

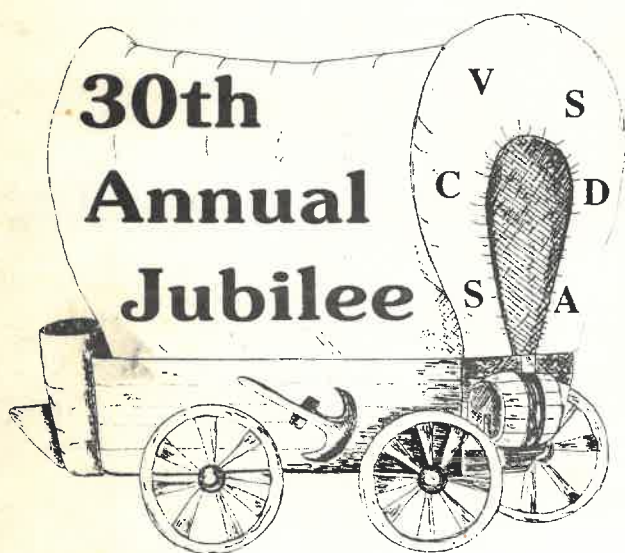

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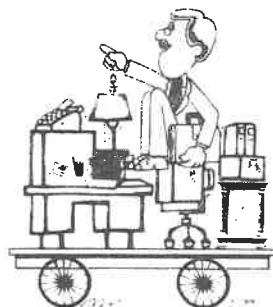
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PUBLISHER'S PATTER

When's the last time that you and your dancing partner visited another club? WHAT???? You say you've never visited another square dance club in the Bay Area?? I'm not surprised. A recent survey I did indicates that the club dancer who's been dancing an average of five years has never gone out on some other night of the week and danced with any of the other 65, or so, square dance clubs in the area. I'm not talking about hoedowns but, rather, the standard weekly club dances. Admittedly, my statistics aren't all that good, but the data does raise questions as to why most dancers don't go out and dance with a different group of people rather than their own club.

One of the reasons for this state of affairs may be that dancers develop a fierce club loyalty and feel they would be "deserting" if they danced on another night. Or maybe they have developed a similar feeling to a particular caller. A little of this type of "camaraderie" is good, but things can be carried too far.

A check of the club listings in the back of any Prompter will show at least a half dozen clubs dancing on every night of the week (with the exception of Saturday which is, of course, used for hoedowns). I've heard the excuse that one cannot understand any other caller but "their caller"... This is the person who really needs to get out and dance to someone else. They need to hear different "cues" and to experience different choreographic patterns.

As part of our duties with The Prompter, we get around to many of the clubs in the area and, no matter what club we visit, I always find a new and novel idea or way to do things. We've always been welcomed and have always enjoyed the dancing. I'd like to suggest that if you haven't recently been out on other than your regular club night (I'm talking about square dancing here!!), you pick up your partner and go visit another club. You may want to call the President of the club you've selected to let

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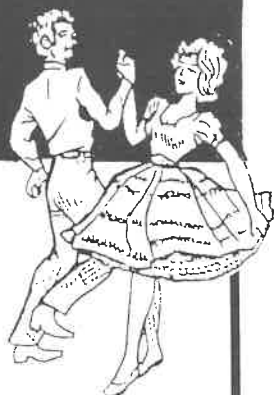


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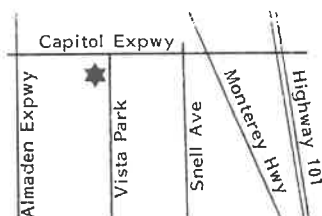
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"OUR" OPINION !

Honey enjoyed the fishing, we all enjoyed the 10 pounds of bluefin tuna... and now they're talking about salmon in October!



