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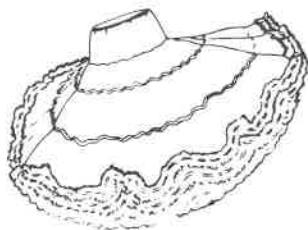

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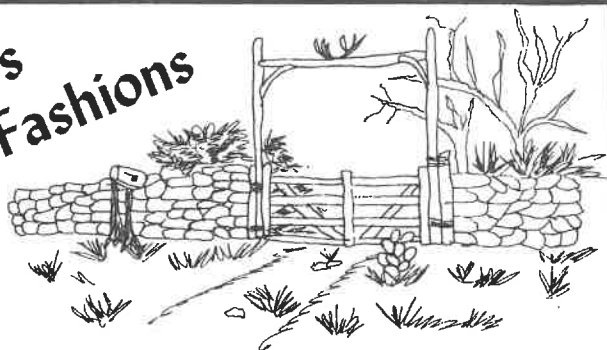
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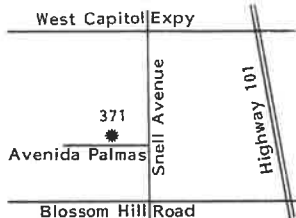
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"OUR" OPINION !

The following article appeared in the May/June issue of the California Square Dancer Blue Book. We found it to be very interesting and educational:

As Editor and Publisher of the "California Square Dancer Blue Book", we receive many copies of other square dance publications on an exchange basis. These publications come from all parts of the country as well as California. They all have one problem in common — late delivery of their publication by the U.S. Postal Service.

The U.S. Postal Service publishes a chart showing the Service Standards for Zip Coded mail. According to the mileage on this chart, Third Class Bulk Mail should be delivered anywhere in the state of California within five working days, however, because third class mail is allowed to sit for 48 hours at every stop it makes on its way

to you, it could take as many as eight working days — possibly more if you live in the "outback".

All Third Class Bulk Mail is mailed according to the U.S. Postal Service requirements which include sorting by Zip Code, bundling by Zip Code and bagging by Zip Code. In the case of our larger local cities, the bags are never opened until they reach that city's post office. By doing the work normally done by postal employees, the bulk mailer is awarded a lower rate, however, this does not relieve the postal employees from their duty to perform according to the published Service Standards.

Postal employees seem to have the mistaken impression that Third Class Bulk Mail is "non-essential" or "junk mail". Nothing could be further from the truth. Numerous postmasters, postal supervisors, bulk mailing experts, etc. have told us

Editor,

In all of the "Hoopla" going on about "Advanced and Challenge" square dancing, I would like to put forth some truths about this activity from a dancer's viewpoint (three years at it).

1. Advanced dancing, is more complicated, is faster paced, is more frustrating to learn and more difficult to remember within the normal "one-night-a-week" club activities, due to the limited frequency of call use in a two hour session.

2. There are as many people having problems dancing at the Advanced levels as those dancing at the lower levels. So, do not expect perfection because someone calls themselves an "Advanced Dancer" and wears an "Advanced Club" badge.

3. Having a forgiving nature, a hearty handshake and a warm friendly smile does not qualify one

for "Advanced Dancing". The ability to hear, remember, and react (move) within the time frame of "stacked calls", however, is a requirement. If you cannot meet these requirements, your "nice person" image will wear very thin in broken down squares at Advanced levels.

4. Advanced dancers must be able to dance a call or figure from any position in the square. The "beaus and belles" concept is used extensively by callers at these levels.

5. If, after reading the above, both you and your partner agree to try this level, and are ready to listen, can hear (very important) and are ready to move when the call goes out, Advanced dancing is for you — and will be fun.

So, join a "workshop group" and good luck.

