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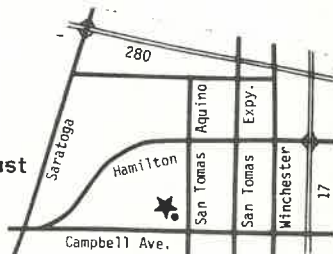
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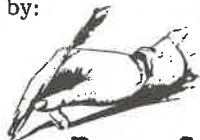

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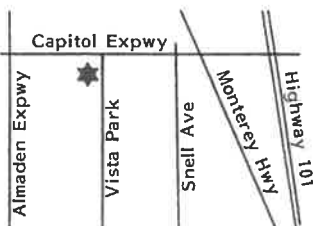
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# "OUR" OPINION !

refreshments, a hall, and a fun night of dancing for our group.

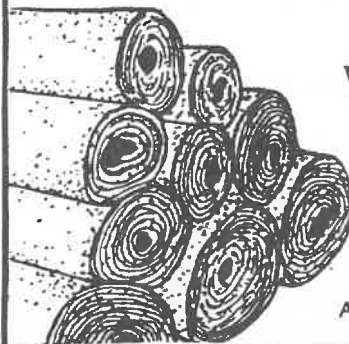

I don't know about Colorado state, but as for "Silicon Valley"

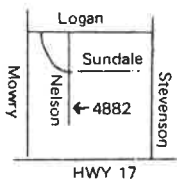


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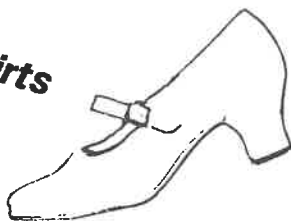
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California, I believe people here join square dance clubs for fun and to meet nice people. Many of our lives are so tension-filled at work that we don't want any more tension in the evening. So perhaps what we need is more casualness and sense of fun rather than pressure to be perfect in the local square dance groups.

May I just relay my own experience to you?

My husband and I have been in three beginner classes now over the past four years and really enjoy the classes. We are fearful now that we won't like regular club dancing as well as the classes where we have such camaraderie with our fellow students.

Attempt #1 lasted 3 months. It consisted of all beginners for the first part of the evening. Later, the caller had us form two big circles with the beginners in the inner circle and the regular members in the outer circle. When the music stopped, we paired up one club member with a beginner. I found this to be helpful. After a tip with the mixed group, the beginners left and the regular club continued on.

Attempt #2 lasted 8 months. This club had both its regular club dance and its beginner classes on the same night. After the beginners practiced for some time, the regular club members danced. This was helpful because we could observe the moves being performed quickly and smoothly, not stopping and starting as beginners do when we have to go back to square one off and on. It also made us feel better when we saw the club members flub up every

once in a while and be able to laugh at themselves and go on. There was a tip or two with the regular club members then the beginners left and the regular club continued on.

#3 (final beginners class, we hope). This club has its regular club on a separate night from the beginners. A few members attend to assist where needed. The caller also gives 1/2 hour extra before class for those who need extra help in catching on.

My personal preference is for the format used in #2. I'm sure that each club votes on whether to have its beginner classes on separate nights from the regular club nights and I have no quarrel with the fact they use their freedom of choice. It just seems to me, from personal experience, that having both experienced dancers and beginners together for at least part of the evening is a more helpful and casual atmosphere. There is more chance for the beginners to check out the regular club and decide whether that group is for them or not before they commit themselves.

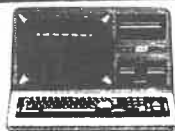

On June 15, 1985 I had the displeasure of dancing to Honey Wolfson at an A-1 dance. This caller (?) seems to think that the level lists are inadequate and require the addition of calls, made up by her, such as Arky Teacup Chain and various all eight calls. She does not deem it necessary to



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walk through or explain her fabrications and pays no attention to the floor. On June 29, 1985 there is an SCVSDA (Editor's note: The dance is actually sponsored by the SCVCA.) Caller appreciation night. It will also be caller deappreciation night or head shrinking night. When Honey Wolfson comes to the platform I will loudly leave the floor and hope that some of the other A-1 dancers who were so disgusted with Honey Wolfson's calling will follow.

Dear Mr. Adams,

The term "arky" and "all eight" are conceptual in nature and are directional to the dancers. "Arky" tells you, the dancer, that in this move, some dancers will be dancing what is technically the "other sex's" part. "All eight" tells you, the dancer, that you will be doing a move which is normally done by four people, but that "all eight" of you will do it at the same time (recognizing, of course, that the

definition of the move does not change).

