It's fun to still read The Prompter while living here in Oregon. And surprise! We get it well before the first. As I read the many articles about concern with declining numbers of dancers, I wonder if our experience here in Oregon might be of some interest. Of course, this is only our observation.

Square dancing is a natural for making new friends when you go to a new community. We have joined two clubs and are having a great time dancing.

The Wagon Wheelers is a Mainstream club. The club dances every first and third Saturdays. The dancing is fast, smooth, innovative and lots of fun. There are 150 members in the 34-year-old club, four who are charter members and still dance regularly. On every Saturday night there are many visitors and usually a few callers dancing with us. On the "other" Saturdays of the month, the Wagon Wheelers go to visit some other club in the area. There are several, almost all Mainstream, clubs in town.

Classes are held weekly on a

week day. Dancers spend nine months learning Mainstream and they dance it for some time before thinking of learning a new level. Most dancers never learn a higher level. People seem to feel comfortable dancing and relaxed and having a good time. The club members only complaint seem to be that the clubs are so large and, with so many frequent new members, it's hard to know everyone.

There is a Plus club in the area and once a month a Plus dance. Callers have been Jet Roberts, Randy Dibble, etc., but not many people attend. We go to Salem once a week to dance A-2 with Marty Firstenberg's Good Time Squares and enjoy that very much. But Mainstream is where the emphasis is.

Starting in December, once a month, each Mainstream club in the area takes a turn hosting all area class members at their regular Saturday dance. By December, the new dancers can be dancing once a month with their friends who are experienced dancers.

While there is an understanding and appreciation for the dancer who wants to learn more, there is certainly no pressure to increase your level. I get no feeling of competition among dancers. Having fun dancing with your friends is the most important thing.

I haven't heard concern expressed about declining numbers. The number of dancers seems to remain stable or to increase.

We are planning to attend the Winter Festival in Watsonville, maybe we will see you and Betty there and we can share a tip.

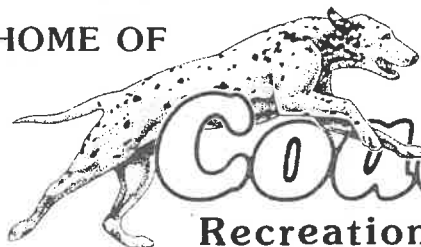

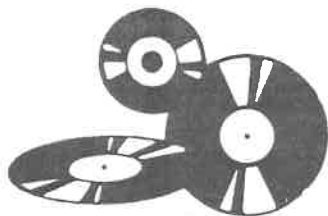

WHAT'S NEW!!

From The DANCE STORE

Cute sleeves! That's what's new in this season's showing of square dance styles. Malco Modes, alone, has four new treatments for the puffed sleeve: one an overlay, gathered up to a bow; another has a lace and bow-trimmed cap sleeve atop the puff; then there is an ample puff, with the top part reinforced with a stiff lining, making it very pouffy; then, wait 'til you see the one with scalloped ruffles at the shoulder line, reinforced with fine fish line in the edge. I bet a lot of seamstresses will be copying this one!

Malco Modes also has a darling new jumper with a vest-like top. I think it'll be the season's hit.

Another item available for seamstresses, not new but many don't know about it, is the hard tag paper for making permanent patterns. That way you don't need to worry about a favorite pattern wearing out. It's 48" wide and is sold by the foot.

The square dancer's own pantyhose, "Dancing Legs", has a new color -- Taupe... now we have three choices!

If you have a special dress and want to add the perfect finishing

touch to it, try having a coordinating slip edged in one of the dress colors. It's done on an overlock sewing machine and will cost you about \$15.00.

Sting, the Swedish import record label, has a new release by Robert Bjork. It's Mainstream and titled "Meet Me in Stockholm" (402), which can be changed to Stockton, Belmont, Merced, Fresno, etc. We think Dick Waibel has another hit with his "Ragtime Cowboy, Joe" (129) on Rawhide. Good, good music. Want a new novelty record? Try "Ballad of a New Caller" (1801) on Eagle by Wes Dyer and Jarvis Kenny, using just Basics.

