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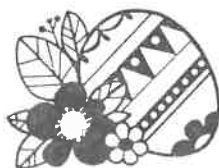
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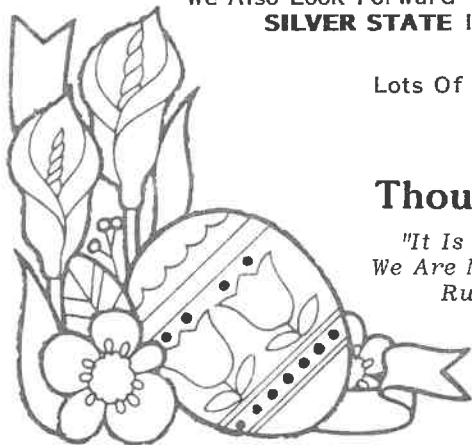
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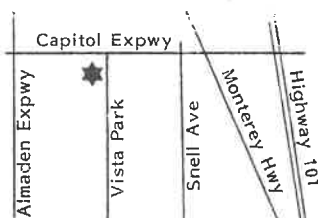
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"OUR" OPINION !

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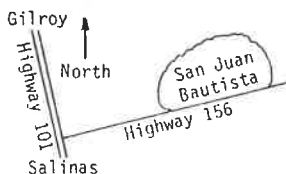

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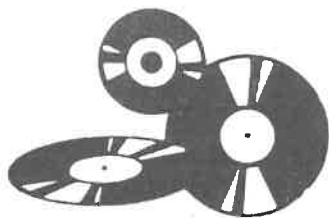
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WHAT'S NEW!!

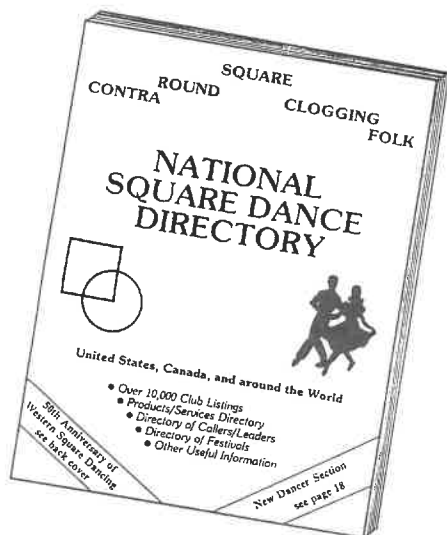


This item is not new but one you comfortable shoe hunters may not know about. It's the jazz-acroballet shoe. A very soft leather with a full sole of split leather, a very low heel, and a narrow instep strap with a buckle. It comes in white and pink and, best of all, is only about \$18.00!!

Do you carry an extra pair of pantyhose or pettipants in your purse? How many times have you wished you did?! Here is an idea: we found some cute little draw-string bags in a boutique shop. They were silk screened with flowers but could be embroidered or appliqued, or just made of a pretty print. A 5" by 6½" bag is just right for pantyhose... a little larger would work for pettipants and then we'd be prepared!

Have you seamstresses seen the newest laborsaving gadget? It's a giant, clear acrylic ruler, 18" thick, so it's quite solid, 5" wide and 24" long with various, helpful lines and markings on it. But, the best thing about it is a lip edge on one end that hooks on the edge of the table. Lay it on your fabric, catch it on the table edge, then cut away with a wheel cutter and you have a real time saver for all your straight line cuts such as ruffles.

We have two new books this month. The annual National Square Dance Directory of square, round, contra, clogging, and folk dancing with over 10,000 club listings. (Don't forget, to be in it, someone must send your listing to them.) This year a Crafts Section has been added. It includes lots of hints and ideas for square dance sewing, including an easy skirt liner and a quick way to gather ruffles with elastic.



The second book is the "'Illesstrated' Country Western Dances" by Paul Illes (thus the 'Illesstrated' in the title). He presents directions and good diagrams and pictures of eleven Country Western line dances, including the "Texas Freeze" (Elvira), "Duchess" and "Chocolate City" hustles and one that sounds very intriguing, the "Tush Push"!!

