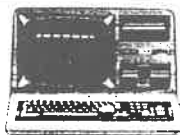

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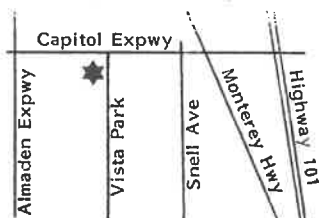
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"OUR" OPINION !

There's an old saying that there are three kinds of people: those who **make** things happen; those who **watch** things happen; those who **wonder** what happened. (There are really four types; we have a cat who doesn't even notice that anything happened -- he's sleeping his way through life!)

In reality, of course, there is a time to watch and wonder. We call it 'getting information' -- or, in this computer age, "gathering data."

Now consider, if you will, that the popularity of square dancing appears to be cyclic -- that is, interest (and participation) in the activity rises, falls, and (hopefully) rises again over a period of time. We have certainly seen the decline during the past several years, and have seen a number of studies conducted on the national level to try to understand the cause of the decline.

This 'data gathering' has been followed by an increasing level of activity to promote square dancing and to reshape the dance programs which may have contributed to the high drop-out rates we've seen.

How effective has all this activity been? It's too early to tell for sure. Square dance dress and shoe manufacturers will be among the first to notice an upswing. Attendance at dances and weekend festivals should see increases also.

There are two interesting trends on the local level. First, the number of Prompter subscribers is increasing again after a very slight but long term decline -- and the really good news is that the increase is in both rate of new subscriptions (new dancers) and in renewals (fewer drop-outs).

The second change we've observed is the high number of ads for beginner's classes in this (August) issue. In past years the class ads appeared in September only; this year most are running in both August and September. So what, you say? We believe this reflects a change in attitude--dancers are "up" and enthusiastic about square dancing and are ready to **make** things happen.

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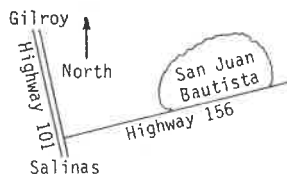
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We Get Letters

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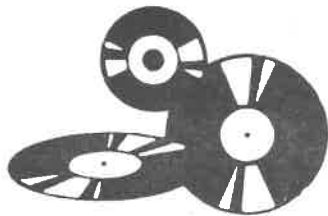
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WHAT'S NEW!!

NON-ELASTIC PUFFED SLEEVE

You may remember that when we featured a non-elastic puffed sleeve in our column a couple of months ago, we mentioned that we had another non-elastic sleeve to present to you.

This sleeve is from the Kentucky Ruffles Pattern #667, available at your local square dance shop.

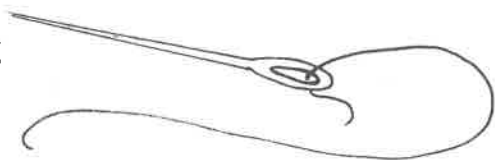
The sleeve is simple to assemble by following the pattern directions. Although the directions are clearly written and easy to understand, we found one minor problem. When adding lace to the bottom of the sleeve, be sure to fold the lace over to the wrong side 5/8" at each end so you don't

sew it into the side seam. We found this out the hard way!

This sleeve is actually two sleeves in one -- one being larger than the other -- assembled together as one. The top sleeve could be enlarged to make it fuller, lengthening both the top and bottom sleeves to accommodate the extra fullness. This sleeve could also be lengthened to the elbow for a longer length and more warmth during the cool fall and winter evenings.

If you find the elastic in the regular puffed sleeve an irritation, try a non-elastic puffed sleeve--you'll love it!

