Betty and I have just recently returned from the Fifth Advanced and Challenge Spectacular. This is the dance that all the Advanced and Challenge enthusiasts look forward to every year. The dance was held at the Hayward Convention Center, about the best facility for a weekend event of this type that I've ever seen. There are several halls, some of which will hold 50-60 squares. All the halls have wood floors or very danceable tight weave carpet.

PACE, the organization which sponsors this event, had four halls going at all times. The callers are

all nationally known and this year included Lee Kopman, Ross Howell, Dave Hodson and Dave Stevens. The event was well attended (over 40 squares) and everyone seemed to be having a good time. What else could be expected with this line-up of callers.

PACE is having some "growing pains" with the number of Advanced dancers that they're able to attract. This is true not only of their weekend events, but also of their monthly dances. What makes this hard to understand is the quality of the PACE callers is hard to beat. The only thing I can figure out is that they don't do enough advertising at the "grass roots" level to make these callers better known to our local dancers. There are a lot of Advanced dancers in the Bay Area, but they just don't turn out for the PACE dances like they should. One thing I'd suggest to PACE that they haven't tried is to send a committee of two or three dancers to each Advanced club the week

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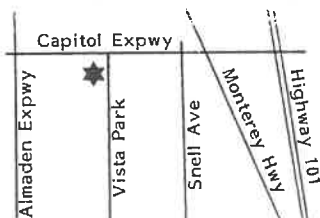
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"OUR" OPINION !

On Wednesday, March 26th, the members of CALLERLAB who were in attendance at the 13th Annual Convention in Baltimore passed two resolutions which, it is hoped, will reverse the current decline in square dancing's popularity.

Over the past several months, much has been written about the difficulty of recruiting and retaining dancers -- especially in areas such as ours where there is no Mainstream Program. One of the key factors identified was the number of moves a new dancer must learn to become a "club" dancer, and the resulting length of beginners' classes. In most urban areas, new dancers face a class length in excess of 12 months to learn all the moves through the Plus Program -- a requirement if they hope to join a club and attend open dances.

In November 1985, a number of square dance leaders gathered at Cope Crest, in Georgia, at what has come to be known as the Crossfire Meeting. The focus of the meeting was clear -- the continuing decline

in the number of active dancers translated directly into smaller and fewer clubs, reduced attendance at festivals, and reduced sales and availability of clothing, records, and publications. Again, the number of moves and the length of classes were identified as major problems.

Based on input from its membership, CALLERLAB had established an Ad Hoc Committee to consider ways to reduce the size of the lists. There were many possible solutions, but no clear direction. There was general agreement on the need to eliminate some moves. The question was, which moves, and how many? How long would it take a committee to agree on a recommendation? And what of the general membership. It was CALLERLAB who established the separate Basic, Mainstream, Plus 1 and Plus 2 Programs, and later voted to combine Plus 1 and 2 into the current Plus Program. Since the establishment of the lists, new moves were added, but seldom were moves deleted.

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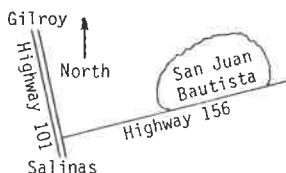
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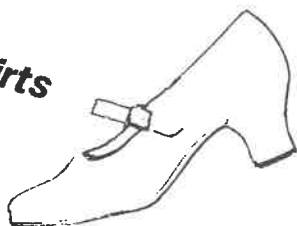
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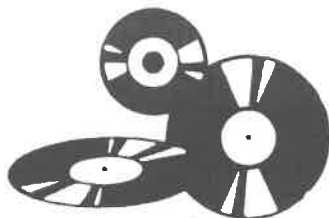
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WHAT'S NEW!!

We mentioned in an earlier edition that "Sets in Order" Magazine would no longer be around and that's so, but they will continue to print their booklets (what would we do without the invaluable, inexpensive basic books?). They've issued a new booklet called "Creative Handiwork". It's full of patterns for knitted and crocheted capes, sweaters, and stoles that have been previously published in the magazine. Now, all you nimble-fingered ladies will have plenty of good ideas to work on.

