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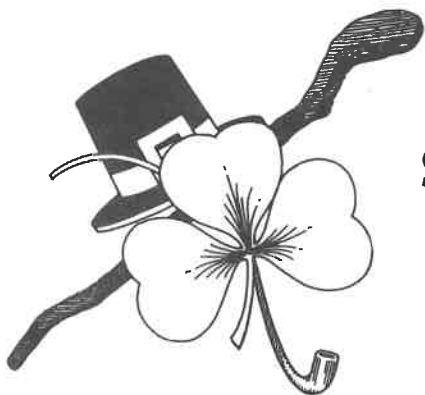
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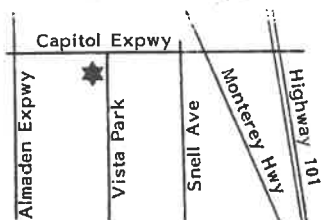
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"OUR" OPINION !

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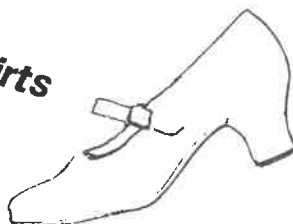
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We Get Letters

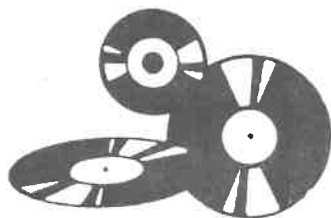

It's acrylic and nylon, the colors are peach and wine -- a cute way to change an outfit and make it look very different. Boulevard Knitwear also has a new sweater with a ruffled collar and cuffs. It comes in black heather, which looks almost black, with silver threads in it. This neat company is also making "I'd Rather Be Square Dancing" T-shirts, and several shirts.

There are two patterns this month. One, a new one by Authentic, with a gathered sweetheart neckline with self-ruffles. The split sleeves are also trimmed with self-ruffles, and are elasticized and form the shoulders of the dress. It makes that very attractive wide neckline.

The second pattern is not new, but, until now, has only been available by mail order. It's a cute

midriff with a sailor top and is multi-sized -- it's by Fann Burrus Originals and can now be purchased in your local square dance stores.

Coast Shoes' new T-strap, the "Kristi", is now in your stores. It's more attractive than their old "Katie", with a pointed toe and attractive 2½" heel, it's available in medium and narrow widths, in black, white, and tan.

Good news to all you teachers! The record "AGADOO" is now available! That's the cute line dance taught by Jack Murtha at the Teachers' Seminar a couple of years ago. This dance may well become popular as the "Birdie Dance". With that happy thought, we leave you for this month!

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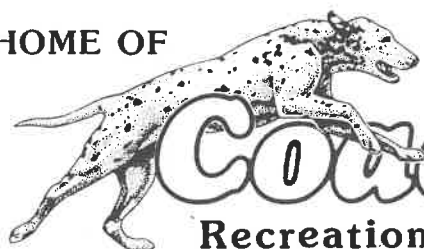

SOMETHING NEW AND SLENDERIZING

I recently found a pattern which gave me several ideas for a new bodice design. The overall effect is slimming as well as giving you a "longer waisted" look. Simplicity 6029 is the pattern number and, as you can see, it has a variety of sleeve styles which give you some nice options. I chose View 4 and used a calico in purple tones. The result is a crisp, perky dress.

As usual, I made some changes in the pattern. The dress opens in the front which really didn't appeal to me. As a consequence, I elected to continue the white broadcloth panels into the back of the bodice and put in a full length (22") zipper down the back. I did retain the button front design by using the "mock" opening front as in last month's issue. The "wing" lapels of calico, which were designed to provide a front bodice interest, were lengthened and doubled to continue into the back. You now have that tall, slim look coming and going!

The sleeves were cut out of the white broadcloth to add to the crispness of the look. Meanwhile, calico was used in the side panels to help continue the slimming effect.

Rather than putting in a waistband and ties, I chose to make a belt of the calico which ties in the back. It gives the effect of a waistband and is more comfortable than the shown leather or plastic



belt. Belting can be inserted into the front section (side seam to side seam length) to keep the belt from wrinkling or rolling. In order to keep the belt in place, you can crochet belt loops (2" of a single chain stitch sewn into or knotted into the side seam at the waistline) or tack the belt at the side seams.

