Betty and I wish for each of you the very best of 1987.



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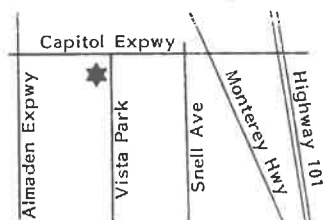
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"OUR" OPINION !

A potpourri of subjects to start off the new year...

Jay Klassen wrote his first column for The Prompter in Volume One, Number One -- that's nearly 90 months ago -- 7+ years!! Jay's "Was That Really Mainstream?" was followed by the current "Beyond Mainstream" as Jay moved his discussion of square dance choreography from Mainstream to Plus and then to the Quarterly Selection calls. Starting with this issue Jay will analyze the moves on the Advanced lists...

CALLERLAB has released the experimental "25-week Learn To Dance" program (see pages 26-28). There are 69 "calls" on the list. Boys Trade, Girls Trade, Ends Trade, Centers Trade and Partner Trade are listed as one "call" for numbering purposes -- the single number for Circulate includes Boys, Girls, All Eight, Ends, Centers, Couples, and Single File (in columns). The list is made up of 61 calls from the Mainstream Program and 8 calls from the Plus Program.

This is certainly an ambitious list of calls to teach in 25 weeks. Beyond that, CALLERLAB appears again to have missed what was, in our opinion, the intent of the resolution passed at the Baltimore Convention. The press release includes a list of "deferred calls" which "should be taught through workshops following the formal instruction period."

We think that square dancing needs a shortened program that contains the popular MS and Plus moves as a new, worldwide, destination level -- not a new "feeder" program!

CALLERLAB members will meet in New Orleans in April. Let CALLERLAB know your feelings directly by mail, through your caller, or write to The Prompter and we'll print them here...

Last year we wrote about traditions, and mentioned two we have been personally involved with: the Acey Deucey's annual Thanksgiving potluck and the same club's support of a needy family at Christmas. This year the club started what we hope will become another holiday tradition. We had read about CityTeam Mission's drive to collect food or cash donations for needy families at Thanksgiving. At the potluck the Acey Deuceys sold "split-the-pot" raffle tickets, planning to donate 60% of the proceeds to CityTeam.

The clubs in attendance included the Rafter Rockers, Katydids, Boots & Garters, Skirts & Flirts, Gold Nuggets, Top 8's, Evergreen Squares, Silver Buckles, Star Eights and Sunnyvale Singles. With about 22 squares, we hoped to be able to raise about \$100.00.

After selling all the tickets we had (some twice -- Jeannie Palma donated all her tickets back for resale), and after several winners donated their share of the pot back to the charity, the Acey Deuceys was able to donate, in the name of the clubs and large individual donors, \$500.00 to CityTeam-- which, based on their estimates, provided a traditional Thanksgiving dinner for 330 people!! May your New Year be the most successful, healthiest and happiest ever!

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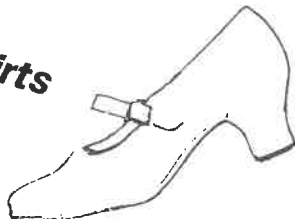
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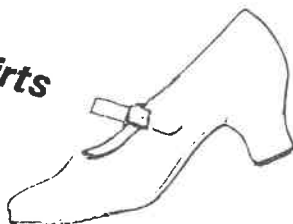
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We Get Letters

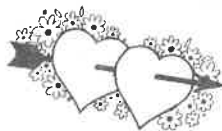

Last month we started out with a substitute for the unavailable Dolly Boards and, lo-and-behold, immediately after press time, a notice arrived that a new company back East is now making them. They're now called "The Caller's Partner" which may be a mistake because more dancers than callers use them for working out the new moves. These are very well made with nice smooth magnetic dolls. The price is about \$24.00.

Wilmarth, the square dance jewelry company, has finally started making their tie slides in a brushed metal so that they coordinate with the collar tips and towel holders... I say, "Good for them!!"