Apparently you are not aware that you were, in fact, dancing other moves "all eight" during the evening. For instance, "1/4 Thru" and "3/4 Thru" were called from Alamo Rings many times at the same dance. These moves, when done from Alamo Rings, are "all eight" (even though callers do not usually use the term since it is clear how the move is to be done in this case) -- but you don't mention them on your list of objections. I don't know if this is indicative of the fact that you are more familiar with these moves, were successful in dancing them, and therefore they are "O.K.", or if you object because I actually used the term "all eight" as clarification in all eight Wheel Thru from a set square (where the term must be used as there are other "Wheel Thrus" which might be done in this case).

Since Teacup Chain is defined as the "girls" do one thing and the "boys" do another, the term "arky"

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is appropriate in an "all position" situation. Since "arky" Teacup Chain is frequently done at the Plus level, I certainly would not consider it inappropriate for an Advanced dance.

It is also interesting to note that although "Left Square Chain Thru" was called many times during the evening, this move also does not appear on your list of objections. Yet, it fits your criteria — it does not appear on any list and was not "walked through" before being called.

I do not "make up" or "fabricate" calls at the Advanced level (or any level, for that matter). Both of these concepts are accepted and used at the Advanced level and you should expect to encounter them in the future at other Advanced dances (e.g. from an Alamo Ring, all eight Walk & Dodge).

I encourage you to discuss your concerns, and my reply, with your Advanced caller. If you want only to dance in situations where all moves called appear on a list, and any which you personally have not

seen are walked through before being called, I suggest you rethink your decision to dance Advanced — as this is not "where it's at" at this level. You are going to find yourself spending more time writing letters than dancing.

Please accept the advice I give to those who dance with me at all levels: if a caller uses a move with which you are not familiar, or one which you would like to have walked through, go and speak with him on the break. Ask what list the call is on, or ask to have the call walked through, etc. The result of the conversation has to be a better understanding of what is going on at the dance — for one, or both, of you. And if, early on in a dance, you feel you are truly being given a rotten time, it is never inappropriate to ask for you money back and go elsewhere.

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## ★ CORNER

In response to our comment regarding picking walls last month, one dancer came up with, "Great idea, but what do you do in a round building?" I first suggested round dancing, then went on to explain that since it is customary to have only one couple (the #1 couple in the square) with their backs to the caller, it does establish a line through the heads' positions and the sides' positions that are at ninety degree angles. These lines, although imaginary, should be used when actual walls are not available.

Another problem that usually causes many breakdowns in squares at any level are those dancers we call "floaters". While they have been called by many other names, most not printable, these are people who, instead of taking a solid position in the square, tend to try to "float" into one behind the action of the other dancers. Because they are late getting into position, they are not quite in the formation when the next call comes. Thus, they are not ready to do it and the square starts to break down.

These "floaters" are not always sure they know the calls and they hang back — trying to see how the others did them so they will not make a mistake. The real mistake they make is that by "floating", they cause the square to break down whether they do the call right or wrong because they are always

late getting there. Our tip to you if you are a "floater" is to take a firm position in the square. If you are wrong you will find out that you really don't know the call and you can learn or re-learn that call so you may do it right in the future.

Speaking of learning, how many times do you go to a dance and never learn anything new the entire evening? I consider the dance a complete loss if I fail to learn anything new and get through the whole dance without making a mistake. According to dancers who dance with me, I must be learning a lot with the number of mistakes I make. Seriously, I like to go to dances where I see something new. This can be either from a dancing standpoint or a calling standpoint, but I am always disappointed if I spend the entire evening and the caller does not do something I have not done before.

Many dancers don't feel the same way I do about the above. But, consider that the caller who did some new thing that I had not seen had to learn it someplace. So, it is likely, if I dance enough, I will run into it again at another dance. We all take note services and steal from each other anyway, so it is very likely I will see the move again and will be more successful with it the next time. At Advanced and Challenge level, most dancers consider each hoedown or new caller they dance to as a new learning experience, or at least they should. Since most of us strive, at least a little bit, to better our dancing ability at whatever level we are dancing, we will get better even faster if we seek out these learning experiences instead of avoiding them. Dancers from my clubs often come to club night and ask for a figure or formation to be reviewed that they first saw at last Saturday's hoedown. I think this is the healthy attitude to have. When they have learned to do the figure from a particular strange formation, they will certainly be able to do it the next time they encounter it at a dance. Think about it, it may help you. See you in a Star Tip!

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A pedometer has been carefully tutored to prove how far you can are dance. This device, hooked your belt, shows approximately far you walk, hop or jump — of which are square dancing ivities.

At a recent square dance, the ometer read 3 miles. This luded round dancing — although st round dancers are far too oth for a pedometer to even gister, except possibly during reet Fair'. The reading also cludes the two to three tips that st people sit out. If you square every tip your mileage may vary. Beware that the 3-mile reading is y an estimate. The pedometer ading is affected by the size of r stride and may be altered if a actually dance forward and

back (as the caller says) instead of just walking.

Square dancing distance may vary by other factors, as well. For instance, if your square constantly breaks down, you won't rack up as much mileage. Also, if you have a caller who is nuts about Promenading all the time instead of Squaring Thru, you may show a bit more distance.

