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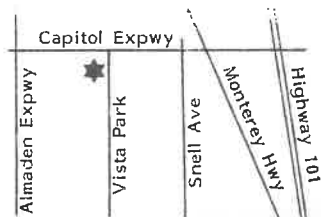
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"OUR" OPINION !

The Mainstream Prompter is the place to list your future Plus and Mainstream hoedowns. Look at your club calendar now and send us the dates for your hoedowns -- maybe we can avoid having six dances one weekend and none the next!

I don't often get mad, but when someone resorts to half-truths, innuendoes, and gross misstatements to deride square dancing -- then I start to see red! The following quotes are from a flyer promoting Traditional or

"Barn" Dancing as an alternative to modern square dancing. Copies of this flyer were out on a table at a recent dance. The introduction: "Let's look at some of the differences between GENUINE square dancing and its modern derivative."

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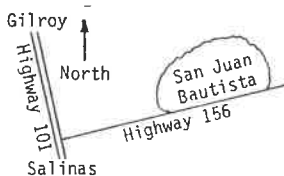

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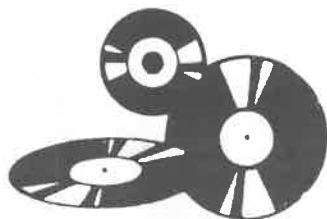

Stir The Bucket With Betty

The holiday season is one of my favorites for several reasons, but I do believe I enjoy preparing the foods of the season as much as anything. We all have our favorite holiday dinner fare, but what do you do for breakfast? Skip it? I hope not! Here are some easy and delicious "bread & breakfast" recipes I'm sure you'll enjoy. The first three are from the "Bed & Breakfast Cookbook" by Pamela Lanier, the last is from "The American Country Inn and Bed & Breakfast Cookbook" by Kitty and Lucian Maynard.

TOM'S TREAT

- 4 juice oranges, squeezed
- 4 (5½ oz.) cans apricot nectar
- 2 fresh limes, squeezed
- ½ cup pineapple juice
- 6 Tbsp. canned cream of coconut
- 1 cup vodka or rum (optional)

Mix all juices and shake well. Great for breakfast. For an evening drink, add crushed ice and vodka or rum. Serves 8.

ORANGE TIPSY FRENCH TOAST

- 6 eggs, lightly beaten
- 2 Tbsp. light cream
- pinch of salt
- 2 Tbsp. Triple Sec liqueur
- 1 Tbsp. maple syrup
- 1 tsp. grated orange rind
- ½ tsp. grated nutmeg
- 1 baguette of French bread, thinly sliced

In a bowl, mix together all ingredients except bread slices. Soak bread in liquid mixture until all has been absorbed, turning the

slices once. Cook on a hot griddle in cooking oil, turning to brown both sides. Serve with syrup and butter. Serves 6.

GINGERBREAD PANCAKES

- 2½ cups all-purpose flour
- 5 tsp. baking powder
- 1½ tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. baking soda
- 1 tsp. cinnamon
- ½ tsp. ginger
- ¼ cup molasses
- 2 cups milk
- 2 eggs, lightly beaten
- 6 Tbsp. butter, melted
- 1 cup raisins

Sift together flour, baking powder, salt, soda and spices. Combine molasses and milk and add eggs, stirring to blend. Stir in melted butter. Add molasses mixture to dry ingredients. Stir only until moistened. Mix in raisins. Cook on a hot griddle using ¼ cup batter for each pancake. Serves 8.

HERSEY BACON

- ½ pound thick sliced bacon
- brown sugar, enough to coat bacon

Roll the bacon in brown sugar to coat. Place on a greased broiler rack and bake in a 300° oven for 30 to 40 minutes until browned to taste. Cook to light tan to avoid caramelizing. Serves 8.

Fashionable Thoughts

SEVEN-POINTED STAR SKIRT

The skirt we are featuring this month is made from Kentucky Ruffles pattern #667. This is the pattern that has the great "no elastic" puffed sleeve which we featured a few months ago.

The overskirt consists of seven panels plus two half-panels in the back. Sew all of the panels together, leaving the two half-panels open at the top enough to accommodate the zipper. Next, sew all of the hem facing panels together and then, on the edge which will not be attached to the skirt, turn under and stitch a 1/4" hem all around. Sew this facing to the skirt, right-sides together, matching the points. Clip and trim all of the curved edge. Turn the facing to the wrong side of the dress to form the hem. It has to be hemmed by hand, but this goes fast because of the facing.



