There are several good dancing opportunities coming up that I'd like to call to your attention. The first weekend in May is a "get-away" weekend with Silver State in Reno and an advanced "Mini-Weekend" in Santa Rosa. If you're staying in town, the Stanford Quads are sponsoring their "2nd Annual Challenging Plus Dance" with John Sybalsky on Saturday, May 3rd. I'm not sure about the plans for this year, but last year the dance was called exactly at the Plus level and not to the floor. After the Plus dance there was a series of star tips which included A-1 and A-2 and the entire series

of Challenge, C-1 through C-4. After it was all finished, the caller got a standing round of applause. John is normally associated with the Challenge movement in the Bay Area, but has worked with the Stanford Quads for several years now. He calls some very interesting choreography if you're interested in a "challenging Plus dance".

There are three good multi-day events which fall on the same weekend in April so you've a choice to make. The "Best Little Weekend in Square Dancing" is being held at the Richmond Auditorium. Sponsored by the Squarenaders Exhibition Group, this is their 5th annual event and the dates are April 11 - 13. On this same weekend the 5th Annual "Spring Fling" is being held in King City, and the 7th Annual "Spring Jamboree" is being held in Lodi. Any of these weekends will give you plenty of square and round dancing opportunities at a variety of levels. It's great to have this kind of availability, but it does make for a difficult choice.

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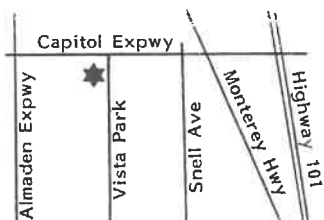
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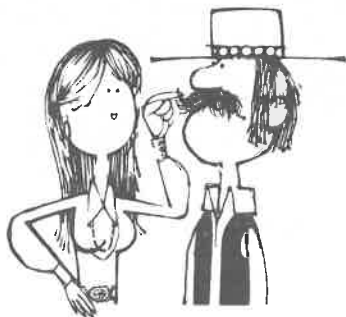
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"OUR" OPINION !

Please renew our subscription for another year. We enjoy reading about the Santa Clara Valley activities, and the many people we know. It keeps us "in touch".

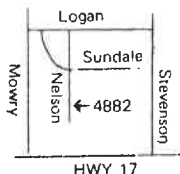
We recently attended the Rhythm Records Weekend in San



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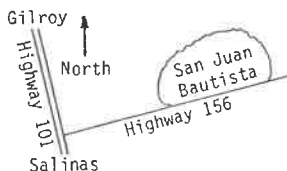
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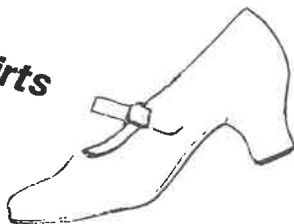
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Jose and were surprised to find the "die hard dancers" from years back were missing! There were very few people whom we knew or recognized.

The choice of the word Styling may have been unfortunate, but it seemed the most appropriate at the time.

However, whatever word is chosen to describe the points in the article, the ideas in it are still appropriate, and not just for Advanced and Challenge dancers. I think it is essential that anyone considering going on to Advanced and Challenge give serious thought to the points brought up in the article, because the figures are harder and the formations are more varied than at Mainstream and Plus. But Mainstream and Plus dancers can also benefit from thinking

about where they are in the formations and where they're going in the call. Everyone likes to be in a square that doesn't break down, and by working as a team and thinking about where they are and where they're going, dancers can improve their success rate.

'ROUND' ABOUT

OTHER LATIN DANCES CHA CHA, RUMBA, BOLERO, AND PASO DOBLES

The Cha Cha is a Latin dance, performed to 4/4 music, whose rhythm is further refined to be: S,S; Q,Q,S;. But there are some variations such as 4&1 Cha Cha. This usually implies international Cha Cha -- more difficult to perform due to the rhythm variation.

Although the rhythm is similar to the Tango, it is an entirely different flavor of dancing. Basically, for the beginner, the difference is noted as when the dance direction changes. In the Cha, the direction change will occur in the first measure, on the second **slow** step, with the direction remaining the same through the remainder of the next measure: i.e., Rock Fwd, **Recover**; Back, 2, 3; Rock Back, **Recover**; Forward, 2, 3;. The direction change is on the **recover** step, while the remaining steps are executed in the same direction. The basic rhythm is S,S; Q,Q,S; requiring two measures of music.

