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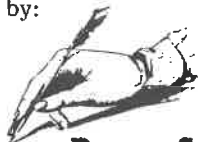

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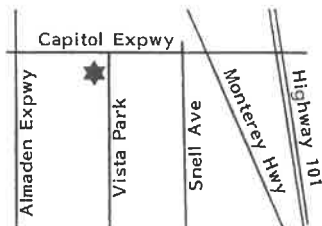


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"OUR" OPINION !

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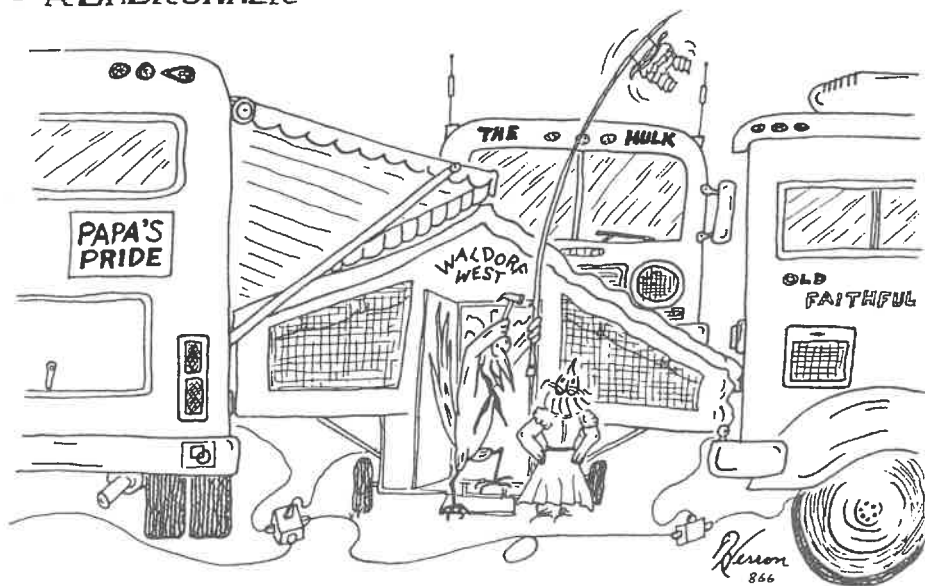


Editor,

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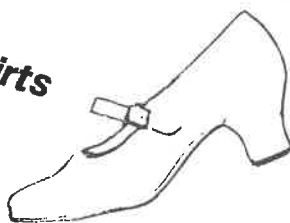
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WHAT'S NEW!!

THE BASIC "TWO-STEP"

The two-step is a dance step in which three steps, changes of weight, are accomplished in four beats of music. The usual music is considered to be 4/4. When this type of step is accomplished in two beats of music (2/4), the term "triple timing" is applied. Several popular square dance rounds are in triple timing, namely "Hot Lips" and "Street Fair".

When performing the two-step basic, the second step **MUST** be a closing step. The first step can be in ANY direction, and the second step must **CLOSE**. The first two steps are accomplished using a single beat of music for EACH step. The third step is accentuated by taking TWO beats of music. Thus, the rhythm pattern for the two-step is Quick,Quick,Slow;. Three weight changes in four beats or one measure of music. This statement or rule applies to all two-step basic figures. Further, if the two-step is performed in a forward, sideward, or backward direction, the travel of the body is equal to "two steps", thus the proper name, "two-step". Also, the three changes of weight must be on alternating feet, R,L,R or L,R,L.



The basic box of a two-step is (for the man): side left, close R to L, forward L, -; side right, close L to R, backward on R, -; The primary basic rule is confirmed: feet closed (together) on the second step and the rhythm pattern is Q,Q,S;. This rule applies to all two-step figures.

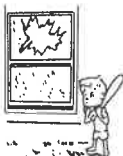
Second analysis: Two Side Touches are not a true two-step. A Vine 3, Vine 4 or Vine 8 are not "two-steps". In either case, the feet are not closed on the second count, or the "alternating foot" is not true.

Third analysis: Walking Steps L,-,R,-; or R,-,L,-; are not "two-steps" as the closing rule is not true. Running steps L,R,L,R; fail the closing test also.

If a person were to invert the rhythm from Q,Q,S; to S,Q,Q;, the rules of closure and rhythm would also fail. However, the Fox Trot is a delightful rhythm, using the 'rule inversion' and certainly adds interesting figures to 4/4 music.

