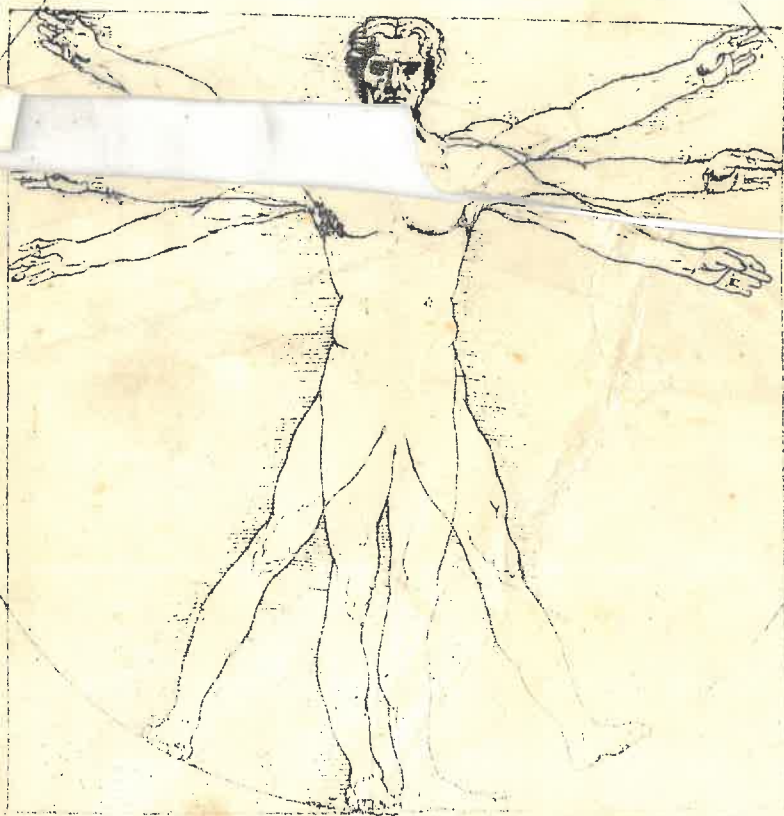

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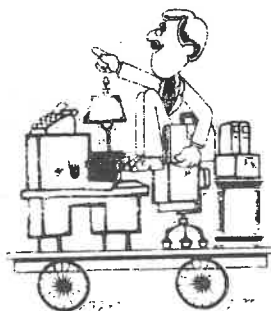
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PUBLISHER'S PATTER

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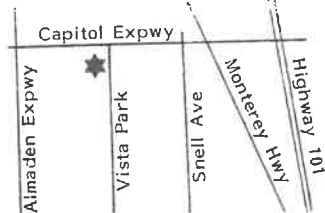
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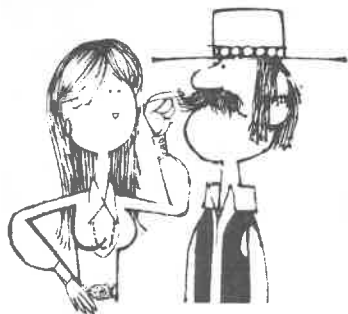
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"OUR" OPINION !

We don't have the answers. We hope the SCVSDA does.



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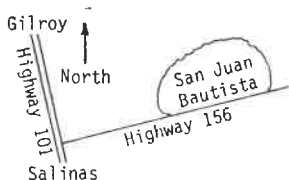
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We Get Letters

★ CORNER

I forgot to say Merry Christmas in my December article because when I wrote it in early November I knew I had to write another at Thanksgiving. However, I forgot that I would be writing for the January issue, not December. I hope you all had a Merry Christmas and will have a Happy New Year.

Last month, we mentioned the new movement that is starting to get CALLERLAB's act together for them. Well, the beat goes on! In the same issue, there was a revision of the Santa Clara Valley Callers Association Teaching Order (SCVCATO). Now, that's good, but, the article that went along with it was even better.

It points out what Bill Davis said in 1964 -- many of the square dance figures we teach in class have been, and still are, in the wrong order if you use the accepted teaching list (at that time it was the "Sets In Order" list).

While CALLERLAB was not organized until well after that time, the similarities between the lists -- then and now -- still exist. More figures have been added and, if you eliminate all of the alphabetical entries and families (or whatever you call them) and use straight numbers, you will see by referring to the November issue that there are actually 150 figures or "things" to teach, plus the glossary.

When 75 of the calls on the list account for 90% of calls used, it is easy to see that CALLERLAB has been leading us in the wrong direction all the time.