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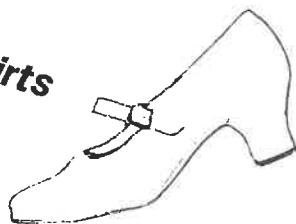

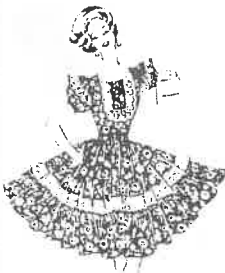

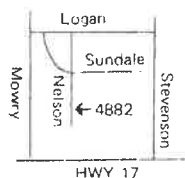
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Editor,

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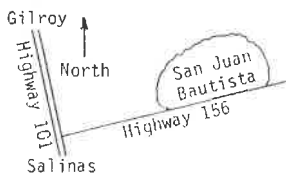

An enterprising dancer in New Jersey is hand-making square dance note cards that are very original. She does an outline of a dancing couple, then puts a shirt and dress on them cut from different calico fabrics and adds a little rickrack trim. They are quarter-fold notes with the figures on the front and inside blank for your own personal message. Great to send or receive!

I haven't seen these yet, but I have heard about a very beautiful iridescent slip made of crystal fabric. It's all rainbow-y. Very expensive and, so far, only available in Japan... that makes it even more expensive counting your trip there to get it!

Dritz has come out with a "Easy Attacher" snap fastener for

\$4.95. It will apply size 15 or 16 snaps, holds the fabric firmly, and is almost as good as the one formerly available from Rockmount Shirt Company.

Have those of you with the beautiful voices seen and/or heard the "singing machines" that are on the market now? They also originated in Japan, are designed to play the sing-a-long tapes, and come with a mike for you, the soloist. Some will play both cassette and 8-tracks, have echoes, are variable speed, and some will record cassettes. Just carry a full band with you! Many companies are getting into the sing-a-long tape business -- now you can get almost any type of music to sing to.

I think the record companies took a vacation this last month. Among the releases, three patter records: Red Boot's "Piano Pickin'" backed with "Amy" (318); and "Tennessee Pickin'" backed with "String Fever" (319); and on ESP, "Patter I" (404). Now, we'll just wait and see what comes out this month!

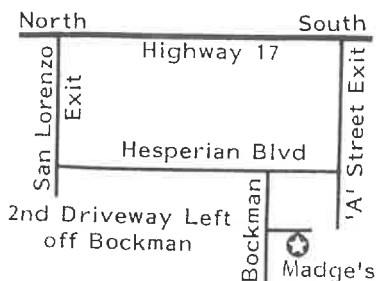

CHASE RIGHT/LEFT -- CALLERLAB Plus Call #23

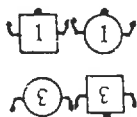
Definition

(CALLERLAB March 1986)
Starting formation - Two couples back-to-back. Each right- (left-) hand dancer does an exaggerated Zoom action, moving into the position previously occupied by the right- (left-) hand dancer behind him, to finish in the same direction as when he started the Zoom

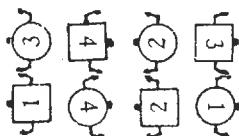
action. (The net result is the same as if the right- (left-) hand dancer had done a right- (left-) face U Turn Back and a Box Circulate Twice.) The left- (right-) hand dancer chases the other dancer by doing a Box Circulate two positions. The call finishes in a Box Circulate formation.

CHASE LEFT (or LEFT CHASE)

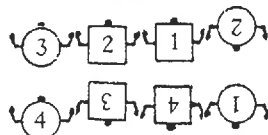
Heads Pass Thru...



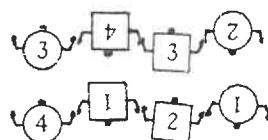
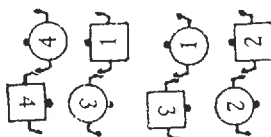
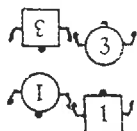
Heads Square Thru, All Pass Thru...



Sides Square Thru, Swing Thru, Boys Walk & Dodge, Boys (only)...