The International Association of Round Dance Teachers, Inc.

ROUNDALAB, a professional organization for round dance teachers, was formed to promote, protect and perpetuate the general round dance movement as a complement to the overall square dance picture. ROUNDALAB now has its annual meeting the Sunday, Monday and Tuesday immediately prior to, and in the same city as, the National Square Dance Convention.

The Universal Round Dance Council (URDC) is an organization composed of both round dance teachers and dancers with basically the same goals. The URDC sponsors an annual round dance convention the end of July.

Since the goals of both ROUNDALAB and URDC are supportive of, and in harmony with, each other, representatives of both organizations met in June 1985 to explore areas of mutual interest and cooperation. The following joint creed and proposals were the result.

URDC - ROUNDALAB CREED

We believe that the ultimate goal of an organization in round dancing is to help round dancing grow and flourish. We believe that we can promote, protect and perpetuate the activity by cooperative effort of teachers and dancers to increase the enjoyment of round dancing by all dancers from Beginners through Advanced.

PROPOSALS

1. To develop common standards we recommend that ROUNDALAB use the URDC Manual as a source for undefined terms. We also recommend that ROUNDALAB submit copies of current definitions to URDC to study. We suggest that the ROUNDALAB Phase Chairmen be the Liaison to the URDC Board in the above matters.

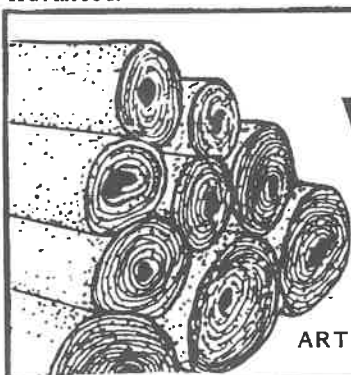
2. We propose that ROUNDALAB share material and ideas of our Mini-Clinics and Teacher Training Curriculum with URDC.

3. We recommend that ROUNDALAB send out press releases on the ROUNDALAB Phase Rating System with the booklet and that these be available for the URDC July meeting.

4. We recommend that to improve the cooperative effort between ROUNDALAB and URDC that all ROUNDALAB members be encouraged to join URDC and vice versa for teacher members of URDC.

5. We recommend that there be another meeting similar to this one possibly in July 1986 and again in June 1987.

All were adopted unanimously by the ROUNDALAB membership at their annual meeting in June and by the URDC membership at their annual meeting in July.

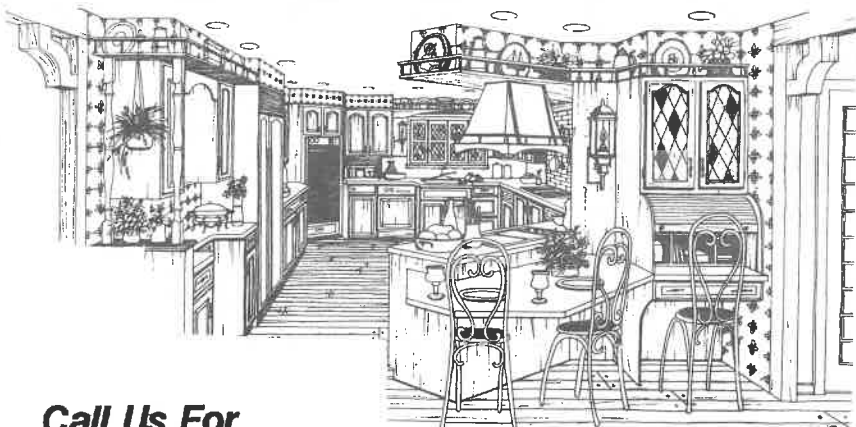


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Stir The Bucket With Betty

Thanksgiving is just around the corner, and even though it's a day of tradition, let's spread a few new favorites throughout the day! We're including a delicious breakfast surprise twist on an old favorite, a yummy refreshing drink, a dinner from the old South, and a light, mouth-watering dessert.