When CALLERLAB was asked, many years ago, to **decrease** the number of calls, they managed to fake us out by using alphabetical letters in place of numbers. It is clear, in my opinion, that CALLERLAB has done little that has been responsive to the needs of, or the requests from, square dancers since its inception. What do you expect from a group that spent, many years ago, a day and one-half debating whether they should support the National Square Dance Convention?

My opinion is that most of the problems that CALLERLAB has created, or not solved, are the result of having had a leadership which consisted mostly of "good old boys" who have been out of touch with the realities of square dancing for many years. These leaders have refused to acknowledge that frequency of usage is important in determining which square dance figures to retain.

With the groundswell that is beginning, I believe that you can soon expect to see CALLERLAB's leaders adopt the new frequency method and come up with a shorter list. When they do, what do you want to bet that it will suddenly be their idea?

Another viewpoint that has not been looked at very much, but does exist, is the resistance to dropping "old traditional" figures that are no longer used with any frequency.

It has also been said by Advanced & Challenge callers that, if certain figures were dropped from MS and Plus, they would have to teach them to accommodate other figures at the A&C level. Too bad!

These are certainly not good reasons to keep many unused figures on the current (too long) Mainstream and Plus lists! 64 for 84 looks better all the time and it looks like maybe 68 for 88 may make it.

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Stir The Bucket With Betty

I've recently been asked for recipes for punch and/or hot drinks for the holiday - New Year's Eve festivities. Here are several, the first four from the "Bed & Breakfast Cookbook", to choose from for your next party.

CHAMPAGNE PUNCH

- 2 cups sugar
- 4 cups water
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup lemon juice
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup lime juice
- $4\frac{1}{2}$ cups orange juice
- 2 cups grapefruit juice
- 2 cups Rhine wine
- 1 bottle champagne

In a saucepan, combine sugar with 2 cups water and lemon juice; boil one minute. Add remaining water and let cool. Stir in lime, orange and grapefruit juices. Pour into bowl filled with ice. Add wine and champagne just before serving. Yields approximately 30 servings.

BOURBON SLUSH

- 2 cups boiling water
- 4 tea bags
- 2 cups sugar
- 7 cups cold water
- 2 cups bourbon
- 1 (6 oz.) can frozen lemonade concentrate
- 1 (12 oz.) can frozen orange juice concentrate
- 12 sprigs of mint

Combine the boiling water with the tea bags and allow to steep 4 to 5 minutes. Add sugar, cold water, bourbon and juice concentrates in a large bowl or pot. Mix all together well, until concentrates are fully thawed and blended. Pour into a large plastic bowl or other unbreakable container and place in freezer overnight. To serve, spoon "slush" into four 6-ounce serving cups or glasses, garnish with mint. Serve with a spoon. Serves 12.

MINTED RASPBERRY COOLER

- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup fresh mint leaves
- 1 cup boiling water
- 1 (6 oz.) can frozen lemonade concentrate
- 1 pint fresh raspberries crushed and sweetened with $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sugar or 1 (10 oz.) package frozen raspberries
- 2 cups cold water
- mint sprigs for garnish

Combine mint leaves and boiling water. Let steep 5 minutes. Add raspberries and lemonade concentrate. Stir (until thawed, if frozen raspberries are used). Strain into pitcher half-filled with crushed ice. Add cold water and stir. Garnish with mint sprigs. Serves 8.

Bishopsgate Inn

FAVORITE EGGNOG PUNCH

- 14 eggs, separated
- $1\frac{1}{4}$ cups sugar
- 1 quart milk
- 1 cup whipping cream
- 1 cup light rum or brandy

Beat egg yolks until smooth and combine, in saucepan, with $\frac{3}{4}$ cup sugar and $\frac{3}{4}$ cup milk. Cook over medium-low heat until a soft custard is formed (about 12 minutes). Cool. Beat egg whites until frothy; add remaining $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sugar and beat until whites form soft peaks. Fold whites into custard. Whip cream and add, with remaining $3\frac{1}{4}$ cups milk, to whites/custard mixture, stirring gently. Refrigerate for several

EXPLODE THE LINE CALLERLAB Advanced Call #6

Definition

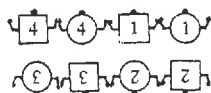
(CALLERLAB April 1984) Starting formation: Any general line with the centers facing the same way. The centers step forward as the ends slide together. Then all

Quarter In and Right Pull By. Ends in couples back-to-back.

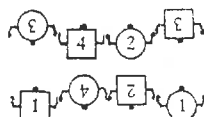
(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #147.)

