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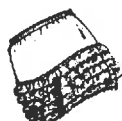
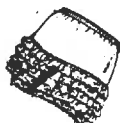
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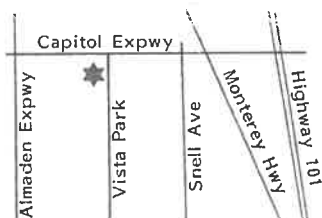
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"OUR" OPINION !

We had occasion recently to dance to a caller for the first time. One of the tips seemed that it would never end. Move followed move, coming faster and faster. The combination of moves, formations and timing began to have their effect -- square after square began to break down.

What, we wondered, was going on here. The opportunities for Allamande Lefts went by, one after another. Then the light dawned--the caller was trying to break down the floor! We've all danced to callers who've called a wrong Allamande Left -- and unless it happens constantly we don't think much about it. To have a caller try to break down a floor -- so no one would realize the Allamande Left was not with your original corner-- seemed a bit extreme.

As the dance progressed our opinion of the caller did not improve. We heard that this caller had done less than a great job at other dances. In one case, a club had considered paying this caller off in the middle of a dance and

having another caller present finish the evening.

While 99% of the callers we have danced to are competent professionals, there is the occasional caller who is not capable of handling a given level. What can you do in that case? Ask for your money back, if you're a dancer. If you're a club hiring a caller, check him/her out ahead of time at the level you plan to sponsor.

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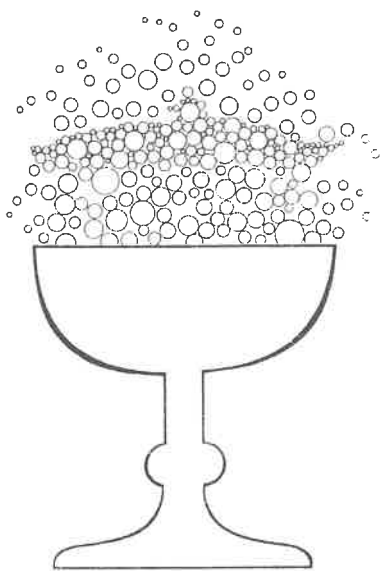
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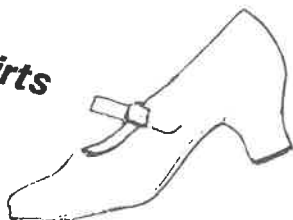

Again this year our hoedown was attended by people from both the "Plus Community" and the "Challenge Community". I think it's great that the Quads affords this opportunity for the two to interact. Normally the Challenge people hide from the Plus people, and the Plus people think Challenge people are snobs for doing so. 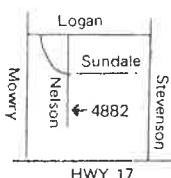

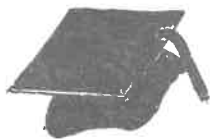

Let these directors know you appreciate the work they do. Happy Dancing!





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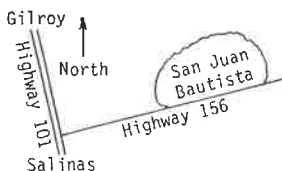
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DISK SLEEVE

We had heard (or dreamed of, I'm not sure which) about the "Disk Sleeve". After much looking, and several telephone calls, we decided that this pattern would have to be created. Several drawings later, we had our sleeve.

To make our creation (sleeve only), you will need: $\frac{2}{3}$ yard dress fabric; $\frac{2}{3}$ yard lining; 3 yards piping or other trim; $\frac{1}{3}$ yard stiff Pellon interfacing.

1. Cut two of each pattern piece out of dress fabric.

2. Cut two of pattern pieces #1 and #2 out of lining.

3. Cut two of pattern piece #1 out of stiff Pellon interfacing.

4. Using all of the #1 pattern pieces, place interfacing between fabric and lining (right sides away from interfacing). Baste or pin along top edge to hold in place. Sew piping or other trim along this edge.

