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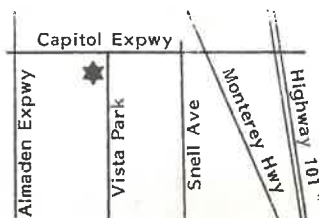
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"OUR" OPINION !

One hundred (100) of anything is a fairly significant number (except in the case of the National Debt). As indicated on the cover, this is the 100th issue of The Prompter -- it's good that square dancing is an ever-changing activity, enjoyed by active and interesting people, or we would have run out of things to write about by now!

One thing is certain, we couldn't be here without the support of our contributors, advertisers, and all of you who buy and read the magazine each month. Thank you!

Speaking of ever-changing, let's update last month's subject: insurance. We understand that the Santa Clara Valley Square Dance Association (SCVSDA) has appointed a committee to study the options available for insurance coverage.

The SCVSDA currently requires member clubs to pay for two types of insurance: liability coverage and medical coverage.

Liability insurance provides coverage for damages to persons (injury) or property which are caused by the insured person or

group. The current policy provides up to \$1,000,000.00 in loss protection, as is required by most of the school districts whose facilities we use for dances.

Medical insurance provides some level of reimbursement for medical expenses to treat an accidental injury which occurs while at a covered activity (dance) or while directly en route to or from that activity. No liability or fault is involved in this coverage.

We believe that the liability insurance is a must. Without it, clubs could not use public schools for their dances.

We believe that the medical insurance should be dropped. The vast majority of dancers have medical or health coverage. If the members of the SCVSDA wish to provide some assistance in special cases, a "self-insurance" fund could be established for that purpose, at a lower cost than the current, mostly unnecessary, insurance.

We urge you to discuss this subject at your club. Take a vote on the options -- then your SCVSDA delegates will be prepared to represent you!



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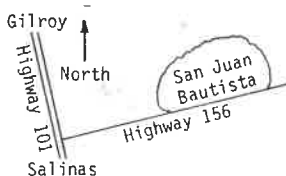
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We Get Letters

The SCVSDA has paid several thousand dollars in the past to subsidize this insurance and it is estimated the price will continue to escalate, costing each dancer an additional \$2.00 per person this year.

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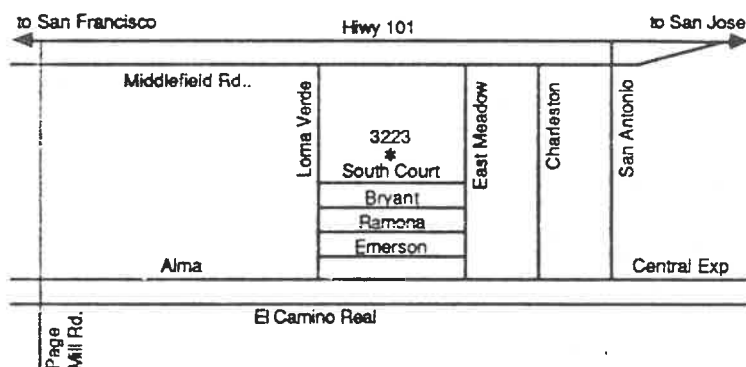
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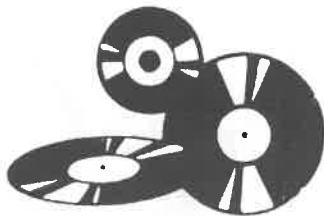
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WHAT'S NEW!!

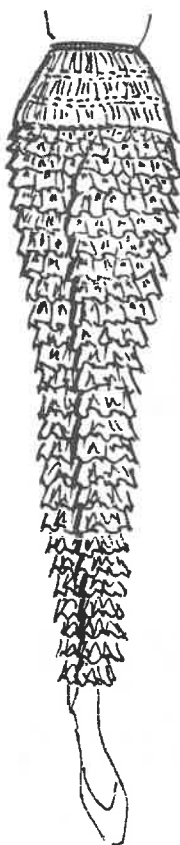

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Stir The Bucket With Betty

The New Year's resolution nationwide seems to be 'get back on the diet! It doesn't have to be drudgery, and good nibblies can still be appreciated. Here are four super recipes: two are from Weight Watchers, and two are from dancers. Bon appetit!



COCKTAIL PECANS

- 1 egg white
- 1 tsp. water
- 1 lb. pecans
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 tsp. salt
- 2 tsp. cinnamon

Beat egg white with water until foamy. Pour in nuts and stir until coated. Combine sugar, salt and cinnamon and pour over nuts. Spread on cookie sheet and sprinkle with salt. Bake at 300° F. for 45 minutes, stirring every 15 minutes. Remove from oven and sprinkle with salt. Cool, break up nuts, and store in airtight container.

