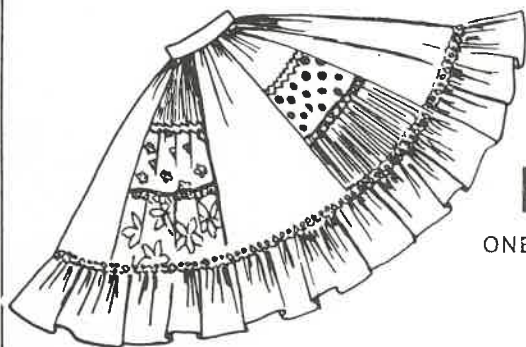

It's getting close to the first of September and the start of school is just around the corner... And, of course, the starting of quite a few beginners' square dance classes. I talked a little about beginners' classes last month and would like to continue in that vein since the lifeblood of any square dance club is the number of newcomers that it attracts to fill in the "shoes" of those who, for whatever reasons, drop out of the activity.

The Santa Clara Valley Square Dancers Association and the Santa Clara Valley Callers Association recently sent out a publicity package to all the clubs in the area which is designed to help in the club's efforts to attract beginning dancers. This is the first time that I'm aware of that SCVSDA and/or SCVCA has mounted such an effort and is a welcome boost. The package includes camera-ready forms about square dancing that can be "customized" by the club if desired. The associations also plan to run ads in the local newspapers and advertisers, and to sponsor

spot announcements on the local radio stations. All of us should be ready to answer questions from prospective students and have some knowledge of where beginner classes are being held so we can invite our friends and neighbors to join us.

Speaking of publicizing square dancing, I am really impressed with what the Diamond Dancers of Santa Rosa are doing in this regard. Abbott Johnson of this North Bay Area group regularly sends us the data on the dances they have planned and it reads like a continuous weekend to weekend festival. They utilize callers from the Bay Area (Bill Davis, John Sybalsky, Honey Wolfson, Ken Kenmille, Dick Houlton, and Kip Garvey, just to name a few) along with callers from other parts of the country. They sponsor "Mini-Weekends", workshops, All-Star Guests, as well as other special events. The level varies all the way from Plus to hard A-2 so they try to provide something for about every dancer. They have something

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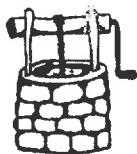


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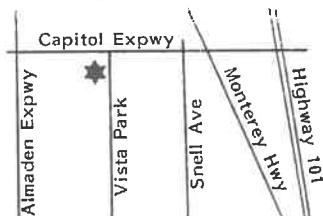


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"OUR" OPINION !

Decisions made by the members of CALLERLAB, The International Association of Square Dance Callers, can have a major and long lasting effect on the entire square dancing world. A case in point is the decision now being made on dance programs (levels) as reported in the CALLERLAB press release on page 23.

Given the importance of these decisions, one could expect that they would be voted on by the entire membership of CALLERLAB. In fact, a motion changing the entire basis of square dancing could be passed by a small percentage of the members of CALLERLAB -- 51% of those in attendance at a

convention -- and members are only required to attend one convention out of four.

Attendance at this year's convention in Baltimore was one of the lowest in recent years. The resolution to create a "soft plus" program and to create a 25 week teaching order -- both viewed as vital to the health of square dancing -- were debated and passed by the members in attendance.

After the convention, concern about the motions was heard from callers who had not attended the convention, and support for the intent of the motion began to erode. Those who had not been a part of the debate, and had not had the opportunity to vote, had no basis on which to support the decisions.

We believe it is necessary for CALLERLAB to include all members in votes on important decisions, and to provide written arguments, both pro and con, with the ballots. Then, and only then, will CALLERLAB decisions represent the will of the true majority.



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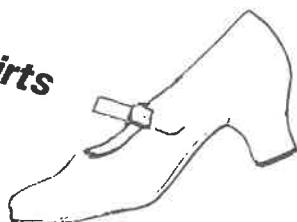
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We Get Letters

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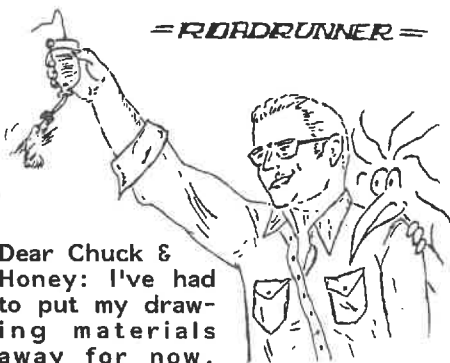

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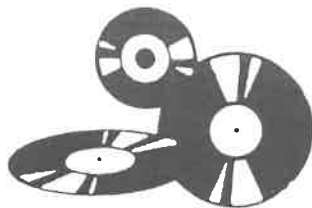
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WHAT'S NEW!!

