (similar to some of the Gunny Sax) with a modified sweetheart neck, or a scooped keyhole... How's that for giving us something new and different?

Coast Shoes is presenting a T Strap with a modified round toe and a two-inch heel. It's available in black, white, silver, gold, brown, red, bone and navy.

Record-wise we have two good

releases on Riverboat, "Walk Right In" (213), by Dave Gullie, and "Leaving on a Jet Plane" (214) by Larry Marchese. There are four new Rhythm releases, all by Wade Driver: "The Rose" (181); "City of New Orleans" (182); a very good "Oh, Lonesome Me" (183), and best of the bunch (my opinion, of course), "I Don't Know a Thing About Love" (180).

Wagon Wheel Records, owned by Bob Ruff, half of the Ruff and Murtha team that put out the invaluable Level 1, 2 and 3 Teaching Series, has released the second in a series of LP's to be used with the teaching records. This one (Wagon Wheel #2) uses Basics 1 - 34. It utilizes the good music from the old Wagon Wheel records, such as "Shindig in the Barn", "King of the Road", "Walkin' in the Sunshine", and "Mississippi". Bob Ruff does the calling. It has eight singing calls, one contra, and one instrumental hoedown. A very valuable LP for teachers, and for practicing at home.

These are just a few highlights of the many record releases, and there'll be more to come next month.

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CHALLENGE



★ CORNER

"It was an attitude adjustment, it'll work every time" -- but sometimes it takes considerable time to make it work. Many callers have told me that they almost have to beat some dancers over the head to bring about the "attitude adjustment" required to move from Plus level to Advanced and Challenge.

We have found that it does take many dancers a great deal of time to accomplish the state of mind in which they finally realize that they have to learn figures by definition and be very much more aware of positions when they move up to the higher levels. Some dancers reach this point more quickly than others, and some never seem to reach it at all. Those who don't ever reach it may continue trying to dance Advanced or Challenge, but they continue to be just that, trying!

The first problem that new Advanced or Challenge dancers encounter until they make the "attitude adjustment" is that they will go to great efforts, at times, to make the ending formation of a figure come out the way they think it should based on their past experience at a lower level. They seem to be totally unaware that the ending formation is dictated by the starting formation.

The second thing they will have

to adjust to is finally accepting the fact that they will actually have to learn figures by definition if they are to be successful. That is meant to imply that they will actually have to memorize the definitions of the figures they learn, as opposed to trying to learn them based on the position they start and finish in as an individual dancer.

Third, they will have to become adept at "where am I" and where is everybody else in the square. This is what we mean by saying you must become conscious of your position in the square at all times, and you must be aware of where other people are in the square at the same time.

When you get into Challenge dancing, in particular, you will then have to learn to dance "footprints". This is done by all good Challenge dancers, but is more difficult because these "footprints" are where somebody was or would be in the case of phantoms. Believe me, it requires very accurate movement from one position to another when you are going to a "footprint" or a spot on the floor and not always meeting another dancer at that spot.

One other thing to consider — to help keep your square going and to really know whether you are in the right spot at any given time, look to see who your opposite in the square is before the tip starts. If you are the number one lady, your opposite is the number three lady. By learning about opposites and mirror images in the square, you give yourself a better chance of being where you are supposed to be at any time. Another thing that good dancers in the upper levels do is to pick out the person who matches them in a square on each side of them. That is to say, if you are the number four man in your square, look to see who the number four men in the squares beside you are. This will allow you to check yourself out at any time and see if you are in the same place they are. It works because it is rare that all three squares will have a problem at the same time.

THE CLUB TRAVELLING DRESS

The ladies of the Almaden Squares Square Dance Club of San Jose traditionally select a design for a "travel dress" for the club's annual outing to the Napa Weekend. In 1984, the club selected Simplicity pattern #5724. The pattern is a very dressy design, easily adjusted for various figures, and is very flattering to everyone. The dress is an uncomplicated sewing task, but I would make one suggestion not included in the pattern. Insert 2 layers of Pellon (medium weight) half-moon shaped pieces into the upper curve of the sleeve. Ease gathers after basting the fabrics together. This will hold the large sleeve out in a graceful manner, rather than allowing it to droop.

The club committee usually makes fabric suggestions when it presents its design selection, but there's always a lot of latitude given for personal preferences. I selected a small Black Watch plaid fabric for the skirt, beige cotton lace underlined in navy broadcloth for the bodice, with navy satin ribbon as trim on the sleeves, waistband, and skirt ruffle of navy broadcloth accented with lace trim. I wore a kelly green petticoat with navy pettipants.