Those of you lucky enough to have danced at Dave and Suzanne Abbott's McCloud Country know about these already: a beautifully done macrame badge holder. The macrame cord that is worn around the neck like a necklace ends in a 2/2 1/2" design for your badge to be pinned on. This saves your blouses and shirts from all those pin holes!

We think they'll be selling for about \$5.00.

Ladies, do your wide-necked square dance dresses and blouses keep falling off the hangers? Do what so many store do... use those nice foam hanger pads. Some dance stores are now selling them for about \$2.50 per dozen.

Border Patrol Patterns has a new 3/4 sleeve dress with a pointed midriff and smocked shoulder line. They have also added size 18 to all their patterns and included sleeve variations to the "Sue" and "Dot" styles.

Would you like to practice square dancing, or round dancing, or ballroom dancing at home with real people showing you how? Check out all these new items and if you know of a product of interest to square dancers, I'd like to hear from you.

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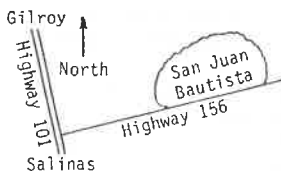
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Stir The Bucket With Betty

After the holiday feasting, I'm always on the lookout for quick, easy and yet delicious dishes. Here are some old favorites and new discoveries! I hope you'll enjoy them as much as we have. Happy New Year!

CRANBERRY ORANGE SALAD

- 1 cup sugar
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup chopped walnuts
- 1 (12 oz.) pkg. fresh or frozen cranberries, finely chopped
- 1 (11 oz.) can mandarin orange segments, drained
- 1 (6 oz.) pkg. orange gelatin
- 2 cups boiling water

Oil 8 to 10 individual molds or a 6-cup mold. In large bowl, combine sugar, walnuts, cranberries and oranges; set aside. In large bowl, dissolve gelatin in boiling water. Refrigerate gelatin mixture until slightly thickened, about 45 minutes. Add cranberry-orange mixture; stir until well blended. Spoon into prepared molds. Refrigerate until firm, about 3 hours. Unmold onto serving plate; garnish as desired.

PORK CHOPS WITH SHERRIED APPLES

- 6 lean pork chops, 1" thick
- 4 tart apples, peeled and cut into eighths
- 4 tsp. brown sugar
- 2 tsp. cinnamon
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup dry sherry wine
- 4 Tbsp. margarine

Brown pork chops in heavy

skillet. Place browned chops in slow-cooking pot. Combine apple slices with brown sugar, cinnamon, and sherry and mix to coat apples well. Spoon apple mixture on pork chops and dot with margarine. Cover tightly and cook at "low" for 6 to 8 hours; at "high" for 3 to 4 hours.

MERRY MOCHA DESSERT

Crust:

- 2 cups crushed creme-filled chocolate sandwich cookies
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup margarine, softened

Filling:

- 2 (8 oz.) pkgs. cream cheese, softened
- 1 (7 oz.) jar marshmallow creme (2 cups)
- 3 Tbsp. creme de cacao liqueur
- 3 Tbsp. coffee-flavored liqueur
- 2 cups whipping cream, whipped
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup chocolate-flavored syrup
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup chopped pecans

Lightly grease 9x13-inch pan. In small bowl, combine crust ingredients; mix well. Press mixture evenly in bottom of prepared pan; refrigerate. In large bowl, beat cream cheese until light and fluffy. Add marshmallow creme; continue beating until smooth. Add liqueurs; mix gently to blend. Fold whipped cream into marshmallow mixture. Spoon filling evenly over crust. Drizzle chocolate syrup over filling; swirl with spoon. Sprinkle with pecans. Refrigerate until firm, about 4 hours.

★ CORNER

Out of numerous reactions to the article last month, some good, some bad (the bad will be published next month), there was general agreement among dancers that we do indeed need to reduce the number of figures required to dance. If we are to help stem the flow of dancers away from square dancing, we should really consider putting an end to the experimental "programs".

Regardless of the intent, these experimentals seem to remain mandatory for dancers at all levels. If we, as callers, would simply stop teaching them, they would go away more quickly. I would certainly like to see this happen, but I am continually faced with dancers who return from Saturday night dances anxious to tell me about the newest Mainstream, Plus, or A & C experimental they just learned.