Each left-hand dancer does an exaggerated Zoom action, moving into the position previously occupied by the left-hand dancer behind him, to finish in the same direction as when he started the Zoom action. (The net result is the same as if the left-hand dancer had done a left-face U Turn Back and a Box Circulate Twice.) The right-hand dancer chases the other dancer by doing a Box Circulate two positions. The call finishes in a Box Circulate formation.



Dancing Hints

When originally written, the current "Chase Right" move was specified as "Chase Right/Left"; even though the left-handed version was rarely used at that time. Accordingly, the Chase Right portion of this call was specified in

The Prompter issue of May 1984. Many callers today are using the left-handed version of this call to create additional variety in their programs.

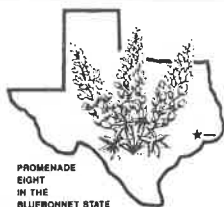
When you are the left-side dancer (the 'lead' dancer) in the

couple (a boy in all the examples), you must quickly execute a **left-facing U Turn Back** before you start your "Box Circulate - 2" action; and once the circulating action starts, you will always complete the call facing in with your left hand joined with the left hand of the dancer who was adjacent to you (in your group of four) at the start of this call (i.e., complete the call with the same dancer and your opposite hand as when you started, facing the same direction as when you started).

When you are the right-side

dancer (the 'trailing' dancer) in the couple, you must avoid the natural tendency to "move too quickly" so that you allow the person you are "chasing" to accomplish the U Turn Back before you both execute the "Box Circulate - 2" actions. You will complete the call facing opposite your starting direction; and your same hand (left) will be joined with the same dancer as when you started.

The "Chase" calls can be used to quickly convert "back-to-back couple" formations to wave or box circulate formations.



36th National Square Dance Convention®

NSDC Returns to Texas in 1987

For the fourth time in its 36 year history, the National Square Dance Convention returns to Texas, on June 25, 26, 27, 1987. Site of the 36th will be the spacious facilities of the Astrodome complex in Houston, providing over 1,000,000 square feet of space for dancing, exhibitions, seminars, clinics, and shopping. A cafeteria will be open full time, catering to square dancers' tastes.

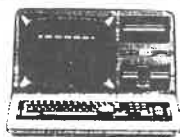
Since 1954, when the first Convention was held in Dallas, and later in 1965 and 1974, over 34,600 dancers have traveled to Texas, and the 36th National Square Dance Convention in Houston hopes to break all previous attendance records.

Texas celebrates its Sesquicentennial in '86 and the state has dedicated millions toward improving its highways and playgrounds for the expected increase in tourism. By the time the 36th opens, the Lone Star will shine in anticipation of your visit. Chairman Lee and Lettie Reed have gathered a staff of dedicated square dancers committed to an outstanding convention. The Bluebonnet Board, the Vice Chairmen, and a staff of hundreds from all over Texas have planned a traditional program, yet in tune with the decade of the 80's, including an all night After Party at Astroworld, the family entertainment center just over the bridge from the Astrodome.

Register early and come to Houston. As Chairman Lee and Lettie say, "...come see what we have in store for you. We know you will like it."

Have you ever been at a dance all dressed in your approved square dance attire on a hot night and looked across the square only to see that your opposite is wearing a short-sleeved shirt or, even worse, just a T-shirt? Some of us have had this experience even when the weather has not been warm.

Recently, we have had some discussions with some of the Challenge dancers who wear square dance attire most of the time and always when it is listed as a requirement at a dance session. It is interesting to hear them complain about those who don't wear what is considered to be proper clothing for square dancing, even when it is a requirement for attending the dance.

Their feeling is that it is time for all callers and dancers alike to stress the fact that proper square dance attire consists of certain articles of clothing (generally western in flavor) that should be worn to almost all dances. They have told me that, due to the lack of training of dancers by some callers, some groups have become the outright slob of square dancing.

This may be true -- we have seen evidence of this at some dances we have attended. Keep in mind though, since callers do not usually sell tickets to dances, or stand at the door and see who

comes in, the dancers putting on these events also share in the responsibility for making sure that those who attend are properly dressed for the event.

