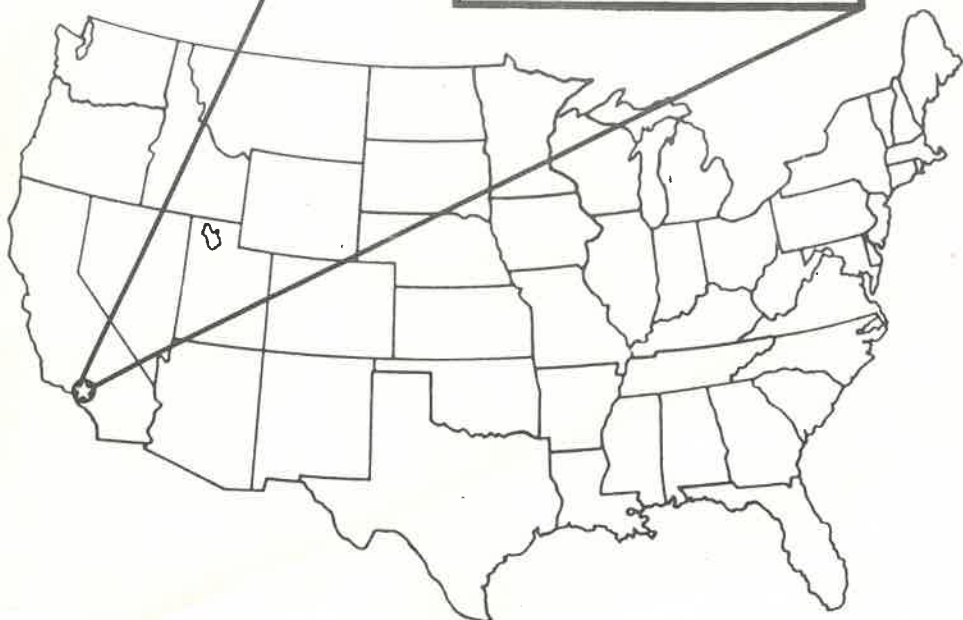

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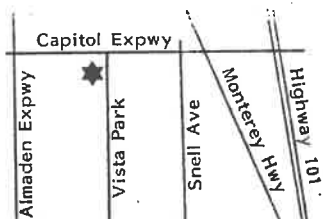
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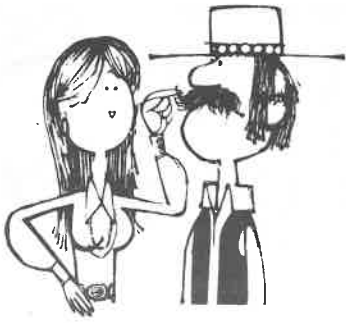
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"OUR" OPINION !

This issue of The Prompter features reports on the 1988 National Square Dance Convention, being held later this month in Anaheim. While we support this convention, from both an editorial position and as dancers/callers, we must take issue with the National Convention Committee's policy of charging admission for spectators.

Promotion of square dancing is a major concern today, as we all work to find ways to attract new dancers to the activity. Festivals are great publicity for square dancing -- we've all seen news cameras at the Jubilee and at other large festivals -- and the non-dancing public is always welcome (encouraged, in some cases) to come and see how much fun square dancers are having. The National Square Dance Convention, which is the grand-daddy of all festivals, should represent the greatest publicity opportunity of the year. Instead, the message to the non-dancing public is "we don't want you" -- unless you are willing to buy a **\$20 full weekend ribbon!**

Excluding (or charging) the general public is bad enough, but the Nationals doesn't stop there. Taking your children with you to the National? If you expect to take them in the Hall you'll have to buy a ribbon. Your mother, or mother-in-law? A friend who wants to watch one session? Sorry, have to buy them a full weekend ribbon.

Actually, thanks to SCVSDA President Louise Mitchell, the situation has improved somewhat. When Louise discovered that she would be expected to buy ribbons for her children, she called Nationals Chairman A. R. Rogers and expressed (for two hours) her displeasure. The result -- a new \$5.00 weekend spectator ribbon. If you think this still represents a rip-off and is not in the best interests of square dancing, and if you will be attending the convention, seek out a committee official and express your feelings.

