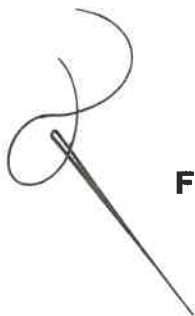

September is that time of the year when the beginner square dance classes are getting started and, from the activity I've seen so far, this year is going to be very busy. If you're new to square dancing (and maybe have graduated from a class in the past few months), now is an ideal time for you to become involved in your club's efforts to attract and train new converts to the "sport". As a matter of fact, you're probably in a better position to be of service than some of the "old hands" who have been around for quite a while. Who better knows what someone in class might have trouble with than one who has recently travelled that same road??

The "message", though, is the same to all club members. Don't hold back waiting for one of the club officers (or the caller) to ask you to "volunteer" your services. Step right up and ask, "What can I do to help?" You'll find numerous ways to utilize your talents: filling in squares, bringing and/or helping with refreshments, helping with the registration and orientation of the

dancers, assisting the caller with the sound/stage equipment, sweeping the floor after the class, etc.

One area that requires caution, however, is the "teaching" of the class. Leave that to the caller, after all, that is what he/she is there for. It's a terrible temptation to "help" someone into position, but the purpose of the class is for the "students" to learn from their mistakes -- just as we did.

And, speaking of beginning classes, Betty and I had the opportunity recently of dancing at the Santa Clara County Fair. This yearly event is one of the showcases for presenting square dancing to the Valley. A great deal of interest was shown by the "public" during the time that we were there. One of the callers even had a "one-night stand" tip where he had the dancers select someone from the "audience" to be their partner for a "demonstration" tip.

I hope you had a chance to dance "on the slab" at the Fair. An individual who works with me attends the Fair three or four

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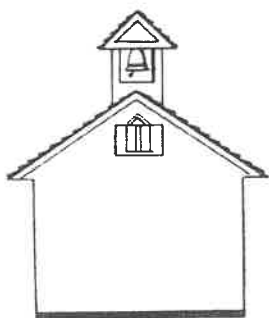
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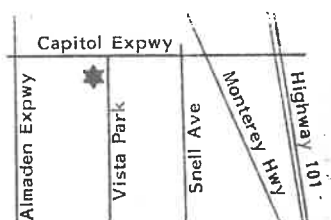


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"OUR" OPINION !

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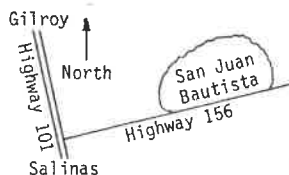
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We Get Letters

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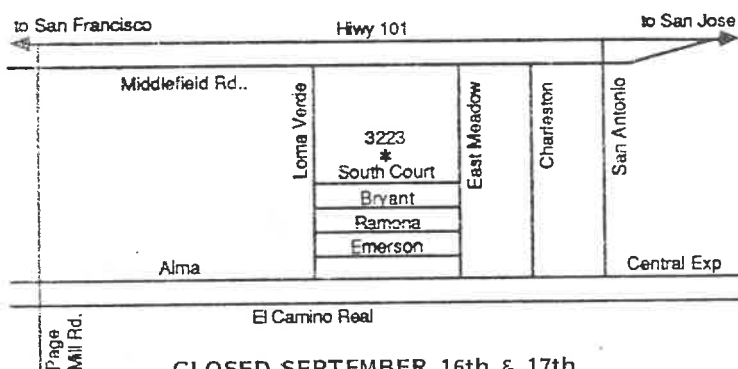
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WHAT'S NEW!!

From The DANCE STORE

Witches' Britches!! They're not new, but it's a new name for pettipants used by our dancing cousins in Australia. Another 'not new' item that seems to be making inroads in our square dance fashion picture is the "stretch dance trunk". It's been used for years by other types of dancers and is a slimming, high-cut leg, brief. It's available in black as a stock item, but many other colors can be special ordered.