The most popular Cha Chas for round dancers are probably **Folsom Prison Blues**, **Doodley Cha** and **The Millionaire**; These dances have all been very popular with easy level round dancers.

There are many Latin dances that are still popular, but difficulty level or scarcity of records (music) keeps them in a lower profile. **Tonite Carmen**, **The High Life**, **WOW** or **Cecelia** and others like



Four and One or Eye Level Cha are popular at higher level dances.

From the standpoint of beginners' dances, the Rumba or Bolero (slower) are really not much more than a two-step with most of the Rumba flavor created by the music and perhaps a little more of the knee bends and hips swishing as a part of the personal styling. The more advanced figures would be difficult to explain in a short time.

The best examples of easy Rumbas are probably **Maria**, **Non Dementicar**, **Taste of the Wind**. All three have received good response at the easy level. Again they are basically a two-step with music providing the impetus to Latin Rumba styling.

The steps that might be new: **Bolero Box**, **Cucurachas**, **Lariats**, **Elevations**, **Gaucha Rocks** and **Gaucha Turns**.

The Paso Dobles dance is a very staccato type of dance with many flicks and cape movements. The Paso Dobles came from the entrance march for the Spanish Royal Court members. The present use is in the bull fight arenas as well as Spanish folk-style dancing. The Paso Dobles is not as popular as the Tango or Cha Cha and Rumba in the square dance picture. Only two or three have survived, namely **El Adorna**, **Spanish Gypsy Dance**, **El Toreador**, and **Corredo**.

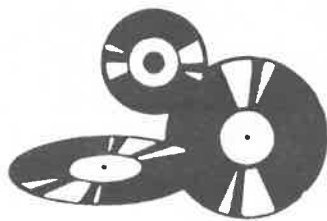

The 1986 National Square Dance Directory is now available. They call it "National", but it's really worldwide and includes square, round, contra, clogging and folk dance clubs. Over 10,000 clubs are listed as well as directories for products and services, callers and leaders, and festivals -- and still only \$7.00.

You've heard about the Million Dollar Slip -- now Square Up Fashions has come out with a Million and a Half Dollar Slip. Same type of nylon fabric with a Velcro closing at the waist and some fantastic colors -- how about a denim blue?

Mona, the mother of Doris of Crystal Magic Slips, makes wonderful knitted and crocheted shawls, shrugs and sweaters, and you should see her newest creation. It's a sweater of acrylic yarn, pick your color, is waist-length and has ruffles (knitted) at the neck, wrists and waist. Really cute -- you'll see me in a navy blue one soon.

And speaking of sweaters, Boulevard Knitwear now has their to-the-waist square dance sweater available in off-white and rust.

C & C's new pattern is a dress with an eight-gore skirt with

ruffled V insets. The bodice and sleeves also have ruffled V insets. I'm anxious to see this made up. They show it in a plaid with solid insets.

Those of you who are "into" eagles will want to see the new eagle head necklaces and tie slides -- gold (not real) and with a rhinestone eye.

This book is not new, but publicity chairmen may find it very helpful. It's a book published by American Square Dance Magazine, titled "Show and Sell". It tells you the "how to" of sending news releases into newspapers and how to get them on radio and television and has many good ideas on selling square dancing, including some good poster ideas and helps on putting together good posters. It has a section on demos and talks about the image we want to promote. Lots of good reading and ideas.

This is a slow month for new records, but you don't want to miss: "I'll Dance the Two Step" on Ranch House (801) by Art Tangen, using Chain Down the Line; and a good Riverboat release, "This Train" (230) by Larry Marchese, using Plus moves. Hope to have a lot more for you next month.

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Fashionable Thoughts

We have been asked to rerun the Japanese Lantern Sleeve pattern. It makes up into a beautiful sleeve which will be the highlight of any dress.

JAPANESE LANTERN SLEEVE

Pattern Parts:

JLS 1 & 2 - (inserts for bottom part of sleeve) Cut 2 of each out of plain fabric.

JLS 3 - (band) Cut 2 out of plain fabric.

JLS 4 - (inserts for top of sleeve) Cut 4 out of print and cut 4 out of plain fabric for each sleeve.