Have you seen the new magazine that hopes to replace "Sets in Order"? It's 8" x 11", printed on glossy stock, is published in Poulsbo, Washington, and is called "Square and Round Dance International".

We just returned from Callerlab in Baltimore, Maryland, where we came across a new shoe, sold only by a caller's wife named Dot, and they are called "Dots". The shoes are very soft and are available in a flat or with a 2 1/4" heel. They have swede soles, and come in the usual colors plus green, pink, and orange. Keep an eye out for them, maybe someone out here will pick

them up.

The newly revised, seventh edition of "Basic Calls for Advanced and Challenge Square Dancing" by Milt Strong, and edited by Ed Foote, is now available. A "must have" for Advanced classes, it not only has all the basics defined and diagrammed, but also covers fundamental formations (do you ever wonder who really is a leader and who's the trailer?), a "Code of Conduct" for tape workshops, and the teaching order for Advanced Program Basics... AND the price is still the same... about \$9.00.

"Kiwi Circle" on Lloyd Shaw label is finally available in this area. It's that cute, easy mixer presented by Jack Murtha at last year's teachers' seminar at the Jubilee.

Other records to catch this month are "Who's in the Strawberry Patch" on Chinook (069) by Bob Stutevoss, using Mainstream basics; "Cajun Moon" by Paul Marcum on ESP (317); and "Buckshot Hoedown" on Rawhide's second label, Buckskin (1510). It has a jaw harp... very different.

DANCING THE FOX TROTS

Fox Trots were supposedly invented by Harry Fox. The music is 4/4 and the usual rhythm is S,Q,Q, with variations to keep it interesting. The fox trot has an inverted two-step rhythm, and basically it uses waltz figures. It can be said it is a **hybrid** dance; from waltzing and two-step.

Fox Trots are usually created by the 'amalgamation' of four measures of basics, sixteen beats of music. Two Reverse Turns, followed by a Hover, and a Chasse to CP facing wall. Leading into a Whisk, a Weave 6 to banjo, Natural Turn to banjo. Into an Open Impetus, Feather Finish, Fishtail, Three Step to CP LOD. Open Telemark, Fall Away Hover, Top Spin, Hesitation Change. Sixteen measures of music and a "free style" Fox Trot. Try it, you'll like it.

There are other figures used in the Fox Trot also: Three Step, Feather Step, Natural Turn, Reverse Turn, Change of Direction, Reverse Weave, Impetus Turn, Natural Telemark, Top Spin, and Promenade Weave. This is in no way a complete list of Fox Trot figures, but if we can execute all these figures, we could get by on most occasions.

It's important to remember that in the Fox Trot the "walk step" is used to join two figures, and also in many cases, the last step of one figure is used as the first step of the next figure. This can confuse the novice.

A good example of this construction is seen in the amalgamation of the Feather Step, Three Step, and Natural Turn.

Thus it can be observed that the last step of the Three Step is used as the first step of the Natural Turn. This type of rhythm choreography is one of the most difficult characteristics that newer dancers have learning, however, it makes the dance interesting.

In many Fox Trot figures we can see 'complimentary action' between two figures. A Reverse Telemark (turning left) is a complimentary figure to an Impetus Turn, meaning the footwork for the man in one figure is similar to that of the woman in the other figure, and vice versa. This is really not too much different from an analysis of "two right-faced waltz turns". If we really scrutinize the figure, we see the man is doing the same footwork as the woman in the second half of the turn, and the woman is really doing the same footwork as the man did in the first half of the figure.

In order to be a really accomplished dancer, we should analyze all the figures under the same light, and we will determine that each person quite often has to

Realizing that each new dance rhythm is like learning a new language, we should try to master all the VERBS of one dance before trying to learn another. We don't want to get our VERBS mixed up!



Fashionable Thoughts

This is the second in our "re-run" series of sleeve patterns. The Tulip Petal Sleeve is flattering to the slender or full-figured upper arm and is so very easy to put together. A "big plus" for this pattern is that it will fit a size 10 to 16... at least that's what I've been told!