This was the first time I had worked with cotton lace... It was an experience! First suggestion, buy plenty of lace. Secondly, wash and dry the lace if you plan to wash and dry the dress. Otherwise, it's dry clean time! My first batch of lace shrank 18 inches in width! Have you ever tried to cut 45" sleeves or a gored skirt out of 18" fabric? I've not had any other problems with shrinkage or raveling, primarily since I basted the lace to the lining and zigzagged the edges.

I've really enjoyed wearing this dress and if you decide to use this pattern, I hope you'll find it a worthwhile project.

TRIPLE TRADE (CALLERLAB Plus Call #27)

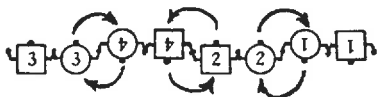
DEFINITION

(CALLERLAB April 1983) Starting formation — Tidal Wave, Tidal Two-Faced Line, Point-to-Point Diamonds, Six-dancer Ocean Wave, Any 3 pairs of adjacent dancers. The two end dancers remain in place as the three adjacent pairs of dancers (the six in the center) Trade with each other.

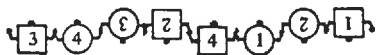
(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #1088.)

TRIPLE TRADE (Example #1)

From Heads Lead Right, Veer Left, Couples Hinge...



The two end dancers remain in place as the three adjacent pairs of dancers (the six in the center) Trade with each other.



TRIPLE TRADE (Example #2)

From Sides Lead Right, Circle to a Line, Step to an Ocean Wave...



The two end dancers remain in place as the three adjacent pairs of dancers (the six in the center) Trade with each other.



TRIPLE TRADE (Example #3)

From Heads Lead Right, Veer Left, Couples Hinge, Ladies Hinge, Diamond Circulate (Point-to-Point Diamonds)...



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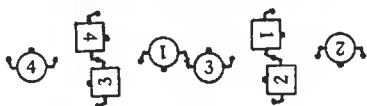
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DANCING HINTS

Triple Trade is an extremely simple and versatile call that can 'catch you by surprise' depending upon the starting formation. The last of the starting formations, "Any 3 pairs of adjacent dancers", allows this call from many non-standard or less-frequently used formations — But in all cases, the formation MUST contain one pair of dancers who are adjacent on each side of the 'flagpole center' of the formation (the 'very center two' dancers).

Since all square dance formations have exactly four dancers on each side of the 'flagpole center', you can usually determine exactly where you are with respect to this 'center' with very little difficulty —

And when you are part of the 'very center two', you know that you must quickly execute your Trade action slightly before the remaining two pairs of dancers. In fact, the "main secret" to the proper execution of Triple Trade is to quickly establish precisely who are the very center two dancers who must start the action.

When you are part of a pair of dancers that is NOT the 'very center two', your Trade action can be accomplished slightly after you see (or sense) the trading action of the very center two dancers.

As 'a lonesome end dancer', you must resist the natural tendency to move forward while the remaining six dancers are active — Although it's really not a lot of fun to stand still while everyone else is moving, you hold the "secret to success" for the proper accomplishment of the ending formation (besides, Triple Trade only takes 4 beats of music to complete). Holding your position will help all the other dancers in your set to properly complete Triple Trade and be 'ready' for the next call.

A MINI-CLINIC — WHY NOT?

There are new faces in round dance leadership who come to us from the ballroom field, and increasing numbers of the "old timers" are getting excellent training the second time around. As a result, we have a fairly large force of teachers conducting clinics on weekends which heretofore were strictly teaches on choreography. We think that this is a healthy trend and that it will eventually lift our avocation to greater heights. Of course, it will prompt more colorful descriptions from the square dance rounders, but we hired out as tough hands and can bear up under it.

There is an unfortunate attendant feature about this clinic boom -- not enough of the teachers who

need this instruction to pass along are getting it. Two compelling reasons seem to be in the forefront: 1. The teacher feels that more instruction is not needed because the years of experience do not warrant it.; and 2. They are concerned about their image where they are taking lessons instead of giving them (the defensive posture). From our amateur analysis of this problem, we see more people leaning toward reason #2 for shunning the needed training.

For whatever reason, it seems to make a great deal of sense to attend the quality clinics and come away enriched to whatever degree you can muster. Without naming names, it has been a pleasant surprise to see so many top leaders coming to other teachers' clinics and participating fully. I will quote from one of our greatest: "We can always learn something -- sometimes it is just what not to do."