Fancy dresses, fancy skirts, fancy slips... we're getting fancier and fancier for the fall and holiday seasons. Malco Modes and Square Dance Dress Company have designed dresses in laces, metallic fabrics, crystal, and taffetas. Skirts are coming out with more and more eyelet and lace, and they are beautiful!

You should see the lace skirt, designed by Jean Jones, to be worn over the lame slips by Crystal Magic... it let's the iridescence of the slip show through.

For their first fall offering, Fashions by Bettye has a solid-color skirt, with lots of lace and ribbons in either white or ecru, to be teamed with a white or ecru blouse trimmed in the same laces and ribbons. I think the most outstanding outfit in that collection is the black skirt with the ecru trim and blouse... a real stand out!

Malco Modes has added a Prom-Prairie slip to its line. Made of poly-cotton batiste, it has a curved yoke (for close fit), the almost-full-circle body is gathered to that yoke and is finished with a deep ruffle. Two-inch lace trims the top of this ruffle and the hem. Of course, they come in longer lengths than the square dance

petticoats. Now you can shop your square dance stores for your Country-Western and cocktail dress slips.

You record buyers have a lot of good ones to choose from this month. On Rhythm, "The Letter" (191) by Bob Baier; "Mountain Music" (196) by all the Rhythm Boys; and "Stand Up" (193) by Jerry Story. On Rhythm's other label, Circle D, "Stop in the Road" (221) done by Les Hughes. Mike Seastrom has signed on with the Rhythm label and his first release will be "Feel the Feeling" -- and it's beautiful.

Chaparral has four new ones: "Mercy" (517) by Ken Bower; "You Been Gone Too Long" (805) by Scott Smith; "I Don't Care" (212) (as in, "If the Sun Don't Shine") by Jerry Haag; and, my favorite, "Red Roses" (319) (as in "For a Blue Lady") by Gary Shoemaker.

Be sure to check out "Crazy" (5083) on Hi Hat by Jerry Schatzer, and another good old Country-Western tune, "Four Walls" (1296) on Red Boot by Bill Anderson.

There will be more Rhythm releases in the next few weeks, so tune (or turn) into your favorite square dance record shop and listen!

Did I say Christmas shopping in September? Well, that's when Stephanie starts her Christmas list!

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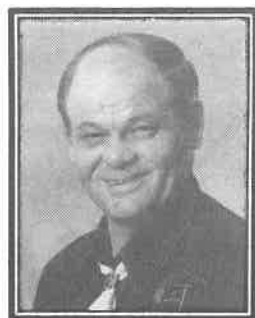
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BEYOND MAINSTREAM

ANYTHING & ROLL CALLERLAB Plus Call #10

Definition

(CALLERLAB March 1986)
Starting formation - Various. The term "...& Roll" may be added to any call which, by definition, causes one or more dancers to have turning body flow to the right or left as they complete their portion of the call. It is an instruction to those dancers to turn individually in place, one quarter (90°) more in the direction of body flow determined by the preceding command.

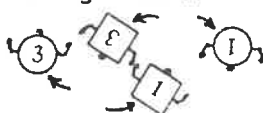
NOTE: Dancer(s) who are walking in a straight line cannot Roll.

(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #1311; and is a new revision of the CALLERLAB April 1983 definition.)

In addition to the definition above, CALLERLAB also (April 1983 and March 1986) established the following uses of Anything & Roll as deemed appropriate for possible inclusion in Plus Programs at the caller's discretion (additions from March 1986 underlined): Star Thru & Roll, California Twirl & Roll, Swing Thru & Roll, Spin the Top & Roll, Cast Off 3/4 (waves only) & Roll, Slide Thru & Roll, Fold Family & Roll, Peel Off & Roll, Fan the Top & Roll, Single Hinge & Roll, Back Track & Roll, Grand Swing Thru & Roll, Peel the Top & Roll, Trade the Wave & Roll, Triple Trade & Roll, Turn & Left Thru & Roll, The final centers of the following calls may Roll: Follow Your Neighbor, Relay the Deucey, Spin Chain the Gears.

Dancing Hints

Anything & Roll continues to be one of the very few calls that requires you, the dancer, to remember the action of the previous call in order to properly accomplish the "...& Roll" movement.

