Since I hadn't been successful in locating motel accommodations before leaving for overseas, Betty and I elected to wait and drive to King City early on Saturday. The "jet-lag" problem hit me about 2:30 a.m. on Saturday so I rolled Betty out about 5:00 a.m. and we hit the road a little after 6:00. Even with a stop for breakfast, we made King City around 9:00 with plenty of time before the first tip at 9:30 a.m.

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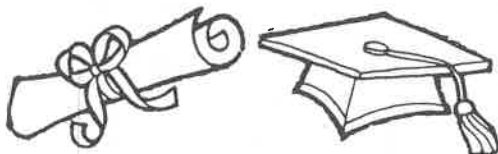
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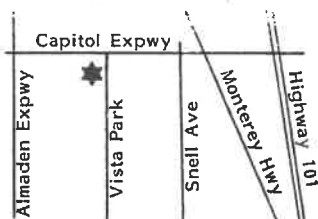
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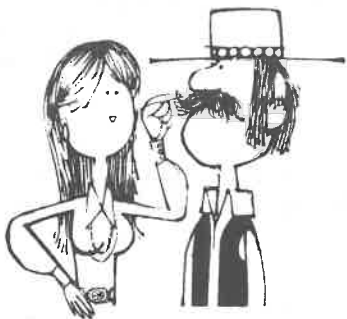
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"OUR" OPINION !

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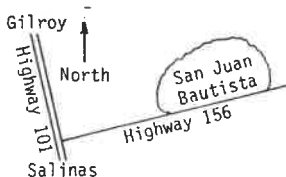
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We Get Letters

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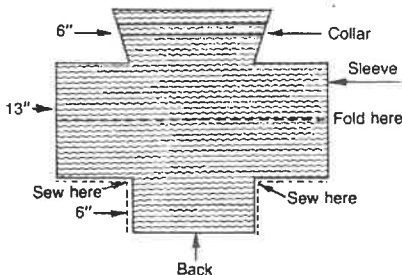


Fashionable Thoughts by Martibet



I know, it's only 90° outside and I'm promoting a knitted shrug pattern! Well, I learned my lesson the hard way in Reno this year... no matter what the weather is like, bring a sweater, at least! This pattern is easily done by beginners or the expert knitter in a short period of time. It'll be perfect for those cool evenings in the Bay Area.

KNITTED SHRUG by Tommi Herrington Potter Valley, California



Where we live, colder weather and sometimes drafty halls have made this shrug very popular with the ladies. It keeps their arms and shoulders arm without being bulky and can be worn while dancing, if necessary, without being in the way.

Materials

8 oz. knitting worsted (4 ply)
1 oz. white angora (or Unger
Fluffy or Dazzle Aire)
#10 needles (or #10 circular
needle). Knit back and forth
because of number of stitches

Directions

6" Collar: Cast on 140 stitches with worsted. (For larger sizes use 160 or 180 sts.) Work in ribbing, K2, P2, for 1½".

Tie in white angora and continue to work in ribbing, K2, P2, for 3".

Break off white yarn and tie in primary color yarn. Work in ribbing, K2, P2, for 1½".

13" Sleeves: Knit 2 tog across row, 70 sts (80 sts, 90 sts).

Cast on 40 sts at beg of each of next 2 rows. Knit first and last 4 sts in garter stitch. Work rest of row in ribbing, 150 sts (160 sts, 170 sts).

Pattern will be: K4, K2 P2 across row, K4; K4, K2 P2 across row, K4.

Work in pattern 13" from last cast on stitches.

Bind off 40 sts at beginning of each of next 2 rows.

6" Back: Work remaining stitches in ribbing for 6". Bind off in pattern loosely.

Fold in half and sew or crochet together. The back (last 6") will be sewn on side of collar (first 6"). Block garment.

To Wear: roll the collar back, insert arms in sleeves and adjust collar on neck.

BROCCOLI SALAD

Dressing:

- 1 cup mayonnaise
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sugar
- 2 tsp. vinegar

Salad:

- 1 bunch broccoli, cut into bite-size flowerettes
- 1 small onion (red or white), chopped
- $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. bacon, fried and chopped, or bacon bits

Mix dressing ingredients together and let stand for at least one hour. Combine salad ingredients and toss with dressing. Let stand before serving. For the calorie conscious, Equal or Sugar Twin may be substituted for the sugar in the dressing.