Pattern has 1/4" and 5/8" seam allowances figured into the pieces as pictured. These pattern pieces are sized for a Misses 10/12.

Instructions for Sewing:

1. Place all patterns on straight of fabric for cutting.

2. Cut pattern pieces as indicated and mark seams/notches.

3. Staystitch all edges before sewing together to prevent raveling.

4. Allow for 1/4" seams on pattern sections JLS 4, and 5/8" seams at underarm seam of JLS 1 & 2, joining of sleeve to band (JLS 3) and joining of sleeve to armhole of bodice.

5. Join all JLS 4 pattern pieces for one sleeve -- alternating plain and print sections -- accent with contrast piping or lace in the seams. You may baste piping/lace to plain sections prior to joining seams to eliminate fabric movement during sewing of fabric pieces.

6. Join "lantern section" (alternating JLS 4 sections) to front and back sections, JLS 1 & 2.

7. Gather bottom of sleeve from front single notch to back single notch. Adjust fullness later.

8. Gather top of sleeve starting at single notch across top of inserts to back double notch. Adjust fullness later.

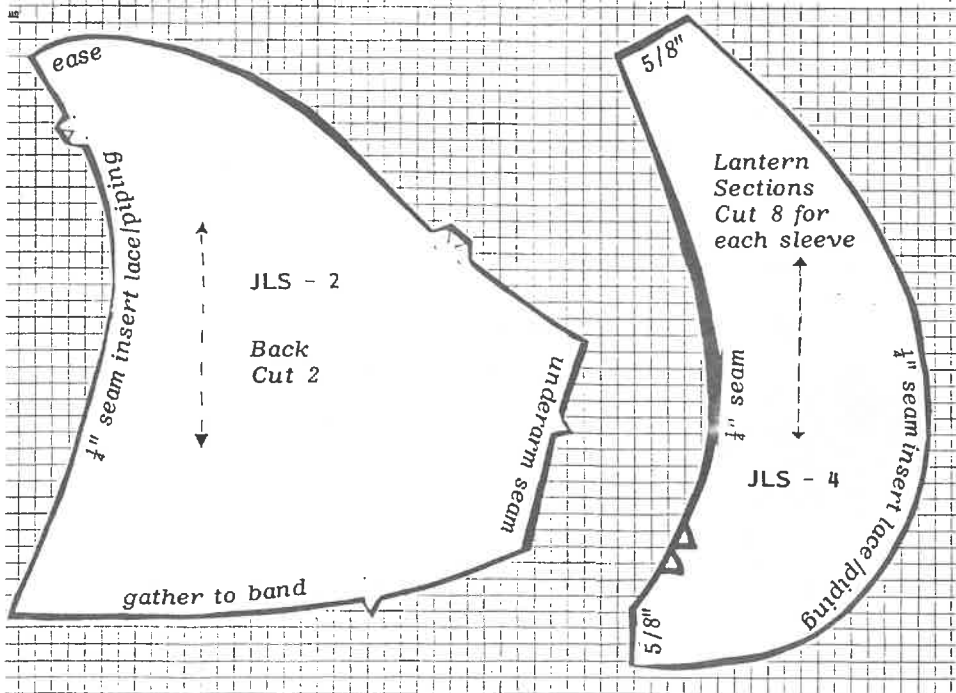
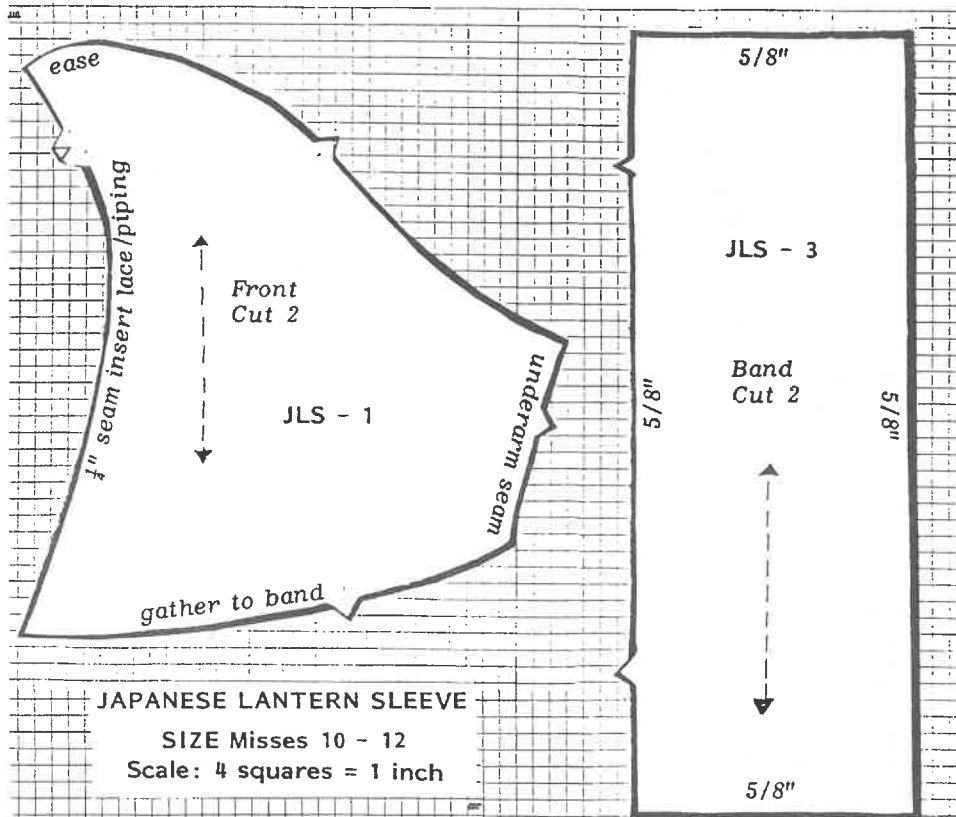
9. Lay arm band (JLS 3) and bottom of lantern sleeve right sides together. Adjust gathering to fit the arm band length. Stitch together. Clip seam for easing.

