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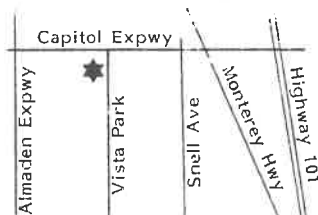
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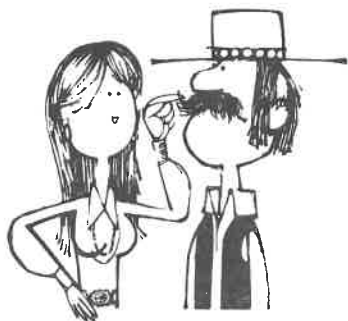

 IF you can do all the above, I'll tell you what to do,
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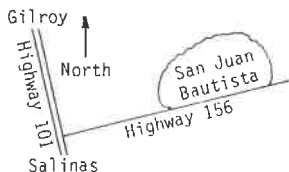

This month's recipes will be perfect for the evenings around the campfires at your next campout or festival. We hope you'll enjoy them!



CLAM SPREAD

- 2 (7 oz.) cans minced clams
(including clam juice)
- 1 tsp. lemon juice
- 1 cube butter
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- ½ green pepper, chopped
- 1 tsp. chopped parsley
- dash of Tabasco
pepper
- ½ cup seasoned bread crumbs*
- ½ cup parmesan cheese

Simmer together clams, clam juice, and lemon juice. In a skillet sauté onion, garlic and green pepper in butter. Add spices, clam mixture and bread crumbs to onion mixture. Pour into buttered pie dish. Sprinkle parmesan cheese on top and bake in 350° F. oven for approximately 30 to 40 minutes. Serve with tortilla chips. *Add more crumbs to obtain desired consistency.

Cook bacon and drain. Grease baking dish and cover bottom of dish with smoked beef. Arrange chicken on top of beef. Arrange bacon on top of chicken. Mix soup and sour cream together. Pour over chicken. Refrigerate for several hours (overnight is okay). Bake in 250° F. oven for 3 hours. Leftovers make great cold chicken sandwiches.

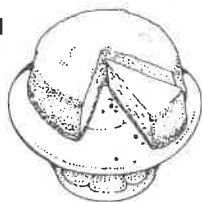
PISTACHIO RUM CAKE

Cake:

- 1 pkg. yellow cake mix
- 1 pkg. pistachio instant pudding
- ½ cup light rum
- ½ cup water
- ½ cup vegetable oil
- 4 eggs

Glaze:

- 1 cup sugar
- 1 cube butter
- ¼ cup light rum
- ¼ cup water



Beat all ingredients together at medium speed for two minutes. Pour into greased bundt pan and bake at 325° F. for 55-60 minutes or until done. During the last 10 minutes of baking, combine glaze ingredients in a medium saucepan. Bring to boil over medium heat and boil, stirring constantly, for 2 to 3 minutes. While glaze is still bubbly, pour directly over cake immediately after removing it from oven. Puncture cake with toothpick to allow glaze to soak in. Cool for 45 minutes before removing from pan.

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'ROUND' ABOUT

ROUND DANCING v.s. SOCIAL BALLROOM "Can It Really Help?"

After a few years of round dancing most couples are experienced to the point where they can "adopt" many of the round dance rhythms and routines into social ballroom dancing very easily. Recognizing the rhythm of the music is a simple matter, then a few "choice" four- or eight-measure sequences from a favorite classic and a current popular dance will suffice to perform some very interesting dancing. Be sure to let your partner know what routine you are "emulating".

"Tango Mannita" for 8 measures followed by 8 measures of "Tango d Ideas". Then 8 from Part B of "Tango Mannita", then the B Part of "d Ideas" makes a very nice 32 measure tango. You can use any round dance routines you are comfortable with. If you feel brave, you can use a more difficult routine, but then it's hard to recover if you goof it up!

