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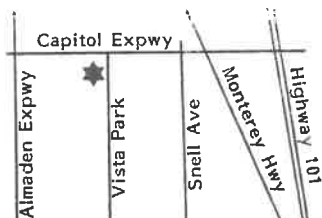
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"OUR" OPINION !

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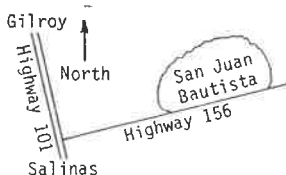
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We Get Letters

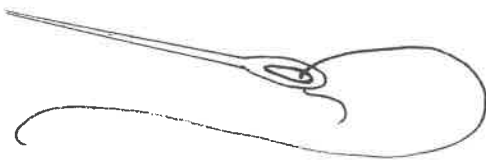

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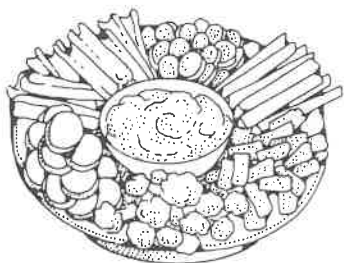
Stir The Bucket With Betty

How's your zucchini doing?
Have you steamed, fried and given
it away?

I've recently discovered
(through Marti Berntsen) "Zucchini
Cookery", published by Wilderness
House, 11129 Caves Highway, Cave
Junction, Oregon 97523.

Here are some delicious recipes
for your favorite, overabundant
veggie!!



ZESTY DIP

2 cups ground zucchini, drained
2 Tbsp. chopped onion
1 cup tomato juice
 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. worcestershire sauce
 $\frac{3}{4}$ tsp. soy sauce
 $\frac{1}{8}$ tsp. tabasco sauce
 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. salt
 $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. basil
2 (8 oz.) pkgs. cream cheese
dash cayenne pepper

Combine all ingredients, except
cream cheese and cayenne, in
saucepan and simmer for 20
minutes. Put zucchini mixture,
cream cheese and cayenne in
blender and blend on high speed
until smooth. Chill and serve.
Yields $2\frac{1}{2}$ cups.

ZUCCHINI ITALIANO

1 large zucchini, about 12 inches
 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup whole wheat flour
2 eggs, well beaten
2 cups spaghetti, or pizza, sauce
2 cups Monterey jack cheese,
grated, or $\frac{1}{2}$ cup grated Parmesan
cheese

Slice zucchini about 1/8" thick.
Dip in flour, then egg, and fry
until golden brown and tender.
Layer zucchini in 9"x12" pan. Pour
sauce over top and spread cheese
evenly on sauce. Bake at 350° until
casserole bubbles, about 30 minutes.
A filling main dish!

DATE NUT TORTE

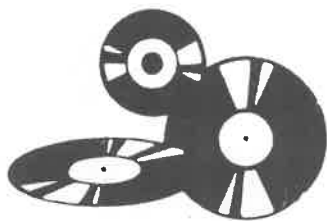
2 eggs, beaten
1 cup brown sugar
1 Tbsp. oil
1 tsp. vanilla
 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. salt
1 tsp. cinnamon
 $\frac{3}{4}$ cup whole wheat flour
 $2\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. baking powder
2 cups zucchini, grated
1 cup dates, diced
 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup chopped walnuts
whipped cream, optional

Beat eggs, brown sugar, oil,
vanilla, salt and cinnamon in a
bowl. In a another bowl, combine
flour and baking powder. Slowly
stir flour mixture into egg mixture.
Stir in zucchini, dates and walnuts.
Pour batter into a greased 9"x9"
pan and bake at 350° for 60
minutes. Let stand for one hour
before serving. Cut into squares
and serve with whipped cream.
Serves 9.

Cycle & Wheel
CALLERLAB Advanced Call #38

Definition

(CALLERLAB April 1984) Starting formation: A 3-and-1 Line. The dancers in the mini-wave do a Recycle while the couple does a Wheel & Deal. If the ends of the line are facing opposite directions, this will end in couples facing. If the ends are both facing the same direction, the right end must pass in front, to end in tandem couples.

(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #2885.)