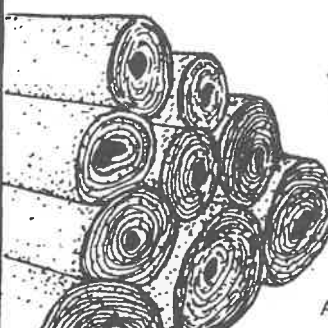

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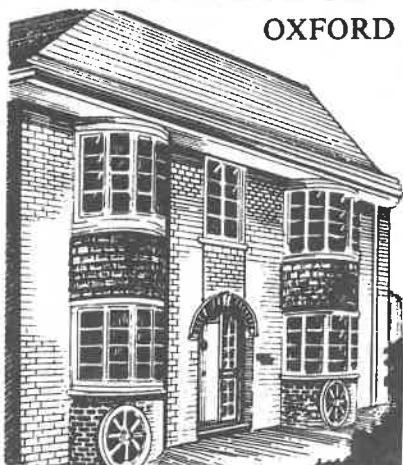

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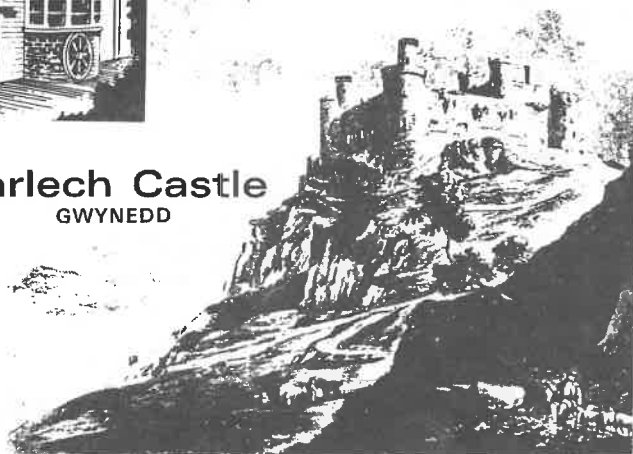


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Harlech Castle

A visit to Great Britain means seeing Castles, learning to drive on the "wrong" side of the road, and, no matter where you stay, Bed and Breakfast. B & B, as it's called, is a way of life in Great Britain — nearly all lodging includes breakfast of some sort.

We tried small, family run, guest houses like Oxford's Tilbury Lodge. The breakfast was good and filling, the room was a small second floor (no lift) bedroom with private bath. We tried large homes that had been converted to medium sized hotels like the Arden in Edinburgh — good food and a very large bedroom with

bath added in a corner during a remodeling. In London our hotel room was very small but modern and comfortable, and included a room-service Continental breakfast each morning. Important in London was the central location and reasonable price — central London hotels can run up to \$150 per night.

Scotland, England and Wales each offer more castles than you can ever find time to see. Among the best we saw were Warwick and Windsor Castles in England, Edinburgh Castle in Scotland, and Harlech Castle in Wales.

SCOTTISH COOKING

One of the pleasures of visiting a country is the opportunity to sample its native dishes. While we didn't get to try all the Scottish cooking we would have liked, we couldn't pass up the lamb and baked goods!

The following recipes and the descriptions of the old Scottish kitchen equipment were all taken

from the book "Let's try some Scottish cooking", a Jarrold Publication in association with the National Trust for Scotland. The author, Patricia Blackcock, was raised on a Scottish farm. She currently lives in Edinburgh with her husband and two children.

Stuffed Trout



Ingredients

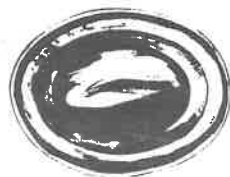
2 trout
1 finely chopped shallot
1 tablespoon butter

Method

Clean the trout. Melt the butter and add the finely chopped shallot and cook until soft. Add the parsley, fennel and ground oatcakes and season well with salt and freshly ground black pepper. Stuff the trout with this mixture and place in a buttered dish, spoon over the cream. Cover the dish in a pre-heated oven and cook at Gas 4 or 350° for 30 minutes.

1 tablespoon chopped parsley
1 teaspoon chopped fennel
2 tablespoons cream
4 tablespoons ground oatcakes

Trout can be found in most of the rivers and lochs of Scotland and provide sport for the fisherman as well as excellent food. At Inverewe Gardens, Morvich and Glencoe, visitors can obtain permits to fish neighbouring waters. Here is one idea of what to do with your catch. The stuffing turns an already delicious fish into something special.

