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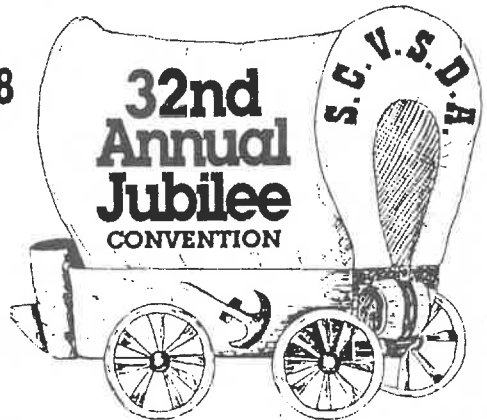
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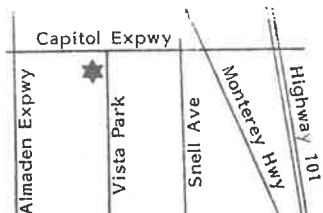
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"OUR" OPINION !

This issue of The Prompter marks the end of our 9th year -- a long time that has gone by in a hurry. While nothing can stay static for that long, the "look" of The Prompter has remained basically unchanged since the November, 1979 issue. Thanks to technology, that's about to change.

Over the past 108 months we have used a constantly evolving process to produce the magazine. In 1979 "Desktop Publishing" was an unknown term. For the first year or so, all copy in the magazine was typed -- twice! The best source of justified, proportional type in those days was the IBM Executive typewriter. To justify copy (left and right edges even) meant typing each line, measuring the length, then typing the line again with manual insertion of "microspaces" between letters.

With the advent of "home computers" (not "personal computers" yet) we installed our first word processor -- a Radio Shack TRS-80 -- the infamous "Trash-80". The computer used a cassette recorder for data storage. Disk drives cost over \$500.00 each, and had to wait. (Today, \$500 buys a complete PC clone with disk drive and monitor.) The printer was another typewriter, driven by a box that triggered the internal "keys" in response to commands from the computer. Things broke down occasionally, but the system cut the typist's workload in half. Of course, The Prompter was growing, so there was more Club Chatter to type each month...

A faster printer, the amazing disk drives, and finally a faster computer with 48K (wow) of memory followed. Computerized accounting came next -- with only an occasional computing error -- the "software" (In Basic) was written by our resident programmer.

The introduction of the IBM Personal Computer totally changed the home computer marketplace. When Wordperfect reached a stable release, we made the move to the PC. We gained a quantum leap forward in word processing function -- and took a giant step backward in re-writing the accounting package in dBase III. (Someday I'll finish that code!)

With all the changes in hardware and software, the tasks became easier but the end result -- the printed page -- didn't change. Graphics and large type faces had to be done by non-computer methods to obtain the print quality we desired.

As we enter our 10th year, we're going to again make some significant changes in the tools we use to produce The Prompter. This time, however, we will also be making some significant changes in the format, look, and content of the magazine. We'll be taking things a step at a time -- some steps forward, possibly a few steps back -- and we invite your comments, observations, and suggestions as we work to make The Prompter the best square and round dance magazine in the country!!



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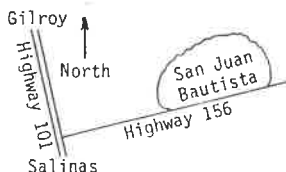
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We Get Letters

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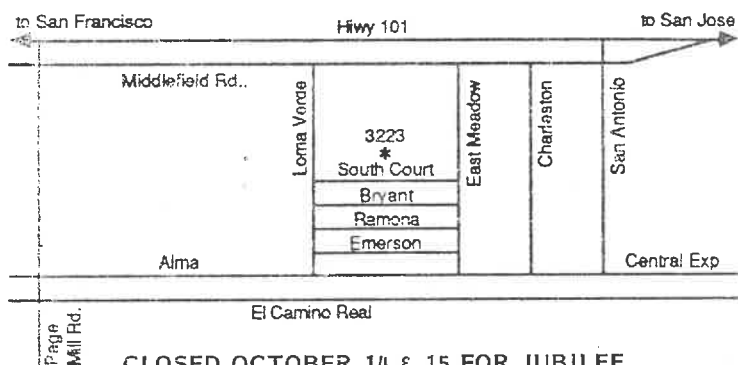
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WHAT'S NEW!!

