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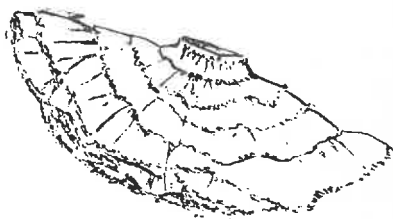

The trouble I have with Marvin's letter is that he only alludes to a solution to the problem. Some excerpts from his letter: "If there are a group of conditions (and there

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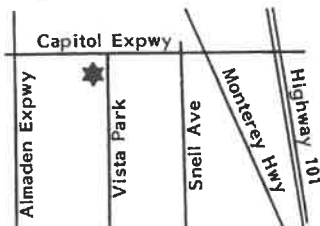
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"OUR" OPINION !

Last week we received a letter from the office of the Postmaster General of the United States. After a year of investigation, the U.S. Postal Service has decided that mail addressed to The Prompter, San Jose 95013, may be subject to delays that cannot be avoided — even though the address is correct.

We now admit defeat. Effective immediately, we will use our home address for all Prompter mail. See the back cover for the new address.

We recently read an article which reviewed the results of the 1985 LEGACY Dancer Survey. In it, the term "greed" was linked to the declining perception of "Leadership", as was a disregard for caller dress codes. With words like these bouncing around, we can't resist jumping in with both feet!

What is a greedy caller? The article related two examples: callers who "double book", and callers who demand excessive fees.

Double booking occurs when a caller agrees to call a dance for one club, then gets a better offer from another club (or festival, or association) and accepts that offer

also. The caller then has the choice of calling the first club and canceling, calling at the last minute and offering a replacement caller due to "illness", or just not showing up. Any of the above actions will tend to leave the caller in a bad light. In fact, done frequently enough they may result in a renewed interest in tar and feathers. (It is possible that double booking could be a result of poor record keeping.)

We agree completely that double booking is inexcusable and very probably motivated by greed. "Excessive" caller fees is a different matter, in our opinion.

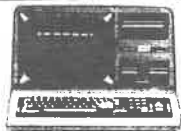
A caller establishes his/her fee; dancers hire callers. If dancers are willing to pay the fee a caller requests, then they must feel they are getting their money's worth. Their alternative is to NOT hire that caller, and instead hire another caller whose fee is more reasonable (reasonable being a subjective term).

If dancers (clubs, associations, festivals) have the choice of who to hire (and they certainly do), and

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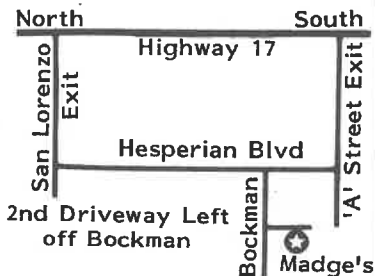
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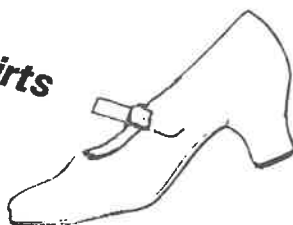

CROCHETED SKIRT

Stella Shilling's crocheted skirt is one-of-a-kind. When your editor saw it at a Belleville, Illinois dance, he asked her to send pictures. Stella's hometown is Centralia, Illinois.

The skirt is worked in filet crochet with approximately 5-6 large balls Coats and Clark Knit Cro-sheen and a size O crochet hook. First get your pattern ready by tracing onto graph paper. Make sure you choose a pattern which doesn't have too much small detail. Everything within the tracing will be closed squares (2dc) and everything outside is open squares (dc, ch1).

Work a waistband of sc the size of your waist plus 2 inches for overlap, leaving a button hole on right end. When band is as wide as you prefer, end on left end and do not break off. Mark off into six sections.

Row 1: Starting at end without button-hole, ch 5 dc in same st, ch 1, sk 1 sc dc in next sc, work across, increasing at marks with (dc, ch 3, dc in same st). Work to within 2" of end of band, dc, ch 2, dc in same st, ch 5, turn.

Row 2: Dc in ch, ch 1, dc in next dc, ch 1, dc in next dc, work across, increasing with (dc in dc, ch 1, dc in ch 3, ch 1, dc in ch 3, ch 1 dc in next dc) work to end, dc in last dc, ch 1 dc in ch 5 ch 1, dc in ch 5, ch 5 turn.

Repeat these 2 rows until skirt measures 7", join ends with a sl st and start working in rounds, adding pattern.

When skirt length is reached at increases, break off. You will need to fill in at the bottom of each "gore" separately by working in rows and leaving off a few squares from each end of each row, whatever is needed to even out skirt length all around. When this is done to all gores, work one row of dc around bottom to finish off. Add one large button at waist and a row of small buttons to side closing. Belt backing was sewn onto inside of waist band to prevent stretching. Stella says she made the skirt because she wanted one she could change with the color of slip worn under it. Making the skirt took six weeks of evening work. The planning stage took longer. The skirt must be hand laundered, then starched with a medium solution and laid out to block and dry.