And a caller who Loads the Boat and Do Pasos all night can really get the pedometer whirling.

Beware, too, of people who, discovering you are wearing a pedometer, want to grab your belt and jiggle everything. They can throw off the whole thing.

However, despite all the variables, a pedometer proves that square dancing is good exercise and, even in the best of squares, you always have a long way to go.

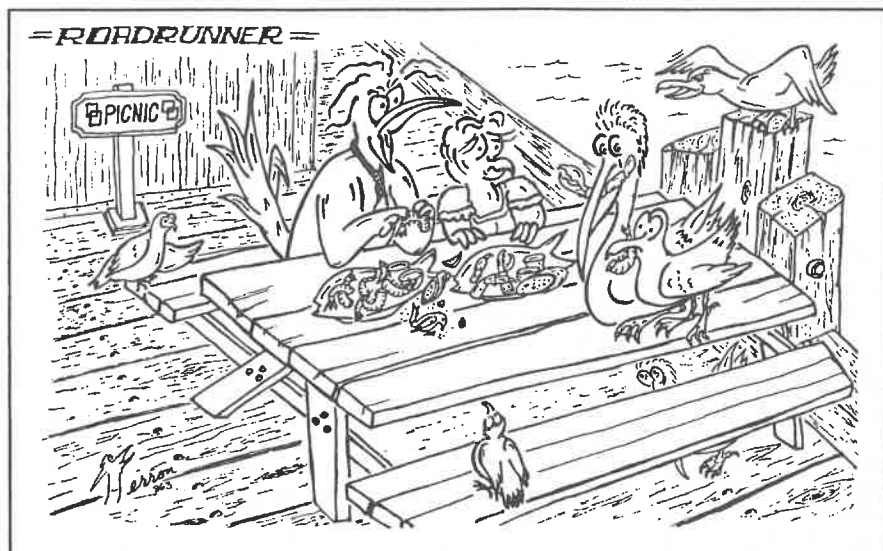
Bronc started square dancing in 1973. That same year, he called his first singing call at his club's amateur night. The following year, he was teaching two beginner classes.

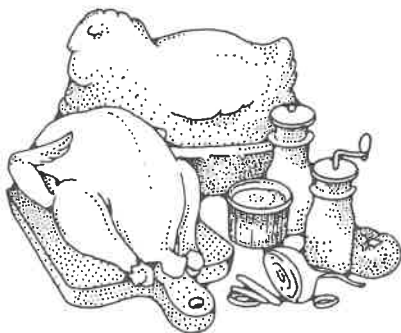

# *Stir The Bucket With Betty*

Here are some quick and easy recipes to try — they are truly delicious, but definitely not for the "diet watcher" group!! (Recipes reprinted courtesy of 'Local Square', January 1985.)



## **CARROT-CAULIFLOWER CASSEROLE**

- 8 large carrots, peeled
- 1 large cauliflower
- boiling hot water
- 2 Tbsp. butter
- 2 Tbsp. flour
- 2 green onions, sliced
- $\frac{1}{2}$  tsp. Dijon mustard
- $\frac{1}{2}$  cup chicken broth
- $\frac{1}{2}$  cup whipping cream
- $1\frac{1}{4}$  cup shredded Swiss cheese



Cut carrots  $\frac{1}{4}$ " thick in diagonal slices (approximately 4 cups). Break cauliflower into flowerettes. Cook vegetables in boiling water for 5 minutes until just tender. Plunge into cold water, drain and set aside. In medium pan, over medium heat, melt the butter. Blend in flour and mustard and cook until bubbly. Gradually stir in broth and cream. Continue cooking and stirring until sauce boils and thickens. Gradually add 1 cup of cheese, stirring until melted. Combine vegetables and sauce in shallow 2 quart baking pan; sprinkle with remaining cheese. Bake, uncovered, at  $350^{\circ}$  for 25 to 30 minutes or until heated through. Garnish with onions.

## **CHICKEN AND WINE**

- 3 lbs. chicken pieces
- flour
- 3 Tbsp. butter, melted
- 1 can chicken broth
- 1 cup white wine
- 1 medium onion, sliced
- 1 jar mushrooms, drained
- seasonings, to taste

Shake chicken in flour to coat. Place in pan and drizzle with butter. Bake at  $350^{\circ}$  until browned — approximately 40 minutes. Pour chicken broth and wine over chicken pieces. Top with onion and mushrooms and bake for 1 hour longer. Thicken pan gravy with flour, adding more wine if necessary, and season to taste.