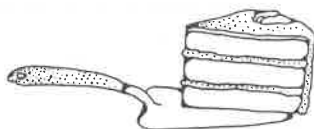
SAUTEED VEAL MARSALA

- 1 Tbsp. plus 1 tsp. margarine
- 10 oz. thinly slice veal
- 1 cup sliced mushrooms
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup dry Marsala wine
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup canned chicken broth
- 1 tsp. all-purpose flour
- $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. salt
- Dash freshly ground pepper

In 9" non-stick skillet heat margarine until bubbly and hot; add veal and quickly sauté on both sides. Remove veal from pan and set aside. In same skillet combine mushrooms and garlic; cook over

high heat, stirring constantly, until liquid evaporates. Add wine and cook, stirring occasionally, for 3 to 4 minutes. Combine broth and flour, stirring to dissolve flour; add to skillet and cook, stirring constantly, until sauce thickens. Add veal, any juices remaining from veal, and salt and pepper and cook until heated; serve immediately.

BETTER THAN SEX CAKE

- 1 yellow cake mix (cook according to directions in 9" x 13" pan)
- 1 (20 oz.) can crushed pineapple and juice
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 large box instant vanilla pudding
- 1 (8 oz.) Cool Whip
- Sliced bananas (optional)

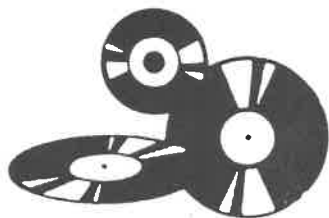
While the cake is baking, cook pineapple and juice with the cup of sugar until dissolved. When cake is done, take a fork and poke holes all over while still hot, then pour the pineapple mixture over cake. Let set for about 2 hours until cool, then mix pudding and pour over top of cake. If using bananas, layer sliced bananas on top of pudding. Spread Cool Whip over top of pudding and bananas. Refrigerate immediately, preferably overnight.

A lot of beautiful prints are on the market now, just crying out to be square dance dresses. However, be aware -- many of them are 100% cotton. So, be sure to check the fiber content of the fabrics and look for the cotton blends, unless, of course, you really dig ironing.

"Call It Fancy", the small but great dress manufacturer in Southern California, is now releasing her new line. Some of the styles are the same but done in very different colors and fabric combinations so that they look very new. Have you noticed how "In" large, wild prints are? Well, "Call It Fancy" has done some polished-cotton skirts in BIG florals with a BIG bow-trimmed pocket, and a plain polished-cotton blouse to match. You just must see them.

"Anyone Can Yodel" -- at least that's what the book by Vell Runolfson claims. It's a loose-leaf binder with 12 chapters to help you become a Donn Thomson or a Jim Wylie, and then an appendix of voice and yodel range charts, practice routines, Swiss yodels, Country yodels, and square dance yodels. Best of all, it comes with a cassette so that you can actually hear his examples.

It looks like we're on a Dixieland kick because this month we also have "Is It True What They Say About Dixie" (081) on Chinook by Joe Saltel, and "Play Me Some Rag" (082) by Dan Nordbye, also on Chinook. Dixieland's okay by me, let's see how many there'll be next month!



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'ROUND' ABOUT

TERMINOLOGY AND STANDARDIZATION



CALLERLAB is a very well known organization for square dance callers, just as ROUNDALAB is the equivalent for round dance teachers. Prior to either of these organizations there were panels and discussion groups at the National Square Dance Conventions. These panels were sparsely attended and the "fruit of the labor" never seemed to be very well distributed or acknowledged by the leadership across the nation. Thus, CALLERLAB and ROUNDALAB found a growing need for national organization to set the leadership trends.

In the past ten years, ROUNDALAB has worked to separate the basic figures into Phase Levels and to further define the steps and rhythms of the basics in the teaching manuals. By this standardization process it is now easy for dancers to move from one Phase (level) to the next by learning the basics of each level as they seek further skills.

The standardization also allows

students to attend other teacher's classes as well as clinics and festivals without fear of hearing a different, or confusing, word or phrase. Have you ever noticed how students tend to stay close to their own teacher at a workshop or festival? They feel more secure close to their own teacher when some other teacher is in the center of the circle!

