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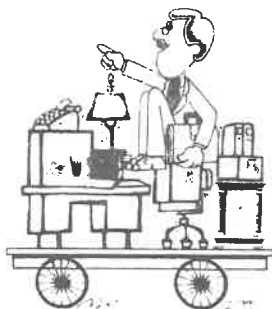
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PUBLISHER'S PATTER

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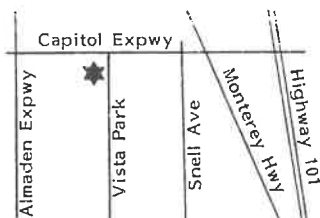
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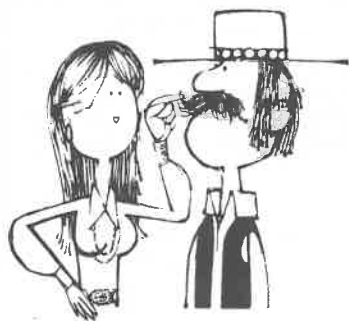
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"OUR" OPINION !

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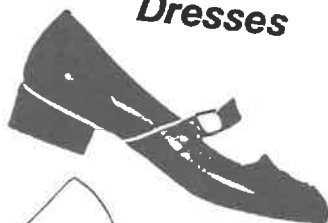

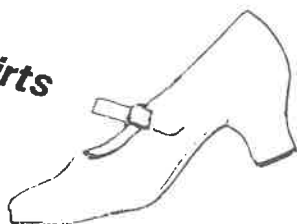
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We Get Letters

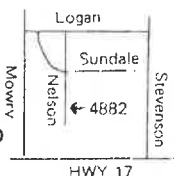
Male superiority has long been proven by the fact that not a single woman has ever won a male event at the Olympics. The fact that no male has ever won a

Editor,

Bob Southern's ending to his October column is right on: It is OK to wear square dance clothes, and it is OK to have fun. But in many circumstances I believe it is also OK to not wear square dance clothes, and I guess it should also be OK not to have fun (hey, it's a free country).

I find that at daytime dances during the warmer months (April through September) not being required to wear square dance clothes greatly increases my enjoyment of the dance. And sometimes, during the winter, being able to wear long pants and a heavy shirt greatly increases my enjoyment of the dance.

Square dance clothes, at least for women, are highly impractical. If square dance attire is required at a particular dance, I will think carefully about the weather when deciding whether to attend. I don't think that people who don't customarily wear square dance

clothes are the scoundrels that Bob makes them out to be. Perhaps the real reason Bob is upset is that he is jealous of those who are comfortable while he is not -- but then, it was his choice to put on that heavy shirt.

I disagree that it is the caller's responsibility to educate his/her dancers about proper attire. I think that is the responsibility of the club. 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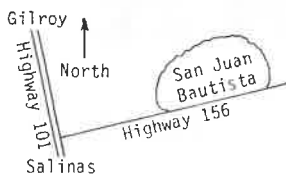
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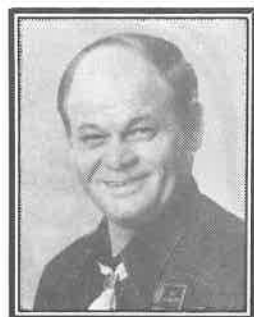

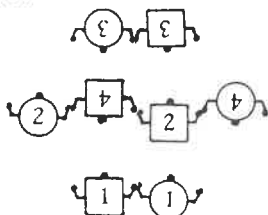
SCOOT & RELOCATE CALLERLAB Mainstream Quarterly Selection

Definition

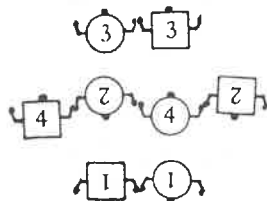
(CALLERLAB October 1986)
Starting formation: $\frac{1}{4}$ Tag. Center wave dancers step forward and Turn Thru with outside dancers, and then return to a wave in the center (Scoot Back). Center wave then does a Fan the Top while the outside dancers individually turn $\frac{1}{4}$ right and single file Promenade $\frac{1}{4}$ and turn to face in. Ending formation: $\frac{1}{4}$ Tag (at right angles to the starting $\frac{1}{4}$ Tag).

