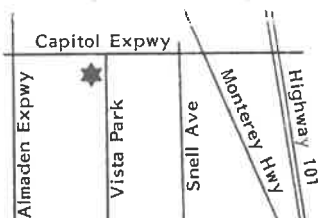

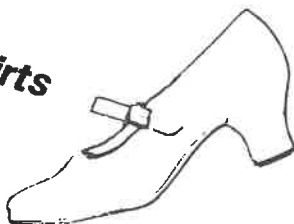

Stir The Bucket With Betty

SALADS GALORE!

Hot summer days give rise to lighter appetites and definitely the desire, on the part of the cook, to not heat up the kitchen. So-o-o, we present three great salad recipes for your enjoyment. One could be a main dish, one a side dish, and the third makes a great dessert. Bon appetit!

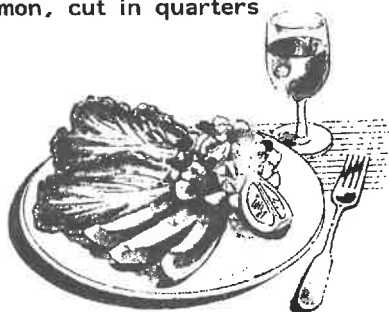
CURRIED CHICKEN SALAD WITH PAPAYA

Curry Dressing:

- 1 cup sour cream
- 2 Tbsp. minced candied ginger
- 1 Tbsp. curry powder
- 1 Tbsp. lemon juice
- 1 Tbsp. Dijon mustard
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. cumin seed

Salad Ingredients:

- 3 cups diced cold cooked chicken or turkey
- 1 cup thinly sliced celery
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup thinly sliced green onion
- salt and cayenne
- 8 to 12 large romaine lettuce leaves, washed and crisped
- 2 large ripe papayas, peeled, seeded, and sliced lengthwise
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup salted roasted cashews
- 1 lemon, cut in quarters



Mix dressing ingredients together well; dressing may be

made ahead, then mixed with salad ingredients shortly before serving. In a large bowl, mix curry dressing gently with chicken, celery, and green onion. Add salt and cayenne to taste. On each of four dinner plates, arrange 2 or 3 romaine leaves. Mound equal portions of the chicken salad on each plate. Arrange papaya slices alongside. Sprinkle cashews over salad. Offer lemon to squeeze over salad and fruit. Serves 4.

CABBAGE CRUNCH SALAD

Dressing Ingredients:

- 2 Tbsp. sugar
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup oil
- 3 Tbsp. vinegar
- 1 pkg. chicken flavoring from noodles
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. pepper
- 1 tsp. salt

Salad Ingredients:

- 2 Tbsp. sesame seeds
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup slivered almonds
- $\frac{1}{2}$ medium head cabbage, chopped
- 4 green onions with tops, chopped
- 1 pkg. Chicken Flavored Top Ramen Noodles

Combine dressing ingredients and mix well. Toast sesame seeds and almonds in a 350° F. oven for about 10 minutes. Just before serving: Mix together cabbage and onions. Crumble noodles over cabbage and add nuts and sesame seeds. Pour dressing over all and mix well.

Well, summer is upon us as you can readily tell by the temperature of the schools we dance in. Too bad we didn't have the lottery a little sooner, maybe then all the schools would be air-conditioned.

This is the season for many A&C classes to graduate. These new dancers are the life blood of the upper levels, so, when you dance with them be patient and try to be helpful rather than critical. Above all, make them feel welcome and give them a chance to get better.

Remember, we were all where they are now once. If they have trouble, be kind enough to show them how to do what they did wrong instead of acting like you don't want to dance with them again.

We have picked up some things that are done by A&C dancers and

we feel that it is probable their teachers did not show them these. We would hate to have them miss out. So here they are. Some of the sights and sounds of square dancing.

Baaaah, for Ewe Turn Back; Boom, Boom, Boom, for Crossfire; Boom for Explode the Wave; Toot, Toot, for Load the Boat; Twack, Twack, for Track Two; Aaa-choo, for Horseshoe Turn; Wheee, for Pass the Sea; High-yaaa, (with a karate motion) for Cut the Diamond; Ding, Ding, Ding, on Trade Circulates from two-faced lines; Bang, for Cross & Turn; OOOOOOOH, for O Circulate; a yawn with raised arms for Stretch (anything); the name Fred, after any Spread call; Hi Ark, for Arky Star Thru; Ho, the sound made by the circulator on In/Out Roll Circulate; and Work, Work, Work, for Scoot Chain Thru.

