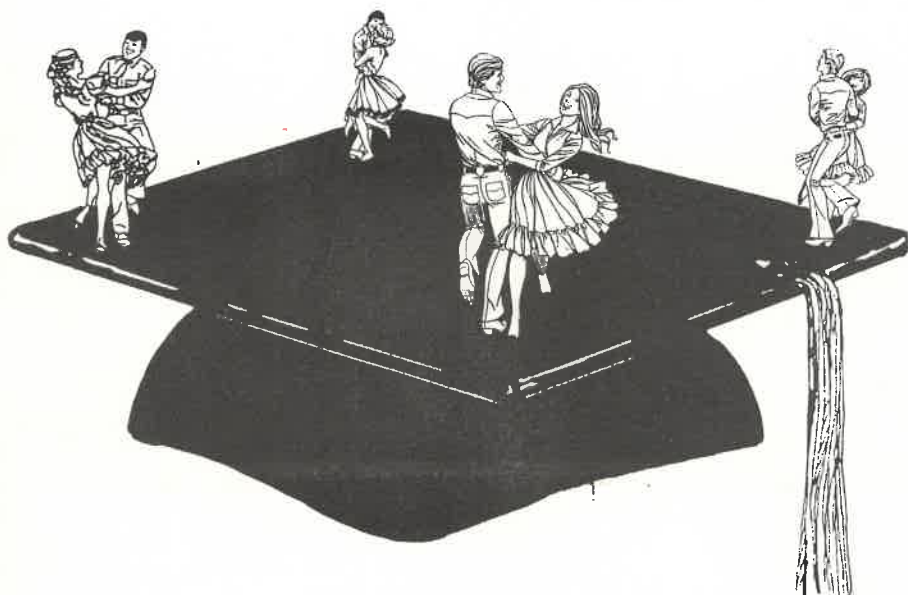


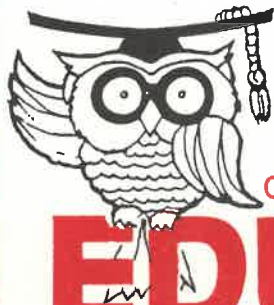

There is one aspect of The Prompter that I think I've discussed once before but would like to emphasize again. And that is our "centerfold" or the center page of the magazine. We've received a couple of inquiries recently that show there is still some confusion over the best way to advertise your hoedowns.

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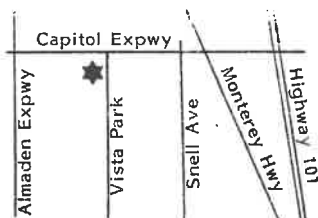
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"OUR" OPINION !

While researching the article on the Santa Clara Valley Square Dancers Association medical insurance, we discovered the following membership numbers for the association. These numbers show the extent of the decline in participation in the square dance activity in this area:

1983	3300
1984	3000
1985	2880
1986	2725
1987	2621
1988	2490

The loss of over 800 members in six years, a 25% decrease, is even more startling when you consider that the trend has been consistently downward.

During the same period, the circulation of The Prompter has declined only slightly. One possible explanation is that those who have dropped out of square dancing were not the active dancers who subscribe to The Prompter and who attend many of the weekend events.

Where are the active dancers? Many clubs report that attendance at their Plus dances is down. Attendance at Advanced dances seems to be as good or better than in the past. Could it be that the Advanced level has become the level of choice of the active dancer?

We happened to pick up a flyer for Dave Abbott's McCloud Dance Country and noticed that many of the Sunday through Thursday packages this year are at the Advanced and Challenge level. In fact, of 23 packages, 16 (70%) are advertised above the Plus level.

To make a comparison, we went back and looked at the Dance Country ad for 1983. There were only 12 packages scheduled that year, and only two (17%) were Advanced. There were no C-1 sessions listed in 1983; in 1988 the schedule includes two weeks of C-1 and one week for C-2.

Square dancing needs to bring new dancers into the activity to rebuild membership and revitalize the Plus level.

