I would like to nominate April to be love-your-caller month. (Particularly with the caller I have for a next door neighbor!)

Now that I have your attention, let me explain. During the six years Betty and I have been square dancing we've had the pleasure of dancing to many different kinds of callers, varying from the module (memory) caller to those who call by looking at the formations on the floor and figuring out where they want to go from there (sightcalling). Also, each caller has a unique, individual style (voice, mannerisms, showmanship, etc.) which is interesting to watch and to dance to.

All callers (particularly club callers) are expected to be a jack-of-all-trades. They're expected to be proficient at calling the level the club dances, to have a pleasant singing voice, to be good "socializers" both during club and at the pizza parlor afterwards, to learn and prepare new material for the club and any workshops, to attend club functions, and to generally help your club to grow

and to prosper. If one added up all the hours that we as a club expect "our" caller to invest in the club's interest, and divided it into his/her monthly salary, I doubt if they'd be making minimum wage. In my opinion, callers certainly aren't "gettin' rich".

One other thing I'd like to observe concerning callers. Good ones are hard to find. I know of clubs who voted not to give their callers a raise (I mean, after all, he hasn't asked for a raise!), even after several years. I have even heard the comment, "No problem!! We'll just get somebody else who appreciates us to do the calling!!"

If your club has a caller who has had success in building up the club, and who most of the club members enjoy dancing to, then I'd suggest you better praise and nurture him/her or you may be out looking for another caller. The club may find out that good callers are hard to find, auditioning several not-so-good prospects as the attendance (and the income) continues to drop.

You've seen the bumper sticker

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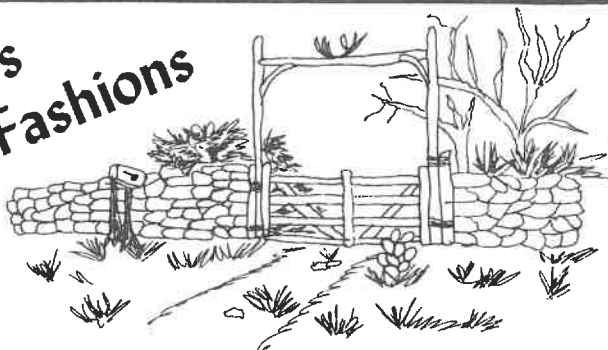
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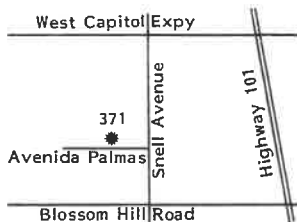
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"OUR" OPINION !

Cathy Jackson's letter (see We Get Letters, page 8) again brought to mind the subject of "styling compatibility". The following is "Our Opinion" as it first appeared in the February 1984 Prompter:

In the computer business, one of the major issues today is "compatibility" — the ability of one computer system to run programs written for another system. Upward compatibility is particularly important so that, as a user moves from a small computer to larger systems, it's not necessary to re-program.

In square dancing we also have upward compatibility. The moves learned at the basic level are still the same at higher levels. And, just as in the world of computers, as we move to a bigger system, the "command set" expands.

Another similarity between computers and square dancing is that there is no downward compatibility. Trying to use too large a "command set" will cause "unpredictable" results!"

In square dancing there is another area where we believe

there is no downward compatibility -- styling. Just as there are CALLERLAB definitions for each move, there are recommended CALLERLAB stylings. Much of the styling used in this area deviates from those CALLERLAB standards (i.e., the "Highland Fling" Do Sa Do) and may or may not be used in other parts of the country or world.

Many of these styling variations come with experience and/or higher level dancing, and that's where downward compatibility comes in. It may be appropriate at Plus level to do a "Highland Fling" Do Sa Do in this area, but try it on an unsuspecting beginner at a newer dancer hoedown and you probably will get those "unpredictable results". A Challenge dancer may be comfortable with a hands-down ocean wave, but at an Advanced or Plus dance it is inappropriate and incorrect styling. (For the many dancers who think that there "ought to be a standard" — there is, folks — the CALLERLAB standard for ocean waves, at all levels, is "hands up"!)

Another thought — a dancer, at

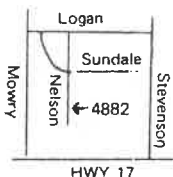

This letter is written to clarify a question I recently asked: What is the CALLERLAB accepted position on handholds (hands up vs. hands down)?

