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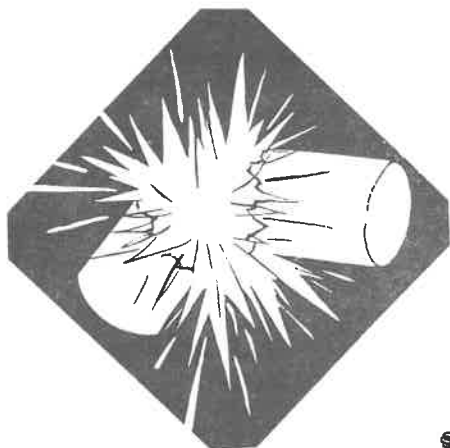
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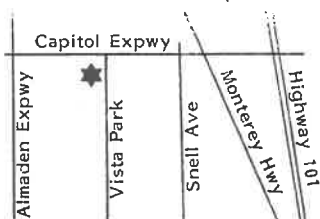
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"OUR" OPINION !

By the way, of the estimated 10,000 square dance callers worldwide, only the 300+ who went to New Orleans got a vote...



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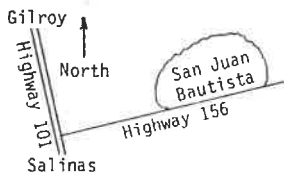
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We Get Letters

It is with considered regret that I advise the SCVSDA that the Adobe Welldiggers square dance club has voted, effective 1 May 1987, to permanently "go dark" and cease any further activities at the Adobe Wells Mobile Home Park.

Decreasing membership, and a very small turn out for beginner classes, reached a point where on most evenings we were lucky if we had a total of two squares and, after almost two years of continuing classes and workshops, we were just plain unsuccessful in attracting new members. When our most recent caller announced in April of this year his intention of leaving, it became clear to all of us that

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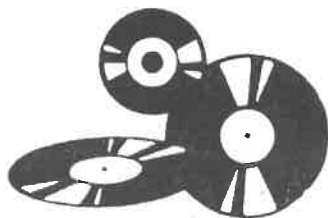

Have you seen Mitzie Poff's Century Club skirt? What an idea! What a conversation starter! In less than a year she filled a Century Club book (and that takes some dancing) then took all the callers' signatures to Sew and Stitch (a monogramming company) and had them put on eight white panels. The panels were then put together with a black waistband, and a black and a white ruffle was added at the bottom. The ruffles were edged in the opposite stitching and Mitzie used black ribbon to outline each gore. It's a fantastic skirt and I bet she gets followed around at dances while everyone tries to find their own caller's name. The 100th name in her book was Bob Robey, now that's a nice honor.

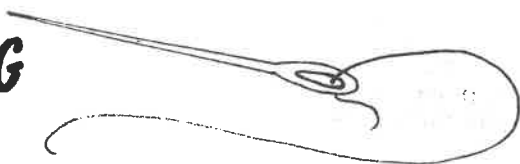
Do you remember "Conga Lines"? They, too, are back in style, all due to a record, "Conga", by the Miami Sound Machine (Epic

MATHEMATICAL SKIRTS

Author Unknown

All tiered skirts can be made without the aid of a pattern. The rule of thumb to remember is that the desired finished length of your skirt plus the number of tiers, divided by the number of tiers will give you the depth of each tier you will cut.

Example: Skirt will be 20" long and made up of 4 tiers. $20" + 4" = 24" \div 4 = 6"$ (depth of each tier).

This will mean each piece you cut for your 4 tier skirt will be 6" x 45" (fabric width).

4 Tier Skirt:

1st tier - cut $1\frac{1}{2}$ widths (67")

2nd tier - cut 3 widths (135")

3rd tier - cut 5 widths (225")

4th tier - cut 8 widths (360")

This allows $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam allowances for all tiers, ruffles, gores, etc.

This same principle may be applied to any length skirt with any number of tiers.

3 Tier Skirt:

1st tier - cut $1\frac{1}{2}$ widths (67")

2nd tier - cut 3 widths (135")

3rd tier - cut 6 widths (270")

5 Tier Skirt:

1st tier - cut 1 width (45")

2nd tier - cut 2 widths (90")

3rd tier - cut 4 widths (180")

4th tier - cut 6 widths (270")

5th tier - cut 9 widths (405")

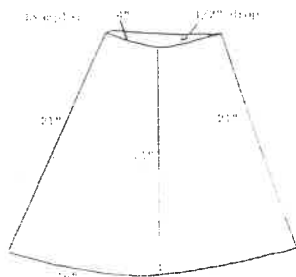
In lightweight fabrics you may want to increase the amount of fabric in each tier; this will give added weight to your skirt. This is beneficial in voiles, etc.