Some sights are: Smiling faces for Square the Bases; flapping your wings (arms) on Butterfly Circulate; shaking your body, for Shakedown; staggering on Stagger Concept calls; tilting your body arms to one side like an airplane doing a bank on Round Off; wrapping your free arm around yourself and squeezing on Squeeze Concept calls.

We are sure that all of the callers will be happy that all of you new A&C dancers now have the straight dope on the above sounds and body motions you are supposed to be making or doing at their dances. Just be sure you don't over do them!

WHAT'S NEW!!

From The DANCE STORE

?...A "thing-a-majig" to hold up a sagging slip! Called "Ad-Just-a-Waist", it's made of soft nylon cording with a plastic catch on it that allows you to put it around your waist, pull up as tightly as you need, then fold your slip over it to shorten the slip as needed, and you can then feel safe and secure all evening. The little "magic" catch won't let it slip. These sell, two in a package, for approximately \$3.00.

This isn't new, but more and more ladies are discovering the convenience of the little purses with long, thin cords. These are just large enough for a Kleenex, lipstick, keys, and some change, and come in many colors, several styles, and can be worn while dancing by pulling the thin cord across your body, shoulder to opposite waist. I think these are reminiscent of the dance bags worn by flappers.

Authentic Patterns has another, cute, new one. It has a fitted bodice with square neckline, front and back, and a front inset trimmed with multiple rows of pregathered eyelet trim. They suggest the elasticized, puffed sleeves be made of eyelet as well as a

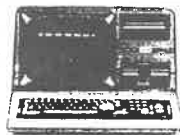
contrasting upper ruffle around the skirt that sweeps up in back in an apron effect. The skirt is eight-gored with a self-ruffle around the lower edge. A very pretty, feminine dress.

Kentucky Ruffles Pattern Company, that we mentioned last month, also has a new pattern, featuring an elastic-less puffed sleeve -- this is a very special design with an inner sleeve that is straight and holds the outer, full sleeve, in a way that makes it puff. You may have noticed this sleeve on a few of Square Dance Dress Company's dresses.

My favorite record this month is "Will the Circle Be Unbroken" (1290) on Red Boot by Chuck Marlow. Good old time gospel flavor. Elmer Sheffield's new release is "Super Love" on ESP (139) and Bill Terrel also does it on Ranch House (309). A couple of promising rounds are "Whoop De Do" on Chaparral (609) (Phase II), and "Twenty Six Miles" on Capitol (6030) (also Phase II). We should be getting lots of new releases now that the National is over -- all the record companies like to present them there first -- so watch for them next month!

Fashionable Thoughts by Martibet



While you may not need a sweater during the summer to keep cool breezes away from you, what could be a better time to start making one for the coming season. This knitted shrug (reprinted courtesy of "Square Dancing Magazine", November 1985) is easy to make and one you'll enjoy wearing.

KNITTED SHRUG by Tommi Herrington Potter Valley, CA

Where we live, colder weather and sometimes drafty halls have made this shrug very popular with the ladies. It keeps their arms and shoulders warm without being bulky and can be worn while dancing, if necessary, without being in the way.

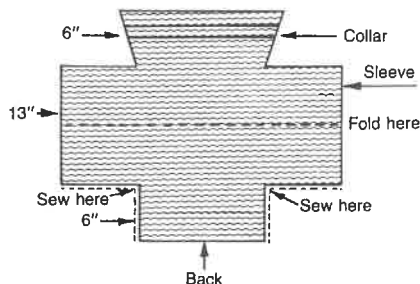
Materials Needed

8 oz. knitting worsted (4 ply)
1 oz. white angora (or Unger
Fluffy or Dazzle Aire)

#10 needles (or #10 circular needle)
Knit back and forth because of
number of stitches.

Directions

6" Collar: Cast on 140 stitches with worsted (for larger sizes use 160 or 180 stitches). Work in ribbing, K2 P2, for 1½ inches. Tie in white angora and continue to work in ribbing, K2 P2, for 3 inches. Break off white yarn and tie in primary color yarn. Work in ribbing, K2 P2, for 1½ inches.