SCOOT & RELOCATE

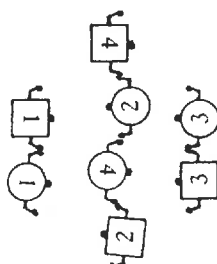
From Sides Pass the Ocean, Swing Thru...



Center wave dancers step forward and Turn Thru with outside dancers, and then return to a wave in the center (Scoot Back)...



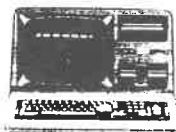

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MS QUARTERLY SELECTION OCTOBER 1986

Daryl Clendenin, Chairman of the CALLERLAB Mainstream Quarterly Selection Committee, is pleased to announce that **Scoot & Relocate** is the Mainstream Quarterly Selection for the period beginning October 1, 1986.

SCOOT & RELOCATE

Starting formation: $\frac{1}{4}$ Tag. Dancers in the center wave step forward and Turn Thru with the outside dancers and then return to a wave in the center (Scoot Back). Center wave then does a Fan the Top while the outside dancers (now facing out) individually turn $\frac{1}{4}$ right and single file Promenade $\frac{1}{4}$ and turn to face in. Ending formation: $\frac{1}{4}$ Tag (at right angles to the

starting $\frac{1}{4}$ Tag). Timing: 10 beats.

Singing Call Figure

Heads Promenade Half while the Sides Right & Left Thru, Pass the Ocean, Swing Thru, **Scoot & Relocate**, (Wave) Recycle, Square Thru $3/4$, Swing Corner and Promenade.

This figure continues to be very popular among workshop groups and weekend dancers. In spite of the Fan the Top, the figure is quickly taught and easily handled by Mainstream dancers. By having the dancers Swing Thru in the center wave (as in the singing call example), the Fan the Top action is "normalized" with the girls as centers.

For the singing call example, be sure to overlap the "Sides Right & Left Thru" with the "Heads Promenade" to time out better. Results in a $3/4$ Promenade.

Current Mainstream Quarterly Selections are: Scoot Cross & Turn, Scoot & Relocate.



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★ CORNER

Well, the 30th Jubilee has come and gone and I am still alive, at least I think I am.

Johnny Preston was in outstanding calling condition at this event. I can't remember when I have seen him so "up" at a dance. Literally filled the Advanced Hall on Sunday afternoon.

I thought Honey and Bill did a great job calling C-1 on Friday night. Love the strange stuff like Tally Ho from a squared set. Honey looked so good on Sunday morning I think Chuck must have sent her clone in her place. Never knew she could even move at that time of day, as she is **not** known as a morning person.

When is it a fudge or an adjustment? While doing some Vertical Tags from columns and Double Pass Thru setups on Sunday morning, I noticed that many had trouble finishing the figure with the proper alignment. This figure in these formations was chosen because it seems that Vertical Tag is seldom called from there. This would certainly be one reason for the problems with the ending alignment, as usually we encounter this figure from some kind of Ocean Wave or Line formation.

When this figure was called from a Column, some dancers remarked that what was called after Vertical Tag would not work or would only work after an

extreme "fudge" by the very center dancers. This was not true.

The current definition of Vertical Tag says that when in a mini-wave, the leads Fold and all finish a Tag the Line as many positions as indicated. One of the older definitions said that in each foursome, the leads Fold and all Double Pass Thru in your own group of four.

In this case, the very center dancers tend to remain offset instead of making the adjustment to end back to front with the dancer behind them, or face to face with the other center in front of them. It is not correct, but the tendency is for those two to step to a mini-wave instead of to remain facing.