We advocate that those who do not dress properly be refused admission to the dance, or even to an entire weekend event if they do not choose to conform to the dress code.

We advocate that all callers teach their dancers to dress properly from the time they start beginners' classes and that callers continue to insist upon proper dress even at the A & C levels. We A & C callers are probably most responsible for allowing the dress to become inappropriate as we began to let our dancers eliminate square dance clothing at various sessions on Challenge weekends and only require square dance clothes in the evening. Many A & C callers, also, have stood by and not requested that dancers be removed from the evening sessions if they were not properly attired. As a result, more and more dancers began to attend improperly dressed.

It now seems that many dancers have come along who apparently don't know what the proper dress is or don't care. These dancers should be quickly educated as to the proper attire for square dancing, or they should no longer be admitted to dances.

Next subject from the soapbox this month is, "I dance at a higher level than you". Or, are we only dancing to achieve a higher level or are we dancing to have fun?

This has been expressed as a complaint from some A & C dancers about others who seem to be more interested in telling people how high a level they dance than in having fun dancing. They say that these people will be the first to tell you that they wouldn't attend a certain dance because it is below their level. They have been also known to say they don't dance with certain people anymore because they dance at a higher level than some of their "past" friends. Don't you just love it?

TOP LINE

Togetherness -- While Dancing

How often have you heard someone say, "Isn't that a lovely couple dancing, together?" And that's the important word: together. The compliment is given to the TWO dancers. Very seldom is a comment made that refers to a single person as an excellent dancer.

How do people judge what makes a good dancing couple? Some say it is the **Top Line** -- meaning, as you watch the couple, they appear to dance in unison. This is a technique used by many dancing judges. The **Top Line** is also determined by the body stature, the footwork, and proper rhythm while dancing. It takes all three to give a good **Top Line**.

Most judges will eliminate the lesser dancers by watching the **Top Line**. But, in the end, they will judge on all of the phases of dancing.

I mention this as an observa-

tion -- most round dance leaders see from the vantage point of the stage as they are cueing. Invariably, the cuer will find a good **Top Line** and key into that couple. It's easier to cue to a smooth-moving couple than to dancers who are having a rough time. Square dance callers use the same technique. They call it the '**Pilot Square**'. So, round dance cuers have a '**Pilot Couple**'.

Body position and stature are one of the first considerations a newer dancer should achieve. Improper body position will defeat the proper execution on most figures. You must start the figure from the proper position in order to end in the proper position. This is especially true for 'turning figures'. A good **Closed Position** should have shoulders parallel; bodies close enough so that a little knee bend will cause contact. Feet must be well under the body to provide a narrow, but stable, base to execute the turning figure. Some

ZUCCHINI JAM

- 6 cups grated, or ground, zucchini
- 6 cups sugar
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup lemon juice
- 1 cup crushed pineapple
- 2 (3 oz.) pkgs. apricot jello

Place zucchini (measured after grating) in heavy-bottomed pan and cook over low heat, stirring constantly, until clear (about 15 minutes). Remove from heat and add sugar, lemon juice and pineapple, and boil 6 minutes. Remove from heat and add jello. Pour in jars and store in refrigerator.

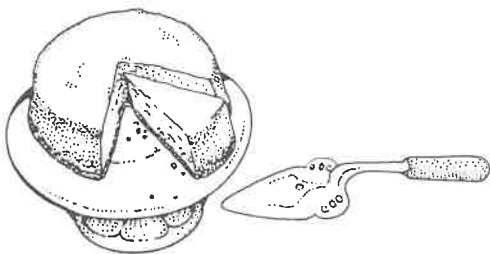
HOT CHICKEN SALAD

- 2 cups cubed, cooked chicken
- 1 cup diagonally sliced celery
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup chopped walnuts
- 1 tsp. grated onion
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. salt
- $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. dried leaf tarragon
- $\frac{1}{3}$ cup orange juice
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup mayonnaise
- 2 oranges, peeled and sectioned
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup dry bread crumbs
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup grated Parmesan cheese