## **CHOCOLATE CHEESECAKE**

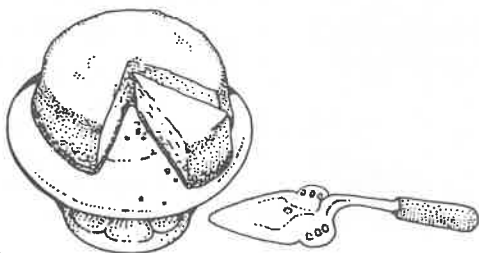
### **Chocolate Crust:**

- 9" cheesecake pan (springform)
- 2 cups finely crushed chocolate cookies
- $\frac{1}{4}$  cup sugar
- $\frac{1}{4}$  tsp. cinnamon
- 7 Tbsp. melted butter

Mix all ingredients and blend until moist and crumbly. Press crumbs with a spoon over bottom and up 3" around sides of pan.

### Cheesecake:

4 eggs  
1½ cups sugar  
6 Tbsp. cocoa  
1 tsp. vanilla  
2 (8 oz.) pkgs. cream cheese  
4 cups (2 pints) sour cream  
Chocolate Crust  
Cream Topping  
1 or 2 oz. semi-sweet chocolate



In a blender mix eggs, sugar, cocoa, vanilla and 1 package of cream cheese until very smooth; pour half of mixture into a bowl. Add remaining cheese to blender and whirl until smooth. Stir cheese mixture from blender into cheese mixture in bowl; fold in sour cream until blended and smooth. Pour batter into crust. Bake at 350° for 1 hour 20 minutes or until edge is set and dull in color, while area about 4" in diameter in center is still glossy looking. Cool, cover and chill thoroughly. Pile cream topping in center of cake. Shave chocolate on top of cream.

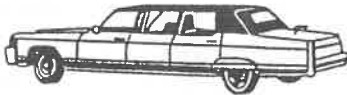
### Cream Topping:

1 (3 oz.) pkg. cream cheese  
½ cup whipping cream  
½ cup powdered sugar  
1 Tbsp. creme de cocoa

Beat cream cheese with mixer until smooth. Add whipping cream and mix at high speed until it has the consistency of stiffly whipped cream. Blend in powdered sugar and creme de cocoa. Cover and chill.



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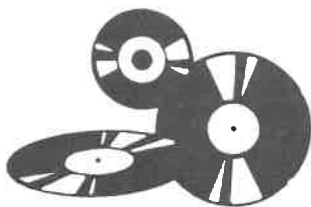
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## WHAT'S NEW!!

This is not new but is certainly a time saver for the home sewer: an ironing board cover with standard and metric measurements printed right on it, lengthwise and widthwise... also a bias marking... have you seen it? It's manufactured by Mil Co in San Diego.

Promenader Shoe Company is now making a ladies' Stomper — a tie clogging shoe to match the men's Stomper. The whole exhibition group can now match. Promenaders also is making a girl's ribbon tie, patent tap shoe, with the taps attached, and at a very reasonable price. Promenader is sure branching out!

How about Brenda and Billy, the Square Dance Bears. The crochet pattern for these cuties is available from Pin Unicorn Creations, P. O. Box 1509, Portland, Oregon 97207.

Callers, want a nice quiet hoedown with lots of banjo and guitar? Try "Dixie Hoedown" on Cloverleaf (#2). It was released back in March, but is really worth a listen if you missed it then. You can get a new "Chinese Breakdown" too, redone by Chaparral (112). And try these for singing calls: "Ramblin Fever" by Jerry Story on Rhythm (188) and "Joy to the World" by Ken Bower (515). This music is even better than the old one on Windsor. Another good one by the new Red Boot band is "Four Leaf Clover" by Chuck Meyer (1282) and, of course, you'll have to try "Mississippi Squirrel Revival" on Lamon by Bruce Williamson (10118), or on Kalox by John Saunders (1305). Our Frances Steitz, who hails from Mississippi, claims this is based on a true incident!!

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# Fashionable Thoughts by Martibel

## REMAKING A DRESS: A TRANSFORMATION

Two years ago a trip to Hawaii necessitated the need for at least a couple of sundress square dance dresses. Time for sewing had rapidly slipped away from me, leaving me with a dilemma. How was I going to acquire two dresses with the least amount of sewing time and cost?

In my closet hung two Gunny Sax floor length dresses — sundress designs. Why not? I took the dresses, released the skirt from the bodice and zipper (from the waist down). The next step required taking the lining out and cutting the lining to my 19" skirt length, hemming and gathering the waist to measurement.

If the existing lining is too slim to fall over your petticoat, consider cutting a simple circular skirt out of lining material. Of course, if the dress material is not too sheer, delete the skirt lining completely.

The third step entails shortening the bottom ruffle. I simply folded it back, adjusted the fullness and

stitched the edge, hiding the stitches in the ribbon trim found at the top of the lace trim and ruffle. Now, measure from the bottom of the ruffle towards the waist the needed length of your skirt. Allow a 5/8" seam before cutting your material. Be sure to staystitch the top of the "new" skirt to prevent raveling. Gather the skirt at the waist seamline and ease to fit the bodice.

