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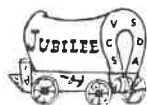
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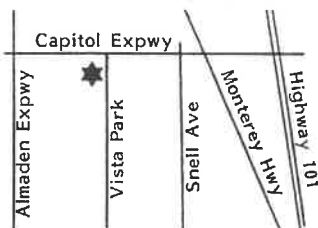


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"OUR" OPINION !

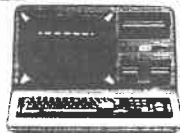

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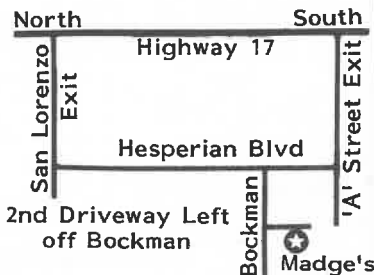
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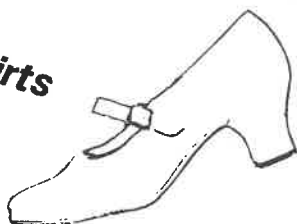

"Proper square dance attire is required ..." That is appearing more and more often on fliers and programs.

What's "proper"?

It may be a little difficult to define in some cases and in some areas of the country, but generally, the consensus of opinion is basically in agreement.

As far as men are concerned, long-sleeved shirts are the unwritten Must. Western is the style preferred, although that is dictated by local fashion. Western trousers, too, are "in" and "dress-up" westerns are preferred to jeans.

Back in the '40's, in the southwest, all the fellows wore boots. Dance boots, some found were more comfortable than riding boots. During the '50's and '60's, many men found softer, leather-soled shoes easier to dance in. Present status: wear what's comfortable for you.

Same goes for the gals. You have to take as many steps as your male counterpart, so be sure your shoes are comfortable.

Thirty years ago, we wore ballet slippers, or flats that went with our floor-length dresses. More recently, some of the ladies have found dance shoes with a slightly elevated heel quite danceable, especially for rounds. But girls, no high heels! I can recommend good square dance insurance, and it covers ankle breaks while square dancing.

Our dresses, ladies, leave lots of room for creativity. A fitted bodice and a full skirt have a multitude of variations.

Don't ask me how long a "proper" skirt should be. I'd say that depends on your own anatomy and your husband's opinion. Some youngsters look "cute" in tu-tu lengths. But most men prefer knee-length skirts on their ladies, according to consensus.

However, it is the bouffant petticoat that is the square dancing "badge" of the distaff side. There, too, you have a choice of fullness, which may be adjusted to your own taste.

Today's miracle fabrics, the myriad of colors and designs, make it possible to be thoroughly creative in your square dance apparel. So, even though your dress is "proper", you can express your own preferences.

Are there occasions where we don't "dress" for the square dance?

In winter resort areas, like the Valley of the Sun, for instance, casual clothes are acceptable for daytime classes and workshops. But long sleeves, boys. And save the club tee shirts for campouts.

Most summer camps and institutes require square dance attire both day and evening. And all festival and convention events are "dress-ups", as well as evening dances. So, when in doubt, wear "proper square dance attire."

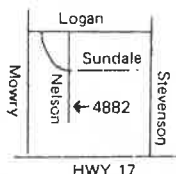


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CHALLENGE



★ CORNER

DBD? What does it really mean to you? To some, it means "Dance By Definition". To others, it means "dance by directions". Many dancers who attempt to reach the Advanced and Challenge levels never realize that "if you don't know the definition, you don't know the call". Let's try a little quiz here. Get a piece of paper and a pencil and we are ready to go. Without thinking about it for more than a few seconds, write down the entire action required by all the positions in the square for the call Spin the Windmill. Now write down all the moves required to do a Relay the Shadow. Too hard? Then write down all of the action for the figure Load the Boat, or Spin Chain Thru. How about Spin Chain the Gears?