If you follow the theory that after a Pass Thru you end up back to back with the couple you did it with, there is an adjustment that is done in square dancing at **all** levels from beginners on up. Therefore, it is not a fudge used just to make the next call work. If we did not make these adjustments, we would end up with all kinds of offset formations after many figures like Pass Thru and Double Pass Thru, Tag the Line In, and many others.

Perhaps, we at the A&C levels are lulled into some of these mistakes because of offset formations used at these levels. Or in other words, we try to make it end offset even when it doesn't end that way. Don't make it any harder than it is, guys.

So far, response to last month's article on appropriate dress has received rave reviews in favor of wearing clothes. Did he say that? We did hear from one who said they saw a flyer somewhere that said square dance attire was not appropriate at any session. Too bad, if true maybe we'll all be wearing bathing suits or something else as ridiculous to our next dance.

Beautiful, colorful legs! That's what's new. Tights to keep your legs warm this winter and coordinate with your outfits. Softouch is one brand that has shades, and a sheen, that go well with the crystal slips.

Many of you have lamented the demise of the pointed toe Ringo Shoe. Rejoice! Coast Shoes is using that last again for the Debbie: pointed toe, soft as the Ringo, but with a narrow strap with a small buckle, and, best of all, a $\frac{1}{2}$ " stacked leather heel. It's a really cute shoe and will be available sometime in November, sized 5-10, medium and narrow only, and the colors will be black, white, bone, and red.

Malco Modes is always innovating and has done it again with a low-priced triple-layer slip. It has a layer of net sandwiched between two layers of nylon parchment tricot to give it an even fullness... no dips or valleys. It comes in most of the Malco Modes slip colors at only \$39.50 for 60 yards, or \$50.00 for 80 yards... now that's a bargain! Malco Modes has also started making the little quilted jackets, one in white eyelet and another in a black embossed

print fabric (this one matches a skirt and blouse of theirs that will make a very stunning outfit!).

Let's go back to slips for a moment... not for something new, but for a word of caution. The blue crystal slips are subject to fading, so, be careful with yours. Store it in a dark place and be sure to travel with it in an opaque bag.

Do you know that there is now an official California State Square Dance Dress? It's well designed--ecru poly-cotton with orange trim, and four brown patches in the shape of the state of California (each embroidered with a California poppy). The men wear an ecru shirt piped with orange and a patch on the back. The patches with dress instructions are available for \$2.50 each -- you need four patches for the dress and one for the shirt. Let's all show off our state at the big functions!

Tony Oxendine and Jerry Story have formed their own record company, "Royal Records". Their first releases are "Beautiful Brown Eyes" (301), by both of them; "The Pride is Back" (201), by Tony; and "Somebody Like Me" (101), by Jerry. 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Stir The Bucket With Betty

Thanksgiving is a special time of the year and one of my favorites. Sometimes we become pleasantly stuck in a food rut for the holidays. How about a change? Here are several new recipes to try. They are really good!!

ZUCCHINI CASSEROLE

- 2 lbs. zucchini, cubed
- 4 eggs
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup whole milk
- 1 small can diced green chilies
- 1 lb. jalapeno jack cheese, cubed
- 1 tsp. salt
- 3 Tbsp. flour
- 2 tsp. baking powder
- 1 tsp. crushed oregano
- corn bread, or bread, crumbs
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup butter or margarine

Cook squash in salted water until just tender. Drain well and cool. Mix together eggs, milk, chilies, cheese, salt, flour, baking powder and oregano; fold in cooked squash. Butter, generously, a 9"x13" glass baking dish. Sprinkle bottom and sides with cornbread crumbs. Pour in squash mixture, sprinkle more crumbs on top and dot with $\frac{1}{4}$ cup butter. Bake at 325° F. for 30 minutes. Serve as a main or side dish. Also good as a "leftover"!

