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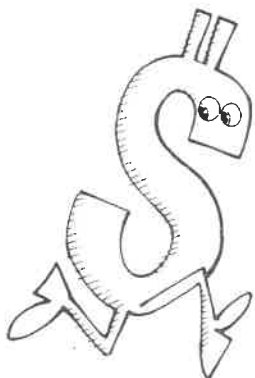
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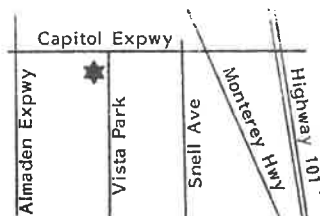


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"OUR" OPINION !

And that, dear readers, is the true tale of why the March issue had two calendars!



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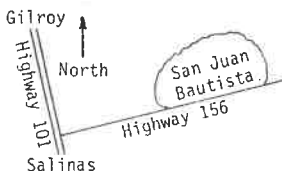

Amidst the vehement exhortation about teaching orders and levels, which are being bandied about in "The Prompter" and "Dancers Diggins"; and among all the impassioned promoting for "frequency-of-use" data and "scientific methodology", some seem to forget (or ignore) the fact that, agree with it or not, there is an existing level structure in square

dancing. And, until it is formally changed, those who put on dances really ought to conform to this structure.

We recently attended two dances which illustrate what we think is a serious breach of faith between the dancers and those putting on the dances. One was a dance featuring Bill Davis and Mike Sikorsky, sponsored by the Top 8's. This dance was advertised in The Prompter as an "Easy A-1 Level" dance. We don't know what "Easy A-1" means technically, but we really don't believe "Chain Reaction - Do Not Turn the Star" or "Chain Reaction - Turn the Star 1/2" qualify as Easy A-1, since neither call is in the A-1 Syllabus. These, together with several APD calls and some very strange non-calls, such as "Swing Thru Once and a Quarter", made us feel that we, as newer A-1 dancers, were out of our depth, and clearly at other than an Easy A-1 dance. We feel we need definitions from Callerlab or "someone" as to what we can expect at dances which advertise levels. Be assured that if the Davis-Sikorsky dance had been advertised as it was called, we would have stayed home.

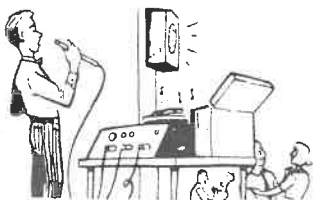
The other dance was quite the opposite situation. We went to the Valley Travelers Plus level ticket dance to hear Wade Driver, known to us by reputation as a Legendary Caller. We drove all the way to Pleasanton from San Jose, in a high state of anticipation. Unfortunately, it was a disappointing evening for us. The sound was abominable, so

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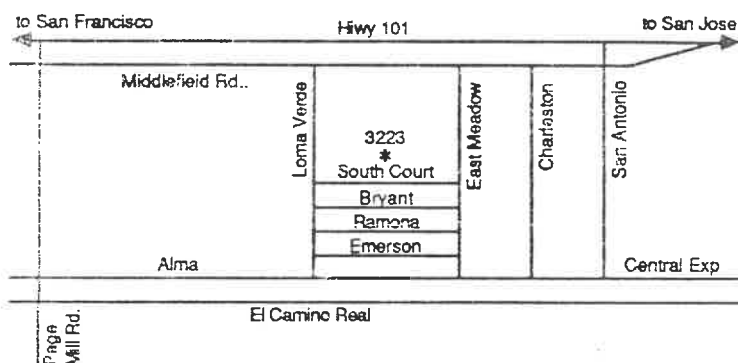
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loud that there was often acoustical feedback from the microphones, and as a result we felt the sound was often garbled and the calls unrecognizable. More important, however, the question of Truth in Advertising came up again, since the actual level of the dance seemed to be more Mainstream than Plus, with some standard position Plus thrown in. At the end of the dance an A-2 Star Tip was announced. We thought this a little unusual at a Plus dance and especially at such a low-level Plus dance. The A-2 tip turned out to be A-1 with a couple of A-2 calls toward the end. All in all the evening was dissatisfying and we drove home with a vague, nagging sense of having wasted our time and energy.