Sew the skirt to the bodice. Pin and baste in the zipper; machine stitch. Voila, a sundress, square dance dress.!

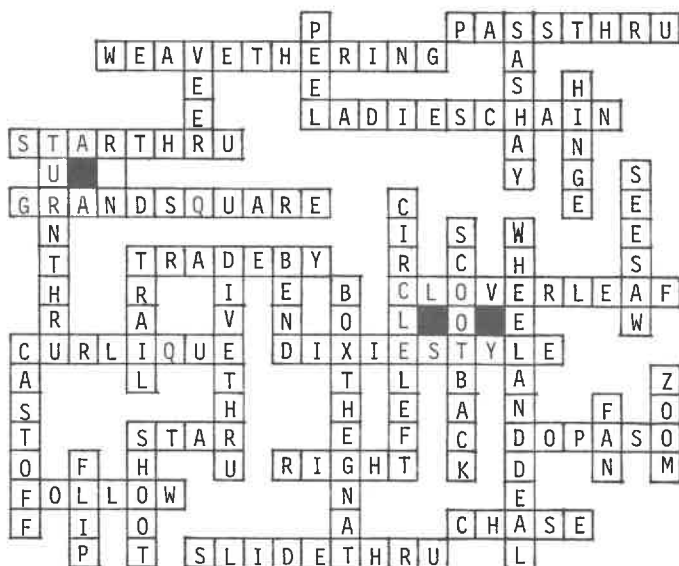

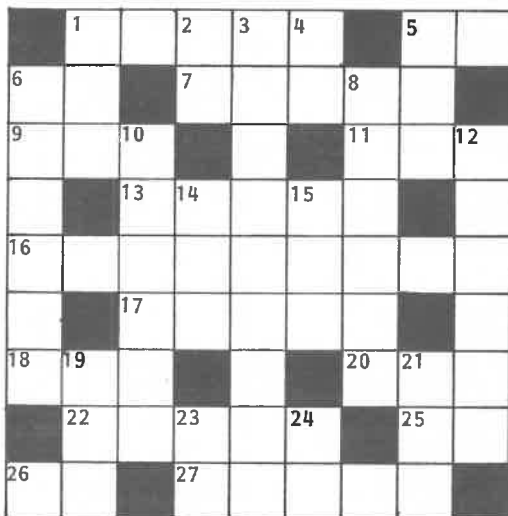

## A KEY TO HAPPY DANCING

Round dancing can be a wonderful activity that brings all of us much pleasure. We can continue this activity, and be happy, using a patient, positive attitude each time we attend a class or dance. First, you felt the desire to learn round dancing. Then, you discovered you had the ability to learn the footwork and started to become familiar with various melodies and routines. Yet, on more than one occasion, have you felt frustration building to a boiling point, being certain your partner was responsible for most of the mistakes, and perhaps even thought a dance program too dull or too difficult?

It appears that many times we are too serious in our approach toward dancing. Could this be fear of making mistakes that make us look less than perfect? So what if



we don't make it through this time, there's always next time. Profit from your mistakes, have fun and be patient! If you add patience to your attitude toward dancing, your partner and other dancers, and the dance program, you will have the necessary attitude for a satisfying dance experience. For the new dancer, the addition of patience is an absolute -- just ask the experienced dancer.

## IT TAKES TWO

Perhaps being patient with your partner will provide the biggest rewards while you develop your dancing. Remember, this may be the only partner you'll ever have! When two people are learning to round dance, they must learn to work together when practicing a new step or position. Your partner needs your help and your understanding. Avoid developing a competitive attitude and don't feel you have to dance as well or better than they do. Also, from time to time, when your partner points out your mistakes, let



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your partner be right. Patiently try again and soon both of you will begin to feel more comfortable.

Quite often we feel that we should be able to learn to execute new choreography and styling that we see for the first time. Seldom does the footwork just fall into place. Good dancing takes practice and dedication, and without patience, there can be no dedicated practice. Sometimes we see other couples able to perform a dance pattern, and may, perhaps, feel envious of their ability. But then, when we realize how much dedication goes into their performance, we should appreciate their ability. Avoid feeling competitive toward other round dancers.

### TAKE IT EASY

Try not to set a time schedule for yourself for learning new dance steps or routines. Work on something until you feel comfortable with it, then move on. If you find yourself having difficulty and beginning to feel impatient, try taking a break and going back to it later. Surprisingly, once you return, the same thing often feels easier. Remember, you won't be able to waltz box one minute and do a natural weave the next.

A good multi-level round dance program usually provides a variety of current and classic dances that interest and challenge most dancers. However, after dancing a particular routine, you may find you do not enjoy that dance. Next time, patiently sit out that dance.

Certainly, an evening of dancing can never be all things to all dancers, but if enough dancers do not dance a routine, it will leave the program. Fortunately, there is always a new dance waiting in the wings for us to try.