I chose a plain six-gore gathered panel skirt design in the calico to compliment the bodice. Ruffles and other trims were left off so as not to detract from the bodice and full sleeves.

I selected a satin and grosgrain ribbon color accent for the tie at the neckline which picked up the primary color of the calico.

It's a great dress for that cool or rainy evening!



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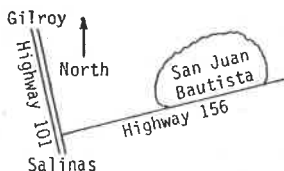
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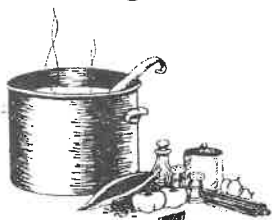




Stir The Bucket With Betty

I've collected some favorite recipes to share with you this month. They provide a nice change of pace for an evening or weekend meal.



CHEESE PUFFS

- 2 oz. Cheddar cheese, shredded
- 2 Tbsp. cream cheese
- 2 Tbsp. green onion, minced
- 2 tsp. margarine
- 1 tsp. Worcestershire sauce
- 1/8 tsp. garlic powder
- 1 egg white
- 2 oz. French bread, cut into eight 1/4 oz. slices, then cut into halves

In small saucepan combine first six ingredients and cook over medium heat, stirring frequently, until mixture is smooth and thickened, 2 to 3 minutes. Remove from heat and cool to room temperature. Preheat oven to 400° F. Using electric mixer at high speed, in small bowl beat egg white until stiff but not dry; gently fold cheese mixture into beaten white. Dip bread halves into cheese mixture, coating all sides and using all of the cheese mixture; transfer to non-stick baking sheet and bake until puffed and lightly browned; 8 to 10 minutes.

MULLIGATAWNY SOUP

- 12 cloves garlic, minced
 - 2 1-inch pieces fresh ginger, peeled and chopped
 - 1 tsp. each: ground cumin, cayenne pepper, ground coriander, and black pepper
 - 1/2 tsp. each: turmeric and curry powder
 - 2 Tbsp. water
 - 4 Tbsp. vegetable oil
 - 1 lb. lean ground beef (chicken or turkey may be substituted)
 - 1 large onion, chopped
 - 2 qts. chicken stock
 - 4 Tbsp. uncooked brown rice
 - 6 Tbsp. cornstarch
 - 1/2 cup water
 - 2 Tbsp. each: lemon and lime juice
- For garnish:
coriander or mint sprigs
fried onion rings

Combine the garlic, ginger, cumin, cayenne pepper, coriander, black pepper, turmeric and curry powder with 2 Tbsp. water and mash into a coarse paste. In large pot heat oil over medium heat. Add ground beef, onion and spice paste and cook 15 minutes or until all of the meat is well browned. Add stock and rice and bring to a boil. In a small cup blend cornstarch and water until smooth. Add to soup and stir constantly to reheat to boiling. Cover, reduce heat and simmer 40 minutes. Add lemon and lime juices. Stir well and serve hot in small bowls for an appetizer or over bowls of white rice for a main course dish. Garnish with coriander or mint sprigs and crispy, fried onion rings.

CAESAR SALAD

1 clove garlic
 3/4 cup olive oil or other salad oil
 2 cups cubes of dry French bread
 2 large heads romaine lettuce
 1/2 tsp. salt
 freshly ground pepper
 2 eggs, boiled 1 minute and cooled
 juice of one large lemon
 6 to 8 anchovy fillets, chopped
 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese

Crush garlic in a small bowl, add oil and let stand several hours. Brown bread cubes in 1/4 cup of garlic oil in a frying pan over medium heat, stirring often. Tear romaine into a large salad bowl, sprinkle with salt and grind over a generous amount of pepper. Pour over remaining garlic oil and mix until every leaf is glossy. Break the eggs into the salad; squeeze over the lemon juice and mix thoroughly. Add anchovies and grated cheese and mix again. Add croutons, mix gently and serve. Serves 12.