The recent release of the higher Phase Level books have made it easier for teachers to define the level of a class or workshop. All of this effort has been made possible by the work of many teachers across the country assisting in committee work to assemble and approve the terminology and the Phase assignments.

Further, in round dancing there is an organization of dancers where teaching is not a requirement for membership. This organization, Universal Round Dance Council, also works on terminology and.

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★ CORNER

Ever take a shower with a PIG? Ask Bill Davis about it! That was just one of the many fun events that took place at the recent Royal Rendezvous at King City.

The recent event at King City proved to me that you can have a good time even when your battery is dead. That is... the one on your motor home, not your body. The phrase "Are your jumper cables new, used and/or permanently attached?" applied to us all that weekend. We arrived a little late for the start of the first C-1 session, and afterwards, when we tried to start our rig to level it, it wouldn't start. Thanks to Don Myers we got it going. No, Steve, it wasn't a case of "If you want to start, try park!"

There was a lot of dancing during the weekend, and those of you who missed it should be there next year. It will be bigger and better, we hear. One thing we did notice was that the A & C dancers seemed to outnumber the Plus dancers. This was too bad because there was continuous dancing for both groups with the callers rotating between the two halls. Here's for more and/or longer C-1 sessions next year... by the time we got awake in the mornings, they were over. One more jump-start for the rig (and for the body this time) and we headed for home.

Ever have just one or two people short of a full square? Try phantom dancing! This is a concept not usually encountered until you try C-1, but it can be done at the lower levels. While not always easy, you can learn to do it and you may find that dancing with a phantom will improve your dancing ability.

The more phantoms (missing people) there are, the more difficult it is to do (except when you have eight phantoms, then nobody makes a mistake!). The easiest way to start trying it is with seven people in the square. Then, you only have to keep track of one phantom.

How do we do this? We always point to the phantom, so all can see where the missing person is supposed to be. Another way to help yourselves is to look at the squares around you and see who the phantom in your square corresponds to in those squares. That way you can always look for that person and see where they are if you have trouble keeping track of your phantom.

My feeling is that many people don't try this because they think they will be accused of being a show off, or they will make a mistake and blow the square. As to the first, people who try it are not trying to show off, but trying to dance instead of sit out. For the second, the square is blown if it is sitting out anyway, and you will eventually learn how to dance with a phantom and improve your dancing ability at the same time.

It will teach you to really learn the figures, positions and formations since, a lot of the time, you have to dance to spots in the square or on the floor and do a figure with no hands (no person). You will have to really know where YOU are going, rather than always relying on other people in the square to get you there. Even if you don't want to become a Challenge dancer, dancing with phantoms is a way to not have six or seven people sitting out while the rest are dancing. Try it, you may like it.

