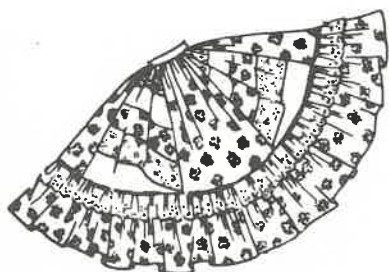

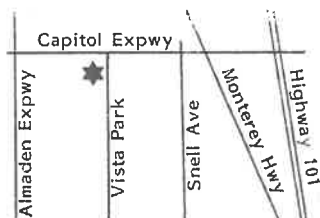

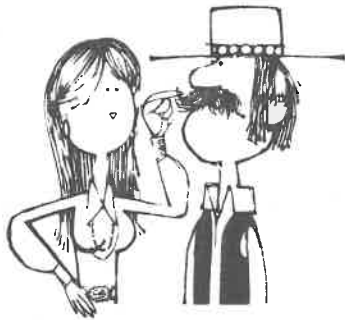

# "OUR" OPINION !

*by Chuck & Honey Wolfson*

In the August issue we expressed the opinion that clubs and dancers were enthusiastic about this year's beginner's classes. We predicted that this could be the year to make things happen -- to bring large numbers of new dancers into the activity. Were we right? To find out we conducted a "snap survey" -- we called club reps and callers and asked them how many new dancers turned out for class.

From the list in the September Prompter we chose 18 classes located in the Santa Clara Valley. Because classes for single dancers are typically much larger in size (and fewer in number) than those for couples, they are not included in the following numbers.

Distribution of classes by night of the week:

- 2 - Monday
- 6 - Tuesday
- 5 - Wednesday
- 2 - Thursday
- 3 - Friday

Twelve of the classes were scheduled to run on club night, and three on a separate night. Three of

the classes had no existing club sponsorship.

Fourteen of the eighteen classes are continuing (four have folded) with a total of 346 students, an average of 25 per class. The largest class has 52 members; the smallest has 12.

Distribution of class size by night of the week:

- 52 - Monday
- 22 - Tuesday
- 20 - Wednesday
- 24 - Thursday
- 28 - Friday

Three of the classes that folded were on Tuesday, on the club's scheduled dance night; the fourth was on Monday and had no club sponsorship.

Finally, we divided the clubs into two groups by age of club. Eight clubs have been operating for more than 10 years. Those clubs averaged 27 members per class. The remaining six clubs averaged 22 members per class.

In January we'll take another survey and report on the retention rate for this year's classes.

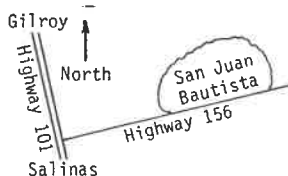

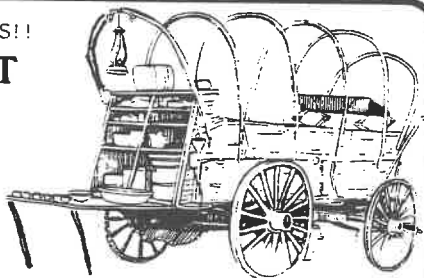

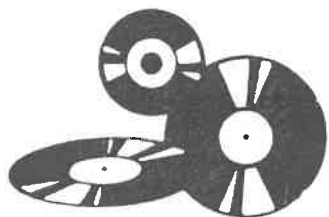

This month several manufacturers showed economy model lamé slips. The slip body is organza or parchment and only the bottom tier is lamé, gold or silver. Now we can have that fancy holiday slip without taking out a loan! And speaking of holiday slips, Malco Modes is producing a fun holiday slip, gold  $\frac{1}{4}$ " dots on black or white nylon tulle -- 60 yards, and approximately \$74.00. And, speaking of slips and Malco Modes, they are now making softie slips in children's sizes, white or "birthday cake" pink, so cute!

Men (or ladies... think Christmas gifts), there is a confined man, in Texas, making beautiful buckles, and he's done one of square dancers in German silver with turquoise (real), coral (real), and mother-of-pearl (real). Also check out his Garfield buckles!