You know Kentucky Ruffles, the pattern company? Well, they have two new patterns. One, a V neck, has a long dickey with a small ruffle around it, a two-flounce skirt, and **big sleeves**; the other, a midriff bodice, has a round neck with two ruffles, and three deep ruffles on the skirt. Haven't seen them made up yet, but the pictures look good.

Also, watch for Kentucky Ruffles dresses in your square dance stores this Fall. If they live up to their patterns, they should be big sellers. Be sure to listen to Rawhide's *Real Good, Feel Good Song* (150), by Jim Brown... now that's some good music! And Chaparral has done a new version of the old *After the Lovin'* (520) by Ken Bower. For you "sing-a-longers", there is a new Elk (012), *Call the Wind Maria*.

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CHALLENGE



★ CORNER

What's happening in square dancing lately? Well, CALLERLAB (it won't be in caps much longer) is continuing to do its best to see that in a few years square dancing won't exist. Some callers are beginning the attempt to see that dancing continues in spite of CALLERLAB. Mike Sikorsky recently wrote a really hard hitting article that got right to the crux of the problem, but probably not many listened. That, also, seems to be a problem. Many callers and dancers won't hear until their clubs disappear and they are out of work—or out of clubs to dance with.

What's happening in A&C lately? Most classes and clubs have gotten bigger, while Plus clubs have gotten smaller. But, it won't be much longer until the decline in dancers at Plus level starts to affect the attendance at A&C classes and clubs. National traveling callers are starting to note that the small dance attendance doesn't cover travel expenses.

Some time ago, I wrote an article to which a well known national caller took offense. Recently, that same caller wrote an article bemoaning the reduced attendance at A&C workshops - just as I had predicted in that article. Unfortunately, I am sure that I will face the same problem in the near future—not a pleasant prospect.

Well, what can we do to save our clubs, both Plus and A&C? We can stop listening to, and following Callerlab guidelines (see, the caps disappeared already) immediately and pursue NEW directions to increase the square dance population at all levels. "We can go where no man has gone before" (except before Callerlab)... to fewer figures and shorter classes. We can use the "LISST", as published in The Prompter, to teach new classes. We can even shorten the "LISST" to 75-80 figures and teach it in 25-26 weeks.

By doing this, we could quickly add many dancers to our activity because we could do two beginner classes each year. As an A&C, as well as Plus caller, I see this as the ONLY way to save our activity for the future.

We, also, need to eliminate the Callerlab quarterly experimentals. These are driving people out of square dancing. The recent selection of *Relay with a Star* (which describes nothing) as a Plus Quarterly Experimental is a case in point. My experience has been (and I don't call for a bunch of dummies) that it is too hard for Plus clubs. This kind of lack of thinking—from Callerlab—we don't need.

My best suggestion for now would be to have about 50 figures for those areas who dance today's Mainstream and call it Club Level. For those areas that dance today's Plus, have about 75-80 figures (from the LISST) and call that Club Level. Anything above the 75-80 figure level would be the

Foot Watching

by Fred Haury

A no-no! Foot watching is a most undesirable practice. Foot watching produces poor posture, imbalance, a bad appearance and bounce. The head must be tilted down and forward, and the dancer bends forward at the waist, protruding the fanny and bending the knees. This posture does not present a pleasing appearance.

Foot watching also adds a confusion factor to the dancer's thinking and coordination. A dancer must step with confidence, responding to the music in a timely manner. The dancer does not have time to stop and think through each step or foot action. Each step must be danced in time with the music and forgotten—so that the dancer may be ready to respond to the next action. The foot watcher will observe the status of each foot, then watch the step and visually note the new status. Watching presents an additional communications circuit for the dancer to cope with. The brain must translate the desired action into a mental image. The eye then observes the feet and relays this information to the brain. The brain must then compare the observed action with the desired mental image before the dancer is ready to proceed with the next step. Each step is also more complex because of the typical foot watcher posture, imbalance and bounce.



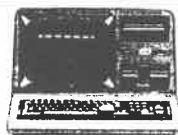
Dancers must learn to control the free foot as a direct response to the brain. They should step in time with the music, responding to their first thoughts, and should disregard any thought of questions as to right and wrong, or what other possible meanings may be intended. Once the music starts there is not enough time to question, analyze, reason or visually monitor steps. Dancers should step in time with the music, accepting mis-steps without hesitation so as to be ready to take the next step at the proper time.

