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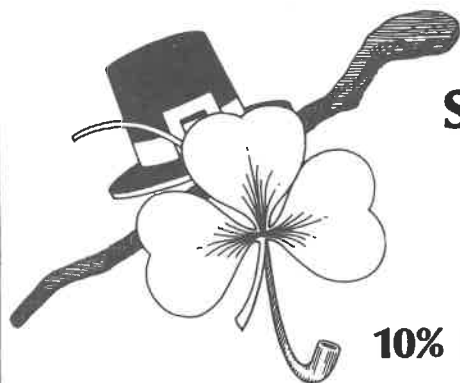
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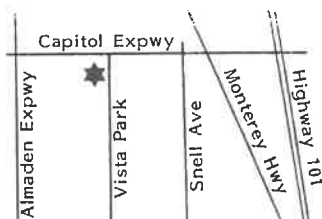
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"OUR" OPINION !

We put in a claim at the Post Office and finally, January 22nd, we received the Prompter you mailed in December.

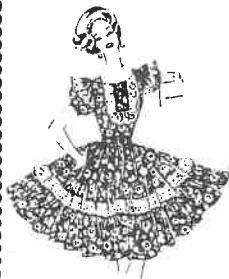

Shortcutting has certainly been taking a lot of heat recently. While I agree with Bob Southern's comments about not shortcutting with those who do not know how or do not enjoy it, I disagree with his comments about why people shortcut. I don't often shortcut, because I don't think of it while dancing, but when I do it's not to show that I'm "better" than the other dancers. I don't shortcut with people at their highest level; that's not fair, and does smack of showing off. Most of my shortcutting happens with C-3 dancers in A-2 tips. It's not unreasonable to say that a C-3 dancer is "better" than an Advanced dancer -- at the Advanced level -- simply because they've had more practice. By shortcutting a C-3 dancer, I'm not trying to prove I'm better (and if I were, nobody would be convinced).

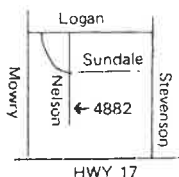
There is something to 'getting' the other person -- surprising them with the shortcut. I remember the first time someone shortcut on me.



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It was in a C-1 tip; the call was Flip Back, and as I came in for the Scoot, Blam! my ears were assaulted with a finger-snap. I wasn't actually confused, because I knew what to do and the square kept dancing, but I was certainly surprised, and spent the rest of the tip trying to "get back" at my adversary. (I don't recall being successful.) This is an example of a successful shortcut. Actually, now, I might say that this was poor judgment on the part of the shortcutter, since there were people in the square whose highest level was C-1. Although they weren't directly affected by the short, they may have been slightly confused by the fact that we weren't moving in the expected traffic patterns in their peripheral view. But the purpose of a shortcut is not to show off; it's more like a friendly half-insult in conversation.

I firmly believe that shortcutting should be optional and those who do not wish to partake should have priority. If you are the victim of shortcutting, please speak to the shortcutter and say "Please don't shortcut with me, I do not enjoy it." The shortcutter may not be aware of your feelings, and may think you are having a good time. If you're a shortcutter, and someone asks you to stop when they're in the square, please accede to their wishes. If you don't, you'll just be contributing to its bad name.

(Perhaps the key word here is "adversary" -- believe it or not Challenge world, most of us (callers as well as dancers), still do not consider square dancing an adversary sport. We consider it a recreation, a social activity, a pastime, and/or a mental challenge -- but not a contest, either between dancers, or between dancers and callers. We, personally, believe that the responsibility (for checking out the acceptability of one's actions) belongs to the shortcutting dancer, not the other way around. If you want to shortcut, why not ask the other dancers in the square, **before** you start dancing, if they mind if you shortcut. The key word **here** is "consideration", and the larger issue is "non-standard styling" of any kind, at any level (Highland Fling Do Sa Do, Skater's Promenade, hands down in Ocean Waves, etc.). We recognize that dancers have 'fun' in many ways -- what we have to learn, as dancers, is that sometimes what we consider 'fun' is not 'fun' for others. We, the Editors, have no objection to anything in square dancing which 1) does not annoy others in the square; 2) does not physically injure another dancer; 3) does not destroy the timing of the dance; and 4) is agreeable to the dancers directly involved. However, the dancers using standard styling shall **always** prevail -- if you want to do something different, it is up to you to check it out! When in doubt-- don't! Ed.)



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★ CORNER

The continuing trend of Advanced and Challenge (A & C) dancers not participating in other levels of square dancing is unfortunate -- both for the dancer and for the square dance movement.