If the dance is a fox trot, try using a mix of "My Shy Violet" and the B Part of "Pop Goes the Movies". Small steps will help if the floor is crowded. For rhumba music, try the C Part of "Movies" and "Rhumba Maria". These two dances are also good amalgamations.



Waltz music is very easy to improvise. There are so many four-measure sequences from the classics and popular waltz routines that are easy to "put together". If you have access to some good 33 rpm dance records, Telemark, Roper, or Dancealong 45 rpm, it's quite nice to just practice some good waltzing in a "hash" manner. Hash dancing provides the perfect opportunity to practice the "leading techniques" we discussed in a prior article.

Swing is probably the easiest dance to improvise. Many jitterbug dancers are really improvising the "basic swing" movements as they "feel" the music. Two-step (4/4) music can be improvised by just saying the name of the basics: box, scissors, hitch, and all of the combination basics: half box, scissors thru, hitch/scissors, etc., ad infinitum!!

Have you ever tried "I Wanna Quickstep", or "Continental Goodnight" sequences to other music? They fit quite well! It's a shame to waste the training and talents you have developed in round dancing. You can really enjoy the basics while dancing to other music and have FUN while you are dancing!!

Kind of a burial at Pass the Sea, so to speak. However, this figure was the winner of the evening. It danced well, timed well, no one blew it, and it was the last one taught, whoopee.

The evening ended early so we could have a general business meeting. I think they were all really looking forward to it by then. First time I have seen that kind of enthusiasm for a business meeting in a long time.

Are we having fun yet? It seemed, in spite of the heavy workshop, all had a pretty good time. The turn out at the Pizza house indicated that all were happy (or just drinking it off), but there was lots of chatter. In any event, the club is having open house during the month of May for C-1 dancers and they hope to see you there!

"Reversed Your Flutterwheel Lately?", "We Curlique, Do You?", "I Spin Chain and Exchange My Gears"... these are some of the new, catchy bumper stickers produced by Kurland Manufacturing Company. They're fun... but would a non-square dancer realize that they, and the little dancer decals, are promoting Square Dancing? The square dance world needs all the advertising it can get and we may be missing a bet here.

More new items by Kurland are towels and ties in dusty rose (we've needed this color for a long time), and two tote bags with square dancers on them. If you like Bob Will's style of music, try "Swingin' Side" on Blue Star (2335) by Johnnie Wykoff, and Rhythm has two new releases, both by Wade Driver, "Rocky Mountain Music" (199), and "Ramblin' Man".

Definition

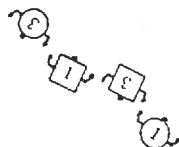
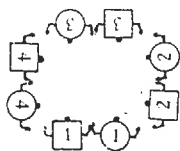
(CALLERLAB April 1984) Starting formation: Facing couples. Similar to Couples Lead Right, except that the dancers drop hands and the original beaus pass right

shoulders with other on the way. Ends in couples back-to back.

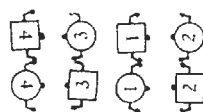
(Callers NOTE: The definition above partially replaces Burleson #222.)

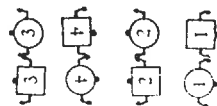
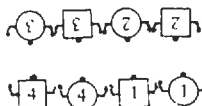
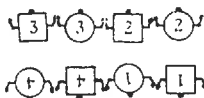

Dancing Hints

Wheel Thru is one of the more versatile and easily-taught Advanced calls. The obvious similarity to the Mainstream call "Couples Lead Right" assures that the majority of dancers will achieve success with Wheel Thru in a minimal time. Even though it is an extremely simple call, there are still some 'secrets to success' for proper execution.

The beau dancers MUST pass right shoulders with each other as

they divide the couple they are facing ("Cut 'Em in Two"). When you are a beau dancer you will always have a left hand 'free' at the start of the call, and you can effectively accomplish your 'right shoulder pass' action with the beau you are facing by extending your left hand and pointing to the space between the couple you are facing where you will divide (cut in two) that couple.