TULIP PETAL SLEEVE

1. Cut the pattern pieces as labeled. Use a lace trim around all edges to add a bit of femininity and a softer look. Piping finishes the sleeve beautifully, but creates a more tailored effect.

2. Mark seam lines carefully and staystitch all edges.

3. Pin lace trim to seam line of pattern A section of dress fabric on right side. Stitch into place.

4. Place right side of lining to matching right side of fabric with lace. Pin and stitch into place. Trim seam and clip to ease.

5. Reverse fabric and press flat.

6. Stitch top of pattern A within 1/8" of edge to close. Stitch along 5/8" seam at top of pattern A with basting stitch and gather to ease to a 2 - 2 1/2" width.

7. Join dress fabric pattern B sections on 5/8" underarm seam. Do likewise with lining sections. Press seams open.

8. Pin lace to outside seam line of pattern B dress fabric on right side. Stitch into place.

9. Place right sides of lining and dress fabric of pattern B section together. Pin and stitch.

10. Trim and clip seams.

11. Reverse and press flat.

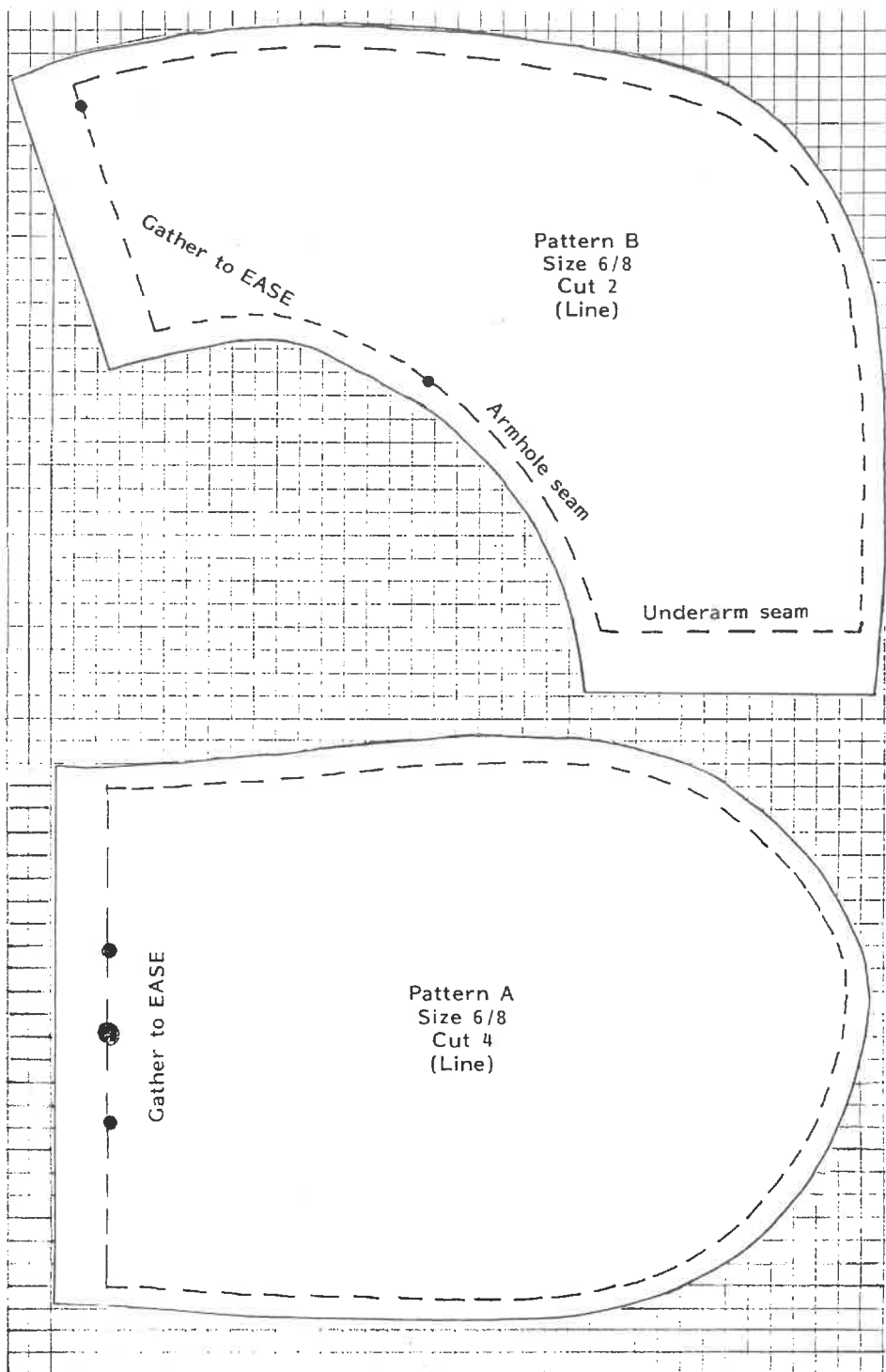
12. Sew all open seams 1/8" from edge to close. Using a basting stitch, make a double row of stitches for gathering dot-to-dot on each side of sleeve pattern A from small dot to outside of pattern piece. Gather to ease.