Insurance Update: At the May SCVSDA meeting, delegates voted to reconsider their decision on medical insurance.

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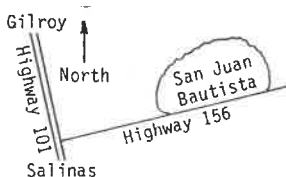
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Message

Oh, yes -- Mike Sikorsky was the caller for that first hoedown we attended after we graduated from beginners' class!



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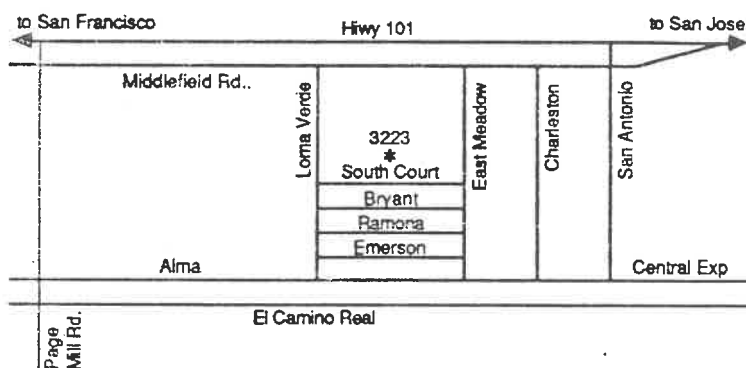
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WHAT'S NEW!!

With the increasing number of A&C dancers who attend weekend festivals, the problem of obtaining qualified callers for the enjoyment of the A&C dancer is increasing. Surely you have attended a weekend where the callers were obviously not qualified to call at the attempted level.

It may surprise you to know that many traveling callers are more show than go, so to speak. Just because they wow you at Plus does not automatically make them good at A&C calling.

Further, you should be aware that you can't always trust a caller! Did he really say that? Remember, some callers have egos that are larger than their brains. They will agree to call at a weekend, knowing it includes levels they don't call on a regular basis.

The pressure is on the chairpersons of these festivals to provide dancing at all levels to improve attendance, causing the pressure to be transferred to the callers. They may have worked very little A&C, but know if they tell the person doing the hiring that they don't call A&C, they probably won't be hired. So, they take the job with the intention of trying to fake it when they get there, or to learn it by that date and never seem to get around to it.

Having been a program chairman on several occasions, I am amazed to see what callers put on

forms regarding levels they can call, when I know they can't cut it at that level. They may think they are fooling someone, but they don't fool the dancers, do they?

I recently saw a caller clear an advanced hall faster than if you yelled fire, and he had only "called" one tip. Later, I was told by the chairman that the caller actually asked to call that level. He not only damaged the reputation of the festival, he will be years living it down, if ever.

When the caller is not qualified, you end up dancing the level below with a few calls at the correct level thrown in, or hear a lot of "oops" and "oh gollys" from the caller and stand around a lot.

Of course, there is the other side of this problem. That is the caller who is competent, and wants to show everybody, right? Some callers have lost sight of the fact that a dance is a dance and a workshop is a workshop. I don't know about you, but it bothers me to go to a session shown as a dance and be workshopped to death! Or, to have the caller attempt to do things the floor can't do and then do it over and over trying to get them to.

When I sit out and listen, it is interesting to note how few calls the caller uses from the level during the "dance". Maybe they should tape themselves -- and discover that they used only 10 calls (out of the 60 to 80 contained in the level) during the dance due to over using those few.

What can be done to prevent these problems? When hiring for a festival, check out the callers before you hire them. Be sure you understand the level first, and then be sure they know exactly what level is expected of them. How long and how often have they called at that level? Don't be afraid to ask.

Finally, as a dancer you hold the hammer. Let the festival committee know you were not pleased. If they don't change, don't go back! When their attendance drops and they lose money, they will get the message.

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Fashionable Thoughts

PETTICOAT CARRIER by Judy Parshall

This great idea for a petticoat carrier comes from Judy Parshall. She finds this carrier very easy to make and extremely useful when traveling.