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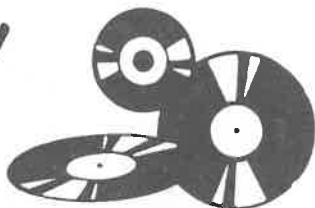

Lots of "new" news this month! First, Malco Modes is now producing a "Sparkling Crystal" fabric slip. It has their wonderful, cotton, adjustable yoke. This fabric is imported from Japan and the slip companies have it dyed the colors they want. The Malco slip now comes in seven colors, and will soon be available in all their standard colors.

Also, you men who have been hunting for a 1/4" black gingham shirt — they are available from Malco Modes, your square dance store can order them for you if they don't stock them

Jean Hardy Patterns used to have more square dance patterns than are now available and we have been able to obtain two of them. One pattern has a midriff that curves up under the arm (like the old, discontinued Advance pattern), but this one also has a set-in sleeve. The second pattern has a double flared, full, cap sleeve and can be made with a detachable front panel to change the looks of the bodice. We also have some of Jean Hardy's triangular bib-front men's shirt patterns that have been unavailable for a long time.

Authentic's new pattern (328) is also a midriff style, but with the peasant-type top and a skirt with three loose tiers to be trimmed with

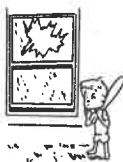
wide lace. They suggest a purchased applique to highlight the midriff... looks like a good holiday pattern.

"Don't Mess with my Toot Toot"!! Blue Star has scooped everyone and come out with this song within weeks of its debut on all the Country Western stations. A good novelty record. The new Hi Hat round dance record company, HMS Enterprises, is now producing their Merry Go Round label with cues on the flip side — that is sure good news for all of us who like to practice at home.

Nashville Sound and You, the sing-a-long LP's, has released six new records, one of them is an all Elvis Presley LP, #43, and three of them are nostalgic pop music. Album #39 is 50's music, #40 is 60's, and #41 is 70's. You've been asking for them, now you've got 'em.

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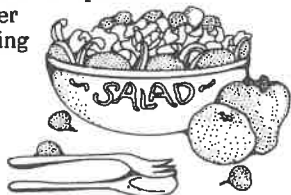
Stir The Bucket With Betty

Welcome back from vacation, y'all! The Barbaras in my life (Hayford and Myers) have shared some great recipes with me for use in the "Bucket" column for this month. These recipes are sure-fire hits for quick fix-ahead meals or club potluck. Bon Appetit!

SPRING HARVEST PASTA SALAD

1/4 lb. fresh green beans
3/4 lb. fresh broccoli
1 small bottle herb salad dressing
4 cups decorative pasta
boiling water
Dijon Dressing
salt



8 medium fresh mushrooms, sliced
1 jar pimientos, drained
1 can sliced ripe olives, drained

DIJON DRESSING

2 Tbsp. Dijon mustard
1/2 cup chopped parsley
1/2 cup chopped red onion
1/3 cup white wine vinegar
1 cup oil (olive, salad, or olive/salad)

Combine all ingredients for Dijon Dressing and mix well. Snap ends off beans and cut into 1" pieces. Cut flowerets from broccoli (save stalks for other uses). Steam beans, covered, on a rack over boiling water for 5 minutes. Add broccoli, cover and steam until vegetables are just tender when pierced, about 2 minutes. Immerse in cold water, cool and drain. Pour herb dressing over vegetables, stir, cover, and chill for up to one day. Cook pasta according to directions until tender to bite. Drain well. In large bowl

combine pasta, Dijon Dressing, and salt to taste. Mix well, cover, and chill at least 6 hours or overnight, stirring often. To pasta, add cooked vegetables, mushrooms, pimientos and olives. Mix well and let stand for at least four hours for flavors to blend, stirring occasionally.

PARTY CHICKEN

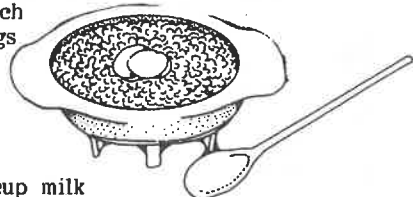
4 whole chicken breasts, boned
8 slices bacon
2 pkgs. smoked beef
2 cans creamy chicken mushroom soup
1 pint sour cream

Cover bottom of greased baking dish with smoked beef. Arrange chicken on beef. Cook bacon and place on chicken pieces. Mix soup and sour cream, pour over chicken and refrigerate (can be made a day ahead and baked the next day). Bake at 250° for 3 hours. (Leftovers make great cold sandwiches!)

1 1/2 tsp. salt

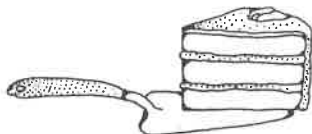
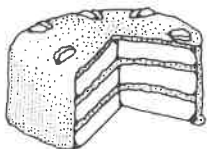
- 1/4 tsp. nutmeg
 1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
 3 cups cooked rice
 2 cups grated sharp cheddar cheese

Cook spinach according to package directions and drain well. Beat eggs and add remaining ingredients except rice and cheese. Mix well. Stir in rice, spinach and cheese. Pour into a 2 quart, buttered casserole dish and bake uncovered for 45 minutes at 350°. Additional cheese may be added on the top for the last 5 minutes of cooking. Serves 6 to 8.