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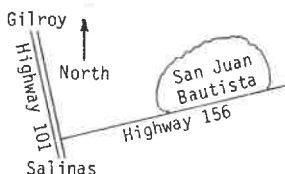

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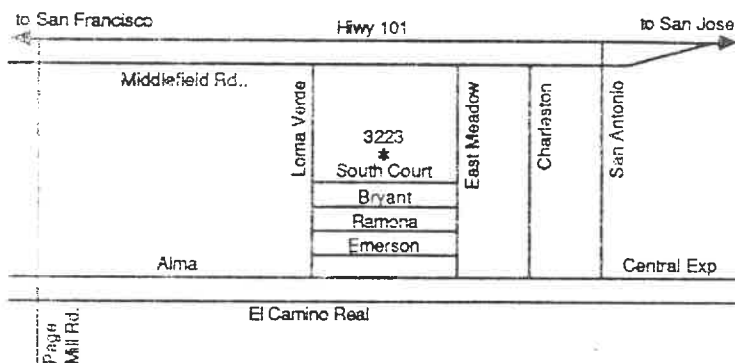

We think this skirt will be the best seller of the season. It is lace-trimmed, comes in seven colors and has a matching blouse with a modified sweetheart neckline. Wear it with the coordinating blouse, or a white blouse, adding a red bow or red necklace and earrings, and you have two cute outfits.

Sam's is now manufacturing petticoats, pettipants and garters in a new silvery grey color, another way to add interest to our square dance wardrobe... try it with pinks, burgundies, reds and blacks.

An Arizona Company has been producing skirt kits for a couple of years and now a California Company has some cute ones on the market. Everything you need for making a skirt: pre-cut fabric, trim, zipper, thread and directions. Watch for them at the National.

Lazy K, the company that makes the beautiful hand-engraved

buckles, has three new ones in silver or gold tones: and old-fashioned locomotive, the classic "End of the Trail" Indian on a horse, and a fierce eagle head. They, like most buckles nowadays, are covered with a finish that prevents scratching without affecting the beauty of the buckles.

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'ROUND' ABOUT

DON'T BOUNCE
by Brian Bassett

One of the first rules in dancing is **don't bounce** up and down while executing various dance figures. This rule rates right up with "Don't look at your feet," and "Don't dance on your toes."

Beginning dancers, once they have become comfortable with their basics, find they need to relax and enjoy dancing the figures they have learned. There is nothing wrong with relaxing and enjoying dancing as long as it is done in such a way as to incorporate proper body mechanics. Fun and enjoyment are often wrongly translated to mean a display of extraneous body motion... bouncing being the most common.

The first place you'll probably notice bouncing is in the "grapevine" dance figure. The vine figure, whether it be a regular vine with both partners crossing in back, or a twisty vine with the man and woman crossing in back, or in front, at opposite times... suffers most in execution and appearance when dancers bounce their way through it.

You'll notice that the crossing steps will take on the dance style of a "limp" with an exaggerated downward motion. You'll also notice that the sideward steps will be



danced with an exaggerated upward motion, causing the dancers to rise on their toes. Put these two exaggerated motions together and the dancers will "bob like corks in the ocean".

It's fun... but "fun" at the expense of proper body mechanics, and rather comical to watch.

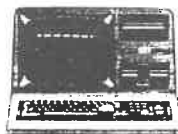
A responsible teacher should explain to his dancers that the legs should act as shock absorbers. Flexed knees (bent slightly, not a crouch) while dancing will eliminate bobbing or bouncing.

While dancing, you progress around the floor in various directions and often turn right or left even while in one spot... both these actions, progressing and turning (also pivoting), are more difficult to execute if your body weight is directed either straight down or straight up. So, for more comfortable, pleasant to watch dancing, keep those knees flexed and **don't bounce!**

A DRESS OF A DIFFERENT FLAIR!

The young lady featured in our column this month is Mary Ann Runyan. She and her partner, Bill Westfield, dance with the Stanford Quads on Sunday evenings and with John Sybalsky's C-2 group on Monday evenings.

Mary Ann is currently in her second year at Foothill College and manages to work part time for SAIC as a word processor.

With this busy schedule, she still finds time to sew. The dress she is modeling is an example of her fine sewing expertise. Mary Ann made this dress last fall to wear to the Jubilee using Authentic Pattern #320.