Foot watchers do not watch their feet in other daily ambulatory activities. They walk or run forward, back up, cross one foot in front of, or behind, the other, and turn without visually monitoring such things. These things are done with natural cadence and confidence. The main difference is that the music controls the cadence in dancing, whereas in other activities people are not concerned with making mistakes as they step.

YOUR PETTICOAT

(Part 2 of 2)

I do hang my slips. I have a chain in a corner of the bedroom and alternate my slips on the chain. It saves a lot of room and looks pretty too! The only thing you should be careful of is to use hangers that clamp **over** the top of the slip so that the elastic does not pull.

A number of years ago I was writing a column of hints for a square dance magazine and I asked the ladies to send me their suggestions for revitalizing their slips. I really got some interesting ideas:

- Wash slip and let it dry. Mix 1 cup powdered milk and 3 cups water in a large pan. Soak up all the solution. Spread slip out to dry on an umbrella (spread an old sheet over umbrella to prevent staining).
- Wash slip and, for final rinse, mix 3 ounces of Elmer's Glue with 3 quarts water. Spread out to dry.
- After washing, let slip become almost dry. Lay slip on a flat surface, lift up the folds

and spray with "spray starch". Put in the dryer to fluff for a few minutes and then dry thoroughly on umbrella. One can of spray starch will do about 3 slips.

- Spray Future Floor Wax on a clean, dry petticoat, then dry. Or, dip damp petticoat in wax (use only clear acrylic), shake out, dry on umbrella.
- Spray clean, dry slip thoroughly with hair spray; let dry.
- Make a solution of sugar and water; use solution as final rinse for clean petticoat. Dry as usual.
- Zigzag 60 pound nylon fishing line along seamline of slip tiers. Be sure to bury or tie ends as they can do in your pantyhose.
- Combine 3 cups Epsom salts with 1 gallon water, use as final rinse, let dry.
- Purchase enough matching fabric to make another layer on your slip, and sew on seamline of the first tier.

I hope one of these ideas will work for you!



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Stir The Bucket With Betty

It's Jubilee time again and visions of pot-lucks in the RV areas are wafting through my head. This year why not try some South of the Border dishes? Here are some you'll enjoy!

Orange Salad

- 5 large oranges
- 1 white onion, thinly sliced
- 1/3 cup salad oil
- 1/4 cup wine vinegar
- 1 tsp. sugar
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/4 tsp. chile powder
- Paprika

Peel oranges, cutting away white membrane, and slice. Arrange orange and onion slices alternately in a bowl. Mix the oil, vinegar, sugar, salt, chile powder; pour over the salad. Sprinkle with paprika. If you wish, serve on crisp lettuce.

Sunset Mexican Cookbook

Lemon Green Beans

- 1 1/2 lbs. green beans, cut in 1 1/2-inch lengths (or two 9-oz. packages frozen, cut green beans)
- Boiling salted water
- 3 Tbsp. melted butter or margarine
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/4 tsp. pepper
- 1 Tbsp. minced parsley
- Juice of 1 lemon

Cook beans, uncovered, in salted water to cover until tender-crisp. (Or cook as directed on the frozen green bean package.) Drain and place in serving dish. Pour a mixture of the butter, salt, pepper, parsley and lemon juice over the top. Serve hot. Makes about 6 servings.

Sunset Mexican Cookbook

Mexican-Style Baked Chicken

- 3 whole chicken breasts (about 1 lb. each), skinned, boned, and split; or 12 chicken thighs (3 to 3 1/2 lbs. total), skinned
- 2 large eggs
- 1 clove garlic, minced or pressed
- Green chile salsa or taco sauce
- 1 1/2 cups fine dry bread crumbs
- 2 tsp. chili powder
- 2 tsp. ground cumin
- 1/2 tsp. ground oregano
- 6 Tbsp. butter or margarine
- 1 large ripe avocado
- 4 to 6 cups shredded iceberg lettuce
- 1 cup plain yogurt or sour cream
- 6 Tbsp. thinly sliced green onions (including tops)
- 12 to 18 cherry tomatoes
- 1 or 2 limes, cut into wedges
- Salt