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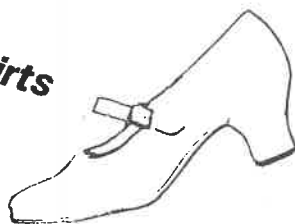

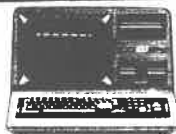

In the area of Advanced and Challenge, the greatest problem seems to develop when we get too satisfied with the great dancing level of our club and don't want to take a chance on bringing in new members because we might cause the level to drop a little. By continuing with this attitude, we eventually lead the club to non-existence. This is true in Plus clubs also, and exists in many of them now. It is more critical in Advanced and Challenge clubs because of the smaller base of dancers who choose to take this path. As the level gets higher, many dancers get more resistant to dancing with those who don't dance "their" level and they stop going to hoedowns or attending clubs that dance a lower level. Thus, they can, and do, lose contact with the rest of the dancers in their area. Pretty soon, their club disappears. It is unfortunate that the higher levels have to get their dancers from the lower levels, but since this is a fact of life, the higher level dancers must participate in the lower levels to help them grow or none of us will survive at any level. Think about these things the next time you would rather make excuses than work to keep your club going.

Speaking of Rolling Ripple, it seems to be getting a lot of play lately. No, this is not the ice cream variety. This is a move for callers to accept or complain about. From a standard, right-hand wave, have the end looking out start a "Rolling Ripple two by one and one half by one". What is the resulting formation? Is it a legal use of the call? Does it follow the definition? Does anybody care? Let's hear it out there! Another of Rotten Robbie's picks from a wave from which one could call Right and Left Grand — "Ends start a Rolling Ripple one by one, Right and Left Grand." Don't overuse this or your dancers may throw rocks at you. Ours use tomatoes and half-filled coffee cups, they get the message across, but without as much pain for the caller.

Many Advanced and Challenge clubs are finding the going a bit tough in regard to getting new members into their clubs. Some others are doing quite well in solving this same problem. What is the difference? Probably the people in the clubs. Many, who aren't doing so well, have chosen to listen to those who say that square dancing is down overall. Many callers have situations where one or more clubs are growing and others are going backwards. Same caller, so what is the reason? Usually, the people in some clubs are out hustling while the people in others are not. Yes, many of us tend to get complacent once in a while, but the membership problem becomes more acute as the club

Sewing is made so very easy when your pattern fits your measurements and can be relied upon. The well-fitted pattern makes wearing your self-fashioned garment a pleasure.

The Hancock Fabric Stores recently advertised a series of

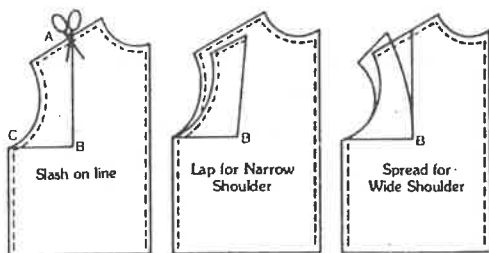
sewing seminars presented by Judy Kessinger and Judy Drury. The following pattern adjustments are some of their easy-to-follow techniques. We've found these illustrations very useful and hope you will be able to incorporate them into your sewing projects.

1. Shoulder



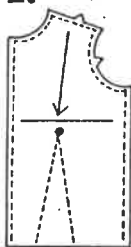
Measure between seams allowances, eliminating dart if applicable.

Shoulders Too Wide or Too Narrow



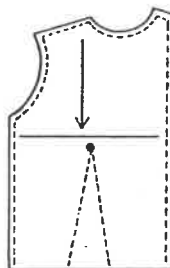
About 3" in from armhole, cut pattern from shoulder down to bottom of armhole, then across to armhole edge. Alter front and back pieces.

2. Shoulder to Bust



After you've determined your shoulder to bust measurement measure that distance on your pattern piece from the center of the shoulder. Draw a line on pattern piece across that point.

How to Move Bust Dart



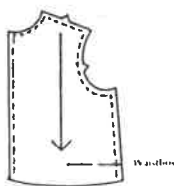
Dart must end one inch below line. Redraw dart if necessary.