See what I mean? If it took you more than the time to start moving your pencil to come up with exactly what the centers and ends do, and so on for each of the figures above, you really don't know the definitions of these figures. Therefore, you are always relying on the other people in the square to help you get where you are supposed to be. If you are dancing in the Challenge level and you are in a phantom formation, relying on others will not always help you because they are not always there to rely on. Also, when you are actually dancing in real time, you have only a fraction of a second for response time to begin doing the figure. Unless, of course, you are a floater who waits to see what is going on before you start to do your part. Then — you will probably cause the square to break down anyway.

Two basic things cause dancers to dance "by directions" instead of "by definition". One is callers who give too many directions, and never stop giving them. This eliminates the need for the dancers to learn the definitions since the directions will always follow the command, right? Yes, unless the dancers try to dance to another caller who does not give constant directions for every figure. Callers who always call directionally are usually trying to retain people in their Advanced and Challenge groups who really don't have the background or ability to be there. Each caller, I am sure, has his own reasons for doing this.

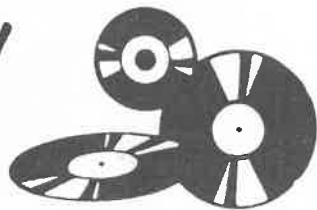
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WHAT'S NEW!!

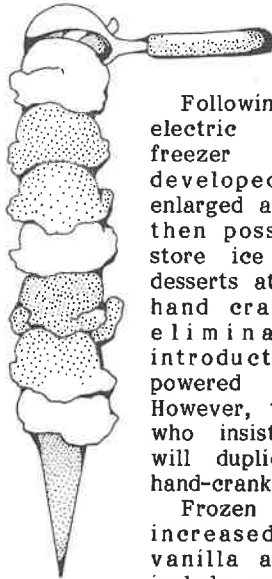
THE ICE CREAM STORY

Thanks to Bill Cocke, realtor with Century 21, for this interesting story about ice cream and the recipe that follows.

On returning from a voyage to the Orient, Marco Polo reported seeing Chinese ices made with milk. The Romans served frozen fruit ices, but after the return of Marco Polo, the use of ices made with milk and cream spread throughout Europe and Asia. Until the early 1800's its enjoyment was confined to heads of state and nobility. In 1809, Dolly Madison, wife of the President of the United States, first served ice cream to dinner guests at the White House. Thus she became known as the first lady of ice cream in America.

Until the invention of mechanical refrigeration, ice cream was stored in large, heavily insulated boxes inside bulky metal containers filled with a salt-and-ice mixture called brine. These brine containers held the temperature inside the storage box below freezing. If salt and ice were not replenished daily, the temperature rose above freezing and disaster followed. Only commercial firms and the very affluent could afford the luxury of storing ice cream.

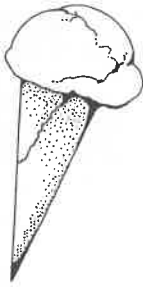
About 1900, ice cream makers were developed for home use. With readily available commercial ice cream and the introduction of homemade ice cream, it was natural for it to become a favorite dessert.



Following the invention of electric home refrigerators, freezer compartments were developed and gradually enlarged and improved. It was then possible to make and store ice cream and frozen desserts at home. Drudgery of hand cranking was largely eliminated with the introduction of electric-powered ice cream makers. However, there are still those who insist no other method will duplicate the flavor of hand-cranked ice cream.

Frozen dessert flavors have increased from chocolate, vanilla and strawberry to include exotic tropical flavors and a variety of exciting combinations. Today, most frozen desserts are easy to make and even tropical ingredients are readily available in supermarkets. They can be frozen by churning them in an ice cream maker or they can be still-frozen in a freezer.

