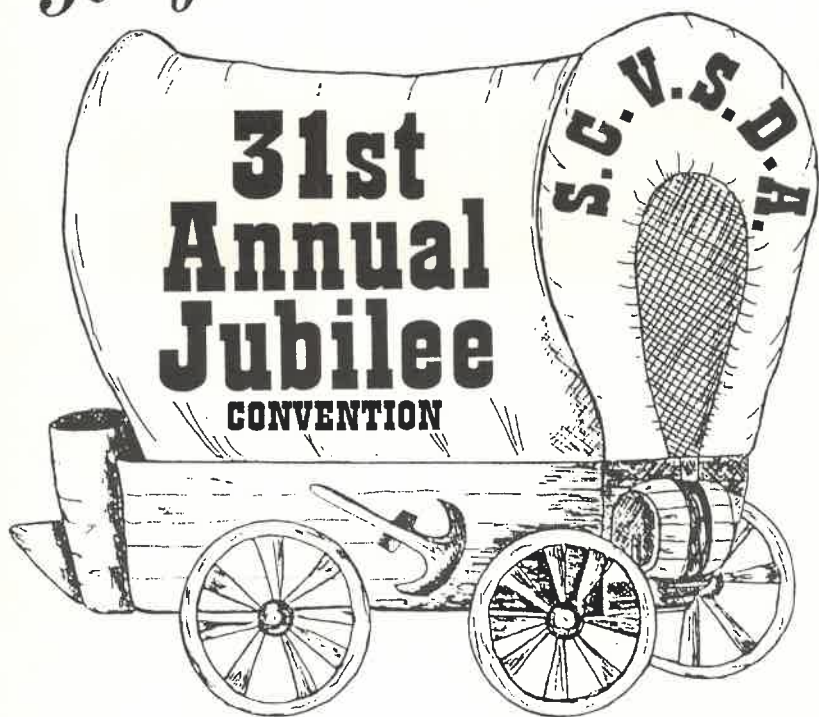

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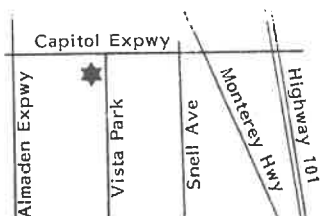
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"OUR" OPINION !

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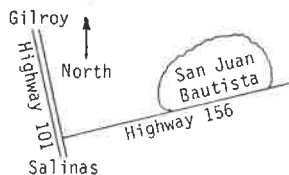

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FREE "DANCER NOTES" FOLDERS

Conceived by Gordon Goss, publisher of the "National Square Dance Directory", endorsed by LEGACY, produced by both the "Directory" and "American Square-dance Magazine", these two-fold handouts are gaining widespread approval throughout the square dance world. The best part of the deal is that they are free for the asking.

The folders, printed in black and red, are not primarily designed for promotion and recruitment, but rather for interpretation and retention of new dancers as classes start. Callers and square dance club leaders are urged to order a quantity of them to hand out this fall.

In effect, the easy-to-read

script says "this is what square dancing today is all about." Reference is made to some of the major organizations, such as CALLERLAB, ROUNDALAB, and LEGACY. Other topics, briefly discussed, are heritage, etiquette, apparel, visitation, publications, festivals and glossary. There's also a place on the folder to localize key information.

Just one of the concise paragraphs, under the heading of apparel, reads as follows:

"Our colorful apparel identifies us as square dancers. Proper attire at dances is very important. Men should wear long sleeve western-style shirts and neckwear. Women should wear a dress, or a skirt and blouse, with a petticoat. Look Special! Feel Special! Be Special!"

Stir The Bucket With Betty

The famous Jubilee potlucks are just around the corner and we've got some great recipes to share with you!! Hope to see you in our square and in the potluck line!