How To Redraw Darts



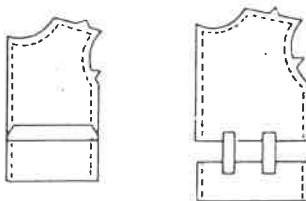
To lengthen or shorten dart, simply redraw the dart on your pattern piece using the existing dart lines as a guide.

3. Front Waist Length



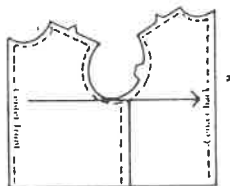
Measure from center of shoulder to waistline.

Waist Length Alteration



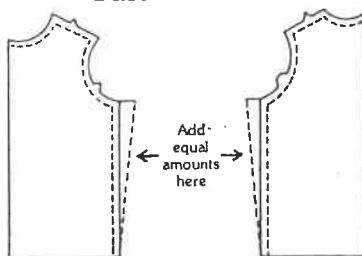
Shorten or lengthen on lines given on pattern. Fold to shorten. Split and add to lengthen.

4. Bust



Pin front and back together, at **YOUR** bust point line, measure from center front to center back.

Bust Alteration



Divide amount needed and add equally to each seam allowance of front and back. Add same amount to sleeve seam allowances.

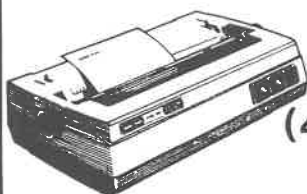
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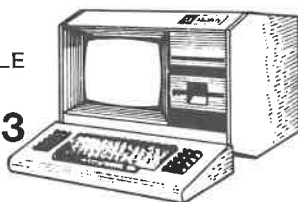

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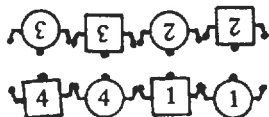
DEFINITION

(CALLERLAB April 1984) Starting formation — Lines of four, with centers facing in, and the ends of each line facing the same (in or out) direction. The end dancers move forward around the outside, passing right shoulders with three moving end dancers, and turn one-quarter (90°) to stand beside the third person passed, facing the center of the set as a couple. Simultaneously, the center four dancers Pass Thru, turn their backs on their momentary partner, Partner Trade with their new partner, and Pass Thru.

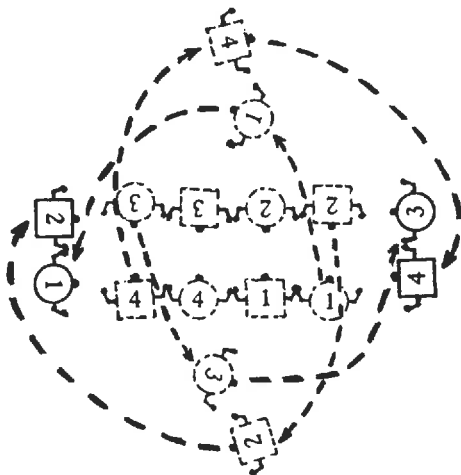
(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #475.)

LOAD THE BOAT

From Sides Lead Right, Circle to a Line...



The end dancers move forward around the outside, passing right shoulders with three moving end dancers, and turn one-quarter (90°) to stand beside the third person passed, facing the center of the set as a couple...



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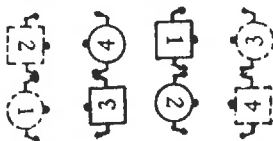
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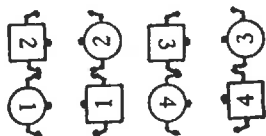
ALLOW 6 WEEKS FOR ADDRESS CHANGES TO BECOME EFFECTIVE



Simultaneously, the center four Pass Thru, turn their backs on their momentary partner...



Partner Trade with their new partner, and Pass Thru.