In a medium mixing bowl combine chicken, celery, walnuts, onion, salt, tarragon, orange juice and mayonnaise; mix well. Cover and refrigerate for 1 hour. Stir in orange sections and spoon mixture into two ramekins. Sprinkle with

bread crumbs and Parmesan cheese, and bake in a 350° oven for 20 to 25 minutes or until mixture is heated through and cheese is lightly browned. Serves 4.

Filling:

- 1 cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 16 oz. cream cheese, softened

Topping:

- 1 cup sour cream
- $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. cocoa
- 2 Tbsp. sugar
- 1 Tbsp. Amaretto liqueur

This year has given us the opportunity to visit many clubs and

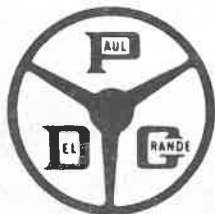
meet members of the dance community whom we had not previously had the privilege of meeting.

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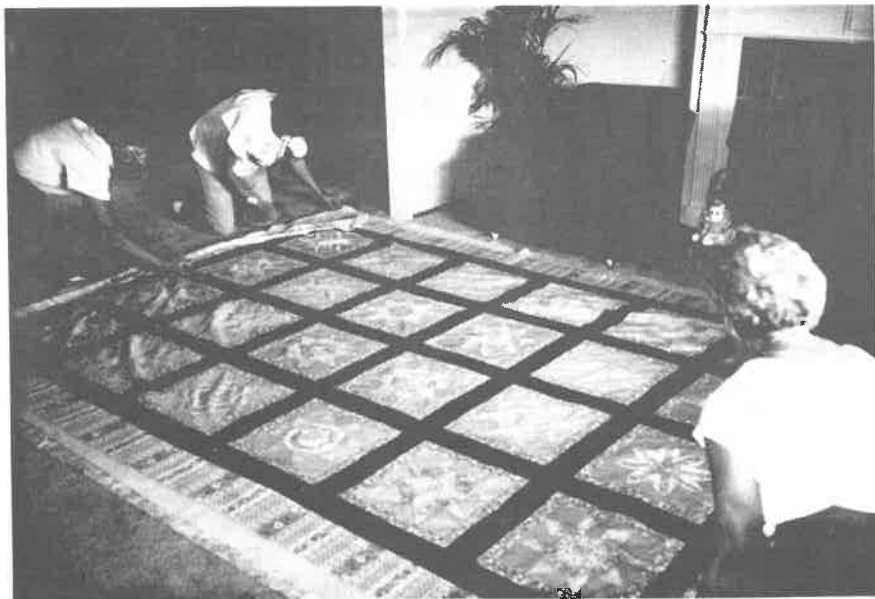

A dream is taking shape. When Chris Kenmille and Norma Degmetich were asked to coordinate the fashion show for the 1986 Jubilee, they decided to build the show around a theme - quilting - that could be used in decorations and costumes to be modeled. As an added attraction, Chris and Norma wanted to have a quilt put together by the Santa Clara Valley square dance community. I got involved in the project in February when Chris discovered me sitting in a corner at a festival, where Bill was calling, and editing Diana Leone's latest book... on quilting!

After a weekend of discussing quilting techniques, patterns and fabric, we decided to "go for it"! Our goal was to get volunteers

from the Santa Clara Valley Square Dancers Association clubs to piece one quilt block each. These blocks would then be assembled into a quilt top and finished off by square dancers at old-fashioned quilting bees. The completed quilt would be used as a fund raiser for SCVSDA teen square dance clubs.