The sneak previews we've seen, so far, of the Fall and Winter clothes indicate that dresses will be just a tiny bit longer, and sleeves, on the whole, will be longer and much more interesting. Speaking of 'interesting' -- watch for Malco Modes' new 'trumpet skirt'. It's a gored, solid color (black, navy, red, royal, kelly, wine, hot pink) skirt with white triangles inserted in the bottoms of the gores. The inserts are designed to 'pop out' when in movement. Should be very eye-catching on the dance floor.

The "Market" where we get to see and buy all the new fashions presented by all the square dance clothing manufacturers, takes place in the middle of September, so

watch for lots of new items in your stores soon.

Have you seen the newest round dance magazine, "Apart Point"? It is nicely put together, has "Vernon's Record Review" in it, has good looking, on time, cue sheets with 'quick cues' included... and it is available in square and round dance stores.

Want a really different hoedown? Listen to "Boogie Bam" (1512) on Buckskin, and Chaparral has a good one, "Penny Dancer" (114). There are many good singing calls this month, but be sure to check these out: Circle 233, "Wild Flowers", Basic level by Dean Crowell; Eagle 1209, "Lamplighter", Plus level by Jim Logan; ESP 518, "Real Good, Feel Good Song", Plus level by Bob Newman; Eureka 1901, "Dancing on the Ceiling", MS level by Jerry Story; 4 Bar B 6093, "Washington Swing", Basic level by Bill Volner; Hi hat 5104, "I Want to Dance with You", Basic level by Ernie Kinney; Rawhide 149, "Babies Grow Up to be Cowboys", Basic level by Stan Cole; Royal 106, "I Have to Say I Love You in a Song", MS by Jerry Story (that's two different labels for him this month!); and Royal 601, "Tennessee River", Basic level by Story, Letson and Oxendine.

And that's just a few of the good new releases... you just gotta listen to records!!

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CHALLENGE

★ CORNER

What are the prerequisites for Advanced (or Challenge) dancing? Are we ready? Can we handle it? These are the questions asked most often by dancers as they become interested in spending more time square dancing.

For many, the decision to learn Advanced results from a keen interest in square dancing and a realization that it has become a vital part of their lives. Should all dancers who have decided they really like to square dance a lot become Advanced dancers? Clearly, the answer is no. High frequency dancing is a necessary, but not sufficient, reason to become an Advanced dancer.

We say you should have had at least 300 hours of Plus level dancing and should be dancing more than five hours a week on a fairly regular basis. This would indicate a couple of things. First, and perhaps foremost, square dancing is high on your priority list, and may even be your most important social activity.

Second, it means that you're likely to have a solid grasp of MS and Plus. Both of these factors are important to becoming an Advanced dancer, but that is not all.

You should also enjoy the puzzle solving aspect of square dancing. You should be prepared for more difficult "dancing puzzles" as well as for a somewhat lower success rate. Typically, at Plus, you

and/or your squares break down less than 10% of the time. At Advanced you should be prepared for a higher breakdown rate; not just because of your own failure, others are going to be reaching also. It takes all eight dancers to succeed at any level, but Advanced has more calls which require individual action; each dancer must know his/her part better than at Plus--a significant factor.

If you go into Advanced, the idea of learning call definitions should be fun to you. If it is not, you may find yourself frustrated since you will encounter more variations of the calls by a given caller and from one caller to another. This is, in part, because the Advanced program grew out of the Challenge program and, as the name suggests, part of the objective is to make the dancing more "challenging".

You should like the mental, or thinking, part of square dancing. If you depend upon others to help you through the moves at a Plus dance, the chances are that Advanced will be stressful for you. On the other hand, if you just can't seem to get enough square dancing, Advanced will be fun.

Another consideration is how your partner feels about going into Advanced? Sometimes one half of a couple is ready and the other half is not. There are two dimensions to this. One is the basic capability of the couple. If one is much faster than the other, that one must not push the other too soon, or too much, because it can backfire.

The other aspect is degree of interest. If one of the pair is really not a square dance devotee, Advanced may be too much. Efforts to push may backfire here as well.

The biggest problem we see is that many dancers go to Advanced too soon. We understand the strong motivations (including peer pressure) to move up. But, remember, it will still be there next year--Advanced is here to stay. Many high frequency dancers dance at Plus for several years before they go to Advanced. It's really more fun that way.