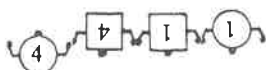
CYCLE & WHEEL

Dancing Hints

Cycle & Wheel is an extremely versatile Advanced call that can 'catch you by surprise' depending on the starting formation. In all cases, the end dancers at the start of the call have 'the more important part' in assuring proper execution and ending formation upon call completion.

When you are an end dancer,

YOU will be executing the 'cross fold' action toward the center of your line -- If you have a **right hand** 'free' at the start of the call, and you meet the other end of your line coming toward the center, YOU must assure that you complete the call **in front of** that other end dancer (i.e., the end with the right hand free must complete the call in

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the Belle position in the lead couple). One easy way to accomplish the action is to raise your free right hand and ensure that you pass right shoulders with the other end coming toward you (by raising your hand, the other end can 'adjust' such that YOU will 'have the right-of-way'). If you are an end dancer with a left hand 'free' at the start of the call, then you still must crisply execute your 'cross fold' action; but if you meet the other end dancer coming toward you in the center YOU must 'yield the right-of-way' to that other end dancer.

When you are a center dancer at the start of the call, you will

execute your part of the call with the NEAREST end dancer; and that same dancer will become your partner at the end of the call. Additionally, you will complete the call facing the same direction as your partner. One easy way to accomplish your part of the call is to quickly recognize WHO is the nearest end dancer; and then allow yourself to be 'led' by that dancer toward the center of your line-- This way, if you have to Recycle, your natural body momentum will allow smooth accomplishment of that action; and if you have to Wheel & Deal, you can execute that action more comfortably.

BREAKDOWN by William F. Meyer

I have been square dancing now for about 15 years. I have done practically everything in the square dance movement except invent a move or concept that would be worthy of publishing. Actually, I did not invent the concept that I am about to put forth, but I can say with honesty that I most assuredly have perfected it. I am sure that adding this concept to one's repertoire of moves will give great satisfaction and fulfillment to the dancer.

The concept is called "Anything and Breakdown". The concept can be, and often is, used with any of the square dance moves in existence today. Just think of the possibilities! You can start with "Square Up and Breakdown", "Bow

to Your Partner and Breakdown". You can Breakdown individually or you can have the men Breakdown, and women Breakdown. As you can see, the possibilities are limitless. Some of the more advanced moves are "Cast a Shadow and Breakdown", "Square the Bases and Breakdown", etc.

The real skills of square dancing come into effect with this move, and some may find it a difficult move to master. There is a right and a wrong way to Breakdown. The more skilful dancer will, however, master these in a short time, probably with one walk thru.

The only way to Breakdown is to totally Breakdown. To totally Breakdown, the following rules must be applied:

1. Move completely out of position, usually to someone's spot that is already occupied.
2. Refuse to take anyone's hand or offer of help. If grabbed take them with you.
3. Look from side to side with glassy eyes, staring at nothing, while turning in a small circle, shifting directions.

If you will practice and develop these skills, I am sure you will realize that "Anything and Breakdown" is a fulfilling and totally enjoyable concept.

By the way, if you find yourself doing this move when your caller has not called it, don't let it get you down. I am forever Motivating when I should be Percolating.

LEVELS & PHASES FOR SATURDAY EVENING DANCES

With the adoption of the CALLERLAB levels of Mainstream, Plus, A-1, A-2, C-1, etc., square dancers are quite well informed as to what moves they are expected to know at any given dance. A Plus level dancer wouldn't think of going to a PACE C-1 dance. The advertising of square dances is pretty well defined and, if a caller is going to use experimentals, the dancers expect to be walked through them so that they may become familiar with the moves.

For many years now, I've been asked why some Pre-Rounds are so HIGH level. Dancers say they have NEVER heard of the dance. Why doesn't the round dance cuer use the "Round of the Month" selections? I am probably guilty of this type of programming and have been asked (told) to "lower the level". We are all humans and subject to these frailties.

The question really is: Should we indicate (advertise) Pre-Rounds and/or Rounds between the tips by using ROUNDALAB Phase level indications? Would dancers understand a Phase 3, Phase 4 Pre-Round program and Phase 2, Phase 3 Rounds between the tips?

Would the round dance cuer's club, which "follows to the dance", be in accord with this type of round dance programming? It's a difficult question to address. Some clubs leave round dancing out of their programs in order to avoid the problems of timing and/or allow more social interaction between tips.