Cut out the skirt pieces according to the pattern instructions. Assemble the skirt using 3/8" seams instead of the overlay called for in the pattern. It goes together easier and the seams lay flatter. It can be done with or without the lace in the seams.

The bodice has to be recut on other paper. The front is cut as one large piece. Make markings for the darts. Pencil in a cutting line tapering from the left shoulder to the opposite underarm. Next, pencil in a cutting line on the bodice back matching the side seam, tapering up toward the center back so the ruffle has a guide toward the shoulder.

Assemble the bodice and sew it to the skirt, gathering if necessary. Next, insert the zipper.

Cut a ruffle on the straight



fabric grain approximately 90" long and 10" wide. Gather the ruffle to fit the top edge of the bodice. Sew the ruffle to the bodice with the right side of the ruffle against the wrong side of the bodice. Turn the ruffle to the outside of the dress. Sew a seam about 3/8" from the top edge to make a casing to accommodate 1/4" elastic.

Cut two pieces of fabric approximately 14" long and 2" wide. Fold and sew the fabric to make two straps. Sew the straps to the inside of the dress at the casing line in the front and back. The straps will tie in a bow on the shoulder.

Enjoy this dress of a different flair!



Stir The Bucket With Betty

Nothing's better than a family potluck favorite and these recipes are some of the Myers' "special dishes". Thank you, Barbara and Don, for sharing these selections with our readers.

CRANBERRY-RASPBERRY RING

- 1 (3 oz.) pkg. raspberry flavored gelatin
- 1 (3 oz.) pkg. lemon flavored gelatin
- $1\frac{1}{4}$ cups boiling water
- 1 (10 oz.) pkg. frozen red raspberries
- 1 (10 oz.) jar cranberry-orange relish
- $\frac{3}{4}$ cup carbonated water
- 1 Tbsp. lemon juice

Dissolve raspberry and lemon gelatins in boiling water. Stir in frozen raspberries, breaking up large pieces with a fork. Stir in cranberry-orange relish. Slowly pour in carbonated water and lemon juice. Turn into an oiled 6-cup ring mold. Chill overnight. Unmold on lettuce-lined serving plate. Serve with sour cream, if desired.

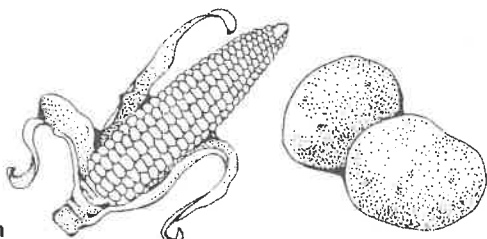
SWEET POTATO & CASHEW BAKE

- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup packed brown sugar
- $\frac{1}{3}$ cup broken cashews
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. salt
- $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. ground ginger
- 2 lbs. sweet potatoes
- 1 (8 oz.) can peach slices, well drained
- 3 Tbsp. butter or margarine

Cook sweet potatoes, peel and cut crosswise into thick pieces (5 or 6 medium). In a bowl, combine brown sugar, cashews, salt and

ginger. In 10x6x2-inch baking dish layer half the sweet potatoes, half the peach slices, and half the brown sugar mixture. Repeat layers. Dot with butter or margarine. Bake, covered, in 350° oven for 30 minutes. Uncover and bake about 10 minutes more. Spoon brown sugar syrup over potatoes before serving.

Serves 6 to 8



SCALLOPED CORN

- 1 egg, beaten
- 1 cup milk
- 1 cup coarsely crushed saltine crackers (22 crackers)
- $\frac{3}{4}$ tsp. salt
- dash pepper
- 1 (17 oz.) can cream-style corn
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup finely chopped onion
- 3 Tbsp. chopped pimiento
- 1 Tbsp. butter or margarine, melted

Combine egg, milk, $\frac{2}{3}$ cup of the cracker crumbs, salt and pepper. Stir in corn, onion and pimiento; mix well. Turn into 1-quart casserole. Toss melted butter with the remaining $\frac{1}{3}$ cup cracker crumbs; sprinkle atop corn mixture. Bake in 350° oven for 65 to 70 minutes.

Well, CALLERLAB has come and gone... (don't I wish). They must have had a swell time, but I guess there really are no problems when you live in a dream world. They always have a theme each year for the meeting. This year's theme should have been "DON'T SOLVE PROBLEMS, DENY THEY EXIST".