As a dancer you miss out on dancing to some of the more exciting callers who come to the area -- because they don't call A & C, you don't attend their dances. Another thing you may miss is learning the new Quarterly Selections that are being called at some hoedowns and weekends.

The rush to higher levels causes many dancers to leave their Plus clubs too soon. For a long time, most A & C callers advised dancers to always dance at least one level below their highest level. Now they are heard to ask them to come to the new higher level workshop that the caller is now promoting. It seems that as soon as they are taught Advanced, they are being asked to come to the C-1 class and so on.

Frequently, I observe A & C dancers breaking down squares at festivals and hoedowns because they don't know, or don't remember, all of the calls at the lower levels. Sometimes these calls are Quarterly Selections, so they say who cares. But, if they can learn Quarterly Selections at the A & C levels and other experimental figures along with them, they can

take the time to learn the figures being used at the lower levels.

Keep in mind that new dancers in A & C come up from the Plus level. Plus dancers come from Mainstream and beginner classes. If A & C dancers don't support these levels, you will soon find fewer dancers interested in A & C because there will be fewer dancers in the Plus level. Think about it when your club gets smaller or your A & C hoedown does not have as many dancers attending. Some Plus clubs have folded lately and some others are on the verge of folding. Overall, the square dance population is decreasing. If we don't help we may find ourselves in the same situation.

I have had a number of people comment to me about a recent article on "styling" that appeared in the February issue. Most of the exception taken to the article was along the line that, while the points discussed were probably important to the success of an A & C dancer, they were not really about styling as most callers teach it -- or don't teach it -- as the case may be.

The general consensus of opinion was that styling was more applicable to the way the figures were done and things like hand positions, handholds, and skirt-work by the ladies while dancing. One comment -- it is hard to do skirt-work when you are not wearing one! Another was that there is no styling involved in Promenades when you don't do them!

I overheard a dancer recently who said that many A & C dancers do not even know the real meaning and benefits of square dancing because they have jumped from beginners class to C-2, or on up to C-4 so fast that they didn't notice the rest of the square dance world existed along the way. From comments like these, some even coming from A & C dancers, it really appears that we should stop and take a look at the way we are heading in A & C dancing, and the way the main body of the square dance movement views us.

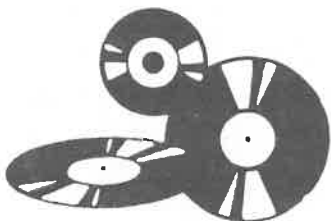

Malco Modes will be coming out with a 1 1/2" stretch belt! You ladies who have been asking for

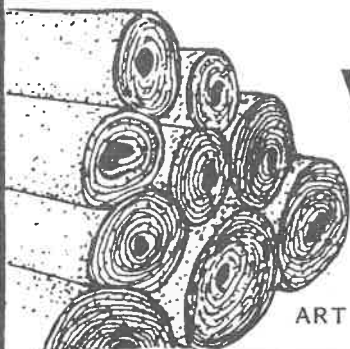
them now can have one.

The multi-tiered skirt is generally flattering to figures and can be a gorgeous design. The following pattern and directions, reprinted courtesy of Square Dancing Magazine (February 1985), produce such an effect with a new twist. Read on... hope to see you in our square wearing your six-tiered skirt.

SIX-TIERED SKIRT by JoAnne Shaw Newark, Delaware

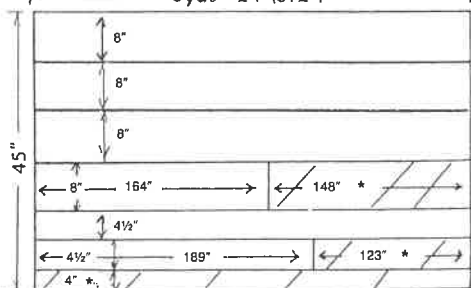
Each tier (T) is sewn to a support tier (ST) instead of the easier construction where the tiers are sewn onto a skirt base. The length of the tiers is evenly graduated and the amount of gathering is controlled by the length of the support tiers. Each

Example Size: Waist 25", length 20"
Tiers (T): 8" wide strips
T1 1 yd-34" T4 6 yd-4"
T2 3 yd-20" T5 7 yd-14"
T3 4 yd-30" T6 8 yd-24"

Support Tiers (ST): 4 1/2" wide strips
ST1 1 yd-25" ST4 3 yd-13"
ST2 2 yd-3" ST5 4 yd
ST3 2 yd-27"

Cutting Layout:

8yds - 24" (312")



tier is formed by cutting a width of fabric and folding it in half along the length. This creates a soft look and eliminates the need to finish cut edges.