Although this call was previously examined (see *The Prompter*, December 1984), the recent additional possibilities created by the March 1986 change to the definition should also be examined. Each of the examples shown represents a "new or slightly different" way of applying this call.

The 'main secret to success' for executing "...& Roll" call is the proper accomplishment of the preceding call BEFORE you execute the "roll action". Since the caller must state the "...& Roll" before you have completed the previous call (in order to let you know what to do without stopping), you must resist the normal tendency to 'blend the call and the Roll' into

the completion of the call itself. In order to assure positive, proper positioning for the 'roll action', you MUST fully complete the previous call just prior to 'turning 1/4 more in place'.

When executing the actual 'roll action', you should always perform this action IN PLACE. Do NOT 'wander' or 'overturn' such that you are out of position for the next call.

Some unusual formations are achieved using "...& Roll". Again, the fact that 'you are where you are' was intentional (theoretically) on the part of the caller; so just let the caller worry about 'what to do next'. You must hold your position precisely to be able to properly accomplish the next call. You must avoid the temptation to move or turn around; since this action usually will result in "square standing" rather than "square dancing".

One final point, this call is executed using TWO FULL BEATS OF MUSIC. Many folks believe that because the time is so short, they must "rush" the call or they will be 'left behind'; and they hurry so fast that they (and others in their square) no longer recognize the formations. Please execute the call properly such that you are DANCING rather than standing.



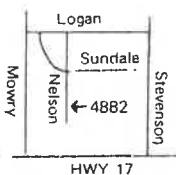

Summer Travels to Expo '86 and the Canadian Nationals

We started out on a leisurely trip to Expo '86 and the Canadian National Square Dance Convention, but it ended as an exciting trip. We reached Rogue River, Oregon, the home of my daughter and son-in-law, and parked our fifth wheeler on their future tennis court. My son-in-law, Andy, has it all layed out to be blacktopped soon -- a real nice flat place to park. The second day we backtracked to Ashland to visit our granddaughter who is going to Oregon State in the little Shakespearean city. She works in a Mexican restaurant, so, we ate mexican food, real good food, and drank Dos XX Beer.

The next day, July 16, we start to Olympia, Washington to stay at the KOA, very close to the Oly brewery. Then, into Vancouver where we had "Park and Share" reservations. We stayed on private property and rode the bus and overhead rail to Expo. Very easy way to get to town -- and no parking or driving problems.

We spent five days in Vancouver and went to Expo four times. We bought the Passport and have about 67 Pavilion Stamps. There's so much to see it would take a month to do it all. We enjoyed China, Italy, France, Germany, Japan, Australia, and Egypt as we had visited these countries in our travels. We also enjoyed Russia as we want to go there soon. All of the exhibits were Transportation-Communication oriented and very interesting.

There are many opinions as to the success of the fair, but we were there with daily attendance at 140,000 to 170,000, so, they were doing quite well.

We left Vancouver bound for the Salmon Arm KOA. We drove up the new Coquihalla Highway. It's a toll highway through beautiful mountain and river country. Overnight at Salmon Arm and then on to Calgary.

Using our Super Saver Value Card, we logged into the Calgary KOA and immediately saw many square dance friends. They were dancing on the gravel roads of the KOA. About 200 square dance RV's were at the KOA; across the highway, at Sun Alta Trailer Park, there were at least 1000 square dance RV's. School bus shuttle buses moved the dancers to and from the Calgary Convention Center. Buy a \$9.00 three-day button-pass and you were all set.

The dancing was in three different buildings on two to three floors in each building. The menu was Mainstream to C-2. Round dancing was Easy S/D to High-Intermediate, some Challenge rounds were taught. At least 10,000 people were registered and it was still growing. This was the 5th Biannual Convention, the next one is in Hamilton, Ontario in 1988. Be there.

We left Calgary heading for Banff, Lake Louise and Glacier National Park. Checked into the KOA and then used our Golden Passport to go into the park. It's quite a sight, beautiful mountains, rocks, trees, and rivers with lakes.

We drove the Highway to the Sun across the Continental Divide to St. Marys. Had lunch at the lake picnic grounds, then back across the mountain to the Valley. The Indians had the Good Life, clean air and sweet water.

Checking out of Glacier, we went to the small town of Plains, Montana to visit some square dance friends. They enjoy the quiet country life. Snow in the winter, sun in the summer. Quite often I've watched the TV weatherman talk about Plains, Montana. Now I know where it is, and what it is...