I am a new Challenge dancer and at the Challenge level it is

accepted practice to dance hands down. But I also dance Advanced and prefer hands up at that level. I see more and more dancers using hands down at the Advanced hoedowns (although the majority still dance hands up). It has become confusing - one hand up, one hand down - never knowing what will come on the next Swing Thru.

I had assumed that Advanced dancers danced hands up. Uniformity is important. Spending time worrying about where to put my hands is not what square dancing is all about.

If your club decides that on club night you prefer to dance a different styling technique, that is fine. But remember that when you're out visiting another club or dancing at a hoedown, the other dancers in your square may not choose to change their styling. Don't force others to adjust to your change in styling. Remember that short cutting or style changing may seem fun to you, but seven other people may be confused by it and unable to concentrate on why we are all there... TO DANCE, TO ENJOY OURSELVES, TO SOCIALIZE... not to worry about where we should have our hands!!

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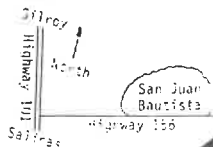
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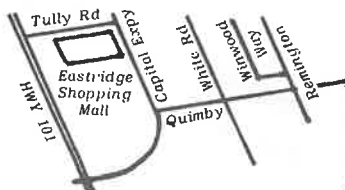
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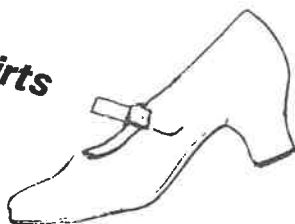
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rebuttal of the suggestions/concepts advocated in my article.

Taking that as a starting point, I offered rationale and suggestions of various types for a solution to the problem of "too much to teach in a season". From this, Jack seemed to infer I was advocating change for the sake of change, or simply because I am a futurist (as opposed to a traditionalist). He then proceeded to make eloquent and well-structured arguments for making no changes to the Mainstream program.

Unfortunately, Jack did not offer a solution to the problem posed in the opening gambit of my article. The point, of course, is that I was not advocating change per se. I was offering a solution to a perceived problem. If the problem does not exist, there is no need for my, or any other, solution. If the problem does exist, what is Jack's solution? (I estimated 2200 words of no solution.)

As an aside, I do not believe we have the problem here in the Santa Clara Valley. Here there are no Mainstream clubs, only Plus. Most of our callers take a full year to teach beginners the Plus program. I have been doing this for the last 8 years. Hence, I do not personally view the problem, which I used as a premise, to be of concern in our area. In our area we seem to cope quite well with the real world in

which the CALLERLAB Plus program is our mainstream (small 'm'). Of course, the knowledgeable teachers don't spend too much time on the little used calls in the program.

Appropos of 'top down organization', casual attention to the context reveals that this suggestion refers to CALLERLAB's approach to establishing the size of each program. Building or remodeling from the foundation up seems like a clever idea to me too! I guess I should have got the hat (white, of course).

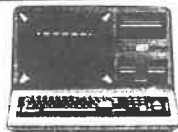

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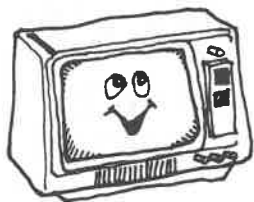

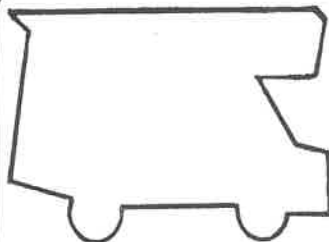

(Anything) & BREAKDOWN

by William F. Meyer

I have been square dancing now for about 15 years. I have done practically everything in the square dance movement, except invent a move or concept that would be worthy of publishing. Actually, I did not invent the concept that I am about to put forth, but I can say with honesty that I most assuredly have perfected it. I am sure that adding this concept to one's repertoire of moves will greatly enhance the dancer and give great satisfaction and fulfillment.

The concept is called "(Anything) & Breakdown". The concept can and

often is used with any of the square dance moves in existence today. Just think of the possibilities! You can start with "Square Up & Breakdown", "Bow to Your Partner & Breakdown". You can Breakdown individually or you can have the men Breakdown, and women Breakdown. As you can see the possibilities are limitless. Some of the more advanced moves are "Cast a Shadow & Breakdown", "Square the Bases & Breakdown", etc.