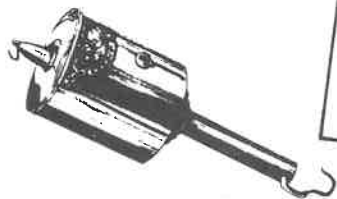


PEWTER PLATE ▲

Pewter ware was widely used throughout the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries, by families who wished to do better than eat off wooden plates, but could not afford silver, porcelain or china. In the nineteenth century, as china became more commonplace, pewter became relegated to use in kitchens and inns.

CLOCK-WORK BOTTLE JACKS ▼

Elaborate hot-air, water, and dog-driven sorts were gradually replaced in the late eighteenth century by clock-work bottle jacks. These were suspended in front of an open fire with a joint hung beneath them, slowly revolving over a tray to catch the fat.



Roast Fillet of Beef with Mustard Butter



Haddo House, in Aberdeenshire, is the home of the Aberdeen family, whose traditional Sunday lunch, eaten at 1.45 p.m., was Roast Beef and Plum Pudding. The very religious 5th Earl once went fishing on a Sunday, without realising, and was astounded at seeing so many people walking towards the church. On his return, he was served with Roast Beef and Plum Pudding. 'But we only have this on Sundays', he said to the butler. 'It is Sunday, my Lord', came the reply. Today, Lady Aberdeen does most of the cooking and it was she who provided this recipe.

Ingredients

1 piece of fillet - 2½ lb
1-2 oz butter

For the Mustard Butter:

4 oz butter
1 teaspoon home-made mustard
1 teaspoon finely chopped parsley
Squeeze of lemon

Method

Place joint in roasting tin with the butter. Put in centre of a pre-heated oven at Gas 3 or 325° and roast. Allow 1 hour for rare joint or 1½ hours for medium rare. Baste often to keep joint moist. Meanwhile, prepare mustard butter. Cream butter, add mustard, parsley and squeeze of lemon. Spoon butter on to square of kitchen foil, shape into fat roll and twist ends up like a cracker. Chill until firm. To serve, cut meat into thick slices and top each portion with a pat of mustard butter.



Wheaten Meal Scones

The Scots have always been great bakers – and if you doubt this, look at the number of bakers' shops we have and the variety of bread and cakes on their shelves.

From time to time I have been fortunate in visiting Leith Hall, Aberdeenshire, the home of the Leith family from 1650 to 1945. It has such a happy atmosphere about it and here is a recipe used by Miss Bunty Hunter and her sister Miss Janet Hunter, the Trust's representatives.

Ingredients

$\frac{1}{2}$ lb plain flour
 $\frac{1}{2}$ lb wheaten flour
 $\frac{1}{2}$ oz butter or margarine
1 tablespoon castor sugar

$\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon bicarbonate of soda
1 teaspoon cream of tartar
 $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon salt
A little milk

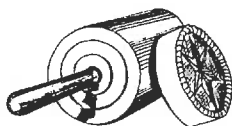
Method

Sieve the plain flour and add the other dry ingredients. Rub in the butter and add enough milk to form a soft consistency. Roll out on a floured board to $\frac{3}{4}$ inch thick. Cut in rounds of 2 inches and bake in oven Gas 6 or 400° for 12–15 minutes or until slightly browned.



BAKING GIRDLES ▲

Culross, Fife, much of which has been beautifully restored by the National Trust for Scotland, enjoyed a monopoly in making baking girdles throughout the seventeenth century. The Culross girdle had a handle, to hold it over the fire, while the more common varieties have a hoop.



BUTTER MOULDS ▲

When most households made butter from their own cows, it was customary to decorate the butter blocks, using a simple mould. Patterns varied according to districts and taste, and now form attractive collectors' items.



Whipt Syllabub

By Georgian times the culinary arts were well developed in Scotland and prosperous citizens used to sit down to enormous dinners, embracing many courses.

A syllabub was a normal ending to such a feast and still goes well with our less elaborate meals today. This recipe comes from Mr David Learmont, the Trust's Curator, who was responsible for the furnishings and decorations of the Georgian House, 7 Charlotte Square, Edinburgh. Do not miss seeing the superb kitchen there.

Ingredients

A goblet of sweet white wine
A small glass of brandy

Castor sugar to taste
Juice and rind of 1 lemon
 $\frac{1}{2}$ pint double cream

Method

Put the wine, brandy, lemon juice, rind and sugar into a bowl and stir until the sugar is dissolved. Add the half pint of double cream and, using a wire whisk, whip until the mixture thickens and leaves a trail behind. This will probably take between 10 and 15 minutes. Serve either in individual syllabub glasses or in a single glass dish. Add a grating of nutmeg and serve with macaroons or sponge fingers.