APPLESAUCE OATMEAL MUFFINS

- 2 eggs
- $\frac{2}{3}$ cup dark brown sugar, firmly packed
- 1 cup applesauce
- 1 cup sifted unbleached white flour
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. baking powder
- $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. salt

- 1 tsp. cinnamon
- $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. nutmeg
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup whole wheat flour, unsifted
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup butter or margarine, melted
- 1 cup rolled oats, uncooked (do not use instant-type oatmeal)
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup dark raisins
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup raw sunflower seeds
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup walnuts, coarsely chopped

In a large bowl, beat eggs and brown sugar with a wire whisk. Add applesauce. Combine white flour, baking powder, salt, cinnamon and nutmeg, and sift into applesauce mixture. Add all remaining ingredients in order given. Blend just to moisten. Oil two muffin tins (12 muffin cups each) and fill $\frac{2}{3}$ full, tucking raisins into batter to prevent burning. Bake 25 minutes at 375°, or until centers spring back to touch. Makes 24 medium-small muffins.

MINCEMEAT-STUFFED PORK LOIN

- 1 (9 oz.) pkg. condensed mincemeat, crumbled
- 4 Tbsp. cider vinegar
- 3 lbs. boneless pork loin, rolled and tied
- 2 Tbsp. orange marmalade
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. salt
- $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. pepper

Heat oven to 350°. Mix mincemeat and 2 Tbsp. vinegar in a small bowl. Using the handle of a long wooden spoon, poke a hole through the middle of the pork loin from one end to the other. Insert a long, thin-bladed knife into the opening and cut, using a sawing motion, until the opening is 1½" wide (it will look like a slit until stuffed). With fingers, pack opening with mincemeat mixture, working from both ends. Place meat fat side up in small roasting pan. Mix remaining ingredients; pour over pork. Bake 1½ hours or until meat thermometer inserted 1" into meat registers 165°. Remove from oven; cover loosely with foil and let stand 10 minutes until thermometer registers 170°. Slice thin. Makes 8 servings.

RUM-MINCEMEAT COUPE

1 (3½ oz.) pkg. vanilla instant pudding and pie filling
2 cups milk



¾ cup whipping cream
½ tsp. rum flavoring
1 (9 oz.) pkg. condensed mincemeat,
finely crumbled
Garnish: chopped pistachio nuts

Prepare pudding mix according to package directions, using the milk. In medium-size chilled bowl, beat cream and rum flavoring with electric mixer until soft peaks form when beaters are lifted. Fold 1 cup whipped cream into pudding until well blended. Gently fold in mincemeat. Spoon into 6 dessert bowls or goblets. Top each with a dollop of the remaining whipped cream and sprinkle with pistachios. Serve immediately or refrigerate up to 1 hour. Makes 6 servings.

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SOME ASPECTS OF TEACHING

Quite often an experienced dancer will be asked by a novice for some help on a basic, or complex, step in round dancing. The experienced dancer will almost always try to explain or answer the question. It's a polite way to act. As this happens more often, someone may say why don't you have a little class in your garage, or family room, to help some of the other dancers to improve?

In any event, someplace along the line a teacher retires, moves or has medical problems and must reduce their activity, so a new person steps in to be a TEACHER.

What a shock they have when the price of records, sound equipment, hall rental and other expenses are known. It all seemed so simple, and now it's a hectic experience.

Preparation for the dance session becomes a major problem. What must I do to have all these dancers happy and learning. One of

the biggest problems is the return to reality of beginners' classes. Going back to "Frenchy Brown", "White Silver Sands", and "Sleepy Time Gal".

Every move must be explained in detail: man's left, lady's right; step forward, lady backs. Opposite footwork, transitions. Touches vs. closing, points and swings. All of this is fundamental to the teacher, BUT it has to be explained and made clear to the students.

Repetition, practice, review--that's the name of the game. Remember, practice makes permanent. If you practice WRONG steps, they become permanent WRONG steps. So, review must be with correctness in mind, not just repetition.