The real skills of square dancing come into effect with this move. Some dancers may find it a difficult move to master. There is, of course, a right and a wrong way to Breakdown. The more skilful dancer will, however, master these in a short time, probably with only one walk-thru. The only way to Breakdown is to totally Breakdown. To totally Breakdown, the following rules must be applied:

(1) Move completely out of position, usually to someone's spot that is already occupied; (2) Refuse to take anyone's hand or offer of help. If grabbed take them with you; and (3) Look from side to side with glassy eyes, staring at nothing, while turning in a small circle, shifting directions.

If you will practice and develop these skills, I am sure you will realize that "Anything & Breakdown" is a fulfilling and totally enjoyable concept. By the way, if you find yourself doing this concept when your caller has not called it, don't let get you down. I am forever Motivating when I should be Percolating.

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Directions for Yoke

Cast on 32 sts, placing markers thus:
2*8*2*8*2*8*2

Row 1 p2, k8, p2, k8, p2, k8, p2

Row 2 k2, p8, k2, p8, k2, p8, k2

Rows 3 & 5 repeat Row 1

Rows 4 & 6 repeat Row 2

Row 7 p2, cbl 8, p2, k8, p2, cbl 8, p2

Row 8 (k2, p8) 3x, k2

Row 9 (p2, k8) 3x, leave 2 sts on needle, turn

Row 10 slip 1, p7, k2, (p8, k2) 2x

Row 11 (p2, k8) 2x, p2, leave 10 sts on needle, turn

Row 12 slip 1, k1, (p8, k2) 2x

Row 13 p2, k8, p2, leave 20 sts on needle, turn

Row 14 slip 1, k1, p8, k2

Row 15 (p2, k8) 3x, p2

Row 16 (k2, p8) 3x, k2

Row 17 (p2, k8) 3x, leave 2 sts (same as Row 9)

Row 18 slip 1, p7, k2, (p8, k2) 2x (same as Row 10)

Row 19 p2, cbl 8, p2, k8, p2, leave 10 sts on needle, turn

Row 20 slip 1, k1, (p8, k2) 2x (same as Row 12)

Row 21 p2, k8, p2, leave 20 sts (same as Row 13)

Row 22 slip 1, k1, p8, k2 (same as Row 14)

Row 23 (p2, k8) 3x, p2 (same as Row 15)

Row 24 (k2, p8) 3x, k2 (same as Row 16)

Row 25 (p2, k8) 3x, leave 2 sts (same as Row 9)

Row 26 slip 1, p7, k2, (p8, k2) 2x (same as Row 10)

Row 27 (p2, k8) 2x, p2, leave 10 sts (same as Row 11)

Row 28 slip 1, k1, (p8, k2) 2x (same as Row 12)

Row 29 p2, k8, p2, leave 20 sts (same as Row 13)

Row 30 slip 1, p8, k2

Repeat Rows 7 thru 30 eight more times.

Repeat Row 7.

Repeat Rows 2 thru 6, making 228 rows total. Bind off.

Directions for Body

Pick up 228 sts along bottom edge of yoke placing markers thus: 2* (8*2*6*3*6*2*) 8x, then 8*2. The sts *3* which are worked k1,p1,k1 will be referred to as seed st 3 (k1,p1,k1) after the last row.

Row 1 (wrong side) (k2, p8, k2, p6, k1, p1, k1, p6) 8x, end k2, p8, k2

Row 2 (p2, cbl 8, p2, k6, s3, k6) 8x, end p2, cbl 8, p2

Row 3 (k2, p8, k2, p6, s3, p6) 8x, end k2, p8, k2

Row 4 (p2, k8, p2, k1&b next st, k5, s3, k4, k1&b next st, k1) 8x, end p2, k8, p2. K front & back of same st—(increase made) = 244 sts

Row 5 (k2, p8, k2, seed 17—beg with p) 8x, end k2, p8, k2

Row 6 (p2, k8, p2, seed 17) 8x, end p2, k8, p2

Row 7 Repeat Row 5

Row 8 Repeat Row 6

Row 9 Repeat Row 5

Row 10 (p2, k8, p2, k7, s3, k7) 8x, end p2, k8, p2

Row 11 (k2, p8, k2, p7, s3, p7) 8x, end k2, p8, k2

Row 12 Repeat Row 10

Row 13 Repeat Row 11

Row 14 (p2, cbl 8, p2, k7, s3, k7) 8x, end p2, cbl 8, p2

Row 15 (k2, p8, k2, p7, s3, p7) 8x, end k2, p8, k2

Row 16 (p2, k8, p2, k1&b of next, k6, s3, k5, k1&b next, k1) 8x, end p2, k8, p2 = 260 sts

Row 17 (k2, p8, k2, seed 19—beg w k) 8x, end k2, p8, k2



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Continue in established pattern, increasing in first knit row after the cable row two more times (292 sts). Work thru the seventh band of seed stitches, 81 rows. Bind off.

