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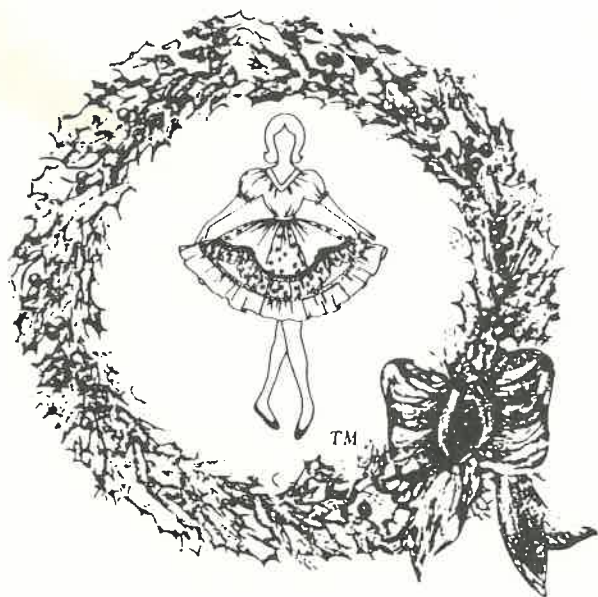

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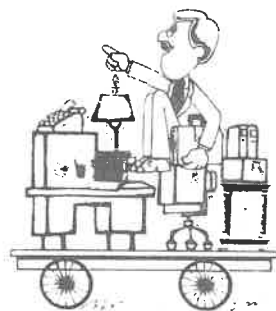
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PUBLISHER'S PATTER

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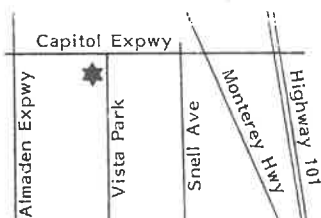


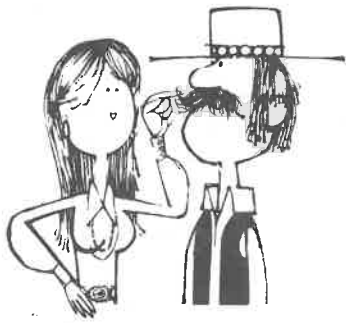
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"OUR" OPINION !

The following opinion appeared in the October, 1986 issue of American Square Dance magazine:

Those who bemoan the decline of square dancing, and wonder as to the cause, might well consider round dancing as a contributing factor.

Time was when a square dance was just that -- a friendly function where people gathered to enjoy an informal four-couple dance that didn't require a lot of fancy footwork.

That time has gone.

Today, most square dances begin with an hour of rounds, then proceed with two rounds following each square dance tip except the last.

This means that in the 7 to 11 dance, square dancers dance one and one-half hours and round dancers almost twice as long, two and one-half hours. Yet all dancers pay the same admission.

The average individual has but so much time and energy to devote to dancing. There are other things in life. He may not wish to, and in many cases cannot, master both square and round dancing.

Yet, what alternative has he but to try to do so? The alternative, if he is a square dancer, is to sit like a wallflower on the sidelines and watch his worn-to-a-frazzle friends drag through the rounds to the eternal croaking of the cuer. And sitting thus, he feels uncomfortable. He feels left out. He feels inferior.

This is one alternative. There is another which he may be considering: He can stay home.

I have no bone to pick with round dancers, and I am not advocating less round dancing and more square dancing. What I am suggesting is that some thought and effort be directed toward keeping the two dances segregated into different times and/or different places.

Mr. Engle's description of an evening dance may be correct for Virginia, but it doesn't fit our area. In the first place, pre-rounds are typically only one-half hour in length. Assume seven tips at an average of 14 minutes each, and six double rounds at about 8 to 9 minutes for two rounds. This means that at a hoedown starting with pre-rounds at 8:00 p.m., and with squares from 8:30 to 11:00 p.m., there will be 80 minutes of rounds and 100 minutes of squares.