Judy and hubby, Jim, dance with the Almaden Squares, John Sybalsky's C-2 Group, and clog with the Suzy Q's Stompers and Blossom Hill Cloggers. They also attend several festivals each year.

The petticoat carrier requires 1 yard of 54" fabric, or 1 2/3 yards of 45" fabric. Matching the fabric color of your petticoat carrier to the color of your petticoat makes identification easy. You will also need 2 1/2 yards of bias tape, and 3 yards of cording (these will vary if you increase or decrease the carrier size). The scaled pattern piece accommodates a 21"-23" organza petticoat. To adjust the length of the pattern for shorter or longer petticoats, plan on allowing 6" more than the length of your petticoat when cutting.

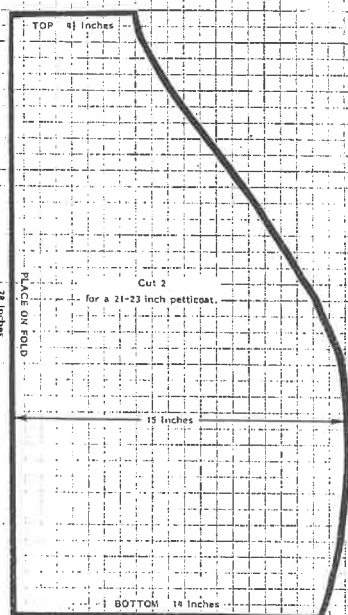
After cutting out the pattern pieces, place fabric pieces right sides together and stitch 5/8" seam allowances on side seams. Press the seams open. Unfold one side of single fold bias tape and align with top edge of carrier fabric (right side of fabric to right side of bias tape), turning under each end of bias tape at one side seam (to create opening for cording). Stitch along bias tape fold line. Turn and press bias tape to inside and stitch close to the other folded edge of

bias tape to form casing (do not stitch ends). Repeat for bottom casing.

Cut the cording the size of each opening plus 6". Thread the cord through the casing. Tie knots in each end of the cords.

Pull the top of the petticoat into the carrier from the wide end up to the narrow end. Gather top and bottom cords and tie to close.

Now you're ready to travel to Anaheim for the Nationals. Hope to see you in our square!

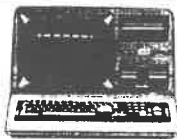

LEGACY trustees extend a cordial invitation to all attendees at the 37th National Convention to join them at all seminars.



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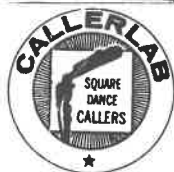

stream will be "Centers In"; for Plus, "Chase Right".



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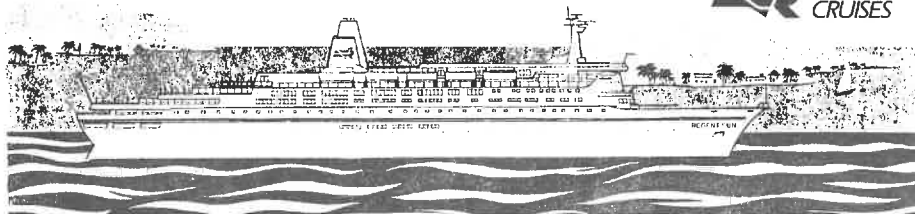

WHAT IS THE 37TH NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE CONVENTION?

**Everything You Wanted to Know
About A Square Dance Convention -- But Were Afraid to Ask!**

A National Square Dance Convention is a once-in-a-lifetime experience for many square dancers, since it is an event that takes place close to home only once in roughly twelve years (Long Beach 1964, Anaheim 1976, Anaheim 1988). The next California National Convention is expected in the year 2001! It would seem that one who is interested in square dancing, round dancing, clogging, or contra dancing would not want to miss an opportunity like the 37th National Convention in Anaheim. A National Convention is one of the biggest events in square dancing and, based on reports of past conventions, those in California have been rated among the best ever held.

This Convention is a three-day affair, with one price of \$18.00 pre-sale (\$20.00 at the door) for the entire three days -- Thursday, Friday and Saturday, June 23, 24 & 25, 1988. One day registrations are not available, so, if you are planning to attend, why not plan on taking advantage of all the

activities that are offered to you by the 37th National Convention?