There are many advantages to making your own frozen desserts. You can enjoy beautifully molded bombes, tangy yogurt confections, delicious ices, and a wide variety of ice creams at about half the cost of commercially produced frozen desserts. You know ingredients are fresh and pure because you purchase them immediately before creating your frozen dessert. You can control or eliminate most chemical emulsifiers, stabilizers and artificial flavors that are found in most



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- 1 1/3 cups sugar
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- 1/4 tsp. salt
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- 2 egg yolks
- 1 (5.33 oz.) can evaporated milk
- 1 cup whipping cream
- 1 Tbsp. vanilla extract

In a medium saucepan, combine sugar, cornstarch and salt; stir in milk. Stir over medium heat until mixture begins to simmer; let simmer 1 minute over low heat. Set aside. In a small bowl, lightly beat egg yolks. Stir about 1 cup milk mixture into egg yolks; stir egg yolk mixture into remaining milk mixture. Cook and stir over low heat for 2 minutes or until slightly thickened. Stir in evaporated milk, whipping cream and vanilla. Cool to room temperature. Pour into ice cream canister, freeze in ice cream maker. Makes 2 quarts.

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'ROUND' ABOUT

Some Round Dance History

Round Dancing. What is it all about? Where did it start? How is it a part of Square Dancing? These are the questions that are asked every time you turn around. Is it the **frosting on the cake**? Or is it really a dish of **ice cream** that can be enjoyed all by itself. You ask the questions, you get different answers from each person you talk to.

"Blessed are those who go around in circles, for they shall be known as Round Dancers." Lloyd (Pappy) Shaw states in his book 'Cowboy Dances' that it was the **custom** to have a tip of two square dances followed by a round dance. This is the **old custom** from long ago. The evening's program was two squares and a couple dance (round dance).

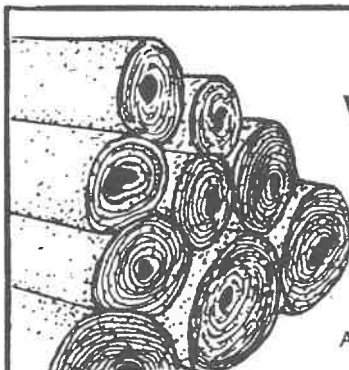
In the early days the dances were Polkas, Schottische, Varsouvianna, Mazurka and Waltz. When the round dancers became very good they wanted a larger selection.

One common waltz was 'Coming Through the Rye'. This was a fun dance as the first twelve measures were played in a fast 4/4 time and the later twelve measures slowed and changed to 3/4 time. This was repeated to the end of the dance. This type of waltzing is still common in Germany in the Beer Gardens, where it is called 'Swiefache', and it becomes a challenge between the dancer and the band leader.

The Schottische is a beautiful dance to watch or perform. It's fast and requires a fast floor. It is a dance of hops, runs and swings and the popularity of this dance is still high with the Slavic people of Europe.

Another old-time couple dance is the 'Varsouvianna'. It originated in Warsaw, Poland. This dance is different in that when the partners are facing, the footwork is opposite; whereas when they are in the

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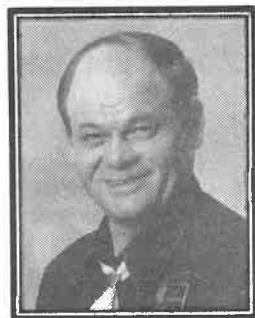

ALL 8 SPIN THE TOP (CALLERLAB Plus Call #21)

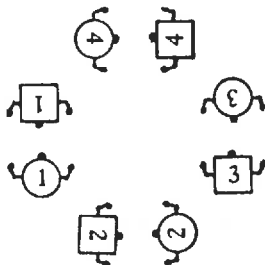
DEFINITION

(CALLERLAB April 1985) Starting formation — Wrong Way Thar, Right & Left Grand Circle, Thar Star. If started from a Thar Star, the handholds forming the center star are released as each center dancer and the adjacent outside dancer Arm Turn one-half (180°). Those now in the middle Star three-quarters (walking forward), while the new outsides move forward one-quarter around the perimeter of the circle to join hands with the same person again in a Thar Star formation. If started from a Right & Left Grand Circle, everyone turns by the right half way (180°) with the person they are facing, then completes the call as above (new centers Star left three-quarters, etc.).