'ROUND' ABOUT

Every year at his time many localities are having annual or seasonal festivals. Usually these events are both square and round dance oriented. How are the round dance leaders chosen? What are the requirements for the leader to fulfill? These are different for every area. Some festivals need very little Phase III or Phase IV dancing. Other areas want Phase IV and Phase V leadership. It all depends upon the prior attendees and also the local dance level.

Many local square and round dance festivals cater to the traveling dancers and the level of the leadership is geared to that requirement. Some areas have a lower level of local dancer and depend on the environmental appeal (fishing, boating, golfing and other recreational interests) to bring in the dancers.

The Jubilee will feature Tom and Jan Kannapel, this year, from Louisville, Kentucky. We have known Tom and Jan for many years and are very fond of their styling both in dancing and choreography. They consistently produce two or three excellent dances each year. Many have been selected in our association as "Rounds of the Month", namely, "Coming in the Back Door", "Sit Right Down and Write Myself a Letter", "Sam", "April Showers", "I Left My Heart", and many others. One of my favorites, never chosen, but still a favorite, is "A Fifth of Beethoven", it's so unusual, beautiful to dance and watch -- classical music in the modern styling. Maybe Tom and Jan will demo the dance.

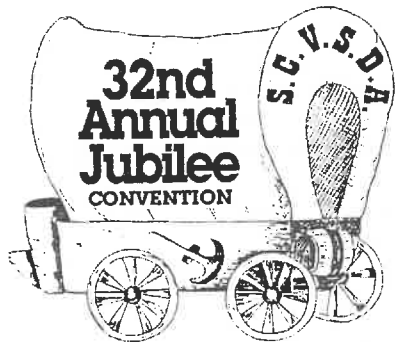
-September 1988-

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Fashionable Thoughts by Martibet



These tips by Dottie Farnsworth are reprinted from one of the many handouts available in the sewing room at the 37th National Convention in Anaheim.

With classes starting, your new dancers may find this information helpful. We hope it answers some of the questions about...

YOUR PETTICOAT (Part 1 of 2)

The basis of any good square dance outfit is a nice, full petticoat. This can be a soft tricot of thirty yards for some ladies, or a crisp 120 yards for others. It really depends upon your personal taste.

One of the first questions new people always ask is, "What length should I wear?" I have talked with ladies across the country who design dresses and slips, and the majority of them agree that any lady can wear her dress **an inch above or below the knee**, be in fashion, and look great. That gives

quite a bit of latitude for personal taste. The most important thing to keep in mind is good balance. Our square dance fashions can be flattering for any lady if she keeps this in mind. Also, almost universally, the ladies agree that the slip should be approximately **one inch shorter than the dress**.

Recommended care: I put my slip in the dryer on "fluff dry only" (no heat) occasionally to remove excess dust and moisture. Sometimes I rinse out just the waistband before putting it in the dryer. This is primarily the area that gets soiled. The more often you wash your slip the sooner it will be limp. I wash my full slips in the bathtub with a mild detergent (never Woolite -- this will soften the fabric), rinse well, and lay over an open umbrella on the patio. This helps to put the shape back in and also it dries faster. I also find that using Rit Whitener helps to brighten a dingy white slip.

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Stir The Bucket With Betty

Here are three great recipes that are easy to prepare and delicious -- just right for those late summer evenings! The recipes, which recently appeared in Parade Magazine, are courtesy of Julee Rosso and Sheila Leekins, authors of the "Silver Palate" Cookbooks.

P.S. Bonus: These are also LOW CHOLESTEROL recipes! Bon Appetite!

SUMMER LIME CHICKEN BREASTS

- 4 boneless and skinless chicken breasts, 1/2 lb. each
- 1/3 cup olive oil
- juice of 3 limes
- 4 cloves of garlic, minced
- 3 Tbsp. fresh cilantro, chopped
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. pepper
- red and yellow peppers, roasted (optional)

Trim fat from chicken breasts and cut out middle tendon. Pound between waxed paper to flatten slightly. Combine olive oil, lime juice, garlic, 2 tablespoons cilantro, salt and pepper in a bowl. Pour over chicken and marinate for 1 hour. Grill or broil chicken for 2 minutes on each side. Remove to platter. Sprinkle with remaining cilantro and serve with roasted red and yellow peppers.