Mac McCall, Chairman of the Plus Quarterly Selection Committee, is pleased to announce that the call **Compress to a Column** has been selected as the Plus Quarterly Selection for the period beginning May 1, 1987. Please note that this call is not to be used as the Plus Quarterly Selection until the week of April 27, 1987.

COMPRESS TO A COLUMN

Starting formation: parallel two-faced lines. The centers facing in Extend (the Tag) to meet each other in the very center and Trade; the centers facing out step ahead and Fold toward the other center; and the ends slide together and Trade. Now, all Extend (the Tag) to form a column. Timing: 6 beats.

Comments: This is an easy teach and feels similar to a Triple Scoot to some dancers. Half sashayed and left-handed arrangements seem to offer little difficulty after a walk-thru.

Singing Call Figure

Side Ladies Chain, Heads Pass the Ocean, Extend the Tag, Swing Thru, Boys Run, **Compress to a Column**, Boys Run, Allemande Left, Swing, Promenade.

The current Plus Quarterly Selections are: Spin Chain & Exchange the Gears, Compress to a Column.

ADVANCED QUARTERLY SELECTIONS

OPEN UP THE COLUMN

From right- or left-hand columns: The number one dancer in the column Cross Clovers, the number two dancer Clovers. The number three and four dancers Circulate ahead, Cast Off 3/4 and Extend the Tag (as in Transfer the Column). This call ends in waves.

Singing Call

Heads Star Thru and Spread, Touch 1/4, **Open Up the Column**, Boys Run, Slide Thru, Square Thru 3/4, Swing and Promenade.

COVER UP

From right- or left-hand waves: All 8 Circulate once and a half. In the center wave, dancers recycle, outsides (in mini-waves) Step Thru and 1/4 In. Ends in starting Double Pass Thru.

Singing Call

Heads Square Thru, Do Sa Do to a Wave, **Cover Up**, Swing Thru, Turn Thru, Swing and Promenade.

The current Advanced Quarterly Selections are: Change Lanes, Checkover, Cover Up, Mini Busy, Open Up the Column.

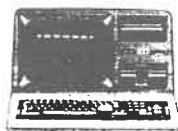

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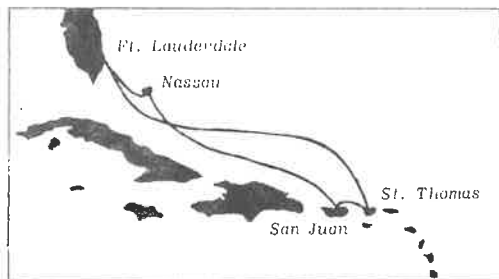
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THU	AT SEA		
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DRESS CODE

Whenever this subject comes up in The Prompter or any other square dance forum, people quickly take sides. One side believing that square dance apparel should be mandatory at all square dance functions; the other side believing that street clothes are appropriate any time. Perhaps there is a more middle-of-the-road solution to this often discussed problem.

Square dancing is, more than anything else, a community of people. In any dealings with people, there are certain rules and etiquette that must be followed. For instance, you wouldn't go to a fancy dress ball wearing jeans and a T-shirt, and conversely, you wouldn't go to a sporting event in an evening gown or tuxedo. These events by custom and common sense have their own dress code. Square dancing likewise has, over the years, developed a dress code. That dress code is more complex than most and this very complexity prompts the controversies and misunderstandings.



Proper square dance attire has changed a lot over the years. In the 1920's when Henry Ford published a book on square dancing, it was illustrated with dancers in full evening wear. It wasn't until 1936, when "Pappy" Lloyd Shaw started the modern square dance movement, that the fluffy skirts and western-style clothes became the standard. This dress code prevails today at the lower levels.