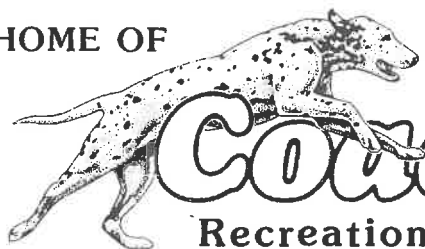

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'ROUND' ABOUT

Perhaps the most difficult "science" in the "art" of dancing is to be a GOOD LEADER and for the woman to be a good follower. Sometimes the leading does revert to the female gender and the man has to follow.

The single most important requirement for the leader is to be "confident in the purpose of leading". If you can't make up "your" mind what to lead, how can you expect your partner to follow. Uncertainty is the most common cause for the female to assume the leading role. Face it, if the woman doesn't get a good strong lead, she will develop a "take over" attitude.

A man just cannot lead unless he knows what to do. The first consideration in leading is to "know the dance".

Following is the lady's responsibility. Some say the woman learns the figures more quickly than the partner. Perhaps so, but the lady MUST NOT usurp the lead. The lady has the obligation to maintain the contact, or resistance, to feel the lead signals from her partner. There is no leading through a "limp arm".

Posture and position are necessary for good leading results. If the lady "drapes" herself all over the man, he will need a "handle" or a "halter" to get his lead signals to work.

The three major tools in leading are: arm position and contact, body position and contact, and "eye attention". As long as the man has at least one of these tools, he should be an effective leader. When performing a Solo Waltz Roll, all leading tools are lost when the dancers are in a "back to back" condition. It's strictly "automatic pilot" for two beats.

Leading also involves "traffic control". For the most part, the man will find himself facing LOD



and can observe the traffic problems. Good leading to the outside of the circle will create space in front of his partner, while leading to the inside will shorten the space and offer a fine position to 'overtake' the slower couple.

In round dancing, we are all doing the same steps at the same time, but, some people use smaller steps, some people tend to "under turn", and so, we do experience traffic problems. In this area, the lady can be of great help if she can communicate an approaching problem so the man can make the lead to avoid a bumping situation. In Ballroom dancing, the problem is most severe and requires constant attention.

Leading doesn't have to be "brutal" to work, subtle pressures and arm moves can create the signals without erratic or brash moves. In all cases, twirls, swing, lariats, etc., if the arm is raised, the lady will go under. If the arm is low she can't make the proper move. Swing dancing is a very fine point of the arm position being a "lead" as to the underarm or throwaway action.

Be receptive to criticism. Try dancing with another partner and asking for an evaluation of your "lead". Your partner may be unable to locate the faults. The lady can also try dancing with another partner to ask for an evaluation of her ability to "follow". Respect whatever comments are made and try to improve your leading or following techniques. And, you can always discuss the problem with your teacher!

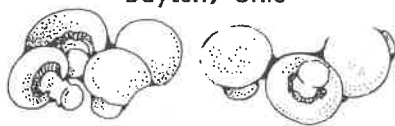
SAVORY MUSHROOM TARTS

- 1 egg
 - $\frac{1}{4}$ cup finely chopped onion
 - 1 (10 $\frac{3}{4}$ oz.) can cream of mushroom soup
 - $\frac{1}{2}$ cup shredded Monterey Jack or Swiss cheese
 - 2 Tbsp. minced parsley
 - $\frac{1}{4}$ cup sherry, wine or milk
 - 5 slices bacon
 - $\frac{1}{4}$ lb. fresh mushrooms, sliced
- pastry for two-crust pie

Mix egg, onion, soup, cheese, parsley, and sherry in a small bowl. Cook bacon until crisp, drain and crumble. Reserve 2 tablespoons bacon drippings. Add mushrooms to drippings and cook until limp. Stir bacon and mushrooms into soup mixture. On lightly floured surface, roll pastry to $\frac{1}{16}$ ". With $2\frac{1}{2}$ "

cutter, make 36 rounds from dough. Press pastry into small muffin pans to fit. Spoon 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ tablespoons mushroom mixture into each shell. Bake at 400° F. for 20 minutes until pastry is brown. May be made ahead and frozen. Yields 36 tarts.