ORANGE OVEN FRENCH TOAST

Sauce:

1/2 cup sour cream
1/4 cup orange marmalade

Toast:

6 eggs, separated
3 Tbsp. sugar
1 tsp. grated orange peel
1/2 tsp. salt
1/2 cup orange juice
2 tsp. milk
12 bread slices
powdered sugar

Heat oven to 450° F. and grease a large cookie sheet. In medium bowl, beat egg whites until foamy. Gradually add sugar, beating until stiff peaks form; set aside. Beat egg yolks, stir in orange peel, salt, orange juice and milk. Fold egg yolk mixture into beaten egg whites. Dip bread slices into egg mixture until coated evenly, place on cookie sheet. Bake for 5 to 8 minutes or until golden brown — do not turn toast. While toast is baking, combine sour cream and marmalade in a small saucepan and heat just until warm. Sprinkle toast with powdered sugar and serve immediately with sauce. 6 servings.

CRANBERRY SPICED TEA

4 tea bags
2 1/2 cups boiling water
1/4 tsp. cinnamon
1/4 tsp. allspice
1/4 tsp. nutmeg
3/4 cup sugar
2 cups cranberry juice
1 1/2 cups water
1/2 cup orange juice
1/3 cup lemon juice

Combine tea bags, cinnamon, allspice, nutmeg and boiling water, cover and steep for 5 minutes. Strain through cheesecloth or old nylon hose in a little strainer. In a large container, combine strained tea with sugar and stir to dissolve. Cool and add cranberry juice, water, orange and lemon juices. Will keep for some time in the refrigerator and can be served hot or cold.

ROCK CORNISH GAME HEN WITH ORANGE, NUT, RICE STUFFING

6 Rock Cornish games hens,
approximately 1 pound each
1/4 cup butter or margarine
1/4 cup chopped onion
1 1/3 cups packaged precooked rice
1 cup water
1/2 cup orange juice
2 tsps. grated orange rind
2 Tbsps. chopped parsley
1 cup chopped pecans
1/2 tsp. sugar
1/4 tsp. poultry seasoning
1 1/2 tsps. salt
Melted butter or margarine

Thaw hens, rinse and pat dry. Melt butter or margarine in saucepan; add onion and saute until tender, but not browned. Add rice, water, orange juice, orange rind, parsley, nuts and sugar. Mix just to moisten rice. Bring to a boil quickly over high heat. Cover, remove from heat and let stand 5 minutes. Add poultry seasoning and salt and mix lightly with fork. Lightly salt inside cavity of each hen. Use approximately 1 cup of dressing for each hen, packing lightly. Place hens, breast side up, in uncovered pan; bake at 425° F. about 1 hour, or until tender, basting frequently with melted butter or margarine. 6 servings.

2 cups flour
2 cups sugar
2 tsp. cinnamon
1/2 tsp. salt
2 tsp. vanilla



1/2 cup cooking oil
2 eggs
2 tsp. baking soda
1 cup chopped nuts
4 - 6 medium apples, pared
and diced

Combine flour, sugar, cinnamon and salt; beat in vanilla, oil, and eggs. Stir in baking soda, nuts and apples. Bake in 9"x11" pan for 45 to 50 minutes at 350° F. Sprinkle with powdered sugar — no icing is needed.

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Fashionable Thoughts

We've recently been asked to direct our column to the newer dancer needs for awhile. All too often we fail to realize that many of our readers are new to the realm of square dance fashions. There are several very good books on sewing, available at your local dance stores, which are an invaluable source of hints and directions for a variety of square dance fashion ideas.

Here are some simple skirt patterns that require little or no sewing experience and can provide you a variety of square dance styles.

THE BASIC GATHERED SKIRT



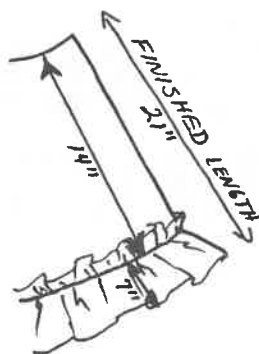
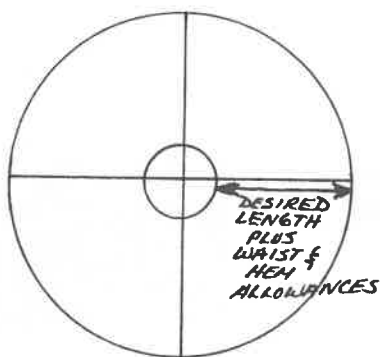
There was a time not too long ago when a square dance pattern had to be passed from square dancer to square dancer. It was impossible to buy one that worked and it took some real know-how to put other patterns together. Fortunately, that is changing rapidly. As more and more people join the square dance movement, more and more are using their talents to come up with products that we need.

