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PUBLISHER'S PATTER

by Phil James



The 37th National Convention is history and it sure was a "bash". This event is billed as the "premier square dance event of the year" and it lived up to its billing. There were dancers there from every state and from many foreign countries. With over 300 vendors there was a ready availability of all kinds of square dance wear and paraphernalia. There were hundreds of exhibits from many organizations and states touting their region and its particular advantages. All-in-all, it was absolutely mind-boggling.

I didn't hear the final attendance totals, but as of Saturday afternoon over 26,000 dancers were in Anaheim. The bulk of these were from California, of course, but several states (Illinois, New York, and Texas) had almost 1,000 participants each. Japan had 119 registrants and Taiwan had 58. With all these people, I'm sure the stores had a "field-day". Everyone was in square dance clothes (even the Challenge dancers) and the scene was very colorful.

Anaheim is ideally suited to host an event of this "ilk". There are a several large hotels and

numerous motels immediately adjacent to the convention center and Disneyland is just across the parking lot (in case one gets tired of dancing and wants to "roller coaster"). Most of the dancing took place in the convention center which had concrete floors. Needless to say, one can only stand so many hours of dancing on concrete, but there were so many other things to do that this wasn't a real problem.

The Advanced and Challenge dancing was at the Hilton, immediately adjacent to the convention center. There was plenty of room in these halls, but the floor surface was carpeted. This made it difficult to turn or spin and I saw several people end up on crutches or with their leg taped (right, John?) after turning an ankle or knee. The round dancers had it best at the Marriott just across the street. All of their halls had wood floors!

The only negative was the food situation. We quit dancing around 4:30 p.m. the first day and only had to wait in line about 15 minutes to get into the dining room. When we finished our meal,

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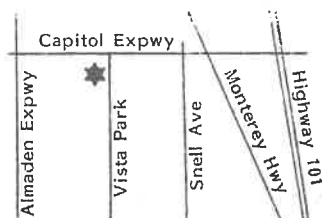
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"OUR" OPINION !

The following is reprinted from "National Squares", May 1988:

- (1) Where does the NEC get needed money? About how much?
- (2) How does the NEC spend this money?

The National Executive Committee (NEC) receives one-eighth (12½%) of the registration fees, so the NEC's receipts are tied directly to the numbers who register. At Anaheim, the fee per person is \$18.00 and the NEC will receive \$2.25 per registrant. If Anaheim has 20,000 registered, the NEC will receive \$45,000 out of their \$360,000 - if 25,000, then the NEC will receive \$56,250 out of their \$450,000.

This money is spent on helping to promote the conventions and on reimbursing each member for certain expenses connected with their responsibilities as Advisors to all phases of the convention. No member receives any pay for their activities, and all pay their own expenses and registration fees when coming to the Convention.

Reimbursable expenses cover travel expense for all members going to the pre-convention meetings and to meetings with the several convention sites preparing for their own "National". Anaheim, Oklahoma City, Memphis and Salt Lake City have committees actively working on their future conventions and the NEC has assigned each of them four members to serve as Advisors. Those sixteen Advisors meet with these convention committees from once a year to as much as five or six times during the last year before the Convention.

Printing costs for publishing the Guidelines and other office expenses are paid out of this money and the NEC finances, in whole or in part, some of the convention expenses, such as the awards given at the Showcase of Ideas, the Seminars put on by Callerlab and Roundalab. Postage and telephone expenses incurred by each member in the course of their duties as members are also covered, but each member spends a lot of their own funds (just as all square dancers do). Last year (1987) the reimbursed expenses were in excess of \$35,000 for the 45 members, or about \$777.00 per person.