Starting at bottom edge of right front, single crochet around entire cape, adjusting size of neck in process. Do a second row of crochet on right front making button holes for as many buttons as desired, work shell stitch across neck and continue down left front with crochet. (Shell st: 4dc in 2nd st from hook, * sk (Shell st: 4dc in 2nd st from hook, * sk 1dc, 4dc in next, * around neck, end with 4dc in last ch).

Use double strand for fringe is using 4 ply. Single strand for Jumbo.

If single strand of 4 oz. 4 ply is used, size 9 needles are required. Follow same instructions as above.

For buttonhole row—instead of sc in ea sc, ch 1 and skip 1 sc, then continue sc in ea sc, etc. Or if using larger button ch 2 or 3 and skip 2 or 3 sc, and continue sc in ea sc except where you need additional buttonholes.

Cable Stitch

A cable is usually worked on an even number of sts (in this case, 8) with a few purl sts on either side (in this case, 2) to set it off. Work the row to the sts to be used for the cable (cbl 8), slip half (4 sts) of the cable group sts onto a double pointed needle or cable holder; hold these sts in back of work. Knit the remaining 4 sts of the cable group. Now knit the sts from the cable holder without twisting or turning any of the sts. Finish the row as directed in the pattern.



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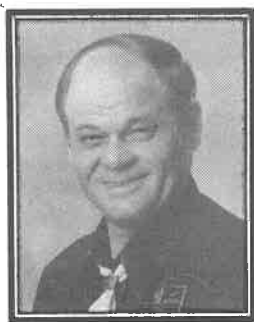

CALLERLAB Plus Call #2

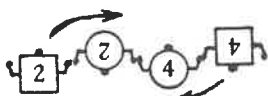
DEFINITION

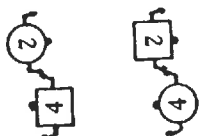

LINEAR CYCLE (Right-Hand Wave)

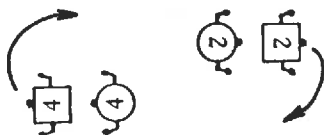

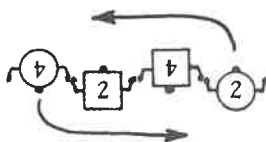

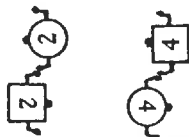


LINEAR CYCLE (Left-Hand Wave)

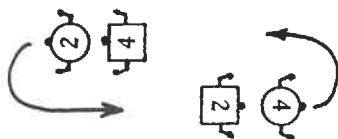

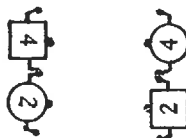

DANCING HINTS

The "main secret" to successful accomplishment of Linear Cycle is recognition of the "hand" of the starting formation. Once you establish this, all actions seem to flow into place very rapidly. A "right-hand" formation Hinges right, Circulates to the right, passes right

'ROUND' ABOUT

PARDON, MY SLIP IS SHOWING

One of the most compelling considerations in our round dance avocation is how we handle mistakes in our routines. It is the source of antagonism between partners — almost to the point of blows in some cases. In any event, it is the prelude to much discomfort and has discouraged many a seasoned dancer as well as the neophyte.

In analysis, we find that most problems arise from the preceding measure, or group, where timing or body position are the culprit. If you can start into a figure with the correct alignment and footwork, the figure will probably develop normally. Of course, we are all guilty of mind-wandering from time to time, particularly if it is a familiar dance. Whatever the cause, it is a human frailty that often neither partner is willing to handle diplomatically — in many cases they assume a defensive posture as a matter of principle.