Let's first look at the two basic skirt types. The first skirt featured is the basic gathered skirt. This one features a ruffle hemmed at the top and sewed to the skirt. It can also be made without the ruffle, or the ruffle can be turned under at the top and sewed to the skirt.

It takes more material for the gathered skirt and it is more difficult to make than the basic gores skirt. However, the gathered skirt adds variety and beauty to square dance costumes and it is often the first skirt to be tackled by the beginner.

It is important that the ruffle have about double the amount of fabric (in inches) than the skirt. A very simple way to make the gathered skirt is to measure from your waist to 7" above your hem length. Take this measurement, allow 5/8 inch for each seam (top and bottom), and cut three lengths of 45" material. For the ruffle, allow 7", amount for bottom hem, plus 2" for the hemming at top of ruffle. Cut six lengths of 45" material for the ruffle. After sewing the three pieces of fabric together, gather the upper skirt, using two rows of gathering stitches. Finish the ruffle completely before attaching it to skirt: sew all ruffle lengths together (end to end), then turn up and stitch the bottom hem allowance. For a ruffle which is hemmed as in the figure, turn under enough fabric

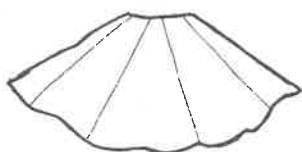


Hint: Get one gore exact (for either 4 or 8 gores) and then use as a basic pattern, cutting the appropriate number of sections. Try using Pellon (non-woven interfacing) for making patterns instead of paper. It is easier to handle and pin, and lasts much longer.

If your desired "finished length" is 21", cut three lengths of material 15 1/4" wide and 45" long (width of uncut fabric). Cut 6 lengths of material 12" wide and 45" inches long (3 inches allowed for bottom hem and 2" for top ruffle to turn under). Finish ruffle completely before attaching to skirt.

on top of ruffle to catch hem in gathering stitches and gather, using two rows of gathering stitches. Sew ruffle to skirt, remove gathering stitches from ruffle, then attach skirt to the bodice.

THE 8-GORE CIRCULAR SKIRT



The gored skirt is a very versatile, quick and easy-to-make addition to your square dance wardrobe. It is simply a complete circular skirt, cut according to your waist measurement. Measure your waist, then add amount for seam allowances. (A simple way to draw the round circle is to find a mixing bowl or other round bowl and draw around it — one that is the right circumference.) Then, measure your skirt length, from waist to hem, and add allowances for waist seam and hem. With a yardstick, or other suitable device, draw two lines at

right angles through the center of your "waist" circle (see illustration). Then, draw a circular line to all points, making sure the circle is even. An easy way to draw the circle is to make a compass with thread and pencil. Tie the thread to a pin and put pin at the center of the circle, tie the pencil to the thread at the proper length, then draw your circle. Cut on these lines for a four-gore skirt, or for an eight-gore skirt, cut each quarter in half again.

Each person has a different way of making this pattern, and if it sounds too complicated, there are some good square dance patterns now available. One such pattern offers an eight-gored, gathered skirt with several bodice variations.

This skirt can become a basic holiday skirt with the addition of removable felt figures, sequins and trim.

The square dance wardrobe adds so much to square dancing and one can find many ways to stretch the clothing budget.

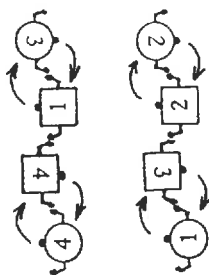

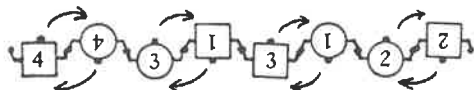
(CALLERLAB October 1985)
Starting formation(s): Parallel Ocean Waves or Eight Chain Thru. From Parallel Ocean Waves, all Spin the Top, to form a momentary tidal wave. Without stopping, the very center four dancers, in their own wave, do another Spin the Top, while the other four dancers, in their mini-waves, Cast Off 3/4 and those outfacing dancers then Run... Ending formation: 1/4 tag.