Most cuers work hard to provide us with an enjoyable dance experience. They stand patiently at the microphone cueing our favorite dances while we have the fun on the floor. They usually do a flawless job, but oops, this time a measure was left out of your favorite dance. We all know it's easy to find fault, but remember, nobody is perfect. Be patient with a cuer or instructor, since he or she has spent many hours helping to make our dancing more pleasurable. So what's a mistake now and then?

There are many things, of which I am becoming aware, that contribute to being a happy, successful round dancer. There are magazines, manuals, festivals and talking to other dancers, all the while remembering we must keep our goals realistic and learn to be patient along the way. A fellow round dancer, who has been dancing happily for many years, suggests we think of the round dancing activity as one in which we can continue learning as long as we wish to learn, but an activity in which we will never know all — who would want to? And remember patience — to paraphrase Longfellow:

"Let us then be up and dancing,  
With a heart for any fate,  
Still achieving, still advancing,  
Learn to labor and to wait."

# SQUARE DANCING 'DOWN UNDER'

During the month of April we had the opportunity to lead a group of a dozen dancers on a square dancer's tour of the South Pacific — Australia, New Zealand and Tahiti. This month, and next, we'll share with you our impressions of the sights, the people, and the dancing "down under".

If the caller announces that the next "bracket" will start with a "round-up", chances are that you are about to enjoy the experience of square dancing, Australia style. But don't panic, for once you get through your first "round-up" (a grand march-like method for forming squares) and start the "bracket" (the Australian term for a tip), you'll find that the calls and styling make you feel right at home. But be prepared for a long "bracket" — it may well include a patter and two "singers".

Square and round dancing are very popular activities in Australia. There are nearly 250 clubs in the country and many fine callers. Calling in Australia is more of a hobby than a profession — very few callers receive direct payment for their services, and many clubs seem to have more than one caller among their members.

The popular level is Mainstream, with a fair amount of all position dancing. The dancers are very capable, and the calling is interesting and varied. What the dancers all seem to do with great enthusiasm is have FUN! If a Left Allemande is with a different corner than expected, consider it a mixer — and with the use of round-ups to start most tips, a different partner is hardly noticed.

Speaking of Allemande Left — in many areas of Australia you'll find

that Allemande Left, Turn Thru and other moves that we do here as forearm turns are done "pigeon wing" — that's hands up, the way we do a Swing Thru. After we discovered that the Australians use the "hands up" styling, at the next dance we were all prepared — only to find out that the club we were visiting had decided to adjust to "American" styling — forearm turns — to accommodate us!

During our tour of Australia we had the pleasure of dancing with clubs in three cities: Cairns, Brisbane and Melbourne. In all cases the dances were "specials", with members from several clubs visiting to welcome the American callers and dancers.

A note about visiting clubs in other countries: if you know the dates you will be in a city, contact a local club or caller and inquire about dances. We wrote to seven club presidents or callers, hoping to be able to arrange three or four dances. We received invitations back from all seven locations — those callers or clubs who had classes or other conflicts had referred our requests to others!

Our first stop on the tour was in Cairns, Australia. Our square dance contact, Cam Tarrant, and other members of the Coral Coasters Square and Round Dance Club were on hand Friday morning at the airport for a surprise welcome (at 7 a.m.!!) when our flight arrived from the U.S. (We did keep them waiting a few minutes while Thalia and Denny Wayne had the pleasure of being the only people on the tour to have their bags searched!)

The host club for our Cairns dance, the Coasters overwhelmed us with their hospitality. In addition to

greeting us at the airport, club members met us at our hotel on Saturday evening, drove us to the dance in Edmonton, several miles south of Cairns, provided an outstanding Australian "supper" after the dance, and provided the return transport to the hotel at the end of a fantastic evening.

In what was to evolve as the typical pattern for our "down under" dances, Honey was joined on the evening's calling program by Keith Ferguson, who was also traveling as a member of our tour, and by a number of local callers and cuers. Round dancing is an integral part of square dancing in Australia and New Zealand, and the rounds are usually cued by the callers.

We suspect the club was relieved to see that bloodshot eyes and bleary smiles were not our group's normal appearance (except for Tom Karl, of course) — we had been "on the road" for nearly eighteen hours when the Coasters met us at the airport. Having left SFO on Qantas (yes, the correct spelling) on Wednesday at 9 p.m., we stopped in Honolulu, then lost a day crossing the dateline (and the Equator) as we celebrated Meg Ferguson's birthday on the lo-o-o-ong 10 hour flight into Cairns. By the time we arrived on Friday morning we were all suffering from advanced cases of jet lag.

Cairns was WARM! Located in the tropics, the region is a popular winter seaside resort reminiscent of Florida. In April (fall in Australia), the temperatures and humidity are still rather high and the tropical bugs abound. In fact, at the dance, Honey started the evening calling beneath an overhead fan, but quickly moved when she discovered the downdraft was "divebombing" bugs into her hair! By the way, we were somewhat confused by the different pronunciations of "Cairns" which we heard, but it became

clear when one young lady explained, "It' easy, it's pronounced Cairns — just like "tin cane"!"