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Stir The Bucket With Betty

SALMON STUFFED SOLE

- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup chopped onion
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup chopped celery
- 2 Tbsp. butter
- 1 can salmon, drain, remove bones
- 3 Tbsp. dry bread crumbs
- 1 tsp. grated lemon rind
- $\frac{1}{8}$ tsp. salt
- $\frac{1}{8}$ tsp. pepper
- 2 fresh sole fillets ($\frac{1}{2}$ lb. each)
- $\frac{1}{8}$ tsp. paprika

Sauce:

- 2 Tbsp. butter
- $\frac{1}{2}$ Tbsp. flour
- $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. salt
- $\frac{1}{8}$ tsp. pepper
- $\frac{1}{8}$ tsp. paprika
- $\frac{3}{4}$ cup half & half
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup white wine

Combine onion, celery and butter and microwave on High 2-4 minutes. Stir in salmon, crumbs, lemon rind, salt and pepper. Place 1 sole fillet on microwave roasting

rack. Top with stuffing and then remaining fillet. Sprinkle with paprika. Cover with waxed paper and MW on High until fish flakes easily. $5\frac{1}{2}$ -7 $\frac{1}{2}$ minutes, rotating after half the time. Let stand covered while making the sauce. Place butter in medium bowl. MW on High 30 seconds-1 minute. Stir in flour, salt, pepper and paprika. Blend in half & half and wine. MW on High until thickened, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ -5 minutes, stirring once. Serves 4.

- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 1 cup chicken broth

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uncovered 2-3 minutes on High. Stir in remaining ingredients, cover and MW on High for 3 minutes, stirring once. Uncover and MW 1 minute more. Let stand 3-5 minutes.

1 (4 oz.) can mushroom stems and pieces, drained
1 jar pimento strips
 $\frac{1}{4}$ cup grated Parmesan cheese

In 2 quart casserole combine butter, onion, celery, rice, bouillon, salt and pepper. Cover and microwave on High 20 minutes, stirring after 10 minutes. Add remaining ingredients, stir well, and MW on High 2-4 minutes. Stir

before serving.

FLORIDA KEY LIME PIE

1 envelope unflavored gelatin
 $\frac{1}{4}$ cup cold water
4 eggs, separated
1 cup sugar, divided
 $\frac{1}{3}$ cup lime juice
 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. salt
2 tsp. grated lime peel
green food coloring

Soften gelatin in cold water. Beat egg yolks; add $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sugar, lime juice and salt. Cook over hot water, stirring constantly until thickened. Add grated peel and gelatin; stir until gelatin is dissolved. Tint pale green with food coloring. Cool. Beat egg whites stiff but not dry; add remaining sugar slowly, beating after each addition; fold into lime mixture. Pour into baked 9" pie shell; chill until firm. Garnish.

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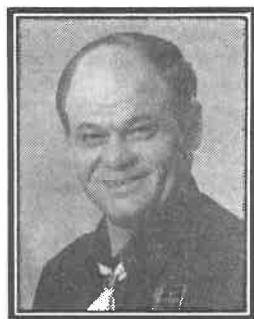
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BEYOND MAINSTREAM

CUT THE DIAMOND (CALLERLAB Advanced Call #18)

Definition

(CALLERLAB April 1984) Starting formation: Any Diamond. The points slide together and Trade, while the centers Diamond Circulate. Ends in a wave or line.

(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #1551.)

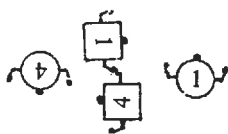
CUT THE DIAMOND

Sides Lead Right, Veer Left, 3/4 Tag the Line, Girls Face...

Right (creates Twin or Trailing Diamonds; all dancers have the same hand or shoulder toward the center of their diamond)...



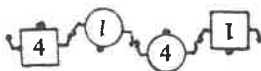
Left (creates Facing Diamonds; centers have the hand joined that is opposite from the shoulder of the point dancers)...



Out or In (creates Funny Diamonds; three dancers have the same hand or shoulder toward center, the fourth dancer has the opposite hand or shoulder toward the center)...



Points slide together and Trade, while the centers Diamond Circulate.



Dancing Hints

Diamond formations continue to be used very frequently at most Advanced dances; and "Cut the Diamond" is the preferred call to resolve these Diamonds to other usable formations. Similar to Flip the Diamond (see The Prompter, January 1984 and March 1986), the most important factor continues to be the precise initial formation of the diamond -- the point dancers MUST NOT have their inside hands

touching the center of their diamond (it's NOT a Star). Since only the centers will have their inside hands joined, the point dancers must resist any temptation to place their hands at the center. Additionally, the point dancers have the more important part in assuring proper completion of the call--they are the ones who MUST properly execute the "Cut" action.