BROCCOLI PRIMAVERA

- 1 bunch broccoli
- 3 medium carrots, peeled and cut into 1/4" dice
- 1 medium yellow squash, cut in half lengthwise and then in 1/4" slices
- 1 red bell pepper, cored and cut into 1/4" dice
- 1 cup cooked peas

-September 1988-

- grated zest of 1 lemon
- 2 Tbsp. chopped Italian parsley
- 3/4 cup Mustard Vinaigrette

Trim stems off broccoli and cut tops into small florets. In boiling water, blanch carrots 1 minute; drain and refresh under cold water. Blanch broccoli and squash 30 seconds each; drain and refresh under cold water. Pat vegetables dry with paper towels. In a bowl, combine broccoli, carrots, squash, pepper, peas, lemon zest and parsley. Just before serving, toss gently with vinaigrette. Serve immediately.

MUSTARD VINAIGRETTE

- 1 Tbsp. Dijon-style mustard
- 3 Tbsp. white wine vinegar
- 1 tsp. dried tarragon
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. pepper
- 1/3 cup olive oil
- 2 Tbsp. safflower oil

Place mustard in a bowl. Whisk in vinegar, tarragon, salt and pepper. Slowly drizzle in oils, whisking constantly, until dressing becomes creamy. Yields 3/4 cup.

RASPBERRY AMARETTO SAUCE

- 2 cups raspberries (fresh or frozen)
- 1/2 cup confectioners sugar
- 1 Tbsp. lemon juice
- 4 Tbsp. amaretto liqueur

In a blender or food processor fitted with a steel blade, puree raspberries. Add sugar, lemon juice and amaretto and continue to process until smooth. Strain to remove seeds. Serve with Angel Food Cake.



JUST THE FACTS!

Many times club presidents and callers are contacted by representatives of the local media and asked for more information about square dancing. It was suggested to the Square Dance Month Chairmen of LEGACY that a press release should be circulated that would provide some information to answer the usual questions about square dancing. Here goes:

Who square dances? Square dance participants include people of all ages, from small children to nonagenarians; all walks of life; all nationalities and races; all phases of health, from those who walk confidently to those in wheelchairs; all mental capabilities, from those in challenge clubs to the special steppers. Square dancing is open to anyone who wishes to participate.

What is square dancing? Square dancing is the name given to the activity which encompasses dancing in square formations, contra dancing in long lines, round dancing (couple dancing in specific patterns) and, in some areas, clogging. Square dancing is eight people moving to music and following the commands of a caller. It's good exercise. It brings people together for fun and fellowship. It relieves stress and tension. It creates friendships.

When does square dancing take place? In cities, square dancing might be found any evening. In smaller towns, square dancing may only be available on weekends, although where towns are clustered, clubs will endeavor not to compete on the same night.

Where do square dances take place? Many towns and cities across our nation now have square dance halls built by clubs and federations for the enjoyment of their own activity. In many other

places, square dancing is enjoyed in churches, schools, gyms, social halls, malls -- wherever there is ample room. Wood floors are best, but not always available. In summer, many square dances are held outdoors.

Why do people square dance?

We mentioned some of those reasons under "what". Another reason that couples enter the activity is that they can square dance together rather than participating in separate hobbies. Others are attracted by the fact that square dancers have an agreement not to partake of alcohol before or during a dance. A dancer feels confident that the others in the square are working together to complete the calls for the maximum enjoyment of all.

How does one get into square dancing? September is designated Square Dance Month, and classes usually begin at this time of year. In some areas, classes are also started in January. For most club square dancing it is necessary to take basic lessons. Many areas have a program called Community Square Dancing which non-dancers may attend.

The above answers are very general. Local information needs to be added, which should be available from your local publications. Historical information is available from several sources, including "Hoedown Heritage" from "American Squaredance Magazine", and "The History of Square Dancing Handbook" from the Lloyd Shaw Foundation.

Places to dance, either locally or when traveling, are listed in the "National Square Dance Directory" which annually lists over 10,000 square dance clubs.