ZUCCHINI CASSEROLE

- 2 lbs. zucchini, cubed
- 4 eggs
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup milk
- $\frac{1}{3}$ cup chopped parsley
- 2 tsp. baking powder
- 3 Tbsp. flour
- salt & pepper
- 1 small can chopped green chilies
- 1 lb. cubed jack cheese
- butter or margarine
- 8 slices white bread, crusts removed, cut into thirds

Parboil zucchini cubes in salted water for 5 minutes, drain and cool. In large bowl combine eggs, milk, parsley, baking powder, flour, salt and pepper; mix well. Stir in zucchini, chilies and cheese. Butter a medium Pyrex dish and line bottom and sides with bread slices. Pour zucchini mixture into bread-lined dish. Butter remaining bread slices and place on top of casserole. Bake uncovered in a 325° F. oven for 45 minutes.

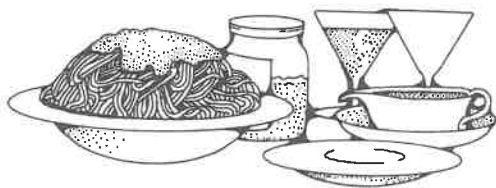
MARTINI FETTUCINI

- 4 Tbsp. butter or margarine
- 3 green onions chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, crushed
- 1 large tomato, diced
- salt & pepper to taste
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup gin
- 2 cups heavy cream
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ lbs. spinach fettucini

- $\frac{1}{4}$ lb. smoked salmon, cut into strips
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup chopped parsley
- $\frac{2}{3}$ cup grated parmesan cheese

In large skillet melt butter over medium heat, add onion and garlic and saute for 4 minutes until tender. Stir in tomato and season to taste with salt and pepper. Cook over high heat, stirring constantly, for about 2 minutes until saucy. Stir in gin and cream and simmer until reduced by half. Cook fettucini according to directions and drain. Add fettucini and salmon to cream mixture, toss gently and garnish with parsley and cheese.

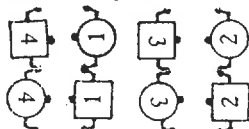
PASS IN CALLERLAB Advanced Call #13

Definition

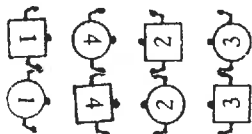
(CALLERLAB April 1984) Starting formation: Appropriate facing dancers (e.g., facing lines, or eight chain thru). All Pass Thru and Face In.
(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #978.)

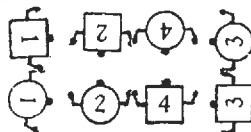

Dancing Hints

Pass In is an extremely versatile Advanced call that has some very "sudden" formation changes that can catch you by surprise if you become the least bit out of position or disoriented. Further, this call is one in which EVERY dancer has an equally important part in its execution to ensure successful completion of the call.

The main "secret to success" for proper execution of Pass In is to positively KNOW that you are (or are not) directly facing another dancer. When you ARE facing another dancer, pass right should-ers with that dancer and immediately face in (one-quarter) toward the center of the set; AND you will become "partners" with that same dancer. This means that EACH of

the dancers originally facing each other at the start of the call will complete the call with that same person; and BOTH OF YOU will end the call facing the SAME direction (toward the center of the set).

Pass In is another example of a call that can have MANY starting AND ending formations, depending on the individual caller's choreography. Remember, if you ARE NOT directly facing another dancer, you do nothing (see last example) and must avoid the natural tendency to "move"; hold your position exactly until the caller uses a call that you can do.

And, as every experienced Advanced dancer can tell you, the real trick to this move is to NOT confuse it with Quarter In! Now, let me see -- Pass In is...

The article last month was appropriate. "Breakdown" was how we started our recent vacation. Made it all the way to Los Banos before stopping for repairs. Ever have a tune-up on your motorhome then have the spark plug wires start falling off? Lots of fun, especially on one of the hottest days of the year.

Got to Huntington Lake at night and had a campsite that a mountain goat could not have gotten level on. Next day, Cheryl found one that was just beautiful. She always does. Nobody close to us, a stream on one side and the lake was seventy-five feet away on the other. All's well that ends well. Even thought about square dancing a couple of times, but didn't let it get the best of me.

Have not heard a lot of news as to what is happening in A&C since we have been back, but did hear the Single Wheels on Friday night are doing well -- great for them and the A&C movement. The Southern Stars are dancing a full A-2 level for the entire evening; to our knowledge the first group in the North Peninsula to do so. Just got some knockout new badges, too.

