

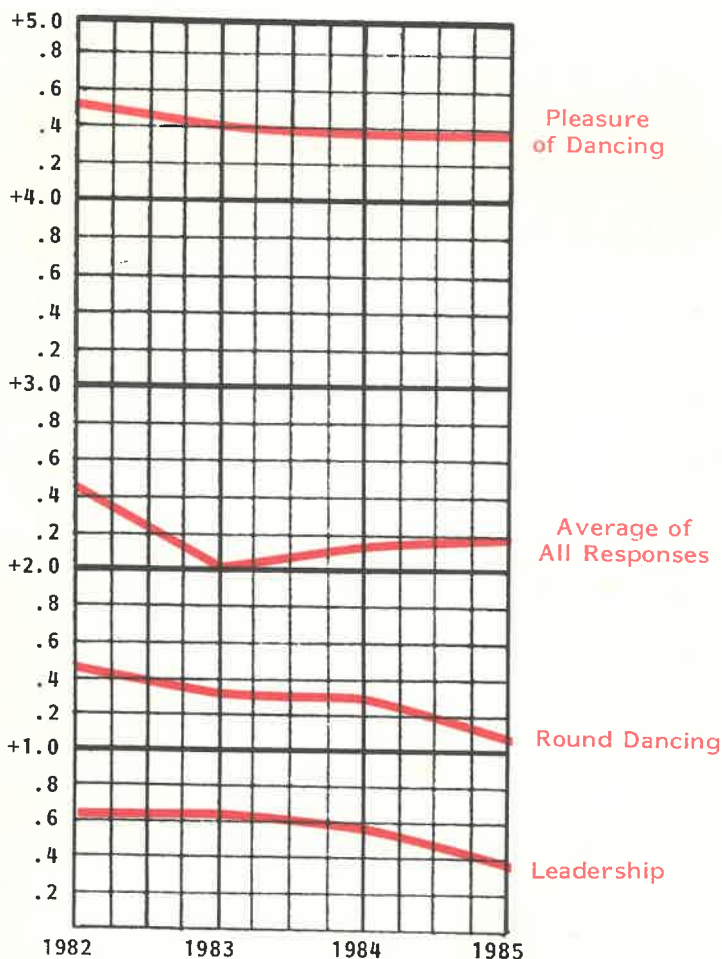

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PUBLISHER'S PATTER

During my monthly square dancing activities, I come in contact with quite a few square dance clubs (and hear about even more). It seems that many of these clubs are having trouble attracting and holding the type of people that they'd like to have in their clubs. This is true not only in the Bay Area but throughout the state of California (and probably elsewhere in the country also). This is not necessarily something new to our movement — there have always been clubs that were decreasing in number while others were actively trying to increase their membership. The secret to attracting new members, and holding on to the ones that you already have, is as elusive today as it ever was.

I won't go into a long treatise on why we lose as many members as we do. One hears all the reasons: "It takes too long to learn to square dance." "The group I'm dancing with is too cliquish." "Our caller is boring." "All the work in our club is done by just a few people." And the list goes on!! (Surprisingly, in the seven years

that Betty and I have been dancing, I have never heard anyone say that they thought square dancing was too expensive.) It is not my purpose here to try to place "blame" on any element of our activity. Rather, I contend that we need to try something different in motivating square dance interest among our dancing friends and acquaintances. Something different... anything different to see if it will improve the interest level.

Well, let's see... Something different you say... The following are just examples of "something different" that could be tried. I'm sure you and your club can come up with a number of things to add to the list.

The club could hold a contest to see who could bring in the most members. Give a prize (like a trophy) to the couple that brings in the most members to the beginners class.

Advertise your club activities on the radio. Radio advertising is not all that expensive and many more people listen to radio than TV.