CRACKERS A LA REDA

- 1 tsp. garlic powder
- 2 tsp. dill weed
- 1 pkg. dry ranch dressing mix
- 1 pkg. oyster crackers
- 1/2 cup oil

Mix together well, garlic powder, dill weed and ranch dressing mix. Mix dry ingredients, crackers and oil together well. Let dry about 30 minutes. Can be warmed for 10 minutes in the oven before serving.

STUFFED CHERRY TOMATOES

- 12 cherry tomatoes
- 1/3 cup cottage cheese
- 1 ounce drained canned salmon
- 1/4 tsp. chopped fresh dill
- dash grated lemon peel (opt.)
- garnish: dill sprigs

Cut thin slice from stem end of each tomato and set aside. Scoop out pulp from tomatoes, discarding pulp and reserving shells; set shells upside-down on paper towels to



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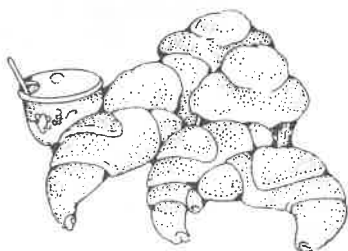
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drain. In blender combine cheese, salmon, dill and lemon peel and process until smooth. With pastry bag, or small spoon, fill each tomato shell with an equal amount of cheese mixture. Arrange on tray; garnish with reserved tomato slices cut into halves and dill sprigs.

TEX-MEX CRESCENTS

- 4 (1 oz. each) ready-to-bake refrigerated buttermilk flaky biscuits
- 2 oz. reduced-calorie Cheddar process cheese slices, shredded
- 2 black olives, finely chopped

- 2 pimento-stuffed green olives, finely chopped
- 1 Tbsp. green onion, finely chopped
- 1 tsp. prepared mustard
- dash crushed red pepper
- dash hot sauce
- 1 - 2 Tbsp. water
- 1 tsp. sesame seeds

Preheat oven to 350° F. Separate each biscuit into halves. Using your hands or a rolling pin, flatten each piece of dough into a 3" circle. In small bowl, using a fork, combine cheese, olives, onion, mustard, pepper, and hot sauce. Spoon 1/8 of mixture onto each dough circle and fold dough over filling, turnover style, forming eight crescents; using tines of fork, press edges of each crescent to seal. Transfer crescents to non-stick baking sheet, brush each crescent lightly with water, and sprinkle each with 1/8 teaspoon sesame seed; bake until crescents are lightly browned, 8 to 10 minutes.

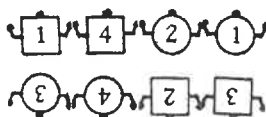
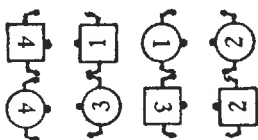
Definition

(CALLERLAB April 1984) Starting formation: Appropriate facing dancers (e.g., facing lines, or eight-chain thru). All Pass Thru and Face Out.

(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #979.)

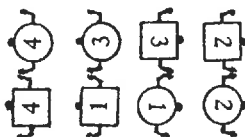
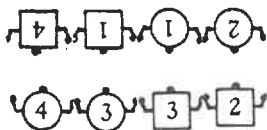

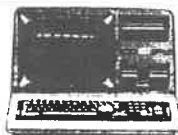

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Dancing Hints

Pass Out is another example of an Advanced call that has some very "sudden or quick" formation changes that can 'catch you by surprise' if you are even slightly out of position or disoriented. Additionally, Pass Out is yet one more call in which EVERY dancer has an equally-important part in its execution to ensure successful completion of the call.

The main "secrets to success" for proper execution of Pass Out are very similar to those actions (nearly identical) that are required for the companion call Pass In (see The Prompter, October 1987). You must positively KNOW that you are (or are not) directly facing another dancer; and when facing another dancer you must pass right shoulders with that dancer and immediately face out (one quarter) away from the center of the set; AND you will become "partners" with the same dancer upon completion of the call. This means

that EACH of the dancers originally facing each other at the start of the call will complete the call with that same dancer; and BOTH OF YOU will end the call facing the SAME direction (away from the center of the set).