5. Placing lining at the back of #2 dress fabric pattern piece; baste or pin to hold together.

6. Place the right side of #1 dress fabric pattern piece to the right side of #2 dress fabric pattern piece, matching the notches. Sew along this edge, easing to fit.



7. Sew the underarm seam.

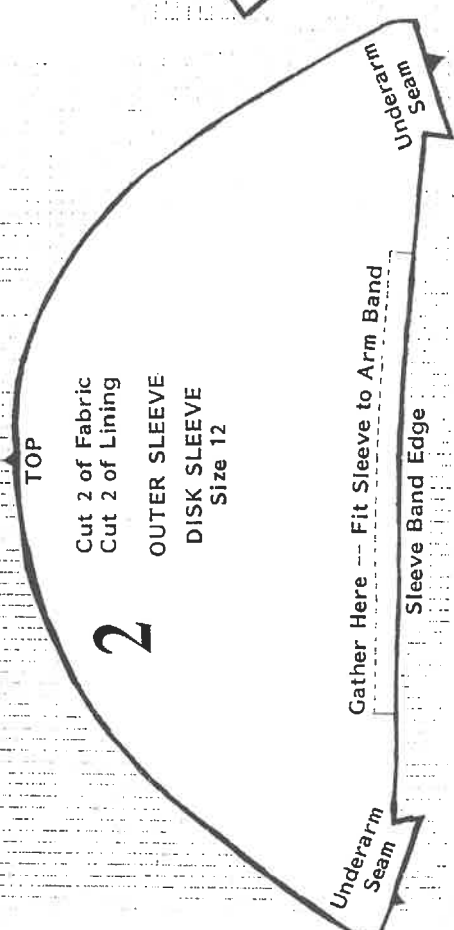
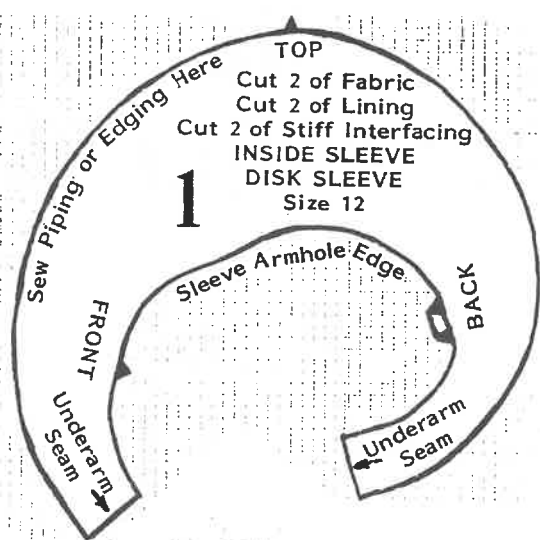
8. Sew the arm band to fit comfortably around arm.

9. Gather the sleeve at the sleeve band edge to fit the sleeve band.

10. Place the right side of the sleeve fabric to the right side of the sleeve band and sew in place.

11. Fit the right side of fabric to the right side of armhole fabric. Sew in place, easing so that there are no gathers or tucks.

Finish your dress according to directions. It is sure to attract lots of attention and compliments!

CROSSFIRE (CALLERLAB Plus Call #20)

Definition

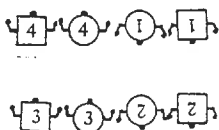
(CALLERLAB April 1985)
Starting formation -- Two-faced
Line, Parallel Lines of four,
Inverted Line(s). As the centers
begin to Trade, the ends Cross

Fold. Upon completing their Trade,
the centers release hands and step
forward forming an Ocean Wave or
Mini-Wave with the dancers they
are facing. If the Trade leaves the
original centers facing no one, they
step forward and remain facing out.

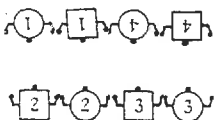

Dancing Hints

Crossfire continues to give the majority of the dancers a LOT of difficulty when called at 'open dances', especially when called from any formation other than the 'normal, right-facing two-faced lines'. Even though it is usually executed properly from that formation, that is NOT the only formation that you can expect to hear all callers use every time you hear it. For this reason, it would help to review the previous data for this call (The Prompter, November 1984).