June 26, 27, 28, 1986



When the 35th Annual Square Dance Convention opens in Indianapolis, a main focus for activities launching the affair June 26, 1986, will be the awesome Hoosier Dome, 95,000 square feet of dancing space surrounded by 60,000 seats under a billowing cover of white. Here, plus dancing will inaugurate the convention from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. on opening day.

Not that other halls in the spacious Indianapolis convention complex will be less active.

Basic dancing will begin at the same 9 a.m. starting time in Hall B, only a short stroll, under roof, from the dome floor. Hall B contains 28,500 square feet of dancing space and will also include a solo area.

The Dome and halls will continue being busily occupied until the convention closes June 28, 1986.

Other areas include: Hall A, 26,500 square feet for clogging; Hall C, 30,000 square feet for A-1 and A-2 dancing; Hall D, 26,900 square feet for plus dancing; Hall E, 26,500 square feet for mainstream, and the 500 Ballroom, 13,340 square feet for intermediate rounds and the Showcase of Rounds. Smaller rooms to be used in the facility total an additional 27,848 square feet, including space for contra, youths, easy and high intermedi-

ate-advance rounds.

And still there is plenty of space for the Showcase of Ideas and exhibitors' booths.

The Hoosier Dome and Convention Center is a convenient layout with minimum use of stairs. The Convention Center halls form a shape like the letter L, with the Hoosier Dome cradled inside the letter. Entering from the top of the L, dancers encounter a wide passageway, highlighted by a broad, semi-circular stairway.

The stairs provide one of several avenues to the upper level rooms. Down the hall, the dancer comes face-to-face with Hall B, site of basics dancing; it is flanked by Hall A and Hall C.

A turn to the left leads to Halls D and E, scene of mainstream and plus dancing. Across from these halls is one of the entrances to the Hoosier Dome floor.

The entire complex covers only about one city block.

Dancers will find Halls D and E and the Hoosier Dome nearly spanning new; the convention will come at the end of only the second full year of operation since those areas were added to the Convention Center. The exceptionally wide hallways and convenient, direct routing to the halls will make the

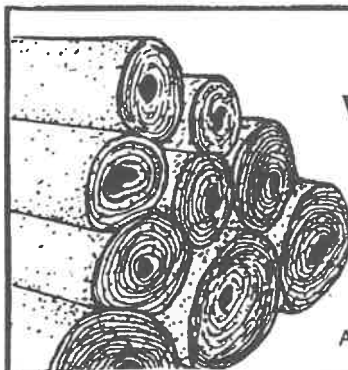
35th Convention a pedestrian's paradise.

Dancing in the Dome during daytime hours will present soft even illumination from daylight diffused through the fabric roof. At night, lights bathe the floor in a glow bright enough to play football as well as square through. From the outside, the lights at night set the dome aglow, announcing to the city that a major event is taking place inside.

The Dome also will be the site of exhibition groups, evening ceremonies and the Saturday fashion show and parade of states. There also will be exhibitions in other halls. The Dome and halls also will be the site of after parties.

The Dome is precisely four blocks from the very heart of Indianapolis. It is diagonally across the street from the Indianapolis Hyatt Regency, one of the city's largest hotels and is connected by a pedestrian walkway to Union Station, the city's newest motel, food and shopping complex, scheduled to open two months before the square dance convention.

The facilities can very comfortably hold the 40,000 dancers expected to attend the convention back home again in Indiana.



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CONVENTION

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Plans are really rolling as the 29th Annual Jubilee is right around the corner. Dates for this year's Jubilee are October 11th, 12th and 13th, 1985. This year's line-up of caller and cuers promises to be the best ever, with greats such as Tony Oxendine, John Marshall, Bronc Wise and a host of local Top Ten callers. Favorites Phil and Lois Atherton from Carson City, Nevada are the featured round dance teachers.

Phil and Lois started square dancing in Southern California in 1965. While still in square dance class, they saw a couple go through a round dance during a refreshment break and... "Got hooked." They immediately joined a round dance class.

In 1973, they moved to Nevada, about halfway between Reno and

Carson City. They joined the Reno Silver Rounds round dance club. Two years later the round dance teachers moved away. Phil and Lois agreed to try to keep the club together for two months while the club found new teachers. That's when they discovered that the months in Nevada are very, very long! They teach round dancing four nights every week and hold a high intermediate advanced workshop one Sunday each month. They spend many weekends every year at round dance workshops having fun either teaching or learning.

Phil works full time as a mechanic for Nevada Highway Patrol while Lois tends to their small ranch. Weekends when they are not out of town, they visit with their children and four grandchildren who live nearby.

Round dancers can look forward to great dancing under the expert guidance of the Athertons and a fine array of local round dance teachers. An excellent program has been planned with something to offer every level of round dancer. Plan to be there!