If Mainstream is alive and well, I guess the traveling callers are all wrong about dances getting smaller everywhere they go, whether Mainstream or Plus.

Anyway, outside of a few small changes which were not important enough to worry about, the real big issue, a shorter list, was ignored. Really, it is too bad when our so-called leadership is so strongly against changing that they can spend the time and effort to hold a convention and then refuse to give a major problem any consideration.

Since it is obvious that CALLERLAB is not going to accomplish anything now or in the future with this approach, it is really time that local areas establish their own programs to solve local problems. We must simply deny CALLERLAB exists, as THEY do with many problems, stop following their direction, and establish our own programs to accomplish rather obvious goals.

These goals should be to develop a list of figures that can be taught in 25-30 weeks of class.

This list should be developed using the frequency count method, so as to have the popular figures on the list and eliminate figures that are not being called anyway. Have you heard this all before? Then what are we waiting for? LET'S DO IT!

In the Bay Area, there is already a committee ready to work on the list. There are some very knowledgeable callers on this committee. The basic frequency counts of the list have already been made. By making the cuts of seldom used figures, we could have this list in place in our area for the start of the September 1988 classes.

I would like to suggest something further. After we have our act together, let's get Southern California, Arizona, Utah and Nevada involved. Washington and Oregon can use it when they realize that they are heading in the same direction we have gone regarding the level of their dancers.

This would give us much greater mobility for the new dancer. The current Plus dancers will not be greatly affected by the changes as they already know many more figures than they need to anyway.

Dancer mobility will be affected somewhat by having different lists for each area of the country. But, if a list that works is presented to the square dance population, this will not be a problem for long, as all areas will adopt it.

Then, CALLERLAB can become a problem that no longer exists. This would be as it should be, since that organization has expended a tremendous amount of time, money, and energy, only to turn problems that were small in 1974 into gigantic ones by 1988.

Those square dance clubs and organizations that continue to follow the current CALLERLAB programs can look forward to extinction, as many already have. Those that change now, to shorten classes and eliminate unused calls, will still be having fun.

When Elmer DeGraf was born, on June 5, 1984, Grover Cleveland was President of the United States. When he was 12 years old his home town of San Francisco was leveled by the great earthquake of 1906.

At the young age of 55 Elmer discovered square dancing -- and made it a central point of his social life for the next 39 years. Elmer, who was featured in a 1981 "Prompter Profile", celebrated his 90th birthday in 1984 by hosting a square dance at his home. On that occasion The Prompter presented Elmer with a lifetime subscription.

Elmer continued to square dance on a regular basis with the B-Sharps and Callers Choice, and round dance with the Silver Slippers. He attended his last dance, with Callers Choice, on March 16th. On Saturday, March

ROUNDALAB has recently developed a "Manual for New Round Dance Leaders" to aid them in starting their teaching programs. This manual is separate from, but similar to, the "Caller's Manual for Using Rounds in Square Dance Programs" which was updated in 1987.

Both manuals include sections on the Five Elements of Round Dancing. The Cue Sheet, Cueing, Teaching Techniques, Suggested Teaching Sequences, Cues for the Dances in Teaching Sequence, Selecting Round Dance Routines,

and Round Dance References. In addition to the above, the round dance leaders manual includes a section on ROUNDALAB membership and the ROUNDALAB Cueing Guidelines. The caller's manual includes a section on "Including Rounds in the Square Dance Basics Class".

Both manuals come with the Appendixes of the ROUNDALAB Glossary and Phase I & II Booklets. The manuals may be purchased from the ROUNDALAB Home Office, 3 Churchill Road, Cresskill, NJ 07626.