The answers above also have been geared to club square dancing. In many areas, traditional square dancing is available and open to those who wish to dance only occasionally and those who enjoy its flavor and rhythms.

Know your local area, resources, and callers. If you don't know the answer, know where to look. Happy promoting!

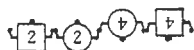

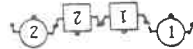

Dancing Hints

Mix is another of the Advanced calls that has some EXTREME versatility and, therefore, can really 'catch you by surprise' when called from some of the more unusual formations. Although the call is danced very well immediately following the initial 'teach' for right-facing two-faced lines and left-hand ocean waves, this same call can present some very real "problems" when called from some of the other formations shown above.

The two 'main secrets to success' for Mix are: 1) When you are a center dancer, your Cross Run must ALWAYS be executed such that you (individually) cross the center of your formation and proceed to the farthest end of that formation where you will complete

the call facing OPPOSITE the direction from which you started; and 2) When you are an end dancer, you must allow the centers to "move out of the way" BEFORE you execute your 'slide together and Trade' action to become the 'far center of the new formation facing opposite from the direction where you started'.

It is important to remember that EVERY dancer must 'cross the center' of the formation, and EVERY dancer will complete the call facing in the opposite direction. End dancers at the start become center dancers when the move is complete, and vice versa. These little "reminders" will ensure that YOU can properly execute Mix from a variety of starting formations.

Damon Coe, Chairman of the Advanced Quarterly Selection Committee, is pleased to announce the Advanced Quarterly Selection Committee has chosen **Counteract** as the quarterly selection for the quarter beginning September 1, 1988. Authors are Mike Jacobs and Tim Scholl.

COUNTERACT

Starting formation: Columns. Ends Trade and do their part of a Split Counter Rotate 1/4, Centers Counter Rotate 1/4 and with the trailing Center acting as a pivot, Cast 1/2 (Anchor 1/2). Ending Formation: Ocean Waves. Timing: 8 beats.

COUNTERACT

(Singing Call Figure)

Heads Square Chain Thru, Slide Thru, Touch 1/4, All Eight Circulate, **Counteract**, Slip, Boys Run, Wheel & Deal, Swing, Promenade (add 16 beat tag).

The current Advanced Quarterly Selections are: Counteract, (Anything) & Cross.

The "life" of a Quarterly Selection is three years after which time calls that have remained as Quarterly Selections for that length of time are dropped as Quarterly Selections and referred to the appropriate committee for possible addition to the appropriate program. In keeping with this

policy, **Mini-Busy** and **Checkover** were dropped and have been referred to John Sybalsky, Chairman of the Advanced Dancing Committee, for possible addition to the Advanced Program.

PLUS QUARTERLY SELECTION

Ken Ritucci, Chairman of the Plus Quarterly Selection Committee, is pleased to announce that his committee has selected **Relay with a Star** as the Plus Quarterly Selection for the quarter beginning August 1, 1988. The author of this call is Phil Kozlowski.

RELAY WITH A STAR

Starting formation: Parallel Ocean Waves. (From parallel right-hand ocean waves, girls in the center) Start as in a Relay the Deucey, all turn 1/2 by the right and new centers turn left 3/4 while the others (girls) Circulate 1/2, forming a six-person wave and two lone dancers; the "lonely girls" join with the very center two dancers in the wave of six to Star 1/2 by the right while the others Trade (this replaces the usual 1/2 Right). Finish as in a Relay the Deucey, those who can turn 1/2 by the left, same "lonely" girls now circulate to become the new ends of the wave of six as the end boys move off and begin to circulate, all who can turn 1/2 by the right, girls turn left 3/4, outside boys move up. Ending formation: Parallel Ocean Waves. Timing: 20-24 beats.

RELAY WITH A STAR

(Singing Call Figure)

Heads Lead Right & Circle to a Line, Forward Up & Back, Pass the Ocean, **Relay with a Star**, Recycle, Swing Corner, Promenade (add 16 beat tag).

The current Plus Quarterly Selections are: Cross the Ocean, Relay with a Star, Rock the Boat.