RED HOT APPLES

1 cup pineapple juice
 1/4 cup red hots
 3 or 4 shakes red food coloring
 1/4 cup sugar or 1 tsp. artificial sweetener
 4 winesap apples
 1/4 cup pecans
 1/4 cup raisins
 1/4 cup small marshmallows

In deep round or square glass dish microwave juice, red hots, coloring and sugar on HIGH for 2 minutes. Core apples from stem to within 1/2" of end. Remove 1" of skin around stem. Place cut side down in red syrup. Cover with plastic wrap and microwave on HIGH for 2 minutes. Turn apples over, baste and cover. Cook on HIGH for 8 minutes. Fill centers of hot apples with nuts, raisins and marshmallows. Cover and let stand for 5 minutes. Allow 2 minutes cooking time for each apple.

'ROUND' ABOUT

Lately, I've had several dancers ask about the Phase Rating System. What it means? How can it help the dancers and teachers? How can dancers understand the System devised by a teachers' organization?

Phase Rating is a "scale of difficulty": one to six, with six being the most difficult Phase (Level). When dances are Phase Rated, it means that they contain no more than two figures from the next "highest" Phase. Therefore, a Phase III dance should be teachable to dancers who understand and dance all of the figures of Phase III, and it may also encompass two figures from Phase IV.

Perhaps these are popular figures: drag hesitation, cross hesitation, back passing change, and the dancer may have already learned the figures, or he may have to learn only one or two more figures to get through the dance. Even when a dancer has danced all of the Phase III figures, he may not be comfortable with every figure in the Phase.

Phase III is a rather high hurdle to achieve. It includes many rhythms: Cha Cha, Fox Trot, Jive, Rumba, Samba, Syncopation, and Tango. Somehow, the Waltz rhythm was omitted, so, the Viennese and other more difficult Waltz figures aren't required. The Viennese rhythms seem to have been omitted from all Phase levels! Thank goodness, for it isn't an easy rhythm to master.

To date, the round dancers haven't been as self conscious about Phase ability as the square dancers are about Mainstream, Plus, A-1, A-2 and the whole Challenge field. If we were to try to draw parallels, we might say MS = Phase I, Plus = Phase II, A-1 = Phase III, A-2 = Phase IV, C-1 = Phase V, and C-2, 3, & 4 = Phase VI. The



learning and development time would be about the same to reach the top levels of both round and square dancing.

As often happens, some students have a slower learning time than other, and some students are more ambitious to achieve, not withstanding that some are trying to achieve beyond their talents or experience level. It happens in all activities.

Answering the questions of the opening paragraph: 1. Phase Rating is a well planned program to aid in teaching dances of a suitable level to a specific group of dancers. It limits the "excess learning" of basics while teaching a dance routine.

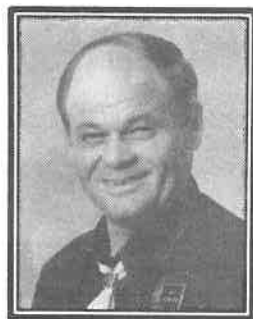
2. If the teachers recognize the purpose of the rating, they should not try to over extend the time required to teach the routine. And, conversely, the student shouldn't be embarrassed or leave the teaching circle due to the lack of basic knowledge required to learn a particular dance.

3. Most important is the requirement that teachers publicize and explain the benefits of the learning sequence. Most square dance callers do publish lists of MS, Plus, and other dance calls used in each level of dancing.

Definition

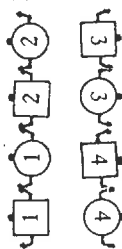
(CALLERLAB April 1984) Starting formation: Any general line or wave. Centers step forward while the ends slide sideways until they

are adjacent.

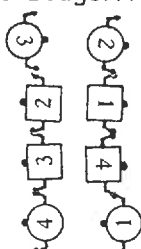

Dancing Hints

Step & Slide is another of the Advanced calls with a LOT of versatility. Though very quick to execute, the variety of possible starting and ending formations can create some SIGNIFICANT difficulty if you do not recognize your own starting position.

Center dancers have a slightly more important part with this call because they must move forward

very 'crisply' to allow dancing space for an end that will occupy that center's 'spot' immediately behind that center. When you are a center dancer, you will have both hands joined at the start of the call; and the end dancer nearest to you will be 'the slider' who will complete the call in your original starting position. You must quickly execute your 'step forward' action



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to allow the adjacent end dancer the proper 'real estate' to complete the call. Additionally, you WILL NOT always complete this call alongside another dancer (Example #3), therefore you must avoid any 'flowing' or turning motion to either side -- the best 'secret' is to step straight forward and hold this position precisely.