EXPLODE THE LINE

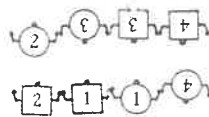
From Sides Lead Right, Circle to a Line, Pass Thru...



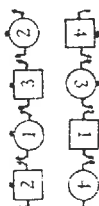
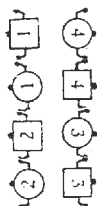
From Sides Pair Off, Centers In...



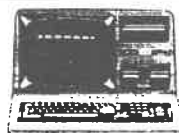
From Sides Touch 1/4 and Spread...

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Dancing Hints

Explode the Line is another example of an Advanced call that is executed very rapidly and, from most starting formations, the call is "repeatable" (i.e., it can be called more than once in a consecutive manner). The call usually ends in lines of four back-to-back as shown in Example #1 (all examples shown end this way). The call is executed correctly by most dancers immediately following the initial "teach", and for this reason, many callers will use this particular call during their "Introduction to Advanced" sessions at festivals.

Explode the Line is another example of a call that is successfully accomplished when ALL dancers in the starting formation share the "important parts" of the call. When you are a center dancer, your FIRST action must be to step forward very rapidly BEFORE you turn to face the other center and Pull By; and when you are an end dancer, your FIRST action must be to slide together without turning

and establish "partners" with the other end BEFORE you turn to face that dancer and Pull By.

When Explode the Line is called in a manner that requires 'repeated execution' of the call, you must very rapidly establish your position within the new formation BEFORE you attempt to execute the call again. One easy way to accomplish this action is to remember that once the first call is completed, "original ends at the start of the call become centers at the completion of the call, AND VICE VERSA"; so, if you start the call as an end, you will complete the call as a center dancer such that you may start the next call as a center, start the next call as an end, and so on.

There is no need to 'rush through' the actions such that any dancer has to feel uncomfortable (or has to experience any undue force), the call is expected to be DANCED in a smooth-flowing and comfortable style.

MORE ON PREPARATIONS!

There are other 'preparations' that can make round dancing more fun to dance and more graceful to watch. Just as other athletes prepare with a 'backswing', a deep breath, or intense mind preparation, so round dancers can prepare, mentally as well as physically, when dancing.

Bending the supporting knee to lower the body and turning the torso into the direction of turn can help to place the foot in the BEST position to accomplish the turn. Turning steps will have continuous flow when using this technique.

Bending the knee -- lowering the body -- can help to make the next step look like it has produced a very HIGH body lift. This action can be very helpful for hovers, whisks, and even a forward waltz basic. The objective is to make the motion appear to be continuous, without any jerky or sudden movement of the body. The elevation difference between the bent knee, and the straight leg and extension to ball of foot is tremendous, with far less effort.

When using these techniques you may appear to be over-concentrating on the move, but practice will produce the automatic body mechanics to have the appearance of a well-trained ballet dancer. It involves time and practice to produce the best results.

Many round dancers try to achieve the Phase 3 and Phase 4 dance level in a very short time. The result is learning more routines -- but the proper basic techniques used in the dance routines probably suffer.

Most likely, your teacher has spent many years, and attended many dance clinics, to achieve what appears to be an easygoing style of



dance. This is the overall objective in dancing -- make it look easy, fun to perform, and graceful.

Don't rush into the endless process of constantly learning, from practice to achievement is a long term goal. When a dancer has learned, thoroughly, all the basics of Phase 3 and Phase 4, learning dance routines of this level will be an easy task.

Having to learn two or three new basics as well as the routine itself can be a difficult task. Therefore, it is far better to master as many basics as possible, then the routines can 'almost' be learned as a walk-thru. Think about it. When you go to a festival or clinic, if the featured teacher says this is an easy walk-thru and you learn the dance in a few minutes, it is because you 'understood' all of the basics in the dance.

Later in the festival, the teacher will probably spend an hour or more teaching a few new basics, or adapting a particular basic to a different dance rhythm. This will require a lot of thought and memory work. You may be able to learn the dance during the teach, but it will require more practice to feel comfortable dancing the routine. If the figures are still 'new' to you, then the comfortable dancing feel usually will not come for a few more practice sessions!!

When you are in this 'learning stage', look around the circle. You may see a few bewildered looks and frowns. If you don't understand the basic, ask the teacher to repeat the explanation -- you will be sure to benefit from the second walk-thru!

37th National Square Dance Convention®



Anaheim, California

June 23, 24, 25, 1988

HALLS, HALLS, HALLS

Beautiful weather, beautiful beaches, the beautiful Anaheim Convention Center -- all are a part of the Southern California scene which awaits the National Square Dance Convention goer in 1988. The Convention Center, largest on the West Coast, is the center of Anaheim's complete planned convention community, and is directly across from world-famous Disneyland.