As you may be aware from reading my past columns, I have never felt that CALLERLAB has done much that has been beneficial to square dancing. It seems to me that CALLERLAB has quieted down

some lately, at least regarding its effect on square dancing in general. Many callers with whom I have talked seem less inclined to "go along" just because CALLERLAB says we should do "whatever". May be appropriate, since CALLERLAB represents such a small percentage of callers as a whole.

As to figure selections by CALLERLAB committees, I would prefer to see decisions backed up by a national dancer poll (or the much suggested and never adopted frequency count method), rather than selection by a few callers who want to hang onto the old -- just because it is old. Figures that are not being used -- usually because most callers or dancers don't like them -- should be allowed to go away and not be retained just because they are "traditional". If this doesn't happen soon, we may see regional or local selections of figures -- resulting in widely varied lists of figures being danced in different areas.

Most of the callers I know are very active -- they have a great deal of experience and call for numerous clubs. While some belong to CALLERLAB, and even attend the convention every year, they do not speak with high praise about the wisdom of decisions being made. It seems to me that active callers, who represent the most dancers, are the ones to be listened to, not those who are not even square dance callers.

If CALLERLAB wants to have a positive impact on square dancing, its leadership should find ways to include the real world by having votes that represent all callers who wish to join, **WHETHER OR NOT THEY ATTEND EACH ANNUAL CONVENTION!** CALLERLAB would become a better organization with broader membership, and would recover its rapidly eroding credibility. If this doesn't happen soon CALLERLAB may become just another solution that didn't work.

Gary, thanks for your note; my comments were in reference to the National Square Dance Convention in Houston, Texas!

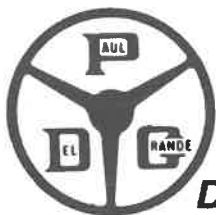
"No New Movement"

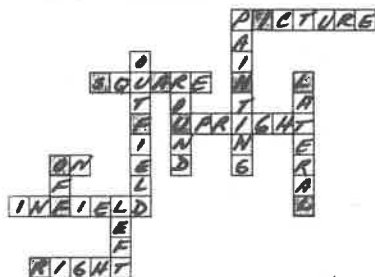

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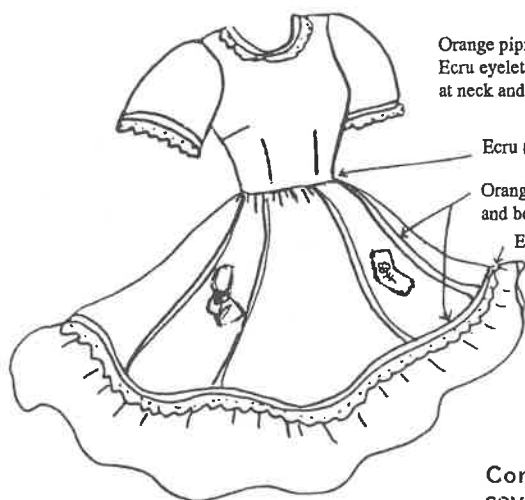

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Hosodacizing Your Way To Physical Fitness At The "Y"

You're probably sitting down while reading this, right?

C'mon. We're in the PHYSICAL FITNESS ERA, so at least move your feet while you're reading.

The Northwest YMCA in Cupertino was a major provider of physical fitness classes long before they became the yuppie rage. Classes in ski fitness and the "Y's Way to a Healthy Back" were just a couple of the classes offered fifteen years ago.

Being an innovator, the Y recently announced a new approach to getting the old motor running without running, without doing 216 leg lifts, 40 arm twirls and a bevy of jumping jacks.

A "Y-Aerobic Square Dance Class" is a novel idea that combines aerobic exercises with square dancing.

The idea came from Morris Hosoda, a Cupertino resident and longtime YMCA friend. In fact, Hosoda is past president of the Northwest Branch of the YMCA of Santa Clara Valley and the Cupertino Y's Men's Club (which does, by the way, admit women and has for at least ten years).

Hosoda recognized that people didn't like to exercise if they were TOLD they were exercising. If they were exercising but told they were stomping grapes for a good cause, they stomped.

With this keen knowledge, he combined a personal hobby, square dancing, with a program of exercise that is done to good ol' country western music.