10. Stitch arm band ends and sleeve underarm seam together with right side of fabrics facing.

11. Fold sleeve band right side to wrong side of lantern sleeve, roll edge and blindman stitch to finish.

12. Join top of finished sleeve to bodice arm hole, adjusting top sleeve gathering done in Step 8. Stitch to secure. Clip seam for easing.

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June 26, 27, 28, 1986

Points of interest in Indianapolis can turn a trip to the 35th National Square Dance Convention in June into a vacation in the Hoosier capital.

Here are some should-see attractions:

Indianapolis Motor Speedway:

The place that made Indianapolis famous is intact with all its heritage dating to 1911. Inside the famous 2½-mile track is the Speedway Hall of Fame Museum with one of the world's largest and most varied collections of cars, including more than 25 which won the 500-Mile Race. The museum is open every day, trips can be taken around the race track, and souvenirs and photos are available. Small fee for museum and track tour.

Woodruff Place: Carved from 80 acres in 1872, this residential area with four fountain-spotted drives still echoes a Victorian era. Many of the homes have been restored. Woodruff Place was included in the National Register of Historic Places in 1972. What was once a "suburb" in Indianapolis is now a charming automobile drive through the past.

Hook's Historic Drug Store: Open every day at the Indiana State Fairgrounds, this drug store features walnut fixtures, ornately carved and accentuated with arched glass advertising signs, which date to 1850. A museum displays drug store artifacts from bygone days. The working soda fountain "builds" sodas the way they were once prepared.

President Harrison's Home: The only man elected U.S. President from Indiana built his home in the capital city in 1875. Now open to the public, it has been restored as

a memorial to Benjamin Harrison, 23rd president. After serving his presidential term, Harrison lived in the house until his death in 1901. A third-floor ballroom in the home houses artifacts from Harrison's personal and professional life. Small charge.

Children's Museum: The largest children's museum in the world is free and as interesting for adults as it is for children. Contains an operating antique carousel, historic locomotive, log cabin and one of the largest model train exhibits in existence. Many exhibits allow museum visitors to handle display items.

Indiana State Museum: The former Indianapolis city hall is a showcase of Indiana heritage with both permanent and changing exhibits. Its central permanent feature is a pendulum which hangs from a free-turning axis and illustrates that the earth turns. As the hours pass and the building moves with the earth, the pendulum maintains its arch and topples pins to illustrate the changing position of the building. Free.