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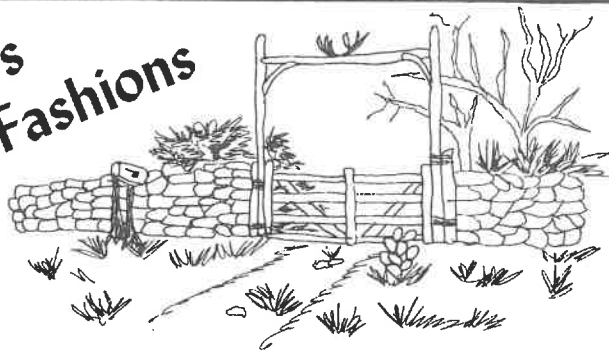
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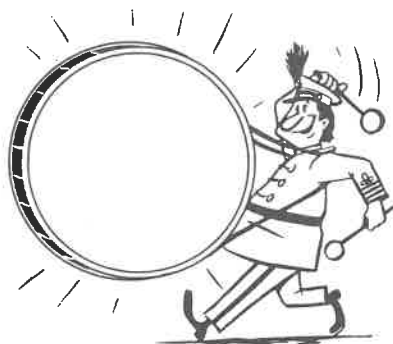
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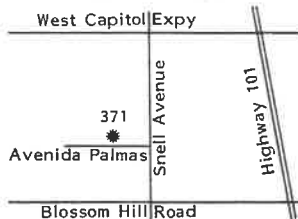
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"OUR" OPINION !

Our feature article this month presents the results of Legacy's 1985 Dancer Survey. Once again, we find a strong call for "more Mainstream" included in the tally. Add this to the other voices we've heard and you could draw the conclusion that there must be a need, and a market, for more Mainstream clubs and dances.

The logic is certainly there — classes are too long when dancers must progress from Basic through Plus in one unbroken sequence. Plus level, especially when called All Position (not DBD, that's not the same as APD), is too tough a level for those who want to square dance only for the social aspect, and then only once or twice a month. Valid reasons, certainly, for the existence of both Mainstream clubs and Mainstream level hoedowns.

If you agree with the above logic, and consider that there are several thousand dancers in the Santa Clara valley, it would follow that there should be several Mainstream clubs in the area... and a choice of Mainstream level

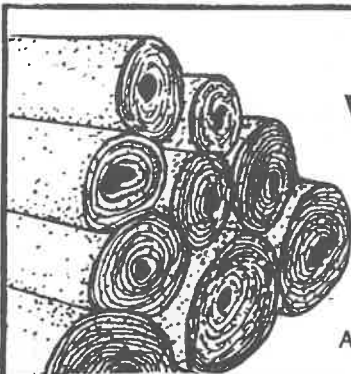
hoedowns. We are starting to see a few Mainstream level clubs, but there has certainly not been a great demand for dancing at this level.

The few Mainstream level hoedowns that we see tend to have small crowds. In fact, a recent C-1 hoedown drew more dancers than a Mainstream hoedown called by the same two callers! Advanced hoedowns far out draw Mainstream hoedowns.

During the past year we have presented a variety of opinions on the health of square dancing, and on the needs of the activity. What we need now are some "how-to's". How to draw more people into square dancing. How to retain more dancers in our classes and clubs. And, how to build the Mainstream level program that this area needs if the activity is to prosper and grow.

Think about these things. Talk about the possible alternatives at your club or class. And let us know what you're thinking. We want to share the ideas and suggestions.

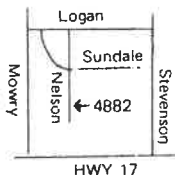
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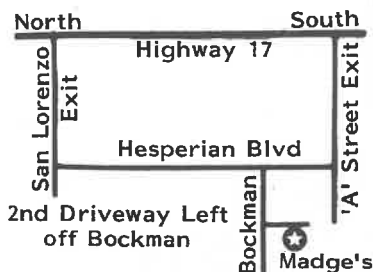
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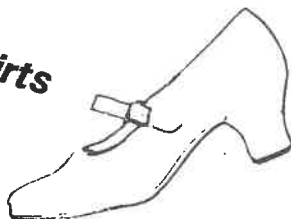
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CHALLENGE

Can we please all of the people all of the time? It seems that many of the festivals and many of the Saturday night dances are trying to do just that. While the Advanced and Challenge movement has seen rapid growth in recent times, it is still not large enough to begin to try to accommodate all of the levels on the same weekend.