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BEYOND MAINSTREAM

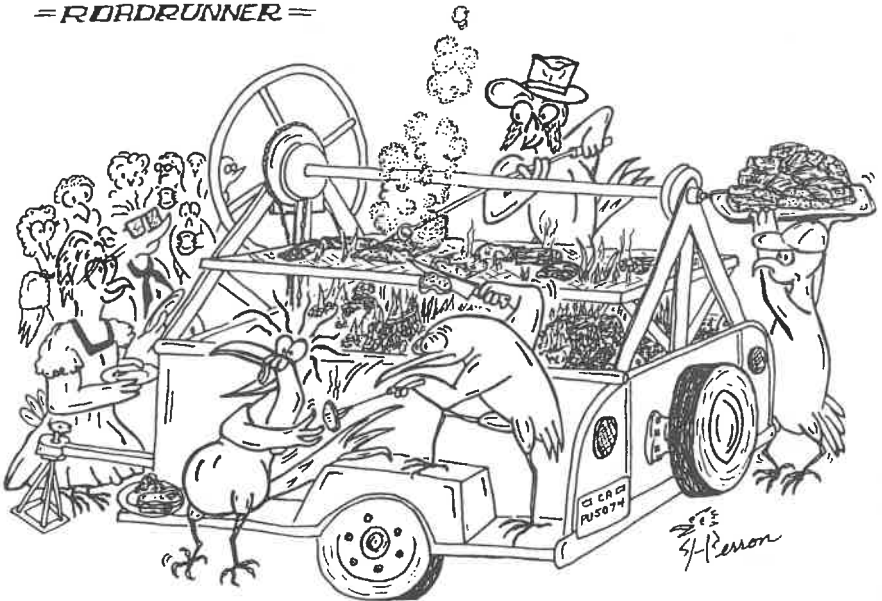
COORDINATE THE GEARS (Plus Quarterly Selection)

DEFINITION

(CALLERLAB August 1985)
Starting formation — Right- (or Left-) Hand Columns. All Circulate 1 1/2 places to form three pairs (column of six) with a lonesome dancer at each end. Without stopping, each lonesome dancer and the adjacent (nearest) pair extend right hands to form two 3-hand stars and, as each star starts to

turn, each of the very center two dancers also extend a right hand to join the star they face, thus blending into two 4-hand stars. Each star turns 3/4 and the new very center dancers Trade with a left hand and then turn the one they meet 3/4 by the right as the other four slide slightly apart to become ends of the final parallel two-faced lines formation. From left-hand columns, the action is reversed (right becomes left and vice versa).

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COORDINATE THE GEARS

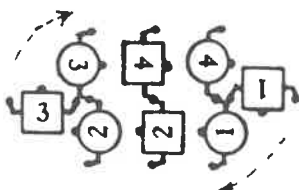
From Sides Lead Right, Circle to a Line, Touch 1/4...



All Circulate 1 1/2 places to form three pairs with a lonesome dancer at each end...

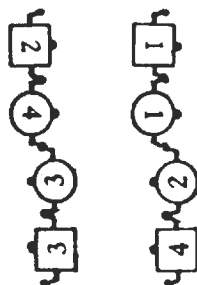
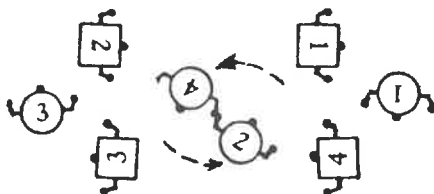


Without stopping, each lonesome dancer and the adjacent (nearest) pair extend right hands to form two 3-hand stars and, as each star starts to turn, each of the very center two dancers also extend a right hand to join the star they face, thus blending into two 4-hand stars...

DANCING HINTS

Coordinate the Gears is the newest Plus Quarterly Selection, and is a combination of some of the actions contained in two of the existing Plus calls — "Coordinate" and "Spin Chain the Gears".

Coordinate the Gears starts like a "Coordinate", but after the 1 1/2 Circulates, the original #4 column dancers (most often men), instead of meeting in the middle and doing a Trade, continue to move forward and join the three dancers in the star ahead of them. Since the instinct for the #4 dancers to "Trade" (as in Coordinate) when they meet is very strong, it helps if these dancers never actually join hands, but rather only lightly slap hands as they pass one another on their way into the stars.

The move then continues in a manner similar to "Spin Chain the Gears". The stars turn 3/4 (from the point that the three-hand stars are formed), the new very center dancers Trade then Cast 3/4 with the one they meet, while the other dancers slide apart to become the ends of the forming lines. Remember that, unlike "Spin Chain the Gears", the dancers who slide apart do not turn back.



The International Association of Round Dance Teachers

ROUND DANCE SURVEY

3,241 surveys were returned from round dancers all over the world including over 300 from Canadian dancers and 190 from Australia, New Zealand, Saudi Arabia and West Germany.

The majority of round dancers are in the 50-65 age group with over 92% having square danced. The average round dancer answering the survey had square danced for more than ten years and had been round dancing for almost eight years. 80% belonged to a round dance club with 79% dancing at the Easy Intermediate levels, 57% at the Intermediate levels, and almost 26% at the High Intermediate, or higher, levels.

While over 28% learned their basics of round dancing at a square dance club, 74% had also attended a basic class of round dance instruction. Over half had attended an intermediate class. Slightly over 35% had also taken some form of ballroom instruction, either privately or with YMCA and adult education groups. More than half attend square dance festivals.