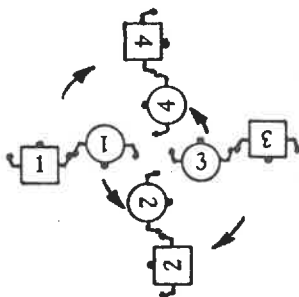
(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #315 and Burleson #720.)

ALL 8 SPIN THE TOP

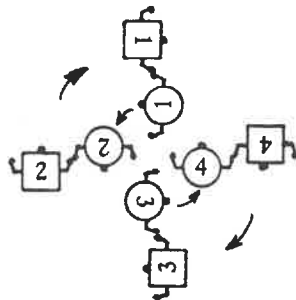
From: All join hands, Circle Left, Allemande Left...



When started from a Right & Left Grand Circle, everyone turns by the right half way (180°) with the person they are facing...



Those now in the middle Star (left) three-quarters (walking forward), while the new outsides move forward one-quarter around the perimeter of the circle to join hands with the same person again in a Thar Star formation.



DANCING HINTS

All 8 Spin the Top is one of the more easily learned Plus calls due to its direct relation to the Mainstream call "Spin the Top". The

-The Prompter-

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only major difference is that the formations are either Thar Stars or Right & Left Grand Circles — the actions of the call are identical to those required in Mainstream.

The 'main secret' to success in All 8 Spin the Top is to "control your forward momentum". Be sure to begin the call by precisely turning one-half (trading places) with the adjacent dancer BEFORE you release the original handhold. As a new center you will turn your star forward exactly three-quarters, or

as a new end you will move exactly one-quarter forward around the outside. Remember which dancer you start the move with! Since, after the one-half turn, one of you moves forward 3/4, and the other moves forward 1/4 ($3/4 + 1/4 = 1$), you should always end the move with the same dancer. As you are often "on the move" when you start this call, be sure to resist the natural tendency to exert too much force — and sling the other dancer --

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June 26, 27, 28, 1986

One development in the heart of downtown Indianapolis will have special impact on the National Square Dance Convention in the Hoosier Capital June 26, 27 and 28, 1986.

A 50 million dollar renovation of Union Station, one of the nation's most historic train depots, will provide a mini-city for the 40,000 square dancers expected to promenade in the Hoosier Dome and adjacent Indiana Convention Center. The complex, which will be connected to the Hoosier Dome by an over-traffic walkway, will offer 60 shops and restaurants, a museumplex, cinemas, a Holiday Inn hotel, numerous nightclubs and streetside cafes. There will be 1,600 parking spaces. Union Station is scheduled to open in April 1986.

The Union Station Holiday Inn will be the only hotel in the chain to be built in an existing structure. It will have 275 rooms and will feature 26 suites housed in 13 restored railway cars. The hotel will have a bar, restaurant, swimming pool and health club.

Union Station, in the shadow of the Hoosier Dome and three blocks

from the heart of Indianapolis, was erected in 1853 and was the nation's first union railway station. The three-story structure now being renovated was built, spanning three city blocks, in 1888 and the train sheds, which will be the location of the railway car rooms, were added between 1913 and 1918.

The food court planned for Union Station will be along old Track 12 in the train shed, which is elevated above street level. The developers have interviewed more than 1,000 vendors in seeking a good menu "mix".

Union Station was the rail hub of Indianapolis, the city known as the "Crossroads of the Nation". In the 1920's, trains passing through Indianapolis numbered 200, but by 1936 traffic had dwindled to 45 trains and by 1970 the station was closed. A Committee to Save Union Station was formed, leading to the present restoration effort.

"We will accommodate a cross-section of income levels," says Robert Borns, the developer. "From the lavish to the conservative tastes, vendors will offer some of both. We want everyone to be able to come join the fun at Union Station."