A ruffler for your machine is perhaps the handiest of all attachments. With practice you can learn to ruffle one piece and attach it to another in a one-step process. Always remember to test your ruffler on scraps of your material as each weight fabric reacts differently.

If you do not have a ruffler, the easiest way I have found to gather fabric is to use your zigzag at it's widest and longest and sew over a kite string $\frac{1}{2}$ " from upper edge of tier. Be sure you don't actually catch the kite string with the sewing machine thread. When you have sewn over the kite string on all the tiers, the string may be pulled to gather the fabric.

The second most important attachment is a $\frac{1}{4}$ " roll hemmer. It will roll $\frac{1}{2}$ " of fabric down to $\frac{1}{4}$ " and seam all at once. Of course, you have to guide it slightly.

Let me touch lightly on gored skirts. These too can be done without purchasing a pattern. Always start with a T to draw you gore. Make sure you have equal space on each side of the top or your T. This is best if the top of your T is $\frac{1}{4}$ the desired width at the bottom of your gore.



The $\frac{1}{2}$ " drop gives a curve at the waistline; thus a smoother fit. Be sure to drop the center of the gore $\frac{1}{2}$ " at the bottom, making the 3 depths the same.

Stir The Bucket With Betty

Pasta is the craze and a good one at that! My recipes are tried and true and delicious!

INSALATA DI FUNGHI CRUDI (Raw Mushroom Salad)

- ½ lb. fresh mushrooms, thinly sliced
- 2 tsp. lemon juice
- ¼ cup thinly sliced scallion greens
- 3 Tbsp. olive oil
- ½ tsp. salt

In a serving bowl, toss the mushrooms with the lemon juice until the slices are lightly moistened. Then add the scallion greens, oil and salt and toss again. Chill before serving. Serves 4.

SALSA DI POMODORI (Tomato Sauce)

- 2 Tbsp. olive oil
- ½ cup finely chopped onions
- 2 cups Italian plum or whole-pack

- tomatoes, coarsely chopped but not drained
- 3 Tbsp. tomato paste
- 1 Tbsp. finely cut fresh basil or 1 tsp. dried basil
- 1 tsp. sugar
- ½ tsp. salt
- freshly ground black pepper

Using a 2- to 3-quart enameled or stainless steel saucepan, heat the olive oil until a light haze forms over it. Add the onions and cook them over moderate heat for 7 to 8 minutes, or until they are soft but not browned. Add the tomatoes, tomato paste, basil, sugar, salt and a few grindings of pepper. *Reduce the heat to very low and simmer, with the pan partially covered, for about 40 minutes. Stir occasionally. Taste for seasoning and serve hot. Makes about 1½ cups.

*For a delicious variation, add before simmer step:

- 1 lb. cooked hot Italian sausage, cut up
- 1 medium sliced raw zucchini
- 1 medium sliced raw yellow crookneck squash
- 3 sliced scallions or 6 green onions with tops, sliced
- 1 to 1½ cups fresh snow peas

Cook for 40 minutes, stirring occasionally. This is great made a day ahead and reheated thoroughly but gently. The seasonings blend beautifully!

Sneeze in your hand, do a Right and Left Grand. Wipe your nose, and go Swing Rose. Sounds terrible doesn't it? An awful thing to think about when you see it in print, but some A&C dancers were talking to me about this just last week.

Both of the above have gotten to be rather unconscious acts by most of us. But, when we do them at a square dance and the next dancer on the Right and Left Grand sees us coming at them, they don't know whether to take your hand or not. The consensus opinion was that if you have a cold, the flu, cough, sneeze, or runny nose, you should not even come to the dance. Stay home and don't infect others, especially the caller. Traveling callers can lose tremendous amounts of money when they are sick, and leave a trail of clubs across the country with no caller for their dance.

Sometimes a caller will have to show up at a dance when he is sick. Believe me, we don't like to do it! Sometimes we have to because we get sick at the last minute and can't get a replacement. Stay away from us and don't use our microphones so you don't get sick too. Enough said. "They" asked me to write about it, and I did.