End dancers at the start of the call will have only one hand joined and must execute their 'sliding action' toward that joined hand.

When you are an end dancer, you are in an excellent position to gently assist the center dancer next to you (if that center NEEDS help) by slightly delaying your sliding motion until the center has moved forward. One more point for end dancers -- the 'sliding action' is executed without changing facing direction, you accomplish your part by sliding (without turning) into the position vacated by the original adjacent center dancer.

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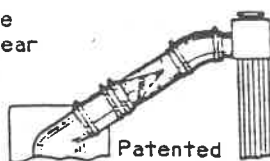
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CHALLENGE



★ CORNER

Last month, we published an article by Kip Garvey which was a response from CALLERLAB about one of my previous articles. There have been numerous dancer and caller responses to this article.

Most dancer responses indicate that they do not understand what the article or the problem is all about. Most of the callers I have talked to do understand the problem and agree that CALLERLAB has again done a less than adequate job of dealing with it. One comment was that "as usual, they took a problem and, in an attempt to solve it, made it more confusing than it was to start with."

While I may be "in error, and misinformed", at least it was nice to find someone who used almost the exact words I have used to describe the committee work of CALLERLAB in the past. Most of us who have seen a "committee-designed" swing can understand the problem.

Before addressing some of Kip's comments, let me try to state the problem as I, in addition to several prominent members of CALLERLAB, see it. First, it is generally conceded that square dance classes take too long to teach. This is especially true in other areas of the country where the available teaching time is even shorter than is here due to seasonal and lifestyle considerations. Second,

many dancers and callers alike have complained that there are too many figures that a dancer has to know to enjoy our activity and to be able to go to various conventions at a local and national level. There are various other problems involving quarterlies and so on, but those two things are the basic problems.

The fact that this complaint existed in 1972, even though less true then than now, when there were only 75 figures you needed to know, gives you an idea of how really overwhelming the current list or lists of figures are to the "average" dancer. CALLERLAB has managed to provide great assistance in turning that list of 75 into about 150 figures at this writing. If you buy the scam of reducing the numbers of items by creating families and giving them alphabetical designations, there is some ocean-front property in Arizona I would like to sell you! This is a good(?) example of committee work. The above is among the reasons given as to why we are losing or not getting more people into the square dance activity.

According to CALLERLAB members who WERE at the meeting, the vote discussed in the last article was, if not ignored, at least misinterpreted by the committee and the Board of Governors involved in producing this new list, program, or whatever you wish to call it!

The way it was told to me, was that the intent was to come up with a NEW list including calls from the Mainstream and Plus lists that could be taught in 25 weeks with the intent that it would become THE required program for square dancers everywhere and that this list would consist of the most popular, and/or most used, calls from the current Mainstream and Plus lists. From what I have seen and heard, this was not truly accomplished!

Although our editor has already commented on some of the things Kip said, I will comment further. You knew I would. First, I don't think that I have ignored the

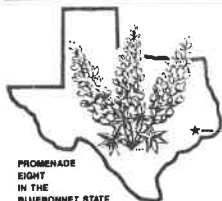

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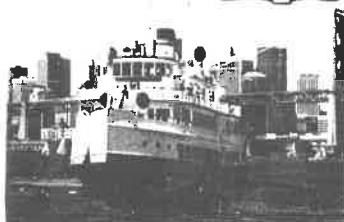


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HIGHLAND SWING!

OUTSIDE OPINION

Above all else, square dancing should be "fun" for those who participate. Of course, individuals need to "knuckle under" by conforming to dress code, making sure they have not used garlic or alcohol before dancing, and agreeing to "listen to the caller". But that does not mean that one should not speak up when he feels there is a better way to do something.

At the conclusion of this move people are in position and are SMILING rather than frowning and apologizing.

It is my opinion that beginners should be taught the Highland Swing rather than the basic Do Sa Do. Let's get over our stuffiness and get into the FLOW!

Somewhere, somehow there is a lot of prejudice against the Highland Swing (or Highland Fling) as opposed to the traditional Do Sa Do. Good callers are forever singing the praises of "Flow" and that good dancing is not "jerking" but is smooth. I'm for that! And to show that I really am, I have to say that the basic Do Sa Do is the jerkiest, most clumsy, most embarrassing move in square dancing. Going forward it is all right, but going backward throws off timing, almost always demands apologies for bumping and makes one feel forever an amateur.