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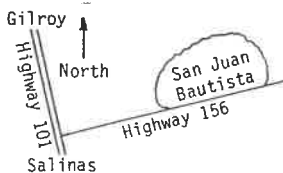
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Square dance clubs get you in swing of things

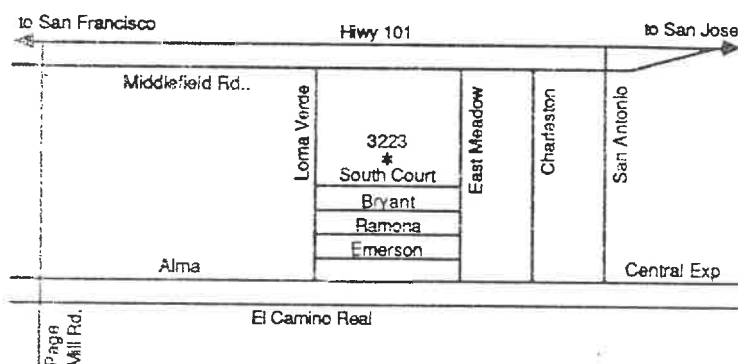
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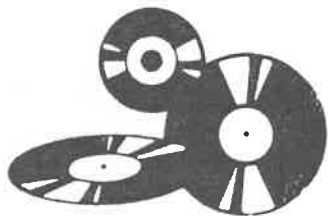

Do we have new things to report!!

First, from the pattern maker, Fann Burrus, a multi-sized dress, jumper, and pinafore pattern with seven skirt treatments -- all for only \$5.00, too! Then, how about an adjustable dress pattern with a waist that expands up to 12 inches? Expectant mothers have been asking for this pattern for years... they haven't been expecting that long... it's been different expectant mothers over the years!

This next item by Fann is over a year old, but if you haven't seen it yet, be sure to check it out. She calls it her "Bag of Tricks". For \$14.50 you get a complete basic dress pattern, instructions and pattern pieces for twelve additional dresses, four skirt patterns, a blouse, and a booklet on fitting a pattern. That sounds like a bargain to me. And it does come in a plastic bag!

C & C Patterns has two new, unusual dress patterns, one with a bodice divided diagonally -- one part to be a print, the other a solid. The second dress has a very pretty, modified sweetheart neck. Their third pattern is for three different skirts, a three-tiered, an eight-gore, and an eight-gore with bottom ruffle.

Malco's good news is a new line of moderately priced western skirts and blouses; a little bit of bad news is a small price increase on Malco Modes pettipants and slips. And Niver, the men's slacks company, is manufacturing pants in colors which match Malco's dusty rose, red, wine, kelly, and natural.

There is a new company, R & R International, producing good, moderately priced videos. Available so far are videos on Mainstream, Plus DBD, Basic Round Dancing,

Contra Dancing, Beginning Clogging, and a Country Western video teaching Elvira, the Ten Step, Tulsa Time, and the 2 Step with inside turns and promenade. Coming soon will be a Round Dance video teaching the classic "Answer Me"! Our own popular local teachers, Wayne & Lynette Harry, will be releasing some C & W Videos--very soon, too.

Callers Bill Faught and Cathy Villa, another local couple, are producing a "Caller's Angels" computer program. Now you can work out routines, explore unusual sequences, and discover new get-outs without a dolly board or live dancers. Looks good to me!

The best bets in records this month are "Flat Top Box" (1310) by Bill Anderson, and "Turn It Loose" (3013) by Don Williamson, both on Red Boot; "I Believe in Music" (206) on Royal by Tony Oxendine; and, if you're looking for something very different, give a listen to "I Heard It Thru the Grapevine" (153) by Elmer Sheffield on ESP.

That's it for this month, should have a lot of new releases next time.

CHALLENGE



★ CORNER

The National Square Dance Convention in Anaheim is over. There was a lot of Advanced and Challenge dancing, however, the facilities assigned were very much second class.

Carpeted halls that held about 90 squares each were used for A-1 and A-2. These halls were quite often filled and, at the popular sessions, overflowing. But the carpet made dancing very tiring and, as a result, many dancers simply went to the Plus hall(s).

In contrast, MS and Basic levels had four halls with a capacity of over 150 squares each. These halls usually had fewer than 20 squares, often only 1 or 2, and had 50 or more squares only when they became 'name caller' halls--then the level was not germane.