PROMPTER PUZZLER

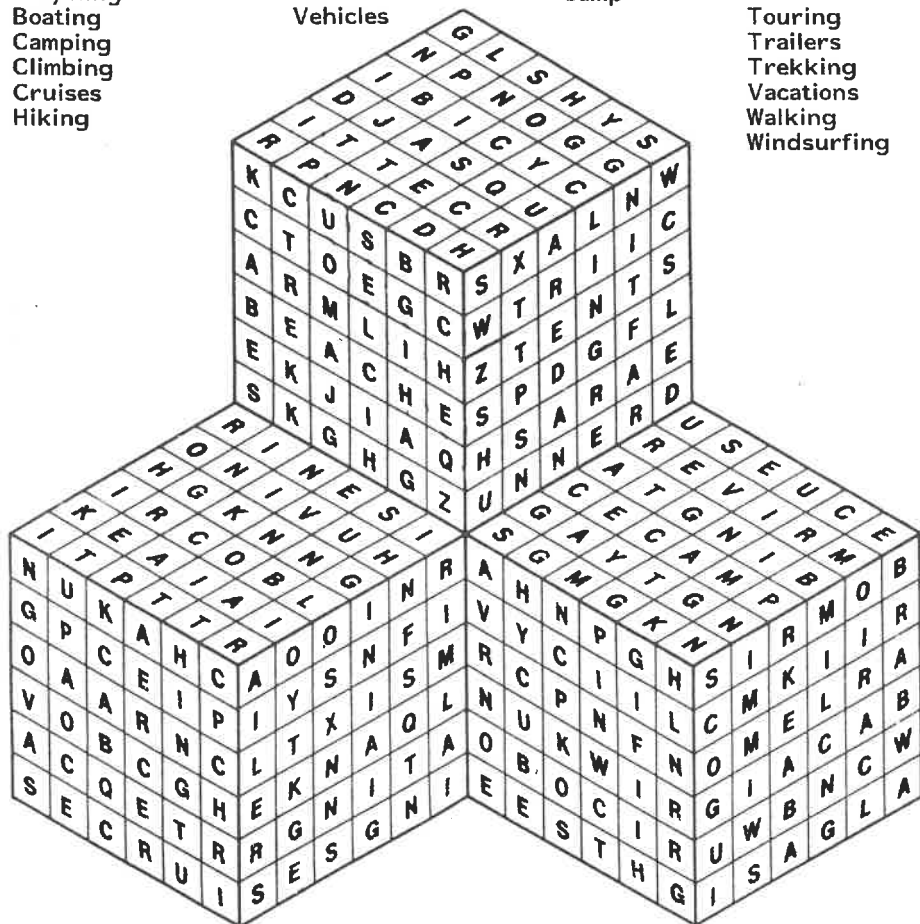

The good news is you won't need to bring a heavy coat. On the other hand, your taw should have a light sweater. The air-conditioning can get a little chilly at night.

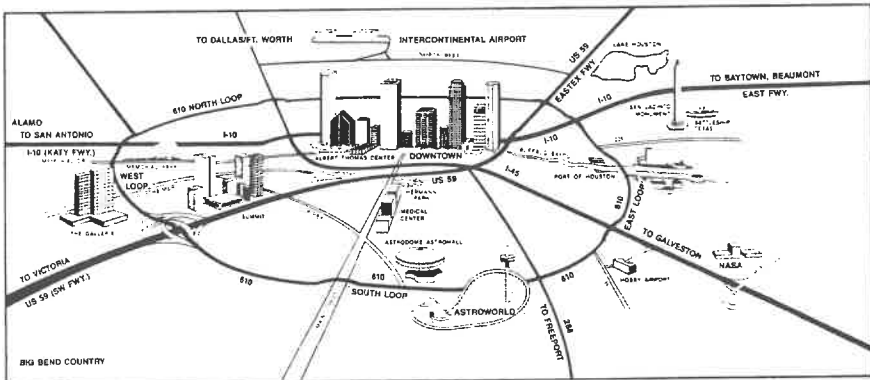

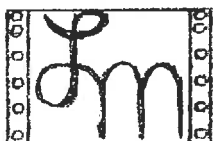
**G.A.S.

standards. Presently there is a wonderful cooperation between ROUNDALAB and the URDC that results in publications that are "The Best of Both Worlds".

Teachers and students having access to these manuals will find a wealth of knowledge assembled by untold and countless persons who have taken many man hours--perhaps man years -- to produce and publish the material.

Fifteen years ago we had very little printed reference material. Frank Hamilton published "Round Dancing" in a 1960 edition. Lloyd Shaw published "Cowboy Dances" in 1939. Sir Alex Moore has publications dating from 1936. "Sets in Order" and "American Square Dance" magazines have published articles and features on round dancing. "Round Dancer" magazine and "Cue Sheet" have published dance routines for ten to twenty years. The greatest progress has

been noted in the past five years by the efforts of ROUNDALAB and Universal Round Dance Council.

Recently, I have attended a few "ballroom dance" classes. The most disappointing aspect is the total lack of "real terminology", or even the use of different words meaning the same step, OR different steps having the same name. I was totally dismayed by the absence of any written instructions. No "cue sheets", no charts or reference material.

We are indeed fortunate to have this vast wealth of material available to teachers and students to assist in understanding the intricacies of round dancing.

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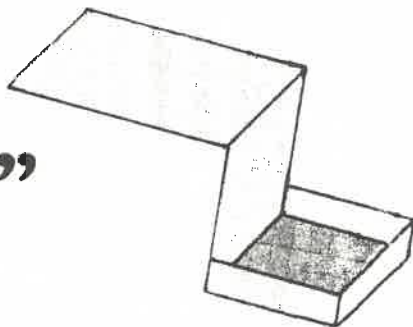
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