The real issue, we think, is Truth in Advertising. Are we wrong to feel this way? Are our expectations too high? Does anyone other than us really care? Do we go back to the rule-of-thumb that says the only really Plus dances are those put on by Advanced clubs?

(You have discovered one of the immutable truths in square dancing today -- there really is no such thing as an "absolute" level. Many factors affect any level: the calls used, timing, stacking of calls, amount of cueing, how crowded the floor is, caller judgment, etc.

A caller must use his judgment as to the level appropriate for a

particular floor of dancers, and most callers aim for "at least 90% of the dancers dancing 90% of the time". Therefore, you can see that if your skills and experience, in relation to those of the floor as a whole, were to be at the lower end, you might think the dance too hard; or, if at the upper end, the dance might seem too easy. A dance that, to you, would be a "really Plus dance" might well be a disaster for the other dancers in attendance.

At the Advanced level, of course, callers have much more freedom in the use of concepts and fractionalization than at the Plus level and this is considered to be part of the interest of the Advanced level. The term "Easy" is a subjective one and varies with the caller and the abilities of the floor.

While, optimistically, callers would like to please all of the dancers all of the time, this is not usually possible. If you feel the level of a dance is not as advertised, we recommend that you ask for your money back and vote with your feet! Ed.)

**THERE GOES
THE NEIGHBORHOOD!**

At a seminar of teachers in Las Vegas we were discussing the introduction of ballroom figures in round dancing, in particular as it applied to cueing and dance style. Since there has been so much controversy about the demarcation line between where round dancing ends and ballroom begins, one of the teachers offered a most interesting analogy: In our society there exists a continuum of those people who lean toward comic books and those who enjoy Homer's Odyssey. Can we say that one is a form of reading and the other is not? Likewise, as long as we have a pattern of couple dancing where all the ingredients of round dancing are present -- a regular pattern of choreography, cue sheets, phrasing to fit the music, etc. -- how do we identify the rascals and when do we cast them out?

When do you cross over into the Netherlands -- when you learn to do a Telemark and Whisk, or when you learn to do a Telemark and Whisk correctly? It is possible to make a case for showmanship versus enjoyment in comfortable dancing, however, a critical



attitude toward those who aspire for improvement should not be a criterion.

On our first trip to Japan to teach round dancing we discovered that it had only been introduced a scant five years before. Here was a chance to see how evolution had affected a neophyte community. It was quite interesting, but what struck us as most significant was to see the square and round dance leaders in perfect accord. Most of them "doubled in brass", and since nobody told them that Advanced level round dancing was incompatible with square dancing, they had no inhibitions about it.

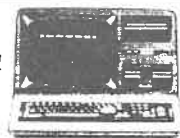
Advanced level round dancing has certainly inched its way into a higher degree of difficulty, but it does not deserve some of the castigation it has been receiving.

ROUNDALAB will, again, hold a six-hour Teacher's Seminar/Clinic on the Wednesday following the ROUNDALAB Annual Convention and prior to the National Square Dance Convention. It will be held on Wednesday, June 22, 1988 at the Marriott Hotel in Anaheim, California. While the Seminar/Clinic is primarily for round dance teachers, any person interested in round dancing is welcome to attend.

The sessions will cover teaching techniques for figures in ROUNDALAB's Phase II through Phase VI. Rhythms to be covered include Two-Step, Waltz, Foxtrot, Rumba and Cha-Cha. The morning and afternoon clinics will each include one two-hour session and a one-hour session. The format will be a seminar/clinic presentation with audience participation. A luncheon, which is included in the admission, will be served at noon.

The clinicians are Bill & Helen Stairwalt (Donna, Texas & Libertyville, Illinois), Dwain & Judy Sechrist (San Jose, California), and Eddie & Audrey Palmquist (El Toro, California). Chairmen of this committee are John & Mary Macuci (District Heights, Maryland).

Since attendance will be limited by the size of the room at the Marriott, advance registration is

required. Contact the ROUNDALAB Office, 3 Churchill Road, Cresskill, NJ 07626-1698 for registration and/or further information.

