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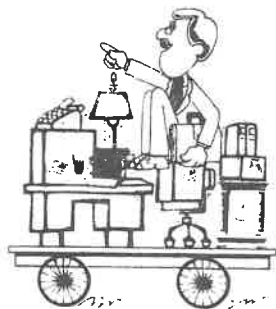
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PUBLISHER'S PATTER

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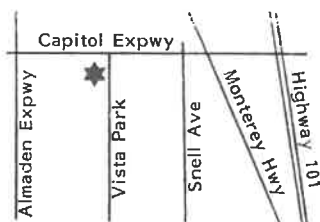


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"OUR" OPINION !

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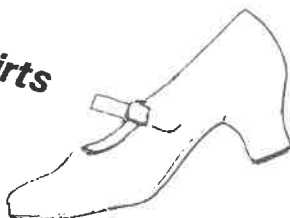
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We Get Letters

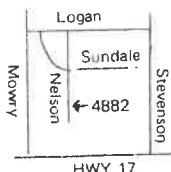
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CHALLENGE



★ CORNER

We received a very nice letter from Jack Murtha regarding the error in the news release from CALLERLAB on the subject of Cross Run and Cross Fold. He refers back to the May, 1984 issue of The Caller's Gazette by Jim Hilton for the correct rule. That rule is that there currently is no such thing as a crossing rule, the only thing left is a passing rule, and that is by the right shoulder.

This means that we pass right shoulders in all crossing moves except Cross Trail Thru which is now a Sashay instead of a cross. In the article it is stated that if you were in back-to-back lines and the Ends were to Trade, they passed right shoulders. However, if Ends Cross Fold was called, you were supposed to pass left shoulders.

At this point, we feel there should come into play some consideration as to how the dancers actually execute the commands. We realize that it would be almost unheard of to ask the dancers for their opinion on anything, but maybe we should at least observe how they do the commands. My observations in the past have been that, whether right or wrong, the dancers have always passed right shoulder in BOTH situations above. However, they usually have passed left shoulders in any case that the

dancers asked to cross are standing side by side.

Many Challenge dancers have stated that the reason they dance with hands down is that it makes for a tighter square and that it actually is more comfortable. It is hard to argue that your hands will be closer to your body when held up by your shoulders than when they are down by your sides. We, as callers, could pass a rule that said dancers had to dance standing on their heads. While a certain caller has been known to call this way, he has not been observed to do it for an entire dance. If there is any logic in the above, it is probable that all dancers would dance the way it felt best to them and, through evolution, the rule would change to dancing on your feet regardless of what we callers said.

Sometimes we have to agree with Jack and say "leave it alone" and let it stay as it was left in 1984. Evolution or adjustments by the dancers will decide in the long run. We, as callers, have many times in the past tried to pass rules, or strongly objected to such things as new ways to Promenade or Do Sa Do, but in the long run you may have noticed the dancers are doing it their way regardless of our rules or objections.

A more important issue than this is to reduce the number of square dance figures for the new dancer in order to reduce class time. We also need to reduce or eliminate the number of quarterly experimentals that we teach to our groups. This would enable us all to add more dancers to the movement, and keep them, instead of pushing them out of it. Many dancers who get sick, or change job hours for a period of time, now feel that they have to go back to class or a workshop to get back into dancing.

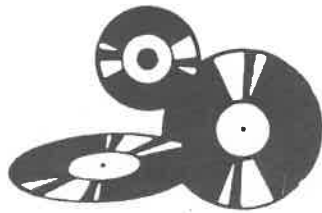
With the current state of square dancing, it is ridiculous to continue the way we have been going! If we do go on this way, we won't have to worry about passing right, left, in, or out, as square dancing will have passed on.