Several years ago, the round dance leader used a Program Board to let the round dancers know what dances were to be used during the evening. This practice was useful to the extent that the dancers knew what was coming up and could decide on "refreshments or dancing". Without the "Board", the dancers never know what the next dance will be until the "music starts".

Saturday night dances are usually meant to be "Party Type" dances. Many clubs hire out-of-town callers to ensure a good attendance. The club advertises to get widespread coverage and hopes to have a "full house" to help pay the bill. Party dances are becoming expensive operations and the clubs need enough revenue to pay the bills and, hopefully, to make a little money for the treasury. There's a lot of work put into a successful Party Dance.

Most clubs will hire a round dance leader to help build the attendance. The round dance leader will probably program for a higher level of round dancer, but, if you ask, I'm sure they will program dances to allow greater participation.

The main issue is that the dance is a "square dance", and rounds are secondary. Many round dance leaders are also hosting Saturday night Round Dance Parties (no square dancing!), and I'm sure they realize the difference between the two types of dances. If square dancing and round dancing are to

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Jack Murtha, Chairman of the CALLERLAB Education Committee, announces the "New Dancers' Bill of Rights" as established by the CALLERLAB Education Committee and adopted by the General Membership on a one (1) year trial basis at our recent 1987 New Orleans Convention. It is as follows:

NEW DANCERS' BILL OF RIGHTS

A new square dancers has the right:

To a class experience that is both educationally and socially enjoyable.

To patient and dignified treatment by the class instructor(s) and sponsors.

To gain experience dancing to other callers and, if possible, with dancers from other classes prior to graduation.

To receive advice and assistance in acquiring appropriate clothing for square dancing.

To instruction and practice with the approved definitions, timing and styling for each listed call.

To information about the history and heritage of our present square dance program.

As stated above, this "Bill of Rights" was approved by our entire membership on a one (1) year trial basis. We encourage ALL callers and square dancers alike to help keep FUN and FRIENDLINESS a part of Square Dancing!

Featured Caller Profile

Mike Sikorsky, from Tustin, California, called his first dance in July of 1972 and within nine months had begun calling four to six nights a week. In early 1973 he began his own club. In the beginning of 1973 he also recorded "Blue Moon Turns to Gold" which became the first in a string of successful recordings. He not only has recorded square dance music, but has made an LP for County Music under the name Michael James.

Mike's popularity spread across the U.S. and into Canada at a fast pace. As well as many guest appearances, he makes regular appearances at many festivals and calls and instructs levels of dancing from beginners to C-1. Mike's own club, Pieces of Eight, has over 400 members in five states.

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We will have 19 halls featuring all types of dancing from Basic through C-3. The smallest hall will dance 45 squares while the largest will hold 250 squares. Besides square dancing, we will also be offering 5 different levels of round dancing. Contra, Clogging, Youth and Singles each have their own halls.

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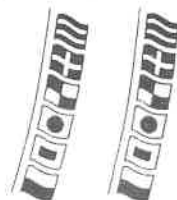
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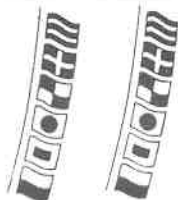
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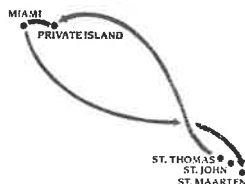
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SQUARE DANCE HISTORY

A Brief History of Modern Western Square Dancing

Like the United States itself, the Square Dance activity is a melting pot of the dances which our ancestors brought with them when they settled this nation. It is flavored by the enthusiasm and spirit which flowed from the young, untamed country. At first, immigrants to America settled in concentrated areas, keeping their dances and the customs in a pure form. As they and their descendants began to spread and "melt" into society, so did their dances. The eventual result was an "American Folk Dance" which includes many of the best features of all the other dances.

What were those dances from which the Square Dance activity was developed? Here is a brief description of some of them.

Mountain Dances: The circle dances of the mountains in the eastern part of the United States including Kentucky Running Sets, Tennessee Mountain Dances and Appalachian Circles where the caller was one of the dancers.

Quadrilles: A precise square dance of 18th and 19th century France. One of the most famous quadrilles is the "Lancers".