The 37th National Square Dance Convention will be held at the Anaheim Convention Center and will use all Convention Center space, plus additional halls in the Hilton and Marriott Hotels located next to the Convention Center. There will be twenty different dance halls (over 800,000 square feet of Convention activities) with all levels and types of dancing. Dance hall sizes will vary from the smallest at forty-five squares to the largest that handles over two hundred and fifty squares. There will be dance halls for Singles, Youth, Handicapable, as well as the standard square dance levels of Basic, Mainstream, Plus, Advanced, and three levels of Challenge. In addition, there will be several dance halls for Contra, Round Dancing and Clogging. There will be numerous exhibitions of square dancing, clogging, round dancing, contra and Handicapable dancing.

CONVENTION EVE TRAIL-END DANCES

Wednesday Evening, June 22, In the Convention Center

Trail-End Dances at the Convention Center, on the eve of the 37th National Convention Wednesday, June 22nd, will be sponsored by three recording companies, the single dancers, and cloggers. Featured callers from the recording companies will do the calling for Trail-Ends sponsored by

Kalox Records in Hall D-4, Ranch House Records in Hall D-5, and 4-Bar-B Records in Hall D-6. The dances will start at 8 p.m. Closing times will be at the discretion of callers and dancers present. Singles and cloggers will have a selection of callers from the Convention roster.



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CONVENTION SPECIAL CEREMONIES

Don't miss the 37th National Convention Special Ceremonies to be held on all three days of the Convention.

The Opening Ceremonies on Thursday, June 23rd, at 1 p.m. will feature some of our famous friends from Disneyland across the way from the Convention Center. It's just a hop, skip and a jump for Mickey and Minnie Mouse and many

of their friends to join us in kicking off the World's Greatest Square Dance Event... and they're going to bring the Disneyland Band to lead the parade!!

And, for the finale... a fantastic, fitting finale... for the World's Greatest Square Dance Event, the Parade of States on Saturday, June 25th!

1988 CONVENTION SINGLES

The Singles Program Committee has planned a lot of special activities for singles at the National Square Dance Convention in Anaheim, California, in 1988. We have a LARGE hall -- big enough to dance 250 squares! We're programming our own callers and all other activities, including after parties (after-after parties), singles hotel (Inn at the Park), and plans are pending for a Champagne Brunch and/or Beach Party.

A special badge has been designed to identify Singles at the

37th National Convention. It's done in Convention colors and is small enough to hook onto your other badge or to be worn separately. It's called 'Solo Belle' or 'Solo Beau'. We wear them to any dances that we attend and find them easy to see. Round dancers will have a sticker to identify them as round dancers as we found that a favorite game at Houston was 'Find the Round Dancer'. If you should wish to dance in other halls, all halls will have signs identifying the Singles' area.

EXHIBITION GROUPS ON VIEW AT 37TH NATIONAL

Always exciting and ever beautiful, at least forty dance exhibition groups will strut their stuff for delegates to the 37th National Square Dance Convention. On display will be fourteen square dance groups, thirteen clogging groups, five round dance groups, four Handicapable dance groups, and two comedy groups.

For the Squarenaders from Sacramento, California, this will be the 24th consecutive appearance at a National Convention. Another group familiar to past Convention-goers will be the Maycroft Tappers, a teen clogging group with members

from two to eighteen years of age, who have traveled all over the world, including the Soviet Union. As many as five generations of some families have belonged to this excellent clogging group.

A special tribute goes to the Handicapable exhibition groups, whose dance figures are always entertaining and challenging. An opportunity to visit and dance with these groups during the regular dance sessions will be available for the first time at the 37th National in the Handicapable dancers' hall in the Convention Center.



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37TH NATIONAL TO FEATURE OUTSTANDING YOUTH PROGRAM!

The program planned especially for youth at the 37th National Convention promises to provide young and old alike with many positive experiences which they will remember with pleasure for years to come. The Youth Hall, designed to accommodate forty-five squares, is located adjacent to the Arena and the Showcase of Ideas... 'right downtown', so to speak, in the Convention Center. It will include a hospitality area for teen dancers, their families and friends.