Rinse chicken and pat dry. Set aside. In a shallow bowl, beat together eggs, garlic, and 1/4 cup salsa. In another shallow bowl, combine bread crumbs, chili powder, cumin and oregano. Dip 1 chicken piece in egg mixture to coat; drain briefly, then coat in crumb mixture. Shake off excess. Repeat with remaining chicken pieces. Melt butter in a 10-by 15-inch rimmed baking pan in a 375 degree oven. Add chicken; turn to coat with butter. Bake, uncovered, until meat in thickest part is no longer pink (cut to test)—30 to 35 minutes for breasts, about 45 minutes for thighs. Pit, peel, and slice avocado. Arrange chicken on a bed of shredded lettuce and top each piece with a dollop of yogurt or sour cream. Garnish with green onions, tomatoes and lime wedges. Offer additional yogurt and salsa. Season chicken to taste with salt.

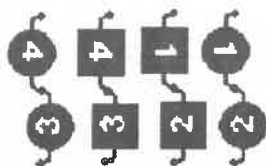
COUNTERACT CALLERLAB Advanced Quarterly

Definition

(CALLERLAB September 1988) Starting formation: Columns. Ends Trade and do their part of Split Counter Rotate 1/4, centers (Box) Counter Rotate 1/4 and, with the trailing center acting as a pivot, Cast 1/2 (Anchor 1/2). Ending formation: Ocean Waves.

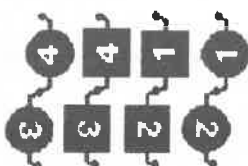
Right-Hand Columns

Sides Lead Right, Veer Left, Tag the Line-In, Touch 1/4...



Left-Hand Columns

Sides Lead Right, Veer Left, Tag the Line-In, Left Touch 1/4...



Ends Trade and do their part of Split Counter Rotate 1/4, centers (Box) Counter Rotate 1/4 and, with the trailing center acting as a pivot, Cast 1/2 (Anchor 1/2).



Dancing Hints

Counteract is the newest Advanced Quarterly Selection released by CALLERLAB. The call is executed well by most Advanced dancers (if three points are stressed (and well-understood): 1) For the end dancers, the 'lead end' plays the more important part, in ensuring the proper completion of the call, because the last half of the call (the Counter Rotate 1/4) must end precisely two Circulate positions from the start AND this dancer must be facing in at the completion of the call; 2) For the center dancers, the 'trailing center' plays the more important part because this dancer's second action must be executed in place (no 'change in real estate', only a change in facing direction); and 3) Every 'lead' dancer at the start of the call will complete the call facing IN in the new wave, and

every 'trailing' dancer at the start of the call will complete the call facing OUT in the new wave.

Counteract dances smoothly in 8 beats of music and 'flows well' as long as each dancer remembers that each will complete the call with the same dancer and the same hand as when they started.

Callers please note: The call may not be done from Magic Columns since two dancers facing the same direction may not share the same piece of real estate. Also, since this call requires every dancer to move 3/4 in the direction of the joined hand, it may be wise to ensure that the call is not done too often in succession such that the dancers will become disoriented.

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38th National Square Dance Convention

Covered Wagons Converging on Oklahoma City

Covered wagons were an integral part of the original Oklahoma Run in 1889, so they will play an important part in Oklahoma City's 38th National Square Dance Convention a century later.

As a promotion for this major event, nine miniature covered wagons have been sent throughout the nation to make the trip back to Oklahoma City in time for the start of the Convention on June 22, 1989.

Constructed of wood, metal and cloth, the wagons will each bear a greeting letter and a supply of post cards. The post cards will be used by recipients 'along the trail' to send information back to Oklahoma City, telling of the wagon's location.

The plan is to have square dancers take or send the wagons from one square dance club to the next, along a route that will eventually end up in Oklahoma City. As a covered wagon reaches a club, an officer of the club

will send one of the post cards to "Wagon-masters" Don and Carolyn Lewis. Each wagon is uniquely numbered and this number is printed on the post card. When the Lewises receive a post card, they will put a pin bearing the wagon's number on a large map of the United States, at the location of the sender's club.