Most of the time when dancers or callers are starting new operations, they put out flyers and

place ads, but they fail to tell the staff of The Prompter about their group.

Recently, I started a new club from an existing class of A-2 dancers. It is called the Southern Stars. (I don't want to hear about it, Jay!) The club level is currently Easy A-2 and we dance on Wednesday nights at the Mainliner Hall in San Mateo (see ad in May issue).

Other groups that start up clubs in the A&C levels should let us know so that we can tell other A&C dancers about your group. Not all dancers are interested in dancing on the same night or to only one caller, so the more people who know about yours, the better off we all are. Any tape groups that are going or starting, and are interested in getting new dancers, could also let us know of your group. The more A&C dancers the better.

Well, the CALLERLAB convention has come and gone for 1987. The word from reading the note services I get, is there is hardly any word. They all seemed to be rather BLAH about the whole thing. Apparently, nothing was resolved regarding the twenty-five week combined MS and Plus list again.

One note service seemed to indicate that you should just do your own thing as a caller depending on what area you were in. Lots of luck to the mobile dancer who travels all over the country. Maybe it is time for the local callers' associations to at least decide what to do in their own areas. That way, there will at least be some uniformity in a given area.

A recent issue of NNN featured a new formation by Deborah Parnell (Los Angeles area). It is the "Egg Formation", accomplished by having facing lines Touch 1/4, Circulate 1-1/2 and the center six Trade & Spread (Squeeze). You can do such eggciting things as Egg Circulate, Scramble the Egg, Flip the Egg, and Cut the Egg. This is just an eggspirical now, but you will see more of it. Look for it at your local square dance.

Dancing Hints

Left Wheel Thru (the 'com-
panion move' to Wheel Thru -- see
The Prompter, May 1987) is also an
extremely versatile and easily-
taught Advanced call. The obvious
similarity to the Mainstream call
"Couples Lead Left" assures that
the large majority of dancers will
achieve success with Left Wheel
Thru in a minimal time. Further,
since the dancers should already
have learned Wheel Thru before
this call is taught, that factor will
ensure an even higher degree of
success when Left Wheel Thru is
first attempted. The 'secrets to
success' with Left Wheel Thru are:

The belle dancers MUST pass
left shoulders with each other as
they divide the couple they are
facing ("Cut 'Em in Two"). When
you are a belle dancer you will
always have a right hand 'free' at
the start of the call; you can
effectively accomplish your 'left
shoulder pass' action with the belle
you are facing by extending your
right hand and pointing to the
space between the couple you are
facing where you will divide that
couple. Additionally, the belle
dancers must assure that their
actions during the call 'cleanly and

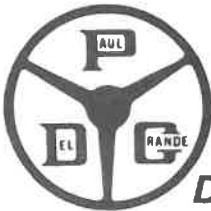

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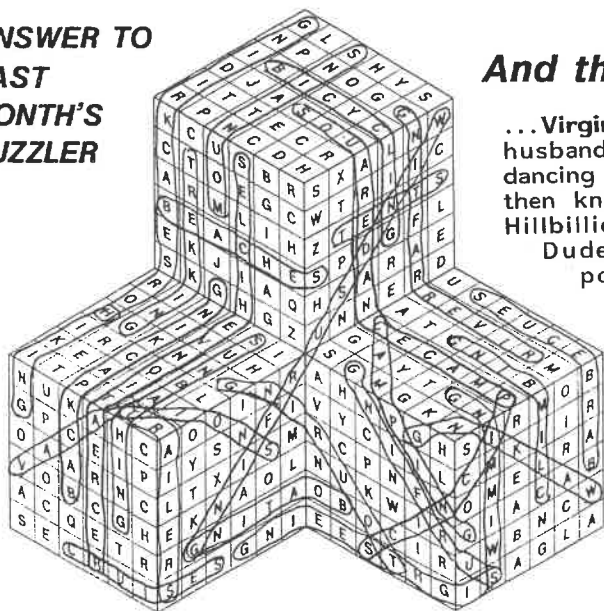

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'ROUND' ABOUT

Music And The Dance

Music, in one form or another, has been an integral part of dance since man first moved his feet in time to the beat of a drum. With today's high-tech electronics, the sound of that drum may be reproduced around the world on a laser disc. The evolution of music and recording devices, along with the increasing interest in limiting copying of recordings, presents interesting potential problems for square and round dancing.