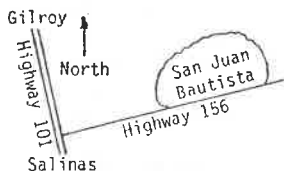

Stir The Bucket With Betty

Do you want to fix your sweetheart a delicious treat? here are three great recipes which I know you'll enjoy!

PORK SMITTANE

- 2 loin pork chops, butterflied,
 $\frac{1}{2}$ " thick
- 3 Tbsps. flour
- $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. pepper
- 2 Tbsps. butter
- 1 Tbsp. sliced green onion
- $\frac{1}{3}$ cup dry white wine
- 1 tsp. Dijon-style mustard
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup cold water
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ tsps. flour

Pound pork with a meat mallet to $\frac{1}{8}$ " thickness. Combine 3 Tbsps. flour and pepper; dredge chops. In skillet melt butter; add chops and brown on both sides. Remove chops. Add green onion to drippings; cook over medium heat until crisp-tender. Stir in wine and mustard. Return chops to skillet, cover and reduce heat to medium-low. Simmer for 15 to 18 minutes or until done. Remove chops. Stir together water and $1\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. flour; stir into drippings. Cook over medium-high heat until thickened and bubbly, stirring constantly. Return chops to skillet. Cover and cook for 2 to 3 minutes or until heated through. Garnish with tarragon and serve with pea pods, carrots, and water chestnuts, if desired. Makes 2 servings.

BROCCOLI & HERBS brocoli aux fines herbes Microwave Recipe

- 2 (10 oz.) packages frozen
broccoli spears
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup butter, melted
- 4 Tbsps. lemon juice
- $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. garlic powder
- $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. salt
- $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. ground pepper
- $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. oregano
- $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. sweet basil
- $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. tarragon

Cook broccoli in packages (puncture box) on High for 7 minutes each. Drain and place in a 2 quart casserole. Melt butter in a 2-cup measure. Add lemon juice and spices, and microwave on High for $1\frac{1}{2}$ -2 minutes. Pour over broccoli.

Crust:

- 1 cup flour
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup butter
- 2 Tbsps. white sugar

Topping:

- $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups brown sugar
- 2 Tbsps. flour
- 2 eggs, beaten
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup coconut
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup walnuts, chopped

Work crust ingredients as for pie crust, then press into 8"x11" pan. Bake 15 minutes at 325°. Mix topping ingredients and spread on baked crust. Bake approximately 25-30 minutes at 325°. Do not over-bake or these will become Chinese Crunchies!

Fashionable Thoughts by Martibet



It's time to take a look at the dresses in the closet and get in the mood to spruce up the ole wardrobe. I've found a great bodice pattern that's easy to put together and is comfortable to wear. You'll love it! It's Vogue #2947 Designer Pattern: Ralph Lauren.

As you can see in the picture, it has a scoop neckline with soft cap sleeves which are perfect for the arm movements needed in square dancing. It's a fitted bodice with darts front and back which make for easy adjustments.

I did make one variation in the pattern you might like to copy. It has a side opening along with the button front. I changed the pattern to open down the back; kept the button front, but staystitched the front bodice panels so they could not gap or come unbuttoned at an inopportune time. It worked our perfectly.

I used a linen-like polyester cloth in a bright gold for the bodice and small round brass

buttons for the front. The skirt I kept simple. I cut 5 gores in a patterned material (brown, gold, orange) and used this same material for a waistband and ties.

Be sure to check your bodice length measurement (neck to waist) as I found the pattern ran a tad short for me.

I hope you'll enjoy your dress -- It'll be great for Spring and Summer fabrics!

The first article on Blends & Crosses dealt with the figures of Phase I and Phase II. This article will deal with the figures of Phase III.