This illogical situation is apparently due to a NSDC guideline that 60% of the floor space must be MS and Basic -- even in an area with no MS or Basic clubs! This is truly unfortunate for the dancers as well as for the future of the National Convention.

For those interested in festival demographics, the facts are: Square dancing is a way of life for most A&C dancers, but not for most MS and Basic dancers. As a result, A&C dancers travel; **MS and Basic dancers usually do not.** Now, I realize it is against motherhood, apple pie, and etc. to suggest that

Advanced and Challenge have equal rights with MS and Basic, but, if you are trying to attract and keep happy the greatest number of dancers, it would seem to make sense. At recent National Conventions I have attended (as far back as Milwaukee), the number of Advanced dancers has significantly exceeded the number of MS dancers, especially at the daytime sessions. Again, at evening sessions it is difficult to judge because the MS halls are attended by Plus dancers who are there to dance to a particular caller.

At Anaheim, the two largest halls should have been for Plus, the next largest for A-2 and the next for A-1. MS should have been next, then C-1. Basic and C-2 were about even. Perhaps it was recognized that with the given conditions many Advanced dancers would simply elect to dance in the Plus halls. If that was a calculated position, I say, "Good luck in the future!"

Although we, and many A&C dancers, had heard ahead of time that the A&C halls were carpeted, it's a long way home for us. However, many of the Advanced dancers in attendance probably came from the metropolitan Los Angeles area, and I imagine that a large number of them, if they came on Thursday or Friday, decided not to come back on Friday or Saturday. Too bad!

The last figure we heard was that there were only about 27,500 dancers at the 1988 Anaheim Convention. Part of the falloff (from 40,000 in 1976) may have been a carry-over from the bad sound at Houston in 1987 and at Anaheim in 1976. The sound was supposed to be good in '88 -- and it was. However, I would bet that many A&C dancers chose not to go, and more will do so in the future, because of the second class treatment.

The percentage of A&C dancers is increasing. The percentage of A&C dancers at festivals and conventions is increasing even faster. Smart convention committees will take these facts into account in the future!

"YOUR SECOND SELF" -- HOW TO MAKE A DRESS FORM

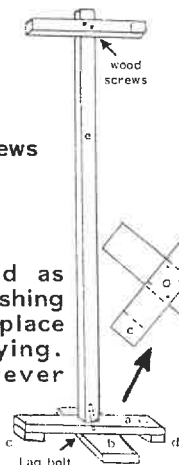
Have you ever tried to fit a bodice or slacks and not been able to do it successfully without many tear-outs and re-bastings? A dress form may be just the answer to your problem. A year ago I bought one and have really enjoyed using it. However, I thought the cost was far too much.

Here is a quick way to make yourself a dress form and stand. The idea is courtesy of Ginger Newman who organized the "Sew 'N Save" exhibits and demonstrations at the Anaheim Nationals.

Materials for Stand:

- ab) Two 1"x4"x16"
 - cd) Two 1"x4"x3"
 - e) 2"x2"x5'-0"
 - f) 1"x2"x13"
 - g) Two 2" wood screws
 - h) Lag bolt 1/4"x6"
- Finishing nails
White glue

Assemble stand as illustrated, using finishing nails to hold in place while glue is drying. Apply glue wherever boards cross.



Materials for Form:

- Man's large T-shirt
- Roll of package tape
- Sponge and bowl
- A friend (or husband)

Put on man's old T-shirt that comes to the fullest part of the hips (wearing only your favorite undergarments). Place the sponge in a bowl of water. Tear or cut the tape in 6" strips. Using the sponge to wet the tape as you go, apply tape strips



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tightly over the T-shirt, starting at the hips and tummy, moving up to the armholes and neckline. The taping should be repeated until the form is firm, but not hard.

Remove form by cutting up the back, being careful not to cut your undergarments. Slip off the dress form and you're ready to mount form on the stand.