Many festivals are trying to take advantage of the growth of the upper levels by trying to program all of the levels in their weekends, but they end up doing this by fragmenting the dancing time for each level so that it is really not very enticing to any of the levels.

This same situation is in evidence at some of the Saturday night dances where we have tried to increase the size of the dance by

using easy A-1 as a "floor" level and then trying to please the A-2 and C-1 dancer by squeezing in tips for them. We fail to realize that there are a large number of A-2 and C-1 dancers who would like to have a dance for just their level. We realize that these dances would be smaller, but if the dancers are willing to pay more to come to them they could be successful. We heard some real good comments about the recent Memorial Day weekend in Ventura where the halls were split for all levels and the A-1 and A-2 dancers had their own action for the whole weekend. We think this should be done more often.

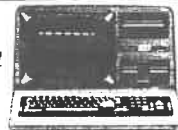

Many do not, therefore, they have nothing to relate to. Many dancers have been taught to use walls in the hall to orient themselves when doing figures. - Marzettis' Poppyseed Dressing (available at your market)

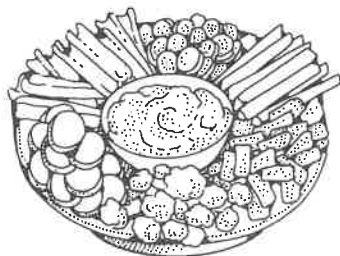

INDIVIDUAL BEEF WELLINGTON

- 1 filet mignon tenderloin, cut into 2" thick steaks*
- 1 jar of pate (goose liver and truffles)
- Pepperidge Farm frozen puff pastry, defrosted
- 2 egg whites, beaten

In hot skillet, sear all side of steaks until browned. Place in refrigerator for 15 minutes. Cover top surface of steaks with pate, 1/8" thick. Roll out defrosted puff pastry, cover steak and tuck around



all sides. Prick surface of pastry and brush with egg white. Place in preheated 350° oven for: 25 minutes = rare; 35 minutes = medium rare. Top with Bearnaise sauce or your favorite mushroom sauce. (*Filet may be prepared whole and cut into individual servings after baking. 2 pounds filet = 4 to 5 servings.)

- 1 cup butter, melted
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 3 pkgs. Waverly Crackers, whole
- 1½ cups crushed walnuts
- ½ pkg. chocolate chips

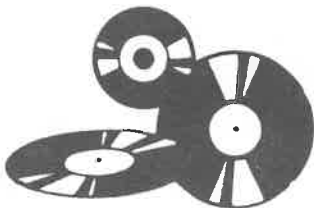
Lightly grease cookie pan (use pan with sides). Cover bottom of pan with Waverly crackers (lay with sides touching). Bring butter and sugar to a full boil and continue to boil for 2 minutes, stirring continually. Pour over crackers, covering completely. Bake in preheated 350° oven for 5 minutes. Remove from oven and immediately sprinkle chocolate chips and walnuts over caramel surface. Allow to cool completely. Break into cookie-size pieces.