Out of Montana, we pushed through Idaho into Washington and down to the Columbia River. That's a lot of water, deep, wide and running fast. The Surf Sailors really live it up in the windy gorges. The afternoon breeze is about 45 mph, whitecaps on the waves running **upstream**.

We stayed at Cascade Locks Koa, saw more dancers and had good campfire chats. Then down the Columbia to Portland and out to the Coast to Tillimook. My

favorite cheese. We visited the cheese factory again. Bought some gifts, smoked salmon and stocked up on very sharp Tillimook cheddar.

Down the coast of Oregon into California and the King Valley Redwood Campgrounds. We were here in 1983 during the construction and danced on the subfloor. Now it's beautiful polished maple. Jack and Darlene Chaffee are resident summer round dance teachers. Doing a real good job. Jerry Rash of Texas is the summer resident square dance caller. Mainstream through A-2 with a little bit of C-1. Nice shady camp sights with cable TV. We are getting back to civilization. Richard and Karen Marquez, former students, are now living in King Valley Redwood and they enjoy the dancing, fishing and country life.

We have one leg to go, Crescent City to San Jose. That's a nine-hour day as the traffic was **terrific**. But we made it home by 6:30 pm, finishing a 3800-mile 3-week trek through the North Woods.

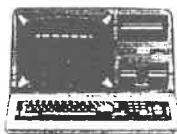

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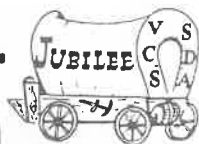
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30th Annual

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**MEMPHIS AWARDED 1990
CONVENTION AS 27,192 ATTEND
35TH NATIONAL IN INDIANAPOLIS**

Memphis, Tennessee, in 1990 was announced as a future convention site as 27,192, including dancers from all fifty states and many foreign countries, attended the 35th National Square Dance Convention in Indianapolis. Thirty-four states had fifty or more dancers in Indianapolis, and thirty had one hundred or more -- indicating it was truly a "National" Convention.

Future Convention dates are: Houston, June 25, 26 & 27, 1987; Anaheim, June 23, 24 & 25, 1988; Oklahoma City, June 22, 23 & 24, 1989; and Memphis, June 28, 29 & 30, 1990. National Conventions always start on the fourth Thursday in June.

The 1991 Convention will be awarded at Houston during the 1987 Convention. Bid sessions, which are

open to all dancers and interested parties, are held on Fridays at 9 a.m. in large auditoriums so that all may attend and learn.

The 27,192 at Indianapolis (third largest to date) included 5,820 from Indiana and 21,372 from other states and foreign countries. Other top states included: Illinois 3,035; Ohio 2,942; Michigan 2,717; Missouri 1,043; Pennsylvania 944; Florida 845; and California 626.

Stir The Bucket With Betty

KEEPING TO THE LITE SIDE

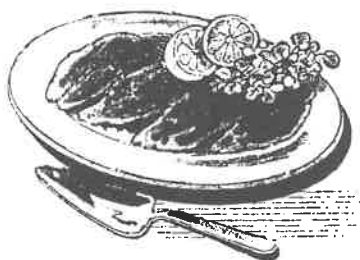
Our recipes this month will cater to those who want something more than a salad, but still prefer a "lighter" meal. For those who are watching calories, these recipes should be a shoe-in for you, too! Bon appetit!

MACADAMIA PARMESAN SOLE

- 2 large eggs
- 3/4 cup grated parmesan cheese
- 2 Tbsp. all-purpose flour
- 4 sole fillets (4 to 6 oz. each)
- 3 Tbsp. salad oil
- 3 Tbsp. butter or margarine
- 1/2 cup finely chopped salted roasted macadamia nuts
- watercress or parsley sprigs
- lemon halves

Heat oven to 425°. Put a 10"x15" baking pan in oven to heat. In a 9" or 10" pie pan, beat eggs to blend. On a piece of waxed paper, mix cheese and flour. Dip fish in egg to coat, drain off excess, and coat in cheese mixture. Set fish in a single layer on waxed paper. Remove heated pan from oven; add oil and butter and swirl until butter melts. Lay a piece of fish in pan; turn to coat with butter. Repeat with remaining fish, setting slightly apart in pan. Sprinkle fish evenly with nuts. Bake, uncovered, in the 425° oven until fish is opaque in thickest part (cut to test), 7 to 10 minutes. With a wide spatula, transfer fish to serving platter. Garnish with watercress and lemon. Makes 4 servings.