The Diamond Turn, as used in the Fox Trot, requires the man to adjust his partner to Banjo position during the first quarter turn. Fox Trot, in this case being S-, Q, Q, allows the dancers to assume a snug Banjo position during the "Slow" beat as the turn is made. Once the woman is in Banjo, the "side, back" steps are easy. There is not much danger of stepping on the partner's feet while in Banjo.

The secret here is to move the woman to Banjo during the first quarter turn on the slow beat, and then maintain the Banjo position for the next three measures. The remainder of the Diamond Turn is accomplished in a snug Banjo. The complete figure may finish in Banjo; or it may call for a smooth blend to Closed Position on the twelfth step of the figure; or it may call for a Feather Finish in the last measure, with a blend to Contra Body position.

The last measure will be the most difficult for adjustment or blend, as the blend will be accomplished on a "Quick" beat and will require a very smooth transition of body position. Experienced dancers will start the blend during the first quick beat and finish it on the last beat of the measure. It will appear to be "SO SMOOTH". Like HOT HONEY.

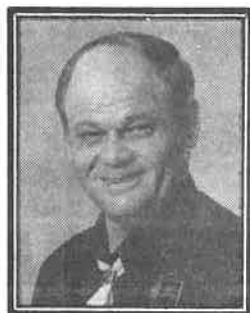
Looking at the Fox Trot Telemark, we will see more body changes. Starting from Closed Position, the man will step OUTSIDE of his partner, turning and blending to a SCP V position, during the second step. The woman performs a "back, close heelturn" as the man furnishes the TURNING power. The man will step forward DLW as the woman may remain in Banjo, OR continue to turn to SCP V fc DWL. There are several body position changes and blends during the Telemark.

If the Telemark is a Hover Telemark, the turn is slower and more deliberate, with a rise up on 1 and 2, continue to rise on 3, and finishing with a soft knee on the third step as the lowering ends.

The Hover is probably the easiest figure of Phase III. The man forward on left, with a LOWERING of the body on a soft knee, while the woman goes "back, toe-heel" on a soft knee while lowering the body. The side step is from the POWER EDGE (inside edge of foot), with a definite RISE to the Man's R and Woman's L foot. Because of the initial lowering of the body during the first step, the rise of the second step will appear as GREAT, without having to really force the elevation. The third step will be a RECOVER to Man's L and Woman's R foot, with a lowering of body to soft knee and flat foot. The overall effect of early lowering, and final lowering to soft knee, will add tremendous effect to a SLIGHT rise of the second step. Practice this skill to gain its maximum effect. This is really a test of BLENDS.

Accey Deucey is one of the most versatile calls on the Advanced List. In addition to the formations shown, this call may also be executed from many MORE formations.

The 'main secret to success' with this call is to very rapidly establish exactly WHO YOU ARE in the formation: if you have both hands joined at the start, then you are ALWAYS a center dancer who must execute the Trade (Examples 1-4); AND if you are in a formation where everybody only has one hand joined and you are closest to the 'flagpole center' of the formation (Examples 5 & 6), you must execute the Trade to properly accomplish your portion of this call.

Although it is somewhat easier to establish if you are 'a Circulator' (only one hand joined when in a formation where some dancers have both hands joined; or facing away from the flagpole center of the set), your action(s) to properly complete this call are just as important as those actions for center dancers. In fact, since you can readily establish that the 'Circulate' is your part, it is possible that you may have a small amount of extra time available to assist a center dancer who has NOT achieved this 'rapid recognition' of his position. When assisting these dancers, please **do not speak** to them, but rather use 'hand signals'.

The Square Dance Activity is made up of many facets of dancing. CALLERLAB recognizes this fact and encourages its members to become conversant with areas other than just square dance calling. The callers have a responsibility to provide a pleasurable program for the dancers. Quite frequently, to provide variety, Round Dancing is included in this program.