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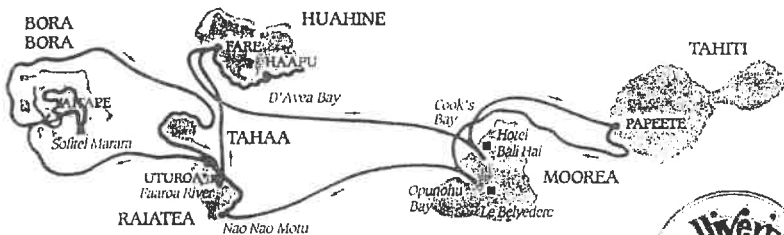
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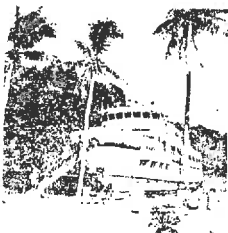
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CONVENTION REPORT

Members of CALLERLAB, the International Association of Square Dance Callers, met in convention in Reno March 28 through March 30, 1988. One of the major topics of discussion was the need for a shorter "learn to dance" program. After three days of debate, the membership voted to ignore the problem.

Two years ago, at Baltimore, convention attendees voted to establish an experimental program which would combine the most popular Mainstream and Plus moves. The resulting list was to be short enough that a complete beginners' class could be taught in 25 weeks.

The list was established and in some areas used (with modifications) as the teaching order for classes which started this past September. Feedback from callers who have used this new teaching order has been very positive.

At the Reno convention, many callers spoke against any change to the established Mainstream Program, with special emphasis against combining the most popular Mainstream and Plus moves. Callers from urban areas, where Plus is the active level, spoke strongly for the need to continue the combined teaching order, at least in urban areas, noting the positive results being accomplished.

At the Wednesday morning business meeting, the majority, while noting the need for shorter classes, voted to eliminate the experimental program. This decision leaves one approved path for those wishing to dance Plus: a complete Mainstream class, followed by not less than one year of dancing with a Mainstream club, followed by a Plus workshop.

Other decisions made at the business meeting:

The Community Dance Program, an experimental six-week learn-to-dance program, was accepted as a permanent CALLERLAB program.

The Mainstream "bold face-italicized" list (a Mainstream shortened learn-to-dance program) was dropped.

A note on the bottom of the Mainstream program was changed to read "CALLERLAB recommends that the Mainstream program calls 1-67 be taught in not less than sixty (60) hours." It previously referred to calls 1-47. Also added to the same note was a recommendation to teach styling and timing.

Split the Ring, Centers Out, Curlique and Partner Hinge were dropped from Mainstream. Chain Down The Line was added.

A motion to freeze the Mainstream program for four years (allow no changes) was defeated.

A motion to limit changes to the Mainstream Program to no more than three additions or deletions of parent calls at any one convention was passed.

Triple Trade was dropped from the Plus Program, and Extend the Tag was renamed Extend.

For the first time, all members and subscriber members of CALLERLAB who did not attend the convention in Reno were sent a ballot to allow them to vote after the fact. It is not clear what effect this procedural change may have on the decisions made at the convention. CALLERLAB states that "if 2/3 of those not attending the convention vote disagreement on any item, that item must be scheduled for discussion at the next scheduled convention."

An Editorial Opinion:

To Insure or Not?

On March 20, 1988, the delegates to the Santa Clara Valley Square Dance Association (SCVSDA) were asked to consider the continuation of medical insurance for all dancers who are members of SCVSDA clubs. This was to be the final step in a series of actions taken to determine the type of insurance coverage desired by association members.

Preceding the March meeting, a survey of member clubs was conducted by SCVSDA Directors. Nine questions were posed by the Directors during club visits. The responses for 42 clubs (of 45 in the association) follow each question:

1. # of members in club
2963
2. # of members present
1523 (51.4% of membership)
3. # of members who have accident/medical insurance
1332 (87.5% of voters)
4. # who don't
33 (2.2%) Note: an additional 158, or 10.3%, didn't respond
5. # who want the SCVSDA to carry primary accident/medical insurance
 - a. Yes
201 (13.2%)
 - b. No
825 (54.2%)
 - c. Don't care
148 (9.7%)**Note: 349 (23%) didn't vote**
6. # of members who would have a financial hardship without association insurance, if involved in an accident at a square dance function
32 (2.1%)
7. # wanting secondary insurance if available at a reasonable cost
125 (8.2%)

The accompanying list shows the responses for each club, and shows that in 33 of the 42 clubs the majority of votes were for no medical insurance.

At the March 20th meeting, this data was not provided to the delegates. The SCVSDA Board of Directors recommended to the delegates that the insurance be continued, and that association dues be raised from \$6.00 to \$12.00 per person per year.