DANCING HINTS

The key to success when dancing Load the Boat is to "do your own thing". Do exactly your part of the move without letting all the other dancers wandering around confuse you. Remember, if you start on the outside of the formation, you continue to work on the outside of the set; if you start in the center of the formation, all of your part is done in the center of the set.

As an end dancer, be sure to count the dancers as you pass them — and immediately **after** passing the third dancer, face in towards the center of the set, join hands with that dancer and become partners.

When dancing the centers' part of Load the Boat, keep it "small". By keeping close together as you dance your part, you are able to "see" your part more easily, you don't allow the outside dancers to accidentally wander into your part of the call, and it makes the "path" for the outside dancers shorter.

It helps to know that, in Load the Boat, if you are facing another dancer at the beginning of the call, you will be partners with this dancer at the end of the call.

Since there are "no hands" used in Load the Boat, all dancers need to dance their part of the call as precisely as possible — but there is no need to rush. The call dances very well using a full 12 beats of music from start to finish. And, don't forget the most important part: the end dancers must say "Toot, toot!" and the centers "Ding, Ding!"

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Stir The Bucket With Betty

This collection of recipes has pretzels as a main ingredient. As unlikely a cooking ingredient as the lowly pretzel seems, it adds that perfect zest to each dish... The recipes are GREAT!!

SPICY NUTS & BOLTS

- ½ cup margarine
- 1 envelope taco seasoning mix
- 1 (8 oz.) jar soy nuts or peanuts
- 2 cups pretzel sticks
- 2 cups corn chexs
- 1 (3 oz.) can chow mein noodles
- 2 cups corn chips

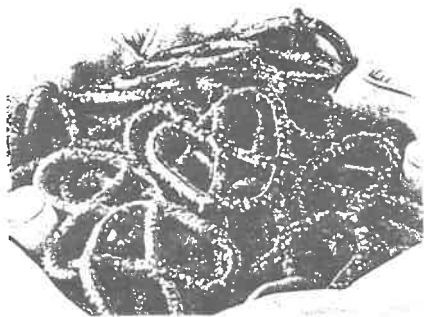
Melt margarine in a saucepan. Stir in taco mix — set aside. In large baking pan, mix nuts, pretzels, cereals, noodles and corn chips. Pour margarine/taco sauce over mixture and stir to coat. Bake 30 minutes at 350° F., stirring occasionally. Store in an airtight container.

PRETZEL SALAD

- 12 oz. cream cheese
- 1½ cups sugar
- 1 cup margarine
- 2 2/3 cups broken pretzels
- 9 oz. Cool Whip
- 6 oz. pkg. strawberry gelatin
- 2 cups hot water
- 20 oz. pkg. frozen strawberries

Cream cheese and sugar together, set aside. Melt margarine in large pan (7"x12") and stir in pretzels. Bake 10 minutes in 400° F. oven. Cool. Combine cheese mixture with pretzels in pan. Spread Cool Whip on cheese/prettzel mixture. Dissolve gelatin in hot water then combine with strawberries. When soft set,



spread over Cool Whip. Makes one large salad.

SOFT PRETZELS

- 2 pkgs. yeast, active dry or compressed
- ¼ cup warm water (lukewarm for compressed yeast)
- 1 quart milk
- ¾ cup soft shortening
- ½ cup sugar
- 12 cups unsifted regular all-purpose flour
- 1½ tsps. baking powder
- 1½ Tbsps. salt
- 2 Tbsps. household lye
- 2 quarts water
- 3 Tbsps. coarse salt

German soft pretzels are crusty, but have a more breadlike interior than commercial pretzels. Although they are best the day you bake them, you can freeze extras in sealed plastic bags and reheat.

Dip the pretzels in mild lye solution before baking to get the characteristic pretzel flavor and shiny crust. Lye at this low concentration (1 part lye to 64 of water) will not remain on the pretzels in dangerous amounts. Do use caution, however, when working

with the solution: when hot it can cause burns.