As the basis for the quilt design we chose a traditional quilt-block pattern called "Eight-Point Star". The design consists of a star made from eight diamond-shaped pieces with the spaces between the outside points filled in with triangles and squares to form a finished square. Historically, this type of block is done in calicos and solid colors. However, since we were dictating the pattern and

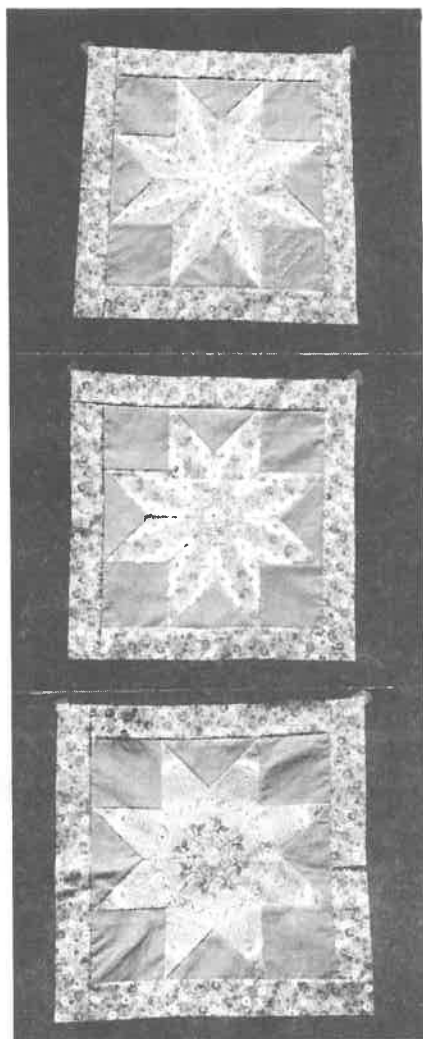

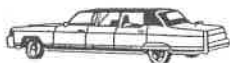
colors for the quilt, we decided to give our volunteer quilters a chance for some creativity of their own. We selected a fabric printed in a variety of floral and geometric-type stripes in pale green and pink with a dark rose accent. Each quilter could then choose a section of the fabric that she particularly liked. By carefully cutting each diamond shape from the exact same design in the fabric and matching all lines precisely, many star variations could be achieved.

By mid-July we had twenty-four completed blocks. The designs of the stars tended to fall into three categories that I labeled "patios", "pinwheels", and "geometrics". Pinwheels are fairly easy to recognize. The geometric designs have no flowers. The patios have to be explained in terms of my brain function. Many of the stars have a circular pattern around the center with the very center area being either flowers or a geometric figure that looks like tiles in a fountain. They remind me of patios. Hence, my clever label. The important point is that each block is unique. No two are exactly alike even though they all came from the same fabric with a fairly simple repeat pattern and used the same basic block pattern.

By framing each block with a coordinating fabric, and adding a contrasting lattice of dark rose cotton-blend moire, our dream of "maybe a twin-size quilt" had materialized as a king-size quilt. On July 25 the quilt went on a



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frame (which is a story in itself) and the next phase of the dream began. As of that date we had had twenty-four representatives of SCVSDA square dance clubs involved in a joint effort. On that Friday we started the actual quilting process with a group that has become our mainstay in the effort to finish the quilt in time for the Jubilee.

Every Friday from 10 a.m. until 3 p.m., Flo Eckert (Spinning Wheels), Bev Johnson (Krazy Dazys), Lee Knowlton (Spinning Wheels), Chris Kenmille (Rafters Rockers and Square Hoppers), Lucille McGuire (Square Hoppers), and Joan Post (Krazy Dazys) have met at my house and stitched diligently.

For the last two weeks we've been holding special "club days" where ladies from one club will come in and work for two to three hours in the afternoon or evening on a one-time basis.

As of this writing we're starting to breathe easier about

meeting our deadline of October 1. The quilt is nearly finished. From that standpoint the dream is nearly a reality.

From another standpoint, the dream has already become real. The spirit of sharing and cooperation during the entire project has been wonderful. More than fifty ladies have generously donated time and work to make this quilt. Other dancers are busy selling tickets (\$1.00 each) for the drawing, and on October 10 and 11 the quilt will be on display at a special ticket-sales table at the Jubilee.