Starting points of the wagons include Seattle, Miami Beach, Salt Lake City, Memphis, Huntington Beach (CA), Melbourne (FL), Ocean City (NJ), New Albany (IN) and Goldsboro (NC).

The covered wagons will travel thousands of miles and will definitely be 'ambassadors' for the 38th National as they make the trek to Oklahoma City. Ultimately, they will publicize their caretakers when they go on display at the convention, bearing the greetings of hundreds of clubs over the country.

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Outside Opinion

It has been a constant mystery to me why many new dancers go through some 25 weekly lesson periods, then fade from the square dance movement during their first year of dancing. Surely, the battery of weekly lessons are of sufficient length to allow those who decide dancing is just not their cup of tea to drop from the square dance scene. So, the answer must be found somewhere else.

It is my belief that we, as experienced dancers, must share a large part of the responsibility for the new dancer dropout rate. We must take the students "in hand" and get them out to other clubs for student dances. Let them see where other clubs dance-- let them meet new people and begin to increase their comfort level while whetting

their appetites for new adventures. They must learn that the real joy of dancing is socializing and visitation or they will very likely fall prey to the dropout statistics.

Perhaps we experienced dancers should reflect on our own dancing habits and goals. Have we gotten into a rut, and, if so, WHY? Square dancing has not changed, therefore, the only conclusion must be that we are doing something different. I suggest that the difference is that many of us are just not getting out and making new friends. Square dancing is, to a large part, social and, unless we get out to different dances and clubs, we lose much of the social ingredient-- we fall prey to the dropout rate as do the new dancers.

The recent Kentuckiana Square Dance Association (KSDA) Christmas Dance was a perfect example. By the standard of some there was a good turnout of about 200. However, in my judgment, a body of some 3000 dancers should have had a much larger turnout. The facilities, refreshments and caller were great, so, the reason for the poor attendance, subject to one's definition, is certainly not the fault of any of the dedicated folks who worked and sacrificed to make an event enjoyable for others. The reason has to lie within each and every one of us who



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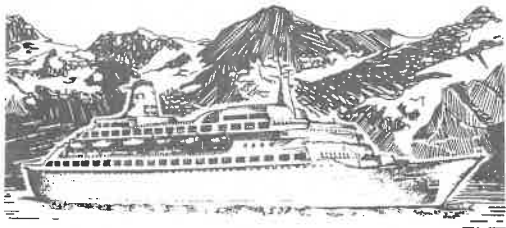
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regularly do not take advantage of such enjoyable events. It was even FREE!!

The Derby City Festival is another example. Many people volunteer their talents and time to put on a major league event for all square dancers to enjoy. However, the event drew only 50% of our KSDA membership in 1986. This means half of the some 3000 who attended the festival came from outside our area and incurred meal and lodging expenses beyond those costs incurred by KSDA members.

Why did only 50% of our own members attend the festival? It certainly cannot be accounted for by a poor dance since the facilities, callers and festival are of first quality. The festival even provided a Fashion Show and many exhibitors of national convention quality. So why aren't all KSDA members attending? Publicity was good through our KSDA publication and through all the area promotion people who call on every club, so they certainly got the news. The answer has to be the decay of visitations and socializing by the individual dancer.

If my suggestions are accurate, we must assume 50% of the dancers have not learned, or have forgotten, that the variety created by visiting and socializing is the key ingredient for longevity in dancing—it prevents stagna-

tion. Therefore, if the experienced dancers are not going out, then they are not encouraging their students to go out. Accordingly, from the start, all but the more adventuresome students are destined for a short dancing life because they never have the opportunity to learn the true joy of dancing.

I am not naive enough to believe there will not be a dropout rate regardless of our efforts. However, I do believe people dance for fun—as dancing pays dividends in the form of enjoyment and exercise. Therefore, we must all get involved and get out. We must socialize, visit and enjoy many of the fine dances and events afforded by so many clubs and organizations, look for new experiences and new friends. There is no better way to begin the new attitude to dancing than attending the special dances many clubs hold during the winter and spring. AND, by all means, get ribbon for your local festival and wear it when you go out. Get involved in your club activities and your local association. Tell your representatives your views and get involved by working on any of the many committees required to run the club and the association.

Your help is needed... just let it be known you are willing and you will no doubt learn more of the joy of dancing.

Who are we?