The best advice, to alleviate this problem, is to point out that "boobos" are nearly always known to the perpetrator first and if we use this idea to build upon, we will save ourselves a lot of grief. Calling attention to a mistake on the floor can only destroy whatever follows in the routine. Many people are forced to walk off the floor or,

at best, stumble around accompanied by their partner's tongue lashing until they can get back on the choreography.

There is a better way. Could we suggest — a knowing smile, or a slight arm pressure to let the partner know that you are with them and want to help by going along until whatever develops gets back on track? If such an arrangement is thought out ahead of time, it usually is possible to do a basic or two — perhaps any movement to the music that keeps the dance going. Above all, it is the consideration you give to your partner that will pay the best dividends. How nice it would be if the "offending party" could concentrate on picking up at whatever point and going on without the mental trauma of verbal abuse to add to self incrimination. Keep in mind the old axiom, "There, but for the grace of God, go I!" An attitude of tolerance and assistance can be acquired by practice and is particularly important at the advanced level. Let's face it, these folks work hard at their trade, and have more than a modicum of ham in their makeup which prods them to excel.

Nothing will "pull the rug" faster than lack of courtesy by either dance partner. The job at hand is to find ways to keep from aggravating the situation. You don't have to go to a shrink to figure out a better way — "People who live in glass houses..."

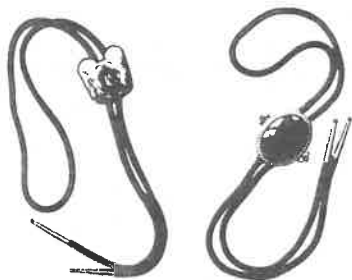


CHERRY DUMP CAKE

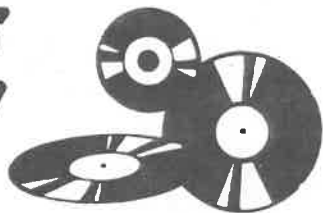
- 1 (20 oz.) can crushed pineapple

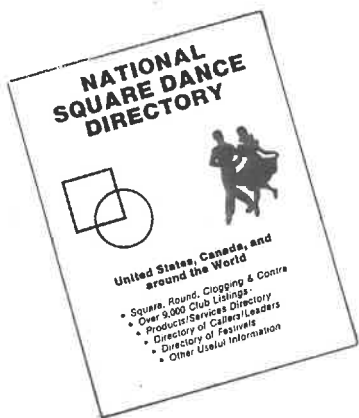


WHAT'S NEW!!

Ernie Kinney and Tom Perry seem to be changing back and forth on each others' labels. I like "It's a Small World" on Blue Star (2269) because it has a different break. Seems as though every record comes out with one of four breaks and it's nice to get a different one.

And we have another "crossover" with Wade Driver doing "Deep in the Heart of Texas" on ESP (128). This would be good except that every time I want to clap my hands, there're busy.

My favorite this month is "Do What You Do Do Well" (214) on Square Tunes by Jack Lasry... another good old tune with good new music.

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Real barbeque smoked over a wood fire and bathed in a savory sauce made from secret recipes handed down from generation to generation tempt the taste buds of those who whiff the aroma of the slow cooking southern specialty. You may satisfy your craving for barbeque at "Old Plantation", "Carlisle Brothers", "Ollie's", and the "Tired Texan", among others. Maryland has its crabcakes -- Alabama has barbeque for a king.

For those who lean to the unusual, there is "Baby Doe's" located high on the edge of a hill overlooking Birmingham. The view is outstanding. This restaurant is designed to look like a silver mine and focuses on the legend of Baby Doe Tabor who shocked polite society when the owner of the Matchless Silver Mine divorced his wife and married her. In 1883, silver prices fell; Tabor died and Baby Doe lived in poverty beside the mine shaft of the Matchless Mine where in 1935 her frozen body was found. The decor is rustic with an abandoned mine car at the entrance. Mine cars are also along the winding road to the building which is covered with rusted tin. Inside are small eating areas with furnishings typical of the Baby Doe era. The menu consists of seafood

as well as house specialties -- including outstanding desserts!!

Another restaurant featuring turn of the century atmosphere is "Down the Street" where you can dine on Oysters Rockefeller, escargots, veal marsala, and steak au poivre in high-ceilinged and dark toned rooms. this Teacher Training Seminar with a series of two hour daily seminars June 27, 28, and 29 at the National Square Dance Convention in Birmingham, Alabama. Final tabulations and a detailed report on the ROUNDALAB round dancers' survey conducted this winter will also be the topic for one of the sessions scheduled at the ROUNDALAB convention as well as during one of the daily ROUNDALAB seminars at the National Square Dance Convention.