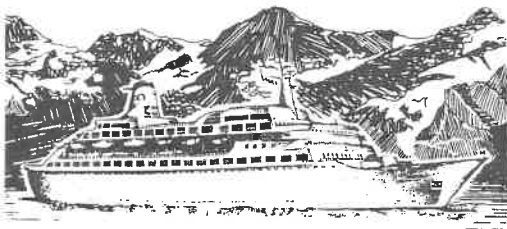
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WELCOME TO SQUARE DANCING!

Welcome to the wide world of Square Dancing! And square dancing is world-wide; currently people are squaring up in all 50 states in the U.S.A., and in a large number of foreign countries. Throughout the world, English is the official language of square dancing; no matter where you may travel you'll be able to Allemande Left and Do Sa Do.

It is interesting to note that in many respects the activity we know as modern American square dancing is neither very modern nor particularly American. Many of the basic steps that we are dancing today go back hundreds of years to some of the earliest known English, French and other European folk dances, and there is little doubt that these dances found their way to this country with its earliest settlers.

These early group dances took many forms. There were "longways" dances, quadrilles, lancers, "country dances" and many others. They were done in large circles, long or short lines, or the four couple square. In almost all of them you will find the obvious forerunners of the basic steps which make up the square dance program today.

Originally these dances were done without the benefit of a caller. In those days you had to memorize the entire sequence of every dance. When they announced the name of one of them, you would make the proper formation on the floor (or on the "green") and begin to dance when you heard the music. As the dances became more numerous, and more involved, it was helpful to have someone who could prod the dancer's memory by calling out the sequence for the next series of steps.

One of the earliest instances of such prompting was the French "Cotillon", a particular favorite of the aristocracy in France during the early 19th century.

Although the "Prompter" is now known as a "caller", this early French influence is still with us today as can be seen in our use of Allemande Left and Half Sashay.

The fun you're having in class now, is only the beginning. A whole world of activities opens up as you progress through class and into club level dancing.

THE "NEWER DANCER" HOEDOWN

"Hoedown" is the name we give to open dances, normally held on Saturday nights in our area. A "Newer Dancer" or "Beginner" hoedown is one where the caller will be using only a limited number of moves. The advertising for the hoedown will list the "level" (i.e., 1 - 37; "For September Classes"). Your caller can tell you if you're ready for a particular hoedown. Newer Dancer Hoedowns are like a party. You'll meet people from other classes, club dancers, and have the opportunity to dance to other callers. Refreshments are usually served, sometimes there are door prizes, and there is normally a donation requested. Remember that these dances are oriented to class level dancing and you are not expected to know everything perfectly.

THE CLUB

The square dance club is the basic organization in square dancing. It is a group of dancers who meet on a regular basis to socialize and dance. Clubs operate as non-profit organizations, collecting dues to pay expenses. Clubs usually organize other types of activities as well, such as picnics, potluck suppers, and campouts. Clubs normally sponsor a class once a year to attract new people to square dancing and, hopefully, to join the club after graduation. That's how clubs grow and prosper.

PARTY NIGHTS; RAIDS

On occasion two or more clubs get together on their normal night to dance as a larger group and have a "party night". Most clubs have designated one particular dance night in the month

to be their party night. Special refreshments are served and visitors are welcomed. A "raid" on the other hand, is a surprise visit by one club on another. Usually the caller or the club president knows ahead of time that a raid is coming to be sure the club will be there. The raiding club brings refreshments for the group and joins in the fun.

HOEDOWNS

In many respects the hoedown can be considered to be an extra special party night. They are "open" dances in that any club-level dancer may attend and there will either be an admission charge or donation made at the door, or the club may elect to sell tickets in advance.

Many clubs will go "all-out" when planning and putting on a hoedown - particularly for their annual anniversary dance. Special attention is paid to decorations, refreshments, door prizes, etc., and the club membership will do all they can to make the dance a success. In keeping with the special nature of the occasion, the ladies will generally reserve their prettiest and frilliest outfits to wear at the hoedown.

It is common practice for the club to engage a special "Guest Caller" for the evening, or they may sometimes feature their own club caller. Generally speaking, the hoedown is an important part of our local square dance picture, and to attend them infrequently - or not at all - means that you will be missing out on a considerable amount of the fun of being a square dancer.