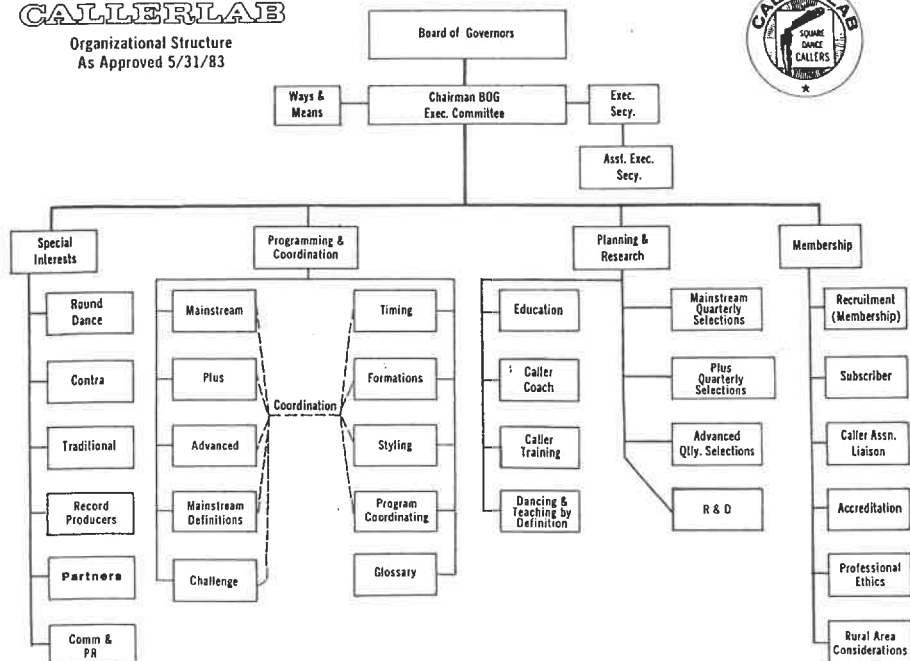
While some square dance callers do not include rounds in their program, CALLERLAB's official position is that squares and rounds go together. They are part of the same family tree. CALLERLAB has an active Round Dance Committee which selects a "Round of the Quarter" for suggested use by its members. It was at CALLERLAB's request that ROUNDALAB developed

a manual for callers who wish to introduce rounds into their square dance program. Dual membership in CALLERLAB and ROUNDALAB is not at all uncommon and many CALLERLAB members teach or participate in round dancing.

If your area does not include round dancing in its square dance program, encourage your leaders (callers, cuers, dancers) to develop a way of including it, especially at the Basic, Mainstream and Plus dance programs. All will benefit from it. Squares and rounds, do, indeed, go together. What the proper balance may be at any particular dance should be at the pleasure of the dancers and worked out cooperatively between the caller and cuer.

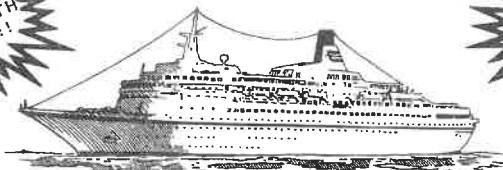

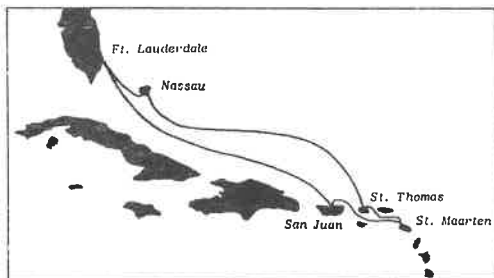

CALLERLAB RESPONDS

Editor,

Bob Southern made some incorrect statements regarding CALLERLAB activity in his "Challenge Corner" article in your December issue. Bob states, in regard to a special committee to develop a 25-week learn-to-dance Mainstream/Plus list, that "...the committee has failed to accomplish this." The committee finished a first draft of its work in time for the September deadline. The work of the committee was reviewed by the entire 25 member Board of Governors, who determined by majority vote that the first draft was not adequate and was not what the general membership had intended. The work was sent back to committee, was redone utilizing the suggestions sent with it, and was in the hands of the membership prior to the publishing of Bob's article. Since it was suggested to the general membership (all callers awaiting this new program) that they follow their old teaching order until the new program was finalized, the net effect of not having the program by September was that callers would not have taught only ONE CALL by the time the finished program was in their hands on November 24. Certainly this was not a major problem for most adequate teachers to deal with.