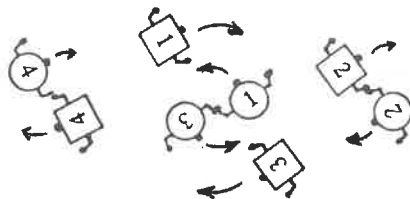

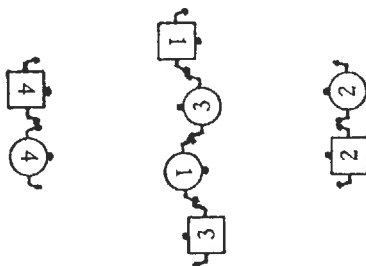

DANCING HINTS

Spin the Net is the newest Mainstream Quarterly Selection. This move very quickly establishes a smooth-flowing "teamwork" action among dancers to properly accomplish the call. The "secret to success" with Spin the Net is held by the original "centers - facing out" in the waves. These dancers, after executing the first Spin the Top, then control exactly when the second (center) Spin the Top will

start; they also establish exactly where the final center wave will complete the call. When starting the call as a center dancer, you must execute the first Spin the Top very precisely and avoid the tendency to immediately rush into the second Spin the Top action -- Please remember that you will start BOTH of the 'Spin the Top' actions with the same dancer, so you must precisely hold your position until that dancer can smoothly 'blend' into the center wave for the final actions of the call; and this same

dancer will be searching for your same hand upon completion of the call in the center wave.

All dancers should remember that they will start, and complete, each of the integral actions of this call with the same dancer and the same hand as when they individually started each previous action of the call.

Even though we all take slightly different-sized steps when we dance, this call takes a full 16 beats of music to complete, so there is no need to rush the call

SPIN THE NET

Starting formation(s): Parallel Ocean Waves or Eight Chain Thru. From Parallel Ocean Waves, all Spin the Top, to form a momentary tidal wave. Without stopping, the very center four dancers, in their own wave, do another Spin the Top, while the other four dancers, in their mini-waves, Cast Off 3/4 and those outfacing dancers then Run. Ending formation: 1/4 tag. Timing: 16 beats.

SINGING CALL FIGURE

Heads Square Thru, Do Sa Do to a Wave, Swing Thru, Spin the Net, Centers Recycle, Pass Thru, Swing the Corner, Promenade.

Callers who have used this call report good dancer reaction along with a reasonably quick teach. Spin the Net, if started from half sashayed waves (girls on the ends, boys in the center), will result in a normal quarter tag formation (normal wave in the center and normal couples on the outside) and the Spin the Top actions will be from the easier, common positions.

The current Mainstream Quarterly Selections are: Chain Down the Line (4/81); Grand Parade (10/84); Spin the Net (10/85).

Square Dancers Coming Up Roses

Dancers will have a chance to stop and smell the roses while attending the 35th National Square Dance Convention in Indianapolis.

Among tours to be made available is one to Richmond, Ind., for the 15th annual Rose Festival, an event which symbolizes Richmond's title, City of Roses.

Arrangements have been made with Bell Tours Inc. of Indianapolis to transport dancers to the City of Roses, only an hour's drive from Indiana Convention Center and Hoosier Dome, site of the square dance convention. The five-day rose festival will coincide with the dates of the square dance gathering, June 26, 27 and 28.

The Hill Companies of Richmond is the reason for the rose festival. The 101-year-old firm grows 25 million roses a year and distributes them all over the eastern United States. The company is among the five largest in the world to grow roses in greenhouses. The festival has more than 100 separate events, including a parade, a rose arranging contest and, of course, tours of the hybrid rose greenhouses.

The trip to Richmond is only one of several available to convention goers.

Other tours will be to the Indianapolis Motor Speedway and Museum, the Indianapolis Children's Museum, Conner Prairie Pioneer

Settlement and the Beef 'N Board Dinner Theater. All these sights are in the greater Indianapolis metropolitan area.

Other out-of-town tours will be to Rush County and the Kopper Kettle Restaurant and to Brown County.

The Indianapolis Motor Speedway is the site of the annual 500-Mile Race, viewed by 350,000 spectators and a nation-wide television audience. A trip around the 2½-mile track can be taken by visitors who also can see many historic and modern racing cars in the Speedway Museum. On display is the first car to win the "500", the Marmon Wasp, driven by Ray Harroun in 1911.