Keep pretzels from sticking by using baking sheets that have been heated, then rubbed evenly with beeswax or paraffin.

Soften yeast in water. Scald milk; stir in shortening and sugar until shortening is melted. Pour milk mixture into a large bowl and cool until lukewarm. Add softened yeast with 6 cups of the flour and stir until smooth. Cover and let rise in warm place until light and bubbly, about 30 minutes. Sift remaining flour with baking powder and the $1\frac{1}{2}$ tablespoons salt. Stir down risen dough; gradually beat in flour mixture until dough is blended. Let rise, covered, in a greased large bowl until doubled, about $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours.

Punch dough down, divide into 6 equal pieces, and let rest 10 minutes. Divide each piece into 10 portions of equal size. Using palms of hands, roll each into a strand $\frac{1}{4}$ " in diameter and 18" long. Twist into a pretzel shape, tucking ends under. Cover shaped pretzels lightly. When all the dough is shaped, the first

pretzels will have risen.

Add lye to cold water in a large pan (do not use an aluminum pan); heat until solution is steaming, but not boiling. Place pretzels, one at a time, right-side down on a wide slotted turner. Lower pretzel into lye solution for 1 to 2 seconds; remove and drain. Place right-side up on waxed baking sheets; sprinkle with coarse salt. Bake in a hot oven (400°) for 15 minutes or until well browned. Makes 5 dozen 5-inch pretzels.

Sunset Bread Cookbook

PEANUT-PRETZEL BARK

- 1 pound white chocolate
- 3 cups thin pretzel sticks
- 1 cup salted peanuts (red)

Melt chocolate in double boiler over medium heat (approximately six minutes). Gently stir in pretzels and peanuts. Spread on heavily greased 9"x13" cookie sheet which has sides. Refrigerate for 20 minutes, break into pieces. Enjoy!

ESSAY ON LEARNING ROUND OR SQUARE DANCING

Learning to dance is like learning a new sport or craft like golf, tennis, furniture making or fine sewing, etc.

These skills cannot be "stolen", they must be earned by learning first the basic fundamentals by application and practice.

The only shortcuts are in using our minds to understand the "what and why", and in using our bodies to do the fundamental actions enough that the thought and body action become simultaneous, easy and natural. Application, concentration, and doing and doing are the shortcuts!

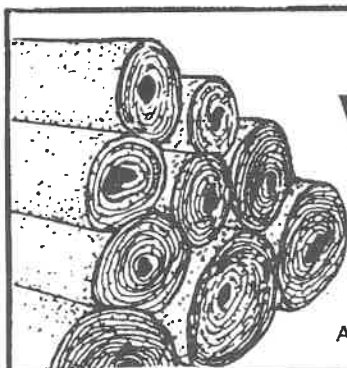
Too often we regard the learning of a skill as some people regard getting to a distant place for a

vacation. We fail to appreciate that the trip to the destination is a part of the vacation. There is a lot of beautiful scenery and pleasurable experience to be enjoyed if we will just allow ourselves the time and attitude for this. The destination is important but not so much so that we should pass up the pleasures of getting there. Enjoy the trip.

Unlike golf, tennis or handball, dancing is not a competitive sport. Dancing is a team sport. We can be only as good as our partner, we can only go as far as our partner is capable or willing to go. Sometimes we find one partner is just "going along" because the other partner wants to dance. This one is going along because they love the other or, at least, have "grown accustomed to the face" and adjusted to the other's habits and don't care to take the trouble to make a change.

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The International Association of Round Dance Teachers

The purpose of a Round Dance Rating System is to provide for rating round dances according to complexity. The system should be one that can be readily used and understood by all those involved in Round Dancing.

Since Dave Fleck, who had been providing point ratings since 1979, was retiring and the Committees had nearly completed the writing of the ROUNDALAB Phases, much time at ROUNDALAB's Eighth Annual Convention was spent in re-examining the Fleck Point System for rating round dances as well as considering several other proposals.