Riley Home: Poet James Whitcomb Riley left more than a legacy of verse; his home in Indianapolis, built in 1872, has been called one of the two most perfectly preserved Victorian homes in the United States. It can be toured for a small charge.

Conner Prairie: A 30-minute drive from downtown Indianapolis takes you to a living pioneer museum where the year is always 1836 and the actors portray residents of an Indiana village. Extensive gift shop; dining facilities; admission charged.

BEYOND MAINSTREAM

DIXIE GRAND CALLERLAB Plus Call #24

Definition

(CALLERLAB April 1985)
Starting formation - Dixie Grand Circle, Double Pass Thru, Quarter Tag, or any formation in which only four of eight dancer can start.

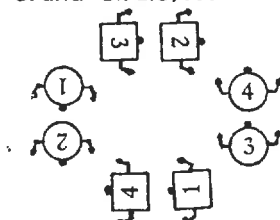
Leaders start the call by joining right hands with the facing

dancer and pulling by. Each dancer moves ahead around the circle and gives a left hand to the next, pulling by, and a right hand to the next, pulling by. Regardless of the starting formation, as the movement progresses, the formation converts to a circle.

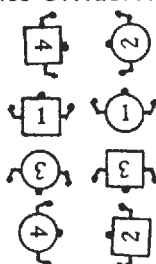
(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #46.)

DIXIE GRAND

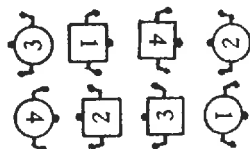
4 Ladies Chain, Sides Rollaway, Circle Right, Boys Turn Back (Dixie Grand Circle)...



Heads Pass Thru, Sides Divide...



4 Ladies Chain, Sides Lead Right, Swing Thru, Boys Run, Tag the Line-In, Slide Thru (Magic Column)...



Leaders start the call by joining right hands with the facing dancer and pulling by. Each dancer moves ahead around the circle and gives a left hand to the next, pulling by, and a right hand to the next, pulling by. (Regardless of the starting formation, as the movement progresses, the formation converts to a circle.)

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Dancing Hints

Dixie Grand continues to be rather infrequently used at most Plus dances; and it usually occurs as the last call before an Allemande Left. Nevertheless, this call can be used from some 'strange' or unusual formations in addition to the 'more normal' (starting) Double Pass Thru formation (see The Prompter, July 1984). Although the July 1984 data for this call is still valid, there are some additional points that can help you execute this call in a successful manner.

Remembering that all 'Dixie' calls start with half of the dancers in the formation active with a right hand, immediately before all dancers in the formation become active with a left hand, will help you achieve success with ALL 'Dixie' calls. For Dixie Grand, the starting dancers execute a 'three-hand' (or Baby) Right & Left Grand; while the trailing (or initially inactive) dancers execute a two-hand Left & Right Grand.

When you are a lead (or starting) dancer, you will either be facing each other or will have right hands joined with each other immediately before executing Dixie Grand. Therefore, you must quickly establish: 1) That you are 'the leader'; and 2) Exactly who you must execute the initial 'right pull by' with before you extend a left hand to the nearest inactive dancer. Additionally, when you extend your left hand to the inactive dancer, you should remember that this dancer's natural tendency will be to extend a right

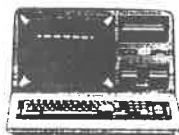
hand to you to start their action. You can assist this dancer by exaggerating your 'reach' for this dancer's left hand by turning your left shoulder toward this dancer (intentionally making your own right hand unavailable to the next dancer). Once the proper left hands are joined, the completion of the call tends to 'just fall into place' for proper execution.

Once again, the trailing (initially inactive) dancers have a very important part in the proper execution of this call. When you are 'the trailer (or inactive)', your actions can be improved by: 1) Remembering to avoid your tendency to use your right hand; your action MUST start with a left hand -- You should 'be ready with a left'; and 2) Quickly 'readjusting' if you happen to see the dancer coming toward you with a left hand when you have forgotten that you are NOT 'active with a right'-- The dancer coming toward you is 'only trying to help you' distinguish the proper hand.