The next day, Easter Sunday, we traveled by motor launch to a diving platform anchored over the famed Great Barrier Reef. The reef is a truly spectacular sight, nearly worth the trip to Australia by itself. Even though we were many miles from shore in the Coral Sea, as the tide went out we were able to stand and "walk on the water".

On Easter Monday, also a holiday in Australia, we flew 1400 kilometers south to Brisbane, the capital of the state of Queensland. A large (1,000,000 population) and modern city, Brisbane is called "the sunshine Capital of Australia" and lived up to it's name during our stay.

In each city we visited there was at least one highlight. In Cairns it had been the Barrier Reef, and in Brisbane it was the animals (and the ice cream — more about that later) on our visit to the Lone Pine Koala

Sanctuary. Koalas, kangaroos, wombats and wallabees — we saw, fed and petted them all!

Our contact for dancing in Brisbane was Eric Wendell, caller for the Wheeling 8's club. Unfortunately, when we arrived in Brisbane we found that Eric was in the hospital awaiting surgery. Eric's wife Dot stepped in and, with the assistance of several other callers and clubs, the dance went on as scheduled. We were honored to find that many of the clubs in the area were represented at the dance, including dancers from the Tablelands area many miles to the north of Brisbane. Elva Hoppe, cuer for the Carousel Round Dance Club,

had even cancelled her club night to make Christchurch Hall in nearby Milton available for our dance.

From Brisbane we traveled across the Tasman Sea to New Zealand for a twelve-day tour of the North and South Islands. Our son Bryce thought it was great to be able to celebrate his twelfth birthday in two countries and three cities (Brisbane, plane change in Sydney, and Auckland, New Zealand). We'll report on the sights, and the three dances, in New Zealand next month.

On Sunday, April 21, we returned across the Tasman to Sydney, Australia... and to the rain!! Up to this point the weather had been nearly perfect, but our good fortune



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was overdue to end. We consoled ourselves with tours of the Rocks (sight of the birthplace of Australia) and the amazing Sydney Opera House, which must truly be seen to be believed. The ladies in the group managed to keep us out of the rain by spending all available time shopping for opals. I must admit that I saw an unset Black Opal that I considered buying — until I found out that the price was A\$160,000. (A\$ means Australian dollars — at the time one A\$ was equal to about seventy cents U.S.) Of course, with the savings in export tax, the favorable exchange rate, and the discount for tour groups, it would have only been US\$80,000...

With a population of 3,500,000, Sydney is the largest city in Australia, and also the financial and business center of the country. The city also has the wildest cab drivers in Australia. We discovered this on the night we went to our "Home-Hosted Dinner", a unique feature for tourists in both Australia and New Zealand. For a fee (usually included in the tour cost), a local Sydney family hosts a dinner party for one or more couples from the group. We enjoyed an evening of food, wine and conversation with an architect and his family in their home overlooking Sydney harbor. Tom and Sherry Karl and Keith and Meg Ferguson had an interesting welcome — their hostess had forgotten the date and was caught a bit off guard when her young son answered the door (wearing his bathrobe) and escorted the two couples into her kitchen. When she turned and saw the visitors in her kitchen, she simply said, "And who is it I'm looking at?" We understand that she recovered nicely and served up a great meal for the fourteen (?) at the table!

By the time we arrived in Sydney we had been on the tour for 19 days, and the combination of early morning departures, long days of sightseeing and shopping, and colds from the weather changes had left our group "tuckered out". We had been invited to visit a club dance in Sydney, but, with great regrets, had to decline the invitation. Having

the evening off also gave Glen McCabe the opportunity to take June to the Sydney Tower for an Anniversary dinner

Our last stop in Australia was in Melbourne, a city which competes in size (3,000,000) and spirit with Sydney. Our itinerary included three highlights in Melbourne — visits to Phillip Island, to Sovereign Hill, and to the Essendon Squares.

Phillip Island, located about 80 miles south of Melbourne, is the home of the Fairy Penguin. Each night at sunset these small animals "march" out of the sea in large groups, cross the wide sandy beaches, and return to their burrows in the sand dunes for the night. The site is a protected National Park, but special viewing areas have been established and each night scores of tour busses travel to Phillip Island for the "march".

Sovereign Hill is a re-creation of the site of gold discovery in Australia. Located in the city of Ballarat, about 100 miles northwest of Melbourne, Sovereign Hill includes tours of an underground gold mine, shops and restaurants typical of the period, and actors dressed in appropriate costumes. The mine tour alone was worth the trip. The only injury sustained during the trip occurred at Sovereign Hill. Leota Fisher stepped back quickly to avoid a horse, stepped back again to avoid what another horse had left behind, and lost a battle with a head-high wooden railing! Fortunately, a headache was the extent of the damage and Leota was able to enjoy the rest of the day. Husband Bob suffered an injury to his pride when the fish wouldn't bite in New Zealand, but that's another story.