One good philosophy in teaching is the 'Terminal Objective' method. The teacher should state what the goal or achievement will be for the lesson. Then teach, using whatever methods will produce the 'Terminal Objective',

SCULPTURED NECKLINE DRESS by Honey Wolfson

Early each year, Ginger and I begin to think about designing her dress for the Jubilee Brunch and Fashion Show (this was Ginger's and Chris' third appearance). We start looking for fabrics that might inspire us, and we keep an eye out for styles and ideas that could be adapted to make an unusual design.

This year, the Jubilee was getting closer and we still had not made a decision. In July, Chuck and I went on a Caribbean cruise which took us to 11 islands in 14 days, a rare shopping opportunity. Each island had its shopping specialties, and on Martinique, a French island, we discovered their beautiful fabrics. After many "Bon Jours", "Cinq Metres", and "Mercis", we managed to purchase several lengths of fabric which I planned to make into dresses for myself. One was a beautiful border print, a cream background with dramatic burgundy roses and a gold overlay.

Ginger, of course, decided that this border fabric was just what we had been looking for. If you're familiar with "Cinq Metres", you know that this is slightly over "five yards" and just the right amount for one dress (that's right Mom, my dress!). However, with a great deal of planning and some

additional fabric for sleeves, I was able to make two dresses, one tie, and cover two shirt yokes!

Since I wanted to use the border in the skirt of my dress, there would only be enough border fabric for the bodice of Ginger's, and we would need to purchase a shiny, sheer polyester fabric for the sleeves. Then, Ginger had an inspiration: the neckline should be "like the skating outfits with the flowers on the edge"! Terrific! We selected Butterick Pattern 4766, one we had used for another fashion show dress. Its design would be particularly suitable for her idea since the sleeve is attached to a tiny shoulder strap and the bodice neckline happened to follow the flower pattern in the fabric closely.

Next, how to do the sculpturing? Since the fabric was fairly thin, I decided to use a lightweight polyester Pellon interfacing to add body and keep the sculptured flowers from "flopping", and to line the bodice with a cream-colored polyester fabric to create the finished edge on the flowers. I cut the bodice patterns along normal cutting lines, except across the top of the pattern where I cut loosely around the flower print to be sculpted. I then cut similar pieces of interfacing and lining.

After pinning the interfacing to the back of the border fabric, I stitched around the flowers on each piece. Then, placing the right side of the lining pieces to the right side of the border fabric pieces, I stitched over my original stitching lines. I then trimmed and clipped the seams, and carefully turned the pieces right-side-out, using a crochet hook to push out the seams around the flowers and pressing the seams with the steam iron (be sure to use a pressing cloth if your fabric has a gold overlay).

Once the flower sculpting was done the rest of the dress was done reasonably easy. I treated each lined bodice piece as though it were one piece of fabric and stitched the darts. The bodice was then finished and sleeves added as directed in the pattern. The skirt was made from the "non-border"

half of the fabric, with darts stitched every six inches to remove extra fabric at the waist. I gathered the skirt, sewed it to the bodice, and finished the zipper.

I had run out of time. Oh, dear... I had to leave for another cruise! Quick to Sherry's Promenade to order gold shoes and slip, matching burgundy shirt for Chris, and gold tie. Since I had waited so long to order Chris' shirt, it would not arrive until after we had embarked. I left the yoke fabric with Sherry and she promised to have the shirt finished when we got back (arriving home Thursday night before the Jubilee would not leave time for shirt sewing).

Friday night at the Jubilee we picked up the accessories and decided that the gold slip just would not do! What it really needed was a burgundy slip to match Chris' shirt. Back to Sherry's on Saturday where we found the perfect slip -- only it was too long and really not as full as we would have liked. The solution: stitch a one-inch hem around the bottom,

all 75 yards (three-quarters of a football field!). This was accomplished at 3 a.m. Sunday, and at 10 a.m. Ginger and Chris made their appearance at the Jubilee Brunch and Fashion Show!