CLUB CAMPOUTS

There are many club-sponsored events where square dancing is the primary activity. There are also those which are family oriented and square dancing may be included. One of the most common family activities is the club campout.

The club will usually pick a campground within a reasonable driving distance. Many of the group will camp for the weekend, while others may choose to join in only on Saturday for the picnic/potluck supper. Saturday night is frequently reserved for an informal dance; the dance may be billed as an "Amateur Caller Night". This gives you the chance to show your

caller how easy it is to do a singing call!

FESTIVALS

Picture a hoedown that lasts all weekend and you have a festival! A festival will normally start with a Friday night dance, continue on Saturday with dances and workshops during the day and the "featured" dance on Saturday night, and wrap up with a dance on Sunday afternoon.

One of the most enjoyable aspects of festivals is the opportunity to travel. Popular festivals within easy weekend range include the "Silver State Festival" in Reno, Nevada each May; the "Square Affair" in Santa Maria in August/September; and the Kross Roads Squar Rama in Fresno in February.

CONVENTIONS

When a statewide square dance association holds their annual festival, it becomes a convention! The California State Square Dance Convention is held each April and is located in a different city each year.

The biggest hoedown of them all is the National Square Dance Convention, held in June each year.

SQUARE DANCE VACATIONS

There are a number of different ways for club level dancers to combine a vacation with square dancing. The least formal is to locate clubs in the areas you visit and drop in for an evening of dancing (this also works well on business trips). There is also a wide variety of vacation spots across the U.S. which cater to square dancers. Some "dance ranches" and/or campgrounds offer complete packages including food and lodging.

Perhaps the ultimate square dance vacation is the packaged tour. These range from convention travel packages to ocean cruises or trips to Europe.

FOR MORE INFORMATION

We have highlighted some of the activities that comprise the wide world of square dancing. If you are interested in more details, we recommend the "Newer Dancers Handbook" available from the Santa Clara Valley Square Dancers Association.

The New Order --

One Year Later

In October, 1987, the Santa Clara Valley Callers Association (SCVCA) voted to try a new teaching order for the 1987-88 beginner square dance classes. Based on frequency of use, the new teaching order was expected to better prepare new dancers for the reality of Plus level club dancing. After a one year trial, how has the new teaching order worked out?

In a word, "Great!"

The first positive feedback came from club dancers -- they were amazed to discover that dancing with the class was no longer "boring" -- class members were learning the interesting (and popular) moves much earlier.

Callers discovered they could offer more varied choreography at newer dancer hoedowns. To be sure, there were a few "wrong calls" as the callers adapting to the new teaching order used old favorites they had not yet taught.

Class members probably noticed little difference -- they had no basis for comparison. But as classes continued, club members and callers could see that the new dancers were becoming stronger at the more difficult Mainstream and Plus calls -- as expected, the revised teaching order was providing more floor time and dancing experience

for the calls the dancers would be using at club and open dances.

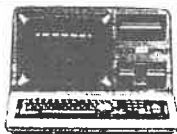
For the past several years classes have required 12 months to cover the CALLERLAB Mainstream and Plus programs -- a requirement when the club level is Plus. CALLERLAB had studied, and discarded, alternate teaching orders to reduce class length. While everyone recognized that classes were too long, agreement on a solution did not appear probable. No one expected to be able to teach the new SCVCA teaching order in less time -- one of the requirements was that all the moves would still be taught; just in a different order.

But the unexpected happened: by June many classes were ready to graduate -- at the full Plus level. As an unforeseen effect of the new order, earlier exposure to more complex moves appears to have made learning experience easier!

For 1988-89 classes, members of the SCVCA and the Monterey Bay Callers Association have joined to fine-tune the teaching order. Both associations support the program -- and callers from other areas are showing interest. Shorter classes and better trained, more confident graduates may be what we need to promote growth!

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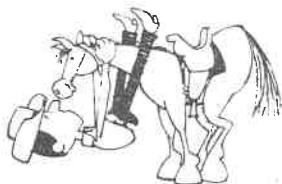
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CLUB CHATTER