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LEMON DREAM SALAD

Salad:

- 1 (6 oz.) pkg. lemon gelatin
- 2 cups mini marshmallows
- 4 cups boiling water
- 1 medium can crushed pineapple, drained (save juice)
- 3-4 bananas, sliced

Topping:

- 3 Tbsp. flour
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 cup pineapple juice (above)
- 1 egg, slightly beaten
- 1 envelope Dream Whip, prepared as directed

Dissolve gelatin and marshmallows in boiling water; cool. Add drained pineapple and bananas. Pour into 8"x10" or 9"x13" pan and let set. For topping, combine flour, sugar and pineapple juice in saucepan. Bring to a boil, stirring constantly. Add egg and boil until thick and smooth; cool. Combine with Dream Whip and spread on gelatin.

CURRICULUM GUIDELINES FOR CALLER TRAINING

CALLERLAB is pleased and proud to announce the publication of a new book, "Curriculum Guidelines for Caller Training", copyright 1986.

The book is in loose leaf form to allow callers, active in caller training, to tailor the book to their individual needs. The entire spectrum of caller training is covered to include the approved CALLERLAB Curriculum topics and suggested time frames for each subject. CALLERLAB recognizes that each caller trainer deals with his subject matter on an individual basis. The binder approach will enable the trainer to insert syllabus material for his own program in the appropriate sections while maintaining the continuity of the approved curriculum.

The purpose of the book is to establish standard curriculum guidelines for the training of all callers regardless of experience. The book provides this for differ-

ent types of programs -- from a one-on-one type of home program to a full week-long college with one or more staff teachers. Caller Associations, who conduct periodic training for their members, can use this book as the source document regardless of who conducts the individual phase of training.

NO NEW PLUS QS MOVEMENTS

Gene Trimmer, Chairman of the CALLERLAB Plus Quarterly Selection Committee, announced

that his committee voted to have "No New Movements" for the period beginning August 1, 1986.



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WHAT'S THIS I HEAR ABOUT NEW CALLERLAB PROGRAMS?

For the past year or more, the square dance world has been very concerned about the many problems that seem to be plaguing the activity -- high drop-out rates, reduced festival crowds, club-to-class transition problems, etc. Groups of leaders such as CROSS-FIRE and CROSSROADS have met to discuss these concerns and seek solutions. Out of all of these meetings has come the thought that the current CALLERLAB Mainstream Program of 68 families of basics, with a suggested 41 teaching sessions of 2 to 2½ hours each, may be longer than some areas can handle. An alternative entry level program that can be taught in 25 weeks has been widely suggested.

CALLERLAB has had one or more special committees studying these problems and possible solutions since its 1985 convention. The findings of the ad hoc committee were a major portion of the discussion topics at the 1986 convention in Baltimore, March 24-26. From this intensive work at the convention came a mandate to develop suitable entry programs with a shortened "Learn to Dance" time frame. These efforts are now underway with committees hard at work on solutions.

Let's look at the thrust of these efforts in an attempt to remove some of the misconceptions that some callers and dancers are talking about. There are four conditions:

1. Areas where the current Mainstream Program is alive and well - **NO CHANGE!** There are many areas of the world where callers, clubs and leaders have been doing a fine job with the existing dance programs and no changes are required. There is no need to tamper with a program that is alive and well and it would be presump-

tuous of CALLERLAB to intrude. To those of you who are operating in such an environment, we salute you and say "Keep up the good work."

2. Areas where Mainstream is the predominant dance program upon graduation - A shortened Mainstream Program with fewer moves to be taught and learned in about 25 weeks, with other moves being deferred for subsequent workshoping. One of the major reasons for this is that many areas cannot devote 41 weeks to a learning cycle and 25 weeks seemed to be a good number for the instruction period. This was one of the major resolutions at Baltimore and the membership of CALLERLAB has been surveyed to determine which moves fall into which categories. Using the existing Mainstream Program as a starting point, the basics that can be taught effectively in 25 weeks would be commonly referred to as "Bold Face Type Basics" while those that can be deferred will be commonly described as "Italicized Face Type Basics". The proposed plan would be to teach the Bold Face Type Basics first in the 25 weeks class time. This means that having completed 25 learning sessions, dancers will have reached a destination where they can join clubs in their area using just these movements. Some areas may choose to workshop the deferred moves in subsequent dances or workshops. While some may view this primarily as a change in the teaching order, it is really much more than that. In many areas, the entire Mainstream list may be covered over time. This trial program with changes in italics may only be a shortened "Learn to Dance" lesson period. Other areas will use the 25 week list of Bold Face Type Basics as a **DESTINATION** program, as indicated.