I don't want to make my caller friends angry -- but I do think they need to recognize that most dancers do the Highland Swing-- which probably indicates that they prefer it over the basic move. If that is so, then perhaps callers should argue for a change when they attend CALLERLAB meetings. Really, I don't think the basic Do Sa Do is etched in stone.

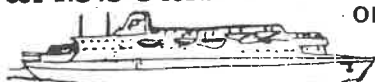
Another time I'll tell you that I don't think much of the basic Promenade either -- it is the second most clumsy and staid movement in square dancing.

On the other hand, moving forward, making a smooth swing and moving back into position is FLOW! It's SMOOTH! It's FUN! When the female partner stands, hip to hip, and leans back slightly, it makes a beautiful and fun turn.

I am reminded of the basketball coaches who for years disciplined players who tried to shoot at the basket with only one hand on the ball. And, for an even longer time, players were not allowed to shoot free throws with one hand. Tsk tsk!

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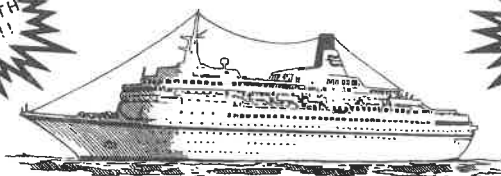
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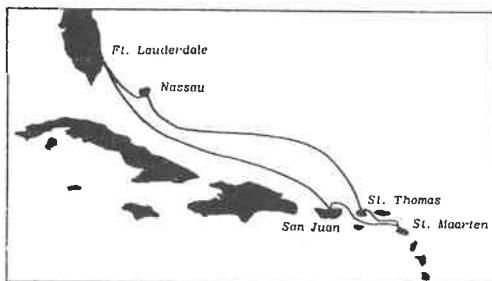