The underskirt of this dress is different from the pattern because a bordered eyelet was chosen instead of the panels and ruffles. By doing so, it doesn't require any hemming. Four-and-a-half to five yards of eyelet fabric is needed for the skirt.

Cut eyelet fabric to proper depth and mark darts along the top edge of the fabric, making them three inches wide and six inches long. After sewing the darts, cut of the excess fabric. This reduces the bulkiness at the waist.

When finished, the underskirt and the overskirt are gathered separately to fit the bodice of the dress. Sew these to the bodice and finish your dress accordingly.

Note: When the zipper was inserted, it was attached to the bodice and the overskirt only.



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BEYOND MAINSTREAM

QUARTER THRU CALLERLAB Advanced Call #10

Definition

(CALLERLAB April 1984) Starting formation: Any appropriate four-dancer formation (e.g., right-hand box circulate, left-hand facing diamonds). Those who can CAST OFF 1/4 BY THE RIGHT, and (then) those who can TRADE BY THE LEFT. There must be dancers who can do each part -- the call is not legal from (formations similar to) a right-hand tidal wave. If Quarter Thru is called, and there

are two side-by-side formations, each of which can do the call, dancers don't move from one to the other. From parallel columns, for example, each of the two box circulate formations does the call independently.

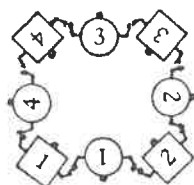
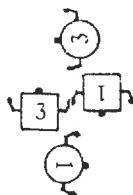
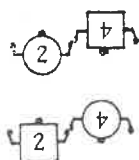
(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #873 'One Quarter Thru', and is NOT related in any way to Burleson #264, #742 or #852.)

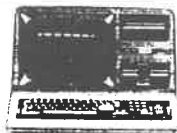

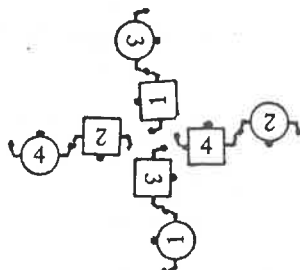
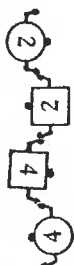

Dancing Hints

Quarter Thru (or One Quarter Thru) is an extremely versatile Advanced call that can 'catch you by surprise' due to the many formations from which it can be done; it is a very quick (or 'sudden') call to complete. While both of these factors must be considered during the execution of the call, the required actions are easily accomplished immediately following the 'initial teach' of the move. For this reason, many callers will use this particular call during their "Introduction to Advanced" sessions at many festivals.

Since Quarter Thru is essentially an 'If You Can' move, it is extremely important for you to very rapidly recognize "where you are and if you can start (or complete) the move".

Every possible "rule" for Quarter Thru has at least one exception regarding starting formations, but two 'secrets to success' for most of these formations are: 1. If YOU have a RIGHT HAND joined at the start of the

call, then YOU must execute the "Hinge action" (in all cases); and 2. If YOU also are FACING IN (in your group of four) at the start of the call, then YOU will also execute the "Trading action" during the second part of the call (note the actions of the MEN in examples #1 and #3).

Under all circumstances, each dancer must very quickly determine if he can start, complete or execute both portions of Quarter Thru. There will be times when you are required to execute one or both portions of this call, and your 'best bet' is to completely understand the 'If You Can' aspects at the start of the call.

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'ROUND' ABOUT

ANTICIPATION??
PREPARATION!!

In square dance classes, many callers notice that the learners are starting to anticipate the moves. The caller may then change the calls so that the novice will "not" anticipate and find himself out of position for the next move!

"Don't anticipate!" A true axiom for square dancing, but not so for round dancing.

In round dancing, anticipating, or preparing for, the next figure helps the dancer execute the figure in a more graceful and timely fashion. Many round dance figures require "preparation", both physically and mentally.

The "acknowledgement" in round dancing is a preparatory (anticipatory) move. This is true for both the starting position of the dance and the execution of the first step on the 'down beat' of the music. We prepare and anticipate the beginning of the dance. It's nice to start the dance in unison!!

Some dances do not include an acknowledgement -- we wait in the starting position and try to "step off" on the proper downbeat in unison with our partner. It's a little more difficult. For example: "Dance", "Dream Awhile", and "Turn Out the Lights" require attention to the music while WAITING for the proper point in the music to "step off".