When you are the point dancer,

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please try to execute your "Cut" action such that you always: 1. Slide (without turning) toward the center of your diamond and establish hand contact with the other point dancer in your diamond BEFORE you attempt to execute your "Trade action" (this initial action is THE most important item to ensure you will complete the call facing the proper direction); 2. Execute your "Cut" action IN FRONT OF the center dancers who are circulating toward each end; and 3. Ensure that upon completion of your "Trade", you are A "FAR CENTER" DANCER FACING OPPOSITE the direction you were facing at the start of the call. These actions will assure that you execute

and complete the call properly.

When you are a center dancer at the start of the call, you must remember to always "yield the right-of-way" to the point dancers (the 'Cutters'). One easy way to do this is to execute your Diamond Circulate in a slightly wider path (or arc) such that you guarantee that the 'cutters' will always be in front (or toward the center). Additionally, please remember that you will end the call having your inside hand joined with the 'cutter' who started the call BEHIND you in your diamond. These actions will assure that you are "in the proper place at the proper time" upon completion of the call.



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★ CORNER

So, you've just been asked to be the program chairman for a State or National Square Dance Convention. What do you do, other than take the coward's way out and decline? If you accept, you are suddenly going to find yourself between a rock and a hard place!

Why? Because you first have to determine whether the convention is to be programmed to please the callers, who may attend, or the dancers. We prefer programming for the dancers. The difficulty here is trying to find someone who has the guts to make the decision, stand behind it, and then back you up when any spears are thrown.

Did you notice the may above regarding the callers attendance? We are hearing more and more these days that the "really good callers" were not in attendance at some convention or another. Why is this happening? Mainly, because of poor programming.

Many of these events are programmed in the worst manner possible, by drawing names out of the hat, so to speak! You simply take the chart of the slots to fill and draw the names of the callers who have said they would attend out of a box until all of the slots are filled. Now, from a dancers standpoint, you can have a really lousy dance by doing it this way.

What usually occurs, is the "greatest caller in the world" ends

up calling in the breakfast hall at 10:00 A.M., and the leading candidate for the "worst" ends up opening the Saturday night dance in the main hall. You've been to one of those conventions, right?

Also, you take the chance that the "greatest" won't even show up when he finds out about his time slot. Or, at best, he won't bother to sign up to call next year. This leaves you to fill in slots with more "worsts", which will surely guarantee that your convention will continue to decline in attendance!

If you think programs for Mainstream or Plus are tough to do, it is even more difficult today when you have to program for Advanced and Challenge, maybe including C-4. Most festivals and conventions have added these levels to increase attendance, but many don't do "selective" enough programming to make the dancers glad they came.

We were not there, but were told by some dancers who were, for instance, that Lee Kopman and Mike Jacobs did not call in the C-1 halls at the recent National. If this is true, it would be interesting to know why. The possibility exists, that they were overworked at higher levels, which can happen due to a shortage of callers at those levels, or, it could just have been caused by poor programming. Either way, at least some dancers were disappointed and commented about it.

First, to get better programming, more selectiveness must be exhibited in choosing your program chairman. Experience and past success should be the criteria here, not politics.

Second, you can't pick callers out of a box, you have to rank them. Nationally known callers should have the better slots, top state callers next, and so on down the line. If you don't know anything about the caller, check him with someone in his area who does. It's more work, but you get a better dance and dancers will come back. Try it, you'll see that it increases attendance.

Ken Ritucci, Chairman of the CALLERLAB Plus Quarterly Selection Committee, announces that the call **Scoot & Relocate** has been selected as the Plus Quarterly Selection for the period beginning August 1, 1987.

SCOOT & RELOCATE

From a 1/4 Tag formation: All Scoot Back. Those coming back to the wave now do a Fan the Top. At the same time, those who are now facing out, individually turn to face right (face left if the original wave in the center had been left-handed), Promenade 1/4 around the set and face in to stand as a couple (Relocate action). Ends in a 1/4 Tag formation.

Singing Call

Heads Promenade Halfway, Sides RL Thru, Pass the Ocean, Swing Thru, **Scoot & Relocate**, In the Wave -- Recycle, Square Thru 3/4, Swing Corner and Promenade.