Square Dancing is Not "Hillbilly" - Square dancing is the "Folk Dance" of America and as such it is an important part of our "folk culture". It was about the only form of dancing known until the turn of the century. The "parent forms", Quadrilles, Contras and the graceful "pattern couple dances", made up the programs of all fine social balls including the Presidential Inaugural Balls. Although square dancing never disappeared completely, it was dormant for a period of twenty to thirty years. The present revival started about 1930 and has grown steadily until an estimated ten million people are now dancing regularly in every section of the United States and Canada, and square dancing has spread to many nations the world over. Thousands of schools are adding square dancing to their recreation programs and find that it is a valuable aid in teaching coordination, cooperation and sociability.

Square Dancing is Not Competitive -- Square dancing thrives in an atmosphere of complete cooperation for fun and fellowship. Small groups of neighbors and friends get together and form

"square dance clubs" and the emphasis is on sociability. Any practices that set up a "process of elimination" should be avoided.

Square Dancing is Not Rough and Strenuous — Some of the television presentations of square dancing create the misconception that gymnastic or tap-dancing ability is required. Actually, the millions of regular dancers move through two to three hours of dancing in an evening with a smooth, gliding one-step, using a fraction of the energy used in walking. All beginners have a tendency to "overexert" but, with practice, the ability to hear, to translate, and do becomes automatic and relaxation increases. Good dancing is mentally and physically relaxing.

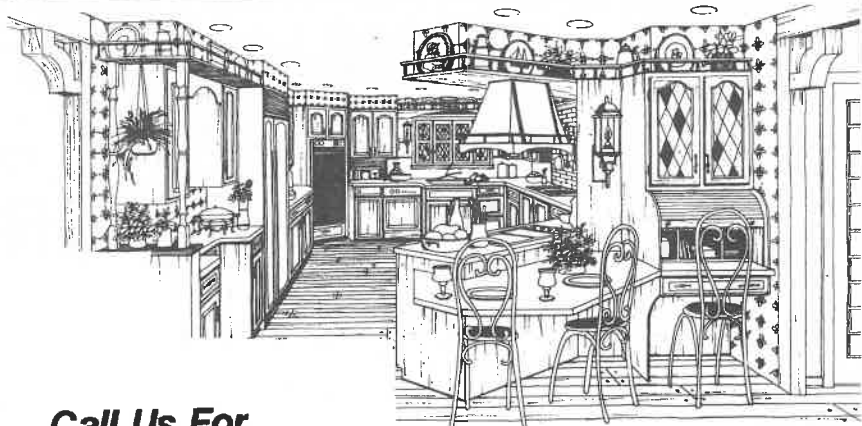
Learn to Listen — This is the first requirement as the dancers rely on the caller for direction of their every move, and these directions change constantly, ensuring a never ending variety in the dance.

Move in Rhythm — This is the second requirement. Dancing is the rhythmic interpretation of the music. The various rhythms of the music tie the figures of the dance together in a continuous flow.

Be Patient — Be patient with yourself and those you dance with. The time required to learn varies with each individual. Do not pull, push or tell other dancers what to do. That is the caller's job. You will only confuse them more.

Last, but not least — **Wear a Smile** -- it's the curve that straightens out a square.

Concentration? Relaxation? Oh, what is the key?

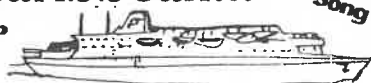
Over and over, and time after time,

through the one-half turn.

Even though all eight dancers are usually moving throughout this call, there is no need to rush! The call dances very well using the full 10 beats of music; and the caller is not in a hurry to all the next command.

'ROUND' ABOUT (from page 16)

Varsouvienne position, the footwork is identical. It is a flirtatious dance, many head movements and flashing eyes — very popular at weddings.

Another popular dance of the early days, and still popular today, is the Polka. Another Slavic dance, 4/4 music and fast footwork. Good polka dancers are able to "slip in a hop" in front of each measure of music (each polka figure). I've been told that this hop can only be attained by people who drink hop malted refreshments.