A solid syllabub sufficient for four generous helpings.



Fudge

The Scots have 'a sweet tooth', probably fostered by the large sugar refineries that sprang up on the Clyde in the late seventeenth century as imports of cane sugar started to arrive from the West Indies.

Fudge, or tablet as it is more often known, is easy to make and is a most acceptable present at any time of the year.

Ingredients

2 lb granulated sugar
1 cup milk

1 tin condensed milk
 $\frac{1}{2}$ lb butter

Method

Warm sugar. Put milk in large pan on low heat and gradually add the sugar stirring constantly. Stir until the sugar has dissolved, then add the butter cut in pieces and when melted, add the condensed milk. Boil without stirring for 20 minutes until a small soft ball forms when a little is dropped into a saucer of cold water. Remove from heat and beat until thick and creamy. Pour into oiled tray and cut in squares when cool.



IRON POTS ▲

Iron pots were in use long before copper was introduced into the kitchen and can still be found in many a house to this day. Some had legs so that they could be set directly over an open fire on the ground.



SUGAR LOAF CUTTERS ►

From the late seventeenth century and throughout the eighteenth century white sugar was sold in cones, called sugar loafs. These were broken up in the kitchen using sugar-loaf cutters. Smaller cutters, called sugar nippers, were used at table.

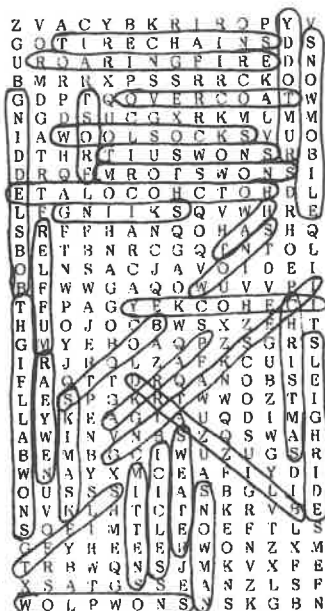

keep those other "vices" from putting a load on my heart. I doubt seriously if one can equate square dancing to jogging on an equal time basis, but square dancing sure beats sitting in front a television set with pretzels and beer. "Happy Valentine".

Yes, we are leading up to something. Simply put, it is to bring back to your group the things that you will learn, and conduct a mini-clinic, say just 10 - 15 minutes worth, from time to time. You will actually learn more from teaching others than you would on your own in the receptor role. The words and the movements force you to do a better job with your own dancing. Remember, your students will emulate you and they can perpetuate some subrosa performances in good faith if they get an under-par teach. As for the bulk of you out there who are not teachers -- you are the real supporters of the clinic idea, so support you local leader. Remember, the grass is not always greener...

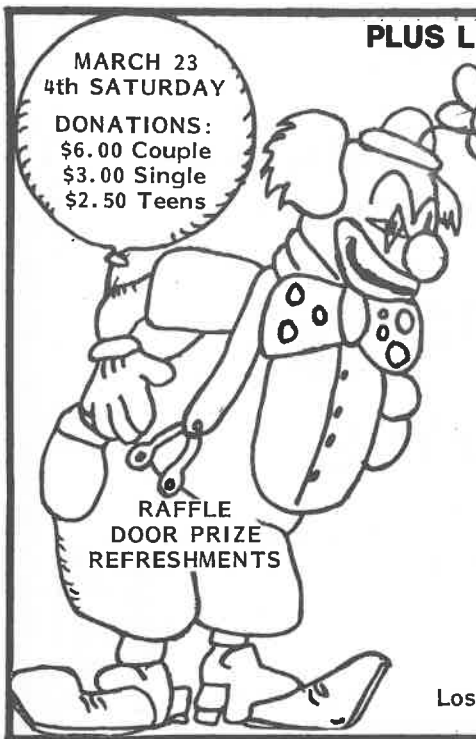

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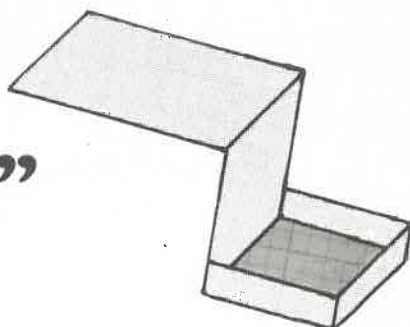