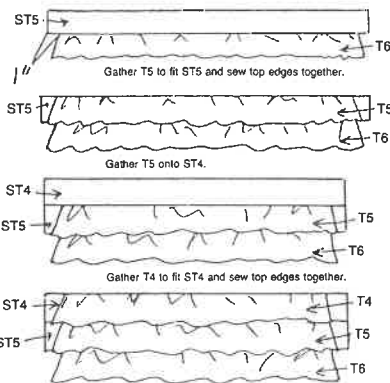
Adjustments in cutting must be made for skirt waist and length and fabric width.

Seam finish all raw edges, if necessary. Cut and sew strips for T and ST into lengths shown in the table. Sew both ends of each T (8" strips) by folding in half, right sides together, stitching and turning right sides out. Fold T strips in half lengthwise and sew long edges together using a zig-zag stitch. This finishes the raw edges also. Do **not** press.

Label all T and ST for quick reference. Start with the bottom tier, T6, gathering it to fit ST5, leaving 1" seam allowance at ends. Set T to ST with right sides together.

Proceed in this way, sewing all tiers and support tiers together. Finally, gather the top tier to fit the waistband and sew in place. Using the 1" seam allowances at the ends of the support tiers, sew the center back seam, leaving 8" open for the zipper. Place zipper in opening. Complete the waistband. Attach a button or hook at the closure. If the skirt is to be sewn to a bodice, place fabric-covered cording in the waistline seam for support and stability.

With the ROUNDALAB annual meeting now the Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday immediately prior to, and in the same city as, the National Square Dance Convention, the ROUNDALAB Board of Directors has decided to hold a one-day Round Dance Teachers Seminar/Clinic on the Wednesday between the two conventions. While this Seminar/Clinic is aimed for round dance teachers, any person interested in round dancing is welcome to attend. There will be a nominal charge to cover expenses.

There will be three one-hour sessions during the morning and in the afternoon with a different topic and subject matter at each session. The format will be a seminar/clinic

TREATISE ON THE TANGO

The Tango is a Latin dance, performed to 4/4 music, whose rhythm is further refined to be S,S; Q,Q,S;. Although this rhythm will vary in the execution of the dance, it is the **basic** approach.

The first analysis would be walk, walk; forward, side, draw-close; keeping the draw foot free for the next series of steps. So, in reality, the closing step is a 'draw-touch'; The experienced dancer will do a close, but then resume with the same foot. Hopefully, the close will be about 1/8 of a beat slow, behind the music, as latin dancers are lazy and never ahead of the music.

When dancing the Tango, the performance should be such that the man is always 'exhibiting' his partner. The term 'Tango Draw' will always mean Q,Q,S; and ready to use the same foot again.

As a normal rule, the Man will usually take the first three steps S,S; Q,--- in the same direction, and accent the last three beats by a **change of direction**. The Lady's steps will probably be similar, but may vary with the complexity of the dance.

One basic rule to maintain in early levels of Tango is: If there is to be a change of dance direction, **it will occur on the second quick step of the 2 measure sequence**. There will be exceptions to this statement given later on.

When a Vine, or a Run sequence, is executed, the rhythm will quite often be: Q,Q,Q,Q,Q,Q,S;. Another variation may be Q,Q,Q,Q;



S,S; All of these variations will be in a modulo of four or eight beats.

The term **gaucho rock** refers to a rocking motion in which the feet remain placed and the **body** rocks fwd,back,fwd; This term may be applied to a 3,4, or 8 beat rocking motion and may involve the turning of the body $\frac{1}{4}$ turn, $\frac{1}{2}$ turn, $\frac{3}{4}$ turn or even a full (360°) turn.

The two principle types of Tango in round dancing are Argentine and International. Argentine is a slow, smooth type of Tango, whereas the International is the harsh, jerky "Flick, Flick" type of dance. Both styles of dancing are beautiful to watch when properly performed. Generally interpreted, Argentine is "Well, Perhaps or Maybe", and the International is "Yes-Yes or No-No". Argentine draws are slow, deliberate and should not have a hesitation prior to the next step. Whereas, in International, the draw is usually fast, with a "Flick", and then usually a one-beat hesitation hold before the next step is executed.

Generally speaking, the Argentine is for beginners and newer dancers, and the International is for the advanced or experienced dancers' routines.