The 'main secret' to successful accomplishment of this call is to avoid the natural tendency to want to "drift" or "flow" from one position to another. Each of the respective actions used during this call should be executed using 'clean' or 'crisp' movements that position each dancer in precisely the correct place to properly complete the call. Please remember that this particular call can be executed from **many** formations; and each ending formation is different

depending on the starting formation (i.e., two-faced lines yield columns, facing lines yield completed double pass thru, facing out lines yield 1/4 tag, inverted lines yield parallel right-hand waves, etc.).

Center dancers continue to have 'the more important part' in assuring success with this call--the execution of a 'crisp' Trade and slightly exaggerating the final 'step forward' will help all dancers in your (portion of the) formation. Center dancers **MUST** avoid the natural tendency to 'drift' into final formation.

End dancers must assure that they quickly establish the exact location where they are to complete their Cross Fold action. Since the Cross Fold action is obviously slightly easier to accomplish, you should always 'yield the right-of-way' (or travel slightly 'wide') to accommodate the centers who will be executing their Trade Action(s).

All dancers will complete Crossfire facing the opposite direction from where they started.



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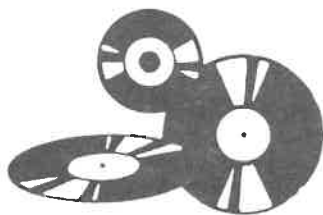
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WHAT'S NEW!!

It's getting to be Luau time and Merry Go Round Records has released an Hawaiian round dance called "Little Brown Gal" (016). It's easy level, Phase II and the flip side is cued. They've also released a Phase II waltz, "Wistful Waltz" (017)... also cued. Isn't it great that the round dance record companies are finally giving us cues? Now we have no excuse not to practice!!

DANCING THE QUICKSTEP

Quicksteps are danced to 4/4 music, and are usually fast dances, as the name implies. In many quickstep amalgamations, the basic figure may bridge through three measures of music, quarter turns are a good example. Using three measures of music for execution, the rhythm is s,q,q,s,s,q,q,s.

Natural turns in the quickstep use 2 1/2 measures with the rhythm as s,q,q,s,s,s. So, in this case, the choreographer will use, in addition, some figure like a natural pivot (1 1/2 measures), rhythm s,q,q,s, to return to the 'down beat of the music'.

This type of dancing leaves much room for the dancers to interpret the music and be very expressive in the dance execution. A dancer who masters the fundamentals of the quickstep will have command of a dance that will never grow old or stale. It is undoubtedly one of the most attractive and expressive rhythms the dance world has known.

A person starting in the quickstep will first have to master the walks and chasse figures. Then, the quarter turns and natural turns, followed by reverse turns, zig zags, progressive chasse, and lock steps. Now you are on your way to the real meat of quickstep dancing. Remember, when practicing the walk and chasse, to shorten the length of the step from the foxtrot step. The quicker music won't allow the longer steps or relaxed knee as in the slower tempo.

The quickstep has an extremely large number of basic steps. To name a few, progressive chasse,



natural spin turn, forward and backward locks, tipple chasse, zig zags, cross chasse, cross swivel, four quick run, six quick twinkle, V6, tipsy, and hover corte.

One of the most popular figures to emerge from the quickstep into round dancing is the fishtail. The fishtail is a four-step basic, usually started from a snug banjo position with the man facing diagonally to LOD and COH. When properly executed all steps will be progressing LOD, with a slight movement to the wall. In no case should any step in the fishtail be backward. The beginning position causes the crossing step to provide a positive forward (LOD) progression. Sometimes additional locks or other moves are added to become a whaletail or other named movement.

The following figures are common to several dances: 1. Tele-mark (rhythms: s,s,s,s; s,q,q,s; q,q,s,s); 2. Impetus turn (rhythm: s,q,q,s,s,s); 3. Open impetus (rhythm same as Impetus); 4. Outside spin (rhythms: s,s,s; q,q,s).

Other ways of making the quickstep have its fast features are to use steps, and hops, in combination with running locks. These would all be fast steps, some executed as a step and hop to ONE beat of music.