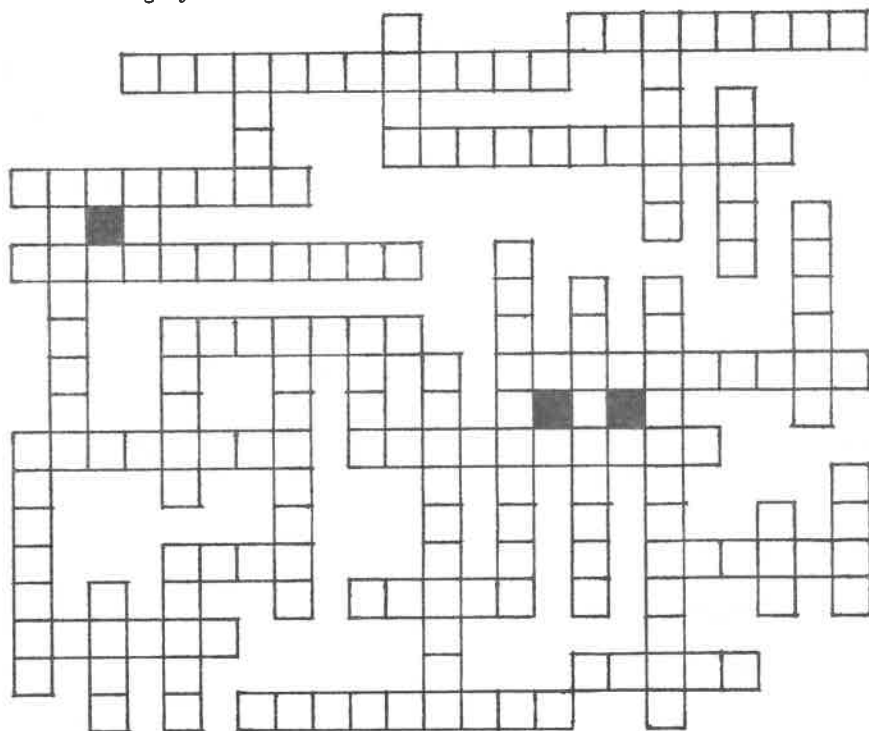

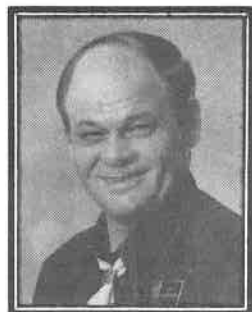

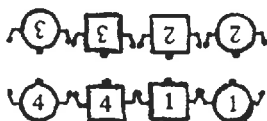
DEFINITION

(Callers NOTE: The definition above is identical to Burleson #3101.)

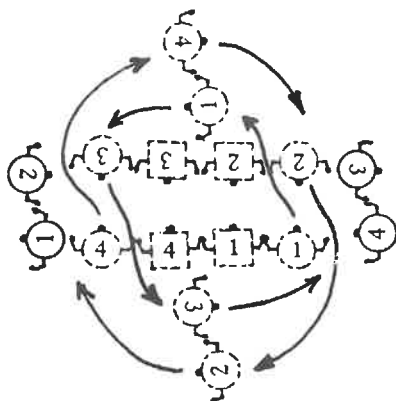

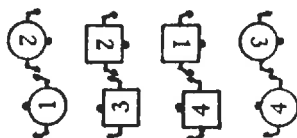

When the National Square Dance Convention promenades to Indianapolis June 26-28, 1986, after a 20-year absence, the reconvening "back home again in Indiana" will be a pleasant contrast for dancers.

In 1966 when the convention came to the Hoosier state, Indianapolis was just stirring from its Naptown image. But today, just as there is a renewal of interest and national recognition for square dancing, there is a renewal for Indianapolis; she is exploding into a metropolis with all the vigor and enthusiasm of a noisy hoedown.

There has been a rejuvenation of the downtown, site of the Hoosier Dome, in which conventioners will dance. Nearly \$200 million in developments will be completed by convention time. Two new hotels have opened near the \$77 million Hoosier Dome and a third is planned. In the last two years 18 restaurants have opened within walking distance of the convention site. Shuttle trolleys operate right past the Hoosier Dome. Carriages cart sightseers around the downtown area. Fast interstate routes make suburban hotels and motels less than 10 minutes from dancing.

The Hoosier Dome and adjacent halls provide 300,000 square feet of dancing space and the football field is a spectacular squaring-up arena under a billowing ceiling of white, 95 feet overhead.