Men, this news is for you! How many times have you hunted, on your hands and knees, for that little screw that holds your collar tip on? A new company, "Clipped", is now making good looking collar tips that clip on. They're available in gold tones and silver tones, engraved, or with stones, crystals or figures. 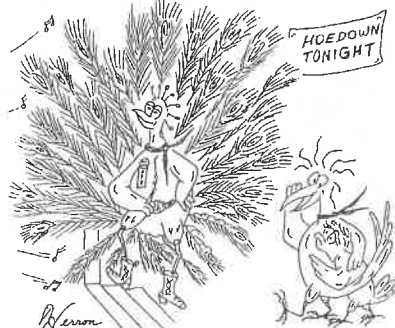
Rawhide has another hit with "Up a Lazy River" (127) by Lee

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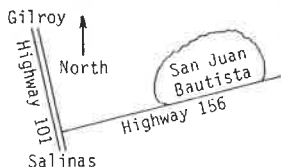

RELAY, CYCLE & WHEEL -- RCW CALLERLAB Plus Quarterly Selection

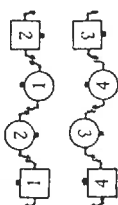
Definition

(CALLERLAB May 1986) Starting formation: Parallel right-hand ocean waves. All swing 1/2 by the right, centers Cast Off (left) 3/4 while the ends Circulate 1/2. Wave of six does a Grand Swing Thru. New ends of the wave and the lonesome dancers Circulate. New wave of six all Cast Off (right) 3/4 to form a momentary column of six. Leader (outfacer) in the column does a U-Turn Back while the momentary two-faced line formed with the lonesome circulators and the two very center dancers in the column of six does a Wheel & Deal. Call ends in a Double Pass Thru formation.

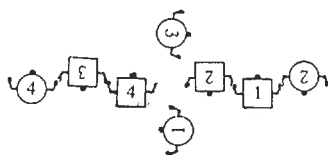
(Callers NOTE: The author specified only parallel right-hand waves as a starting formation. Left-hand action is possible, but not advisable unless dancers are well-versed in all possible positions within the makeup of a square.)

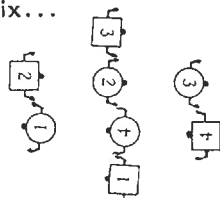
Heads Lead Right, Step to a Wave...



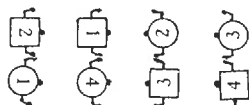
All swing 1/2 by the right, centers Cast Off (left) 3/4 while the ends Circulate 1/2...

Dancing Hints

Relay, Cycle & Wheel (or "RCW") is the newest CALLERLAB Quarterly Selection. This is an excellent DANCING call that has very few significant 'adverse effects' -- Nevertheless, it IS guilty of 'overflow' for the original centers in the ocean waves. For this reason, dancers can become disoriented (dizzy) if the call is

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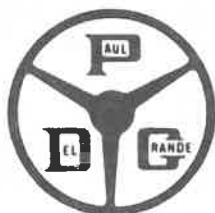

repeated too frequently in any one dance session.

There are two 'secrets' that may help with RCW: 1) The original end facing in and adjacent center dancer will become partners upon completion of the call; and 2) the original end facing out MUST execute a "clean and correct" Circulate (not at big diamond circulate) when that dancer leaves the ocean wave of six dancers to form the momentary two-faced line

in the middle of the formation (near the end of the call).

All dancers begin the call like a 'normal Relay the Deucey' until the final wave of six is formed. The final 'half right' (of the Relay the Deucey) for the wave dancers is replaced by the Cast Off 3/4. The very center two dancers then join with the 'circulators' to form the two-faced line for the Wheel & Deal while the out-facing dancers in the mini-waves turn back.



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Stir The Bucket With Betty

Our featured cook this month is Ellen Snitil of Palm Springs. Several of her recipes have been past favorites of readers of the column. These recipes will be equally enjoyable!