The waltz is the best of all round dances. In a majority of cases it is danced incorrectly. Alas, those people always insist they are doing it correctly. They are really doing a smooth (even-rhythmed) two-step to waltz time. This dance is called a 'Redowa'. In true waltzing, the dance is "step,step,close;", while the 'Redowa' is "step,close,step;". Another popular dance of the early dancers was the Spanish Waltz. This involved a turning of the body 180° (more or less) in each waltz figure. It is fun to do, but it can cause dizziness.

Modern-day round dancing has brought many more dance techniques and rhythms to the dance floor. The broad base of round dancing now includes Fox Trot, Tango, Rhumba, Cha Cha Cha, Samba, Quick Step, Swing, Viennese Waltzing, and Westminster Waltzing. Who knows, we may see Break Dancing next in the round dance field.

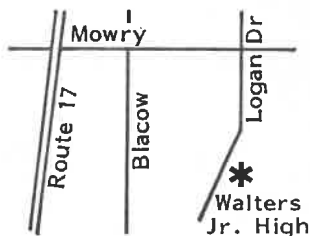

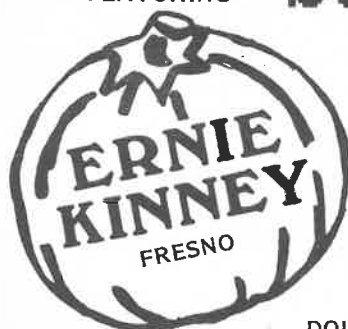

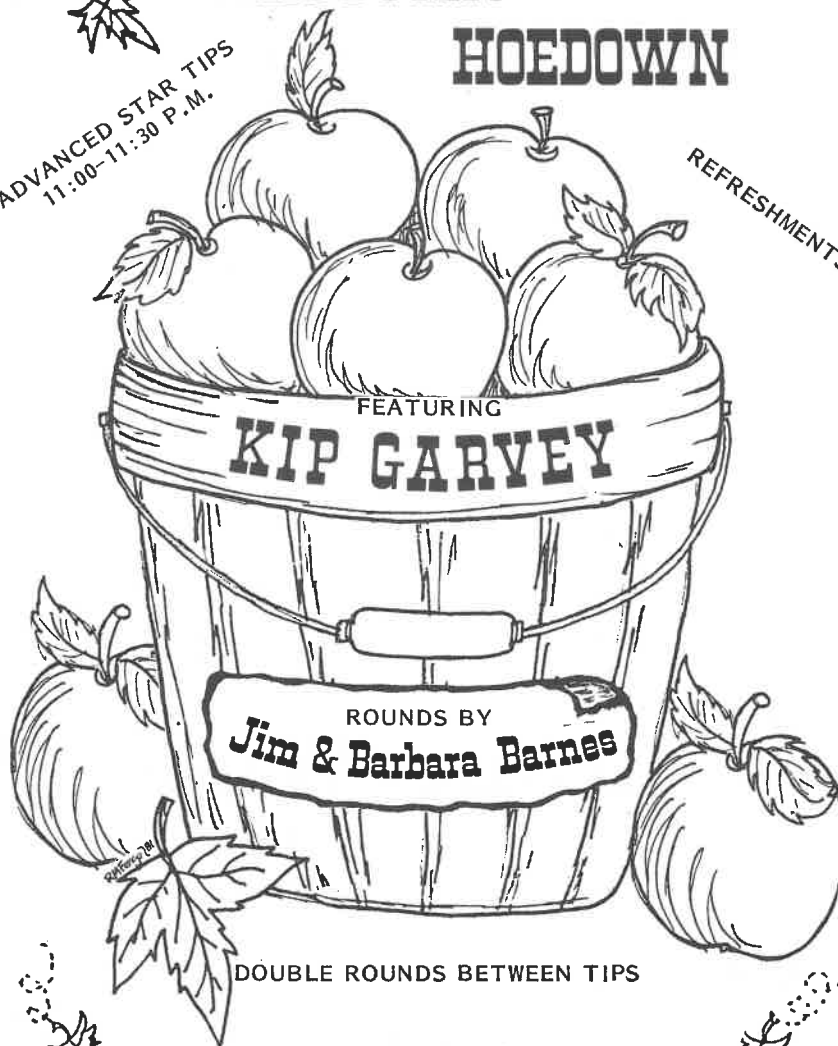

Another comment was that the caller tried to push and give too much material, too fast, in an effort to keep the "helping" club members happy.

This particular individual had come to the conclusion that he and his wife were going to have to dance more than one night a week if they were ever going to learn to be proficient at the activity. In fact, in discussion with other class members, he has come to the conclusion that club members dancing with the class may actually slow down and inhibit class member advancement!! I've never thought of it this way, but I think he's got a good point.

Hey gang, listen up!! When you go to dance with the class members, it's imperative that you remember that you also made mistakes when you were learning. Beginning square dancers are particularly sensitive to what the club members "think" of their efforts and it's critically important that we don't give them negative inputs. Don't try to "teach"

the students. That's the caller's job. If he needs or wants help, he'll ask for it. Just go and smile, be friendly, dance your part so you'll be in the right place at the right time, and "allow" the new dancers to learn the call. Be available to do anything else the caller needs or wants done. In other words, be part of the answer, not part of the problem...