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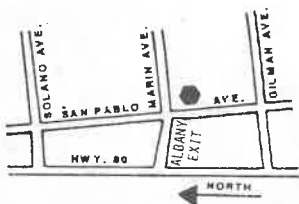
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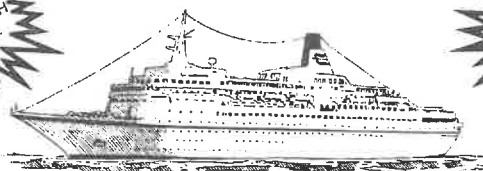
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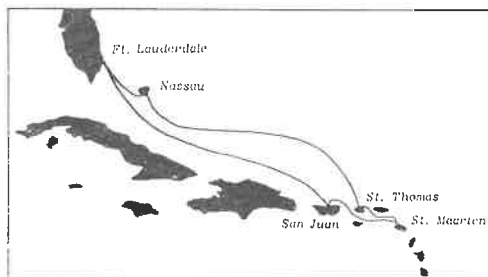
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PROMPTER PROFILE

CHARLOTTE CORDES

Charlotte Cordes is an attractive, intelligent square dancer who started taking square dance lessons in June and by October was dancing Advanced at the Jubilee. Charlotte credits her rapid progress to learning and dancing all moves by definition. For Charlotte, knowing where she should be at any time in a square is a requirement -- Charlotte Cordes is blind.

The daughter of a Navy family, Charlotte was born in Japan. The family lived in Tennessee, Indiana, and Texas before settling in the San Francisco area 20 years ago.

Although she lost her sight due to an accident at birth, Charlotte has not allowed her handicap to restrict her physical activities. She has studied Martial Arts for more than 20 years, and currently holds a 3rd Degree Black Belt.

Charlotte was attracted to square dancing by the combination of physical activity and mental challenge. Two friends, Jim Jones and Rouanne Bloomgarden, both members at that time of the San Francisco Rebels, encouraged Charlotte to try a beginners' class. Jim attended the first classes to dance with Charlotte.

To form a mental picture of the dancing patterns, Charlotte sees the square as though it were on a graph paper, with an X/Y grid. She learned to think of moves as a number of steps in the "X" direction, followed by a turn to the "+Y" or "-Y" direction. As moves get more involved, Charlotte's ability to "see" the moves has to keep pace (imagine "seeing" RELAY THE DEUCEY!). Charlotte admits that the call that gives her the most trouble is "Weave the Ring", because there is no contact with other dancers.

By August, Charlotte was ready to try Mainstream Level at the Santa Clara County Fair. She did so well there that she was invited to dance with the Sunnyvale Singles Club -- where she learned the Plus moves by dancing them during the first two weeks.

Discovering the Stanford Quads in September, Charlotte added their Sunday night dance to her schedule and learned many of the Advanced moves in the three weeks prior to the Jubilee.

Charlotte's weekly schedule demonstrates her commitment to an active life:

Monday - Martial Arts

Tuesday - SF Rebels class

Wednesday - SF Rebels club

Thursday - Sunnyvale Singles

Saturday - Hoedown

Sunday - Stanford Quads

Maintaining a busy schedule requires transportation, and for Charlotte the solution has been a combination of ingenuity, self-sufficiency and helpful dancers. Living in San Francisco, her most frequent mode of transportation is the Southern Pacific Peninsular train. She and her guide dog King leave the train at the proper station and walk the several blocks to the dance location. Finding the school the first time can be the problem -- On her first visit to Sunnyvale Singles she was meet at the Santa Clara Station by club member Steve Feinstein, who walked the eight-block route with King and Charlotte until all were satisfied they knew the way.

Because the last north-bound train leaves Santa Clara at 10 pm., Charlotte could only dance 4 tips before leaving to catch the train. When friends in the club heard about the problem, Charlotte received a continuing offer of a place to spend the night so that she could finish the evenings' dancing and catch a morning train back to the city.