There have been a number of A & C dancers who told me they dropped out of C-1 and C-2 groups when their pile of experimental cards got bigger than their pile of cards for the list at that level. If our groups are getting smaller, we in the A & C levels need to start asking why dancers leave.

Recently, one of our more prominent callers asked me if I was interested in exchanging tapes of our dances at the A & C level. I was and, as soon as I get my tape deck back from a certain other

caller, I will begin to tape my dances and send some to him.

It seems to be a good idea and perhaps more of us should do it. It would even be of benefit for callers at the A & C levels to exchange tapes on a national basis. This would benefit a lot of dancers, particularly those who attend P.A.C.E. dances where nationally known callers from other areas are frequently found.

On a local basis, the dancers could gain increased confidence when they are about to attend a Saturday night dance by knowing they have been brought up-to-date on some of the stuff they are likely to encounter -- by their caller having a tape exchange with the caller doing the dance.

This would certainly provide increased mobility for the dancers. I, for one, always ask my dancers (who are frequent hoedown attenders) to look for unusual stuff to bring back to me so the rest of the group can learn it. I have found that when they see it once, they will see it again sooner or later. By preparing them in advance, they will have a better success rate and be happier about their dancing experiences at Saturday night or weekend festivals.

Since this article is a little more oriented to callers, I would like to cover one other subject, that of insurance. I am reminded of this due to my annual duties for our local callers association. This, of course, can affect dancers.

I am sure, from conversations with people who call me from various parts of the country, there are many callers and dancers who are, through ignorance or due to the high cost, working "barefoot" as far as having proper insurance. My advice to you is -- DON'T! Many A & C callers do this because of the small size of their groups. Some try to set up dummy clubs to cover themselves. When a lawsuit is filed, the dummy club is torn apart in court, and you end up on the hook for amounts that can ruin your life. DON'T DO IT!

DANCE INSTRUCTIONS "CUE SHEETS"

Quite often, I'm asked to explain or clarify a portion of a dance instruction. Whenever possible I try to give my interpretation or explanation, or "As I See It".

Most experienced choreographers use excellent dance instructions, one need only follow the basic symbols of choreography to understand what they are 'detailing' in the instructions. However, sometimes these instructions are over-explained and cause some concern deciphering what is meant by the abundance of words.

Then, in other instances, the instruction may be very concise and lack enough detail for an inexperienced dancer to comprehend. Sometimes the detail lacking is the ending body position or facing direction. In this case, it's best to refer to the last one or two measures and see what the basic figure does to the 'facing or body position'. Perhaps the word 'Blend' is not present, but the last figure would leave the dancer in Sidecar or Banjo, so this should be the facing or body position. Don't 'fight' the natural body mechanics.

In a prior article on Blends and Crosses, the body positions are quite well explained. Remember, the body mechanics will win the fight. Don't reposition yourself unnecessarily.

Scissors and Twinkles are the only natural body changes in the Easy level of round dancing. As a



person progresses to Intermediate and Advanced levels, they will find that almost every figure will have a slightly different facing, or body, position at the end of the figure. In the Advanced levels of round dancing, many choreographers explain in fine detail every figure, both man's and woman's footwork, body position, and facing position. This makes for difficult reading as most dancers or teachers are really interested only in the changes that may be used in the figure.

Sir Alex Moore, and other notable dance personalities, have published many volumes on figures for many dance rhythms, giving excellent amalgamations and, also, providing the normal and abnormal finish positions and facings. Avid dancers and teachers buy these books and study the figures in great detail.

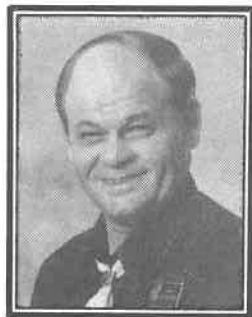
When in doubt over a specific dance instruction, ask your teacher. If you are isolated, then discuss it with a dancing friend for mutual benefit. If all else fails, send a copy of the cue sheet to the choreographer, marking the portion to be clarified, and include a SASE for your response. Most choreographers are pleased to explain the reasoning of their instructions.