Contras: Line dances based on English Country dances popular in New England in the 19th century.

Mixers: Dances interjected into old-time programs where partners changed during the dance. Famous mixers include "Soldier's Joy", "Sicilian Circle" and "Paul Jones".

Couple Dances: Free-style round dances done in couples including the polka, waltz, schottische, and varsouvienne included as an integral part of early dancing in America.

Grand March: The "official" start of a night of dancing reflecting the traditions of each area and the talents of the leader.

As America's population moved westward, dances began to mix. Gradually from the square formation of the quadrille, the visiting couples patterns of the running sets, and the movements of the contras, a form of western dancing developed. This form of dance was referred to by several names including Cowboy dance, Miner's dance, West Texas, Clodhopper or Farmer's dance. The calling was shared by many of the dancers and might be done from the floor. Styles and terminology varied by region, but, by the end of the 19th century, had blended into a square dance with definite characteristics. In the early 1900's, square dancing began to fade, but refused to die.

After little activity for 25 years, Henry Ford, along with Benjamin Lovett, revived the square dance, assembled a book of dances and music, and began a weekly dance program. Then, in the mid-1930's, Dr. Lloyd "Pappy" Shaw, the headmaster of Cheyenne Mountain School in Colorado, collected the dances that told the tradition of dance in America. Shaw taught these dances to students, developed an exhibition team and started touring, awakening a fresh interest in the American dance.

In the years that followed World War II, square dancing made a great resurgence, becoming an ideal family activity. Callers and leaders were developed with the aid of Lloyd Shaw who each summer taught callers at the Cheyenne School. Modern transportation and sound equipment enabled callers to bring square dancing to ever larger numbers of dancers. These technical advancements enabled the square dance to develop to the activity we know today.

As a square dancer you are now part of this ongoing history. Be proud of the heritage. Remember, just as it took much work and sacrifice to build this great country, it also took much work and sacrifice to build the square dance movement. Your help is needed to keep it a thriving activity for all to enjoy.



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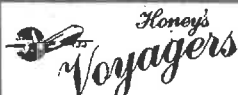
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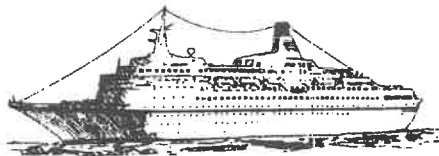

Here is a list of rules for
Square Dancing 100 plus years ago:

Admittance 50 cents, refresh-
ments included.

The music is to consist of a
fiddle, a pip or tabor, a hurdy
gurdy. No chorus is to be sung
until after dancing is over.

No lady to dance in black
stockings -- nor must she have her
elbows bare.

Every lady to come with a
clean handkerchief with her name
marked.

To prevent spitting, no
gentleman to chew tobacco or
smoke.

No gentleman to dance in a
great coat unless his under one
torn.

No lady to dress her hair in
tallow candle, nor must she have a
bunch of hair sticking up, top of
her head.

Leather small clothes except
newly washed are forbidden, as
they might soil the ladies gowns.
And to prevent the tearing of the
planking, no gentleman to dance in
nailed shoes or boots.

No whispering to be allowed. If
anyone shall be found to make
insidious remarks about anyone's
dancing, he or she shall be put out
of the room.

No scissors or gimlets are to
be brought either by ladies or
gentlemen unless their pockets are
whole.

No gentleman to appear with a
cravat that has been worn more
than a week or a fortnight.

Long beards are forbidden, as
they would be very disagreeable, if
a gentleman should happen to put
his cheek beside a lady's.

Those ladies who have not
white stockings and black morocco
shoes will not be admitted under
any pretense whatever. Two old
ladies will be provided to examine
all who enter.

No lady must appear with a
veil on even if it be turned aside,
as the gentlemen will not have an
opportunity of looking at their
faces distinct.

No gentlemen must squeeze his
partner's hand, not look earnestly
upon her; and furthermore he must
not pick up her handkerchief,
provided it were to fall. The first
denotes he loves her, the second he
wishes to kiss her, and the last
that she make a sign for both.

For distinction sake, the
master of ceremonies is to wear a
red coat, buff small clothes, black
stockings, green shoes, and a
furlough. The word of command is,
tumble up ladies.