Bob states, "...the vote (of the general membership to have a list by September 1) has been ignored or misinterpreted by the Executive Board." This is not true at all, and to say so ignores the fact that the September 1 deadline was, in this case, an unrealistic deadline. To further assume, as Bob does, that CALLERLAB failed to meet the deadline because "...CALLERLAB always seems to try to make things more difficult than they really are!" ...ignores the nature and behavior of committee work. The committee

in question drew its input from all over the square dance world, not just Santa Clara county. It is very easy for one caller to come up with what he believes is an adequate list. It is another thing altogether for an entire committee of callers, all with varying backgrounds and interests, to develop an adequate list.

Because of the complexities of committee operations, the Board of Governors is charged with overseeing the activities of all committees to ensure that their actions comply with the desires of the membership at large within a feasible time frame. The entire Board of Governors (25 members) sent this action back to committee, not the Executive Committee alone (5 members). It is true that the Executive Committee agreed with the Board of Governors that the first draft was not appropriate for the purposes required of the general membership. Bob is in error when he states that the vote was "ignored" or "misinterpreted".

It is interesting to note, even though Bob is not a member of CALLERLAB and did not attend the Baltimore convention at which the resolution was passed, that he seems to know more about what the general membership wants than the Executive Committee and the Board of Governors of CALLERLAB. Perhaps his involvement from within the organization would be more effective and better appreciated. His skillful leadership qualities could be put to good use within CALLERLAB, if he chose to renew his membership. Just imagine how effective he could be in ensuring that CALLERLAB does "...get its act together..." and that it "...gets the job done..." Everyone would benefit.

Bob makes a weak attempt to tie his argument into his theme of Advanced and Challenge dancing by

asking what effect this alleged lack of action has on the Advanced and Challenge community. It has no direct effect whatsoever, since in our area callers have been utilizing a 25-week learn-to-dance program for the last three years. The newly developed CALLERLAB list (a) is not an approved CALLERLAB dance program, (b) is in the experimental stage, (c) is not recommended for all callers in all areas, (d) is to be used in areas where Plus dancing is the largest majority of club level dancing, and (e) is actually an outgrowth of what has been happening in the Bay Area for the last three years. Indirectly, an argument can be made that unless we bolster up the Mainstream and Plus dancing community, Advanced and Challenge dancing could be threatened.

But there are other ways that Advanced and Challenge dancers can help allay any such threat, rather than getting all excited about the timely delivery of a new teaching program. They should consider returning to their home MS or Plus clubs regularly to help support the end of the activity that supports them. They should consider taking a year to bring a new dancing couple into the activity by accompanying them to a beginner class and seeing to it that they are well entrenched in their home club dancing environment. They should run for office both in their own home clubs and in the dancer association to provide adequate and well trained leadership to square dancing. Some

Advanced and Challenge dancers do these things and are to be commended for their involvement. But, failing to do any of the above, they should at least make an effort to adhere to all the standards set, including those regarding hand positions and square dance apparel.

And, if they happen to write articles for local publications, they might consider honing their investigative reporting techniques to ensure that the truth gets published and that their readers walk away enlightened, not misinformed.

EXERCISE YOUR BRAIN
TO KEEP IT YOUNG



People who want to stay mentally sharp in old age should exercise their minds as well as their bodies.