The dancers showed a strong dislike of round dancing to tapes and cued records, and a mild dislike for records with vocals and memorizing sequences. Many commented that vocals are too loud and they find it difficult to listen to two or more voices simultaneously.

The round dancer's greatest pleasure, besides just the enjoyment of round dancing itself, was being with friends and leaders cueing rounds. Pleasure was also expressed in learning new figures, the exercise, learning new rhythms and just plain getting out. Mild pleasure was new acquaintances, the challenge of rounds, cost and clothes.

Comments were received on about ten percent of all the surveys. Most of them dealt with new dances and level of dances. It was the feeling of most dancers that there are too many new dances and that most of the new dances don't stay around very long. Some of the comments suggested that Classics should be taught, better quality of dances at lower levels are needed, and that more different rhythms be used. Comments also pointed out that the level is too high for the length of time a dance stays around.

The next largest number of comments dealt with standards. Most of those wanted cues standardized and dances cued the same way. Some comments dealt with teaching techniques. Quite a few expressed appreciation for their teachers. Some have to travel long distances to round dance and wished there were more round dance teachers.

Some dancers expressed views that are food for thought. A number of people expressed a need for a national ROM/ROQ. Others wanted manuals which list, explain and diagram movements for the ROUNDALAB Phases, and a Teaching Progression or Schedule for new round dance leaders.

ROUNDALAB thanks all who took the time to answer the survey and is carefully evaluating the results in light of its current programs on Standardization, Phase Rating System, Cue Word Standardization, Video Tape Committee, Teacher Training Program, and Teaching Progression Manuals.

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PROMPTER PROFILE

Millard & June McKinney

Millard and June McKinney, joining The Prompter staff this month as Round Dance Editors, have enjoyed a broad range of dancing experience.

Millard, born in Astoria, Oregon, and June, from Oakland, California, met while learning to dance on ice, at the Oakland Ice Rink, while both were still in high school. They were married in 1943 in Key West Florida, where Millard was serving in the Navy during World War II. After the war they returned to the West Coast where they continued to develop their expertise in ice skating, becoming judges in the U.S. Figure Skating Association.

In 1965, after daughter Karen had married and son Peter had joined the Navy, the McKinneys found they had time for a new activity (after some serious falls on the ice, both had decided they were ready for a less strenuous form of dancing) — square dancing. At a hoedown they discovered that "it's indeed a small world" — the round dance cuers, Ray and Jean Hanna, were old friends from their ice skating days. Discovering that it

was a natural transition from ice dancing to round dancing, they soon began a round dance basics class with the Hannas. The McKinneys continued to dance on ice as well. For more than two years they ice skated from 5 to 7 p.m., then traveled a few miles to round dance with Clark and Maxine Smith's Silver Slippers from 8 to 10 p.m.

By 1970 round dancing had become a major interest. Millard started cueing rounds for Larry Ward's B-Sharps of San Francisco, and the McKinneys' involvement in the round dance world has been increasing ever since.

In addition to their very successful local clubs, the Diamond Rounds, Millard and June travel extensively. They have been featured cuers at the Monterey Square Dance Festival, the Oroville Golden Fiesta, Sonora Springtime, Lake Tahoe Jamboree, and San Diego Fiesta de la Quadrilla. They have also appeared at five National Square Dance Conventions, and have served as round dance chairman at the Golden State Round-Up and the California State Square Dance

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Convention. They have also been assistant round dance chairman at the SCVSDA Jubilee.

The McKinnys' cueing credits outside the continental U.S. read like a travel brochure: Hawaii, Australia, New Zealand, Fiji, Japan, China, Egypt, Greece, Italy, France, Netherlands, Germany, Austria and Great Britain. They have also lead round dance groups on cruises to the Caribbean, Alaska and the Panama Canal.

Millard and June are active members of ROUNDALAB, UDRC, both Northern and Southern California Round Dance Teachers Associations, and both NorCal and Santa Clara Valley Callers Associations. Millard is a past-president of both NCRDTA and SCVCA.

The McKinnys have choreographed several round dances, including: "Easy Strollin'" (1975), "Forever More" (1977), "Texas Waltz" (1982) and "Think Summer" (1983).

A special thanks to Jack and Ione Kern, who have served as Prompter Round Dance Editors since August 1984. Jack and Ione's efforts have helped to make The Prompter a "well-rounded" publication.

Millard is a "retiring" person. After retiring from a career in the U.S. Navy, Millard started a second career with Friden and Singer Business Machines. He began as a field engineer, moved up to educational specialist, and became manager of computer support, the position he held when he retired for a second time in 1976. However, Millard and June are not planning a third retirement anytime soon — they are having too much fun with round dancing. What they are planning is more cueing, more travel, and more fun. We look forward to their contributions to The Prompter.