Place the form on the dress form stand then stuff with newspaper. Tape the back of the dress form together, adjusting as needed to make 1/4" smaller than your own measurements. Tape up the neck, armholes and bottom. Repeat a layer of tape to make form neater and firmer. Varnish if you wish.



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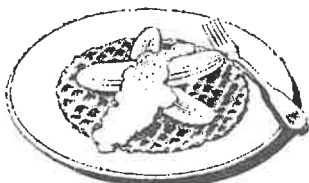

How's Your Cholesterol?

That's the oft heard question these days! Luckily, cholesterol level can be helped by diet. Oatmeal, bran, and combinations of oat bran and oat-wheat are growing grain favorites to use in reducing cholesterol. Here are three great recipes to try. Good health!



OAT-WHEAT WAFFLES

3/4 cup all-purpose flour
3/4 cup whole-wheat flour
1/2 cup instant rolled oats
4 tsp. baking powder
1 Tbsp. sugar
1/4 tsp. salt (optional)
6 Tbsp. salad oil
2 large eggs, separated
2 cups milk
Unflavored or fruit yogurt and
bananas, or butter and syrup
Freshly grated or ground nutmeg

In a bowl, mix dry ingredients. Add oil, egg yolks and milk; stir until smooth. In a small bowl, whip egg whites until they hold stiff, moist peaks; fold into batter. Heat a greased waffle iron to 375° or medium-high; half-fill with batter. Cook batter until crisp and golden, 4 to 5 minutes. Serve hot with yogurt and bananas or butter and syrup; dust with nutmeg. Makes 7 or 8 waffles (8" each).

OAT BRAN BANANA PANCAKES

1/2 banana
2 Tbsp. oil
2/3 cup milk
2/3 cup oat bran
1/3 cup unbleached flour
1 tsp. baking powder
1 tsp. baking soda
2 egg whites

Blend all ingredients in blender then cook on griddle in the usual way. Makes 12 (4") pancakes.

OAT BRAN MUFFINS

2-3 fruits (apples, bananas, pears, carrots, etc. -- or combination)
3 egg whites
2 1/4 cups oat bran
1 Tbsp. baking powder
1 Tbsp. cinnamon
3/4 cup nonfat milk
2 Tbsp. oil
1 Tbsp. vanilla
2/3 cup raisins
1/3 cup chopped nuts

In food processor, mix until well blended all the fruits you want, using at least two. Add to food processor and pulse just until mixed: egg whites, oat bran, baking powder, cinnamon, milk, oil and vanilla. Stir in raisins and nuts. Fill muffin tins very full as these muffins do not rise very much. Bake in preheated 450° oven for 21 minutes or until muffin springs back when touched lightly. Makes 1 dozen.

BEYOND MAINSTREAM

THREE-QUARTER THRU CALLERLAB Advanced Call #14

Definition

(CALLERLAB April 1984) Starting formation: Any appropriate four-dancer formation (e.g., right-hand box circulate, left-hand facing diamonds). Those who can turn by the right $3/4$, then those who can turn by the left $1/2$. As in the case of Quarter Thru, there must be dancers doing each part of the call.

If Three-Quarter Thru is called,

and there are two side-by-side formations each of which can do the call, dancers do not move from one to the other. From parallel columns, for example, each of the two box circulate formations does the call independently.

(Callers NOTE: The definition above replaces Burleson #2788.)



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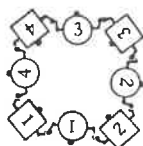

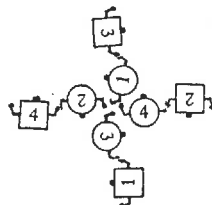

Dancing Hints

Three-Quarter Thru is an extremely versatile Advanced call that can 'catch you by surprise' due to the many formations from which it can be done, and it is a very precise (or 'exacting') call to complete. Although both of these factors must be adequately considered during the execution of the call, the required actions are easily accomplished immediately following the 'initial teach' of the move.