ROUNDALAB will also be sponsoring a Round Dance After Party on Friday evening June 28, 1985 at the National Square Dance Convention.

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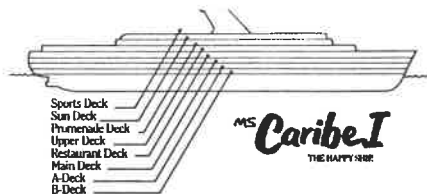

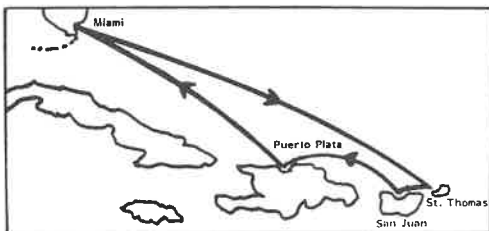
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SQUARE DANCE PROGRAMMING

A recent announcement of LEGACY, the International Assembly of "Trustees" of the Square Dance Activity, that they will conduct yet another survey of dancers' wishes in their square dancing programs is one more indication of the attention that is finally being given to dancers themselves, rather than just to the activity.

The renaissance of square dancing in America beginning in the '40s and early '50s seemed to be spontaneous but unorganized, with leaders or callers interpreting the needs of their dancers without regard to what might be going on in other areas. Naturally there were many different ideas brought forth with each area of the country concentrating on that area's specialty — New England with its traditional and contra background; the Appalachians with their big circle dances and clogging; the West with its cowboy dances; California with its Spanish influence; the Midwest with its conglomerate population of mid-European and puritan (fundamentalist) influences. This tended to emphasize the differences, and there were few instances of anyone's trying to coordinate the square dance activity nation-wide. Bob Osgood's "Sets-in-Order" magazine was one of the early advocates of bringing all phases of square dancing together.

National Square Dance Conventions can also claim to be pioneers in these efforts. The first National Convention in 1952 began with the idea that dancers from all over the nation could get together annually for a Convention where they could all dance together, and where they could spend time in educational activities which would help them to work together to improve square dancing.



One of the requirements of that first Convention was later reduced to writing in the "Policies for Conducting a National Square Dance Convention". Clause 13a of the "Policies" states: "Programmed callers should be cautioned to avoid projecting any feeling of extremely 'fast time' or 'contest type' calling into the dances but should rather be encouraged to provide calling that is enjoyable to an overwhelming majority of the square dancers in attendance."

Thirty or forty years ago there were few callers' colleges where a beginning caller could go to learn to call dances. Most of them learned while doing. Les Gotcher, one of the early callers, now partially retired, reminisces in an article in "Follow the Sun", an Arizona Square Dance magazine, of his first calling experience in 1916, when at age eleven he and his brother, both harmonica players, were sometimes called upon to fill in as the "band" for square dances. At this particular dance, the caller as well as the band were prevented by a flash flood from getting to the dance until after midnight, and Les stood on an upturned tub and called a few tips while his brother provided the music.

Even today callers sometimes evolve from just such a need — a club losing its caller, or some other reason making it necessary that a dancer step in to substitute, and going on to become the club caller.

Many of us who have danced for over thirty years can remember visiting callers spending much of their time at a dance sitting out and writing notes on some variation of a call or some brand new figure which that evening's caller was using.

Over all these years, while everyone was trying to recruit new dancers, callers were trying to improve their skill; to bring to their dancers new figures and variations of movements, explained as trying to keep them interested, but really to expand the calling techniques. Of course, many of the dancers were also enchanted with the ever increasing complexity of square dancing, but the new dancers were being forced to learn all the basics in order to be able to dance at all, and also to endure an expedited course in all the new figures or variations. Just dancing to the music seemed to fall by the wayside.

It's true that there were many leaders who had always advocated keeping it simple. Dr. Lloyd Shaw said many times that square dance leaders should "keep it simple — keep it fun". Frank Hamilton, one of the early leaders, who later became prominent as a round dance leader, had this to say: "We must not make the mistake of beaming our program at either the less capable and least enthusiastic 15%, or at the other extreme — the most talented, eager and aggressive 15%... This consideration should be uppermost in our thinking as we function today, and as we plan for the future."