13. Match small dots on pattern B to small dots on top of pattern A section. Laying pattern B over pattern A, tack into place.

14. Pin sleeve, matching underarm seams and matching large dot to shoulder seam. Ease gathering to armhole and pin into place. Stitch sleeve into place.

15. Clip seam to ease.

16. Repeat process for second sleeve.

The definition for Cross Run now states that if the ends are to Cross Run, and they are facing in the same direction, they will pass right shoulders -- However, if the centers are to do it, they pass left shoulders. I don't know about you, but I am starting to "Run" into people because all are so confused now that most of the time we don't know what to do.

It seems that Callerlab is now forming a committee to determine which calls from the Basic, Mainstream and Plus lists can be capably taught in twenty-five weeks. Unfortunately, we were told that this list is not to replace the other lists immediately, but is to be available to those who want to start moving their groups toward it. Now that ought to get really interesting if we all decide to use a different list. This new list is being set up to reduce the teaching time for dancers, and also will use the most used calls. Does that sound anything like a frequency list that has been discussed many times in the past issues of The Prompter? I suppose since it is now Callerlab's idea, instead of a Bill Davis' idea, it will be okay to do it.

In the same department, a pamphlet from the Advanced Committee now recognizes three levels of Advanced. I am sure that you longtime readers of The Prompter will remember that "new" idea also. Ed Foote, in his recent issue of NNN, suggests different names for the levels as he feels the word hard is not descriptive of the top level. While we feel a rose by any other name applies here, we would tend to buy the term "solid" Advanced that he is promoting.

Stir The Bucket With Betty

Our featured cooks for this month are Marge Spicher and Pat Shank. Both of these lovely ladies are great cooks! The following recipes are absolutely delicious! I know these will be favorites of yours, too! Bon Appetit!

SPINACH SALAD

- 2 bunches spinach, washed, dried and torn into bite-sized pieces
- 8 slices bacon, fried well, drained and crumbled
- 1½ cups large curd cottage cheese (optional)

Dressing:

- 1 cup salad oil
- ¼ cup cider vinegar
- ¼ cup sugar
- 1 tsp. salt
- ¼ tsp. pepper
- 1 tsp. dry mustard
- 1 Tbsp. poppy seed
- 1 Tbsp. juice scraped from onion

Mix dressing ingredients together. Shortly before serving mix half of the dressing with the cottage cheese. Toss this mixture with the spinach and the bacon. Add enough of the remaining dressing to moisten salad to your liking. Serves 8.

BOSTON CLAM CHOWDER

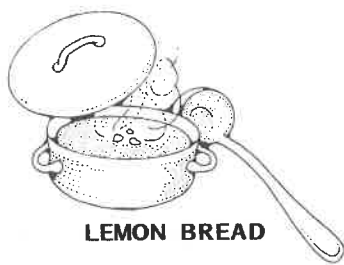
- 1 cup diced bacon
- 1 cup butter
- 1 cup chopped onion
- 1/2 stick celery, chopped
- 2 tsp. smashed garlic
- 3 Tbsp. thyme
- 1 bay leaf

-May 1986-

- 2 quarts clam broth
- 3 large potatoes, peeled and diced
- 2 lbs. chopped clams
- 1 quart half-and-half
- 1 quart heavy cream

Saute bacon until crispy. Remove bacon bits and add ½ cup butter to bacon fat. Add onion, celery, garlic, thyme, bay leaf and saute until translucent. Dust with flour and cook until nutty aroma (3-5 minutes). Add clam broth and bring to a boil; lower to simmer and skim surface. Add diced potatoes, simmer until almost tender. Add chopped clams. Whip in remaining butter; add half-and-half and cream. Serves 11 generously.