Proper Usage of Quarterly Selections

1. QS calls are not a mandatory part of any program. Dancers are not to be held accountable for selections past or present.

2. QS calls should be verbally mentioned and/or physically workshopped prior to being called the first time at an open dance. QS calls are to be used at the caller's discretion.

3. Conventions and festivals shall be encouraged to delete quarterly selections from all designated halls. For example, the Mainstream Hall should read, MS, not MS+QS or MSQS.

The International Association of Round Dance Teachers

Round dance teachers from twenty-nine states in the United States including Alaska, three Canadian provinces, New Zealand and Saudi Arabia attended the 11th Annual Convention of ROUNDALAB at Stouffers Greenway Plaza Hotel in Houston, Texas, June 21-24, 1987. Also in attendance were Bill and Kathi Higgins and Herb Egender representing CALLERLAB, Louise Cole of LEGACY, Walt Cole from CONTRALAB, and Brent and Mickey Moore, Universal Round Dance Council Chairman of TAB.

It was a very busy week as 90% of the ROUNDALAB attenders remained the entire week to share their talents and expertise with dancers and leaders alike at the 36th National Square Dance Convention, June 25-27, in Houston.

Several new rhythms were placed in the Six Phases of Round Dancing and additional figures were defined. The contents of the Glossary and the Callers Manual for Using Rounds in Square Dance Programs were expanded. A Manual for New Round Dance Leaders and a Cueing Guidelines Booklet were adopted. Added to the ROUNDALAB library was a comprehensive Round Dance Reference Manual, compiled by Richard and Jo Anne Lawson.

Approved for 1987 was the new Classic Listing. Six dances which had been on this listing for five consecutive years were moved to the Golden Classic List.

While the ROUNDALAB Annual Meeting is a committee oriented convention, time is provided for educational opportunities. On Sunday evening all attenders had a chance to participate in four round robin clinics on proper figure execution and teaching techniques conducted by John and Mary Macuci, Brent and Mickey Moore, Carmen and Mildred Smarrelli, and

Bill and Helen Stairwalt. At the Monday evening education session, Brent and Mickey Moore introduced the newly phased samba and paso doble rhythms and some of the basic figures. Members also had an opportunity to participate and compare experiences in three Swap & Exchange sessions Monday afternoon.

To many, the convention highlight was Sunday evening when Manning and Nita Smith shared their philosophy of teaching and experiences during their 39 years of teaching round dancing. To others it occurred on Monday evening when the first Silver Halo award, honoring those persons who have outstandingly contributed to the round and square dance movement in a manner which is special and unique, was given to Manning and Nita Smith.

Norma Wylie (AZ) and Irv and Betty Easterday (MD) were re-elected for a second term on the Board of Directors. Joining them will be Don and Pete Hickman (TX) and Bill and Helen Stairwalt (IL/TX). Continuing on the Board are Ron and Donna Baba (Canada), Wayne and Barbara Blackford (FL), Ray and Anne Brown (CO/AZ), Herb Egender (CO), Ted and Barbara May (LA), Pete and Carol Metzger (CA), Wilson and Ann McCreary (AL), and Clancy and Betty Mueller (IN).

Irv and Betty Easterday were elected Chairman. Continuing on as Executive Secretaries will be Peg and Doc Tirrell (NJ).

The Wednesday all-day Teachers Seminar/Clinic received excellent reports from a capacity crowd. Another will be scheduled for next year. ROUNDALAB's 12th annual meeting will be held June 19-21, 1988 at the Grand Hotel in Anaheim, California.

Country Western Dancing

In the world of recreational dancing we would be remiss to not mention Country Western (CW). This type of dancing is not only popular at Western night spots, it is also becoming increasingly popular at many square dance afterparties.

This type of dancing includes Couple D, Stomps, Western Two Step and Waltzes, to name a few. And more are developed every night -- it's an endless process.

Many people dress for the dancing (quite expensively) with designer jeans, beautiful cowboy boots, embroidered shirts, bandannas, and western-style hats with feather and other ornaments.