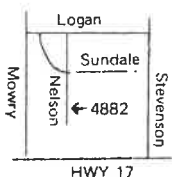

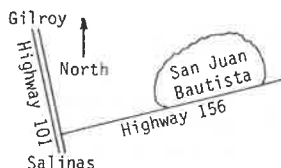

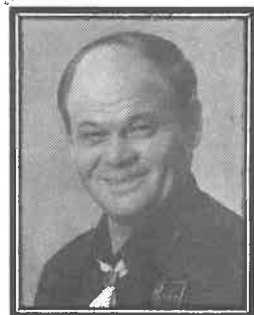

WALK AND DODGE CALLERLAB Mainstream Call #57

Definition

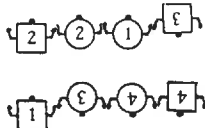
(CALLERLAB April 1984) Starting formation - Box circulate or facing couples. From box circulate formation, each dancer facing into the box walks forward to take the place of the dancer who was directly in front of him. Meanwhile, each dancer facing out of the box steps sideways (dodges) into the

position vacated by the "walker" who was formerly beside him. Dancers end side by side, both facing out.

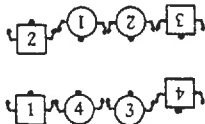
If Walk and Dodge is called from facing couples, the caller must designate who is to walk and who is to dodge (e.g., "men walk, ladies dodge"). Ending formation is a box circulate formation.

(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #546.)

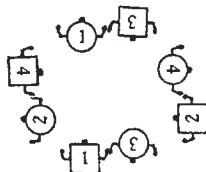

From box circulate formation, each dancer facing into the box walks forward to take the place of the dancer who was directly in front of him. Meanwhile, each dancer facing out of the box steps sideways (dodges) into the position vacated by the "walker" who was formerly beside him. Dancers end side by side, (both) facing out.



Dancing Hints

Walk and Dodge continues to be an extremely versatile Mainstream call that can be used to establish many infrequently used or 'unusual' formations. Additionally, this call may be called from some unusual formations as shown in each of the examples.

Although this call was previously examined (see The Prompter, June 1980), the 'main secrets to success' warrant another publication at this time. When you are 'a walker', you must execute this action such that you: 1) Precisely walk to the exact position of the dancer who was directly in front of

you (all examples shown); 2) Pass right shoulders with another 'walker' coming straight at you (example #2); 3) Yield the 'right-of-way' to another 'walker' on your left (example #3). Under all circumstances, the dancer executing the 'walking action' MUST complete the call facing out in the new formation.

When you are 'a dodger', your "sidestep action" must be executed precisely such that you: 1) ALWAYS remain facing the same direction as when you started (all examples shown); 2) 'Dodge' completely to the end of your formation (all examples shown, but example #2 requires that you quickly 'dodge' three full positions); and 3) Upon completion of your action, you

MUST NOT turn nor 'wander' in order to achieve the proper ending formation (all examples shown, but example #3 probably causes you the most trouble).

Walk and Dodge from facing couples continues to be executed poorly due to dancers hesitating to establish 'who walks and who dodges', the infrequently used formation(s) for this call, and the extremely poor 'body flow' required for the successful execution from these formations. When executed from columns (the controversial formation among callers), the call can be executed well if you can ALWAYS remember exactly who you are in the column -- #1 and #3 are always 'dodgers'; #2 and #4 are always 'walkers'.

'ROUND' ABOUT

SWING AND JIVE

Swing Dance, Jive, Jitterbug, Lindy, Push, Rock, and whatever other names you may wish to use, are very much the same type of dancing. The dance has the distinct character of using 1 and 1/2 measures of music for each basic move. This may also have some variations, but it is the real identifier to the swing dance.

There are three variations, namely single swing, double swing, and triple swing. Within each variation there are many basics. Some choreographers START as basic with two slow steps followed by a triple time. In this case, the rhythm would be s,s,q,q,s. Or 1,2,3&4. Other variations may be: 1&2,3&4,5,6. This would represent two triples and a slow rock and would use the 1 and 1/2 measures. Or, it could be 1,2,3&4,5&6, with the slow rock being at the start. The two slow steps could be any of the following: Push-Pull, rock back recover, rock forward recover, walk 2, wrap up 2, unwrap 2, Tamara 2, side and touch, or whatever tickles your fancy. Swing is a "free style" type of dance that has produced a very large number of basics or amalgamated steps.