Quicksteps are for the young-at-heart, nimble-footed dancers who can maintain the fast footwork through a two to three minute dance routine. Keep in mind, however, that there is a dance called "Lazy Quickstep" that's not too fast or difficult and is quite popular with round dancers.

FRENCH CHERRY OR BLUEBERRY PIE

4 oz. cream cheese
1/3 cup powdered sugar
1 tsp. vanilla
1/2 pint whipping cream
3 Tbsp. granulated sugar
1 pastry shell 9" (baked and cooled)
1 can Comstock cherry, or blueberry, pie filling

Whip cheese, powdered sugar and vanilla. Whip cream, adding granulated sugar gradually, then blend into cream cheese mixture. Spoon into cooled pastry shell and spoon pie filling over cream cheese mixture. Cover with foil and refrigerate for 24 hours.

CHINESE CHEWS

Crust:

1 cup flour
1/2 cup butter
2 Tbsp. white sugar

Topping:

1 1/2 cups brown sugar
2 Tbsp. flour
2 beaten eggs
1/2 cup coconut
1/2 cup chopped walnuts

Work crust ingredients as you would for pie crust. Press into 8" x 11" or 9" x 13" pan. Bake about 15 minutes at 325° F. Mix topping ingredients and spread on baked crust. Bake approximately 25 to 30 minutes. Do not overbake as they will not be as chewy.

PACE, Biorhythms

30 DAY BRANDIED FRUIT CAKE

You need a glass, wide-mouth, gallon jar. Always slant lid on jar (do not screw on).

Day 1 - Place in jar 1 1/2 cups starter juice, 2 cups sugar, 2 large (29 oz.) cans peaches (cut up with juice). Stir daily for 10 days. (You may use 1 1/2 cups peach brandy instead of starter juice.)

Day 10 - Add 2 cups sugar, 1 large (20 oz.) and 1 small can crushed pineapple with juice. Stir daily.

Day 20 - Add 2 cups sugar, 2 (10 oz. each) jars maraschino cherries, cut up. DO NOT ADD JUICE. Stir daily.

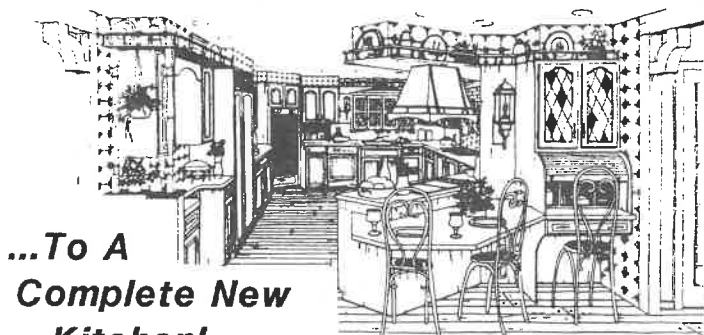
Day 30 - Make 4 bundt pan cakes now, or whenever you wish to. Do not refrigerate fruit or juice. There should be 6 (1 1/2 cups each) starter juices. Keep one

★ CORNER

The word is out that Dave Stevens is moving to the state of Washington around the end of July. This move will certainly be a loss for our area regarding A & C dancing. Just talked to Dave before writing this article to confirm the above. Faster horses?

We just plain overlooked the ad for the new C-1 class being held by Jay Klassen on Sundays at the Legion Hall. Good chance to learn C-1, and you can even go fishing in the pond or picnic before the dance.

Our Advanced class at the Mainliner Hall in San Mateo will conclude at the end of July. Look for the ad for the new one starting in September. The dancers attending the class are really coming on strong now, and are starting to attend local Advanced dances on Saturday nights. As is always the case, the more you dance the level, the better you will get.

We are making plans to hold a dance at Cubberley in Palo Alto in the near future. This dance would be at Advanced level with a C-1 star tip. We hope to hold this as the first North meets the South dance with the purpose in mind of getting the Advanced dancers of the Nor-Cal area and the Santa Clara area together at one location as they really don't have much contact with each other now. There are a lot of Advanced dancers in

the Nor-Cal area who don't like making the drive down to this end of the Peninsula and their comment is that all of the real Advanced dances are held in this area. Look for the ad in The Prompter.