There are other times in round dancing when preparation is required. A "Quick Vine 4; Slow Double Pivot;" requires preparation in the form of a "maneuver" on the last step of the vine -- step in front of the partner, assume a tight closed position and start the Double Pivot in time with the music. This is an excellent example of preparing for and anticipating the "maneuver" as well as the Double Pivot.



In the high-intermediate and challenge dances, the choreographer may include the term "preparation" as an alarm to the dancers to be aware of the next figure. In the other phases of round dancing, unconscious preparation occurs, for example, when executing a 'pickup'. The man takes a smaller step, allowing the woman to step in front, on her toe, and make a 180° facing change. If the man oversteps the woman, the pickup looks poor. If the woman doesn't step in front and make the turn, the pickup probably fails and a good closed position is not achieved. It's that simple.

Another excellent "preparation" in round dancing is the 'check', meaning, there will be a direction change on the next beat of music, be it sideways, crossing, or backing. It is notice to the dancers of that coming direction change--anticipate, prepare!

In the case of "(SCP) Two Forward Two-Steps blending to Closed Position Facing Wall", preparation makes for a smooth transition to the closed position. There are many other similar conditions when knowledge of the dance, good leading by the man, and "anticipation" will make the dance, and the enjoyment of dancing, easier to achieve.

Round dancing is easy if we are prepared. There are only four things to remember: (1) Place the foot, (2) change the weight (3) in time with the music, (4) gracefully. The latter is what makes round dancing an ART!



★ CORNER

While this article may "Ramble" a little, I'll try to "Scoot" right through it.

Last month we were talking about mirror images, opposites and counterparts and the response ranged from -- "I had never heard of that" -- to -- "I knew about it already, but just don't do it enough." It was nice to see some new A&C dancers actually doing it for the first time. (Giggle! Ed.)

We commented in a past article that if CALLERLAB didn't get its act together, others would start to do it for them. The move in that direction is starting! The new teaching order, based on frequency of usage of figures, is, I hope, just the start. This list was recently adopted by our local callers association. There has also been a great deal of interest in the Bay Area Teaching Order.

Hopefully, some combination or merging of these lists will take place and accomplish two things that CALLERLAB has not been able to get done. One is a shorter list, and the other is a realistic set of figures based on what we are really dancing anyway. Two things that our local callers association has always been short on are -- self interest and politics -- and when these are set aside, things get done. This new list should be mailed to every CALLERLAB member.

Marvin, of the Heritage Squares, was kind enough to give us a copy of two excerpts from a round dance book by Lloyd "Pappy" Shaw. For the newer dancer, "Pappy" Shaw is the man who is really responsible for the beginning of modern square dancing. See if you see any similarity, in these excerpts from a book written in 1949, to what has actually happened up to now.

"and there was posed one of the fundamental problems of dancing. Shall the dance be left simple so all the people can do it, or shall it be given into the hands of professionals who will make it as complicated as they can? The teaching professional must stylize it, standardize it, make it hard enough to acquire so that his customers will keep paying for his continuing lessons. He must make it difficult or take up something else for a living."

"In this situation it was only natural that something should be organized to try to do something about it. The American Society of Dancing Masters was inevitable. They would agree upon the correct execution of the correct and acceptable dance. They would impose with their organized will, from above, what the people must like and must do. And that is never a healthy state of affairs."

While it could be argued that these were from a round dance book, there seems to me to be a strong correlation between these statements and where we find ourselves in square dancing today. It doesn't take much looking to find CALLERLAB and other organizations of its type in the above. Maybe we should have listened back then. If we had, we might not be facing the accelerating loss of square dancers and indeed, entire clubs that we are seeing today. It seems that "Pappy's" mind was able to reach far into the future, doesn't it?

Looking backwards is sometimes a good thing. Would going back a little ways in the number of figures we use help us now?

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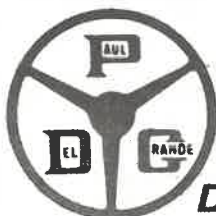
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PLUS QUARTERLY SELECTION "ROCK THE BOAT"

Ken also stated that he was extremely pleased with his committee's excellent and enthusiastic response to the past two ballots.

Rock the Boat (Bob Bellville, Author)

Starting formation: facing lines.
Ends do their part of a Load the Boat; centers Single Circle to a Wave, Fan the Top and Extend the Tag. Ending formation: parallel waves. Timing: 12 beats.