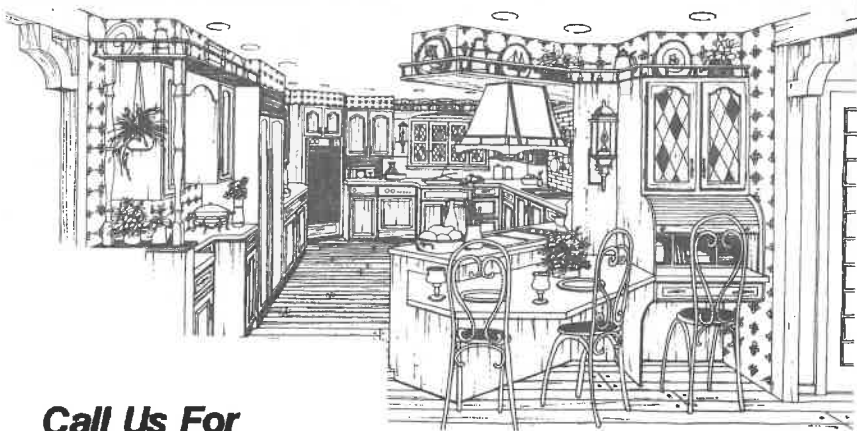
On People, Clubs, and Events

SQUARE DANCING 'DOWN UNDER'

By Chuck and Honey Wolfson



PART 2: NEW ZEALAND

Last April we, along with a group of square dancers, toured the South Pacific. In last month's Prompter we described our adventures in Australia — this month we complete our story with our impressions of New Zealand and Tahiti.

We had arrived "down under" on Friday, April 5th, and spent a few days in Cairns and Brisbane, Australia. On Wednesday, April 10th, we flew across the Tasman Sea to Auckland where we began our visit to the islands of New Zealand. (After hearing the "locals" pronounce Auckland as "Oakland", we weren't surprised to learn that, a week earlier, a young sailor from Los Angeles had boarded a flight he thought would take him to Oakland, only to discover that he was on an Air New Zealand flight bound for Auckland!)

We were met at the airport by our Mt. Cook Landlines driver, Malcolm, who was to be our "Coach Captain" for our motor coach tour of the North Island. Malcolm proved to be a real jewel -- he was knowledgeable, helpful and friendly, and frequently went out of his way to accommodate special requests from members of the group.

New Zealand consists of three islands: the North Island, South Island and Stewart Island (a very small island off the southern tip of the South Island). Three-quarters of New Zealand's three million residents live on the North Island; with one-quarter of the country's population residing in Auckland and its suburbs. All of Auckland is visible (and an impressive sight)

from the top of Mt. Eden, an extinct volcano located in the center of the city and the first stop on our tour the next morning. Our tour of the city ended at the War Memorial Museum where we saw one of Tom Karl's ancestors, the now extinct eight-foot-tall ostrich-like "Moa" bird, and the museum's famed collection of native Maori artifacts.

Thursday evening we were met at our hotel by members of Auckland's North Shore Square and Round Dance Club who drove us to the dance being held in our honor. Host caller Vern Anderson, taw Jean, and their dancers were joined by callers and members of several other area clubs (like the "Haere Mai" Hoedowners and the Waimarie Squares — not exactly your run-of-the-mill square dance club names) as well as from clubs as far away as Tauranga. We particularly liked the name of the local round dance club, "Southern Cross", and the title given to the club's cuer, John Stallard. He's known as the "leader/tutor". We had the pleasure of dancing rounds to John's cueing twice — he took advantage of a business trip to the South Island to join us at the dance in Christchurch the following week. The hospitality, the calling and the dancing were all outstanding -- as was another terrific "supper"!

On Friday, April 12th, we drove south out of Auckland through Te Awamutu and Otorohanga, whose names reflect the Maori heritage of the area, to Waitomo, site of the Glow Worm Grotto. The caves of the Grotto are illuminated by millions of tiny glow worms, clearly visible if you remain quiet as you

glide through the caves in small boats.

After our Grotto tour we returned to Te Awamutu where we were met by a group of New Zealand farm families — we were about to experience a "New Zealand Farmstay". The group was split up, spending that afternoon and night on different farms, with a farm-style (also known as "good and lots of it!") dinner and breakfast included.

Honey, Bryce and I were hosted by Allan and Pat Jackson, proprietors of "Warick Lea", a 120 hectare farm which supports 100 head of dairy cattle, 160 head of beef cattle, and a small herd of sheep (which we suspect is now one sheep smaller — we had the best lamb dinner we've ever eaten). When Allan went out to round up the cows for evening milking, Honey and Bryce provided a willing hand while I settled for photographing the action. After Bryce got his first experience at milking a cow "by hand", Allan used his automated milking equipment to milk the 100 head in less than an hour. During dinner, Pat, who is the coordinator for the farmstay program in the Te Awamutu area, told us that the program is becoming very popular. We can certainly understand why — it was a rare opportunity to experience a different life style and get a chance to talk to the local people.

When our group met the next morning, the reports were all the same: the location, the facilities, the food and hospitality were all

first-rate. Everyone in the group agreed that our farmstay on Friday night was the greatest highlight of the entire 26-day trip. The only complaint was that we couldn't spend at least a week on the farms.

Saturday afternoon we continued our motor coach journey southward to Rotorua, an active geothermal area and home of the Maori culture in New Zealand. The Maoris, the native New Zealanders, now share in the government of the Islands with the Europeans who "settled" the area. We enjoyed tours of a model Maori village, the Whakarewarewa (ask Denny Wayne how you pronounce that one!) Thermal Reserve, the Rainbow Trout Springs and the Agrodome, where we saw an expert demonstration of sheep sheering.