The Indianapolis Children's Museum is the largest children's museum in the world and one of the largest museums of any kind. Its permanent exhibits include one of the largest model railroad setups in the nation, an historic steam locomotive and a turn-of-the-century carousel. Special exhibits include hands-on materials which are as interesting to adults as they are to children.

Conner Prairie Pioneer Settlement, once the site of an early trading post, is a living history museum where the time is always 1836 with residents in costumes of the times relating stories about their families and work.

Beef 'N Boards theater brings Broadway productions and stars of screen and television to its Northside Indianapolis facility to entertain audiences in a theater in the round setting; dining is from an ever-changing menu of buffet items.

Rush County is noted as the site of the headquarters of Wendell L. Willkie when he unsuccessfully ran for the presidency against Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1940. Rushville also has one of the largest horse auctions in the country. Along the route from Indianapolis to Rush County is the Kopper Kettle Restaurant, a highlight in country dining for many years. It occupies an old home.

Brown County needs no introduction to art lovers. Site of an artist colony founded more than 100 years ago, the hub of the county, Nashville, is a tourist mecca with an endless variety of shops and a ceaseless beckoning to the days of backwoods cabins and dusty lanes. Attractions range from candle makers and glass blowers to a museum which boasts of having all the known artifacts connected with John Dillinger, famed Indiana bank robber of the Depression era.

In short, tour features make it possible to combine the National Square Dance Convention with delightful vacation outings in the heart of the Midwest.

Being visually handicapped is defined by all government agencies and dictionaries, but really it is a state of mind. For the past eight months I have had the privilege of square dancing with the VISCAPS Square Dance Club in Salinas. The Viscaps Club is an organization of "visually handicapped" people that was formed just over 12 years ago. Square dancing is only one of many club activities. The square dance club was formed about 5 years ago and meets every Saturday in the dance room at Hartnell Community College in Salinas. John Brockman is the regular caller and I help out when John has other commitments. Georgia Jimmo, the Secretary of the Viscaps Club, is the mover and shaker for the square dance group. She makes sure that everything operates smoothly and organizes

picnics and other activities for the club. One of the main problems is finding enough men to fill the squares. Each blind dancer has a "sighted" partner.

On November 23rd, the Viscaps will sponsor a Hoedown at the National Guard Armory in Salinas for the benefit of the less fortunate. All callers in the Monterey Bay area have volunteered their services (without charge) and all proceeds will go to the Salvation Army. The calling level will vary from Beginners to Plus with something for everyone. The Viscaps will provide free refreshments donated by local merchants and club members. The charge will be donations of canned goods or cash (with cash preferred).

Yes, being handicapped is truly only a state of mind!

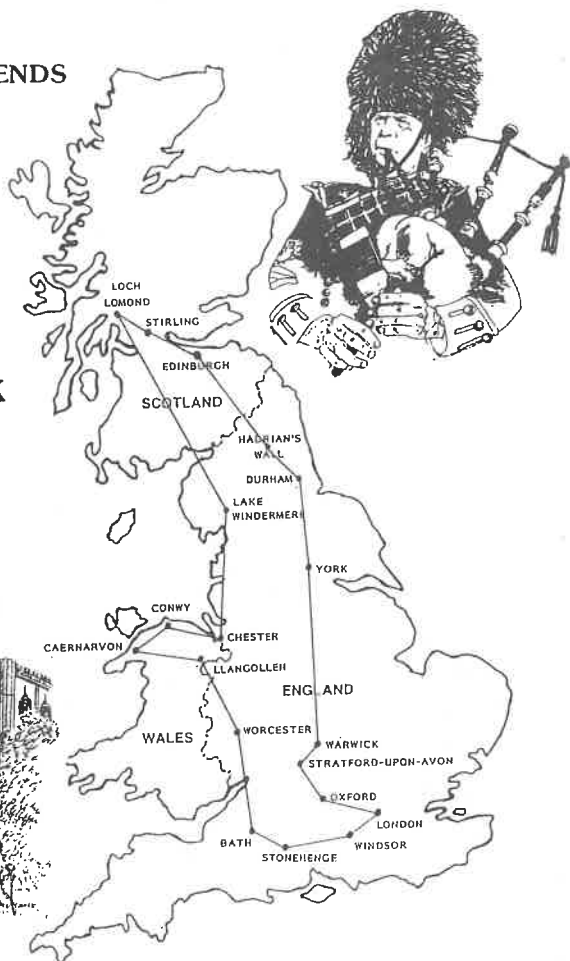
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PROMPTER PROFILE

PHIL & BETTY JAMES

Phil and Betty James first became exposed to square dancing in late 1975, when Honey and I bought the house next door. Betty expressed immediate interest in a beginners' class but Phil was more difficult to convince. The pressure on Phil increased in 1977 when Honey became a caller and, by the time the Acey Deuceys were formed in January 1978, Phil had run out of excuses.