More importantly, the round dancing does not take time from the squares -- our experience is that double rounds use no more time than a caller will normally allow between tips with a single round, or in fact, with no rounds at all!

Round dancing offers another facet for those dancers who want more. The time devoted to pre-rounds and rounds between tips is not time taken away from squares--even the most avid dancers need to rest sometime!

To all of you, our best wishes for a happy Holiday Season and a happy and successful New Year.

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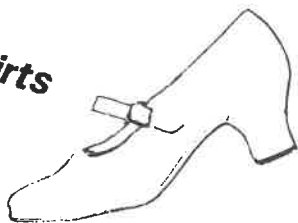
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We Get Letters

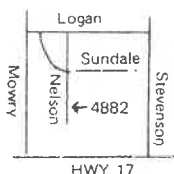


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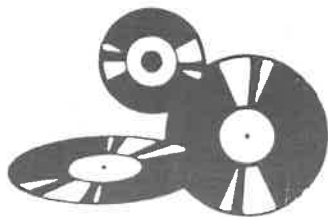
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WHAT'S NEW!!

From The DANCE STORE

How about "Smart Dolls"?!! Smart Square Dance Dolls, that is. They are the answer to the no-longer-available Dolly Boards for working out the Basics and new figures. A set of 8 cardboard dolls, 4 ladies and 4 men, each couple a different color, comes with little slotted wood blocks. Insert the dolls in the blocks and you're all set to move them according to Burleson. There is only one thing wrong -- the expression on the boy dolls' faces look like they don't have square dancing on their minds!! The devils! They sell for about \$5.00 and would make good stocking stuffers.

And we have a new book to report, actually a set of Country-Western Dance Books. Book I is the best seller with a short history of Country-Western dance, a list of dance terms and positions, directions (including footprints) for 14 couple-dances (Texas Two-Step, Country Waltz, Polka, Hustle, etc.), 28 Country-Western circle or round dances, and 68 line dances! It also includes suggested music for all of the above. Book II is a continuation of Book I. Book III has instructions for, and photos of, all kinds of turns (Sweethearts, Pretzels, Duck Outs, etc.), and Book IV is a teacher's manual. They're written by Kelly Gillette of Las Vegas and sell for around \$20.00 each. Those 68 line dances alone would be worth it!

Have you seen Jeri Bee's beautiful new, fancy blouses? Some with Western yokes studded with rhinestones, others with lace-covered yokes and rhinestones, but the best is a sweetheart-neck trimmed with ruffled lace and tiny pearls. They all have 3/4 sleeves. They're available in white only for

the pearls, and beige and white for the others. Check them out... they are fancy enough to wear with long velvet skirts for the holidays!

Shirley's Patterns' newest is a ten-gore skirt with a fully elastic waist, two roomy front pockets and a deep bottom ruffle. Looks like a winner.

Now, the Biggie!! Video tapes for learning to square dance. Gold Star Video, in Roseville, is producing them. There are four "training tapes", taking you through Plus, and a fifth "singing call" tape. Joe Kula is the caller. Also, there are three videos available which teach round dancing. Two on the two-step and variations, and one teaches the waltz. George and Judie McFarlane are the cuers. These retail for around \$45.00 and some dance stores will also rent them.

Two record companies have released Christmas records in time to be used this year. Blue Star has "Country Christmas" (2315) by Johnnie Wykoff using just Basics, and there is Quadrille's "Merry Christmas Here in My Hometown" (848) by Bob Huff, using Mainstream figures. Some "don't misses": two beautiful ballads on Rhythm, "Feelin a Feelin" (194) by Mike Seastrom (new to the Rhythm label), and "We've Got a Good Fire a Going" (189) by Wade Driver. Another by Wade, "Proud Mary" (197), should be a rouser. Also, be sure to listen to "Rockin to the Rhythm of the Rain" (704) by Craig Rowe on ESP -- it's good. Another with really good music is "Rollin Nowhere" (5089) on Hi Hat by Tom Perry.

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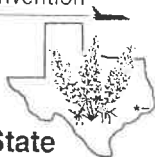
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NASA TRIP A MUST!