And ladies (or men... think Christmas gifts), you've got to see the sweat shirts, pull-on or open down the front, with square dancer silhouettes made of calico fabric and decorated with rhinestones. These patches are also available for doing your own appliques, approximately \$5.98 each patch. And, since

- 1 to 2 tsp. curry powder

Mix all ingredients until well blended. Cover and chill. Serve with crackers or taco chips.

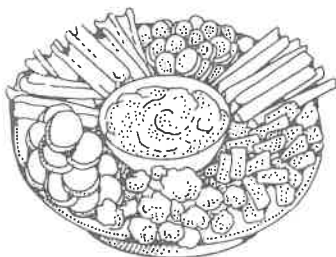

## CHILI DIP

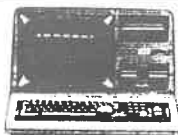
- 1 lb. ground beef, browned

## OVEN CHICKEN & LINGUINE

- ½ cup butter or margarine
- 1 medium onion, thinly sliced
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 Tbsp. dry basil
- ½ tsp. crushed red pepper
- 8 chicken thighs (about 2½ lbs.), rinsed and patted dry
- 2 (10 oz.) pkgs. frozen, chopped spinach
- 8 oz. linguine or spaghetti
- boiling salted water
- 1 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- salt
- 1 small unpeeled orange, quartered

Melt butter in a 10"x15" rimmed baking pan in a 400° oven. Stir onion, garlic, basil and pepper into melted butter. Place chicken, skin side down, in butter mixture, then turn over. Bake, uncovered, until meat near bone is no longer pink when slashed (about 45 minutes). While chicken bakes, thaw spinach and place in a 2 or 3 quart baking dish, cover, and set in oven for about 30 minutes. After about 15 minutes, break into chunks with a fork to speed thawing. Pour thawed spinach into a colander and squeeze out liquid. Ten minutes before chicken is done, cook linguine in a large quantity of boiling, salted water until al dente. Drain. When chicken is done, lift from pan and keep warm. Add spinach to pan and stir to scrape browned bits free. Then add pasta and cheese; lift with two forks to mix well. Season to taste with salt. Mound a portion of the pasta mixture on each of four dinner

plates flank with two pieces of chicken and an orange wedge. Before eating, squeeze orange over chicken and pasta.

## KILLER BROWNIES

### Brownies:

- 4 eggs
  - 2 cups sugar
  - 2 sticks margarine, melted
  - 1½ cups sifted flour
  - 4 Tbsp. cocoa
  - 1 cup chopped pecans
  - 2 tsp. vanilla
  - 1 bag miniature marshmallows
- ### Icing:
- ½ stick margarine, melted
  - 4 Tbsp. cocoa
  - 1 box powdered sugar
  - evaporated milk as needed to make creamy

Beat eggs slightly; stir in sugar, then melted margarine. Mix flour, cocoa and nuts in another bowl. Add vanilla to egg mixture; add flour mixture and blend well. Pour batter into a greased, floured 13"x9"x2" baking dish. Bake 35 minutes at 325°. When brownies are done, cover with marshmallows while they are still hot. Prepare icing by combining all icing ingredients and mixing until creamy. Pour icing over brownies and let stand overnight.

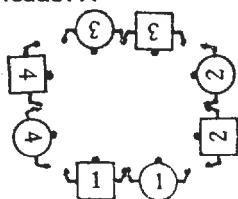
## Definition

(CALLERLAB April 1984) Starting formation: Normal facing couples. All Star Thru then Left Star Thru (the man uses his left hand, the lady uses her right hand, and the man goes around while the lady goes under). Ends in couples back-to-back. Teaching note: The lady always goes under the arch.

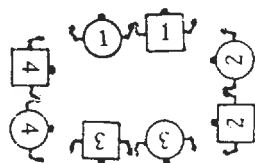
(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #347.)