CHICKEN BREASTS IN SOUR CREAM-ALMOND SAUCE

- 4 to 6 whole chicken breasts, halved, boned and skinned
- 3 Tbsp. butter
- 2 Tbsp. chopped onion
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 1 Tbsp. tomato paste
- 2 Tbsp. all-purpose flour
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cups chicken stock
- 3 Tbsp. dry sherry
- 3 Tbsp. shredded almonds
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. minced fresh tarragon
- salt and freshly ground pepper
- $\frac{3}{4}$ cup sour cream at room temperature
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup grated Gruyère cheese

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Sauté the chicken on both sides in butter, remove from the skillet. Add the onion and garlic, cook and stir for 2 to 3 minutes. Add tomato paste and flour to skillet, stir until blended and smooth. Gradually add the chicken stock and sherry, cook and stir until smooth and slightly thickened. Return the chicken to the skillet. Add the almonds, tarragon, salt and pepper to taste. Cover and simmer over low heat for 30 minutes or until tender. Arrange the chicken in a shallow baking dish. Stir the sour cream into sauce and pour over chicken. Sprinkle with grated cheese and brown under broiler. Serve with rice or noodles.

Nut Crust

$1\frac{1}{2}$ cups finely chopped walnuts
1 Tbsp. all-purpose flour
 $\frac{1}{4}$ cup margarine, softened
 $\frac{1}{4}$ cup sugar



Mud-Fudge Filling

$\frac{1}{2}$ cup margarine, softened
1 cup sugar
3 eggs
2 oz. unsweetened chocolate,
melted and cooled
 $\frac{1}{3}$ cup all-purpose flour (unsifted)
 $1\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. vanilla
 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. baking powder
 $\frac{1}{8}$ tsp. salt

For crust, chop nuts in food processor or by hand. Add flour, margarine and sugar. Mix well and press over bottom and sides (but not rim) of 9" pie pan. For filling, mix all filling ingredients until smooth and pour into nut crust. Bake at 325° F. for 35 - 45 minutes. (Filling will appear slightly moist when done.) Delicious served warm or cool with whipped cream or vanilla ice cream. Yields 8 servings

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CHALLENGE



★ CORNER

Did you ever wonder how the figures on the current Advanced and Challenge lists got there in the first place? While there have been a few alterations in these lists since the concept of the lists started, most of the figures were selected by a small group of callers who were prominent in the early Challenge days B.O.L. (Before Official Lists).

B.O.L. there were informal lists of figures that developed from the continued usage of figures that had been written or were being written at that time. In the 60's and 70's there was a great proliferation of figures, many of which are still being danced today. Many a caller burned the midnight oil trying to come up with a better figure or elaborate on an already written figure.

When the figure Rotary Tag was written, about twenty-five variations on it were written within the next month. This was true of many figures written then and is still true to some extent today. Most of these figures are never given much, if any, use and they are relegated to various square dance figure dictionaries, a fact that is fortunate for all of us.

Many of these figures while not used in regular club dancing were being used in clubs that were called "experimental", or even Advanced. These clubs were usually "closed" or "invitational" only and you generally had to go to a special class to even be eligible to be invited to the club. I was in such a club in 1964 (no, I'm not as old as B.D.) and we had to learn such figures as Follow Your Neighbor, Wheel Thru, Run, Island Chain, Chain the Glade, and so forth to get into the club. The class I went to had a seventy-five per cent attrition rate. Back then, if you called Run at a Saturday night dance, you could expect the floor to break down.

It was about that time that a young man named Larry Ward appeared on the scene and started several groups -- the B-Sharps. I already had, at the time, a group called the Acey-Deuceys.

More time passed and more figures were written -- sometimes at the rate of thirty to forty a month. In the Bay Area some will remember a group called the Little Mores. Also, there was the Top Eights, but Bob Fisk was the caller

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then. The Almaden Squares was a group in the early seventies that was dancing the standard "seventy-five" plus about forty of the more popular experimentals of the time. Also, Callers Choice started about that time with Dick Houlton.

The trick for the callers was to keep abreast of what were the most popular figures and when some should be dropped and when new ones should be added. To aid in this, various callers and dancers produced informal lists that could be passed around or carried from one end of the country to the other, as it is generally conceded that the heavy Challenge dancing was being done mostly in the New England area at that time. Even today, most of the callers brought in by P.A.C.E. are from the Eastern part of the country.