If you have an interest in space technology and exploration, then a visit to the Lyndon B. Johnson Space Center is a must, as there is nothing like it in the world. The space complex, more commonly known as mission control, serves as the nerve center of our country's manned spaceflight program. Here, the astronauts receive their training and undergo rigorous testing to determine their ability to withstand the environment of outer space. In addition, all manned space flights are directed and monitored from mission control.

The collection of equipment and hardware from America's space voyages is truly awe-inspiring. Among the exhibits are astronaut Gordon Cooper's Mercury space capsule, the Lunar exploration module, the Apollo 17 spacecraft, and a Saturn V rocket.

Your first stop at mission control should be the visitor orientation center, where you can view official NASA films. The visitor center is also the starting point of tours. The tours include visits to the mission control center viewing room, space environment simulation laboratory, rocket park, mission simulation and training facilities, the moon rock collection and Building 2 where thousands of artifacts and space gear are on display.

Getting to the space center is easy. From the Astrodome, take 610 East to the I-45/Galveston exit. Follow I-45 toward Galveston and exit at NASA Road, then follow the signs to the NASA Center. Allow at least four hours for travel time and tour. The center is open daily from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Admission is free, and don't forget your camera!

Continued dancer and caller responses regarding wearing proper square dance attire are still in favor of wearing clothes. Did he say that again?

We were also asked to mention this month that the proper square dance attire should be clean and odor free, as well as the person wearing it. One stated that Phew diamonds were bad enough, we don't need Phew dancers to go along with them. A good thought!

We received a letter, which you read in last month's issue, from Judy Anderson about square dance clothes. Our feeling about the letter is that Judy's attitude regarding proper square dance attire seems to be it's okay to wear it if convenient to do so, but if it is not, you shouldn't have to wear it.

To some, club night may not be a really "big deal" in their lives, but since they joined an already existing activity with its own traditions and mode of dress, they accept these and conform to them whether it is always convenient or not. If all dancers and clubs had this attitude, square dance clothes would disappear from the activity in short order. We feel the vast majority of dancers and callers would not like to see this happen. Most new dancers cannot wait to get their first square dance or western clothes. Why take that thrill away from them for the sake of convenience?

At the last CALLERLAB convention, a vote was taken to establish a committee charged with the responsibility to come up with a list of calls from the Mainstream and Plus lists that could be taught in twenty-five to thirty weeks, and have this list ready by September of 1986. This was passed by the membership. However, the committee has failed to accomplish this. Articles we have read since seem to indicate that the vote has been ignored or misinterpreted by the Executive Board.

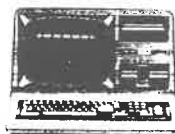
How does this affect you as an Advanced and Challenge dancer? Stop to consider where the "new" dancers coming into your level come from!

We feel that CALLERLAB has lost all touch with reality on this issue. Further, we feel that the larger number of programs, figures and quarterly selections created by CALLERLAB have done more to run

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dancers out of square dancing than any other single factor. A dancer with a prolonged absence from the activity literally feels that they must go to class again to rejoin it.

A & C dancers make square dancing a large part of their lives. The Plus or Mainstream dancer may not feel this way and may leave the activity much quicker than the A & C dancer when they are burdened with more than they want to take. Even A & C dancers have left for the same reasons.

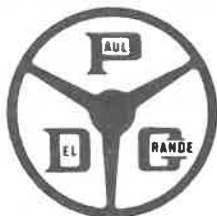
If you don't want the A & C levels to die because the level that your dancers come from dies, now is the time to start expressing yourselves to CALLERLAB members that they should insist that CALLERLAB follow the directives of its membership votes, do it quickly and meet the deadlines set.

CALLERLAB always seems to try to make things more difficult than they really are! Those of you who are longtime readers of The Prompter will recall that such a list has been available for some

time now. If you recall 64 for 84, you know this is true. If you ignore for the time being the fact that it took CALLERLAB two years to consider the issue, you should not ignore the fact that one of our local callers had already done the job and CALLERLAB still has not gotten the job done they were directed to do by the members.