ROUNDALAB will also present three two-hour programs at the 37th National Square Dance Convention in Anaheim, California. The daily presentations will be from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. in the Marriott Hotel. On Thursday, Ray & Jean Hanna, along with Gene Brakeman (both from California), will discuss the "Operation and Care of Sound Systems, Including Microphones, for Round Dancing". "Cue Sheet Reading for Dancers and Teachers" will be the topic covered by Harmon & Betty Jorritsma (California) on Friday. Bill & Helen Stairwalt (Texas, Illinois) will discuss, on Saturday, "Teaching Progression of Family Figures from Phase to Phase and within Phases II, III, IV". Handouts will be available at all sessions. Betty & Clancy Mueller (New Whiteland, Indiana) are chairmen of the committee making the arrangements for these programs.

Both dancers and teachers are encouraged and welcome to come and participate in the seminars. The location of these informative sessions will be found in the NSDC Convention Book.



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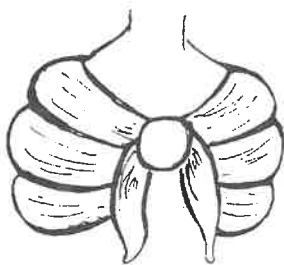
Fashionable Thoughts by Martibel

We are pleased to share the pattern with you again at the request of Evette Dilley.

KNITTED MAJORCAN-STYLE BOLERO



MATERIALS NEEDED

6 oz. 4-ply yarn (Columbia, Minerva, Glimmer, Fluff, Roly Poly, Dazzle, etc.)
1 pair Size 13 knitting needles
1 pair Size 7 knitting needles

DIRECTIONS

Using #7 needles, cast on 74 sts.

(A) K1, P1 for 6 rows.

Change to #13 needles.

(B) K1, P1 for 10 rows. Always knit 1st stitch in the regular way but all other knit stitches, knit into the stitch below to make a loose stitch.

Change to #7 needles.

(C) Knit 6 rows as per (A), increasing in every 7th st. in 1st row (84 sts).

Change to #13 needles.

(D) Knit 12 rows as per (B).

Change to #7 needles.

(E) Knit 6 rows as per (A), increasing in every 8th st. in 1st row (94 sts).

Change to #13 needles.

(F) Knit 14 rows as per (B).

Change to #7 needles.

(G) Knit 6 rows as per (A), increasing in every 10th stitch in 1st row (114 sts).

Change to #13 needles.

(H) Knit 16 rows as per (B). Bind off.

TIES

With #7 needles, right side facing you, pick up 41 sts. along the side of the garment. Always knit first 4 sts. and last 4 sts. of every row.

Row 1: K4, P33, K4

Row 2: K4, K1, P1 (7 times), K2 tog, K1, *K2 tog in back of stitches, K1, P1 (7 times), K4 (39 sts)

*Always do second K2 tog in back of sts.

Row 3: K4, K1, P1 (7 times), P3, K1, P1 (7 times), K4

Row 4: K4, K1, P1 (6 times), K1, K2 tog, K1, K2 tog, P1, K1, P1 (6 times), K4 (37 sts.)

Row 5: K4, K1, P1 (6 times), K1, P4, K1, P1 (6 times), K4

Row 6: K4, K1, P1 (6 times), K2 tog, K1, K2 tog, K1, P1 (6 times), K4 (35 sts.)

Row 7: K4, K1, P1 (6 times), P3, K1, P1 (6 times), K4

Row 8: K4, K1, P1 (5 times), K1, K2 tog, K1, K2 tog, P1, K1, P1 (5 times), K4 (33 sts.)

Row 9: K4, K1, P1 (5 times), K1, P4, K1, P1 (5 times), K4

Row 10: K4, K1, P1 (5 times), K2 tog, K1, K2 tog, K1, P1 (5 times), K4 (31 sts.)

Row 11: K4, K1, P1 (5 times), P3, K1, P1 (5 times), K4

Row 12: K4, K1, P1 (4 times), K1, K2 tog, K1, K2 tog, P1, K1, P1 (4 times), K4 (29 sts.)

Row 13: K4, K1, P1 (4 times), K1, P4, K1, P1 (4 times), K4

Row 14: K4, K1, P1 (4 times), K2 tog, K1, K2 tog, K1, P1 (4 times), K4 (27 sts.)

Row 15: K4, K1, P1 (4 times), P3, K1, P1 (4 times), K4

Row 16: K4, K1, P1 (3 times), K1, K2 tog, K1, K2 tog, P1, K1, P1 (3 times), K4 (25 sts.)