K. Warner Schaie, professor of human development and psychology, draws that conclusion after studying 2,000 adults in the Seattle, Washington, area for nearly three decades.

"The people who led active lives when they were middle-aged remained stable or showed improvement in mental abilities after age 60," Dr. Schaie says. "Those people

who didn't have very stimulating lives showed a marked decline."

Dr. Schaie concludes that people should seek out a variety of stimulating activities in their middle years.

"Square dancing, for example, not only has aerobic value but also exercises mental skills," he says. "You have to remember the sequences given by the caller and translate them into organized motor behavior. It is much more desirable than sitting in front of the television."

He also recommends crossword puzzles and word games like Scrabble because they require using memory and verbal skills.

"Any retired person who can afford a personal computer and doesn't buy one is foolish," he adds. "Computer games offer all sorts of interesting ways to exercise your mind."

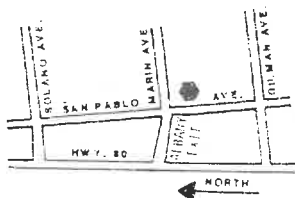

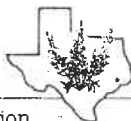

Texas is a Camper's Bonanza

How do you like your camping? Do you bring along the TV, and your shower to clean up after a stroll around the countryside? Or do you prefer throwing the tent and lantern, and maybe a cook stove, in the trunk of the car? Whatever you like to do, Texas is ready for you. The scenery varies from the swamps and forest of the East to the rocks, cactus and spring fed pools and rivers of central Texas to the mesas, or slender table-topped mountains of the North-central part of the state. To the west, you drive and drive through hills and stretches of plains until you arrive at Big Bend country, home of the Chisos and Davis Mountains and the fabled Rio Grande River. South is 624 miles of seashore caressing the Gulf of Mexico.

Square dancers are always interested in history and would enjoy sitting near the very spot in Galveston where pirate Jean Lafitte buried pieces of eight. You might have to dig pretty deep, though, because after the giant hurricane of 1900, they built a seawall and raised the whole town about sixteen feet. Perhaps you are interested in the Alamo in San Antonio. We had folks from all over come to help us in our war for independence.

Some of the more famous, and infamous, places to visit are: did you ever hear of Luckenbach, Texas (where everyone wants to go); Terlingua (home of the world's greatest chili cook-off); or Beaumont (home of the "Spindletop" museum)? The biggest single attraction of North Texas (around the Dallas, Fort Worth area) is the place where J.R. Ewing is the orneriest ranch boss around. Southfork Ranch is near Plano.

The Texas Rangers are another part of Texas history that you can

visit at the Texas Ranger Hall of Fame in Waco. They were really a special breed of people.

Judge Roy Bean's place is all fixed up and waiting for you to visit it in Langtry. That's sixty miles west of Del Rio. You may not spend the night, but you will see the place where the Judge proclaimed himself, "Law West of the Pecos."

There are caves and lakes (bring the fishing rod) to visit, and museums, and some of our great vacation spots, such as New Braunfels or San Marcos. Perhaps you plan to try some sea fishing, or make a quick trip to the Mexican border or, better yet, to a town further on into the interior.

Reams of great camping spots are described in the "Texas Public Campgrounds" brochure obtained from the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation, P.O. Box 5064, Austin, TX 78763. There is also a "Texas Travel Handbook" obtained from the same people at 11th and Brazos Streets, Austin, TX 78701. KOA Campgrounds has a special Texas brochure. Write them at 6805 Guadalupe Street, Austin, TX 78752. "Houston recreational and camping facilities" are outlined in a brochure by that name, obtained from the Greater Houston Convention and Visitors Council, 3300 Main Street, Houston, TX 77002-9396.

If you want to visit interior Mexico, be sure to bring your automobile title along. This is not necessary when visiting the border towns. Write to the Mexican Government Tourism Office, 2707 North Loop West, Suite 450, Houston, TX 77008. They will do everything possible to make your trip a pleasant one.