Singing Call Figure

Heads Lead Right, Circle to a Line, Forward & Back, **Rock the Boat**, Recycle, 8 Chain 4 (add words to song here if you wish), Swing Corner and Promenade (add 16 beat tag).

CALLERLAB wishes to advise of the proper usage of Quarterly Selections. Please note:

1. QS calls are not a mandatory part of any program. Dancers are not to be held accountable for selections past or present.

2. QS calls should be verbally mentioned and/or physically workshopped prior to being called the first time at an open dance. QS calls are to be used at the caller's discretion.

3. Conventions and festivals shall be encouraged to delete quarterly selections from all halls designated. For example, the Mainstream Hall should read MS, not MS+QS or MSQS.

TEACH FOR SUCCESS!!!



Last month we introduced the new Santa Clara Valley Callers Association Plus Level Teaching Order (SCVCATO). The purpose of the new teaching order is to better prepare new dancers for the real Plus level they will encounter at club and Saturday night dances. Based on a study of the frequency of call usage, the SCVCATO should provide maximum experience on those calls dancers see most frequently.

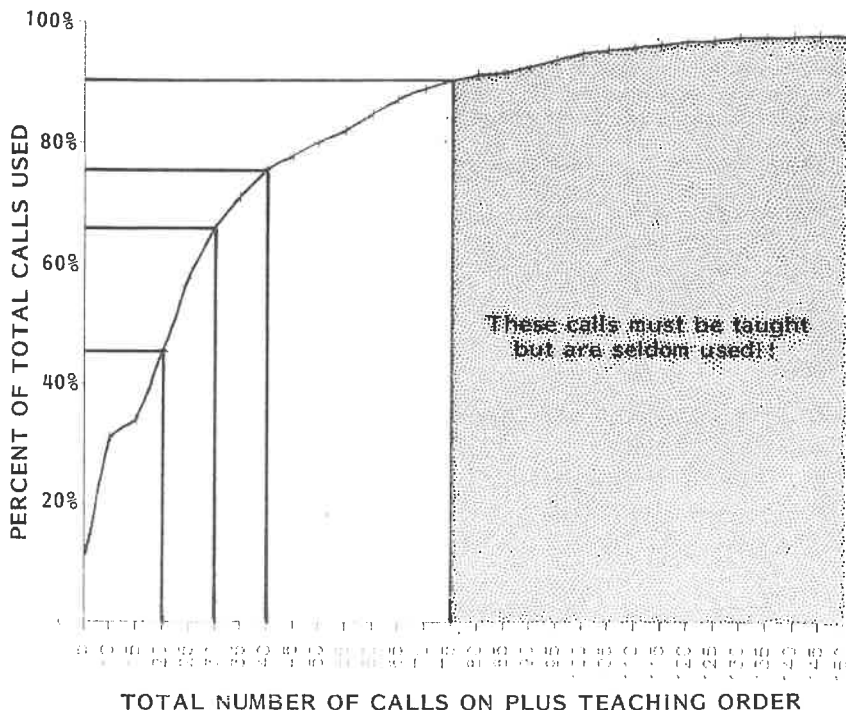
Because the study was last done in 1984, the SCVCA decided to update the data by measuring the frequency of call usage during

the Friday evening Top Ten session at the recent Jubilee Festival. Ten tips called by ten different callers were recorded and transcribed. (Special thanks to George Holser, who provided the detail data!!)

A total of 1740 calls were used during the ten tips. The list on the facing page shows the number of times each call was used. For example, "Circle Left" was called 37 times. The list is in the recommended teaching order, and the results of the survey show that most of the frequently used calls are to be taught early in class.

The other fact that becomes obvious is that a very few calls make up the majority of the frequently used moves. As the graph below shows, the first 20 calls on the list accounted for 45% of all the calls used in the Plus



hall on Friday night. The first 30 calls made up 60% of the total, and 75 of the 152 calls account for 90% of all calls used. Half of the calls on the CALLERLAB Plus list could be discarded! In fact, 40 calls were never used, and 25 additional calls were used only once or twice. Class time is being spent to teach those 65 calls, with a very small chance that dancers will ever hear any of them again after class!

How effective is the new teaching order? We'll know when this year's students join clubs and start to attend Plus hoedowns.

How good is the existing CALLERLAB Plus list? We suspect that it is TOO LONG. Look at the list, and let us know if you would be willing to "give up" those calls which were not used. We would like your input -- let us know!