When the Challenge movement started, there were so few dancers that garages were often used as "halls". Traditional square dance attire was too bulky and the garage too dirty. This brought about the relaxing of dress codes. Pants and T-shirts became not only accept-



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able, but the preferred attire due to the precise formations and the distortions that a large, bulky petticoat may cause.

This ambiguity in dress code spurs all the controversy. Some common sense rules should help to clarify the situation:

1. When in Rome do as the Romans do -- if you are visiting a club where you know how they usually dress, dress likewise. It will make you more comfortable and make the club friendlier because they will see that you respect their preferences. If you have doubts, wear traditional square dance attire (petticoats and square dance dresses for women; pants and long-sleeved shirt, often western style, for men).

2. At evening dances and special events dress in the traditional square dance attire (unless otherwise specified) -- evening dances are parties and it is considerate to dress up for a party (rather than dress down).

3. At day dances, where the level is C-1 or above (A-1 and A-2 can go either way), you are probably safe to dress casually, but it is never wrong to dress traditionally.

4. At all times dress neatly-- never dress down for a dance.

Most of this is common sense. Unfortunately, when common sense is not followed by some, organizations need to make rules. PACE finds itself in that position. Just as restaurants can require shoes and shirts, PACE will refuse entrance to dancers who come to the dance in inappropriate dress.

To be more specific:

1. Shorts are not appropriate for an evening dance.

2. Ratty-looking clothing is never appropriate -- especially at evening dances.

3. Square dance apparel is recommended for evening dances.

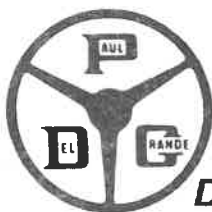
SAN JOSE SEE SAWS by **Isadora & Howie**

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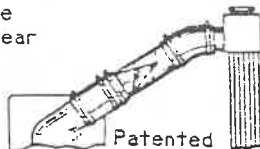

Our annual hoedown this month was a huge success. We want to thank all the folks who came and supported us. And the teen clubs are benefitting as we promised. Although the floor was somewhat

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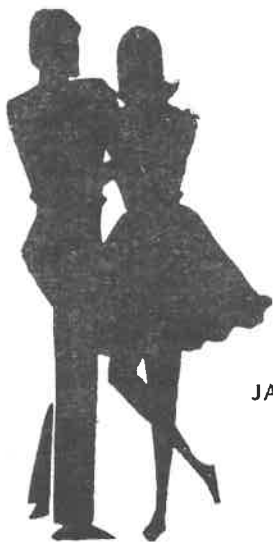
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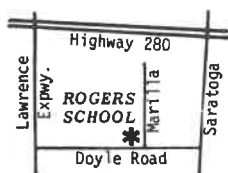

Also, the beau dancers must assure that their actions during the call 'cleanly and crisply' AVOID any contact with the belle dancers that they originally faced. Since this call can occur very quickly (see the example series above), the belle dancer you face may be 'run over or into' unless you delay your action slightly to let that belle know your intended action. This slight delay can be accomplished by 'clapping your hands' and extending your LEFT hand to point to the area you will use to accomplish your part of the call.

The original belle dancers at the start of the call always have a right hand 'free', and they must execute their part of Wheel Thru by (stepping forward slightly, if necessary, and) turning precisely one-quarter (90°) right. When you are 'the belle', you not only 'turn one-quarter right', you also must "adjust" (if necessary) to avoid possible contact or collision with the beau dancer you face. Since

that beau will be passing to your left, you can assure that there is no contact by exaggerating you 'right-face turn' and leaning slightly to your right. This action enlarges the space between you and your partner such that the beau you face will more readily 'see where to go'. Additionally, your 'belle dancer action' must be accomplished in a manner that assures that the ending formation is properly established. YOU have the responsibility to assure that your partner completes 'the beau part' facing the correct direction with the same hand joined both before AND after the call.