In this unusual setting, these

practical aspects beckon an expected 40,000 to Indianapolis for the greatest spectacle in dancing:

TRAVEL: There are 138 daily flights into Indianapolis, providing seats for 30,000 passengers a day. Among the 15 airlines which land in Indianapolis is Delta, designated the official airline of the 35th National Convention, which guarantees flying dancers the best rate available.

Indianapolis is an easy drive from most major cities: Boston is 941 miles, Dallas, 882; Houston, 997; New York City, 646; St. Louis, 231; Chicago, 186, and Denver, 1,224.

HOUSING: Downtown Indianapolis, called the Mile Square because of its shape and size, offers more than 2,000 rooms, with more to be ready by 1986. Outlying areas, only 10 minutes away, have nearly 9,000 more rooms.

CAMPING: Special camp sites for the convention total 2,200, and arrangements include transportation to the convention center, only 45 blocks away.

CLIMATE: Indianapolis averages 71.7 degrees and June can be comfortably balmy. June averages 4.09 inches of rain; a dry convention is a good bet. Relative humidity averages only 62 percent in June at 1 p.m.

In 1986, Indy is no longer in the sticks. Good news for those who plan to dance under the Dome in the heart of Hoosier hospitality.

The SCVSDA's 29th Annual Jubilee is featuring a great line-up of callers for the October 11, 12 & 13th 1985 event. One of our all-time favorites is Tony Oxendine from South Carolina.

Doin' what comes naturally. For Tony Oxendine that is singing. Doin' what he likes best. That is calling. His exceptionally fine singing voice and his easy flowing, well-timed patter bring enjoyment, excitement and challenge, and have made him a popular choice for special dances and festivals across the country.

Tony is a full-time caller, traveling many thousands of miles each year. He is also staff caller of the Myrtle Beach Balls in April and September of each year at the Convention Center, Myrtle Beach, South Carolina; the Charles Towne Square and Round Up at the Francis Marion Hotel in Charleston, South Carolina; the Springs Park Festivals in Lancaster, South Carolina; and at Andy's Trout Farm in Dillard, Georgia.

At home in South Carolina he conducts classes and workshops and

is the club caller for four clubs. He works regularly with beginner callers in a Callers Clinic he recently organized in Columbia.

Tony was introduced to square dancing at age 19 in 1972 in a teenage square dance program for youth sponsored by the Sumter, South Carolina Parks and Recreation Department. He liked square dancing so well that, upon graduating from classes, he embarked upon a marathon of dancing and danced 38 straight nights. With his musical background -- singing with a band, singing for weddings, in churches, and for special events in Sumter -- and his young analytical mind, he was quickly drawn into and fascinated by the challenge of calling.

An accredited member of CALLERLAB, Tony is also a recording artist for Ranch House Records. Some of his best sellers include "Texas Woman", "I Feel a Hitchhike Coming On", "Back on My Mind" and "Pretty Woman".

So, plan on dancing to these fine songs and to many other favorites at the Jubilee in October.

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The Declining Health of Square Dancing



RESULTS OF LEGACY'S 1985 DANCER SURVEY

LEGACY's fourth dancer survey turned out to be the largest of all with 7,584 forms received. Over the past six years, close to 20,000 in all have been read, compiled, reviewed and analyzed in an effort to measure dancers' needs, learn what makes things tick and feel the pulse of the activity.

Any doctor feeling the pulse of square dancing right now would have great concern over the patient's welfare. The data indicated declining class sizes, declining dance attendance and decreasing dancer satisfaction in several important areas.

The average profile of all respondents was a person who had been dancing about six years and

danced about six times per month. 6% were callers, 3% were cuers, 25% were club officers and 7% were association officers. Looking back, the average years of dancing experience and average dances attended per month of respondents has been gradually increasing. While the exact reasons for these two trends cannot be defined by the data, most likely the average experience is increasing because of the reduced numbers of new dancers. Probably the frequency is increasing because of the gradual movement of dancers into programs that require more frequent dancing to maintain proficiency.

Class sizes and dance attendance was suffering more in the

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metropolitan and suburban areas. All dancers together reported the trend was downward about twice as often as they reported increases.