As many more dancers are getting involved in the discussion about levels within the Advanced and Challenge levels, the opinions get more diverse. There are those who feel that if we really label these levels within, we will only segment the movement more than it already is. That is, we will create more clubs than we have now by using the three designations of Easy, Medium, and Solid. Each of these degrees of level has the potential of becoming a new level is the way they put it.

Others feel that it is very important to have these labels to tell them whether they feel they are qualified to attend a dance or club before they go. That is, if they are new A & C dancers, they would not expect to attend a "Solid" A & C dance at that stage of their development. A good argument in favor of this viewpoint is that the worst thing that can happen to a new dancer at any level is to end up at a dance that is so far above their level they get frustrated and lose confidence and quit.

Regardless of which side you are on, the fact remains that these levels exist because of the way the callers choose to call the dance. It is apparent that the more successful callers call to the level of the floor on that night, rather than stick to a specific level within the level even if the dancers cannot handle it. Here, we are rating the success of the caller based on the larger attendance at his/her dance as opposed to other callers on a consistent basis. Most of us know that dancers do not want to lose all of the time, but will tolerate losing once in a while. Some callers consistently have much smaller dances than others due to their not recognizing this fact. See you in a Star Tip!



LEGACY

Spring usually heralds the graduation of thousands of new square dancers around the country. We rejoice with them in their accomplishment and tip our sombrero to the callers and angels who worked diligently to train these welcome newcomers to the square dance world.

Unfortunately, our rejoicing may be short-lived if we do not continue to work to serve the needs of these new dancers and make them feel welcome. The question we need to ask ourselves is, "After graduation, what's next?" Do the new dancers have a place to practice and enjoy their newly acquired skills, or are they faced with a summer hiatus and a wide gap between what they have been taught and what their club is actually doing?

The problem of the summer hiatus can be solved in many ways with special dances and social outings during the summer to help assimilate the newcomers into club activities. Solving the problem of the gap between class and club often is not so easy, and failure to solve that very problem accounts for a large number of dropouts; dancers who become discouraged and frustrated because there is no place for them to dance and have fun with what they already know.

All too often an attempt is made to solve the problem by rushing the new dancers into another program during the summer so that (supposedly) they can begin to dance with the club in the fall. Thus, we see a plethora of Plus workshops during the summer that are filled with new dancers who have not even had the opportunity to practice their Mainstream skills. Not only are the dancers being rushed into a new program much too quickly, but many of the workshops are too short for what they pretend to do. CALLERLAB recommends that a new dancer dance the Mainstream program regularly for at least one year before he or she attempts the Plus program. This summer rush often only compounds the problem and produces dancers who are proficient at neither Mainstream nor Plus and who are, therefore, doubly frustrated.

As graduation time is a time of rejoicing, the transition time also should be a time for rejoicing. Let's all work to make it so. Let's make it a time during which new dancers find the fun and enjoyment they have been working for, a time during which they find the acceptance and friendliness they have a right to expect. We have told them that square dancing is fun. Now, let's prove it!



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MAINSTREAM PROGRAM TEACHING OPTIONS TO BE REVIEWED

Among the resolutions passed at the CALLERLAB Convention in Baltimore on March 26, 1986 was a resolution dealing with the realignment of the calls within the Mainstream Program that might be deferred for later workshoping. This reflects the reduced use of some calls in selected areas and will NOT affect existing Mainstream Programs in areas where there are Mainstream Clubs. The intent is to allow callers and clubs to teach new dancers a program of calls that reflects the dance program of the sponsoring group. In many areas of the U.S. and Canada as well as many overseas locations where a dance program of Mainstream calls as published is being danced, the adjustments will not affect the teaching series of classes.

In other areas, where the predominant dance program is Mainstream with some Plus calls, the realignment will reflect the calls which can be deferred to a later time. In some of these areas, the class time is limited to 25-30 weeks and some calls just cannot be properly covered in that period of time.