The Center provides 685,000 feet of air conditioned space and will house the 37th National Convention's Basic, Mainstream and Plus levels of square dancing; Contra dancing; Clogging; Singles Hall; Youth Hall; Education clinics, panels and seminars; cafeteria; and 309 vendor booths. The Showcase of Ideas will be on display in the 12,000 square foot Grand Lobby of the Center all three days of the Convention.

The three large halls of the

Center will be partitioned with heavy velour drapes to insure good separation of sound between the sections. Dancing will take place in an area 100 by 250 feet (large enough to handle 250 squares) at each end of these halls.

North Hall will have Basic square dancing at one end and Mainstream at the other end, separated by 200 feet of vendors booths. South Hall will have Mainstream at one end and Plus at the other, also separated by 200 feet of vendors booths. Southwest Hall will accommodate Clogging and the Singles Hall, separated by a 50,000 square foot Cafeteria. Smaller rooms throughout the Center will be used for Youths, Contra dancing, Sew & Save, Education and, a 'first' for a National Convention, a Hand-dancers Hall for handicapped dancers.

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night's Parade of States will go on in the 27,000 square foot Arena with comfortable seating for more than 8000 people.

But, the 37th National Square Dance Convention will be bigger than that! Additional space has been reserved for dancing in the Anaheim Hilton and the Anaheim Marriott, two of Anaheim's ultra-modern hotels, which are located immediately adjacent to the Convention Center.

Chandeliered grand ballrooms in the Anaheim Hilton will be used for A-1, A-2 and C-1 through C-3 square dancing.

All Round Dancing (Easy, Intermediate and Advanced levels) will take place in the Anaheim Marriott directly across the street from the Hilton. Five ballrooms at the Marriott (with 5000 to 9500 square feet in each) will house the Showcase of Rounds each morning, workshops in the afternoon, and parties each evening. The Showcase of Rounds will give round dance enthusiasts a chance to see

teachers and choreographers demonstrating round dances and styling that will be taught later in workshops.

All in all, 20 separate dance halls will be in use all day long, all three days of the Convention.

CLUB AND ASSOCIATION BANNERS ON DISPLAY

Don't miss your opportunity to display your own club's banner at the 1988 National Convention in Anaheim. Having your banner displayed at a National Convention doesn't happen every day. It can be done by following just a few simple guidelines established by the Anaheim Convention Center. One of the requirements is that your banner must be fireproof.

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Ed Foote on styling:

HANDS UP VS. HANDS DOWN

In 1974 CALLERLAB passed a resolution advocating the use of palms up (hands up) for establishing an ocean wave and for ocean wave turning movements, specifically naming Swing Thru and Spin the Top. In 1985 CALLERLAB passed another resolution reaffirming the use of hands up for ocean wave turning movements.

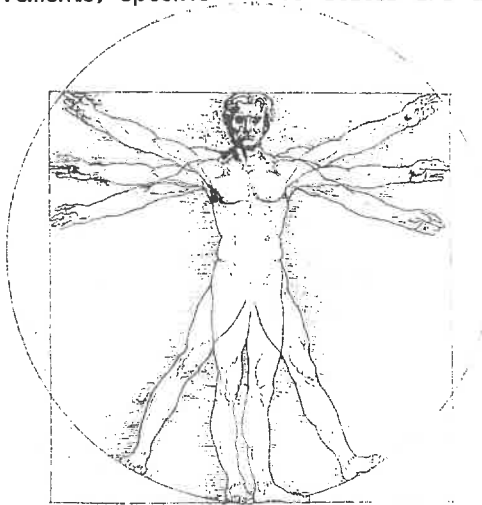
Prior to the 1974 resolution, parts of the country used hands up, parts used hands down, and parts used forearms.

In the eleven years between the two resolutions, did most of the country go to hands up? No. The country remained divided, with the majority dancing hands up and a sizeable minority using hands down

or forearms. According to a 1985 CALLERLAB survey, twenty-five states are dancing hands up, 9 states are dancing hands down, and 16 states are divided. But some

point out that many of the states favoring hands up have sparse square dance populations, and that an actual dancer count might show a closer separation between the various dancing styles. Those in favor of hands up often are unable to understand why there is such

resistance to hands up by dancers and callers who favor hands down or forearms. Hands up advocates say, in effect: "The CALLERLAB resolution is to promote consistency and standardization, so why won't