Eventually, when CALLERLAB began, the need was seen to establish some official lists that would be ongoing so dancers would be able to dance in all areas of the country as "experimentals" did vary some from one part to another. The

"guys" (sorry, Honey) got together at CALLERLAB and out came the official lists.

Was there any real rhyme or reason to the way the figures were selected? In most cases there was. At that time, I was given a set of lists by Bob Fisk, the pages of which were simply titled: "The Most Used Figures of Challenge Dancing", "The Next Most Used", and so on down to "The Least Most Used".

It was interesting to note, at the time, that most of the figures on the "most used" list were placed on the Advanced list. The rest progressed upwards towards C-4, which became kind of a catch-all category for figures that were not selected for one of the lower levels. Some of the "most used" are even on the Plus list today, i.e. Follow Your Neighbor.

These recollections, while they may not be perfect regarding exact times and events (in case K.G. reads this), are close to the way things developed with the Advanced and Challenge lists that we use today. See you in a Star Tip!

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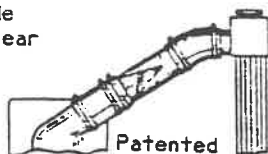

Definition

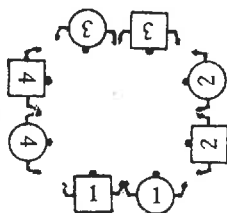

each other. Ends in couples back-to-back.

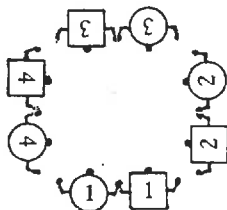
(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #594.)

Dancing Hints

Curly Cross was added to the Advanced List in 1983 (from the previous Plus 2 List) due primarily to its lack of usage at Plus dances. The move requires execution of a very exact Curlique (without extra 'flow' or turning motion); and a very rapid recognition of "Who

must pull by". Additionally, the dancers executing the Pull By must be aware that 'the ending couples that are back-to-back' must (at Advanced) be the same couples who started the move (see Example #3).

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MAINSTREAM QUARTERLY SELECTION

Daryl Clendenin, Chairman of the CALLERLAB Mainstream Quarterly Selection Committee, is pleased to announce that **Connect Four** is the Mainstream Quarterly Selection for the period beginning April 1, 1987.

CONNECT FOUR

Definition:

From a column: The number two dancer in each column moves out and forward to stand beside the number one dancer. Then this couple does a Wheel & Deal. At the same time, the number three and four dancers move forward to from

a momentary box of four, then do a Walk & Dodge. Ends in an Eight Chain Thru formation. Timing: 6 beats.

Singing Call Figure:

Heads Promenade Half, Down the Middle Square Thru Four, Right & Left Thru, Veer Left, Wheel & Deal, Sweep 1/4 More, Touch 1/4, **Connect Four**, Swing the Corner, Promenade.

The current Quarterly Selections for Mainstream are: Scoot & Relocate, Scoot Back 1 1/2, and Connect Four. For Plus: Spin Chain & Exchange the Gears.



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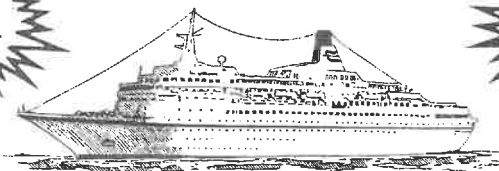
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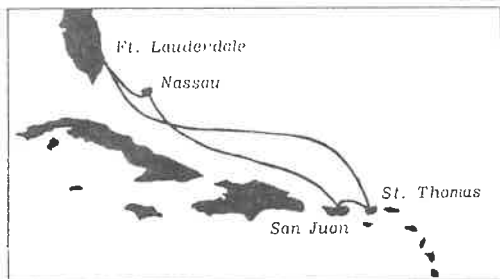

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THE LANGUAGE OF SQUARE DANCE PROGRAMMING

There seems to be a great deal of variety, and some confusion, regarding the designation of dance programs throughout the square dance world. At conventions, festivals, club dances, and in various publicity releases and publications, one sees program designations such as MS+, MS Plus, MSQS, Soft Plus, etc. What do these terms mean? Does MS+ indicate that the dancers should know some of the Plus Program? If so, which part? Or does it mean that, in addition to Mainstream Program dancing, there will be some sort of added attraction? The MS Plus designation is similarly vague and confusing.