3. Areas where the predominant dance program includes some number of calls from the existing Plus Program - A shortened Mainstream Program with fewer moves that can be taught in 25 weeks and which may include some number of Plus calls. Sometimes, dancers and callers use the term "Soft Plus" to describe this situation. There is a very select committee working on this proposal with a target date of late summer for the proposed list of calls. It should be emphasized that this, too, is a DESTINATION program and not a stepping stone. This program will also be designed to be taught effectively in 25 weeks. Graduates of these classes then would be able to dance with clubs in their area using the figures taught in this 25 week program. This should reduce the trauma of class-to-club transition since the class will have learned what will be danced upon graduation.

4. The fourth concurrent effort is called "Community Dance Program" and it is geared towards a limited repertoire of calls that can be taught effectively in a six-week time frame. It is emphasized that this, too, is a DESTINATION program and not a stepping stone to some other existing programs. This six (6) week program is under the development auspices of the Traditional Dance Committee and will draw heavily on the rich heritage of America's traditional dance plus material from successful limited Basics programs. It is geared for those people who do not

wish to devote their time and energies to learning the Mainstream Program in any of its existing or proposed forms, but rather want a system of social outlets for recreation and exercise. Many people who enter this program may subsequently gain a greater interest and move to one of the other programs listed above, but this program is a complete program by itself. This is not designed for the current club dancers.

As these programs are completed, callers and dance leaders will be advised and they will be made available to all interested persons through the CALLERLAB Home Office. It should be emphasized repeatedly that NONE OF THESE PROPOSED PROGRAMS IS DESIGNED TO REPLACE THE CURRENT MAINSTREAM PROGRAM IN AREAS WHERE IT IS NOW WORKING. Indeed there are many areas where Mainstream is "alive and well" and no changes should be considered. To repeat an often used expression - "IF IT AIN'T BROKE, DON'T FIX IT."

It also needs to be stressed that no program will work magic. It is not the pieces of paper that cause problems, but rather the dance and caller leaders that use or fail to use the designed programs. By working together for a common good, we will be able to strengthen the entire movement of square dancing in all of its forms. People can and do make the difference. Let's make it work for ALL of us!

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THE NEW CALLERLAB PROGRAMS

ANALYSIS by CHUCK WOLFSON

When I received the CALLERLAB press release on the proposed new programs (see page 23), I was surprised by the contents. My understanding of the resolutions passed at the Baltimore convention didn't match the statements made in the release.

Over the next week I talked with John Kaltenthaler, Executive Secretary of CALLERLAB, with Norm Cross, Chairman of the Board of CALLERLAB, and with Martin Mallard, Chairman of the Mainstream Committee and member of the Bates committee working on what is known within CALLERLAB as the "soft plus" program. I tried to reach Red Bates, Chairman of the "soft plus" committee, but he was unavailable for comment.

I also talked with other members of the Board of Governors and with callers who had been in attendance at the Baltimore Convention. I also reviewed the original resolutions presented to the membership at the convention, and the final wording of the resolutions as passed.

Following are the pertinent resolutions as passed:

MAINSTREAM COMMITTEE

Be it resolved that CALLERLAB submit a survey to all voting members of CALLERLAB to choose which Mainstream calls should be bold faced in the present list and recommended for first teaching—the other calls would be italicized for later workshoping.

AD HOC COMMITTEE

Be it resolved that a committee shall be appointed by the incoming Executive Committee which will include the chairmen of the Mainstream, Plus and Advanced committees who will direct this committee to make recommendations to the Board of Governors on a

suggested list of dance movements that will be published no later than August 15, 1986. This suggested list will be offered to the general membership to be tried on a one year trial basis beginning September 1, 1986.

Be it resolved that CALLERLAB establish a committee to determine which calls from the Basic, Mainstream and Plus lists can be capably taught in 25 weeks at two hours per session.

Based on the comments of those who attended the convention in Baltimore, the mandate of the membership was to create a new program, "soft-plus", which could be taught in 25 weeks. This program was recommended as a replacement for the existing Mainstream and Plus programs, providing a single program containing the most popular and frequently used moves from each list. Such a program, it was felt, could reunite Mainstream and Plus dancers around the world.

The idea of not adapting the new program in some Mainstream areas apparently surfaced after the convention and appears to have been a key factor in the publication of the press release.