After maximum participation at the Convention, the attendees enthusiastically endorsed the recommendation that ROUNDALAB adopt the "ROUNDALAB Phase Rating System" which will identify a dance relative to the ROUNDALAB Phases. Specifically, the system will identify a dance with a ROUNDALAB Phase Number with a plus of no more than 2 to indicate steps in the dance which are in Phases higher than the basic rating or unphased steps or movements. For example: ROUNDALAB Phase II + 2 would indicate a dance including ROUNDALAB Phase I & II figures but with two figures in Phases above Phase II. Since the system is simplified and leaves little room for error, the Committee felt

each choreographer should assume the responsibility of rating his own dance before publication. If however, the choreographer chooses not to rate his own material, it can easily be accomplished by any person using the ROUNDALAB material.

The Committee further recommended that, by 1986, the ROUNDALAB Classic List be revised to reflect these changes.

At the same time the membership was adopting this new system, the membership was also restructuring the Standardization Committee so that all activities in each of the Phases would be under one Chairman. Chairman of the Standardization Committee is Ty and Ann Rotruck (CO). Chairman of Phase I (Beginning) & II (Easy) is Clancy and Betty Mueller (IN); Phase III (Easy Intermediate) is Bob and Barbara Wilder (TX); Phase IV (Intermediate) is Horace and Brenda Mills (AZ/CA); Phase V (High Intermediate) is Wayne and Barbara Blackford (FL); and Phase VI (Advanced) is Irv and Betty Easterday (MD).

The Phase material has been distributed to all ROUNDALAB members. An alphabetical compilation of the Six Phases, enabling all interested persons to rate round dances, will soon be available from ROUNDALAB.

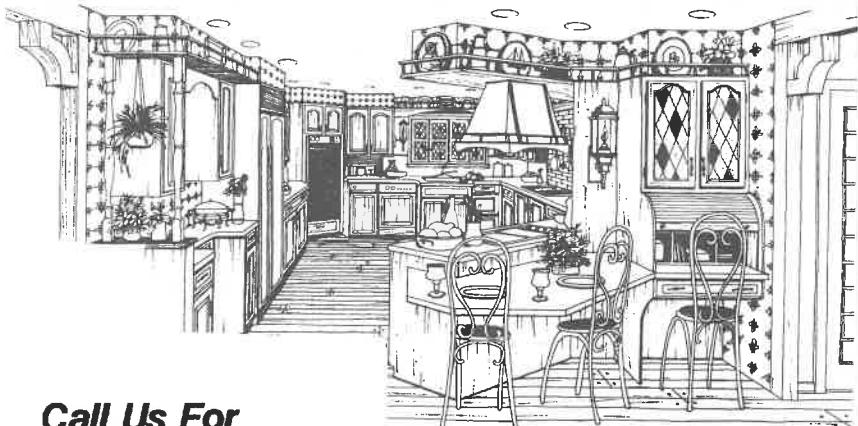

The International Association of Square Dance Callers



CALLERLAB recently completed its 12th Annual Convention at the Phoenix Hyatt Regency, April 1-3, 1985, with more than 1100 callers and partners in attendance. The theme of the convention was "Music — Our Greatest Ally".

At the opening session, The American Square Dance Society presented the prestigious "Silver Spur" award to Herb and Erna Egender of Aurora, Colorado.

The highlight of the Tuesday evening banquet was the presentation of CALLERLAB's most coveted award, the Milestone Award. This year, two members were presented this prestigious award — Jon Jones of Arlington, Texas and Dick Leger, Bristol, Rhode Island.

The Chairman's Award was presented by Chairman Bob Van Antwerp to John Kaltenthaler for his dedication and significant contributions to CALLERLAB.

Awards of Excellence were presented to retiring Board Members Jerry Haag, Dave Taylor and Don Williamson. Those members from overseas attending for the first time were presented with a Small World Award and Quarter Century certificates were presented to those members who have been calling for 25 years.