Believe me, many of the National Traveling Callers agree that they are and have been calling their dances using material that coincides almost exactly with the list presented back in 1984. You do not have to know some 150 to 160 figures to dance at one of their dances, so why do you have to be taught that many?

If CALLERLAB doesn't get its act together and solve the problems facing square dancing, there probably will not be any "problems" left to solve. Remember, all you Advanced & Challenge dancers, if the foundation of the building falls apart, the top of the building goes right after it! See you in a Star Tip.



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The International Association of Round Dance Teachers, Inc.

In continuing the spirit of cooperation between ROUNDALAB and the Universal Round Dance Council, members of the Executive Boards of both organizations met in Kansas City, Missouri, Monday afternoon, July 21, 1986 before the URDC Convention.

Areas in which both organizations can work together and share their expertise were explored. The general consensus of all persons was that both organizations have much to offer to the round dance movement, and that a tremendous amount can be accomplished as long as no one cares who receives the credit.

It was decided to establish a joint committee to work on terminology and standardization as it relates to descriptions, cue words and abbreviations. The first stage of work for this committee will be to compare the existing dance figures already approved by both organizations and suggest modifications to bring them in closer harmony. While the definitions might not be identical, the meaning would be the same. June 1987 is the target date for completion of this comparison. The second and third stages would be to discuss the figures only one organization has defined. Working together on terms not as yet defined would be the fourth stage.

Other areas of mutual cooperation include producing a joint round dance promotional brochure, developing a suggested teacher training curriculum and setting up the machinery for an interchange of ideas and leaders between various organizations -- local, national and international.

The next joint meeting will be Tuesday, June 23, 1987, after the ROUNDALAB Convention, and before the National Square Dance Convention in Houston, Texas.



Universal Round Dance Council

ROUNDALAB conducted three seminars at the National Square Dance Convention in Indianapolis this past June. All sessions were extremely well attended.

On Thursday, Jack and Ione Kern, from California, and Wayne and Barbara Blackford, from Florida, teamed up to present material on teaching techniques involved in presenting figures from Phases V and VI. Those in attendance enjoyed lectures and demonstrations, and also participated in practical applications of the techniques discussed. Figures in foxtrot, waltz, cha cha, rumba and jive were used.

On Friday, a presentation was made by Richard and Jo Anne Lawson, from Alabama, utilizing figures from Phases III and IV. Again, lectures and demonstrations were the order of the day, and audience participation was encouraged. Many rhythms were utilized during this two-hour session.

On Saturday, an interested group of round dance teachers, and square dance callers, enjoyed the expertise of Herb Egender. Information presented was based on the manual produced by ROUNDALAB entitled "Callers Manual for Using Rounds in the Square Dance Program". Again, lecture and practical application were utilized.

Each of these three sessions was two hours in length. Handout information was made available to all in attendance.

At the 1987 National Square Dance Convention in Houston, ROUNDALAB will again present three two-hour sessions covering teaching aspects of the round dance program. Actual "hands on" sessions are being organized so the **dancers** and **teachers** alike will be able to actively participate in figure execution and teaching techniques. The staff will be announced in mid-winter.

ROUND DANCING AN ART OR A SCIENCE?

Art, denoted in its broadest sense, is merely the ability to make something or follow a plan. Science denotes performing to methods and principles, systematic and exact, done according to methods gained by systematic training. Excerpts from Webster.

In general, dancing is both an ART and a science. Round dancing is science in that we do routines as prescribed by the choreographer, it's also an art as we are following the plan to make the dance.

The choreographer is the scientist to the greater extent, the dancer is the artist, using interpretive senses. In order to be a good round dancer, we must strive to understand the scientific portion, the construction of the dance, the rhythm, the basic steps -- and when we present the dance in active motion, we are truly artistic. We are demonstrating a skill that requires knowledge, physical activity, and grace in its performance.