Diana Leone, proprietor of The Quilting Bee of Los Altos, isn't even a square dancer, but she sold us all the material for the quilt at a generous discount, placed a special rush order for us, and provided the quilting frame.

We may each have had several anxiety attacks along the way, but it has been fun and I think we all feel it has been worth it. Now, if I can just figure out some way to make sure I have the winning ticket!

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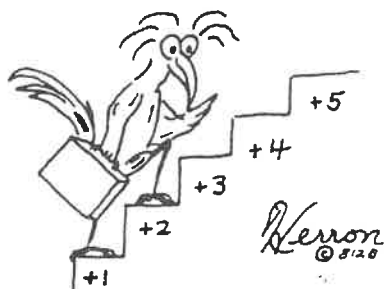
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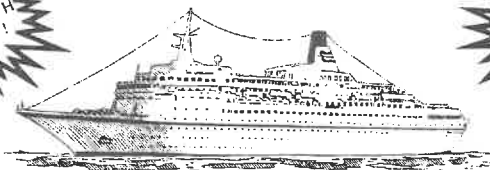
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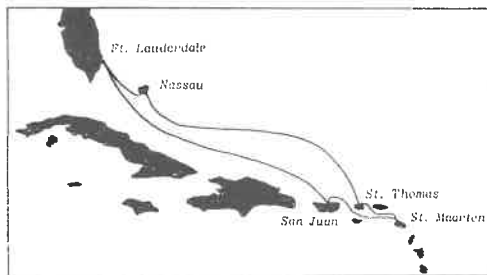

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To All Members, Associate Members, Subscribers, Apprentices and Affiliates:

This letter is to advise you that the September 1, 1986 deadline, as part of the resolution for a **Shortened Learn to Dance Program** combining the Mainstream and some Plus calls, has not been met. While there are many reasons for not meeting this deadline, none can be blamed on the lack of effort on the part of Red Bates and his special committee. Red and his committee have had voluminous correspondence dealing with this subject and many iterations of various considerations and concerns. The enormity of this project rendered the September 1 deadline an unrealistic target date. The Executive Committee felt unanimously that CALLERLAB, its members, and the entire square dance community would be better served by delaying the announcement of a **Shortened Learn to Dance Program** until such time as the total content would satisfy educational and choreographic needs.

Concurrent with the efforts of Red Bates and his committee, Martin Mallard, Chairman, and the Mainstream Committee have analyzed the surveys returned by the membership of CALLERLAB. It is unfortunate that many of you failed to respond. As with the **Shortened Learn to Dance Program**, it is felt that the **Bold Face/Italics Mainstream Program** listing contains

more calls than can be taught effectively in a 25 week program of learning to dance. Since additional work will also take place in this area, a delay of this committee report has also been decided upon by the Executive Committee.

To those of you who intended to use this program, the Executive Committee would suggest that you begin your fall teaching programs in 1986 using the lesson plans and concepts that have proven successful for you over the last few years. It is anticipated that the Mainstream Committee report of **Bold Face/Italics** as well as the combined Mainstream with some Plus figures (a **Shortened Learn to Dance Program**) will be distributed and publicized mid- to late-fall of this year.

We regret that we were unable to announce these reports prior to the implementation of the dance season, but feel that the best interests of square dancing will be better served by providing a more feasible set of reports as they become available.

We apologize for any inconvenience this may have caused you. Your patience and understanding are very much appreciated! Thank you!