On our last night in Australia, members of the Essendon Squares met us at our hotel and provided transportation to their club night dance. Because our contact in Melbourne, Bill Pendlebury, did not have a hall available for that evening he had made arrangements with Essendon caller David Hooper to host our group. Bill, and a number of his dancers, along with dancers from many of the other

clubs in the Melbourne area, joined the Essendon Squares in putting on a great dance and "super supper" — Australian style. We can't say enough about the hospitality we received from David, Bill and all the other callers and dancers who so openly welcomed us to their country. All of the good things we had heard about the friendliness of the people in Australia proved to be true — and in the case of Australia square dancers must be experienced to be believed!

Speaking of hospitality, we've mentioned those Australian "suppers" -- a "supper" at an Australian square dance is like a refreshment break at our hoedowns. One club told us of an American group that skipped dinner before a dance in anticipation of the "supper" and hoped we had not done the same. We reassured them that our group **never** skipped a meal for any reason.

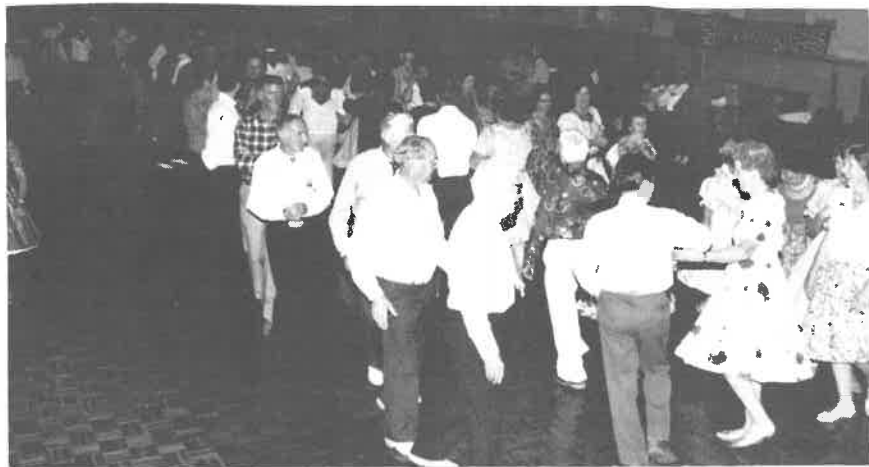
Our tour covered only a small portion of a very large country, focusing on the major population centers located on the continent's east coast. Australia is nearly as large as the United States in physical size, but has a population of only 15,000,000 compared to 236,000,000 in the U.S. Almost half of Australia's population resides in

the four cities we visited.

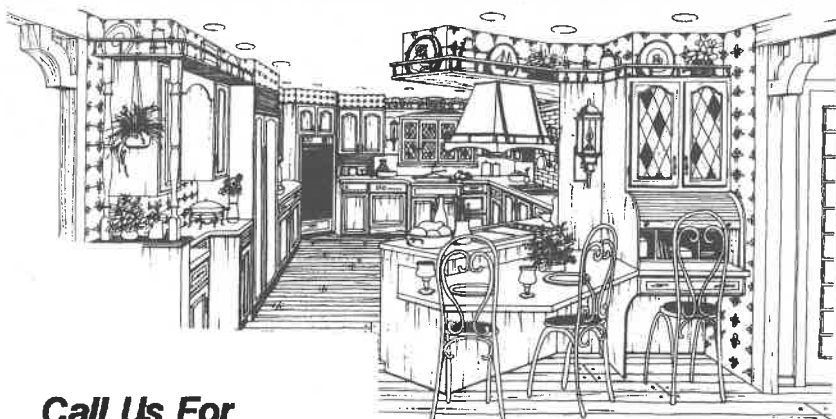
Oh yes, the ice cream story. Each group we travel with seems to have its own unique "thing" — and this group was into ice cream. June McCabe got us started in Brisbane, and by the time we reached Melbourne we had sampled every variety of ice cream available in Australia and New Zealand -- except "Fish & Chips" — we saw that flavor in Rotorua, New Zealand, but I don't recall anyone having the nerve to try it! Bryce's favorite ice cream parlour was in Queenstown, New Zealand where you could by a "six-scooper" — on one cone. As an aside, June also got into collecting stuffed koalas and Glen began to worry that, between the koalas and the petticoat, he might have to give up his seat on the flight home!

Would we go back? YES!!! In fact, we plan to return in 1988, for the Australian Bicentennial Celebration. Special square dance festivals are scheduled in both Brisbane and Sydney. As long as we're there, we could always go on to Perth, and to Ayers Rock, and to the Opal mines at Coober Pedy, and to...