The Tango should be executed with narrow base on the feet, that is to say, walking a chalk line. No straddles -- and avoid wiggling the posterior. Always remember that in the art of leading, any unusual motion could be interpreted as a lead motion,. If the female partner feels this motion, it should be interpreted as a lead motion.

FLIP THE DIAMOND CALLERLAB Plus Call #18

Definition

(CALLERLAB April 1985)

Starting formation - Any Diamond.
The centers of the Diamond do a Diamond Circulate to the next position in their diamond, while the points "Flip" 180° into the nearest center position and join hands to become the centers of the forming wave or line. When "flipping" a facing Diamond, the points always take the inside path, and the centers always take the outside

path. Definition of "Flip": The term "Flip" is used to mean an action where the designated dancer(s) will roll 180° in either direction, assuming the position that was originally adjacent to him. It is the same action that would occur if the designated dancer (the "flipper") was asked to do a Run around an imaginary adjacent dancer and into the imaginary dancer's position on the floor.

(Callers NOTE: 1. The "Flip" definition was approved in April 1985; and 2. The Flip the Diamond definition replaces Burleson 1608.)

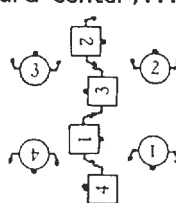
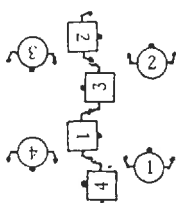
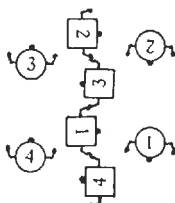
FLIP THE DIAMOND

All examples are started from: Sides Lead Right, Veer Left, 3/4 Tag the Line, Girls Face...

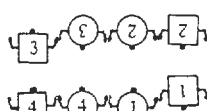
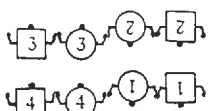
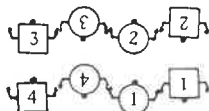
Right (Creates Trailing Diamonds; All dancers have the same hand or shoulder toward the center of their diamond)...

Left (Creates Facing Diamonds; Centers have the hand joined that is opposite from the shoulder of the point dancers)...

Out (or In) (Creates Funny Diamonds; Three dancers have the same hand or shoulder toward center, remaining dancer has opposite hand or shoulder toward center)...



The centers of the Diamond do a Diamond Circulate to the next position in their diamond, while the points "Flip" 180° into the nearest center position and join hands to become the centers of the forming wave or line. When "flipping" a facing Diamond, the points always take the inside path, and the centers always take the outside path.



Dancing Hints

Diamond formations continue to be used more and more frequently. Although the previous examination of this call is still valid (see The Prompter, January 1984), there are additional consideration that can "make life a little easier" when you encounter some of the newer (or less frequently used) formations-- especially the left-handed, facing or funny diamonds.

The most important point continues to be the precise initial formation of the diamond -- the points **must not** have their inside hand touching the center of their diamond (it's **not** a Star). Since only the centers will have their inside hands joined, the point dancers must resist any action (or temptation) to place their hands at the center. Additionally, the point dancers have the more important part in assuring proper completion of the call -- they are the ones who **must** properly execute the "Flip" action.

When you are a point dancer, please try to execute your "Flip" action such that you always: 1.

"Flip" exactly 180° **toward the center** of your diamond (you always turn toward the foot or shoulder that is facing toward the center); 2. "Flip" **in front of** the center dancer who is circulating toward you; and 3. Make sure that you **only** offer the hand that was **toward the center** of your diamond to the center dancer circulating into the point position your leaving. These actions will assure that you complete the call properly.

When you are a center dancer at the start of the call, you must remember to always "yield the right-of-way" to the **dancer in front of you** (the "flipper"). One easy way to do this is to execute your Diamond Circulate in a slightly wider path (or arc) such that you guarantee that the "flipper" will always be in front of you. Additionally, please remember that you will always **join your inside hand** with the only hand you can see on the "flipper" in front of you. These actions should assure that you are "in the proper position at the proper time" upon completion of the call.

March winds may blow and howl, but these great recipes, just received from readers, will warm the tummy!! Enjoy!