Row 17: K4, K1, P1 (3 times), K1, P4, K1, P1 (3 times), K4

Row 18: K4, K1, P1 (3 times), K2 tog, K1, K2 tog, K1, P1 (3 times), K4 (23 sts.)

Row 19: K4, K1, P1 (3 times), P3, K1, P1 (3 times), K4

Row 20: K4, K1, P1 (2 times), K1, K2 tog, K1, K2 tog, P1, K1, P1 (2 times), K4 (21 sts.)

Row 21: K4, K1, P1 (2 times), K1, P4, K1, P1 (2 times), K4

Row 22: K4, K1, P1 (2 times), K2 tog, K1, K2 tog, K1, P1 (2 times), K4 (19 sts.)

Row 23: K4, K1, P1 (2 times), P3, K1, P1 (2 times), K4

Row 24: K4, K1, P1, K1, K2 tog, K1, K2 tog, P1, K1, P1, K4 (17 sts.)

Row 25: K4, K1, P1, K1, P4, K1, P1, K4

Row 26: K4, K1, P1, K2 tog, K1, K2 tog, K1, P1, K4 (15 sts.)

Row 27: K4, K1, P1, P3, K1, P1, K4

Row 28: K4, K1, K2 tog, K1, K2 tog, P1, K4 (13 sts.)

Row 29: K4, K1, P3, K1, K4

Row 30: K4, K2 tog, K1, K2 tog, K4 (11 sts.)

Row 31: K4, P3, K4 (11 sts.)

Row 32: K11 (11 sts.)

Row 33: K4, P3, K4 (11 sts.)

Repeat Rows 32 and 33 until desired length of ties (40 rows). Knit every row for 8 rows. Bind off.

Repeat on other side of garment for matching tie.

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Stir The Bucket With Betty

Bon appetite, everyone! Here are some delicious new recipes which I know you'll enjoy! Many thanks for those recipes that are sent our way. Nothing is as good as a "tried and true" favorite!

SALMON CASSEROLE

- 2 cups cooked rice
- 2 beaten eggs
- 2 cups creamed cottage cheese
- 1 lb. can red salmon
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 1 can water chestnuts, chopped
- 1/4 cup green pepper, chopped
- 2 tsp. soy sauce
- 1 cup cracker or bread crumbs
- 1 (4 oz.) can sliced mushrooms
- 3 Tbsp. butter or margarine
- 5 Tbsp. flour
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 1/2 cups milk
- 1 small pkg. frozen peas, thawed
- 2 Tbsp. chopped pimentos

Combine first 8 ingredients, mix well, place into 9"x13" baking dish, sprinkle with crumbs, and bake at 350° for 40 minutes. In the meantime, saute mushrooms in butter, stir in flour and salt. Add milk and cook until thickened. Add peas and pimentos, cook until peas are done. Cut casserole into squares and serve with sauce.

FAT CITY SQUARES

- 1 (14 oz.) pkg. light caramels
- 2/3 cup (1 sm can) evaporated milk
- 1 pkg. chocolate cake mix
- 3/4 cup butter
- 1 cup chopped nuts
- 2 cups semisweet chocolate chips

In heavy saucepan, combine caramels and 1/3 cup milk. Cook over low heat, stirring constantly, to melt caramels. Set aside. In large bowl, combine cake mix, butter, 1/3 cup milk and nuts. Stir by hand until dough holds together. Press half of dough in greased, floured 9"x13" pan. Bake 6 minutes at 350°. Remove from oven. Spread melted caramels over cooked dough. Spread with chocolate chips, then cover with reserved dough. Bake an additional 15 to 18 minutes. Cool slightly, refrigerate for 30 minutes to set caramels, then cut.

ALTA'S BAKED BEANS

- 1 smoked sausage (kielbasa, linguicia, or chorizo)
- 1 Tbsp. oil
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 1 Tbsp. molasses
- 1 Tbsp. dry mustard
- 1/2 tsp. each allspice, cumin, cinnamon, coriander, and garlic powder
- 1 drop Tabasco sauce
- salt & pepper, to taste
- 1 can (#303) tomato sauce
- 1 can (#202) kidney beans
- 3 cans (#303) pinto beans
- 2 cans (#303) pork and beans

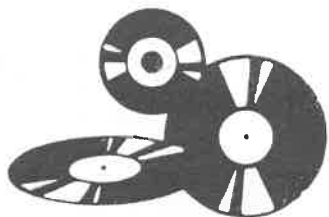
Cut up sausage and saute in oil until light brown. Add chopped onion and saute until onions are transparent. Add molasses, mustard, spices, Tabasco, salt and pepper, tomato sauce; bring to a boil. Drain kidney and pinto beans and rinse with warm water. Add beans to sauce and simmer to meld flavors.