The final lap of the race to the 35th National Square Dance Convention is in progress in Indianapolis, Indiana. The spectators are all standing and cheering. Dancers are racing at top speed as they enter the fourth and final turn of the race. Spirits are at a peak as the finish line and checkered flag near. Months have gone by since the entries were received in preparation for the Victory Lane Celebration.

On Wednesday, June 25, 1986, dancers will start participating in the festivities by attending Trail End Dances. Each evening at 11:00 p.m. there will be after parties for even more dancing pleasure. Thirty-one exhibition groups have accepted invitations to perform at the convention. They are exciting to watch -- hope you get a chance to see them all perform.

Attending the 35th National Square Dance Convention will be one of the most exciting and memorable events any dancer could behold. Our advice is not to miss it and to get all the rest you can before arriving. We hope you will enjoy dancing at our Convention as much as we have enjoyed planning it for you!

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"THE WORLD'S GREATEST SQUARE DANCE EVENT"
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INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA

Square dancers coming to Indiana for the 35th National Square Dance Convention June 26-28, 1986, will find themselves in the heart of travel and recreational opportunities.

Any spot in Indiana -- from spectacular caves in the south to frothy Lake Michigan in the north to the rambling Wabash River on the west to King's Island (Disneyland of the Midwest) just across the eastern boundary -- can be comfortably visited by car from Indianapolis in one day.

Indianapolis itself, site of the convention, has the world-famous Indianapolis Motor Speedway and its museum as premier attractions; but there is much more.

Lockerbie Square, complete with cobblestones, marks the era of children's poet James Whitcomb Riley. Scottish Rite Cathedral is the nation's largest devoted exclusively to Masonic activities and boasts an interior beauty unmatched in more modern structures.

Monument Circle, the hub of the city, is unique in the nation. It combines history, art, tribute to the past and a panorama of the city from 284 feet in the air.

Nearby City Market is one of the few surviving original marketplaces in the nations. It features shops, groceries, butchers, bakers, and a wide selection of food to be eaten on the spot or carried to picturesque munching facilities just outside the building.

Conner Prairie Pioneer Settlement is a perpetual celebration of the year 1836 in Indiana; Lilly Center permits a peek at one of the world's largest pharmaceutical firms; President Benjamin Harrison's home recalls the lifestyle of Indiana's only first executive; Indianapolis Museum of Art is a

leader in collections and decor; Indiana State Museum features main street Indiana and a huge pendulum which demonstrates the earth's rotation, and the Indianapolis Children's Museum is the largest in the world and a place where adults are sometimes even more beguiled than are children.

Besides these pleasant vacation-like attractions, Indianapolis offers a plentiful list of daily living pluses:

More than 125 shops serve downtown Indianapolis. Five major malls, all under roof, dot the suburbs. A major collection of shops, restaurants and nightclubs will open just before the convention in historic Union Station, connected to the Hoosier Dome and the convention center by a walkway.

In a survey of 30 metropolitan areas in the United States, only two cities had a lower price index than Indianapolis -- meaning: bargains in housing, transportation and food.

Three major downtown banks handle foreign currency. Seven local television stations are part of full-cable networks broadcasting to Indianapolis. Twenty-three radio stations offer car radios everything from rock to religion, news to nuttiness.

Square dancers will be part of the nearly 1,000,000 who attend conventions in Indianapolis annually. Total visitors to the Hoosier capital are approaching 5,000,000 a year.