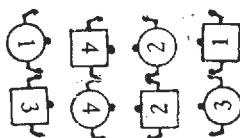

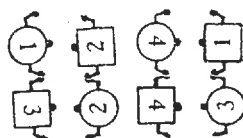

## Dancing Hints

Since Double Star Thru can be called **ONLY** from 'normal facing couples' (each couple is a man and with a lady on his right), this call is a quick way for the caller to create "half-sashayed couples" that complete the call facing the same direction as when they started.

For the men, the 'secrets to success' are: 1) As with the Mainstream call "Star Thru", you must turn precisely one-quarter toward your joined hand to properly complete each portion of the call; 2) You must ensure that each lady goes **UNDER EACH** arch;

and 3) You must ensure that the handholds are 'firm but gentle' by resisting any action that could result in 'gripping' or 'hanging onto' the joined hands while executing the call.

For the ladies, your 'secrets to success' for this call are: 1) You must also turn precisely one-quarter toward your joined hand to properly complete each portion of the call; and 2) You must **ALWAYS** go **UNDER EACH** arch.

All dancers will complete the call with the same partner as when they started.

# CHALLENGE



## ★ CORNER

Mirror, mirror on the wall,  
who's the squarest of them all?  
How am I doing in the square next  
to me?

Some people don't think you should dance by yourself, I do. At least at the Challenge level. In fact, it seems to me that the Phantom Concept in C-1 indicates that we need to learn to dance by ourselves in order to dance Phantoms.

Before I started trying to call C-1, and it's still trying, I was given a great deal of advice by Mel and Nancy Bradley. Having made a considerable study of the Challenge levels through C-4, they were very helpful in educating me as to what a Challenge dancer had to know.

It always intrigued me to see that they could put a whole square back together over the period of a few calls after a breakdown. How did they do it?

If you were perplexed by the first two sentences of this article, you are missing two things you need to know, when dancing, to do this. Do you care? Read on.

These are the knowledge of mirror images or opposites, and counterparts! While some of us are aware of these, do we always practice them? I, for one, don't always do it. Shame on me! When I do, I often find that others are not. Shame on them!

This concept can be used at

any level, but seems to be used more at the higher levels.

You're dying to know, right? Well, in order to use mirror images to find out where you belong in a square, you have to know who your opposite was in the square to start with. You are the number one lady, so you have to know who the number three lady is.

In all formations you should be diagonally opposite from this person. This is true unless you become unsymmetrical or your square is in a pile of eight due to a mistake, and that is how you tell there is a problem, or the caller has called some unsymmetric material, which is rare. The easiest example is, if you are in the couple on the outside of the square looking in, your opposite (mirror image) has to be in the other outside couple on a diagonal from you. If she is not there, usually, one of you is in the wrong place.

How do you know who is wrong at this point? By using counterparts. To do this, you pick out those number one ladies who you feel are the best dancers in one or two squares around you. Hopefully, you feel that they are better dancers than you. (As if such a person could exist!!!)

To check out yourself or your square, you can look at them and see if they are in the same spot you are. If they are, you are probably right and the adjustment must be made by the number three lady in your square. There always exists the possibility that all of your squares made the same mistake, so none of you are right but this is also rare.

If I made myself clear enough, you are now ready to try this at your next dance. If we all got good enough at it, we could put our square back together during a tip and always come out right. We would be the ones who amaze others, instead of always being the ones amazed. Big deal! I guess it depends on your own viewpoint? But, the next time you see someone else put their square back together, you will know how they did it.

## CLASSICS AND EVERGREENS



Quite often I'm asked, "What is a 'classic' and what is an 'evergreen'?"

Way back in 1963, Bill and Lil Knowland, creators and editors of Round Dancer Magazine, published a list of "Classic" round dances that were "well-known and well-danced routines". "Classic" denoted a dance that was well-fitted to the music and was being danced across the country. Beginning in 1964, dancers submitted ballots to determine the fifteen most popular dances to be given "Classic" status for the ensuing year.

To be nominated for the "Classic" ballot, a dance must be at least three years old and still be experiencing high popularity. Some dances make it in three years; others "sleep" a year or so longer and then come on strong. An example of the latter is "Street Fair". First appearing in 1972, it was not until 1983, eleven years later, that it achieved "Classic" status.