Terms such as Soft Plus really tell us nothing, since the "soft" part, like beauty, is in the eye of the beholder (or, probably, the caller for the evening). When one sees the MSQS designation, he probably assumes that the dancer will be expected to know something about Quarterly Selections. However, does that mean all Quarterly Selections, only the current Quarterly Selection, or something else?

Even more important is the fact that the Quarterly Selection Program was never intended to be a regular dance program. The latest publication of the CALLERLAB Basic and Mainstream Programs makes that clear with this statement: "There is no program called Mainstream Quarterly Selections Program. Those experimental calls are intended for use in mainstream Workshops. No dancer is required to know the QS calls to attend a MS open dance. If such calls are used, the caller is to teach them if necessary. Please advertise dance programs as MS not MSQS."

Proper program designations

-April 1987-

help dancers find that dance where they can be most comfortable and can have the greatest enjoyment. Program designations also tell callers the program they are expected to call. We need to be more specific and careful in designating dance programs, and club officers and dancers need to be more insistent that callers adhere to the advertised program. Use of vague and incorrect programming language leads to confusion and frustration. Use of the proper terms aids both dancers and callers.

The correct program designations are shown below. Dancers should be able to dance, in accordance with their definitions, the number of basics or movements shown. All lists are current as of February 2, 1987.

Basic Program (B): Numbers 1 through 49 on the CALLERLAB Program approved 4/18/84.

Mainstream Program (MS): Numbers 1 through 68 on the CALLERLAB Program approved 4/18/84.

Plus (+): The Mainstream Program and the 27 calls on the CALLERLAB Plus Program approved 4/18/84.

Advanced One (A-1): The Mainstream and Plus Programs and the 38 calls on the CALLERLAB A-1 Program approved 9/85.

Advanced Two (A-2): The Mainstream and Plus Programs plus the 78 calls on the CALLERLAB A-2 Program approved 9/85.

Basic Challenge (C-1): The Mainstream, Plus, Advanced and the 64 calls on the CALLERLAB C-1 Program approved 11/85.

Extended Challenge (C-2): The Mainstream, Plus, Advanced, C-1 and the 76 calls on the CALLERLAB C-2 Program approved 12/85.

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CATEGORIES OF CALLERLAB AFFILIATION

CALLERLAB has several types of membership as well as a number of ways in which non-members can become affiliated with the organization. In some instances, the difference from one category to another may be quite small. That, and the fact that the word "member" sometimes is tacked on incorrectly to the name of a non-member category, causes confusion.

To be a MEMBER of CALLERLAB, a caller must be an active caller, subscribe to the CALLERLAB Code of Ethics, pay dues, and attend the annual CALLERLAB Convention at least once every four years (eight years for overseas members). An active caller is defined as one who calls an average of at least one full dance each week and at least 50 dances each year. To qualify for membership, a caller must have been an active caller for the three (3) most recent years. The requirement to be an active caller is waived as a requirement for continuing full membership for those callers who have been members in good standing for eight consecutive years.

ASSOCIATES are callers who have been dues-paid members in good standing for three or more years, have attended three or more annual CALLERLAB conventions, and who have, for one reason or another, dropped out of active calling. Upon request, this category of membership is granted to individuals whose interest and experience in caller leadership makes it advantageous to retain their expertise in CALLERLAB. Associates may not seek office or

vote in elections.

A GOLD CARD HOLDER is a special category of CALLERLAB affiliation. The gold card is presented to selected individuals who have served CALLERLAB in an outstanding and meritorious fashion. The Gold Card Holder is entitled to all privileges and benefits of active membership. To date, three (3) Gold Card Memberships have been awarded.