It has been encouraging to note that when callers got together as a national group — in CALLERLAB — they quickly came to realize that the salvation of square dancing was in keeping the majority of dancers happy and encouraged to continue to enjoy themselves.

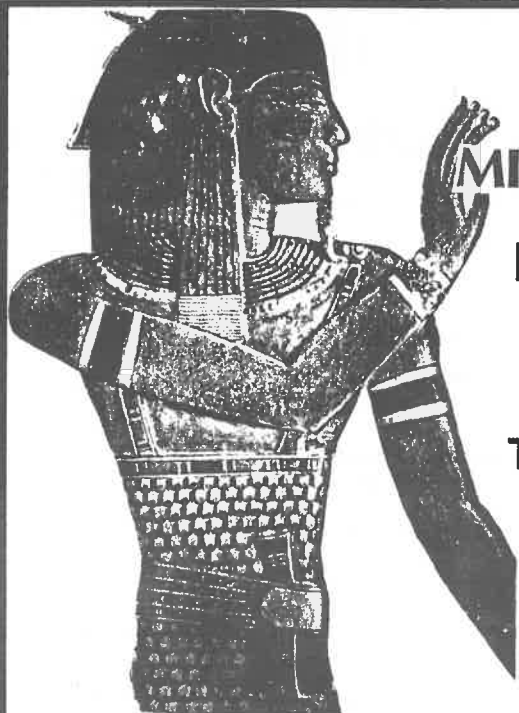
While room has been made for Plus, Advanced and Challenge dancing, the emphasis has now been turned toward the beginner and mainstream dancer. The word "level" has been dropped, and "program" has been adopted, to de-emphasize the constant prodding to "go to a higher

level" of dancing. Those dancers who want and need to have this constant challenge in their dancing can find a place in the "programs" where they are happy, but the backbone of the movement — the dancer who still wants to enjoy square dancing as a recreation for the entire family without becoming almost a "professional" -- can remain as a Mainstream dancer, a club dancer, who dances once or twice a week, or even twice a month, and these Mainstream dancers are truly a majority of those dancers involved in the activity.

Those dancers who attend National Square Dance Conventions are also representative of this "mix" of dancers. Such statistics as we have indicate that well over half the registrants to National Conventions are dancers with less than five years of square dancing experience — some even a year or less — which has led to a statement that at National Square Dance Conventions the programming should be such that over 50% of the halls or 50% of the dancing time (whichever seems appropriate for that Convention) be directed to the Mainstream or Basic dancers, and that when a program is identified, no experimental quarterly selections should be programmed or called. In addition, when a Program level is listed for a hall, the entire Program is to be considered as the maximum to be called, not the minimum.

After all, every one of the Programs following Mainstream contain the Basic and Mainstream figures.



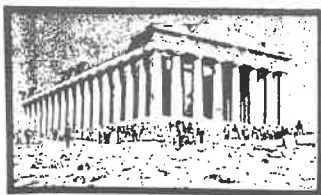


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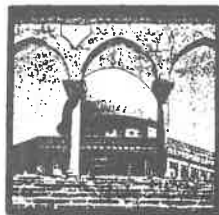

shoulders and Peels to the right. A "left-hand" formation Hinges left, Circulates to the left, passes left shoulders and Peels to the left.

When you are an end in the original wave, you will always Hinge toward your joined hand and "take the lead" for the Circulate, Extend and Peeling actions. When you are a center in the starting wave, you are "the trailer" during the execution of the call and you have the "more

important part" in assuring that the ending formation (facing couples or lines) is properly aligned for the next call.

When executing Linear Cycle from left-hand waves, you must avoid the natural tendency to want to pass right shoulders during the Circulate and Extend portions of the call. One easy way to do this is to "precisely execute" the Hinge before you attempt any of the "passing actions".

any level, using the accepted standard styling has the "right-of-way". We should never expect another dancer to conform to our "non-standard" styling and should never force them to adjust! Consider, also, that non-standard styling usually creates confusion for the inexperienced and/or unsuspecting dancer at any level.

Individualized styling adds to the enjoyment of square dancing for many dancers. Highland Flings and "twirling, hip-bumping Right and Left Grands" can be fun if everyone is on the same wavelength. But we believe that "When in Rome..." is the best approach. Be considerate of the other dancers — don't expect or force downward compatibility in styling.