Top name callers will be featured in the Youth Hall, along with some of the up-and-coming teenaged callers who will surprise

and delight the dancers and their audiences. Youths only may dance in the Youth Hall.

In addition to the full dance program for youth, five or more teen exhibition groups will perform. For sheer inventiveness, energy and exuberance, you can't equal a square of young dancers. There's no doubt about it... it's breathtaking, literally!

Another highlight of this program will be the Youth Fashion Show to be held in one of the large dance halls on Friday afternoon from 1 to 3 p.m. Bleacher seats will be brought in to provide good viewing for everyone.

CONVENTION SPECIAL EVENTS FEATURE 1988 FASHIONS

37th National Fashion Show

Golden State on Parade will be the theme of the Fashion Show to be held in the Convention Center Arena at 1 p.m. on Saturday. The parade will feature floats depicting various events from California history and attractions from all over the Golden State. Models from

all parts of the United States and several foreign countries will take part in the show. Dance attire for both male and female dancers will be modeled with time allotted after the show for the audience to take pictures and/or talk to the models.

Sew (Fashion) and Save (Money)!

A very popular attraction of the 37th National Convention will be the 'Sew and Save' demonstrations where you can learn how to turn your own fashion ideas into a custom fashion statement. Demonstrations of how to combine patterns, fabrics, and decorative touches to achieve square, round, and contra dance outfits which suit individual taste, coloring, and figure type will be offered continuously on all three days of the Convention from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. A new concept in tracing, using a double-sided illuminated A-frame designed by the Sew and Save Vice-Chairman, will make patterns available to participants who want to copy them. All of the patterns

available for tracing will have a sample made up so that you can see how they will look when you've finished sewing them. Patterns will include men's, ladies' and children's attire.

The 'Sew and Save' area, located in the Convention Center, near the North Lobby entrance, will also provide a comfortable lounge area for spouses of participants of Sew and Save. In addition, a special section containing sewing supplies for on-the-spot repairs will be available to convention-goers who may have an emergency. For those who do participate, several outstanding prizes, donated by commercial suppliers, will be awarded.



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PANELS TO FACILITATE EXCHANGE OF IDEAS

Seventeen panel discussions have been designed by the Convention Education Committee to present varying points of view on topics of interest to dancers and callers alike, with time allotted for questions from the audience. They will address pressing concerns, such as levels of square dancing and teen participation, as well as all phases of club management. Clubs with special interests (handicapped, contra, camping, etc.) as well as general club needs (by-laws, computers, caller/club relations) will be discussed by panelists chosen for their expertise and diverse experience.

Callers from every level of dancing and from all over the United States will participate in a panel considering the question, 'Where Are We? Mainstream, Plus, Advanced, Challenge'-- an analysis of whether or not these levels serve the square dance community well or need to be modified. Another topic of ongoing concern

will be addressed by 'Teen Rap Session' -- not just for gripes, but for teens, their parents and friends to move toward joint solutions to problems that may exist. 'Defensive Dancing' will provide all dancers with hints on how to avoid causing discomfort or injury to other dancers and how to avoid injury to oneself.

Additional panels will cover 'After Parties', 'Club By-Laws', 'Computer Applications in Square Dancing', 'Contra Clubs', 'Exhibition Square Dance Clubs', 'On the Road (Camping)', 'Round Dance Topics', 'Square Dancing for the Handicapable', 'Tired - Retired', and 'You Want to Publicize'. Of the remaining three panels, two will be of special interest to callers: 'Caller & Partner - Club Relations', and 'Caller-Run VS. Dancer-Run Clubs'. The final panel, 'Commercial Venture', will take up the subject of getting into the square dance shop business and making a success of it.

The 1988 National Convention Organizations Round Table will be held on Thursday from 2 to 5 p.m. in the Anaheim Convention Center. Square dance leaders from California, Florida, Michigan, Missouri, Pennsylvania and Texas will sit on the Round Table panel to represent the east, west, north, south and middle United States. Red and Reva Null of San Jose, California, and R.D. and Oleta Thompson of Garland, Texas, will be co-chairpersons for the event. Florida: Chet and Julie Vetter, Plant City - 'Attracting New Dancers'; Pennsylvania: Freddie Kaltenthaler, Pocono Pines - 'Coexistence of Dancing Types and Levels'; Missouri: Randy and Marge Randall, Florissant - 'Financial Aspects of Dancing'; Michigan: Chuck and Dora Olsen, Kalamazoo - 'Club and Organization Leadership'.