If CALLERLAB now follows the direction indicated by the release, the square dance world will be divided by at least three destination programs, rather than united by one (not including the "Community Dance Program").

The "bold face" mainstream list, which in theory could be taught in about 25 weeks, would include no Plus moves and would become, in some areas, a destination program.

The "soft plus" list, which would also be designed to be taught in about 25 weeks, would contain some subset of the "bold face"

mainstream list, with the addition of several popular plus moves. This would also become a destination level.

Today, dancers all learn the Basic/Mainstream Program. Those who continue on to learn the Plus Program can still attend dances at the Mainstream Program level, because each CALLERLAB level is built upon the base of those which come before.

According to information currently available, dancers who learned the "bold face" mainstream would not be able to dance either the "soft plus" program or the mainstream program. Dancers who learned the "soft plus" list would not be able to dance either the "bold face" or full Mainstream programs. None of these dancers could dance the existing Plus program.

There has also been discussion about making the "soft plus" list a "bold face" subset of the Plus program, continuing the full Plus Program as an additional destination program.

According to CALLERLAB, the "soft plus" committee has submitted a recommended list prior to the committed date of August 15, 1986. That list, and the "bold face" list, are currently being reviewed by the Board of Governors.

Square dancing today needs a shorter teaching program -- both the existing Mainstream and Plus programs take too long to learn. The typical square dancer today dances perhaps three nights a month, for the fun and social

aspects of the activity. A "soft plus" list, containing the most popular and frequently danced moves from the Mainstream and Plus list, is an ideal level for the majority of dancers, and could be learned in a reasonable time.

Square dancing does not need multiple new destination programs which will only make it more difficult for dancers to visit other clubs or areas. Local, State and National Conventions or festivals would have an impossible task trying to accommodate the dancing levels of visitors from different areas. Currently, no one in CALLERLAB has been assigned the responsibility to implement the new programs in a manner which will avoid this situation.

CALLERLAB needs to re-examine the mandate of the Baltimore Convention. The current press release does not address that mandate -- it is not a blueprint for solving the problems facing square dancing, it is a recipe for disaster.

If the results of the committee work do not provide a single program that can be embraced by callers and dancers in all areas, CALLERLAB should consider a delay in implementation while seeking an appropriate list.

To unite and revitalize square dancing, CALLERLAB's executives must take a position of firm leadership and recommend that callers in all areas give a new, single, program a fair trial. Square dancing needs leadership that seeks solutions, cooperation, and compromise.



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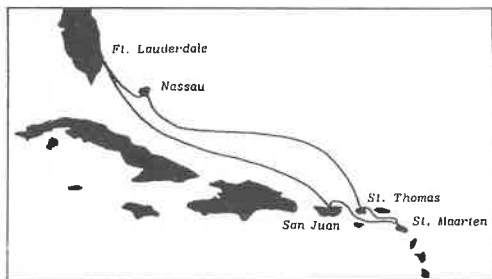

Presented here is the information you will need to produce the outfit. We hope you join into the spirit of this and wear the "Square Dance Dress of California" whenever you attend a National Square Dance Convention, State Square Dance Convention, at major "festivals", or at any time you desire!

We wish to take this opportunity to "Thank" the Dress Committee members for their efforts in this project.

SQUARE DANCE DRESS OF CALIFORNIA

Materials Needed:

- 5 yards ecru (poly-cotton) for sizes 10, 12, and 14. Add 1 yard for larger sizes.
- 1 yard orange/tangerine color (poly-cotton) for piping.
- 10 yards of cord for piping.
- 11 yards 1½" non-ruffled ecru eyelet. 12 to 14 yards for larger sizes.
- 1 ecru dress zipper.
- Ecru and orange/tangerine thread.
- Horsehair braid (optional). 2 four-yard packages for hemline.
- Optional: 1½ yards ecru nylon net.

Fabric Description and Source:

Fabric is a 65/35 poly-cotton and the color is parchment. This fabric can be purchased at most any yardage store including Hancock Fabric Warehouse, House of Fabric, New York Fabric, etc.

Bodice:

Use a basic bodice pattern and scoop the neckline as low as you like or dare. After basting the ruffled eyelet around the neckline, bind with orange/tangerine binding (cut 1½" wide).

Cap Sleeve:

Cut double if you choose to line them. To make larger or smaller, fold pattern in half and cut larger or smaller at center of sleeve and underarm seam. Lay your pattern on the armhole and **cut to fit armhole** as there are NO gathers.