After the Knowlands published their "Classics" list for several years, they found that certain dances were repeat favorites. It was decided that any dance which was named a "Classic" for five or more years (not necessarily consecutive) would be designated as an "All Time Classic". Moving these dances to the "All Time Classics" list then made room for other dances to be voted onto the current year's "Classics" list.

Once a dance has become a current "Classic" it achieves a special status and will appear on

Round Dancer Magazine's "Evergreen" list in any year it does not appear on the current "Classic" or "All Time Classic" lists.

So, now, we have the three types of "Classic" dances: "Current Classics", the fifteen dances voted for the current year; "Evergreens", dances selected as "Current Classics" from one to four times; "All Time Classics", those dances which have been selected as "Current Classics" five times.

Many "Evergreens" are on the verge of extinction due to limited record availability. These dances are said to be "retired". Some examples are Charmanine (Glenn), Goodnight Two-Step (Moss) and Rainer Waltz (Bagley). Were a "retired" record to become available again, it could go on to achieve "All Time Classic" status.

Two other organizations now also publish lists of 'classic' or 'hall of fame' round dances; ROUNDALAB and United Round Dance Council (URDC). These lists generally contain more current dances. URDC's list tends to include dances of a more difficult level. In some cases a dance may appear on the 'classic' list for all three organizations.

The best music usually produces the dances with the longest life. Records for approximately 50% of the most popular 'classic' dances come from four major recording companies: Decca (13); Grenn (10); RCA (7); Windsor (5).

So, you can see that the term 'classic' has many meanings in round dancing today.

# Fashionable Thoughts by Martibet



The Jubilee brought out some lovely new dresses which were enjoyed by one and all. However, I did overhear one lady and her partner shopping for some new "duds". They were newer dancers concerned about what would be their best buy. The following column, reprinted courtesy of California Square Dancer Blue Book, offers some excellent suggestions for those first purchases.

## FIRST DANCE OUTFIT by Mary Jane McClelland

**Shopping:** The first visit to a square dance shop can be rather sobering. When you start the classes, the thought of the price of your costume seldom comes to mind. As time progresses, you too want to look like a dancer. By the time you add up the cost of dress (or skirt and blouse), petticoat, sissie pants and shoes, your budget may be blown -- but it needn't be quite that awesome.

**Shoes:** Your feet are really going to take a beating from normal use, so be sure that your shoes fit well and provide good support. Western and square dance shops offer a number of shoe styles -- flats, one-inch heels, and a tapered heel (frequently favored by round dancers). Also, another source of square dance shoes is through mail order catalogs such as Sears and Penney's. These are generally less expensive. Your first pair of shoes should be a basic color which will go with various costumes -- the safest being black or white.

**Petticoat:** It is suggested that this item be purchased. For a first one, white or varicolored is good in that it will go with just about outfits you may purchase. Other colors can be added as money permits. Also, be sure that you try the petticoat on with your new skirt or dress to be sure it has the fullness you prefer. Your petticoat should be 1/2" to 1" shorter than

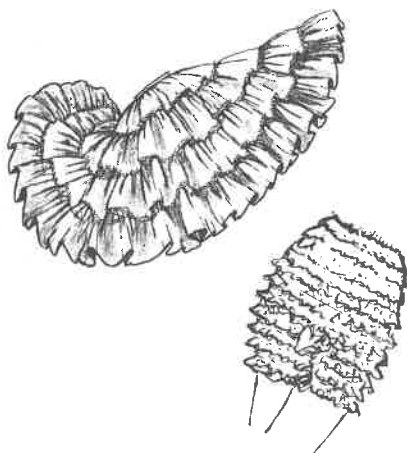

the skirt. The more fullness you have, the more you can expect to pay. Petticoats can be made, but they constitute many hours of sewing -- take it from a fool who knows. A medium-full petticoat can be found for about \$40. Occasionally, you might luck into finding one at a thrift shop. Also, a few of the square dance shops now have a "recycle" corner. Beware of a used item which has lost its crispness. Rejuvenation is difficult to achieve, however, if you should have a petticoat which seems to be getting "tired", hang it on the clothesline so that as much fullness is stretched out as possible and spray with starch or sizing. Sometimes a dip onto liquid starch helps, too.