Please note that each formation shown (and the one in July 1984) is nothing more than a slight modification of the Dixie Grand Circle example. In each case, this Dixie Grand Circle has merely been 'compressed' (or 'indexed') to show a very slightly different formation. ALL Dixie Grand starting formations are therefore only slight changes to the actual Dixie Grand Circle. Dancers always execute 'Dixie' calls along a single file track with dancers immediately in front on the SAME track.



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Stir The Bucket With Betty

April is a great month for cooks. It's not too warm to use the oven frequently and it's not so cool that you don't want to try salads and cold treats.

Pat Shank is our featured cook for this month and has generously shared some delicious treats that are "tried and true". Many thanks, Pat.

DOUBLE BRAN MUFFINS

- 1 cup 100% bran cereal
- 1 cup boiling water
- 2 eggs
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 cup white sugar
- 1/2 cup salad oil
- 2 cups buttermilk
- 2 1/2 cups flour
- 2 1/2 tsp. soda
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 2 cups 100% bran cereal

Combine 1 cup bran cereal and boiling water; set aside to cool. In large bowl beat eggs with sugars and oil, stir in buttermilk. Mix flour, soda and salt; combine with egg/buttermilk mixture. Stir in 2 cups bran cereal. Stir in bran/water mixture. To bake, fill muffin tins 1/2 full and bake at 400° F. for approximately 20 minutes. Makes 30 muffins. Batter can be stored, refrigerated, in covered jar in for 3 weeks.

ORANGE CRANBERRY BREAD

- 2 cups flour
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1 1/2 tsp. baking powder
- 1/2 tsp. soda
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 egg, well beaten
- 3/4 cup orange juice

- 1/4 cup margarine, melted
- 1 cup raw cranberries, cut in half

Measure and mix dry ingredients thoroughly in medium mixing bowl. In small mixing bowl, beat egg and add orange juice, margarine and cranberries. Mix with dry ingredients to moisten. Do not beat. Fill well-greased and floured 9"x5" bread pan. Bake at 350° for 1 hour. If using a glass pyrex loaf pan reduce oven temperature to 325°.

RAW APPLE CAKE

- 1/2 cup shortening
- 2 cups sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 2 cups flour
- 1 tsp. soda
- 1 tsp. baking powder
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. cinnamon
- 1 cup nuts
- 1 cup dates or raisins
- 4 cups sliced apples

Frosting:

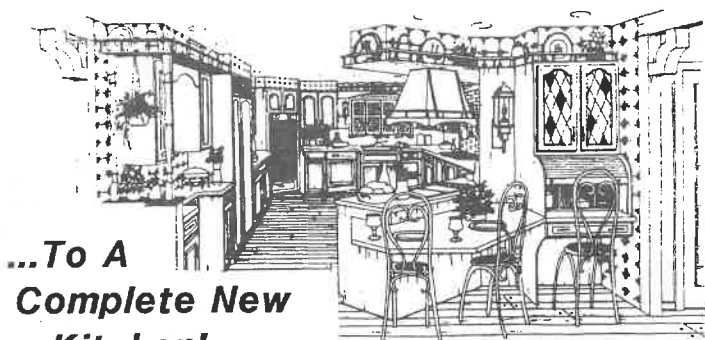
- 6 Tbsp. butter
- 2/3 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 tsp. vanilla
- 1 cup coconut
- 1/4 cup cream or canned milk

Cream shortening and sugar, add eggs and vanilla and beat well. Add dry ingredients and mix well. Add nuts and dates, or raisins, and mix. Add sliced apples and mix. Place in well-greased 9"x13" pan and bake at 350° F. for 45 to 60 minutes. Mix frosting ingredients together and spread on warm cake. Brown under broiler -- watching closely!

IN MEMORY OF A FRIEND TO SQUARE DANCING

(On Wednesday, March 5th, Mac McClure died suddenly of a heart attack. The following is a composite of memorials written by Wil & Millie Smith and Red & Reva Null.)

Mac McClure, a native of Leesville, Louisiana, a World War II Veteran who served in the Tank corps, a retired employee of United Airlines, and a resident of Los Altos, California for 29 years, was indeed a friend to square dancing.

Mac and his wife, Mary, joined the Covered Wagons' beginners' class in 1960. When that club disbanded in 1962, they joined the Spinning Wheels of Los Altos. They have been square and round dancing for 26 years and are still members of Spinning Wheels as well as Star Eights, Sues 'N Ques, and Star Rounds.