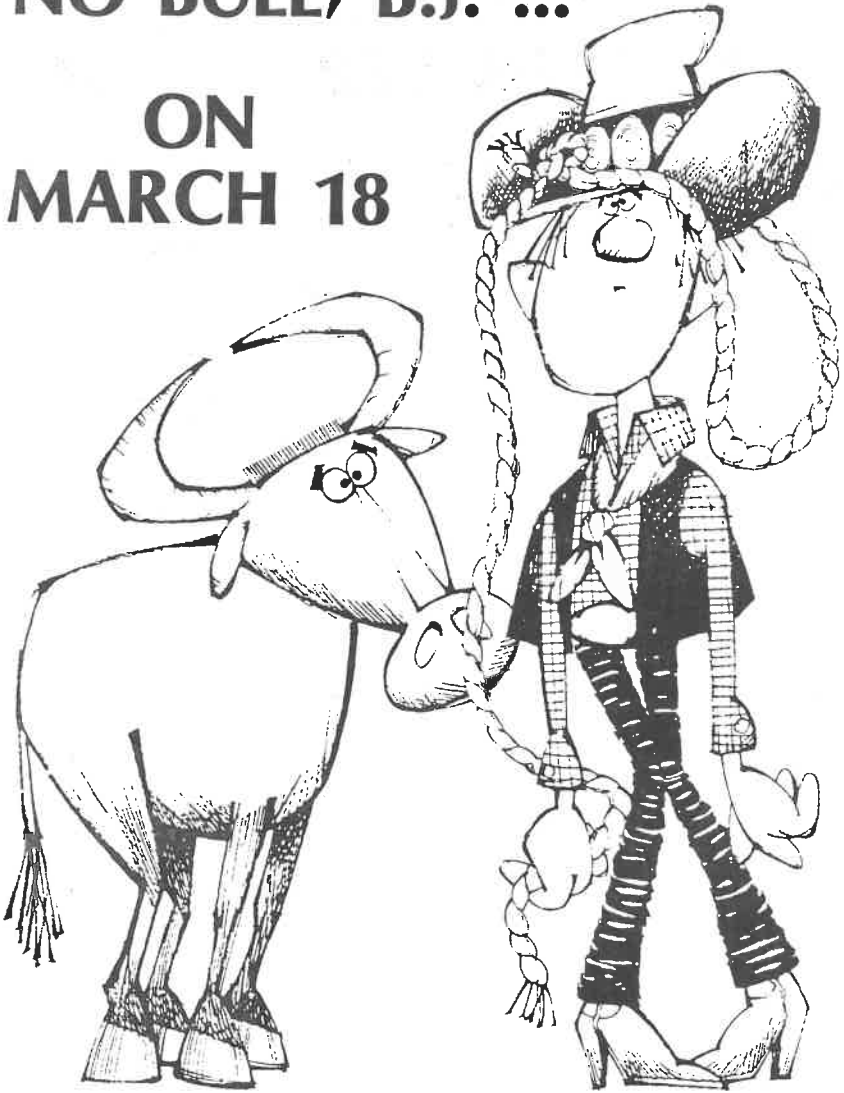

With the beginning of the new year, our club is going "full steam

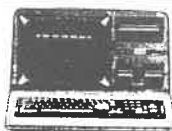

nature of committee work. I think that these committees and the selection of the people who are on them are the root of the problems that CALLERLAB is causing rather than solving. I thought our goal was to please the dancers, not the callers! I feel that the only viable method to select figures for this list is to count the usage of figures at the National Convention as well as state and local conventions and let the chips fall where they may on how the list comes out. What is being called at these events is what the dancer needs to know, not what some committee thinks they need to know. Most callers, including myself, don't even really know what figures they called at a dance last night and how many times they used each figure, but the dance tapes won't lie -- or guess.

I really hope that Kip does not honestly believe that what is happening in the Mainstream and Plus areas, and the dancers who are being lost there, has no direct effect on Advanced and Challenge dancing. If any of the Board or Executive Committee of CALLERLAB really believe this, we are in greater trouble than I imagined.

I have not heard of any 25 week learn-to-dance program in our area, but maybe there is an underground group of callers using such a program that I do not know exists. There are a lot of other callers I have asked that do not know of its existence either.

Finally, I agree completely with

all the suggestions he made in the next to last paragraph of his article.

New subject: Recently, some very good friends of mine whom I taught to dance in 1976 have had to stop dancing due to a back problem of hers that is aggravated by square dancing.

There are few people I can point to who have contributed more to square dancing, especially in the Advanced and Challenge areas than Mel and Nancy Bradley.

They expended great effort to go from beginner to C-4 dancers during their dancing career, and for this they have been greatly respected. I respect them even more for their pleasant, helpful, and positive attitude towards square dancing and other dancers, and their willingness to assist anyone who asked for their help in progressing to the higher levels of Challenge, including at least one dumb caller. They ignored our mistakes and helped us overcome them.

Mel and Nancy have worked tirelessly over the years for the Jubilee, P.A.C.E. and the Almaden Squares. Fortunately, we may have to miss them as dancers, but we won't have to miss them as friends. When you go into the Advanced and Challenge halls at the Jubilee this year and see the "beloved wall" and enjoy the best sound these halls ever had, be sure and find Mel and Nancy and thank them. They'll be camped with the Almaden Squares.

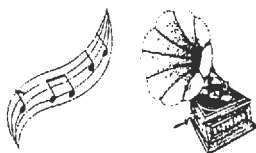

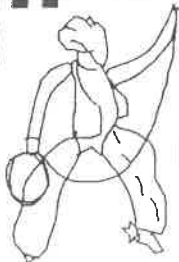

said in effect that mangled or delayed mail was NOT a problem with the Post Office's equipment or techniques, but rather was caused by "mail being insecurely enveloped or containing bulky contents". The strong implication was that the problems with delayed or damaged mail was not the fault of the Post Office, but rather caused by the "packaging" not meeting the requirements of the postal equipment. We have solved that problem with The Prompter... we just don't use any "packaging", not even a "plain brown wrapper". It'll be interesting to see what happens to the mail delivery with this new postal facility... stay tuned...

It's about time for my "annual pitch" for The Prompter bus trip to Reno. The Silver State Square

Dance Festival is scheduled for the "World's Biggest Little City" on May 1-3, 1987. The Prompter is again running its annual bus trip to the Festival (see ad in this issue). 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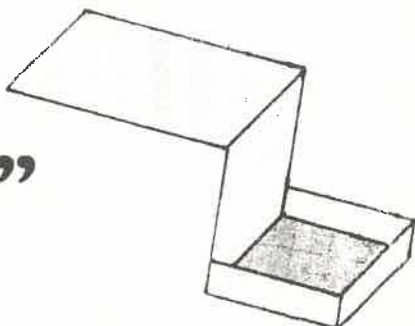