Basically, in round dancing, we have to perform FOUR functions: (1) Place the foot, (2) change the weight (3) in time to the music (4) gracefully. The fourth function requires the most SKILL.

Many persons attend a basic class, learn a few easy level dances, and are happy with what they have accomplished. They can do the rounds between the squares at Saturday night dances. Square



dancing and round dancing are truly a recreational activity for these people. Others continue on in round dance clubs, dancing two, three or more evenings a week, and attend a square dance at A-1, A-2, or C level workshop. In either case, it's a place for FUN and recreation. It's great that our dancing activities provide a broad spectrum for participation.

This article represents my thoughts on round dancing. I have gathered these thoughts over many years as an ice skater, ice dancer and skating judge -- and, most recently, as a round dancer, and a round dance teacher. I have enjoyed every minute.

To the experienced dancers and teachers, I hope these articles have created discussion, dissension, or, at least, made you think about the subject matter. To the newer dancers, I hope that the articles have been informative, created a curiosity to ask questions or, at least, provided a few chuckles while reading.





Stir The Bucket With Betty

HOT MULLED WINE PUNCH

- 1 cup grapefruit juice
- 2½ cups orange juice
- 2 cups apple juice
- ¼ cup water
- ¼ cup sugar
- 6 whole cloves
- 1 whole cinnamon stick
- 2 cups white wine

Combine grapefruit, orange, and apple juices with water in percolator. Place sugar, cloves and cinnamon in percolator basket. Perk until the pot stops; add wine and serve hot.

ROAST LOIN OF PORK WITH SWEET POTATOES AND APPLES

- 5 to 5½ lb. pork loin in one piece with the backbone sawed through lengthwise but left attached and tied to the loin in 4 or 5 places with kitchen cord
- 1 tsp. salt
- ½ tsp. pepper
- 3 sweet potatoes (about 2 lbs.), peeled and cut in half lengthwise
- 6 tart firm red apples, cored
- 1 tsp. cinnamon
- ¼ cup light brown sugar

Preheat oven to 350°. Rub the loin with salt and pepper, and place fat side up in a large roasting pan. Insert meat thermometer horizontally at least 2" into one end of the loin, the tip should not touch fat or bone. Roast the loin in the middle of the oven for 45 minutes, then place sweet potatoes around it and roast for 15 minutes longer. Mix cinnamon and sugar together and fill the centers of the apples, place the apples upright in the pan. Continue to roast for 30 minutes, or until the thermometer registers

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165°. Without a thermometer, test for doneness by piercing the loin deeply with a sharp knife. The juices that trickle out should be clear; if they are still pink, roast for 5 to 10 minutes longer. Place roast on heated platter and let rest for 10 minutes; surround with sweet potatoes and apples. Skim the fat from the juices and serve the gravy in a heated sauceboat.

Serves 6

FRUIT EMPANADAS (FRUIT PIES)

Filling:

2 small cooking apples
 $\frac{1}{4}$ cup sugar
 $\frac{1}{8}$ tsp. ground cinnamon
dash of salt

Pastry:

$1\frac{1}{2}$ cups unsifted flour
1 tsp. baking powder
 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. salt
 $\frac{1}{3}$ cup vegetable shortening
 $\frac{1}{3}$ cup milk (approximate)

Filling: Peel and core apples, and place in a bowl of water with

1 tablespoon lemon juice. Cut apples into $\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces. Place apples in a small saucepan and add cinnamon, sugar and salt. Cook, covered, until the consistency of chunky applesauce. Cool. Pastry: Mix flour, baking powder and salt in bowl. Cut shortening in with a pastry blender (should resemble cornmeal). Sprinkle with milk and mix with a fork until dough clings together. Gather dough in a ball and knead about ten times until smooth. Roll dough on a lightly floured surface to $\frac{1}{8}$ " thickness. Cut into 4" circles. Fill each circle with 1 tablespoon filling. Moisten edges of pastry with water, fold in half and press edges to seal. Press edge with tip of a fork. Re-roll trimmings, cut and fill. Heat $\frac{1}{2}$ to 1 inch of oil in a skillet to 370° F. Lower pies into oil and fry 2 minutes, turning once until golden brown. Drain on paper toweling. Dust with powdered sugar. (Pies may be baked in a 400° F. oven instead of fried.)