A very strong correlation was noticed between the average number of lessons and dancer retention. In one state where respondents reported an average of 22 lessons, 84% of the dancers estimated the average percentage of graduates dancing regularly after two years was somewhere between zero and 50%. In another state where the average was 28 lessons, 79% made the same observation. The national average was 25 lessons with 80% reporting the percentage dancing after two years was between zero and 50%. This same lesson/drop-out correlation extended through other states as well.

When the dancers were asked what they enjoyed the most, the far-and-away most popular answer was open club dances (49%). Next was vacations and weekends (13%). Rounds, workshops and festivals-conventions came out even at 10% for each. Lessons were more popular in rural environments, and open club dances appealed most to dancers in small towns. Dancers in metropolitan areas chose closed club dances and festivals-conventions more than those in other areas. Rounds and vacation-weekends appealed most to city dancers, and workshops got the highest vote in suburban areas.

Dancers responded to the question, "What would help square dancing most?" by checking "more workshop tips" (37%), "stabilize lists for all programs" (26%), "more

Mainstream clubs" (23%), and "more lessons" (21%) as the top four. Looking at all of these choices together (there were others) indicated the dancers collectively lacked confidence in their ability to dance what was being called.

One part of the form, the part where respondents are requested to rate a variety of aspects of the activity on a +5 to -5 scale, has been maintained in the same basic configuration in all four surveys. The purpose was to identify and track changes in attitudes through the years. With this survey providing the fourth point on each aspect, patterns became well defined. A few of them precipitated considerable concern at CALLERLAB and LEGACY meetings this spring.

Since the sampling method was non-scientific and the terms not defined, it would be a mistake to use scores earned by the various aspects as finite measurements. However, when the mean average score trend for all aspects in the four surveys are compared with the trend in mean average scores for each aspect, some valid conclusions can be drawn. For example, the mean average scores for all aspects in the four surveys was 2.43, 2.00, 2.11, 2.18 or, in broad terms, the overall score trend from the first survey was down, up, up. Most of the variations can probably be attributed to sample differences.

Exercise, cost, learning new things, doing things with friends, the challenge, mixers and getting out scoring trends conformed closely

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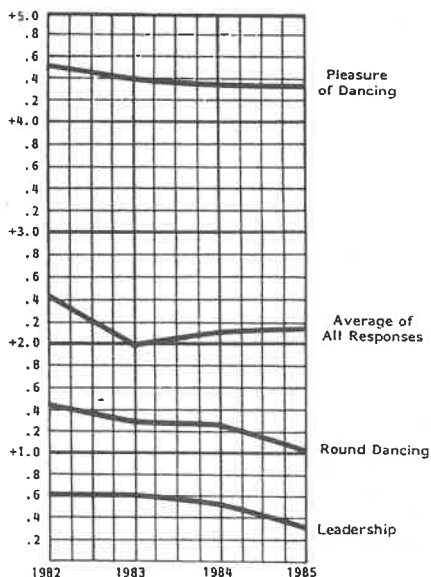
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with the mean average score, indicating dancers see little or no change in their relative appeal. Two aspects, clothes and club activities, dropped in average scores with this survey even though the overall trend was up. A one-time divergent movement is cause for concern, but not necessarily a problem. If the scores for these two aspects continue away from the mean in the next survey, then a problem is probably developing.

Three aspects — club leadership, the pleasure of dancing, and round dancing — have not conformed to the overall trend and should be considered problem areas. Club leadership scores for the four surveys, in order, were 0.62, 0.62, 0.55 and 0.37. Pleasure of dancing scores were 4.51, 4.41, 4.35 and 4.35. While the last point was not lower, the overall score rose at the same time so the trend was still divergent. Round dancing scores were 1.45, 1.30, 1.26 and 1.05.

Since the pleasure of dancing is the highest scoring aspect, it could



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be considered the primary appeal for most dancers and its downward trend should be of great concern. While the appeal of round dancing is not as universal, the steep decline could indicate something is really amiss. Club leadership's trend could be influenced by the decline in new dancers who, so often, are given the burden of running the clubs.