Concurrent with this, a special committee was formed to review the existing Mainstream and Plus Programs to determine if a suitable "Learn to Dance Program" can be covered in a 25-30 week (lesson) time frame. Again, it is emphasized that, where the existing clubs have a strong Mainstream Program, there would be no change. There is no intent to force clubs or dancers to learn one or more figures from the existing Plus Program.

We welcome suggestions or your ideas on these and any programs. We encourage you to send your thoughts and ideas to the CALLERLAB Office, Box 679, Pocono Pines, PA 18350. We will forward your views to the respective people involved so that your views are considered before a recommendation is formed. We anticipate a preliminary publication some time this Summer.

NO NEW AQS MOVE

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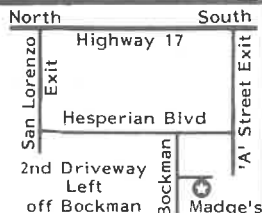
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CALLERLAB ANNOUNCES NEW BOARD CHAIRMAN

We would like to tell you about the facilities we will be using in 1988. Many of you remember the 25th National Square Dance Convention held in Anaheim in 1976 at which time a record-breaking crowd of 39,796 attended from all over the world.

Since then the space at the Convention Center has been increased by 125,000 square feet. Besides this additional space, we will be using all of the ballrooms in the Anaheim Marriott Hotel and the Anaheim Hilton and Towers, our co-headquarters hotels, located just a few steps away.

The smallest of these halls will dance 45 squares, while the largest will dance 250 squares. In addition, there will be 300 booths where vendors will have all types of wares for sale.

Education will not be neglected, for numerous large rooms have been provided for Panels, Clinics and Seminars. College credit will be offered for some courses.

We have many exciting plans such as parties at Knott's Berry Farm, Disneyland, a Country Western Concert, tours, trail end dances, housing, RV park, Sew & Save, and a Fashion Show.

We will be telling about these in more detail in future reports and what part you can play in our plans. We will soon start adding about 3,000 people to the various committees.

Our Cook Book "Golden Treasures from the Golden State" has been delivered and has over 500 recipes from various people including President and Mrs. Reagan; Governor George Deukmejian; Merlin Olson; Phyllis Diller; Tommie Lasorda; Debbie Reynolds; Dr. Schuller; John Denver and many, many square dancers. The price is only \$8.00 (plus \$1.50 for postage and handling, if mailed). You can make your check payable to the 37th National Square Dance Convention and mail to P. O. Box 8549, Anaheim, CA 92802.

We would be happy to check out boxes of 12 or 24 books on consignment to anyone interested in helping us sell them.

Another bargain is our Early Bird Certificates. The price is only \$15.00 each, and they can be used as full payment for registration or they can be redeemed for full face value. They are also transferable and make great gifts or raffle and door prizes at club dances.

Without an Early Bird Certificate, the price will be \$18.00 for preregistration, or \$20.00 at the door for any one or all three days of the Convention.

We also have a number of other fund raising items available so be on the lookout for them.

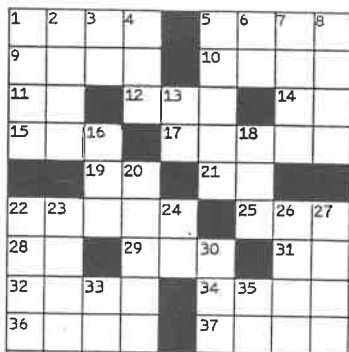

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CALLER "ROAST"

by Janet Wessels

Ingredients: One square dance caller; 60-80 square dancers, preferably the promenading outside type; 20-30 4-F's (Finger Food For Four) with small signs attached denoting the caller's attributes (real or unreal), abilities (learned or unlearned), or any square dance euphemism; 3 or 4 people who like to talk to a room full of semi-strangers (should have access to personal, little-known anecdotes about the caller; 6 rolls of cheap bathroom "tish-oo" (cleverly disguised in a plain brown wrapper; 1 paper sack for each dancer.

Preparation: Put the caller on a stage or raised platform with appropriate equipment. Put the dancers on the floor in appropriate order.