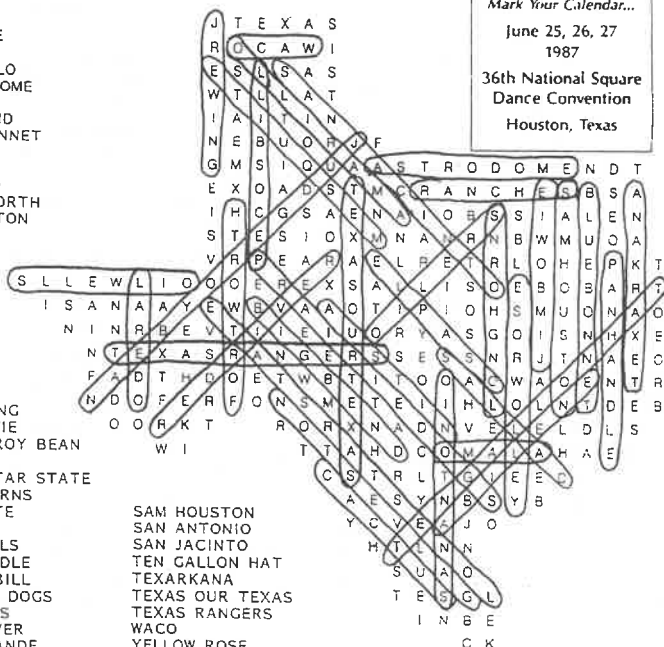

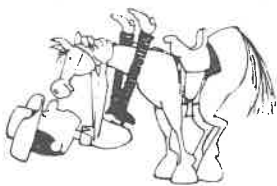

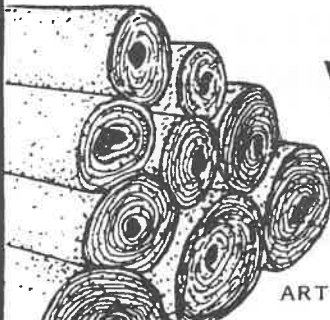
SAGE STOMPERS by Roni

Combine all crust ingredients and mix thoroughly. Press on to bottom, and up 2/3 of sides, of 9" spring form pan. Chill. For filling, beat sugar and eggs until fluffy, add softened cream cheese gradually and beat until thoroughly creamed (about 10 minutes). Melt chocolate with amaretto and add to egg-cheese mixture. Add sour cream, beating constantly, then add melted butter and mix well. Pour in chilled spring form pan and bake for 20 minutes in 375° F. oven. Cool for 15 minutes. Meanwhile, mix topping ingredients together and pour onto cheesecake. Bake at 425° F. for 10 minutes. Chill cheesecake overnight before serving.

Betty and I didn't get to attend the National Square Dance Convention when it was held in Baltimore a few years ago. However, I was in Baltimore last week, and boy, has that place changed. I hadn't been there in 20 years and the whole city has taken on a new look. The entire area around the inner harbour has been revitalized. All the old warehouse buildings that had been there for a hundred years have been torn down and in their place has been built open harbour area which includes shopping, many restaurants, an aquarium, a large science museum, art galleries, the 27 story world trade building, and a maritime museum. A tremendous amount of civic pride is very evident. There are many attractions for the tourist and the "row" houses in the immediate vicinity have all been cleaned and remodeled (and are

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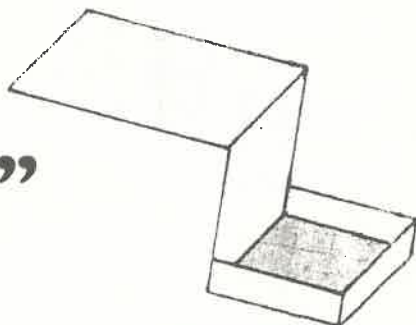

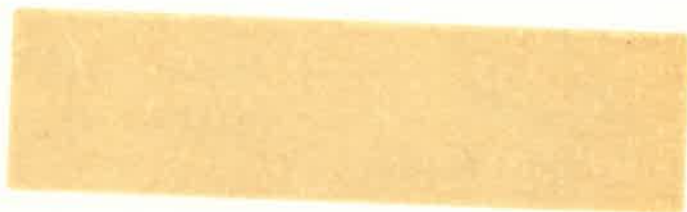
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