Cal Golden, Hot Springs, Arkansas, was elected as Chairman of the Board with Norm Cross, Milnor, North Dakota elected to serve as Vice-Chairman. Don Hanhurst, Fort Myers, Florida, Jon Jones and Martin Mallard, Saskatoon, Canada were elected to the CALLERLAB Executive Committee as well. John Kaltenthaler was re-appointed as Executive Secretary and Herb Egender was re-appointed Assistant Executive Secretary.



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ARE WE LISTENING?

(The following is reprinted courtesy of "Guidelines", the CALLERLAB Newsletter, April 1985.)

Are we listening to the dancers who tell us they are being pushed too fast? Are we listening to those who, in one national survey after another, tell us that there is too much rough dancing? Are we listening to all those we have lost who say that they simply could not make the transition from class to club? Dropout rates around the country, reduced class sizes, and reduced crowds would seem to indicate that we are not.

Recently, the Colorado State Square Dance Association tried to contact dancers who had dropped out to find the reasons for their leaving. Six hundred fifty-six questionnaires were sent out. One hundred thirty-one were returned. Obviously, that is not a large number. However, it might not be

out of line to suggest that the 131 couples who responded are a microcosm which is representative of dropouts throughout the country. Their replies to some of the questions should make callers and club officers alike re-examine their approach to teaching and leadership.

Many of the questions produced no startling information. However, several were eyebrow raisers; to wit:

When you joined the club, were the people friendly?

Yes: 87 (66%) No: 44 (34%)

Did you feel your club was friendly to you?

Yes: 4 (3%) No: 127 (97%)

Was there a clique?

Yes: 124 (95%) No: 7 (5%)

After you graduated and were out dancing did you find that the caller called things you did not know?

Yes: 127 (97%) No: 4 (3%)

The caller called too fast?

Yes: 129 (98%) No: 2 (2%)

That seasoned dancers looked down their noses if you made a mistake?

Yes: 55 (51%) No: 53 (49%)

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That you were embarrassed if you couldn't do the movements?

Yes: 91 (69%) No: 40 (31%)

That you enjoyed the challenge?

Yes: 42 (32%) No: 89 (68%)

That after the dance you were thanked for coming?

Yes: 62 (47%) No: 69 (53%)

That the regular club members asked you to go with them to various dances?

Yes: 34 (27%) No: 92 (73%)

To the question, "If you were in charge, how would you change the program?" — 43 said to teach fewer moves, 23 to work longer on harder movements, 19 individual help for some, 17 better teaching, 10 no angels, and 5 longer sessions.

The responses to this survey indicate that some of us are not doing such a great job in promulgating the fun and friendliness for which square dancing is supposed to be famous. The foundation for whatever we do

in square dancing is laid in the class and the results of corner cutting in our teaching become clear in the replies of the dropouts.

Dick Brown, who has spent countless hours working on and analyzing the several nationwide LEGACY surveys, briefed the Board of Governors and the Ad Hoc Committee on Program Review on the preliminary results of the latest survey. Those results indicate that class sizes are decreasing, dance attendance is decreasing and that ratings of club leadership and dancing pleasure are consistently down. The finger of responsibility points directly at us, the callers. While there are those who would discount the survey data as merely the complaints of a few thousand disgruntled dancers, it might pay dividends for the organization and square dancing in general to look closely at the final results of the survey. They will be available shortly after the LEGACY convention in May and are recommended reading.