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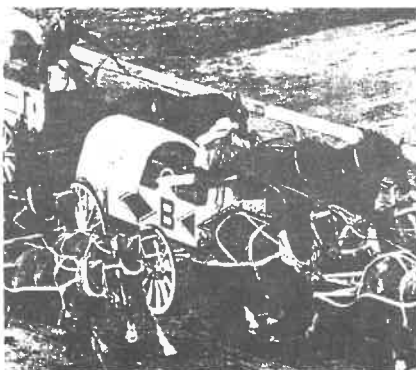
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To clarify the three methods of styling, the definitions are as follows:

Palms Up: (CALLERLAB definition, labeled Hands Up). Hands are joined in a crossed palm position, i.e., opposing dancers place palms together with fingers pointing up, then tilt hand out slightly which will result in a crossed palm position. Thumbs are gently closed on the back of the opposing dancer's hand. As the turning action starts, wrists are straightened.

Palms Down: (CALLERLAB definition, labeled Handshake Hold). Use a comfortable handshake with hands reached and touched at about average waist height. Thumb should overlap the back of opposite dancer's hand.

Forearms: (CALLERLAB definition). The arms are held past the wrist but not past the elbow joint. Each dancer places the hand on the inside arm of the person with whom he is to work. The fingers and thumb are held in close. The center of the turn will be at the joined arms, so, while turning, each dancer is moving equally around the other.

you support this resolution?"

The answer to this question is four-fold:

1. CALLERLAB's inconsistency in call definitions.
2. CALLERLAB's inconsistency regarding standardization.
3. Habit patterns ingrained in dancers through years of dancing.
4. The relative merits of hands up, hands down and forearm styling.

This series will examine each of these areas, and then suggest a solution to the problem.

CALLERLAB INCONSISTENCY IN CALL DEFINITIONS

If CALLERLAB wishes to have standardization regarding dance style for turning motions, then it is

logical to expect that CALLERLAB call definitions, which employ identical or quite similar body actions, will follow the same rules. Unfortunately, this is not the case. Here are some examples.

A. Making a wave. The CALLERLAB definition for making an ocean wave says for all dancers to take hands in a palms up manner. Forearms are not mentioned. But to make a thar, CALLERLAB says: "...each outside dancer holds the forearm of a center dancer..."

What is a thar? It is simply two crossed ocean waves. The inconsistency is quite apparent.

B. Spin the Top. The CALLERLAB styling for Spin the Top from parallel waves requires hands up. But to do All Eight Spin the Top



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from a thar, the definition reads: "...each center dancer and adjacent outside dancer arm turn one half..."

Both calls start from waves, but in one case hands up is to be used and in another case forearms are to be used. This is inconsistent.

C. Turn Thru. The CALLERLAB definition specifically says to use forearms. Yet the swing 1/2 in a Turn Thru is no different from the swing 1/2 in a Swing Thru or Spin the Top. Inconsistency!

An example of this is as follows: A popular combination of calls is Swing Thru, Turn Thru. According to CALLERLAB, the Swing Thru is done with hands up, but then a shift to forearms is required for the Turn Thru. Yet the swing 1/2 for each call is the same action.

D. Allemande Left. The CALLERLAB definition specifically says to use forearms. This definition is consistent with the turning motion used in Turn Thru, but is

inconsistent with Swing Thru and Spin the Top.

E. Two adjacent dancers. CALLERLAB says when two adjacent dancers are facing the same direction, hands are down at waist level; but when two adjacent dancers are facing opposite directions, then hands are up--except in a thar, when hands are down again. There is no consistency here at all!

Summary of inconsistencies: We are discussing turning motions of two adjacent dancers. The body movement of the dancers in doing these turning motions is always the same -- the only variable is how far to go with each turning motion. It is inconsistent for CALLERLAB to have two different approved ways to do the same action.

Next month: CALLERLAB's inconsistent standardization.

2 tsp. whole cloves
2 tsp. whole allspice
2 sticks cinnamon (3" each)
1 gallon apple cider
2/3 cup sugar
2 whole oranges, washed

Tie spices in cheesecloth or place in a tea ball. Pour cider in a large pot (a stock pot works well) and add spices, sugar and oranges. Heat to boiling, cover and simmer for 20 minutes. Hot spiced cider can be kept hot in an electric percolator.

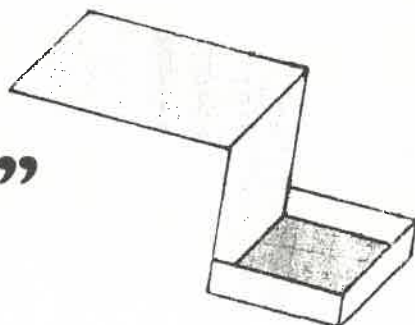