The delegates, after much discussion, voted to approve the Board's recommendation -- even though the vote of club members was clearly to do the opposite!

The following table shows the cost per member for liability and medical insurance for each year since 1983, along with the total cost per member. Note that each year the association has had to subsidize the cost of the insurance:

Note that in each year the elimination of medical insurance would have more than offset the loss to the SCVSDA. To put the cost of this subsidy in perspective, the following table shows the total dollar loss per year compared to the cost of the medical insurance:

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What coverage has the association received for its money? The medical insurance provides reimbursement for covered illness or accident in route to, at, and returning directly home from, an association sponsored square dance event. Note that, even though question #6 would indicate otherwise, if a dancer were injured in an accident at a covered event the cost of medical treatment would be covered under liability insurance.

While the claims history for the medical coverage was not made public at the meeting, indications are that the association pays far

more in premiums than members recover in benefits.

The estimated cost of the medical insurance for 1988 is \$9760.00. For this amount, the association is providing primary medical insurance for 33 dancers, and then only for those hours while they are attending a covered square dance event.

Currently, a number of clubs are encouraging members to sign a petition requesting that the Board of Directors of the SCVSDA reconsider the decision to continue medical insurance coverage.

WHAT ABOUT THE EXTRA \$1.50?

In the discussion about the increase in SCVSDA dues from \$6.00 to \$12.00 per person, an increase of \$6.00, all the attention has been focused on the increase in insurance premiums from \$5.00 to \$9.50 per person -- an increase of \$4.50. What about the extra \$1.50 which will be collected

by the association. Based on an estimate of 2500 members contained in the current report, the association will collect \$6,250.00 this year, compared to \$2,500 without the increase. Given the thousands of dollars the Jubilee Festival earns each year, and the estimated \$40,000 in SCVSDA accounts and T-Bills, we wonder about that \$1.50.

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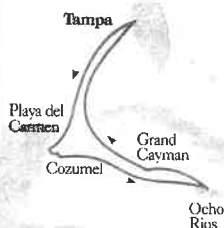

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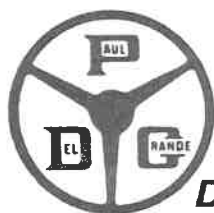
HIGHLAND SWINGERS by ME

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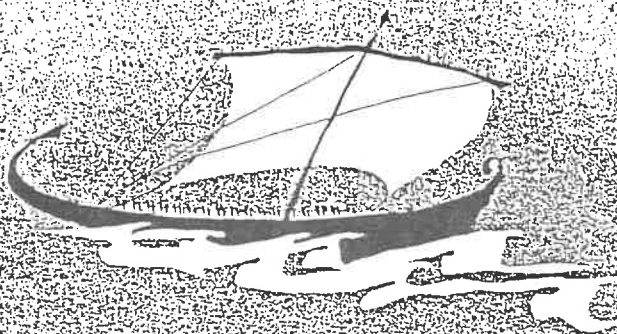
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SUES N' QUES

days) are the dances that are being held on that particular day which also have an ad in this same issue. Another way of saying it is, you must have a display ad in the magazine to have your dance listed on one of the numerical days of that month's calendar. Of course, we have advertisements for dances, festivals, special events, etc. which are in future months (June, July, August, etc.) which also appear in this month's issue. These events are listed under special headings which are shown in display form.

We think it's important for your dance to be listed on the calendar. We feel that the calendar is one of our most important and most used features. I know that when I want to know what's happening on any particular night, the first thing I do is turn to the center page and check the calendar... **then** I turn to the particular ad to get the details. The bottom line is -- the only way you can get

listed on this important page is to run an ad for your dance in the month that it's being held. We do not "track" dances that were advertised in previous months as we just don't have the staff to keep track of "old" ads. Many people feel that it's cost effective to advertise a dance two or three months ahead of the date (and we do, too) as this gives dancers a head start on their planning. And to encourage this kind of advertising, we give a discount (see ad rates on page 3) for advertisers who run their ads for two or more months. Just be sure to have an ad in the month in which the event is being held and you'll get listed on the page the dancers consult first.