Despite frequent protests that he would never be able to learn "all those moves", Phil made it to graduation without causing Betty too much embarrassment. The James' were soon completely engrossed in square dancing, attending hoedowns and weekend festivals at every opportunity.

During the summer of 1979 discussions started about the need for a local square dance magazine that included feature articles — "something to read besides the ads". In September a partnership (Square Dance Graphics) was formed and, six weeks later, the first issue of The Prompter was introduced at that year's SCVSDA Jubilee.



In the six years since that Jubilee, the James' have become increasingly more active in square dancing. They now dance at least four nights each week, at all levels through C3, and are members of the Almaden Squares and Sybalsky's Cheshires and President of the Top 8's.

Phil and Betty are the creative force behind the advertising in The Prompter, designing the majority of the ads which appear in each

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month's magazine. As Publishers, they also deal with many of the business issues involved in the running of a partnership. Phil also has the "pleasure" of dealing with the U. S. Postal Service and, with Betty's help, addresses, sorts and mails the magazines each month.

Phil, a native of Huntington, West Virginia, is an Advisory Chemist with IBM. He attended Marshall University in West Virginia and Louisiana State University in Baton Rouge, earning Bachelor of Science degrees in Engineering and Chemistry and a Master of Science degree in Chemistry. Prior to joining IBM in Endicott, New York in 1961, Phil worked for Allied Chemical in Virginia and for Convoir in Fort Worth, Texas.

Betty is a "southern belle" from Dallas, Texas. She grew up "all over the world"; her father was a project manager for Bechtel Corporation. A graduate of the school of Education at Texas Christain University at Fort Worth, Betty has been teaching math to junior high students in San Jose for the past 23 years.

Phil and Betty both lived in Fort Worth at the same time and at one point in 1961 even taught night school classes across the street from one another. But they didn't meet until 1974, in San Jose, when both were members of a singing group, the Santa Clara Chorale. They were married in June, 1975.

When they are not square dancing, traveling, or working on The Prompter, Phil and Betty head for the mountains and their cabin at Soda Springs -- both are avid cross-country skiers. They have recently discovered the joys of wind surfing as a counterpoint to winter skiing. Phil is also an instructor pilot and a dedicated cyclist who thinks nothing of riding 40 or 50 miles to "relax". When he wants to get serious, he rides in a Century, a 100 mile bicycle race generally held on a mountainous course.

Looking back over the past seven years, Phil and Betty would admit that they didn't expect square dancing to become such a major portion of their lives -- but they are glad that it has!



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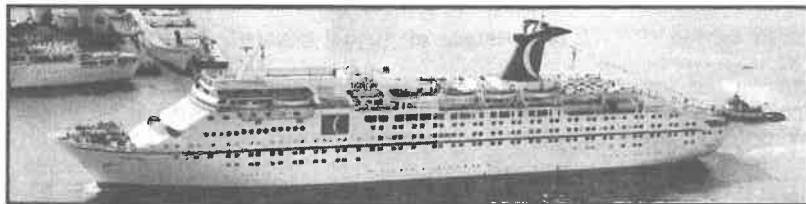

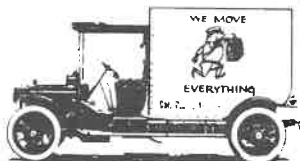

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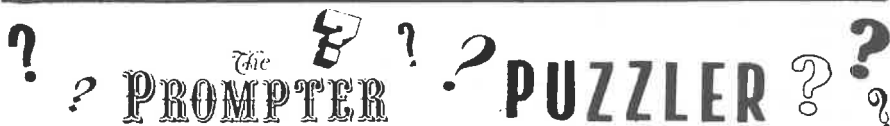

ANSWER TO LAST MONTH'S PUZZLER

When the badges are sold at a combined price of 5 for \$2.00, the 3 for a dollar ones are exhausted more quickly than those sold at 2 for a dollar. The cheaper badges are all sold after 20 sales. As a result, Connie's last 20 badges are sold for 40 cents each (5 for 2 dollars) instead of her usual price of 50 cents each (2 for a dollar). The difference on the 20 badges is, therefore, \$2.00.