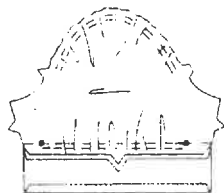


NON-ELASTIC PUFFED SLEEVE

Recently Marti and I have noticed the non-elastic puffed sleeve in patterns. It's a nicely designed sleeve, easy to put together, and an attractive part for a dress.

The new Kentucky Ruffles patterns, which are available at The Dance Store and Sherry's Promenade, have a very nice non-elastic puffed sleeve pattern. If you can't find the Kentucky Ruffles pattern, try Simplicity's Minnie Mouse Halloween Costume Pattern #7730.

One word of caution: the arm band needs to be snug enough to stay in place, but not so tight that it will constrict movement. It fits best on a slender upper arm.



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What do LEGACY, CALLERLAB, and ROUNDALAB have in common? Many things. Not the least of these is the fact that they are organizations whose members are dedicated to the premise that square dancing in all of its facets, to include rounds, contras, clogging, traditional, etc., is the greatest form of recreation there is.

LEGACY is a non-profit international assembly of trustees representing all facets of square dancing, including dancers, callers, cuers, suppliers, publishers, and special interest groups. It is a service-leadership organization interested in developing better communication among the many facets of the square dance activity. LEGACY is best known for its worldwide dancer surveys.

CALLERLAB, the International Association of Square Dance Callers, is, as the name indicates, an organization made up of callers who give of their time, talent, and resources to promote, promulgate, and improve square dancing in all

its forms.

ROUNDALAB, the International Association of Round Dance Teachers, brings together round dance teachers from around the world who work to standardize steps and cues, delineate and describe various levels of round dancing, and promote and improve the activity.

In keeping with its mission to improve communication and working relationships among the various facets of square dancing, LEGACY instigated a meeting of the chairpersons of these three international organizations during the National Square Dance Convention in Indianapolis. Bob and Dottie Elgin of LEGACY, Norm and Clarice Cross of CALLERLAB, and Betty and Clancy Mueller of ROUNDALAB got together to exchange information and ideas to better serve the dance activity. It was a productive meeting, and an annual get-together of the three Chair-couples is planned.



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OUR NATIONAL FOLK DANCE Pros & Cons

Should America have a National Folk Dance? If so, should it be square dancing, and if not, what should it be?

Taking the viewpoint of one opposed to the establishment of **any** folk dance, one **could** say: "The American people are a heterogenous group as any the world has ever seen, so how can we agree on what would constitute our common heritage?" True enough. This continent was probably settled by Asian stock who crossed the land bridge from Alaska's chain of islands, now called the Aleutians, about 50,000 years ago, and who knows what intricate kinds of dancing they did? The Europeans who followed 49,500 years later brought many different styles of dance with them, including quadrilles, contras, polkas, and waltzes, to name a few.

The traveling dance masters of olden days often adapted the current "rage" of the courts of Europe or simply renamed the popular dances and, it is now



thought, even passed them off as their own inventions on occasion. With such a background of diversity, it is said, no consensus can be reached about our origins and history.

Another argument that has been brought to bear against the adoption of square dancing as the "official dance" of our country emphasizes the exclusive nature of the modern western clubs, with their protracted lessons, fancy costumes, "graduations" resembling a university-style commencement ceremony, complete with diplomas. It zeros in on the undisputed fact that less than 1% of the total population is involved in **this** activity, at least on a weekly basis.

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And yet, it can be argued that America already has a national folk dance, and that it is square dancing, with all of its variations and its related forms of expression such as contras, clogging and rounds. Clubs have been organized at military bases around the world, and no other leisure activity is so universally recognized as being uniquely American, and yet available to all peoples as they may wish to participate in it.