The 29th SCVSDA Jubilee is coming up the second weekend in October. The lineup of callers for this year is the best I've seen in years, and we're looking forward to the weekend. But — don't look for The Prompter booth this year.

We've always enjoyed having our "rest area" booth, with chairs and a coffeepot, which gave us the chance to see all the people we may not have seen since last year. However, we were advised that the Fairgrounds would not let us have a booth that offered free coffee this year. We'll miss the booth, but we'll enjoy the opportunity to participate in more dancing. Hope to see you there...

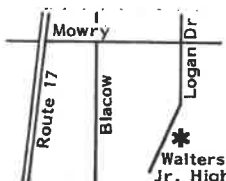

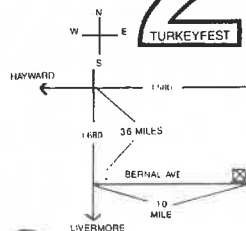

sought a league (called a "club" or a "workshop") where the coach and other players would see and appreciate his ability. But it came to pass that, wherever Omar went, the yell could be heard, "Omar, turn around!"

The moral of our story could be... if your feeling paranoid, and you can't understand why your teams are always breaking down, listen up, the Yeller may be trying to help — you!

It might have been an allegory...

However, in doing so they turn out many dancers who attend Advanced and Challenge dances and are unable to have a good time because they constantly break down squares and they soon realize that it is their fault.

Another thing which causes dancers to rely on "directions" or

try to, is being just too lazy, or not interested enough, to do the work required to learn the material in the Advanced and Challenge levels. Some dancers want to get into these levels the easy way, and it takes some period of time to find out they can't survive trying to do it the easy way. The dancers who do survive in these levels actually do study and learn the definitions, or they have the ability to learn them from the teaches. Many of them can tell me the definition for a figure as fast, if not faster, than I can tell it to them. When they blow one, they check the book to see what they did wrong. The ones who won't survive will be seen standing around complaining about the caller. Think about it! Who knows? The Shadow do! See you in a Star Tip!

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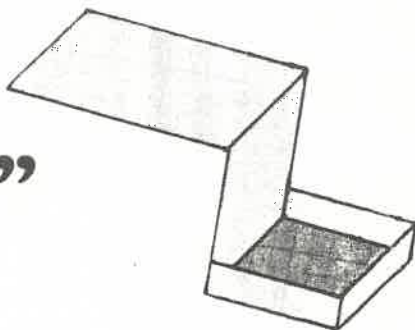