Tracing the history of dance to its earliest times -- African and American Indian tribes and South Sea Islanders -- we find there was always RHYTHM. The Indians and Africans used drums and other assorted 'musical' devices. In the harem, dancers used finger cymbals and bells for their music. These instruments controlled the tempo, rhythm, and nature of the dance. Later, in the 17th and 18th century, string instruments, wood winds and skin drums were introduced to add melody to the music.

Today we have electronic synthesizers and keyboards, as well as electric guitars and other amplified instruments to enhance the musical spectrum.

We have also had an evolution in the recording and reproduction of music. Paper rolls, punched with holes, brought "recorded" music to player pianos. Grooved discs, in combination with a fine needle, gave us the sound of "his master's voice." Magnetic tape, and now digital processes, have increased the fidelity of reproduction to the point where we now ask, "Is it live or is it..."

The sound equipment used for square and round dancing still uses the grooved disc as the primary source of recorded music. Most of our music is first recorded on pop labels like Decca, Columbia and RCA. Adaptations for square and/or round dance use are then made by specialized recording companies including ESP, Rhythm, Hi Hat, Grenn, Belco, and TNT, and many more. Round dances may be written

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for either original pop records or special label recordings.

Music composers and recording companies "copyright" original music and recordings. While this makes it protected property, the purchaser of a record is, in effect, given a license for private use. When broadcasting companies play this same music on the air they pay a royalty for its public use.

Square and round dance record producers **know** their music is purchased for public use, and allow the caller/cuer to use the music at events where admission is charged. However, they don't always appreciate having dancers make tape recordings of their music during a dance or class. They see it as a loss of income to the artist.

The POP labels are even more restrictive in the public use of records and in rerecording for personal use. Most pop labels are under the protection of ASCAP (American Society of Composers, Artists and Producers). Each time a record produced by an ASCAP member is played for public use, a

royalty is due. Again, it's to protect against loss of revenue and income. In some cases, keeping track of each record used is not practical. For example, ice and roller skating rink operators pay an annual royalty fee to ASCAP based on the average number of records used.

ASCAP is now starting to monitor the use of the music in dance studios, and may soon be monitoring other places where admission is charged -- like square and round dances.

The use of live music doesn't even eliminate the problem -- the composer is entitled to a royalty any time one of his/her songs is performed. Square dance record producers may also have an exposure when they convert a pop song into a singing call.

Square and round dancing, like all forms of dance throughout history, have an enormous appetite for new music. It will be interesting to watch the continued evolution of music, the dance, technology, and artists rights.

It started in Palo Alto and went up through Woodside to Skyline Drive... down Skyline for a ways and then dropped over into Santa Cruz... up the coast on Highway 1 for ten miles or so and then back up to Skyline, over Highway 9 into Saratoga and back to Palo Alto.... Since this call can occur very quickly (see the example series above), the beau dancer you face may be 'run over or into' unless you delay your action slightly to let that beau know your intended action. This slight delay can be accomplished by 'clapping your hands' and extending your RIGHT hand to point to the area you will use to accomplish your part of the call.

The original beau dancers at the start of the call will always have a LEFT HAND 'FREE'; they must execute their part of Left Wheel Thru by (stepping forward slightly, if necessary, and) turning precisely one-quarter (90°) left. When YOU are 'the beau', you not only turn one-quarter left; you must also "adjust", if necessary, to avoid possible contact or collision with the belle dancer you face. Since that belle will be passing to your right, you can assure that there is no contact by exaggerating your 'left-face turn' and leaning slightly to your left. This action enlarges the space between you and your partner such that the belle you face will more readily 'see where to go'. Also, your 'beau dancer action' must be accomplished in a manner that assures that the ending formation is properly established -- YOU have the responsibility to assure that your partner completes 'the belle part' facing the correct direction with the same hand joined with you both before AND after the call.

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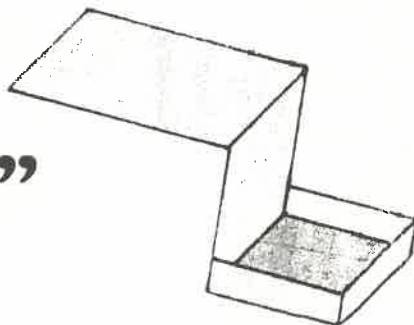
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