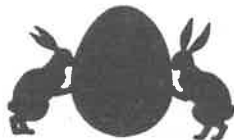

One blouse has a modified western yoke with a collarless round neck. The skirt is eight gores with trimmed scallops three-quarters of the way down. The second blouse is V-necked with a large, double, circular cut ruffle and three-quarter sleeves. The skirt is divided into three tiers by small, contrasting ruffles. Jean Hardy patterns are expensive, but she

Fine Tune Records is back in business again with "Save the Last Dance for Me" (106) by Phil Farmer, but better news still is that their old release "Pick Me Up on Your Way Down" (103) is available again. 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BEYOND MAINSTREAM

QUARTER IN (CALLERLAB Advanced Call #21)

Definition

(CALLERLAB April 1984) Starting formation: Anywhere "partner" is defined, or the call Face In (toward the center of your half of the set) can be done. Turn 1/4 in place to face your partner. If you

have no partner (as in a Diamond), then Face In toward the center of your half of the set.

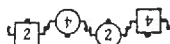
(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #60.)

QUARTER IN

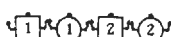

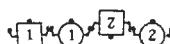
Waves (L/R)

Turn 1/4 to face partner. If no partner, Face In (toward your half).



Dancing Hints

Quarter In is yet one more call that can be executed very rapidly. And, if you are the least bit 'out of position' or hesitant, this call can 'catch you by surprise' in a manner that may cause the square to break down. Additionally, this call is another example where EVERY dancer has an equally important part in assuring the correct execution of the call (and assuring correct ending formation).

The main 'secret to success' for Quarter In is to very quickly establish exactly where you are in the set and WHO is your partner (if there is one). In most situations: 1) When you are a center dancer, your partner is the nearest end dancer (and vice-versa); and 2) When you have no partner, you will turn 1/4 toward the nearest (or

next) dancer (on your side) to properly execute the Face In action.

It is recognized that there are some minor exceptions to the above "rules" (such as when the caller directs the call ONLY to the centers or ends of the starting formation, and/or when the caller directs ONLY certain dancers to Face In), but the "rules" above are true often enough to be used in just about every case.

When executing your portion of this call, you should be 'very crisp' in your 1/4 turning action, and you should avoid any tendency to 'wander' or move out of position. A clean, crisp turn in place is recommended for you to achieve a high degree of success with Quarter In.

14. Welcome Wagon/Newcomers distribute information to new residents.

15. Store window displays.

16. Newspapers - dailies, weeklies, "shoppers", news and paid ads.

17. Radio - free spots, paid ads, weekly forum series, talk show call-ins.

18. Church bulletin board, program and newsletters.

19. Area magazines, national magazines for dancers.

20. Television - cable offers golden opportunity for series.

21. Personal gimmick opportunities - pins, emblems, aerial flags, bumper stickers, jackets, "you have been patronized by square dancers" cards.