On two or three tables arrange the 4-F's. Look for such items as "Oatbill Cookies", "Caller's Crunch", "Bill's Yellow Rocks", or "Right & Left Chews", and give a \$5.00 prize for "Bill's Sweet Buns" to Chris and Bob Levine.

Line up talkers and intersperse their commentaries between tips. Comments about the time the caller drove his family bananas practicing calling on an auto trip or about his dancing style due to infirmity may be used. If all else fails, have the club president read a nice poem about him and semi-apologize for all the things you have or might have done to him.

Prepare the toilet paper for unwinding. During what you think might be a particularly important call, "gift-wrap" the caller by winding the paper around him from neck to toe, taking care not to obstruct his hold of the microphone nor to cover his mouth or eyes. If "gift" is not claimed by 10:15 p.m., flush!

At a predetermined time do the following: 1) Have each dancer don his/her own paper sack which has been prepared for wearing and wear during a tip. (If some dancers become frustrated because they cannot see to either dance or see how frustrated the caller is becoming, have them remove the sacks to further frustrate the caller.); 2) During one tip, if the caller says the key word "Promenade", have each couple promenade out one door and in another. (How they re-group is anybody's guess.); 3) Choose another tip and when/if the caller uses the term "Men Run Around...", have them do just that. Make sure they don't run into each other, or "around" too far, and know how to get back in the square.

Mix all the ingredients well and roast approximately 1 1/2 - 2 hours at 65 degrees (door open). Serve hilariously. The recipe may be adapted for any caller. This one was the **Katydid's Bill Davis Roast**.



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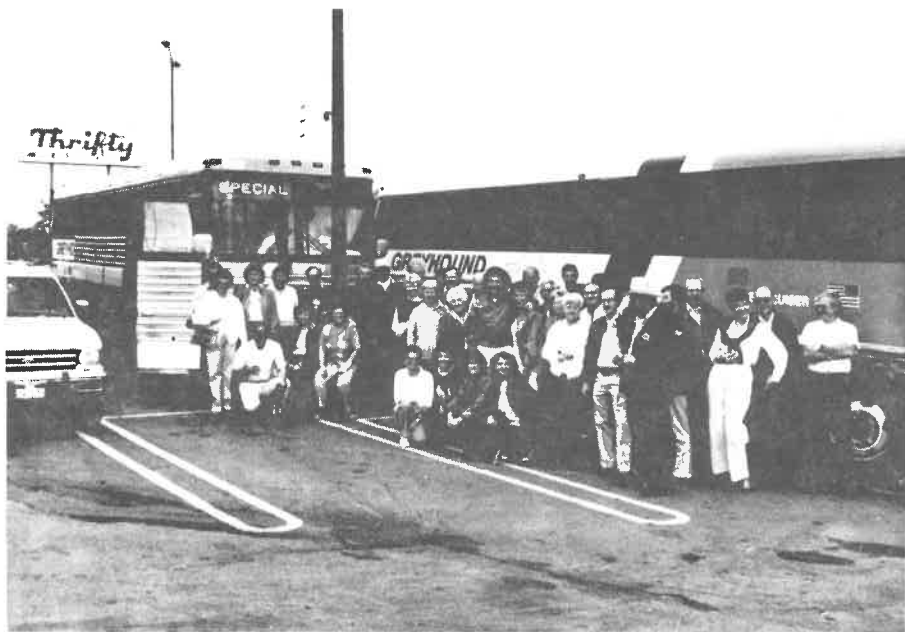

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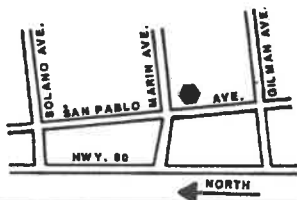

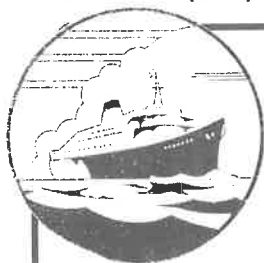
DIXIE DERBIES by Bear