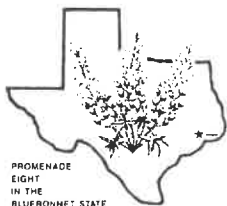
Charlotte has one major goal to complete -- she would like to run across the entire United States.

When she drove west with her family, she listened to their description of the country and decided she wanted to experience it in the only way she could -- on foot. The run, which requires another runner as "helper" and a van and driver, was originally scheduled for this September. In August, tragedy struck when Charlotte's 16 year old son was killed in an accident. Too distraught to continue with plans, Charlotte postponed the run.

Charlotte credits square dancing with helping her through her depression, and now hopes her 19 year old son can join her scheduled cross-country run in September, 1987 -- with the addition of square dancing each night along the route!

In addition to square dancing friends Jim, Steve and Rouanne, Charlotte particularly mentioned the efforts of Rebels caller Vickie Woods, who did such a good job of teaching by definition, and the helpfulness of the Sunnyvale Singles and Stanford Quads.

Although some clubs have expressed to Charlotte a concern about inviting a blind dancer to their dances and hoedowns, they haven't had the pleasure of watching her dance. Ask the fellow in the advanced hall at the Jubilee who walked up to Charlotte, complimented her on her ability to dance by definition, and walked away without ever realizing he had been watching a blind dancer.

computer terminals. All of this is intended to help make your California National Square Dance Convention less trouble and more enjoyable for all.

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In the future news releases we will supply a whole lot more information and details for you RVers. This is to get you started planning for that really BIG camp out in Anaheim in 1988.

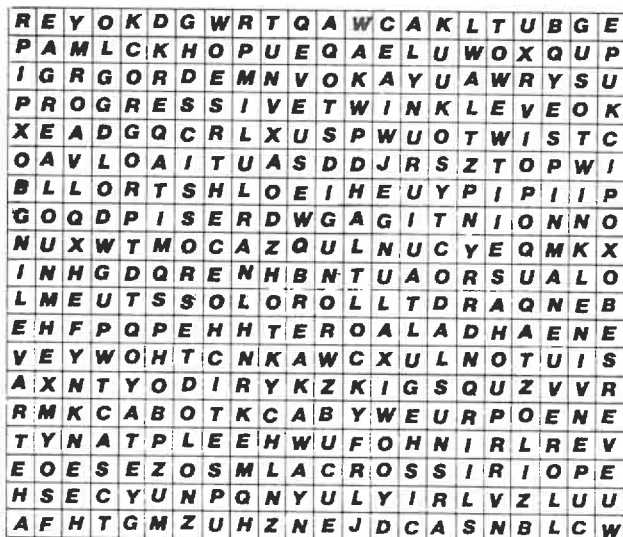

be had in plastic or metal. Anyway, I've had trouble for the past several months in getting just the right kind of metal to make the trays and as a consequence, we've been out of stock on the metal Drip-Stops. I want to thank all you patient people who have had their orders in for the past few months. We now have the metal trays again available and you should have received yours by now. If any of you didn't receive a Drip-Stop that you've had on order, please let us know and we'll check our records to see wherein lies the problem.

A few days ago, we had the opportunity of attending the first anniversary of Sherry's Promenade Fashions. so that the student will accomplish the purpose of the lesson.

Keep the 'Terminal Objective' in mind, don't allow side subjects to change your original lesson plan. If questions arise that require a side track, tell the student that the subject will be covered in another lesson. Don't lose control of the class for the sake of a few "hotshots" or idle questions.

It is good practice to have printed 'handout sheets' with diagrams and detailed explanations of the basics that are being taught. It will require preparation, but once these sheets are in good order, duplicating them for following classes will be a breeze. Perhaps some updating or improvements will come to the surface, but again, the reference material will save much time in the next class you conduct.