THERE ARE NO OTHER CATEGORIES OF MEMBERSHIP. The category closest to that of a member is the SUBSCRIBER. This caller meets all the requirements of full membership except physical attendance at an annual CALLERLAB convention. He or she receives CALLERLAB publications, participates in discussions and polls, and is included in the CALLERLAB insurance program. The Subscriber cannot vote in elections and can serve only on the Subscriber Committee although input from subscribers is actively solicited in straw ballots. Upon attendance at an annual CALLERLAB convention and payment of the established dues, the Subscriber becomes a full member. This category frequently suffers from the incorrect use of the term "Subscriber Member", which is akin to saying "Non-member Member".

When a caller receives a nomination for membership in CALLERLAB, his or her name is entered on the roster. The candidate's qualifications are then ascertained by personal letter and, if qualified and appropriate, an invitation to attend the annual CALLERLAB Convention is issued.

The name remains on that list until the caller takes action to have it removed, or other circumstances make it clear that the name should not remain on the roster. Callers in this category may become subscribers or members as established above.

At the annual CALLERLAB Convention held in Phoenix, Arizona in 1985, the members voted, almost unanimously, to add a new category of CALLERLAB affiliation -- the CALLERLAB APPRENTICE. For some time there has been concern that newer, and usually younger, callers who cannot qualify for member or subscriber status do not have ready access to up-to-date information from CALLERLAB. Many of these young callers have expressed a desire to receive CALLERLAB publications and even to attend the convention. The wisdom of providing these future leaders with proper training and guidance is apparent and the action of the membership is in the best interests of square dancing.

The CALLERLAB APPRENTICE is not a member and will not be referred to as such. The CALLERLAB Apprentice may be a caller who does not meet the requirements for membership such as calling 50 dances per year for once a week for the three most recent years. An Apprentice may attend the conventions in a non-voting capacity upon payment of the current fees. An Apprentice gets no vote and may not serve on committees. Conversion to a full member may be requested when, and only when, ALL requirements for full membership are satisfied. If a CALLERLAB Apprentice has attended a convention and subsequently meets our criteria for membership, the Apprentice could convert to full membership upon written application. The Apprentice would be identified with a similar but different badge from the member/subscriber. CALLERLAB Apprentices residing in continental North America will be covered by the same corporate liability insurance policy as are our members and subscribers.

It is hoped that with the category of CALLERLAB Apprentice many additional callers will be able to take advantage of the experience of the outstanding leadership available through CALLERLAB. With the opportunity of attending conventions for Apprentices, additional training will be provided which should result in an overall improvement in the teaching and calling skills of the newer callers.

A recognized callers' organization may become an AFFILIATE organization of CALLERLAB through a chartering process. The organization need not initially have a member of CALLERLAB as one of its members. Within three years, at least one of the members of the affiliated organization must be or become a CALLERLAB member who attends an annual CALLERLAB Convention. Convention attendance requirements are then the same as for members; i.e., once in four (4) four years for organizations in North America and once in eight (8) years for non-North American organizations. The affiliated organizations receive selected CALLERLAB publications and are expected to meet CALLERLAB standards, including subscribing to the CALLERLAB Code of Ethics. The individual members of the affiliated organization have no personal status in CALLERLAB unless they are, in fact, CALLERLAB members, subscribers or apprentices in their own right. Members of Affiliated organizations in the U.S. and Canada who are not members, subscribers or apprentices of CALLERLAB may elect to receive liability insurance by a payment of a specified fee (currently \$20.00 per year in 1987). Affiliate organizations are eligible to receive education grants in accordance with established policies.

This explanation is intended to help our readers understand more clearly the ways in which callers can become partners with CALLERLAB and to encourage all to use proper titles when referring to the various categories of affiliation.

with this move is an extremely PRECISE Curlique. Once you have completed this part of the call, you must be EXACTLY FACING one quarter (90°) to the right of where you started the call. One easy way to accomplish this action is to assure that your LEFT shoulder is now pointing to the wall you were facing when you started.

Once the Curlique is completed, dancers facing each other diagonally ON THEIR SIDE OF THE SET will be required to execute the 'Left Pull By' action. A quick glance at the couple you are facing at the start will assure that if you complete the Curlique facing one of those same dancers, then you must execute the Left Pull By with that dancer.