The format of the Organizations Round Table has been designed to allow for an initial presentation of a POP subject by the state assigned to that topic; a discussion among all the panel members of that topic; and questions and comments from the audience. Each of the four topics will be addressed in this sequence.

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CALLERLAB's Decision

An Analysis by Mike Sikorsky

(The following article originally appeared in the May, 1988 issue of Open Squares, Culver City, CA.)

A few years ago, studies were conducted to determine if square dancing was down, and if so, why.

Those studies confirmed that square dancing was indeed down, as much as 40%, from 10 years ago.

It was determined that the reasons were as follows:

1. Square dancing isn't as much fun as it used to be;

2. There are too many calls to remember; and,

3. It takes too long to learn to square dance.

As you probably know, the Callerlab Convention was held this past March in Reno. In the Mainstream committee, a few callers were trying to get the Mainstream list reduced. They were booed.

I was in the Plus committee meeting myself when the chairman asked for a straw vote on the concept of changing the Plus program. There were three choices: decrease the list, increase the list, and leave it basically alone. No one voted to increase the size of Plus. Only three or four callers voted that the Plus list needed to be greatly reduced in size; of which I was one. Over 90% (a majority) of the callers on the Plus committee voted that there should not be any major changes.

I must be an absolute devotee of "How to Win Friends and Influence People" -- I stood up and told them that they were talking out of both sides of their mouths.

I said that they all agreed that square dancing was down and yet they were voting for "no change". I said we needed fewer Plus calls, and fewer Mainstream calls. I said we needed to be able to graduate people in twenty-five weeks, or less, if we wanted square dancing to start growing again. I generated two things: mild applause and widespread grumbling.

Callerlab's one chance to allow square dancing to grow again was the twenty-five week teaching program. All it did was infiltrate the Plus calls into the progression earlier, and "de-emphasize" other calls, so the new grad could practice the tougher calls longer and get out to dancing with the clubs earlier. It isn't a final cure, but it's a good start.

In typical fashion, the Callerlab members voted it out, by majority vote, almost two to one. There were even some Southern California callers who voted against it. I have yet to figure out why.

Many callers seem determined to do exactly what Callerlab says to do, even though it is in direct conflict to what the studies of a few years ago said that we needed: fewer calls, shorter teaching time and more fun.

There was one very positive moment during Callerlab. For the first time, there was a special interest session for the full-time caller. These callers call five, six and seven nights a week. They travel to different areas to call quite often, so they get first hand knowledge of the situations in different areas. Although they are

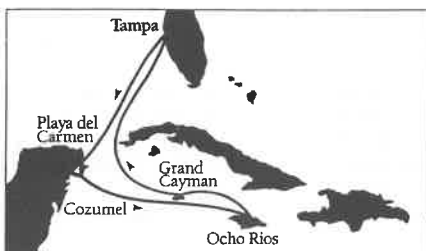

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a vast minority in number, these callers are responsible for calling to more dancers in one week than the part-time callers probably see in two or three months.

You might be interested to know that the full-time callers (the ones who need it for food and shelter) almost unanimously felt that it was absolutely necessary to reduce the Mainstream and Plus lists, and teach people in a lot less time than it now takes. This is in direct contrast to the majority opinion of the Mainstream and Plus committees.

Perhaps it would be wise, the next time you hear a caller speak, to ask yourself the following questions: How many times a week does this individual call? How many dancers does he/she see each week? Each month? In how many different areas does this person call? How often? How good is this caller? How much do you enjoy dancing to this caller? As you obtain opinions for your own consideration, it always pays to evaluate the credibility of the speaker.

It appears to me that Callerlab is determined (with the best of intentions) to lead square dancing down the garden path, making it into what it thinks it ought to be, and many callers are determined to follow, simply because "Callerlab says so". That is, except a few innovative individuals who are determined that they (and their square dance programs) will not be led down that garden path.