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HOUSING UPDATE

Housing at this point is still in adequate supply outside the downtown area. Large groups might find it difficult to obtain housing together in the major chain hotel/motels, however, requests will be scrutinized to offer the best housing placement possible. Special requests should be directed to the Housing Chairman (317)881-6970.

RIDE FOR \$9.00

Unlimited air-conditioned shuttle bus service will be provided from Indianapolis area hotels and motels to the Convention Center for only \$9.00 during the 35th National Square Dance Convention.

The \$9.00 ticket will provide rides any time on the shuttle bus

for all three days of the convention, June 26-28. The service will be in operation each day from 8 a.m. to 1:30 a.m.

The tickets will be on sale at the Convention Center during the convention, and also may be purchased at any Holiday Inn in Indianapolis during the convention. The shuttle bus tickets will not be good for rides on regular Indianapolis buses.

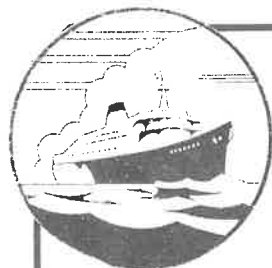

PROGRESS-GROWTH-DEVELOPMENT

These words typify the United Square Dancers of America, Inc., as they move into 1986 under the leadership of President Howard and Loraine Backus of Pine Bluff, Arkansas. The USDA held its largest and most successful mid-year meeting to date in Amarillo, Texas, on January 25, 1986. This meeting was hosted by USDA affiliate, Top of Texas Square and Round Dance Association.

PROGRESS was evidenced in all of the programs which have been undertaken by this, the largest of all square dance organizations. Special interest has been expressed in the USDA Handicapable Dancer Program under the direction of Mac and Chieko Mackenzie and Frank and Nancy Cherry, Handicapable Dancers Committee Co-Chairmen. This committee is working to further the interaction of handicapable dancer groups throughout the nation and to achieve recognition for the handicapable dancer as an integral part of the square dance activity.

The economical dancer and club insurance program continued to attract interest from dancer organizations throughout the country. This program is operated under the competent direction of Charles Naddeo, Insurance Chairman and Parliamentarian.

GROWTH was demonstrated by the interest in membership expressed by various state and area organizations.

DEVELOPMENT of a proposal was initiated for the revival of the

entry level square dance club to appeal to the interests of the mainstream dancer as proposed by the Crossfire Discussion Group. A resolution was adopted proposing that Callerlab restructure the entry program to not exceed 30 weeks and to not exceed 60 calls. USDA pledges to assist Callerlab in effecting this change through encouraging all its member organizations to support this new program.

In accordance with the directive of the United Square Dancers of America Board of Directors, plans are moving ahead for the development of Regional Festivals. The Regional Festival Committee, under the leadership of Chairman Jim Maczko, is actively working on guidelines and policies for holding festivals in each of the four USDA regions.

Interested square dancers are invited to attend the annual meeting of the United Square Dancers of America Board of Directors to be held from 1:00 to 5:00 p.m. on Friday, June 27, 1986, in the La Petit Room of the Atkinson Hotel at the corner of Illinois and Georgia Streets, Indianapolis, Indiana, concurrently with the 35th National Square Dance Convention. Election of officers, together with discussion of all of the above programs and more, will be covered at this year's annual meeting.

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Again this summer, LEGACY will participate in the educational program of the National Square Dance Convention. A number of interesting subjects, important to the square dance activity, will be discussed during the three days of the convention June 26, 27 and 28, 1986, in Indianapolis, Indiana.

On Thursday, the 26th, from 1:00 to 2:00 p.m., Chet Vetter will be moderator for a discussion on "Dancer First Aid Kit" by Bill and Donna Anderson. It is a subject all club leaders should find helpful and interesting. That same day from 2:00 to 3:00 p.m. Bill and Donna Anderson, Bill and Colleen Wilton, and John and Freddie Kaltenthaler will discuss "Caller-Dancer Relationship". Chet Vetter will again moderate. The smooth functioning of a square dance club requires understanding and cooperation between the caller and the dancers, particularly club officers. This discussion should provide ideas for improving that spirit of working together.