Pass Out is another call that can have MANY starting formations, and successful identification of "Who is Facing??" also identifies those dancers who can (and must) execute the call. If you ARE NOT directly facing another dancer, you must not do anything when this call is called. In that specific case, you must avoid the natural tendency to "move"; and you must 'hold your position exactly' until the caller uses a call that you can do. Please remember that 'the caller put you there, and it's the caller's job to determine what to call next'.

Dancing While Cruising

Some of the cruise teachers also have a different name for the same basic and, so, you have to pay very close attention. In some respects this can be very helpful



and, at other times, misleading.

Darryl and Lucia Calloway, of the Noordam, are very good teachers and also excellent exhibition dancers. The evening shows were well presented and related to the music; I enjoyed the shows. We will never use the dances in round dancing, but it's nice to see the performance.

The interesting and amusing part was the Rumba box -- being described as a Waltz box-- Forward, Side, Close. In round dancing we have always used the two-step box (sd, clo, fwd) as the Rumba box. In retrospect, we are **on the beat**, and the American Ballroom was two beats of music slow. This is the usual type of OFF BEAT dancing we see in the Fox Trot. As a matter of fact, I believe now that figures were all transposed Fox Trot figures. That's life!

Also, I noticed that most of the dancers were doing a form of Rock and Roll dancing. Regardless of the music, when the ship rocked and rolled, so did the dancers!

Where have all the new A&C dancers gone, long time passing...

Drop the words A&C dancers and substitute "young men" in the above and this may take you back to the days of Peter, Paul & Mary. They too have faded from popularity. While the drop in new square dancers hasn't really hit the A&C clubs so as to be noticeable yet, wait around and it will hit yours.

Many of us, including me, who have been members of, or callers for, a successful C or A club have not really been that aware of, or concerned about, the fact that Plus and Mainstream clubs are not gaining ground as far as new dancers are concerned.

I read more about classes that were cancelled than I do about rousing successes. It seems that most of these beginners classes are turning into Plus workshops that are not that successful either, as regards turn out of dancers.

With this seeming to be the trend, how long will it be before the Plus workshop will be turned into the Advanced class because of a poor turn out at Plus? Will this trend then become the Advanced class that was turned into the Challenge class due to a poor turn out for Advanced? **How many levels can we go up for more dancers before square dancing disappears?**

Of course, the limitations of their club callers will determine the

things most clubs can do to reach into the higher levels to try to attract dancers to keep their clubs in operation, but many will try even when they are not capable. This will only further erode the image of the caller and club, and, in the long run, will prove to be the downfall of both.

What is the answer? Of course it's obvious, **more new dancers!** What are the A&C dancers doing to help? Speaking for myself, very little or nothing that is productive! How about you? When was the last time you tried to interest a friend of yours into going to a class and learning to square dance? Probably not lately, huh?

Why is this? Well, it seems to me that we have gotten into our own little elitist world where the "others" of square dancing really don't exist. We hold an Advanced or Challenge class or C or A hoedown and a lot of dancers show up, so what's the problem, right?

We are not aware of the one or two Plus clubs that folded last month, or the beginners' classes that didn't turn out enough dancers to continue, so we go on thinking all is well, or we don't really care! Yes, it's too bad that a twenty- or thirty-year-old club folded, they must have done something wrong, but that's their problem not ours, or is it?

Yes, there is a tendency for most people to try to reach the highest level they can achieve, and this is what keeps the dancers coming into the A&C levels. However, we have lost sight of where they come from -- the Plus club!

If the trend continues, we may find ourselves holding classes at the A&C level for NEW dancers, and I **DO** mean people who have never danced before.

Imagine an A&C dancer who never danced Mainstream or Plus! Would it work? We may have to try it and find out to keep our level going. I once knew a couple who learned to round dance before they learned to square dance, believe it, or not?

See you in a Star Tip! I hope!

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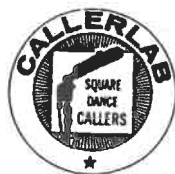

MAINSTREAM QUARTERLY SELECTION - "RETAIN YOUR LANE"

Decko Deck, Chairman of the Mainstream Quarterly Selection Committee, announces that "Retain Your Lane" is the Mainstream Quarterly Selection for the period beginning January 1, 1988.

RETAIN YOUR LANE

Starting formation(s): Parallel two-faced lines or parallel ocean waves. Ends Circulate twice (two positions) as the Centers Hinge. The very centers Trade and then Cast Off 3/4 with the ends. Author's note: If the centers are facing the same direction, the Hinge is danced as a Partner Hinge. This allows starting formations such as 3 & 1 Lines and Outfacing Lines. Timing 8 - 10 beats.