The Sheepskin Shop at the Agrodome was especially popular (as were any and all shops during the tour). The New Zealand dollar (NZ\$), which a few years ago was worth more than our dollar, was valued at only US\$ 0.45 during our visit, making the shopping a real bargain.

On Saturday night it was square dance time, with transportation from our hotel provided by the host Sulphur City Square Dance Club. Their caller and taw, Terry and Colleen Hefferen, welcomed us to the dance, where we were joined by members and callers from the JS Square & Round Dance Club and the Orange City squares, both from nearby Tauranga. We enjoyed the opportunity to dance again with members of the Orange City club who had been at the dance in

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Auckland. Another great group of square dancers, another great supper, another few pounds — oh, well!!

On Sunday morning several members of the group planned to try their hands at fishing the "trout filled" waters of Lake Rotorua. Denny Wayne wanted to be sure Tom Karl didn't "miss the boat", so he called Tom's room at a very, very early hour. He was rewarded with a male voice which assured him, "Yes, we're up!" — but it wasn't Tom! In that hotel the room number and phone number were not the same.

Bryce was the only lucky fisherman in the group, landing an 18-inch, two and one-half pound trout that became lunch for he and his "boat-mates". That trout is considered small in New Zealand; 3 pounds is average, and 10 pounds and up is not uncommon! Actually, our group had another successful fisherman, but for some reason Glen McCabe chose not to be photographed with his "remarkable" catch — Glen also did not provide any data on size. (We understand he had to throw it back because it was under the size limit — and 1 inch is pretty far under!)

Several members of the group took advantage of the ideal weather on Sunday for an optional helicopter flight to a nearby crater while our ever-helpful driver, Malcolm, arranged for a friend to open yet another wool shop for some last-minute shopping. Everyone found the sheepskin rugs and hand-knit wool sweaters to be irresistible!

We spent our final evening on the North Island at a traditional Maori "Hangi" feast and concert. The food and entertainment were both well done — and Tom Karl stole the show with a traditional native greeting!

On Monday we had our first experience with Mt. Cook Airlines. The life style in New Zealand is very casual and the local airline fits right in. The aircraft are 44 seat British Hawker Siddeley jet-props, and when all 44 seats are sold the flight attendants have to sit on the baggage in the rear of

the plane. Security is unknown — there were no metal detectors at the gates and on the flight south the pilot opened the cockpit door, inviting the passengers to enjoy the view over his shoulder! On a later flight (we were the only passengers), the flight attendants were discovered sleeping in the front seats — and they slept right through the "fasten seat belts" light during the landing!

Monday through Wednesday nights were spent in the resort village of Queenstown on the South Island. One full day was spent on a trip to the incredibly beautiful Milford Sound in Fiordland National Park. The most memorable experience on the south island had to be the launch trip that day on Milford Sound into the open Tasman Sea — in a driving rainstorm. The sheer glacial cliffs of the Fiordland were covered with waterfalls — waterfalls that never reached the sea because the winds blew them upward!

Our fishermen took advantage of some free time at Queenstown to try "one more time". After all, just standing on the dock Bob Fisher could see 10 to 15 pound trout in the lake waters below. While Denny did manage to catch a respectable sized fish, Bob was overheard saying, "Never again!"

The most spectacular view of Queenstown was from the Skyline Chalet Restaurant, high on a mountain top overlooking the city. The trip to the top was made in a chairlift gondola, a memorable experience in itself. Maybe next time Honey will try uncovering her eyes. The view and the buffet dinner (another "few" pounds!!) were great. In fact, the dessert table alone made the trip worthwhile for Keith Ferguson.

Thursday afternoon we flew from Queenstown to Mount Cook National Park on a Mt. Cook Airlines flight, which was met by a Mt. Cook Landlines bus (the Mt. Cook Company has a bit of a monopoly in the islands). After boarding the bus for the ride to the hotel, we found we were missing a driver. I went looking and learned he would be

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with us in a while — right after he helped the pilot load the luggage and service the aircraft for the outbound flight, etc., etc.

We had been scheduled to take a flightseeing ride over the snowcovered Southern Alps to land on the nearby glaciers in (yes, you guessed it, Mt. Cook Airlines) ski-planes, but the flights were cancelled due to poor weather. Everyone was disappointed, especially Meg Ferguson who could hardly wait to climb into a small six-passenger plane and play tag with a glacier. Weather conditions did not change the forecast which, as usual, was "fine".

Our last stop in New Zealand was in Christchurch, home of Art Shepherd and the Cathedral Squares. Art and Blanche came to Christchurch from Canada nearly 25 years ago and are credited with introducing square and round dancing to New Zealand. The Cathedral Squares is a very large club, meeting several nights each week to square and round dance at different levels. Our Saturday night dance was a "special", which describes how the wonderful dancers and callers in New Zealand made us feel with their ever-warm hospitality and friendship.