BEYOND MAINSTREAM

PAIR OFF (CALLERLAB Advanced Call #33)

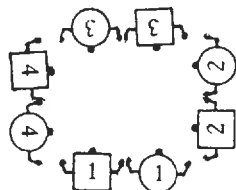
Definition

(CALLERLAB April 1984) Starting formation: Static square, eight chain thru, or lines facing. From facing couples: step forward, if necessary, and Face Out. Ending formations: From a static square,

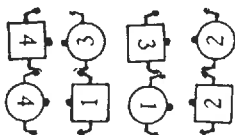
ends in eight chain thru; from eight chain thru, ends in lines back-to-back; from facing lines, ends in completed double pass thru. (Callers NOTE: The definition above partially replaces Burleson #71.)

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Dancing Hints

Pair Off is an extremely versatile Advanced (A-1) call that can create very rapid formation change(s); especially when called from Facing Lines.

When you are dancing this call, the "main secrets for success" are: Take your hand that is closest to the flagpole center of the square and join it with the corresponding hand of the dancer you face; each of you (individually) turns your back toward that hand (the center of the square). This action will ensure that you always execute and complete this call properly.

Further, if you are dancing to a caller who has used this call for longer than the last ten years, it is possible that you may be required

to execute this call from two additional formations (starting double pass thru or trade by). In these cases, the facing (or lead) couples Pair Off and take one step forward so that the trailing couples (if there are any) can step forward and Pair Off. In all cases, joining the hand closest to flagpole center with the corresponding hand of the dancer you face and each of you individually turning your back toward that hand will WORK successfully.

Even though this call only takes two beats of music to execute (When all goes well! Ed.), it is still possible to DANCE this move.



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Fashionable Thoughts by Martibet



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The choice of sleeves is perfect for square dancing. The 3/4 puffed sleeved is big, but has a soft, flowing line to it. The double-layer sleeve is flattering to all upper arm sizes! Both sleeves are comfortable for dancing movements.

The tucked bodice is a super style that is very chic. One problem I encountered -- the bodice runs a tad short-waisted and you may want to make some adjustments.

Keep the skirt simple -- I chose a basic gored skirt and used six gores instead of the usual five. It gave the skirt some extra fullness, swish and sway! It moves

beautifully over a soft petticoat. To put ruffles, etc., on the skirt would only detract from the bodice.

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I hope you enjoy your new creation!

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TO MERGE OR NOT TO MERGE THAT IS THE QUESTION

The Prompter recently visited the oldest "new" club in the Santa Clara valley, If the name, The Hillbillie-Dudes & Dolls, has a familiar ring to it, it should. The club is an "amalgamation" of two well-established square dance clubs, the Highland Hillbillies and the Dudes & Dolls.

About a year ago, these two clubs were in a position shared by many other clubs -- declining membership, smaller class sizes and increasing operating costs were making it difficult for the clubs to continue as viable organizations. This is where the expertise and experience of their boards came into play. They decided to explore the possibility of merging the two clubs together to form a much stronger single organization.

The following report was written by club members Jeanette and Howard Olson who were very much involved with all the mechanics of the merger.

In many areas, circumstances may make the growth and/or stability of square dance clubs uncertain. These clubs may be old or young, have new ideas or long standing traditions. Whatever their status, they were formed for the fun and fellowship of square dancing. They are needed in the overall scope of community activities.

The possibility of merging membership with another club to prevent dissolution of either, should be explored. Two clubs at 34 and 35 years of age, recently merged in the San Francisco Bay Area. These clubs were both charter members of the Santa Clara County Square Dancers Association and now live

on to tell a success story. The following is shared to possibly be of help to others.

The following are some of the conditions that may be present:

- Declining membership.
- Costly or unsuitable facilities.
- Availability of qualified callers.
- Small beginner class turn-out.

The characteristics of possible participants in merging clubs should be examined to determine compatibility. Is the average age of members similar? Is the level of dancing the same, that is, do they enjoy APD, rounds between tips, quarterly selections, line dancing occasionally? Do the clubs enjoy similar social activities, such as camp outs, potlucks, attending hoedowns, holding party nights or mystery trips? Is the dancing night the same or is a change acceptable? A location must be considered, whether one used in the past or should be different for both clubs.