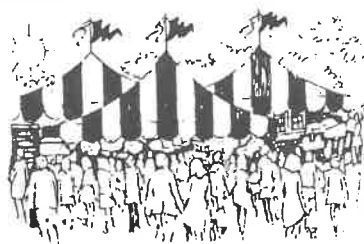
The first introduction to round dance swing may come with the classic "Green Door", "Johnston's Rag", or other easy level old-time dances. The newer dances on the scene (November '84) would be "Undecided" and "Sentimental Journey", "Calendar Girl", "Sentimental Old You", and an easy favorite like "Crazy Eyes".



A partial list of the swing basics are: Chasses Rocks, Right to Left, Left to Right, Throwaways, Tunnels, Spanish Arms, Stop and Go, Fallaway Rocks, Turning Rock (right and left), American Spins, Change Hands Behind Back, Links, Cuban Walks, Umbrella, and many more -- too many to mention.

Practically any two-step basic can be amalgamated to a swing basic as the timing is very adaptable qqs qqs. Just add the two slow steps to the front or back: "ss qqs qqs", or "qqs qqs ss", or even "qqs ss qqs ss". They would all fit into the swing category.

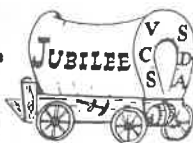
Swing, or whatever you wish to call it, is probably the most adapted dance to 'social dancing' today. Age isn't a problem as many people do single swing and do it slowly to fit the music in 1/2 timing. Today's dancing doesn't always call for closed positions and again swing fits this type of dancing very well. Don't ever criticize those people who enjoy this type of dancing. If this is their way of recreation, stress relief or whatever, it is a good muscle toner and cardiovascular exercise.

HOEDOWN!

Volunteer dancers in four states hopscothed back and forth through time during a recent tour by Cope Video Productions of Dillard, Georgia, to shoot major scenes for HOEDOWN!, the Golden Anniversary movie tracing the history of square dancing.

Baltimore, Maryland was the first stop where CALLERLAB members were interviewed concerning the life of a modern square dance caller, and videotaped as they recorded "Square Dancing's Calling Me", the Golden Anniversary theme song.

Then the camera crew headed for Berea College, in Berea, Kentucky, where Dr. John Ramsay and the Berea Country Dancers gave up their Easter holiday to perform as Morris Dancers and English peasants from the 15th and 17th centuries. East Saturday proved breathtaking with warm sun and brisk breezes ruffling the spring blossoms and peasant dresses. The innovative students even brought along children, infants and one Medieval-looking dog to make the scene complete

A spectator passing the hillock full of laughing peasants could not have guessed that most of the dancers had worked past midnight costumed in the elaborate white-wigged Colonial style of George Washington's era and the tightly trussed and corseted early-1900's. All of the authentic costumes were provided by Mary Ann Shupe of Berea's Drama Department who made sure they were correct down to the last ruffle or wrinkle, depending upon whether it was a Colonial petticoat or a peasant wrap.

By the time the movie crew pulled into Bethel, Ohio, two days later, they were beginning to feel the strain of nearly two weeks of creative work under deadline pressure. But it didn't take long for the enthusiasm of the Ohio Valley Pioneer Dance Troupe to wipe out their fatigue. Caller STEVE Bing and his dancers had researched not only the dances and calls for three distinct periods of dance, but also had collected vintage clothing, covered wagons, horse teams, a furnished pioneer cabin and even a dead rabbit, victim of a nocturnal auto encounter.

Joe Whitt, a pioneer historian, scouted locations for a Colorado goldmining settlement circa 1859 and a frontier wagon train from 1870 to complement the



Kentucky housewarming scene at the pioneer cabin. He scrutinized the tiniest details of daily life from those periods, even building a sluice box from old drawings of a mining town.

At 9 a.m. on April Fool's morning, dancers began arriving at the Burke Park Pioneer Homestead. Each one was already costumed for the 1820's so a minimum of time was spent popping wigs over modern hairstyles while cast members showed off their most thrilling costume finds such as high button shoes and cowhide vests. The "pioneers" then dance for an old-time Kentucky housewarming, cheerfully repeating the same scenes many times so the camera crew could catch it from several angles. A local restaurant catered the lunch in antique dishes using foods that would have been available to the pioneers: fried chicken, green beans, homemade fruit pies, jam in a crockery jar, and mounds of biscuits on a wooden platter. After three hours of dancing, the actors needed no coaching for the lunch scenes.