All data from the 1985 survey has been compiled and full reports produced as follows:

National: by all dancer profiles (years dancing, frequency and location of dance).

States: by experience profile and only when 100 or more responses were received.

Groups of States: by experience profile and grouped as follows — Northeast, Mid-Atlantic, Southeast, Midwest, North Central, Southwest and West Coast.

Special Runs: by experience profile, includes breakouts by callers, cuers, club officers, association officers, Canada and other countries.

Each report is thirteen pages long and covers all scores in each part of the survey for 1985. Some stations even give free public service announcements.

Have the club sponsor a "one-night stand" where all the members would bring their friends. Get a good looking caller (I have one I'd recommend) and introduce non-dancers to the advantages of square dancing.

The club could try changing its dancing level. We are members of a club that is actually trying this at the present time. The thought in mind is that many of the club members lose interest in "dancing the same old figures". A change in club level may lose some members but at the same time, you may pick up a group of new ones that are looking for something new.

Have the club sponsor non-dancing social activities such as theatre parties, hayrides, RV and family camping outings, etc. I know of a few clubs that use this technique very successfully.

This is just a small list of things that might work for your club. Hold a contest in your club for other ideas. Have a "brainstorming" session. I'm for trying anything new. What we've been doing in the past isn't working as well as it needs to.

Speaking of things new, did you hear about the dance held a couple of weeks ago in Palo Alto? The Stanford Quads sponsored a "challenging" Plus Hoedown. Betty and I were out-of-town or we would have been there because the caller was John Sybalsky. (John is trying to teach us C-3 and he really has his work cut out for him.) I have never danced to John at the Plus level and was interested to see how this dance would be received. All reports that I have gotten indicate it was a huge success. The hall was filled to its maximum number of squares. There were tables filled with food that the club members had brought. Nobody left early (not even while the star tips were being called). But I think the greatest measure of success of the dance was the standing ovation that John received at its conclusion. When's the last time you were at a dance

and the caller received a standing ovation?? John is an excellent caller and I understand that if you knew the Plus moves, you'd have had no problems at this dance. If you use the old "jump in the hole" technique, you may have been in trouble. Oh yes, I forgot to mention the star tips. There were two squares for the C-4 star tip (that's right, C-4). A couple of additional squares for the C-3 and C-2 star tips and several additional squares for the C-1 and Advanced star tips. Sounds like a great time. I'm sorry I missed it but will be sure and make the next one.

DANCING HINTS

Load the Windmill is the newest CALLERLAB Plus Quarterly Selection (May 1, 1985) and very closely resembles the actions required for Load the Boat (see The Prompter June 1985). Once again, the main secret to success when dancing the "Load" calls is to "do your own thing". If you start the call on the outside (as an end), your part of the call continues to be ONLY on the outside of the set and you must avoid any action or contact with the center dancers. The 'Circulate path' on the outside is very similar (how about identical?) to the path in Load the Boat, and the person you will end the call with is the person you face at the beginning of the call.

As a center dancer, you should "keep the square small" and avoid any contact with the end dancers who are Circulating on the outside. This action helps assure that the ends will not accidentally wander into your part of the call, and helps make the "path" for the outside dancers shorter. Here again, you must precisely execute your portion of Load the Windmill, thus helping the end dancers as much as possible. As a center dancer, you WILL NOT complete the call with the dancer you originally face, but rather with the center dancer who is originally beside you.

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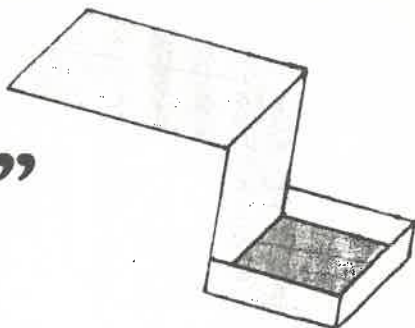