In other words: Connie sells her badges at 2 for a dollar and gets 50 cents per badge. Ginger sells her badges at 3 for a dollar and gets 33 1/3 cents per badge. The average of these two prices is 41 2/3 cents per badge. At the combined price of 5 for 2 dollars, the price per badge is 40 cents. Therefore, there is a difference of 1 2/3 cents on each badge. On a total of 120 badges, therefore, there is a loss of \$2.00.

Crossing steps in a "two-step basic" will occur on the third step of the measure, this being a two-beat step will allow the dancer to perform the body change in a smooth transition. Crossing steps in two-step dances are used to change to banjo, sidecar, open, left open, and semi-closed position.

There are enough variations in the mixture of 4/4 music to present a lifetime of dancing to rhythm variations of either the two-step or the Fox Trot. There are still other

variations of the 4/4 music, the Tango is 4/4 (the rhythm is S,S; Q,Q,S;), the Cha Cha is a similar variation (S,S; Q,Q,S;). The difference in the 'moves' is where the "direction change" occurs. Beyond this point, the 4/4 music is also suitable to the Polka, Schottische, Rumba, Paso Doble, Bolero, Samba, Single - Tripple Swing, and many other dance techniques. Each dance technique involves the learning of a 'new vocabulary', it's almost like teaching or learning a foreign language.

At the annual CALLERLAB Convention held in Phoenix, Arizona April 1-3, 1985, the members voted, almost unanimously, to add a new category of CALLERLAB affiliation — the CALLERLAB APPRENTICE.

For some time there has been concern that newer, and usually younger, callers who cannot qualify for member or subscriber status do not have ready access to up-to-date information from CALLERLAB. Many of these young callers have expressed a desire to receive CALLERLAB publications and even to attend the annual convention. The wisdom of providing these future leaders with proper training and guidance is apparent and the action of the membership is in the best interests of square dancing.

The CALLERLAB Apprentice is not a member and will not be referred to as such. Specific details of this new program are as follows:

a. The new category of affiliation will be called CALLERLAB Apprentice and will NOT be considered membership in any way.

b. The CALLERLAB Apprentice may be a caller who does not meet the requirements for membership such as calling 50 dances per year or once a week for the three most recent years.

c. The CALLERLAB Apprentice may attend the CALLERLAB Conventions in a NON-VOTING capacity upon request and payment

of the current fees.

The CALLERLAB Apprentice gets NO VOTE and MAY NOT SERVE on committees.

e. The CALLERLAB Apprentice may convert to a full member when, and only when, ALL requirements for full membership are satisfied.

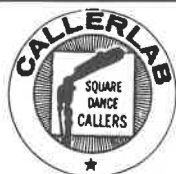
f. If a CALLERLAB Apprentice has attended a convention and subsequent meets our criteria for membership, the CALLERLAB Apprentice could convert to full membership upon written application.

g. Accreditation would not have to be completed until two years after the CALLERLAB Apprentice first becomes a subscriber or full member.

h. Dues for a CALLERLAB Apprentice would be the same as for a Member or Subscriber.

i. The CALLERLAB Apprentice would be identified with a similar but different badge from the member/subscriber.

With this category of affiliation with CALLERLAB, many additional callers will be able to take advantage of the experience of the outstanding leadership available through the membership of CALLERLAB. With the availability of attending the conventions by CALLERLAB APPRENTICES, additional training will be provided which should result in an overall improvement in the teaching and calling skills of the newer callers.

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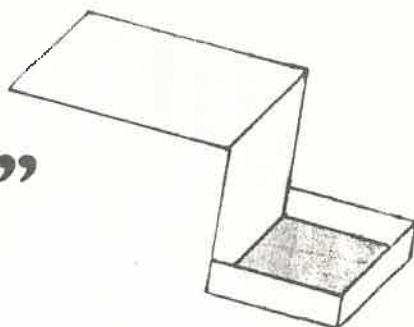
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