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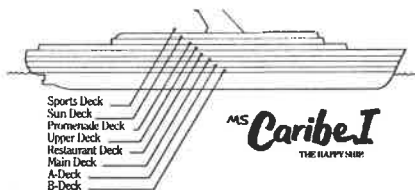

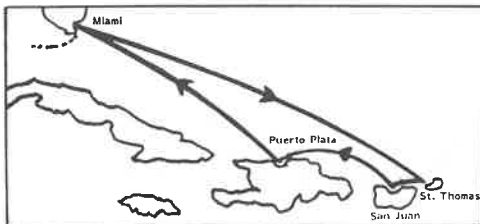
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CALLERLAB CONVENTION REPORT

CALLERLAB, The International Association of Square Dance Callers, held its 12th Annual Convention at the Phoenix Hyatt Regency, April 1 - 3, 1985. Significant awards and election of officers are detailed in the report on page 24. At the Wednesday morning business meeting a number of actions were approved by the general membership:

The question, "Who is your partner in an Ocean Wave?", was raised. It was decided that this does not affect choreography in popular use today, and that the subject should be treated as a non-issue.

A formal petition was submitted to CALLERLAB concerning hand position in Ocean Waves. In response, a Styling Committee Resolution was passed which reaffirmed that the definition of hand position in Ocean Waves is "hands up", and that it is the obligation of each CALLERLAB member to subscribe to the established standards of definitions, styling and timing.

It was agreed that the Plus Committee will establish an emphasis call for each quarter comparable to the Mainstream Emphasis calls of the quarter. Also on the Plus Program, the definition of "Anything and Roll" was amended to note that if "and Roll" is added to a call which, by definition, has some dancers walking straight forward, or standing stationary at the completion of the call, those dancers will do nothing for the "and Roll".

The Mainstream Quarterly Selection list remains unchanged with only two calls: Chain Down The Line and Grand Parade; Grand Spin had been deleted prior to the Convention.

Load the Top was deleted from the Plus QS list, while Load The Windmill was added. Retained on the list were Ping to a Diamond and Spin Chain & Exchange The Gears.

The Advanced QS list remains unchanged: Change Lanes, Linear Action, Mini Busy, Zing, and Check Over.

over the years that the bulk mail is what pays the bills. Without the bulk mail, there would be no Postal Service and these same postal employees, who "put down" Third Class Bulk Mail, would not have their jobs.

If you have not received your copy of the Blue Book (**In our case, The Prompter - Ed.**) by the 27th or 28th of the month prior to the date of issue, please do the following:

1. Call your post office and talk to the Postmaster or the Superintendent of Mails. Ask when they are going to deliver the bulk mail to your address. Sometimes this is all it takes to get your book delivered, so please give them a call.

2. If a call does not do the

trick, go to your post office and pick up a Form 4314, which is a consumer complaint card. These can usually be found on the counter, if not, ask a clerk for them. Fill out the card and mail it (no postage required). It is actually two cards — one card goes to your local post office — the other goes to the Postmaster General, Washington, D.C. Your local post office doesn't like to have Washington breathing down their necks, so this might facilitate a little action.

There is only one way to correct this situation — if all subscribers who have trouble getting their mail on time, would take the trouble to complain to Washington, D.C. via the Consumer Complaint Form 4314, it could generate enough disciplinary action in the local post offices to reverse the trend of throwing all Third Class Bulk Mail in a corner somewhere until they want to do something with it. It might even make the outrageous rates we pay for postage worth it. We don't mind paying for services rendered if, indeed, we truly get service.

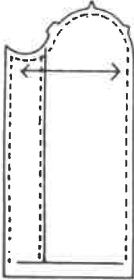


Make line 5" down center back.

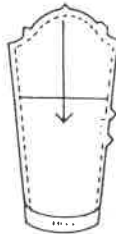

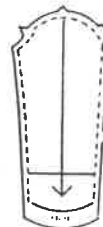


Elbow and Sleeve Length Alteration

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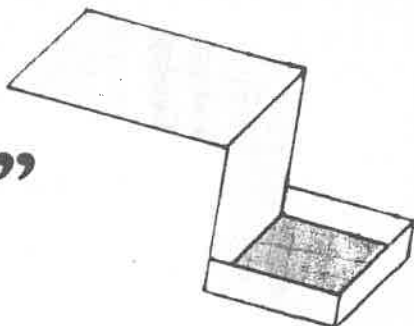