Here are the details: Take your un-exercised body to Y-Aerobic (or I guess you could call them Hosodacize) square dance classes on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 7:30 to 9 p.m. at the Northwest YMCA, 20803 Alves Drive in Cupertino (that's behind the new Target department store), and register before September 15.

By the way, knee-slappers, this isn't free.

Eight sessions cost \$24 for Y members or \$32 for non-members.

You don't need to look like you're headed for a barn dance, either, as loose comfortable clothing is recommended with long-sleeved shirts for men.

Why the long-sleeved shirts?

According to Hosoda, "Women hate grabbing onto a hairy arm."

Those are the kind of words that belong at the base of a statue.

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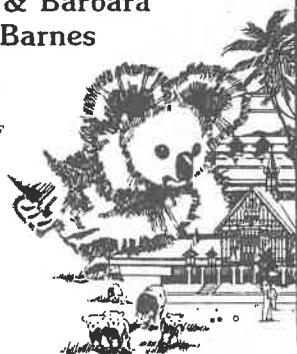
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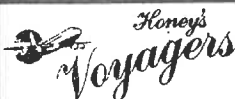
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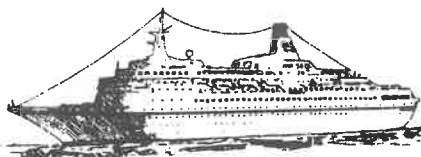
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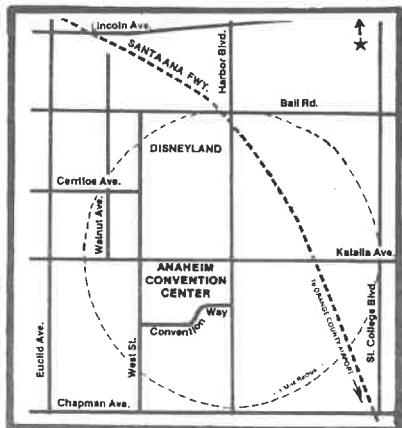

Are you ready for a terrific square dance vacation in Southern California? Well, the 37th National Square Dance Convention Committee is getting Southern California ready for you. In keeping with the beautiful saying, "Mi casa es su casa," we are planning to make thousands of dancers from all over the United States and the world feel at home in Anaheim, California in June of '88.

We have reserved 8320 rooms within one mile of the Convention Center. A wide variety of room sizes at special rates is available for your selection. One of the best features of attending a National Square Dance Convention is to be able to stay at the same hotel or motel with friends. Options for Group Housing (fewer than 25 rooms) and Block Housing (over 25 rooms) are available on the registration form. More than thirty Blocks have been reserved already. The deadline for Blocks is October 31, 1987. Reservations for Groups and Blocks must be sent in the same envelope and have one person in charge. The Anaheim Convention Bureau will assign rooms; confirmations will be in the mail beginning mid-September 1987.

Current plans call for RV accommodations to be provided at

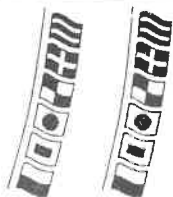
the Orange County Fairgrounds (15 miles from the Convention Center). Shuttle service will be available. A list of private campgrounds, with reservation instructions, may be obtained by writing to: 37th National Convention, Housing Committee, P.O. Box 8549, Anaheim, CA 92802.

Square dancers, round dancers, cloggers and contra dancers of all ages will find a smorgasbord of dancing opportunities at the 37th National Square Dance Convention. Innovations such as a Singles Hall, Youth-Only Hall, and a Hall for Handicapped Dancers will be included in response to participant reaction polls from previous conventions. Nationally known, top callers from California and other states will call for 30 minute sessions to give them time to get warmed up to the crowd.

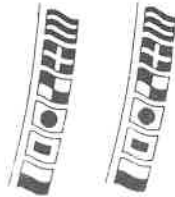
More than 600 callers and cuers have already signed up to provide: square dancing from Basic to C-3 with all Advanced and Challenge dances in the Marriott Hotel; round dance sessions (including workshops and exhibitions) at the Hilton Hotel as well as dancing between tips in square dance halls up to and including the A-2 level; clogging in a 25,000 square foot hall; contra dancing for beginner and experienced levels.