PLUS QUARTERLY SELECTION - "CROSS THE OCEAN"

Ken Ritucci, Chairman of the Plus Quarterly Selection Committee, is pleased to announce that "Cross the Ocean" has been selected as the Plus Quarterly Selection for the period beginning February 1, 1988.

CROSS THE OCEAN Larry Letson, Author

Starting formation: From Facing Couples (assume normal couples for ease of description), women diagonally pass right shoulders and then face right to become ends of right-hand waves. As soon as the women clear the center, the men diagonally start to pass left shoulders, but when they meet, they join lefts and Single Hinge to become centers of the final waves. Timing: 4 - 6 beats.

Zero Box to Zero Line Module:
Swing Thru, Boys Run, **Retain Your Lane**, Bend the Line, Slide Thru, Pass Thru, Trade By, Slide Thru.

Singing Call Figure

Heads Square Thru, Do Sa Do to an Ocean Wave, **Retain Your Lane**, Right & Left Thru, Swing Thru, Turn Thru, Corner Swing & Promenade.

By (keep/drop) vote of the full membership of CALLERLAB, "Connect Four" has been dropped from the Mainstream Quarterly Selection list.

The only current Mainstream Quarterly Selection is "Retain Your Lane".

Get out from Zero Line (L1P):
Right & Left Thru, **Cross the Ocean**, Right & Left Grand!

Singing Call Figure

Heads Square Thru, Do Sa Do, Swing Thru, Men Trade, Men Run, Bend the Line, Right & Left Thru, **Cross the Ocean**, Scootback, Swing Corner & Promenade (add 16 beat tag).

The results of the PQS Keep/Drop Ballot voted upon by the full membership was to drop "Compress to a Column" effective immediately.

The current Plus Quarterly Selections are: Scoot & Relocate, Rock the Boat, and Cross the Ocean.

All 8 Swing Thru, Arky Allemande, Arky Grand, and Cross Cloverleaf.

A-2 Calls Dropped

All Four Couples Pass Thru, All Four Couples Cross Trail thru, and Beau/Belle Naming Convention.

Calls Added to Advanced List

Diamond Chain Thru, Grand Quarter Thru, Grand Three-Quarter Thru, Transfer & (anything).

The added calls will be temporarily assigned to the A-2 program. Review and discussion by the Advanced Committee will take place at the CALLERLAB Convention in Reno, Nevada in March

1988. Bulk distribution of the revised Advanced lists is now available through the CALLERLAB Office, Box 679, Pocono Pines, PA 18350. Cost is \$4.50 per 100 (including postage).

The above changes are effective immediately.

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TEACH FOR SUCCESS!!!

JACK MURTHA COMMENTS!

I read with interest your article titled, "Teach for Success" (November 1987), and the follow-up article "Teach for Success", part two (December 1987). I want to commend you on the research you are doing relative to the numbers of new dancers, clubs and graduate dancers in your area. Square dancing needs more solid statistical information to help identify our present dancer base. It appears evident that there are fewer than 1,000,000 in organized programs nationwide, but we have no reliable statistics which pin down an actual number. Perhaps with your leadership more qualified researchers will turn their attention to establishing our base population and identifying techniques to measure whether experimental changes such as those you suggest increase or decrease that population.

Your article leaves an erroneous impression about Callerlab's current programs. You state, "Until recently, there was only one teaching order recognized by CALLERLAB." There is still only one teaching order recognized by Callerlab! I believe what you are referring to is the work of two Callerlab committees which are studying possible revisions for Callerlab discussion and possible action. One committee is studying the possibility of combining the Mainstream and Plus Programs into one program. They suggest starting by moving about one fourth of the listed Plus calls to the Mainstream Program. The other committee is studying the continued separation of the two programs, but italicizing a few more MS calls allowing

WE RESPOND!

Jack Murtha's response raises several points which require comment:

First, my reference to multiple teaching orders comes from the official CALLERLAB press release dated July 3, 1986, entitled "What's this I hear about new CALLERLAB programs?" That release listed several new destination programs.

1. Regarding the 25 week 'Bold Face Type' Mainstream program: "This means that having completed 25 learning sessions, dancers will have reached a destination where they can join clubs in their area using just these movements... In many areas, the entire Mainstream list may be covered over time. This trial program... may only be a shortened 'Learn to Dance' lesson period. Other areas will use the 25 week list of Bold Face Type Basics as a DESTINATION program." (Emphasis by CALLERLAB.)