STUFFED CHICKEN BREASTS OLE'

- 4 whole chicken breasts, halved, skinned and boned
- 2 tsp. instant minced onion
- 2 Tbsp. chopped green chilies
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup grated cheddar cheese
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup melted margarine
- 1 cup soda crackers, crushed
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup grated parmesan cheese
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ Tbsp. taco seasoning mix

Pound each chicken piece with mallet to flatten. Blend onion, chilies and cheddar. Divide mixture evenly among chicken. Roll up each piece, tucking ends to enclose filling. Fasten with toothpicks if necessary. Brush each roll with melted margarine. Mix cracker crumbs with parmesan and taco seasoning. Roll each chicken piece with crumbs. Arrange in 8" baking dish, cover with foil and bake at 350° F. for 50 minutes. Remove foil and bake 15 minutes longer. Serve on bed of shredded lettuce, garnished with chopped green onions, diced tomatoes, black olives, sour cream and salsa.

STRAWBERRY FREEZER ICE CREAM

- 2 pints strawberries
- $\frac{1}{3}$ cup sugar
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup orange juice
- 1 (8 oz.) La Creme, thawed

Place strawberries sugar and juice in blender and process until smooth. Pour through fine strainer.

Fold in whipped topping. Cover and freeze two hours, stirring after each hour. Continue freezing until firm. Place in refrigerator 30 minutes before serving. Serve garnished with mint leaves.



CHOCOLATE CHERRY CRUNCH

- $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups flour
- 1 cup brown sugar
- $\frac{3}{4}$ cup quick cooking rolled oats
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup unsweetened cocoa
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. soda
- $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. salt
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup softened margarine
- 1 (21 oz.) can cherry pie filling
- 1 tsp. brandy extract

In a large bowl, combine flour, brown sugar, oats, cocoa, soda and salt. Cut in margarine until mixture is crumbly and well blended. Press one cup crumb mixture in bottom of 8" or 9" square microwave dish. Combine pie filling and brandy extract. Spoon evenly over crust. Crumble rest of crumb mixture evenly over cherry filling. Press lightly over filling. Microwave on high for 13 to 15 minutes, or until firm, and cracks appear in topping. Cool on flat surface. Serve with ice cream or whipped cream. Serves 6 to 8.

THE LLOYD SHAW FOUNDATION ARCHIVES TO ACT AS NATIONAL ARCHIVE CENTER

The American Folklife Center and The Archive of Folk Culture of The Library of Congress have jointly commissioned The Lloyd Shaw Foundation Archives as the national depository and central clearinghouse for square dance archives. Acting at a recent meeting in Washington, D.C., were Dr. Alan Jabbour, Director, American Folklife Center; Gerald Parsons, Archive of Folk Culture; and Vicky Wulff, Librarian of the Performing Arts Library at the Kennedy Center (a division of The Library of Congress), joined with Bob and Becky Osgood, American Square Dance Society; Herb Egender, Former Cheyenne Mountain Dancer; George and Ann Holser, National Folk Dance Committee; and Dr. Bill Litchman, Director, Lloyd Shaw Foundation Archives.

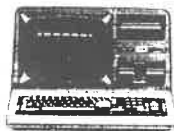
Under the agreement, The Lloyd Shaw Foundation Archives will coordinate and help the formation of archival collections across the country by offering help and advice to those involved in regional collections and will exchange duplicate materials and

copies of valuable originals both with them and the Library of Congress. This is a landmark agreement in the field of folk archiving and should be instrumental in helping the nation preserve its heritage in dance.

Most importantly, recognition has been given to square, round, contra, clogging, line and heritage dancers by the premier center for archiving activity in the world. Dancers from all corners of this country in modern as well as traditional and recreational activities can look with pride on this agreement. These important activities, so often overlooked by national institutions, have been not only recognized as important parts of our national heritage, but are being actively promoted through the present agreement. 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'ROUND' ABOUT

ROUNDS, AROUND THE WORLD

In the past seven years, June and I have traveled rather extensively. We have been almost-- "Around the World" -- we missed Malaysia, India and South America.

During our travels to Alaska we have met many round dancers. After all, it is a part of the good old US of A. Several fine teachers live in the Big State. They are a month or two behind the lower states due to mail and communication problems. But they are fine round dancers.