In northern California, the two callers' associations have voted to ignore the Callerlab suggested teaching progression. They have a program that is very similar to the twenty-five week program that Callerlab voted down.

Unlike Callerlab, which decides everything by majority political vote, the northern California lists were devised by a frequency count. Local dances, by both local and traveling callers, were taped and the calls were counted. Local festivals were taped, also. The results were compiled and the calls were listed in order of frequency.

-June 1988-

Both callers groups did this independently and the results are remarkably similar. (Editor's note: In the SCVCA list, weight was also given to customary usage and logical teaching sequence although the frequency count order was left as much intact as possible.)

The highest frequency (and sometimes more difficult) calls are taught earlier and, therefore, the dancers get more practice dancing them. The ones towards the end of the list are "de-emphasized".

This program is WORKING. Dancers who begin in September are dancing with their clubs in March. They may be a little weak on Peel Off (who isn't?), Box the Gnat (an easy one to help on), and Partner Hinge (who cares), but they can hoot and holler as they Relay the Deucey, toot-toot as they Load the Boat, and clap hands as they Ping Pong Circulate along with their fellow club members.

I'm using the Callerlab twenty-five week program this year with my class. So are some other callers. The clubs like it. Helpers are more enthusiastic. The new dancers learn quicker and retain better. Just ask them.

As I see it, callers and clubs have two choices as to how they will run their classes this fall.

Plan A is the way Callerlab says to do it. Teach Mainstream first, with all its simple little calls, many of which the dancers won't hear very often once they graduate. About April 1st begin teaching Plus. That means you'll be teaching Relay the Deucey, Spin Chain the Gears, Spin Chain & Exchange the Gears, Teacup Chain, Load the Boat, Coordinate (in other words, all the more difficult, fun calls) as the weather is beginning to warm up and people are beginning to plan for graduations and vacations.

Between learning all these Plus calls together, and at a less-than-ideal time, they won't perfect them (if they don't get discouraged, quit before graduation, and take up bowling). They go out to a dance, get blown away, get discouraged and quit. The ones who make it (however few in numbers) will be



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real survivors; real achievers. This handful of people will surely want to continue their learning at their hot-to-trot pace by entering an A-1 class the following September, before you ever have the chance to cement them into your club.

Plan B is the alternate plan. It says each class should sponsor a party dance at the ten-week level. Then have another party at the twenty-week level. Somewhere between twenty-five and thirty weeks you will finish teaching the new dancers the important calls. Then have another party dance at the thirty-week level. (This could be at your regular club dance sometime in March).

Continue the class another ten weeks, working and practicing the important calls and teaching as many of the "de-emphasized" calls as you comfortably can. Then, have a final forty-week party. Since the dancers will be dancing with the club in March, they will get reasonably good at the tough calls before summer vacation time

arrives. As a result, they will remember what they have learned, as well as making new friends in the club, and return to square dancing in the fall.

To me, the choice is simple. If you're undecided, try telling some non-dancers about this terrific way of making new friends all over the world, and it only takes you 10 months to learn it.

I'm in favor of advertising the classes as "introduction to square dancing", taking ten weeks. It will be a lot easier to get non-dancers to commit to ten weeks than forty. Once you have the people hooked, you can explain about the entire course. I think we need to get them in the hall first, then tell them the longer story.

I will personally coordinate this effort. The more classes we have running this modified teaching program, and running party dances every ten weeks, the better off southern California square dancing will be!

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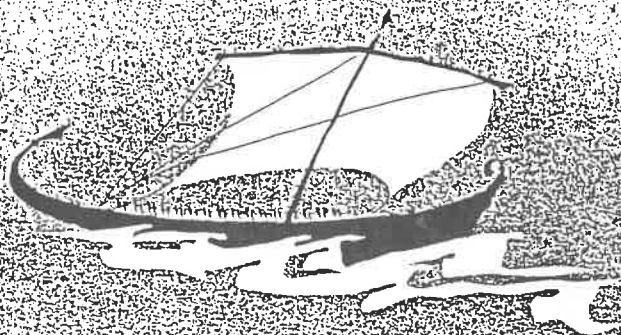