Dance positions are similar to round dancing, although there are some definite variations, as with the thumb and the beltloop. Other variations are in dress, and in wearing hats while dancing. (Please don't think I'm knocking the sport, I'm merely stating the difference.) There are probably as many people (or more) enjoying CW as there are round dancing. I enjoy trying to do the routines as well as watching the highly talented dancers in action. They put on a real show.

I attended several nights of instruction in CW dancing. I enjoyed it and try to relate the terminology to round dancing. CW dancers use many Vines, with Turns, Kicks and Stamps. Many 4 steps forward, with a turn (right or left), and then 4 steps backward, with the opposite turn. This would resemble the Grand Square pattern in square dancing.

My evaluation would be that CW is a cross between disco, line, round, and social ballroom dancing,



with its own "unique" styling. Many dances are choreographed, named and danced as round dancers would in a counter clockwise movement, some are performed as line or chain dances (Conga Line), and some are strictly "freestyle" as in disco. Something for everybody.

The Varsouvienne position is very popular in CW dancing, it's called "Western Polka" position. This position gives the man a tremendous leverage for leading and excellent control, usually same footwork is also used in this position. Many Polkas are written for this position as it lessens the chance of a "kick" going astray and causing sore shins.

There are several books published for CW dancing. Most are inexpensive and in Xerox form with soft covers. Each book is usually representative of the area where it is published, and authored by the local teaching talent. Check your square dance shop for these books.

Interested in learning more? Check the local Western night spots -- they may have a teaching period once or twice a week, followed by a dance after the teach. It may be gratis or a donation kitty may be on the stage. Whatever the cost, it is a lot of fun. Also, be sure to check the program at the weekend festival as many of them now offer Country Western dance teaches.

CW dancing is quite inexpensive after you buy the boots, that is, until you buy the Winnebago. Wanna put your thumbs in my beltloops?

SPOTLIGHT ON THE 37th National Square Dance Convention®

(In 1988 the National Square Dance Convention returns to Anaheim, California, site of the largest National in history (1976) when nearly 40,000 dancers attended the three-day event. The following interview is reprinted from "Golden State Nuggets", the newsletter of the 37th National.)

California square dancers are justifiably proud of their state and the high quality of square dancing that they enjoy right at home. We are anxious to show off the interesting and varied scenic, recreational, and cultural opportunities we have the good fortune to experience in one of the best climates in the world. These facts, together with the knowledge that "Everybody wants to come to California!", makes California an obvious choice for hosting "The World's Greatest Square Dance Event", a National Square Dance Convention. To find out how this is done, we asked A.R. and Edna Rodgers, General Chairman of the 37th National Square Dance Convention.

Where do you start? In 1982 A Square D put together a "bid committee" of six to prepare a bid to bring before the National Executive Committee which awards contracts, four years in advance, to host National Conventions. Our target date was 1988, so our bid, together with extensive commitments from local convention facilities, hotels, etc, had to be completed by 1984. This had to be accompanied by a favorable evaluation by the NEC committee as to the suitability and availability of local sites for putting on the Convention. Perhaps some people would remember the two "trial dances" we were required to have to test the sound at the Anaheim Convention Center.

What happened after you were awarded the contract in 1984? The committee of six expanded into the Staff of the 37th National and recruited many more people interested in organizing a convention. We have a General Chairman, two Assistant General Chairmen, and seven working committees





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which are: Business, Education, Program, Publicity, Registration and Housing, Services, and Social and Special Events. At this time we formed a non-profit corporation for the purpose of putting on the 37th National Square Dance Convention in Anaheim in 1988. We are independent of A Square D, but that organization guarantees to pay off any debts that may remain after the close of the Convention. However, in effect, we will have some monies left over which will be divided among all square and round dance associations, clubs who helped support the 37th, and other groups dedicated to the promotion of square and round dancing.

How many people are involved at this date in planning and preparation for the 37th? Approximately 1000. This number will grow to about 4000 at the time of the Convention. We are encouraging any and all individuals and/or clubs to come forward to offer their assistance.