Since Three-Quarter Thru is essentially an 'If you can' call, it is extremely important for you to very rapidly recognize where you are, and if you can start (or complete) the move. Although it is

true that in the majority of cases, NOT all dancers can do all parts of the call, it nevertheless IS NECESSARY that you quickly establish whether YOU can start, complete or execute both portions of this call.

There will be times when you are required to execute one or both portions of Three-Quarter Thru, and two 'secrets for success' exist for this call: dancers with right hands joined at the start MUST Cast 3/4 (turn by the right 3/4) in all cases, and those dancers originally facing out will normally have to Trade during the last half of the call (turn by the left 1/2).

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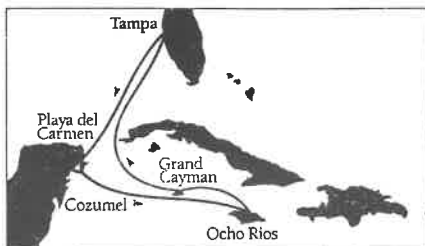

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SHOWMANSHIP

By Red Bates

Is the caller of today a "showman"? The answer is yes; from the time you pick up the microphone and stand in front of a group of dancers -- whether that group is large or small -- you should consider yourself a showman.

There is much that goes into showmanship, including calling techniques, enthusiasm, style of dress, sense of humor, poise, and hard work. Think of the callers you have danced to that stand out as callers you'd like to dance to again and again; each one -- in his own way -- is a showman. Each had something that made you leave the dance wanting to go back again. If we all have the same ingredients to use, i.e., voice, mike, records, dress, etc., then what is the difference between a good showman and a poor one? What qualities do outstanding performers possess?

ENTHUSIASM

I have never seen a good performer who did not have a lot of enthusiasm for what he or she did! Enthusiasm -- the maker of friends -- the maker of smiles-- the producer of confidence -- it

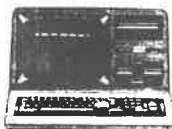
cries out to the world, "I've got what it takes". A caller has a tough job, trying to be enthusiastic at all times. As you all know, there are nights when you would have rather stayed at home, nights when the crowd is small, nights when you don't feel well; these are the times when you must work hard at being a showman. If you are successful, your enthusiasm will be transmitted to your dancers and you will both have a better time.

WORK

Achievement: "the art of using moderate abilities to advantage (which) often brings greater results than actual brilliancy". To be sure, we are not all endowed with beautiful voices, perfect timing, excellent memories, quick wit, natural stage presence, etc., but we all can develop what we do have to its fullest. You all can think of performers (callers included) who have made the most of their abilities and have had a good deal of success as the result of hard work. "You can't build a reputation on what you're going to do." (Henry Ford)



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POISE

Stage Presence: "It is the man who is cool and collected, who is master of his countenance, his voice, his actions, his gestures, of every part, who can work with others at his best". This quotation (author unknown) best describes the qualities that go into making a good showman and a good caller. The best callers in the business are like the best actors, comics, and public speakers -- in control of the situation. When a caller is in control, the dancers feel it and respond by paying closer attention, listening more intently, and dancing better. the result is a union between caller and dancers -- they are in "sync" -- working together to create a unique dancing experience. To be sure, you cannot achieve this every time you call, but you should be trying to do so, every time you call!!

DRESS

Watch carefully some of the better known performers (callers

included, of course) and you will see that dress plays an important role in the art of showmanship. How a person dresses makes a statement about how they regard themselves and others. If a caller goes to a dance looking sloppy, the dancers cannot help but react negatively. The caller, like any showman, should "look the part" whenever he or she is on stage. Some well-known and successful callers have made a real "thing" out of their dress -- even changing costume during a dance for effect. There are many different styles of dress that are appropriate, but callers will be remembered for the way they look as well as for how they call -- it's part of a caller's "image".

While every caller is not a natural showman, with a little determination and practice most callers can improve these skills, and as a result, do a better job. (Reprinted from "The Northeast Square Dancer Magazine")