Puffed Sleeve (Optional):

Some ladies prefer a "puffed sleeve", therefore, this is an option.

Skirt:

8 gores: Cut 1 of these gores in half for center back gore. Don't forget to allow 1" for seam.

Ruffle:

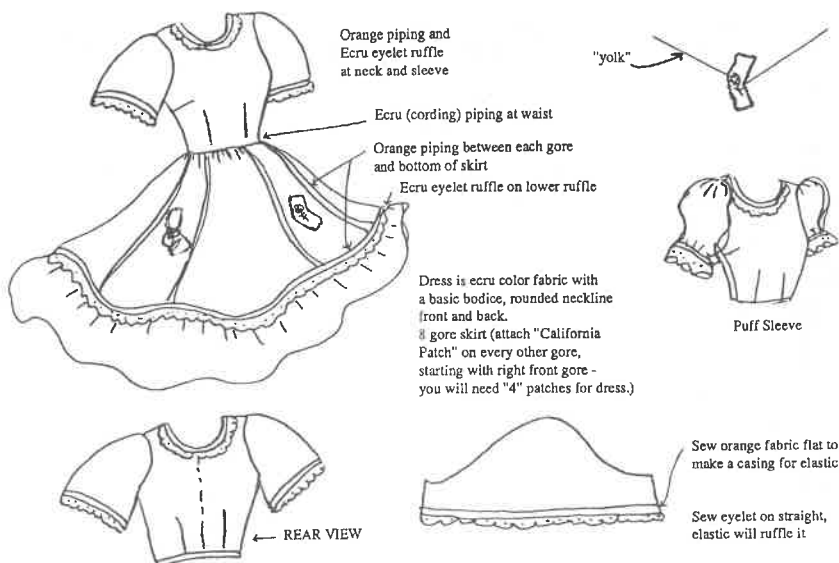
Cut 7" wide. It will take 6 widths of 44" fabric. Sew orange/tangerine piping around bottom of gores, then gather eyelet ruffle and sew on top of piping. Gather the 7" ecru ruffle and sew on top of eyelet ruffle. This way, the eyelet ruffle will stand out.

Piping:

To make your own piping, cut orange/tangerine fabric on the bias in 1½" strips, fold in half lengthwise and press. Lay cord inside and, with zipper foot, sew down side of cord. 1 yard of fabric makes enough piping for two dresses.

Hemline:

In the hemline, horsehair braid $\frac{1}{2}$ " wide may be used. You may want to line your skirt and ruffle with nylon net for extra body, but that is optional. (Tip: Cut all gores of the ecru fabric first, then lay each gore on the net (cutting one at a time) and leaving them pinned to the net and treating them as one piece of fabric or gore. When sewing the gores together, a "French seam" was used.)

Accessories:

Ladies will wear orange petticoat and pettipants; brown shoes. The outline (patch) of the state will be dark brown with orange poppy. (You will need 5 patches: 4 for the dress and 1 for the shirt.) The patches can be purchased from State Council. Ask your association president for information on how to order them. The only changes to be made to

the outfit will be the sleeve style and the depth of the scoop neck.

For the Gentlemen:

Men will wear dark brown trousers, brown shoes and belt.

Gentleman's Shirt:

Shirt should be the same material as the dress and have the orange/tangerine piping around the yolk and cuffs, but NO eyelet. The state outline (patch) is the same as the one on the dress, centered on the back, near the top. (Suggestion: Tilt the patch slightly to the right so that it appears more "centered".)

Trousers:

It is suggested that men purchase the "Mesquite" brown trousers found at most square dance shops and in festival booths. This would allow all men to have the same color pants.

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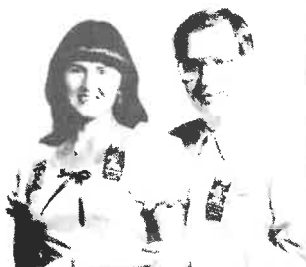

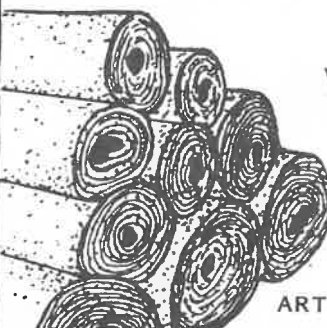
MAVERICKS **by Dot & Al Cortesi**

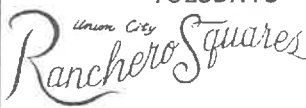
Our 1st Anniversary Hoedown on July 19th was successful despite