2. Regarding the 'Soft Plus' program: "A shortened Mainstream Program with fewer moves that can be taught in 25 weeks and which may include some number of Plus calls... this, too, is a DESTINATION program and not a stepping stone." (CALLERLAB's emphasis.)

3. "Community Dance Program... is geared toward a limited repertoire of calls that can be taught effectively in a six-week time frame... this, too, is a DESTINATION program and not a stepping stone to some other existing programs." (CALLERLAB's emphasis.)

Subsequent to that release, CALLERLAB members voted to accept on a trial basis the 'Bold Face' Mainstream and 'Soft Plus'

teachers to delay the instruction of those calls. These committees held hearings at the Callerlab convention last year and will hold hearings again this year.

Last fall I conducted a survey of all 240 Callerlab members in eleven states which list 70-78% of their clubs as Mainstream clubs. my study of the calling practices of the callers in these states verifies that those Mainstream percentages are quite representative. From the results of my survey (94% of those responding want separate programs), the animated discussions at the Callerlab hearings, the reported actions of some areas trying these experimental programs (the first action of a Canadian Province in agreeing to try the experimental list was to eliminate all Plus calls) and the recent results of surveys by the Mainstream Committee, it seems to me apparent that we have a very large caller population which does not want the Mainstream and Plus Programs combined into one program. I'm surprised by your enthusiasm for combining the programs for your area in light of your comments regarding the merging of the former Plus One and Plus Two Programs.

Callerlab will decide in march whether or not to begin combining these two programs into one as your area has already done. Callerlab has only one set of programs now and I'm sure will have only one set of programs following Reno whether or not changes are made.

California and Florida are almost unique in the degree to which they have eliminated their Mainstream Programs. Over half the clubs worldwide are still dancing and enjoying the Mainstream Program. I think you will find, as I have, a lot of positive support for the MS Program described by Lois Montgomery in your February 1987 issue. I, personally, have discovered the problem for callers in California who call in areas which are going their own way. There are now at least three separate programs being used in California which are different than the

teaching orders. Finally, the following appeared in the April, 1987 issue of 'DIRECTION', the newsletter for members of CALLERLAB:

WHICH LIST

"It is not a question of which list you must use in teaching your classes. CALLERLAB is not suggesting that there is a single list that will meet the needs of all areas. Each caller/teacher should use the list which best meets the needs in his/her area -- the list which will best prepare one's dancers to dance competently in the area concerned."

Jack, that says to me that CALLERLAB recognizes more than one teaching order!!

Our enthusiasm for combining the current Plus and Mainstream programs - as a teaching order - exists because in our area we have only one level - Plus level - and we need to better prepare our dancers for the reality of open dances at that level. It makes no sense to give the dancers in our area months of practice doing Star Promenade when Flip the Diamond is what is going to be called on Saturday night. We have not (in the Santa Clara Valley) eliminated from our area teaching order any of the calls from either the CALLERLAB Mainstream or Plus Programs. We don't know where you called your dances, but, as you know, callers are independent businessmen and make independent decisions.

What you need to recognize, Jack, is that we, and many callers and leaders, believe that for square dancing to survive one thing must happen: The Mainstream and Plus levels must be combined and then, based on the popularity of the calls, the list must be reduced to one National Program which can be easily taught within a normal dancing season, approximately twenty-five weeks. This would reunite the majority of square dancers, once again, in a single DESTINATION (our emphasis) program. If you were to ask your

Callerlab list. I called a Plus dance in one area where dancers did fine on Load the Boat and Spin Chain the Gears, but one whole club broke down on Eight Chain Thru which their caller had decided not to teach. In a second area I had a similar experience, except in that area it was Turn Thru and Spin Chain thru the caller left out.

I'd recommend highly that your leaders read again Lois' letter about square dancing in her new community in Oregon. I'm sure what she describes would never work in San Jose, but everyone should also think twice before imposing a San Jose style program on Lois' new state. Keeping the Mainstream and Plus Programs separate allows local areas to choose what works best for their dancers.

240 callers if they would be in favor of reuniting the dancers, and not just combining the programs, we think you would get an entirely different response.

We recognize that the full Plus program in areas like ours is too extensive for most dancers, and we recognize that human nature dictates that we "not move backward". We also recognize that Plus moves are not inherently evil and Mainstream moves are not necessarily sacred. While you state that over half the clubs worldwide still dance Mainstream, I believe that statistics show that at least half the dancers dance Plus. If 50% of our dancing population is dancing the Plus program, there must be something within that program which is enjoyable to those dancers. Surely, you would have to agree, Jack, that Relay the Deucey has more going for it than Spin Chain Thru!