"Square Dance Preservation" will be the subject of discussion on Friday, the 27th, from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. Dan and Mary Martin, Cathie Burdick, Bill and Colleen Wilton, and Jerry and Becky Cope will provide a variety of ideas for keeping our favorite form of recreation hale and hearty throughout the years. Gordon Goss will moderate and make sure that each of the fine panelists gets an opportunity to be heard.

Last, but not least, of LEGACY's presentations will be on Saturday, the 28th, from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. It should be a rousing one with the idea taken from surveys in which many dancers tell us that we need to put the fun back in square dancing. Walt Cole will keep the peace as John and Freddie Kaltenthaler, Stan and Cathie Burdick, and Bill and Donna Anderson tackle the challenging question: "Fun -- If it is gone, where did it go, and how can we get it back?"

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1986 CONVENTION REPORT

Following are the highlights of the 13th Annual CALLERLAB Convention, held March 24-26, 1986 in Baltimore.

AWARD WINNERS: Bill Peters, Dave Taylor and Melton Luttrell were presented with the prestigious Milestone Award. Walt Cole received the Chairman's Award for his contributions to CALLERLAB.

COMMUNITY SQUARE DANCING: Because present CALLERLAB programs (i.e., Mainstream, Plus) are not easily adaptable to the community outside of the current club structure, the Traditional Dance Committee of CALLERLAB will develop a program to be called Community Square Dancing. This program, which will be suitable for use in family, adult and similar group recreation activities, will contain the fundamental elements of square dancing which can be taught in six two-hour sessions or less.

COMBINED PROGRAMS: CALLERLAB formed a new committee, to include the chairmen of the Mainstream, Plus and Advanced committees, to make recommendations to the Board of Governors on a suggested list of dance movements. This list is to be published no later than August 15, 1986, and will be offered to the general membership to be tried on a one year trial basis beginning

September 1, 1986. It was further resolved that the committee determine which calls from the Basic, Mainstream and Plus lists can be capably taught in twenty-five weeks at 2 hours per session.

PROGRAM COORDINATING COMMITTEE: CALLERLAB adapted a uniform method for a square which has broken down to return to dancing. The method, which includes forming lines on the command "Lines Right" from the number one man, will be taught to all dancers for a one year trial through all CALLERLAB dance programs.

MS QUARTERLY SELECTIONS: It was resolved that the purpose of the MSQS Committee is to provide directed variety for the MS program by selecting not more than one movement per quarter to be used in MS workshops. Spin the Net and Chain Down the Line were dropped from the MSQS list.

PLUS QUARTERLY SELECTIONS: The PQS committee reaffirmed that calls selected are not a part of the Plus Program and should not be considered as such. They strongly recommend that, if a caller does insert a quarterly selection as a part of their program, they first conduct a walk-thru of that call. The call Coordinate The Gears was dropped from the PQS list while Spin Chain and Exchange The Gears was retained.

Gene Trimmer, Chairman of the Plus QS Committee, is happy to announce the selection of one call as the Plus Quarterly Selection for the quarter beginning May 1, 1986. The call is **RELAY, CYCLE & WHEEL** by Wade Driver.

RELAY, CYCLE & WHEEL

Starting Formation: Parallel Right-Handed Ocean Waves. Definition: All Swing 1/2 by the Right, Centers Cast Off (Left) 3/4, Ends Circulate 1/2. Wave of six does a Grand Swing Thru, new end of wave Circulates while lonesome circulator moves forward to become the end of the wave of six. New wave of six all Cast Off (Right) 3/4 to form a momentary column of six. Leader (Outfacer) in column does a U-Turn Back while the momentary Two-Faced Line which has formed with the lonesome circulators and the two very center dancers in the column of six does a Wheel & Deal. Ends in a Double Pass Thru formation. Timing 20-22

beats.

Comments: The author specified, in his original correspondence, that the starting formation for this call was from parallel right-handed ocean waves. The original definition was changed somewhat to clarify some of the actions taking place during the flow of the call. Left-hand action is possible, but not advisable, unless dancers are well versed in all positions possible within the makeup of a square.

In giving directional cues during the dancing action of the call, the sequence of cues 'Half Right, Cast Left 3/4. Half Right, Half Left, Cast Right 3/4, Centers Wheel & Deal while outfacers U-Turn Back' has proved to be helpful.