Another versatile idea is to make or buy a peasant blouse. This blouse is simple for the beginner and can be trimmed or untrimmed. For maximum wear, try plain white (trimmed in white). If you have numerous dribs and drabs of trim, use them up with rows and rows of trim on a solid colored or white blouse. Do be sure that the trims are colorfast. And that brings up another subject -- preshrinking.

#### **Fabric and Trim Preparation:**

This is a must! Any material which is to be used for a square dance outfit must be prewashed in the same manner as the garment will be laundered. As an explanation, when the fabric is washed, if there is any loose dye, it will be suspended in the suds and floated out, but will not streak. If the material is merely dipped in water and hung to dry, this streaking



could still occur with the first washing. Don't forget to shrink the zipper, too, if it has cotton tape. The new tape does not need extra care for prewashing. In the case of bias tape, the edges are pressed under and would fray and get out of shape if tossed into a wash load. The proper treatment of bias tape and rickrack is to leave it on the cardboard it comes on and bend the board. Then dip into hot water and allow to air dry while still on the board. Cotton/poly or all poly binding usually does not need this care. The same applies to poly rickrack. If you are using a braid or ribbon trim on a curved area, sew only the top edge. Rickrack is sewn through the middle. Bias on a curved edge is stretched into convex edge and shrunk onto concave edge with steam iron (to fit the curve).

which held its first convention in 1974, set as one of its major goals the standardization of dancing so that "dancers may dance anywhere, with anyone". The CALLERLAB dance programs which evolved during subsequent years helped to create order out of chaos. The building blocks were well defined. Basic was followed by Mainstream; dancers wanting more could go on to Plus One, then Plus Two. A dancer could dance literally anywhere in the world, confident that the advertised level would be based on those common building blocks.

On Sunday, October 4, members of the Santa Clara Valley Callers Association voted to use a new teaching order for this year's beginner's classes.

Based on a frequency-of-use study conducted in 1984, the new teaching order reflects the real world of square dancing as it exists in this area on "Saturday night".

Unlike CALLERLAB's "25 week Learn to Dance" and "Boldfaced Mainstream" programs, the SCVCA teaching order is not a new destination level. All moves from the existing CALLERLAB Basic, Mainstream and Plus Programs are included. What is changed is the order in which moves will be presented to new dancers. Those moves most frequently called at open Plus dances will generally be taught early in the class. As a result, new dancers will have more experience at dancing these moves by the time they become club-level dancers.

Until recently, there was only one teaching order recognized by CALLERLAB. That organization,

The November, 1980 issue of The Prompter listed 86 square dance clubs; 9 Mainstream, 27 Plus One, 43 Plus Two and 7 Advanced. When CALLERLAB combined the two Plus lists into a single Plus Program, clubs and dancers at the Plus One level were forced to make a decision; move on to Plus Two or back to Mainstream. Plus One had been a popular level -- dancers could enjoy a few of the more difficult moves without the time commitment required by the full Plus Program. Last month we listed 104 clubs; 9 Mainstream, 69 Plus; 26 Advanced/Challenge. Of the nine MS clubs, eight are special interest groups -- youth, family or daytime senior clubs. By the way, of those 86 clubs listed seven years ago, 27 no longer exist.

CALLERLAB now seems to be trying to create chaos out of order. Dancers attending a "25 week" class will not be able to dance either Mainstream or Plus. The follow-on lessons still don't include all of the Mainstream moves. The "Boldfaced Mainstream" list doesn't include any of the popular Plus moves. Square dancing needs a shorter class program -- but CALLERLAB has been unable to agree on a solution.

Given the current environment, the decision of the SCVCA to adapt the frequency-based teaching order seems logical. Club members who dance with the class will notice how quickly the students are dancing "club level" choreography. And, no matter what happens to the Plus program, this year's students should be uniquely well prepared to enjoy club and open dances.