After lunch, the cast and crew moved to a rocky stream bed on the outskirts of Bethel where all the props and camera equipment was hand-carried down a steep embankment. The women had a chance to rest and change costumes for the covered wagon scene to be shot later, but the men donned their roughest clothes and toughest faces to portray rowdy miners hoofing it without women partners. They danced on loose shale rock in

their heavy boots while the sun poured rivulets of sweat from under their slouch hats.

The sun was sinking quickly by the time the mining scene was finished so instead of resting the "miners" grabbed their props and the camera equipment for the climb back up the embankment. When they reached the grassy clearing for the wagon train scene, the women, wagoners and horse teams were already in place. A quick change of costume for the men and it was "Wagons Ho!" around and around the clearing. For the sake of accuracy, the actors walked beside the wagons instead of riding on them. They walked and they walked while the cameras rolled from all sides.

Finally, at sunset, the wagons pulled into the familiar circle of community. A campfire was built to hold the iron kettles of food and the fiddler unpacked the travelers' one precious musical instrument. By this time the long day's activity was showing in the straggled hair, dusty faces and sagging shoulders so that the actors looked and felt just like their historical role models. But, as the fiddle music split the cool evening air, spirits lifted and toes tapped with fresh energy. In seconds, the bedraggled crowd was enjoying the magical renewal that always comes with dance.

Because of such participation of real live people sharing their lives through dance in the making of HOEDOWN!, this made-for-TV

TWIRLING SANDS by Marie Fowler

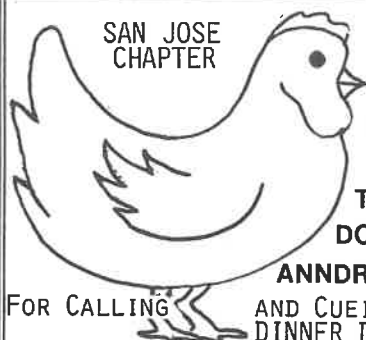

PRETZEL SALAD

- 2 2/3 cups broken pretzel pieces (unsalted or 1/2 salt preferred)
- 1 1/2 cups melted margarine
- 4 (3 oz.) pkg. cream cheese, softened
- 1 1/4 cups sugar
- 1 (8 oz.) carton frozen whipped topping, thawed
- 1 (6 oz.) strawberry (or raspberry) gelatin
- 2 cups pineapple juice (or water)
- 1 large pkg. frozen strawberries (or 2 pkgs. raspberries) with no sugar added; or 2-3 cups fresh berries

Place pretzel pieces and margarine in bottom of 9"x13" baking dish; bake 10 minutes at 400° F. Cool. Cream cheese and sugar; spread over top of lukewarm baked pretzels. Spread whipped topping over cheese. CHILL. Dissolve gelatin in boiling pineapple juice (or water). Stir in berries and

allow to thicken almost to jelled point. Spread over topping and refrigerate.

13" Sleeves: Knit 2 tog. across row, 70 sts (80 or 90 for larger sizes). Cast on 40 sts at beg of each of next 2 rows. Knit first and last 4 sts in garter stitch. Work rest of row in ribbing -- 150 sts (160 or 170 for larger sizes). Pattern will be: K4, K2 P2 across row, K4. K4, K2 P2 across row, K4. Work in pattern 13 inches from last cast on stitches. Bind off 40 sts at beginning of each of next 2 rows.

6" Back: Work remaining stitches in ribbing for 6". Bind off in pattern loosely. Fold in half and sew or crochet together. The back (last 6") will be sewn on side of collar (first 6").

Block garment. Wear by rolling the collar back and inserting arms in the sleeves. Adjust collar on neck.

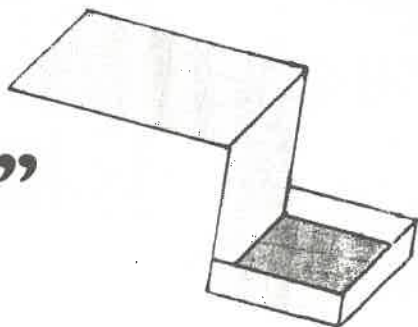

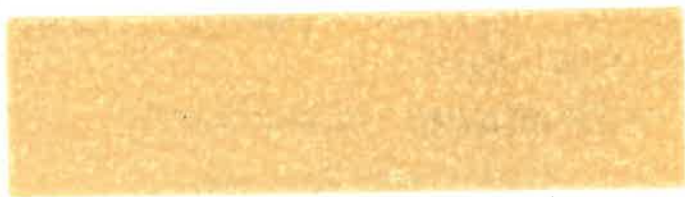