The same can be said about Hawaii. Mary Jane Falk has it going real well on Oahu, and other teachers on the Big Island of Hawaii have fine classes that are abreast of the latest dances. Hawaii is fortunate that many other round dance teachers are continually visiting or touring the Paradise State.

On our trip to New Zealand and Australia, we found that most square dance clubs do have rounds during their club nights. On New Zealand's South Island Art Sheppard has a very nice group of round dancers within his Cathedral Squares in Christchurch. Art and his wife, Blanche, along with a large group of dancers, attend the National Square Dance Convention here in the U.S. on a very regular basis. On the North Island, John Stallard has an extremely large club in Auckland, New Zealand. The Southern Cross Round Dance Club meets five nights a week at different levels, and the Wednesday

night is 'All Level' and very SOCIAL. John is probably the #1 round dance teacher in New Zealand.

In Australia, Sydney and the large cities all have very large and successful round dance groups. The Ballroom influence is very strong and the teachers tend to use a lot of 'English' terms. It shows in the technique styling of the dancers.

England, France and West Germany also have fine round dance groups. Many are found in the military installations, some are native and have the styling of each country. In general, the interest in square and round dancing is a result of the U.S. military presence. The occupation troops left a fine heritage of "American Folk Dancing". The cueing and calling is always in the English language, but sometimes the teaching will be in the native tongue.

While visiting my cousin in West Berlin, he invited us to his Ballroom Practice class. A beautiful two-story dance hall, maple floors and all the GOODIES. We did a little demonstration of round dancing: Tangos, Viennese waltz and some swing. The cute little blond teacher wanted to see all of the dancing styles and would have had us stay all night. We were flying to Paris the next morning, so we had to leave early.

One of the strongest square and round dance countries is Japan. Here the dancers are really addicted to the dancing. This is probably due to the long term of American occupation. Again, all

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cueing and calling is English; teaching may be in native dialect.

It's strange to dance to the callers in Japan and then find out they can't speak more than three or four words of conversational English. It baffles your mind.

In our trip through China, we tried to expose the Chinese people to square and round dancing. One of our English-speaking guides was able to master several simple calls and singing records. His translations were very helpful in getting the message across to other Chinese dancers.

While in Beijing (Peking), we danced for the National Folk Dance Teachers and they in turn danced for us. It was a real cultural

interchange. They are hoping to send four squares of dancers to the 1988 U.S. National Square Dance Convention. It should be interesting when they arrive. Don't underrate the Chinese, they built the only manmade object that was visible from the Moon -- we danced on the Great Wall of China while we were in Beijing.

We still think the best dancing is in the U.S.A. We, of the Bay Area, are very fortunate to have highly talented square dance callers and round dance teachers residing here. After we travel around a little, we're always happy to get back to the local clubs, and the Saturday dances, at home.

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DONN & CLAUDIA THOMSON

Born in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, Donn Thomson started square dancing in Sacramento, California in 1962, at the age of 13. At the same time Donn met his square dance sweetheart, Claudia (age 11) who had moved from Detroit to Sacramento with her family. Over the next few years Donn and Claudia danced with the Tombstone Twirlers and with the Bachelors 'N' Bachelorettes.

At the age of 16, Donn had his first experience as a caller, and worked with several clubs in the Sacramento area until 1969, when he joined the U.S. Air Force.

1969 was also the year that Donn and Claudia were married. During his 10 years in the Air Force, Donn continued his career as a caller. While Donn and Claudia were stationed in Alaska, they started the Snowshoe Shufflers. That was followed by an assignment in Denver, where Donn called for the Do Si Dos at Lowry Air Force Base. He later started the Teen "N" Jeans in Denver, calling for them for three years.

When Donn and his family came to San Jose seven years ago, he started calling for the Silver Buckles youth club. When Donn's own children, Kim and Donnie, were of age, they started dancing with the club and are currently active members.

The Silver Buckles are high on their caller:

"Donn is terrific with the kids, has a great personality and patience to deal with this age group."

"Donn is always available to listen to the youth's needs and wants."