One last thought in parting, as we start to teach, we usually have a beginners' class, teaching basics, and hope that this will lead to a newer dancer who may choose to go into Intermediate dancing and then progress on to becoming an accomplished dancer. My thoughts have been that what we really want to teach is the 'fundamentals of dancing' that will instill into a person the desire to continue to the higher levels of dancing.

I have often thought that the prerequisite for a good round dancer is really 'a burning desire to learn the art', or is it really a science?

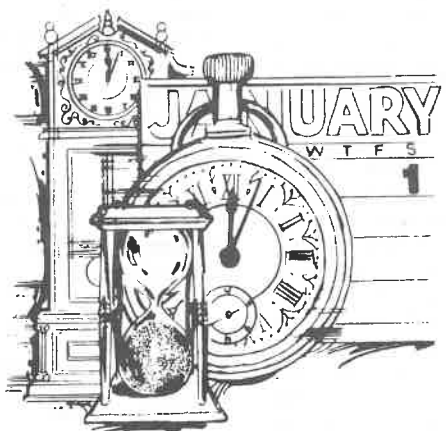

Dancing Hints

Scoot & Relocate is the most recent Mainstream Quarterly Selection, and is one of the few calls that can start and end in a $\frac{1}{4}$ Tag formation. There are two "main secrets" to the proper execution of this call: 1) The center wave dancers must execute a COMPLETE Scoot Back before attempting the Fan the Top action; and 2) The outside dancers must execute a PRECISE $\frac{1}{4}$ Promenade action following the Turn Thru and before facing in.

When you are a center wave dancer, you must execute your Scoot Back such that you return exactly to a wave in the center having your right hand touching the same person as when you started the call BEFORE you start your 'move up $\frac{1}{4}$ ' action to execute the Fan the Top. You will complete this call having the right hand joined with the same person as when you started; and, if you started as a wave center, you will

finish the call as a wave end (and vice-versa).

When you start this call as an outside dancer, you must execute a 'clean and crisp' $\frac{1}{4}$ right-face turn in place immediately following the Turn Thru and before executing the Promenade $\frac{1}{4}$ action. Additionally, your Promenade $\frac{1}{4}$ action must be very precisely executed before you face in. One easy way to accomplish this action is for the outside leader (the Head Men in the example) to exactly track (or follow) the wave end on your side of the set (the Side Men in the example).

This call is easily accomplished when executed as shown in the example, and it DANCES very well using the full 10 beats of music.

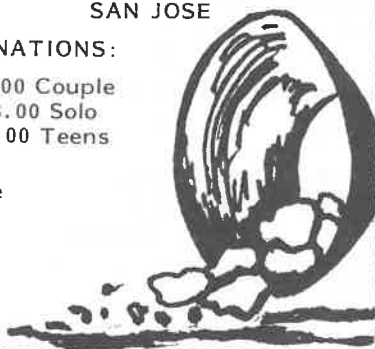

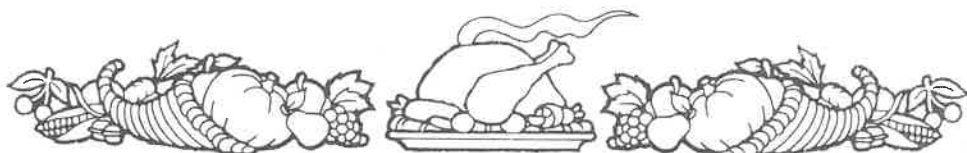

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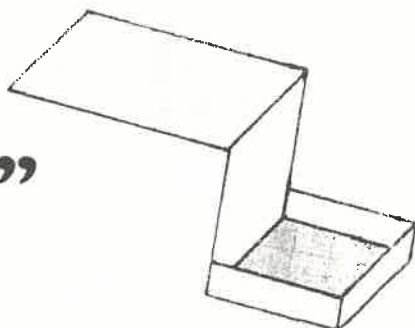
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