Nearly everyone in America has been at and/or participated in some kind of square dance, be it a one-night-stand fund-raiser for a local team, a scouting campout, or one of the ever-present demonstrations that the modern western clubs are constantly devising. The terms "Do Sa Do" and "Allemande Left" are universally recognized and are done at all levels of our activity. (Yes, Virginia, there really are "levels" and not just "programs".)

There is still "traditional" square dancing and live music on occasion, and there is virtually no

group in our society, handicapped, retarded, stroke victims, seniors or emotionally disturbed, that does not have access to a program of square dancing. Do you know any club officer or caller who would refuse a request to develop such a program if it were requested?

And herein lies, I think, the heart of the matter: square dancers are such great people, who are so happy with themselves and willing to work hard to bring the same joy to others, that it is only a matter of time before nearly everyone will consider themselves square dancers in one way or another. When that day arrives, and square dancing is in fact, if not de jure, the National Dance in the minds and hearts of all Americans, then the only problem left will be to convince the rest of the world that the Official International Dance should be...

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37th National Square Dance Convention®

General Chairman's Report

A.R. & Edna Rodgers

It is getting closer to the time when California dancers will once again be hosting the world's greatest square dance event. The last convention in California, in 1976, had 39,796 people in attendance. People came from every state in the Union as well as from seventeen foreign countries.

This time, in 1988, we will have more than twice as much space as we had in 1976. There has been another 125,000 square feet added to the Convention Center and, in addition, we will be using twelve ballrooms in the Marriott and Hilton Towers hotels (just steps away from the Convention Center).

We have reservations for 7,800 motel and hotel rooms within 1½

miles of the Convention Center; with the promise of more, if needed.

The halls have been tested to determine the best equipment to be used and what it takes to have the best sound.

In the Convention Center, no dance hall will be within 200 feet of another; we will also be using heavy velour drapes from ceiling to floor. The smallest dance hall will hold 45 squares; the largest will hold 250 squares.

Nationally known callers will be programmed with half-hour time slots in the evening, while each caller during the day will have a full tip, consisting of a patter call as well as a singing call. We will be using hundreds of California callers as MC's, aides, and alternates.

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STOWAWAY TRAVEL

All round dancing will be in five beautiful ballrooms in the Anaheim Marriott which will also be the site for the round dance seminar as well as the callers' seminar.

All callers and cuers, wishing to, can stay at the Marriott. We are planning to use 150 acres at Mile Square Park for RV parking. This is just 5½ miles from the Convention Center, and we will be providing shuttle buses between the two locations.

On the last night of the Convention, we will be having an all-night afterparty at Disneyland until daybreak Sunday morning. This will be at a special reduced rate. We will also be having trail end dances at Knott's Berry Farm for five days prior to the convention.

We have hundreds and hundreds of man-hours of education scheduled with all kinds of panels, clinics, seminars, and workshops as well as a large area for "Sew and Save". The plans for the Fashion

Show are shaping up and this promises to be another memorable event.

We are looking for club liaison people, one person or couple from every club in California. These important people will be receiving information from the Publicity Committee and sharing it with the members of their club. If you think you would be interested, please send your name, address, telephone number, and name of your club, along with \$6.00 per person for Convention badges, to the 37th National Convention, P. O. Box 8549, Anaheim, CA 92802. These people would not be salesmen trying to sell anything.

If you would like to help us out by taking items on consignment and selling them, then you are needed as a Ways and Means worker on the Business Committee. Again, please send your name, address, phone number, name of your club or organization, and \$6.00 for each convention badge to the 37th National Convention.

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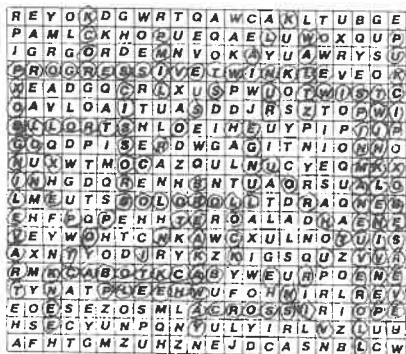