What is the difference between a National Square Dance Convention and other large Square Dance Festivals? In addition to this being among the largest reunion of square dancers from all over the U.S. and the world, we will have the widest range of square dancing offered in one place (Basic through C-3), there will be over 200 hours of courses offered for the education of square dancers (from "Learning to Call" to "Successful Club Management" to "Round Dance Topics"). Those in attendance will have the opportunity to look over the wares of more than 300 vendors of square and round dance clothing, accessories, jewelry, music and publications. These, together with opportunities to enjoy Southern California weather and attractions should make this the best "Square Dance Convention ever!"



37th National Brings Innovations In Program

**Singles Hall, Teen Hall
Among Changes**

Square dancers from Basic Level to Challenge 3 will find hours of enjoyment at the 1988 National Convention in Anaheim. Round dancers will have their choice of Easy, Intermediate and Advanced dancing and plenty of opportunity to observe the oh-so-graceful movements of those more experienced dancers who have mastered the art of dancing in perfect harmony with one's partner. The clogging hall has 25,000 square feet -- which probably won't tax those most aerobically conditioned of all dancers. Accomplished contra dancers will find opportunities to test their skills, while at the same time, those wishing to be introduced to contra dancing will have many opportunities to do so.

Some innovations in the dance program are as follows:

All evening square dance tips will be 30 minutes long to give the callers a chance to "get warmed up to the crowd".

Dance halls will be closed from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. to allow for attendance at many of the valuable educational panels, clinics, and round tables scheduled during those hours.

There will be a singles hall for the first time at a National Convention.

The teen hall will be for teen dancing only; adults may enter to observe or to contact a teen inside the hall. (Teens are not restricted from dancing in any hall.)

All of these changes were made in response to needs of dancers reflected in evaluations from previous conventions. It is expected that the changes will enhance the enjoyment of many dancers at the 37th National Convention.



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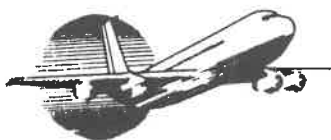
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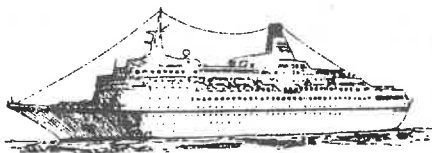
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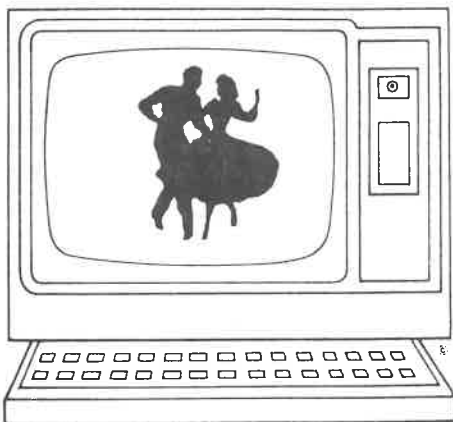
COMPUTER SQUARES

I first learned about "computer squares" at an A-1 class. The purpose apparently is to break up cliques and set-squares and get people dancing with different people each tip. In other words, dance the way I was taught to dance.

When we went through beginner's class, Nate Bliss would tell us to find someone else to mess up with each tip. We have danced that way ever since. Because of this, and the fact that we will travel anywhere for a dance, we have friends from Santa Cruz to Nevada City -- and everywhere in between -- whom we might not have had otherwise.

We would have missed a lot of the fun of square dancing by not mixing! Why do we see set-squares? I suspect that some folks don't want to take the chance of dancing with someone of lesser ability (maybe they forgot that they were new dancers once). On the other hand, they may not have the confidence to try dancing outside their own clique. In either case, it makes them appear very unfriendly.



Consider the image projected when a whole club does this.

I can see that the purpose of "computer squares" in a class is to keep the stronger dancers from leaving the weaker ones to fend for themselves. However, at a recent workshop, the only way that I was able to dance with special friends (once) was to set up a square in advance for a "free" tip. I found that the "computer squares" were forcing me to do exactly what they are designed to eliminate.

I, for one, resent the use of "computer squares" to tell me with whom I may, or may not, dance. I would like to dance with everyone -- once; some more than once. It is unfortunate that we need a mechanical means to make us do what we should be doing naturally.