Especially needed is the desire of both memberships to pursue a merging venture, and input from all is important, and should be requested and considered. If each club has a caller, their cooperation and insight is needed to facilitate the continuing of square dancing in a wholesome atmosphere for both memberships.

When implementing the merger of two clubs, a steering committee made up of members of both clubs can establish guidelines and a time frame, and insure communication of progress to all members. One method successfully used to assist in communication is a one or two page newsletter published monthly

-The Prompter-



and sent to all members. This newsletter announces coming events, kitchen squares, birthdays and anniversaries.

Clubs should dance together to acquaint all members with one another, joint board meetings should be held regularly, membership lists should be reviewed and inactive members contacted to determine their intent. Joint general meetings should be held on dance nights primarily as brief announcement time of steering committee work and board meeting recommendation; this also can be a time for input from the general membership. Communication is the key to success.

If merger proposals are acceptable to all members, the club's by-laws must be reviewed and consolidated. A key issue here is to determine what officers are needed and describe their duties. At the same time it should be determined when the new officers are to take office. New officers take over when the merger is agreed upon. The revised by-laws are distributed to each member for reading before adoption. A revised membership list from each club should be collated. Don't rush. Repeat, don't rush at this point.

The joint club's treasury is funded by each separate treasury contributing a predetermined amount per member. At this point, the steering committee should determine dues during the trial period, and set up a nominating committee made up from both clubs, instructing them to nominate from each club's membership.

If membership in a dancers association is desired, contact should be made, and information and assistance requested. Their help and support made our merger easier.

The name is an emotional item that must have input from all members. A democratic procedure must be used but the members must have the ability to give their suggestions. The method used successfully in our club was to encourage members to write down their suggestions for a name. Consequently the board, upon reviewing that list, recommended a likely possibility for the general membership to vote upon. The new name is a combination of both original names. This was important to all since we were two very senior clubs in our area.

Club badges are another item that need input from all members.

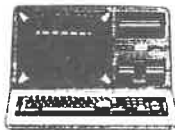

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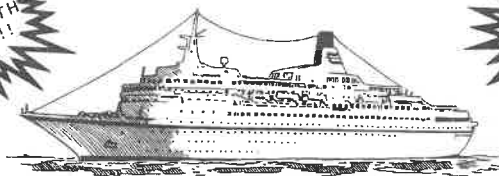
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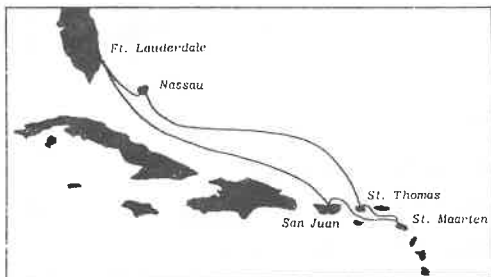

CALLERLAB EXPERIMENTAL 25 WEEK PROGRAM



Red Bates, Chairman of the Special Committee established to review the Mainstream and Plus Programs to develop a 25-week Learn to Dance Program, is pleased to announce the completion of the committee's work. It has been a monumental task involving many iterations of ideas back and forth within the USA and Canada. The results reflect the surveys and thinking of many leaders and are offered to those callers and clubs who wish to try an experimental program. This program is designed for those areas and clubs who have requested a 25-week Learn to Dance Program using the most popular calls from the mainstream and Plus Programs.

This program was developed

over a period of time subsequent to a resolution made at the 1986 Baltimore Convention of CALLERLAB. The listing of calls reflects the same numbering scheme used on the existing Mainstream Program and all Plus calls which are included are identified with a (*Plus*) following the call.

Calls from the Mainstream or Plus lists which are not included in this 25-Week Program should be taught through workshops following the formal instruction period. This program is designed as a "feeder" program for Plus clubs. Individual modifications to suit local conditions are anticipated. No effort should be made to pressure anyone into teaching with this experimental program unless the sponsoring