Singing Call Figure

Heads Promenade 1/2, Sides Square Thru, **Relay, Cycle & Wheel** (filler), Centers Pass Thru, Left Allemande, Swing New Partner, Promenade Home.

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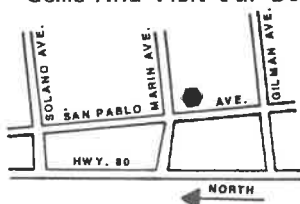

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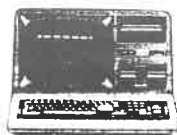

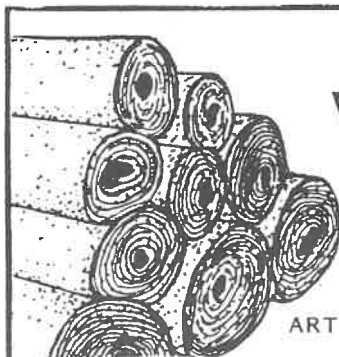
THE JOKERS by Helen

before their monthly dance. This committee would have flyers and would maybe give a short blurb about the upcoming caller and also give directions on how to get to the hall, etc. Since most of the PACE dances are held in the Fremont/Hayward area, it's a fairly long trek for someone from, say, the Morgan Hill area. I'd really like to see the PACE Advanced movement "take-off" as the local Advanced dancers really don't appreciate the opportunity they're missing by not attending these events.

We also recently attended the SCVSDA Fifth Saturday Whing Ding. The Square Dancers Association holds several of these fifth Saturday events each year, but due to other commitments, we usually don't get to attend. I'm always impressed with the ability of the local callers at the Plus level. We danced to tips by Mike Degmetich, Bill Davis, Bob Southern, and Jim Osborne. Would have danced to the others also except we got to

talking to friends that we hadn't seen for several months/years and somehow never did get into a square. The dance was well accepted. I didn't count the squares but there must have been at least fifty. I don't know what other events might have been available to attract the dancers this particular Saturday night, but most of the local square dancers attended the Whing Ding.

When's the last time you "thanked" a caller after a hoedown. Most callers put a lot of effort into making a hoedown an enjoyable experience. They usually are paid for this effort, but I've found that additional "compensation" can be had from the dancers with very little extra effort on the dancers' part. What I'm suggesting is that if you have a particularly enjoyable evening of dancing at a hoedown (or even at your local club night), go up to the caller after the dance and relay that information to them. Everyone likes to be told they've done a good job and callers are no exception. (They're people too!)

This was the environment when the members of CALLERLAB met in Baltimore. There were debates about complexity, and discussions about lists and programs. Finally, those in attendance voted to act -- a new list of moves would be established from the existing Basic, Mainstream, and Plus lists. The size of this new list would be limited to the number of moves which can be taught in 25 weekly two-hour sessions.

This new list will be in effect for a one year trial period starting September 1, 1986 -- in time to be used for the new beginners' classes.

We feel that beyond the obvious results of implementing the

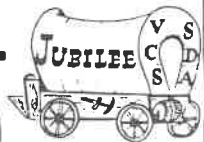
resolutions -- shorter classes and a viable program based on the most popular calls in use today through the Plus Program -- the real benefit will be the re-creation of "square dancing" as one program.

There are many unanswered questions -- what moves will be on the list, how many moves can be taught in 25 weeks, what level will be used at clubs and open dances during the trial period, what happens to moves not selected for the new list?

There will be answers to those questions. Most important is that the toughest question -- How do we reverse the current decline in "square dancing"? -- may have been answered.

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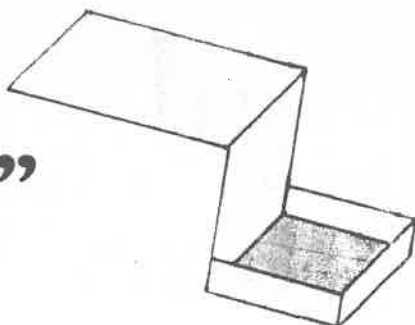
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