MOCHA NUT MUFFINS

- ½ cup butter or margarine
- ¾ cup firmly packed brown sugar
- 3 Tbsp. finely ground coffee
- 2 tsp. vanilla
- 2 large eggs
- ¼ cup dark rum or water
- 1 ¾ cups all purpose flour
- 1½ tsp. baking powder
- 1 bag (12 oz.) semisweet chocolate chips
- 1 cup coarsely chopped walnuts

With electric mixer, beat together until fluffy, the butter, brown sugar, coffee and vanilla. Add eggs, one at a time, then rum; beat well after each addition. Mix flour with baking powder; add to batter, beating slowly to blend, then beat faster until batter is well mixed. Stir in chocolate and nuts. Fill 12 greased muffin cups to the rim. Bake at 350° F. for 25 minutes or until done.

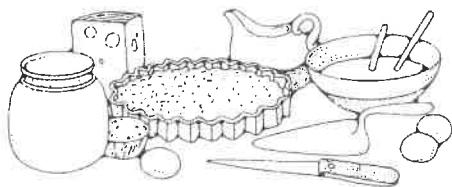
CRUSTLESS SPINACH QUICHE

- 4 Tbsp. melted butter
- 1 cup sugar
- ¾ cup unsalted butter, softened
- 5 eggs
- 8 oz. unsweetened chocolate, melted
- 2 tsp. vanilla
- 1 Tbsp. strong coffee
- 1 cup heavy cream, whipped
- 2 Tbsp. powdered sugar

Mix together the crumbs and the melted butter. Press into bottom and on sides of 9" pie plate. Chill. Beat the sugar and softened butter together until fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Stir in melted chocolate, vanilla and coffee. Beat mixture well and pour into crust. Chill at least 4 hours. Blend cream and sugar; just before serving, spoon over top of pie.

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CIRCULATIN' WITH THE KATYDIDS

Making a statement that the Katydids of Cupertino is a flourishing square dance club is a little like saying that President Reagan is a Republican. Anyone who has ever attended a Katydid affair knows that this group is doing something right.

We recently visited the Katydids at their regular Friday Night club dance and found a very large group of dancers. The club dances nearly 15 squares, and is preceded by a beginners' class of approximately 10 squares. Now that's an active square dance club.

The Katydids was created in September of 1962 by a group of dancers who decided to start a new club in Cupertino. Kenny Steen was selected as the caller and the club

graduated their first class in June of 1963. The first club president was Don Dunham.

The club sponsored its first hoedown in October 1963, the Harvest Moon Hoedown held at Overfelt High School. A look at the flyer for this dance showed a donation of... 75 cents. Times have changed.

Kenny Steen continued to call for the club until 1978 when he was followed by Bill Davis. The club also has an active round dance program with Herb and Ruth Fogel cueing the rounds.

Bill has been calling continuously for over 30 years and has called for eleven different clubs in the Bay Area. He is the author of many square dance calls and has been active in Callerlab since its inception. He has written

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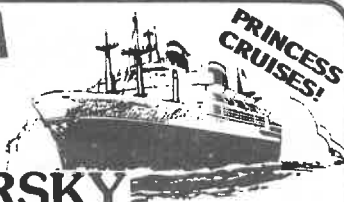
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Left: Caller Bill Davis, Right: Presidents Frank and Avaneil Kirchman

many articles for square dance publications and has published yearly volumes on definitions and choreography. Bill's "better" half is the former Bobbie Berry and she and Bill have two girls.

Bill's program at the Katydids intimately involves the club with the beginners classes. The class is held on the same night as the club. Class starts at 7:00 p.m., with several club couples available to fill in as needed.

The entire club joins the class at 8:00 p.m. for an hour of alternate club and class level tips. The class is over at 9:00 and the club continues for another hour or so of Plus level tips.

This type of program very quickly acquaints the club and class members and gives the class a very

early feeling of "belonging". This approach to classes has been very successful for the Katydids.

The club has a very active social program with many different activities, most of which involve square dancing. They also sponsor golf tournaments, campouts, bowling tournaments, mystery trips, and will dance for any worthwhile cause. Their recent annual Sweetheart Dance was their 22nd. One of their early Sweetheart Dances raised over \$1,000 for the Heart Fund.

Many of the members have been with the club with several years -- two of the couples, Wes and Janet Wessels and Gil and Agi Gilluly, have been active in the club since May of 1965.

The club has continuously published a monthly newsletter



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since 1964. The **CHIRPER** carries dancing information and upcoming events of interest to all club members. The editors are Bob and Ginny Cowie and Morris and Louise Hosoda. The club also has an active Historian, Sandy Franger.

The Katydids dance at Collins School in Cupertino. Current Presidents Frank and Avaneil Kirchman invite you to join the club at their weekly Friday night club dances.