Through the years, Mac and Mary held numerous leadership positions in their club and in the Santa Clara Valley Square Dancers Association. Prior to being elected and serving as president of the Association from November 1970 to November 1972, they had been delegates, by-laws committee members, directors, and Vice-President. They have also served on several Jubilee Convention committees and were General Chairman for the 1974 Jubilee.

Mac and Mary also were active volunteers in State Council, having

been chairman of the committee which achieved Council's incorporation and obtained for it a non-profit status in the State of California; and serving on several State Convention committees and acting as the legal officer for Council.

Mac and Mary were LEGACY trustees and, for over ten years, members of the National Folk Dance Committee, serving as Chairman for a part of that time. They were instrumental in getting Square Dancing designated the "National Folk Dance of the Year".

The McClures helped to organize United Square Dancers of America, write the by-laws which established the structure of USDA and were current Ways & Means Chairman.

In 1984 Mac and Mary were recipients of the "Silver Spur Award", presented by the "American Square Dance Society" to persons who are instrumental in the development and promotion of square dancing.

Not only was square dancing a part of Mac's life, but Mac was a part of square dancing. Our sympathy goes to Mac's wife Mary, their two daughters, and the family.

I know psychiatrists are going to have their theories about all this -- how maybe I'm afraid to face life or some such thing. I assure you that is not the case. I love life.

It's mornings I hate.

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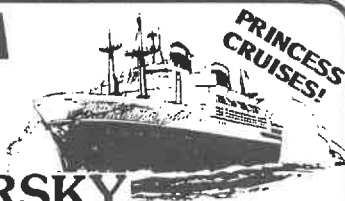
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Frank Grundeen

Cartoonist - Laureate

If this activity had a cartoonist-laureate, it very well could have been Frank Grundeen. Frank, a free-lance artist whose credits included work with the Walt Disney organization, came into square dancing in 1947 when he and Ethel, his wife, joined one of Bob Osgood's classes at Beverly Hills (California) High School.

It was just at this time that a new square dance magazine was about to be born and Frank was recruited on the spot as its "official cartoonist". With the introduction of *Sets in Order*, in November 1948, Frank drew the first of his 444 cartoons that would

appear on the back cover of each issue for the next 37 years.

Over the years, Frank's ideas captured the joy and friendliness of the activity. No phase of square dancing was spared. The dancers, callers, round dancers, new dancers -- all aspects of square dancing were singled out at one time or another. He saw the fun side of everything and shared it with many thousands of dancers over the years.

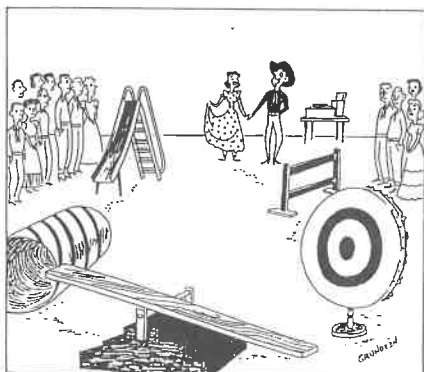
With the closing of *Sets in Order* (Square Dancing Magazine) in December 1985, Frank's work with the magazine was complete. Somehow he must have known this for, barely three weeks into the new year, Frank passed away suddenly and without any lingering illness. He will be missed but, as in the case of the magazine itself, he has said his piece and, hopefully, future generations of square dancers will have occasion to enjoy his work.

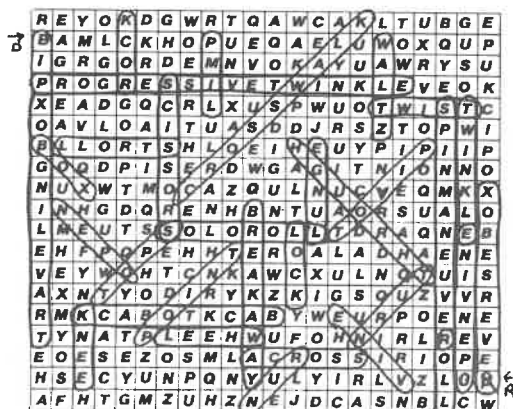