Christchurch was also our "last-gasp" at shopping for New Zealand bargains — and the group made the most of it. If we had not been able to ship most of the items home, we might have had to have something larger than a 747 just to hold the souvenirs. One souvenir almost caused Tom Karl some problems: he

purchased an authentic "All Black" rugby shirt, then was advised not to wear it in Christchurch because of expected demonstrations against the team's planned trip to South Africa.

From Christchurch we returned to Australia, then on to Tahiti. There was no square dancing in Tahiti, but no one seemed to mind. The beautiful lagoons, clear skies and lack of swimming attire at the beaches provided fun and entertainment for all!

Here in the U.S. we tend to think of Australia and New Zealand as one — Australia/New Zealand — because from our perspective, 7000 miles away, they are close neighbors. We learned that these two countries, and their people, can be very different in many ways. Australia is a large country with many large cities and a faster pace to life, while New Zealand is a small country of mostly small towns and farms (there may only be 3,000,000 people but there are 70,000,000 sheep!) and a more relaxed, rural lifestyle. Everyone we came in contact with in both countries — square dancers, tour guides, farmers, waiters (but not all taxi drivers) — went out of their way to make us feel welcome and comfortable. And we can't wait to go back for Australia's bicentennial in 1988!

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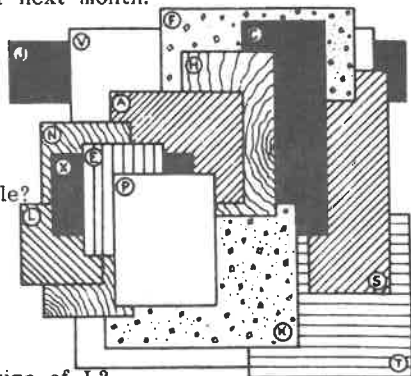

are) that push people out of the clubs and out of square dancing, then it is an exercise in futility to try to get more new people in, as long as these conditions persist for, by definition, they will just push these new people out, too, so what have you gained? The solution you gave is the popular one, I grant, the one always given by those organizations and people who have appointed themselves to run square dancing; this is, the people who have created those problems." His solution appears to be that the clubs have to get rid of the people who are causing the problems. A gesture I don't agree with, but in any case, the implementation could be worse than the "disease". What is your club doing to hold on to the dancers they have and to attract newcomers to the activity???

The dancing at the Santa Clara County Fair was great. I understand there was a good amount of interest from the non-dancing audience every night. With the starting of new classes this month, let's hope some

of this interest is translated into new dancers.

And speaking of new dancers, it's time for my annual "soapbox" bit about supporting the numerous beginners' classes that are starting this month. If your club is sponsoring a class, volunteer your services to help make that class a success. It's easy and it's fun.

Betty and I recently attended the annual TNT's Dynamite Weekend in Sacramento. This is the weekend that I told you last year not to miss if you enjoy Advanced and Challenge dancing. This year Dave Stevens joined the already prestigious staff of Ron Libby and Johnny Preston, a triple barreled combination that made for some great dancing. I was very pleased to see that the attendance increased to over twenty-five squares. When you've got a good thing it pays to advertise. They also added the C-2 level this year and this hall consistently had six or more square dancing. Hope to see you there next year.

agree in advance to the fee, then why are there complaints about greedy callers.

Consider the following scenario: the East Overshoe Twirlers have heard about the great caller, Bigpockets Mikemouth, and just have to have him for their anniversary dance. They feel a slight twinge when they learn his fee is 75% of the gross with a \$600.00 minimum (plus round trip airfare!), but decide that anyone that great is worth the money. Besides, he's booked solid for the next two years so he must be great.

Three years later the long awaited night finally arrives, the great Bigpockets is going to call in East Overshoe! One of three things can happen: One, the dance is a roaring success — the hall is full, everyone has a great time, the Twirlers pay expenses, make a profit and everyone goes away happy. Two, the dance is a roaring

success, etc., etc., but the Twirlers realize that, while they made a profit, Bigpockets made more than THREE TIMES as much as they did. Boy, is he a GREEDY CALLER! The third possibility, the dance doesn't even draw flies. Perhaps Bigpockets has lost his following, or perhaps the Twirlers did a poor job of promoting the dance. Whatever the reason, the Twirlers have that \$600.00 minimum (plus airfare) to pay. Boy is he a GREEDY CALLER.

Caller's fees, as well as caller dress codes, are subject to a free market system. As long as dancers will pay to dance to a caller, no matter what he/she wears, dancers will hire those callers at the rates they think they can afford. Callers are kind of like baseball players — they will ask for what they think they are worth. And the dancers who hire callers are like baseball owners — what they are willing to pay establishes what a caller IS worth!!

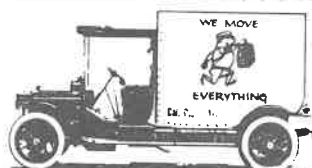

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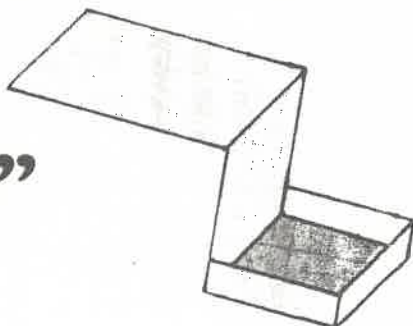