22. Sponsor benefit dances.

23. Service club programs.

24. Create a float for an area parade.

25. One night stands.

26. Library - posters, magazines, donate teaching records.

27. Joint sponsorship of class.

28. Electronic bank sign.

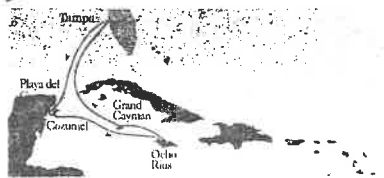

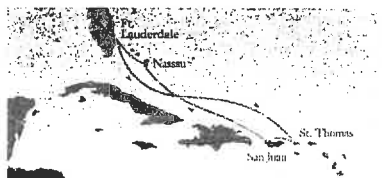

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HANDS UP VS. HANDS DOWN

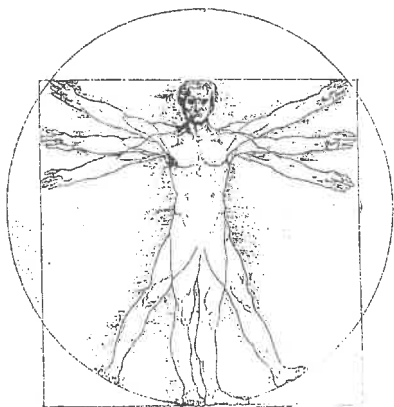
(In the January issue, Ed Foote began his discussion on "hands up" vs. "hands down" with a review of styling resolutions passed by CALLERLAB in 1974 and in 1985. He also spoke to CALLERLAB inconsistency in call definitions.)

CALLERLAB INCONSISTENCY REGARDING STANDARDIZATION

Those in favor of "hands up" say standardization is important--that there should only be one approved styling method for each call. This sounds reasonable until we realize that Callerlab has approved more than one styling method for some calls. Examples:

1. Swing Your Partner. The Callerlab definition says either a Walk Around Swing or a Buzz Step Swing is acceptable, and each method is defined.

2. Thar Family. The Callerlab definition says that when the men are in the center, they will use a packsaddle/box star; but when the ladies are in the center, they will



merely touch hands.

Thus, when advocates of hands down or forearms are told by advocates of hands up that standardization is vital, they reply: "Which method of Swing Your Partner is Callerlab going to drop" or "Which method of Thar Star is Callerlab going to drop?"

INGRAINED HABIT PATTERNS

Dancers are comfortable with the way in which they have been taught, and they will resist change. The same is true for callers. No matter how logical it may appear for dancers and callers to make a change, they usually resist because they have become accustomed to do what they are doing.

Thus, it is recognized that those currently dancing hands up are not likely to change, and callers who are comfortable with hands up are likely to continue teaching hands up. Likewise, despite the 1974 and 1985 Callerlab resolutions, dancers and callers who



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prefer hands down, or forearms, are likely to continue to use and promote these styles of dancing.

POSSIBLE SOLUTION

It is more than twelve years since Callerlab's resolution on hands up, and the country remains divided. Thus, it would seem logical for Callerlab to recognize the reality of the situation by saying that "hands down or forearms are acceptable alternatives to hands up".

This would give us three approved methods, and let each area adopt the styling with which it is most comfortable. Callerlab's inconsistency problems would remain, but they would not be as glaring.

Is it a problem to have three different methods? While those favoring only one method, especially those favoring hands up, would say yes, reality seems to indicate otherwise. There has been no problem with two different methods of Swing Your Partner, or two

different method of making a Thar Star. We know that different areas have styling variations on other things as well, such as Circle to a Line, Promenade, Courtesy Turn, skirt work, etc., and these variations have not seemed to hurt the square dance activity.

Obviously, variations in styling exist in square dancing today without problem. The problem occurs when one styling method is insisted upon to the exclusion of other methods, especially when other methods have extensive and strong support as in the case of hands down and forearms.

As long as Callerlab insists on hands up, to the exclusion of other alternatives, there will be dissension in the square dance world on this issue. Make all three methods acceptable and dissension will drop.

Thus, it would appear logical to have the three methods of styling recognized and accepted by Callerlab. Let each area choose whichever of the three methods it wishes to adopt, because this situation is what prevails anyway.



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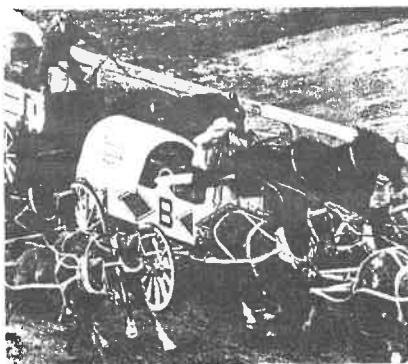
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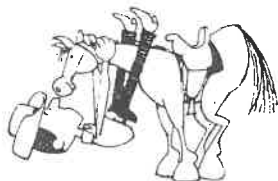

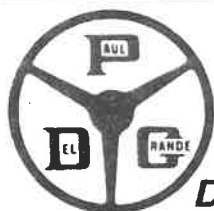
LONGHORNS by Helen Rogers
